International Astrology: Eclipse of the Sun

NEW Moon, 24th Jan., 1925, 2.45 p.m.

THIS is a total eclipse of the Sun, visible as such in the northeast of the United States; visible as a partial eclipse over most of North America, the north of South America, Britain, most of west and central Europe, and the north of Africa.

The Sun and Moon will be in the sign Aquarius 4° 8' at the timeof New Moon, and in the eighth house over Britain and the west of Europe, with no close aspect except the semi-square of Uranus in the The eclipse falling in Aquarius is unfortunate for mid-heaven. Parliaments and legislative assemblies, causing changes, the loss of measures, defeats, resignations, by-elections, general elections, party splits, and disputes; and this will be felt also by councils, municipal bodies, societies, and Trade Unions; authority will be lessened and leadership impeded. The effects should be evident in the United States, for the eclipse will be in the eleventh house at Washington. It causes trouble through international relations, and questions that concern allied or rival states; and this will be felt in central and eastern Europe, where the eclipse will be in the seventh house, but only indirectly or not at all in Britain and western Europe, where the conjunction of Venus, Mercury, and Jupiter on the cusp of the seventh house will tend to bring the nations together, treaties, alliances or understandings will be strengthened, visits exchanged, and good-will expressed.

The eclipse is in the eighth house in this country and western Europe, which signifies the death of persons eminent in the state, chiefly amongst statesmen, but perhaps royalty also; it is not fortunate for the health of the country; some deaths from heart affections will follow. This will also be felt in Russia with the eclipse in the sixth house, there will be much disease and an epidemic.

The eclipse will be in the fourth house at Shanghai and Mars will be setting, which will weaken the ruling power and increase military activity and international friction. At Washington the presence of Jupiter, Mercury, and Venus in the mid-heaven is very fortunate for the country; trade and money matters will prosper and foreign affairs be smoother.

The map for the New Moon as a whole shows many benefic aspects and remarkably few malefic ones.

The eclipse affects a number of well-known horoscopes; thus:

On September 9, there was rioting at Kohat near Peshawur in the Punjab arising out of religious quarrels between Moslems and Hindus; troops fired and 26 persons were killed. The eclipses of August 14 and 30 both fell in the ninth house, religion; and in each of the maps of July 31 and August 14 Mars was the highest planet in the heavens.

On the night of August 28, a hurricane raged in the West Indies, killing many persons and doing much damage, Montserrat, Tortola and the Leeward Islands being especially affected. Mercury, which causes winds, was then stationary going retrograde in opposition to Uranus. When referred to the lunar eclipse of August 14 this opposition fell from the ninth to the third house, storms at sea; Saturn was culminating, and the eclipsed Moon in the second house, financial loss, was in opposition to the Sun in the eighth, many deaths.

In the middle of September there were floods in the Punjab and many villages were submerged in Bharatpur State. This followed the aspects 첫 8 병, 이 6 후, 이 8 병. At the eclipse of the Moon of August 14, Mercury was on the cusp of the fourth house in opposition to Uranus in the watery Pisces.

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Astrology: What it is, its Purport, and its Inner Meaning

AT Christmastide there are many earnest Christians who turn their thoughts to the biblical history of the world's Saviour, and think of the star and the wise men who were guided by it to the birthplace of Jesus, and there are a few who believe that the Wise Men of the East were astrologers who had seen the rising star of the Great Teacher. But whether this was so or not does not really concern us, for all who study Astrology know that the star every one is born under clearly indicates the destiny of the child then born. Some definite purpose is before the life, and it either responds to the vibrations of that star willingly, or is forced by environment, circumstance, and surroundings to give forth some kind of answer. Every soul who comes into physical manifestation must come under his own star, so that the law may be fulfilled, and until that star shines forth so brilliantly that all men may see it and feel its warmth as well as its light he will continue to come short of his mission; this is the teaching of Astrology. We all have each our own star but very few indeed have seen that star, and thousands to-day do not believe they have one at all; only a few know that their star is shining, for some dimly, and for others brightly; this is the secret of Astrology.

But what is Astrology?

It is the guide and chart for the soul that can use it. It is a map of the heavens in which is portrayed the soul's pilgrimage among other souls, and in it is seen the reflection of that greater star which sheds its light into the Nativity.

Astrology is one of the grandest and most beautiful sciences that the world has ever known, because it is directly concerned with the science of the soul. It is the law by which the soul during manifestation is governed; let us see how.

Every revolution of the earth upon her own axis produces

a different position of the heavens, as seen from the earth, and every four minutes the earth's relation to the belt which surrounds this globe, called the zodiac, is changed, and another degree of a sign is ticked off, and so like a great clock our earth marks times and indicates the passage we appear to have made in space. Every four minutes we may have a child born whose whole characteristics are different from the one born four minutes earlier, four minutes in time equalling one degree in space, which allows fifteen degrees for every hour, and by this means the whole space of 360 degrees, which encircles the earth, is traversed in the course of twenty-four hours. Then when we consider that the earth is also travelling round the Sun, completing the circle in a little over 360 days, we can see that the earth's position to the Sun is altered each day, and so we have spring, summer, autumn and winter, each with its special changes; and in addition to this the idea of the motion of the planets will at once convey to the mind the conviction that we have wonderful order amid the many complications. For a moment consider our earth's position amongst the planets. If a diagram be drawn of seven rings, placing the Sun in the centre, it will be seen that our earth is between Venus and Mars, and counting from the Sun, we are third in the circle.

If each one of these rings be considered as a SPHERE OF INFLUENCE, we shall gain some idea of planetary influence. not matter very much what we call the vibratory force that is acting upon us, so long as we are agreed that there is some influence, and astrologers maintain that there is, and that it can be studied by all who feel so disposed; but to those who are interested in other studies, it is our privilege to give forth the result of our own special study, that the world may be enriched by our experience. If we consider the outermost ring as being governed by Uranus (男), this planet in sweeping round the Sun sets up certain vibrations, and also each planet by its rapid motion round the Sun acts upon the other circles, and so modifies or accentuates the planetary influence of that ring until the whole may be considered as one force, or separately. At certain angles a certain vibration will be set up that differs entirely from the vibrations caused by another angle. These are called by astrologers aspects, trines, squares, etc. So Astrology may be known as a law of vibrations, or planetary influence, or spheres of influence, or whatever one chooses to name it; but the one word Astrology covers the whole study, and that study is concerned with law, action and re-action, the fate of individuals, and the destiny of the whole of humanity.

But what is its purport? for this is the question that must arise in every thinking mind. No one who thinks can doubt that the whole of the workings of our universe is governed by a wise hand, and that its laws are perfect—so perfect, that the teacher, Jesus, said, "Not a sparrow falleth to the ground without your father's knowledge."

Our desires bind us to our wants, and our mind binds us to its own limited vision, and we are morally strong or weak through the will to obey or disobey the law, and when we recognise that our nativity is but a representation of the past only, that it is only by that past with the present that our future is affected, we may join with Lord Tennyson, who wrote:

"I hold it truth with him who sings
To one clear harp in divers tones,
That men may rise on stepping-stones
Of their dead selves to higher things."

There is no fate that the will of man cannot eventually dissolve. The soul of every man is immortal, and thus free. But humanity still struggles under its load of self-limitations, and so becomes fated to be whirled round on the great wheel, which must crush some, while it raises others—and so the wheel of destiny rolls on; to thousands its inner meaning is entirely lost; but some have caught a faint light which has partially revealed the workings of the law, and in that working they see perfect justice, and with it perfect love.

Astrology teaches that we are all one in essence, for there is no horoscope that does not contain a planet in some portion of it, and through the knowledge of Mercury the wisdom of Jupiter may become common to all, and through the passions of Mars, all may experience the love of Venus, and by the realisation of the selfhood of Saturn the will and power of the Sun may be always manifest. There is but ONE will as there is but ONE love, and ONE wisdom. All we mus seek to do is to attune ourselves to that universal principle and so become conscious partakers of the Divine life, which is near and about us all.

We have but to open the windows of our soul and let the light pour in. This is the inner meaning of Astrology, which dissolves all limitations, and unites our human soul with the great universal spiritual soul.

EX-MINISTER, C. P. & BERAR, INDIA

THE following is the Nativity of a self-made man who rose from abject poverty to one of the highest positions possible for an Indian in India. In what follows I would try to point out how the Celestial influences brought about the striking phenomenon apparent in this native's case.

The evil positions that are most prominent in the horoscope are the squares and oppositions between Sun, Moon, Mars and Saturn. Their evil nature had become all the more unfortunate, as Mars was in the second house, and the luminaries were lords of the first two houses, and also because these aspects were formed from the second. fifth and eleventh houses. Among other things, this combination was characteristically significant of the abject poverty that the native was He was born in indifferent circumstances and was dependent for his maintenance on his uncle, at whose house he resided. He did not feel any difficulty, monetary or otherwise, for the first few years. But fate could not afford to leave him free. overtook him as soon as the evil influences came into force by way of reproduction in progression or otherwise. In 1883, the Sun, lord of wealth (second) was passing through the twelfth house by progression, and Uranus was transiting the house of wealth. Mars was transiting the luminaries in the course of his cycle, and Saturn was doing the

same, and was thereby embarrassing the luminaries by his SADE-SATI.¹ These influences indicated among other things many difficulties and dire poverty. They were to act for a long time, and could not make themselves felt so long as the native's source of maintenance (his uncle) was intact. At last disastrous, separative and death-inflicting directions

came into force in that year, and no sooner did Saturn the lord of death (eighth house) enter the eleventh house—the house of uncles—than the native's uncle left him for ever. The death of his uncle in 1883 released upon the native all the hidden horrors. He was turned out of the house by his aunt! Neither the native nor his father had anything with them for support! He was thus left to the adverse attacks of fate—homeless, destitute—in the most appalling circumstances!!

Apparently it would appear improbable for such a stricken person -a child of 14 years only!-to raise his head up. In fact it would have been so-at least the native would not have attained the future exalted position or occupied it with the ability he has shown-had there not been any aspect indicative of future glory, and had these hopeless circumstances been produced by less worthy combinations. But the combination though evil was pregnant with possibilities of high order; the energising rays of Mars being mixed up all through and crossing the arrow of Sagittarius, were necessarily to make the native face the The combination makes one fearless and situation untrammelled. pursue his course unbent, disregarding all misfortunes and protests, and gives him all the requisite qualities for making him a leader. It makes a man put up a manly fight, as it were, to make him fit for the high mission he has to fulfil, a mission the native himself perhaps never dreamt of. The outward proof of this extreme good out of the extreme evil became visible when the native was driven out of the house. Straight off he went to Kalhapur, not heeding the loving entreaties of his father, and joined a school there! And how did he maintain himself in his school days? He begged his food from door

which are characteristic of success in learning. He then went to the Central Provinces and prosecuted his law studies with the help of Mr Mahajan. By the end of 1890, all of the aforesaid evil influences had come to an end, and the sky had become clear. To supplement the waning influence of 'M C P & 4r' further fortunate and epoch making directions

came into being. The Progressed Moon was also passing through the ninth house. As a result the native passed the local pleadership examination in 1890, and began to practise at Balaghat in 1891. He soon distinguished himself and had a lucrative practice, a thing significant of the beneficial aspect of the lord of wealth Θ to the auspicious planet \mathcal{U} . Thus the dark period was over. It was really the ground-work for the ever-increasing prominence the native was to attain in future.

Among the good positions in the horoscope the residence of Jupiter in the Royal Mansion is a very beneficial one. It rarely fails to lift a man up to a prominent position. The position had become all the more fortunate as Jupiter is the lord of Bhagya-sthan (ninth house), and is receiving the fruitful trine aspect from Mars, who while dwelling in the second house rules the tenth house—a house of action, honour, etc. Such a combination is indeed a strong indication of what is known in Hindu Astrology as RAJ-YOG, ensuring high governmental position and honours, a sort of rulership, and monetary benefits from the Government. Presence of the luminaries in the eleventh house is no less significant. Planets in that house bring distinction in city, country, or national politics, according to their strength. It must be noted also that Mercury, lord of the eleventh, though in twelfth, was in good aspect with Jupiter and Mars, and thereby denoted independent yet moderate Liberalism of the native's politics. All these influences,

therefore, were determined to raise the native from the abject condition of his early life high up in politics and the Government of his country, and in fact secured for him honour, distinction and wealth when suitable directions prevailed as shown below.

As a minister the native was in charge of education, medicine, etc. An astrological explanation can be found for such a charge in the following equation:

The same was indicated and supported by Jupiter. $\partial \Delta \mathcal{L}$ was therefore a most characteristic combination for ministership in education in this case. The wonder is that the native did not possess a single university degree. As for the charge of medicine, the following combination would answer it:

¥ (along with others) in the 12th house—a house connected with Jails, Hospitals, etc.

★ ♂ lord of 10th + 4 lord of 6th and 9th

The native showed great ability as a minister and acquitted himself worthily of the duties he was entrusted with.

A 14-years-old boy—poor and destitute in 1883—to rise and to practically rule over an area much bigger than some of the present petty kingdoms. A homeless wayfarer—to have got himself installed in one of the highest positions to the great credit of his country! Wonderful indeed! It testifies to the truths of Astrology and to the powerful Celestial influences! Good aspects alone would not have made him what he has shown himself to be. The so-called evil aspects were as essential to train him up and make use of the opportunities as the good were to place the shining glory before him. Thus it was that the striking phenomenon was brought about.

SATURN was culminating in Scorpio 1° 0′ at Calcutta in the map for the Autumn Quarter. The Sun and Mercury both reached this longitude on October 24; and the next day particulars were published of the arrest of fifty-six men in Calcutta. The Government stated the existence of an anarchical movement by revolutionists. This influence was felt in other parts of the world about the same date. In England particulars were published on October 24 of the Russian Communist plan in a letter designed to promote a revolution in this country, which caused much excitement and had great influence at the ensuing General Election. Mexico closed all its Consular offices in Great Britain. The police made a raid on Communists in Berlin who had been using that city as headquarters for foreign agitations and forty arrests were made. India, Russia, and Mexico are ruled by Capricorn or Aquarius, which in former times were both under Saturn, the planet first mentioned.

MARS was on the cusp of the fourth house in Austria opposing the midheaven, the Government, at the October New Moon. The Cabinet in Vienna resigned as a result of a state financial crisis following a general railway strike and threatened scarcity of food.

In our forecast based upon the New Moon of September 28, we wrote: "In this country or in those parts of Europe where Mars and Uranus afflict the tenth and eleventh houses politics will be very disorganised, changes in governments, by-elections, or a general election" (p. 261). The dissolution of the German Reichstag and of the Prussian Landtag both followed in addition to the general election in this country.

The Murder of Sir Lee Stack

UNREST in the Sudan and the Egyptian claim to sole control over that region continued to cause trouble between this country and Egypt during the autumn. Zaghlul Pasha, the Egyptian Premier, visited this country but efforts to find a basis of agreement failed. On Nov. 15 he resigned the Premiership but withdrew his resignation $(\bigcirc \square \ \ \ \ \) \ \square \ \bigcirc , \angle \ \)$.

On Nov. 19 () o w, $\square \odot$) Sir Lee Stack, Governor-General of the Sudan, Sirdar of the Egyptian army, was shot at and killed while driving in the street at Cairo. On Nov. 22 Mr Austen Chamberlain, British Foreign Secretary, sent an Ultimatum to the Egyptian Government ($\lozenge \square \circ$). On Nov. 24 Zaghlul Pasha resigned the Premiership ($\lozenge \square \circ$) and Ziwar Pasha succeeded him and formed a new Government. In connection with the last two aspects in brackets, notice that Mars and Uranus were going to conjunction, where they met at $\bowtie 17^\circ$ 36' on Nov. 27; so that Mercury was "translating light" (as the old term is) between them by square.

Turning back to the Autumn Quarter when the Sun entered Libra, the positions of the planets and the signs on the cusps of the houses at Cairo were as follows:

Mars is on the cusp of the fourth house opposing Neptune just past the cusp of the midheaven; and Uranus in the fourth opposed Mercury in the midheaven; serious afflictions for those in authority, especially as Mercury ruled the tenth (the Government) and eighth (death) and Mars the twelfth (secret enemies) and ascendant. Mars progressed to the opposition of the place of Mercury in this map on Nov. 19, the day of the murder; the Sun progressed to the square of the place of Mars from Scorpio about a day and a half before; and

the Moon was in opposition to the place of Mars from Leo on the exact day.

There was an eclipse of the Sun on July 31 showing the Sun setting at London in & 8° 16′, significant of foreign trouble sooner or later. The New Moon immediately preceding the murder, that of Oct. 28, showed the Sun, Moon, Saturn, and Mercury in the fifth and sixth degrees of Scorpio, in square to the place of the eclipse, some of the evil effects of which it served to stimulate. On the day of the murder Saturn was at 11′, 7° 44′, which is only 32′ from the square of the eclipse, and it reached the exact square on Nov. 24, the day on which Zaghlul Pasha resigned the Premiership.

According to the books Upper Egypt is under the sign Libra; and it is a singular coincidence that Mr Austen Chamberlain, who as Foreign Secretary had charge of British policy, has Sun, Mercury, Mars and Saturn all in Libra, having been born 16/10/1863.

UNDER the Autumn Quarter at Washington we predicted: "There will be accidents by rail and to shipping"; and amongst others there was a collision on the electric railway at Niagara with several killed and injured on October 20. Saturn was in the third house and the Moon applying to the square of it, both in watery signs.

On October 20, forty-two persons, men and women, were charged at a London Police Court, having been arrested during a Police raid on a night club. Here there is the influence of Uranus in the fifth house at the Quarter, "pleasure," afflicted; and on that date Venus had progressed to near the opposition of Uranus.

THERE was a smallpox epidemic in Madrid in October, and compulsory vaccination was enforced. At the New Moon of September 28 Saturn was in Scorpio in the sixth house, health, there; Mars, its dispositor, was in the midheaven at \$25.37\$ in square to the rising degree \$27.35\$. On October 8, the day on which the news of the compulsory vaccination was published, Mars had progressed to \$27.1\$, closer still to the square of the rising degree. The affinity of Mars-Scorpio-Taurus with fevers and smallpox is known. The same two signs are also associated with earthquakes, and a shock was felt at Granada in Spain during the night of October 18, 19. The rising degree here was \$25.12\$, in almost exact square to Mars at the New Moon.

Of the Sense of Kumour

HAVE any students of Astrology, I wonder, satisfied themselves as to the origin and planetary equivalents of the "Sense of Humour"? Some may be inclined to say that it is a minor point and does not much matter; but a deep study of human nature inclines one to differ from this view. It is not so much wit that falls under this heading. Many very witty people are born when Mercury is in Aries, aspecting the Sun or Moon in Gemini. But a witty person is not necessarily an advanced soul from the point of view of Astrology. In fact, many, like certain French satirists, have been wanting in the gift of sympathy. Wit may easily be allied to cynicism. It flashes purely from the Mental plane. Humour is another matter altogether. We have often heard that it is "akin to tears." In Dickens—to take a literary example—humour and pathos were never far apart. And there was no kindlier and sweeter nature in the world of letters than the supreme humourist, Mark Twain.

The real humour is allied to tenderness. It sees "the funny side" of poor humanity,—it sees the Spirit of Fun lurking in all Nature,—in the play of animals, the "make believe" of children, the incalculable element in the affairs of men. The people who possess it in a high degree are the most sympathetic, the most tolerant, the most understanding. Hence, we contend that it belongs to the more advanced Ego just as it seems to be a mark of the more civilised races of the world. And again, if we consider civilisation in its truest sense as the development of the social, ethical, and altruistic qualities which enable man to get out of the Self into the Not-Self, we shall see that the more developed the nation, the more the element of real humour enters into its literature, its ballads, its songs. Humour, therefore, develops when man is at his best, when he has achieved a measure of freedom, self-control, and unselfishness. The question naturally arises: Can it be cultivated?—a question difficult to answer when one

has to admit one's (astrological) ignorance of the producing cause. Yet I have observed one thing which does perhaps give us a lead in the right direction. The want of humour certainly goes with a large amount of self-preoccupation. The Russians for example, as a nation, are, in their present stage, intensely morbidly preoccupied with themselves, their problems, their destiny. Hence the awful gloom of their literature; the fierce and joyless introspection of their philosophy. And so among individuals, nothing kills the sense of humour so much as intense preoccupation either with oneself or with one idea. And nothing educates or develops it so much as the habit of living outside oneself. In cases where the deficiency amounts to a disease, as in acute melancholia (generally to be diagnosed from a horoscope under an affliction of Saturn), it is of great importance to get an attendant with a bias of natural gaiety. Almost insensibly a sick soul will respond to the happy mood of those round about. I am not sure that people who have this gift largely developed always realise what an asset it is in the service of humanity.

Astrologically I am inclined to think that m rising or a Moon in Aquarius, supported by an Aries influence, may be relied upon for humour. And perhaps Saturn in Sagittarius is a contributing factor. It would be interesting to get a body of observation upon this point.

The two greatest humourists among my circle of friends belong to Air and Fire signs, mainly Aries and Aquarius. Saturn is well placed and aspected in both cases, and Venus in Gemini perhaps contributes to a harmonious gaiety of mind. The people most deficient in the sense are those with the Sun in Capricorn or in Virgo, supported by planets in the earthy signs. But this is poor material for any theory to be built upon.

Speaking of preoccupation with one idea, perhaps I may add a little experience of my own which I fancy may "go home" to many who have achieved disaster in trying to "bring together" their various friends! Personally I learnt a lesson from this experience. It was a little "impromptu" tea-party in a London museum, and I gathered four people individually delightful and interesting, but who, like other valuable elements, were not destined by nature to combine. One was an occultist, one a scientist, the third a genial man of the world, and the fourth a nice bright girl of my acquaintance. It was the first two

who upset my tea-party. "Sir," said the occultist, gazing at the other with a seraphic gaze, "You have the forehead and eyes of a mystic. Yet I find you here immersed in scientific pursuits. This is interesting."

The little scientist probably detected in the smile a hint of superiority: it seemed to upset him.

"My eyes, Sir," he answered, "may be looking into the Absolute, but my feet remain on the solid ground of reasoned observation."

From that moment the talk became chaotic. Each of the combatants was too absorbed in his own interpretation to get the other's point of view. It was a situation that humour would have saved. As Clifford Harrison used to say, "A faith that is deep can afford to laugh at its own profundity." In a momentary pause the genial man of the world told an anecdote or two to relieve the tension, and the girl nudged me and whispered "Isn't this awful?"

After tea we all went down a corridor where there was a large meteorite. The scientist, replying to a question, told its history. The occultist, his face grown rigid and frowning, felt for its "emanation"; and then, attacking his antagonist once more, began to enlarge upon this theme. More chaos. And so to the end.

It is just this rigidity of mind coupled with the determination to make our friends see the thing exactly as we see it, which is such a devastating factor in life. We want more of that deep wisdom, that intellectual balance—which was so manifest in the author of "Esoteric Astrology." In comparing the horoscopes of Balzac and Robespierre, he makes this observation: "Both were right according to their stage in evolution." If this were only more understood how many human tragedies might be saved!

SATURN re-entered Scorpio, the seventh sign from Taurus, which is the ruling sign of Ireland, on August 13. Three days later the Moon entered Taurus in opposition to Saturn; and on this day, August 16, the Ulster Government decided not to appoint a representative to the Boundary Commission to consider the question of the readjustment of the boundary between Ulster and the Irish Free State. When referred to the maps for the lunar eclipse of August 14 and the solar eclipse of August 30 this opposition in each case was from the first to the seventh house; appropriate for a struggle between two different Governments.

Medical Astrology

I.—FEVERS

THROUGHOUT all ages one of the principal uses of Astrology has been in the treatment and diagnosis of disease: and it is probable that the present generation is equally interested in this application of the science. As few persons pass through life without suffering from fever of some kind, the first subject selected is that of fevers in general. Fever is here used in its simple non-technical meaning of "abnormal bodily heat." This is not strictly a disease, but an indication or symptom of disease.

The primary causes of fever are different according to the nature of the disease. The immediate causes are excessive conversion of food into heat, or excessive conversion of the blood tissue into heat, or irregular distribution of the heat of the body, or a combination of these causes. It is to be expected, therefore, that astrologically the symbols of heat (Υ and \simeq and their rulers σ and Ψ) will be combined with the symbols of temperature (σ and σ and their rulers σ and σ

In considering the cure for fever it is to be borne in mind that the removal of the fever may not necessarily be a good thing. For the fever may itself be the remedy for getting rid of some poison in the system. If, however, the fever is so great as to strain the heart or to endanger the life by its very intensity, allopathic treatment is indicated and some drug should be used under the dominion of $\mathfrak{B} \times 11$ (and their rulers, Pluto and Saturn). If the fever is comparatively mild and it is desired to increase the fever slightly in order to hasten the cure, the homoeopathic treatment is desirable and drugs should be used which are under the dominion of $\mathfrak{P} = 11$ (and their rulers, Mars and Neptune). But the safest drugs will naturally be those which are under the dominion of the degrees which are in sextile or trine to $\mathfrak{P} = 11$, namely $\mathfrak{B} \times \mathfrak{A} \times 11$.

From a Piscian to an Aquarian

THE most infallible method of studying the religious states the coming Aquarian age is by astrologically comparing it we passing Piscian religion. It is infallible because the trend of the masses follows the course indicated by the heavenly bodies. The exceptional few follow the path of initiation.

The passing Piscian-Virgo religion is a religion based on self-sacrifice and the adoration of an immaculate virgin, including forms and ceremonies peculiar to these signs. Mankind, from the uncivilised to the most intelligent, have a tendency for this form of worship. Although very crude and degrading amongst the uncivilised, the influence comes from the same source, only their moral standard cannot respond to the highest vibrations that these signs embody. Now that the Sun and planets are receding to Aquarius an entirely new religion will gradually replace the old, and in time to come only traces of the old will be left. But, before we consider the new, let us observe how the Piscian religion swayed mankind in the past few thousand years.

When the Sun and planets passed through the natural zodiacal sign Pisces it was in a cosmical area where the vibrations are akin to the sign. We have a planet (Jupiter) in our Solar System that is especially receptive to these vibrations, intensifies them and sends them forth to its sister planets. Thus, all our planets receive a similar form of religion—namely a negative Jupiterian religion; and they respond to it according to their stage in evolution. The part assigned to us enters the Earth zodiac through the sign most harmonious to the negative quality of Jupiter. We can illustrate by arranging twelve plates of glass—coloured to represent the twelve signs—in a circle and placing a blue light in the centre. When the rays from the blue light penetrate the yellow glass it will neither

produce blue nor yellow but a g reenish tint is the result; the delicate hue violet it destroys entirely, but when it penetrates the blue it intensifies that colour and a very beautiful deep blue is the result.

The fact that the Solar System passed through such a sublime area and is now entering another does not mean that we have surpassed the Piscian-Jupiter religion. The majority were not evolved enough to respond to such a religious standard. Christ working with the law of the cosmos came and taught mankind, but they could not grasp the full significance of His valuable teaching. Without a doubt beings inhabiting the more evolved planets like Venus and Mercury were more receptive and consequently further advanced during this period than the inhabitants of the earth. However, there was a certain known number from our planet advanced enough to respond and therefore to enter the path. And the masses, those under jurisdiction of religious institutions and compelled by their authorities to compulsory sacrifice, made conditions favourable for future incarnations.

Individuals born with a favourably aspected Jupiter in Pisces were religiously the people of the time. Their self-sacrificing nature cannot be better described than in the words of the author of *The Messenger of the Stars*:

"The true Jupiterian is a jovial fellow, his heart is almost too big to find room, the corners of his mouth are always turned upwards with a broad smile, always ready to give anything and everybody a boon. He seems actually grateful to you when you ask him to do you a favour and is never so happy as when working hard to help others. He would never harm a child and get angry, never cruel, always showing mercy and kindness to his enemies." There are not many. The Solar System will again enter a similar space after the Aquarian and Capricornian ages have passed and the benevolent influence of Jupiter will again come forth in the Sagittarian age; by this time mankind will be more evolved and therefore respond more readily to its influence.

Those that have entered and successfully passed the Piscian age are mentioned in the seventh chapter of *Revelation* from the fourth to the twelfth verse. From the fourth to the ninth are the given number from each sign: one hundred and forty-four thousand in all

that entered the path or were greatly evolved during the Piscian age. And the "multitude which no man could number" are those that lived faithfully to the creed of their respective religion.

Volney in his Ruins of Empire based his belief that the entire fabric of religion, beginning from history, down to the present religious forms, is all superstition based on astrological symbols invented by the Ethiopians. His argument was very forcible and presented in such a masterly literary phraseology that it appears indisputable; only a man with an intellect like Volney could present it. He compared, with remarkable accuracy, the motion of the planets, the changing of the seasons, and the precession of the equinox with the different forms of religion as far back as religious history goes. But, Volney was an astrologer of the first order, though it might have offended his proud materialistic mind had someone thus described him. All his calculations were correct but instead of admitting that religious forms were representations of cosmic vibrations intended to elevate mankind, he condemned all forms of worship and concluded that they were merely a form of Sun and stars adoration. If he would have used his ability to decipher the stars and planets so minutely centuries ahead as he did the past, he would have been one of the foremost men to promote spiritual science, and translate the message of the Aquarian age.

Will the coming religion be an Aquarian-Uranus, or an Aquarian-Saturn religion? It seems that most astrologers give no attention to the rulership of Saturn in Aquarius when they study the coming age. It is an indisputable fact that Jupiter and not its co-ruler Neptune was the chief indicator of religion in the Piscian age, and so we can safely conclude that Saturn and not Uranus will rule the multitude. However there are such as have need of strong meat. "For every one that useth milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe. But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil" (Hebrews iv. 14). Christ taught the chosen ones mysticism (Piscian-Neptune) and thus showed them the adept's path. It is obvious that some will be taught occultism (Aquarian-Uranus), the path of the Masters.

It would be no surprise, if the much expected Avatar should

base his teaching for the masses on a purely Saturnine quality, such as chastity, justice, or some other principle of Saturn.

The unrest in the religious world as well as the other departments of life can be accounted for by the Sun's orbit touching the last degree of Aquarius. Both favourable and unfavourable rays of Saturn were influencing humanity in the past few decades. Its evil rays are the cause of materialism. The denying of an intermediate condition after death for the past few centuries can be traced to Saturn. The advancing of material science is the outcome of the combined wisdom of Saturn and the mental sign Aquarius. Russia, a country ruled by Aquarius, is painfully attempting to adjust itself to the exact justice that Saturn demands. Uranus or Neptune have no direct bearing on our evolution and therefore cannot be counted as originators of these many changes.

We can expect Saturn to chasten and restrain: many who were swayed in the past by the evil indolent rays of Jupiter will now find themselves in his icy grip. Neither will his control of mankind cease at the end of the Aquarian age, he will also have dominion of the next age. So by the time he is finished chastening human beings he will have the required number of egos who are to be saved.

Thus, a general astrological view shows us the world karma is of a Saturn-Aquarian nature, and will be worked out along such lines, but to judge clearly of the effects of a given cause the mind must be unbiased by desire; it must be as cold as a scientific problem. It is by this celestial algebra that the mind can look ahead and decipher God's secret.

ON November 3 an express train was wrecked near Lytham, with fourteen killed. At the New Moon of October 28, Saturn rose as lord of the third house, railways, in conjunction with Sun, Moon and Mercury (lord of the eighth, death). On November 3 the Moon was in the third house squaring Saturn and the place of the conjunction. At the hour of the accident, 5.45 p.m., the Moon was culminating as ruler of the third house.

THE eclipse of the Sun of August 30 at Virgo 6° 40′ was rising near Pernambuco, Brazil. Mars reached the opposition of this longitude on November 6, when a mutiny occurred in the Brazilian Navy, and one vessel with the mutineers on board sailed for a foreign port.

A SHOCK of earthquake was felt in Iceland on August 25 followed by a tidal wave. In the map for the Summer Quarter in Iceland Mars was in conjunction with the Moon not far from the cusp of the fourth house, a seismic position, and the beginning of Scorpio, a seismic sign, was rising. The opposition of the Sun and Mars occurred only two days before.

THERE was an insurrection in the Provinces of Georgia and Azerbaijan, southern Russia, at the beginning of September, with fighting in the streets of Batum. In the map for the Summer Quarter Saturn was culminating at Batum. At the Solar Eclipse of July 31, Saturn was setting. The eclipsed Moon of August 14 was in the midheaven. The eclipse of the Sun of August 30, showed Neptune culminating in opposition to Mars on the cusp of the fourth house; the Sun and Moon were in the midheaven separating from the opposition of Mars.

DEAR SIR,—Now that the General Election is over, and the Conservatives have swept the Country, some astrological comment would not be out of place; and this election may be said to be ruled by the New Moon of October 28th.

In Modern Astrology, your political comment on this New Moon was as follows: "Labour will gain headway." In spite of the fact that Labour sustained such a great defeat at the polls, yet it actually did increase its voting numbers; the reason for the defeat being that the Conservatives increased their voting numbers still more.

Taking the Map for the lunation it will be found that the luminaries with Mercury and Saturn are conjoined on the ascendant in Scorpio in trine to Mars, their dispositor; in quintile to Neptune,

sesquiquadrate to Uranus and in semi-square to Venus. The ascendant represents the VOTERS, so the trine of these planets to Mars in the fourth house (opposition of the Government) accounted for the great increase in Conservative votes. Their quintile to Neptune in the M. C. (The Labour Government) increased the Labour vote, but a weak aspect like a quintile could not be compared with the powerful trine of Mars from the fourth. As England is ruled by Aries, Mars naturally denotes the "Britain for the British" party or, in other words, the Conservatives. Both Mars and Neptune are free from serious affliction.

Now Mars is not the only planet in the fourth house. Uranus is there also, and in the past that planet has denoted the Liberal Party and Mr Lloyd George in particular. This planet is afflicted by the bodies rising (the Voters) denoting that they are absolutely "fed up" with liberalism and this accounts for the great diminution of the Liberal vote and relegation of that once great party into obscurity.

The aspects of other planets to the rising luminaries denote minor factors in the election. Their affliction to Jupiter shows that the Voters choice was largely influenced by money matters such as the repeal of the McKenna Duties, and, as Jupiter squares Venus, ruler of the seventh, loans to foreign powers, Jupiter being in the second house.

The affliction of the rising luminaries to Venus showed that the Voters as yet do not want women in Parliament.

One thing remains to be noted and that is the trine of Neptune to Jupiter, this showed the popularity of the German Loan raised under the auspices of the Socialist Government, and it shows that the Bolshevic party in this country are very well provided with funds.

The position of Neptune in this epoch-making lunation should not be lost sight of. Its power shows that Communism is only wounded, but not killed. Everybody therefore having the interest of this country at heart should do their best to fight it.

On Friday, October 3rd, Prof. A. W. Bickerton, A.R.S.M., delivered a lecture entitled "Explosions, Terrestrial and Celestial."

Prof Bickerton spoke of many of his early experiments and researches in connection with explosions of chemical compounds such as gunpowder, dynamite, and guncotton, and explained how he came to apply the principles underlying such explosions in the study of astronomy and particularly with regard to the formation of new stars, or exploding suns as he called them. He came to the conclusion, he

said, that a collision between one-tenth part of a pair of stars would produce a result 10,000 times as effective as a head-on collision, and all his subsequent work had supported his theory that grazing collisions between stars were responsible for the formation of most new stars with their attendant nebulae and debris. The new star, or third body, received practically all the heat generated by the collision, and consequently attained immense brilliance, though it might die out in the course of a few days. The two stars which had collided would become a pair of variables, and from an actual chart of variable stars in a small portion of the heavens, eighteen variables had been found to be close pairs.

The lecture was illustrated by a number of slides showing photographs of stars and nebulae, and also spectra of new stars with peculiar dark lines crossing each band. In connection with some of the slides Prof Bickerton referred to the ways in which the forces of nature are exerted and the way in which they may accumulate and give rise to spectacular displays.

SIGNS OF SHORT ASCENSION. 19, 22, 7, 8, 11. These are of long ascension in the southern hemisphere.

SIGNS OF THE ZODIAC. See ZODIAC.

SIGNS OF VOICE. II, ng, -, first half of 4, and

SINISTER ASPECTS. See ASPECTS.

SIZE, PLANETARY. The Moon, Mars and Saturn are short; Mercury and Jupiter are long; and the Sun and Venus are of medium length.

SLOW OF COURSE. A planet moving slower than its mean motion. In Horary Astrology this is considered a great debility.

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
