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THE WEAK AND THE STRONG

Even the Greeks were worried about the effect of the masses upon the individual, about Nationalism, Internationalism and the unable. The Greek defined Justice as that mechanism of the weak to protect them from the strong.

For all our civilized centuries we have been grappling with the problems caused by both the "weak" and the "strong", for each attacks the other in some way. Thus, it would seem none has defined or looked at these things or else they would long since have gone away. A man who has already surrendered considers himself weak. A man still guided by a sense of right and dignity, a man who still resists slavery, can be considered strong.

Slavemasters dislike the strong. They break up chains and correct wrongs. Slavemasters like only the weak, the defeated, the indigent and incompetent.

Today at the gates of a once-great empire, the immigration officers carefully admit the shabby, the misfits, the hopeless and as carefully turn back the able, the competent, the individual with pride. Thus the decay of empire.

What would happen to the weak if they did not fear the strong? Nothing. For only the weak must kill. The strong can tolerate. Only the weak must protect, defend, connive, hide, stab in the security of night. The weak dare not glow or act or appear. If the weak cannot reach, then they cannot work. Only the strong can reach. Only the strong can survive or, a vital consideration, can make Survive.

Thus when an empire attacks the strong only, supports only the weak, it attacks its own survival.

Thus the decay of Empire. The beast eats itself.

Today we have two political philosophies dominating Earth. These are Nationalism and Internationalism.

Nationalism could consist of many forms -- monarchial, dictatorial, democratic. Each contains the elements of weak and strong. Sometimes the strong are few and ferocious as in the reign of Ivan the Terrible or Hitler. Sometimes the weak are many and the strong nearly absent as in the reigns of King Edward VI (now the Duke of Windsor) or Eisenhower. When

the strong are few and the weak many they attack the strong. A weak government always attacks the leaders of groups, a strong government helps them.

Nationalism is a term which best expresses this contest. A rather new idea, it apparently came to the United States in Lincoln's term with his "of, by, for the people".

Another modern idea is Internationalism. This idea is new only because it tries something new.

Internationalism is an effort to restrain nations by paralyzing them, just as U. S. Nationalism sought to restrain states by weakening them.

We wonder why our "democracy" does not export. Why have we failed to "sell Democracy" abroad? In the first place it is a nationalism designed only for internal consumption and as such has no export intent. In the second place Democracy is only a managerial idea, not a philosophy. As most nations are somewhat governed by majority rule today they already have what we would "export" as a philosophy. And Democracy is not a philosophy but an agreement.

Internationalism is being touted today by Russia and toyed with, in the U.N. by the U. S. Government. It is an hysterical effort to hamper the strong by rendering everyone weak. Thus it has small chance of success.

Out of all these unworkables, a new philosophy is emerging. It is Individualism.

If one could make all citizens of a nation moderately strong, with the tolerance of the truly strong, one could only then abandon violent Nationalism and hysterical Internationalism.

All things start on the first dynamic. Without that there are no higher dynamics. This is true whether one runs a family or a business, a nation or a world. No theory of familial ties will work if the husband is a drunkard and the wife a tart. No nation of dogs will ever do more than bark and steal bones. No world of hysterical anti-nationalists or never-fight-anythingists will develop a culture.

Individualism would be that philosophy of government based on the premiss that a whole is influenced by its parts. The philosophy would stress that sound timbers make a sound boat and that ships of state made of rotten planks sink regardless of the captain's ideas.

Individualism is closer to reality. We are people. The collection of us is as good as the one of us averaged.

A family, a business, a nation cannot run with other than able individuals. No third dynamic load was ever carried on other than first dynamic shoulders.

Why can Individualism, always known down deep to be true, now emerge?

Scientology is the answer. We can take the individual person and raise him. We can thus raise the whole. This could not be done before with accuracy.

It may seem to be, or be, a long job. But there are only millions.

Individualism is an answer to bombs. Only the weak think in terms of total destruction to save themselves.

Let us then forget this word strong and all its centuries old abuses. Let us forget the word strong and put in its place a better word, a more workable word, ABLE.

Individualism does not say that all men, then, should be strong men. It says each man should be an able man.
