

## Zodiacause

### Quarterly Indications

#### General Business Outlook For The SPRING SEASON

Between March 21 and June 21, 1934.

(Written in October, 1933.)



**CAPRICORN**, the twelfth degree is ascending on the eastern horizon at the moment when the Vernal Equinox occurs, March 21st, 2:20 a. m., Washington, D. C., mean local time.

As the Sun makes its ingress into the sign Aries it does so on the cusp of the third house of a chart made for this data. This attracts attention to and develops activity in affairs related to railways, and other transportation, postal service, telegraph, radio, power transmission, news, publishing, reports, agreements, treaties, neighboring countries and protectorates.

As the Sun is conjoined with Mars in this chart and is opposition to Venus and Jupiter of the U. S. horoscope, a great deal of interest and activity may be expected in all these

affairs. Activity in mechanical affairs, industry and transportation is desirable but likely to be attended by an unusual amount of strife, accidents, and trouble for the Government especially as relating to foreign affairs.

The influence of this conjunction of Mars and Sun becomes acute in April, especially about the 6th to 9th when these planets oppose Jupiter. This is an inflammatory combination causing political flareups, both domestic and European, also in other foreign affairs, as well as financial, industrial, social and economic troubles. A period which will require the finest kind of cool-headed statesmanship in every department of life. It usually affects the weather, causing great storms, tornadoes, tidal waves and earthquakes. It increases illness and crime. Many fires of incendiary nature, strikes and riots. In foreign countries it predisposes to declarations of war and chaotic conditions generally.

Critical vibrations are again agitated between April 18th and 26th when the Sun and Mars together conjoin Uranus, stirring up all the forementioned difficulties augmented by Pluto's power. In the U. S. this affects the eastern and western coasts in particular and all the country in general. However, conditions will be much worse in practically all the leading foreign countries.

Despite the critical conditions developed by these malign aspects this country will manifest

considerable progress out of the "depression," for Saturn will be in good aspect to both Jupiter and Uranus. Saturn occupies the "house of money" but as Venus is there also and likewise in good aspect to Jupiter and Uranus it would seem as if even in the midst of extremely unusual and erratic conditions some huge practical plans will be effected to stabilize currency and credit and promote a freer and more equable distribution of money and labor.

Although the principal major planets are in ominous aspects throughout the entire quarter, producing a menacing undertone in world affairs, the general conditions of this country should show improvement in many respects. This quarter has more generally favorable aspects for domestic business improvement than the last quarter.

The good aspect of Saturn with Jupiter indicates the effective use of government funds for useful labor and the improvement of banking conditions. The good aspect of Saturn to Uranus tends to activate business, industry, manufacturing, airplane developments, municipal, public welfare and utility projects.

Unfortunately, Mercury is in the house of money, in opposition to Neptune. This involves financial matters, international debts, defaults, swindles, misuse of funds. Tends to heavy losses at sea and to loss of commerce; trouble in naval affairs and heavy financial losses through labor troubles and illness.

As Saturn is transiting the place of the Moon in the U. S. horoscope it denotes public sorrow through the passing of high officials as well as many who were prominent in manufacturing and theatrical lines. Trouble through farming and labor problems. Much illness of peculiar nature and high mortality.

This Vernal Equinox or Spring Quarter is fraught with much activity, great excitement and many dangers. However many substantial undertakings of great public benefit will be established. Many startling changes will occur; old methods will be discarded and innovations introduced. Activity in mining; many new inventions pertaining to transportation and warfare.—L. G.

**ARIES**, the twelfth degree, is ascending on the eastern horizon at the time of this New Moon, 7:01 a. m., March 15, Washington, D. C.

The conjoined Sun and Moon occupy the twelfth house of a chart of the zodiac made for this data, in the 24th degree of Pisces. The twelfth section of the sky is known to affect interest concerning prisons, prisoners, pardons and paroles; hospitals, asylums, reformatories, charitable institutions and stock yards. It also relates to crime, spies, secret enemies, plots and subtle propaganda. The

New Moon of January 15, 1934, also occurred in the twelfth house, although in a different sign and in different aspects.

In this present instance Mercury and Mars are also in the twelfth space which tends further to focus attention on the matters mentioned. The luminaries have some minor good aspects which tend toward improvements in all such affairs, but as the lights are also in conjunction with Mars public interest will be centered more upon the untoward conditions and events which occur in relation to such matters. It increases the work of surgeons and the police and inclines to labor troubles.

Mars rules the ascending sign and its position just above the cusp influences both twelfth and first houses of the chart. To the first space its influence is generally adverse through the production of discontent, inharmony, strikes, riots, incendiarism and crime. However, as Mars is entering its own sign, Aries, it also inclines to confidence, fearlessness, adventure, enterprise and the promotion of new industrial activity.

Uranus is in the first house of this lunation chart in slightly good aspect with the luminaries and in strong good aspect with Saturn. This usually inclines to interest in progressive movements, reforms, innovations in government procedure, departure from old or orthodox methods, adaptation to new methods with

an adventurous and pioneering spirit. Enthusiasm, confidence, patriotism and new incentives promote and advance general business and industrial activity. Extraordinary inventions and discoveries should appear as well as great achievements in aviation, transportation, radio, and government projects.

The position of Pluto retrograding in the fourth space denotes the presence and activity of insidious plotting and propaganda against the Government. Floods and earthquakes.

The position of Neptune, retrograding in the sixth house, opposed by Mercury is somewhat unfavorable for labor interests as it inclines to undermining activities both within and without its circle. This aspect also is somewhat unfavorable for general public health, indicating intestinal disorders and illness through ptomaine poisoning, impure food and liquids, and incorrect diet. It also inclines to increase drunkenness and drug taking, including considerable trouble concerning control of liquor traffic. The Army and Navy usually suffer disadvantage in some way through sickness or accidents or through discredit, under such an aspect.

Jupiter is retrograde in the seventh section in the sign, Libra, but as it is in favorable angular relation with Venus its influence tends to promote more friendly and amicable relations with other countries. New alliances and

treaties may be made to some advantage but unusual diplomacy, as well as highly efficient statesmanship, is necessary because Jupiter is retrograding towards a conjunction with Saturn in the U. S. horoscope, denoting dissatisfaction, humiliation and loss. In connection with Jupiter's influence attention is called to the fourth paragraph in the preceding chapter of "Zodiacaese."

The period of this lunation, March 15 to April 13, should show considerable business and industrial improvement.

## *Favorable - Unfavorable Days*

### *April 1934*

According to Astrological Indications

(Notice: The Moon's position each day is its place at 4 a. m., Pacific Standard time, which is the same as 5 a. m., Mountain; 6 a. m., Central; 7 a. m., Eastern time. The Moon advances at the rate of approximately one degree in 2 hours. The following indications are of interest to every one regardless of their birth month. See chapter describing Features of the Zodiacal Signs.)

#### Moon in Third Quarter Decreasing.



**SUNDAY, 1st**—Moon enters Scorpio at 5:35 a. m., Pacific Standard time.

The good aspect between Mercury and Jupiter which culminates early this morning has a favorable influence on the mind and is beneficial for philosophy, science, religion or humanitarian and charitable efforts.

Just before midnight, the good aspect between the Moon and Neptune reaches its maximum of influence and all the previous portion

of the day is benefited by these rays. They tend to give interest in gentler and more refined pleasures of life, conducing to sociability and amusements as well as keen appreciation for music. It is a favorable aspect for psychic research and also somewhat favors matters related to liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs and the sea.

**Monday, 2nd**—Moon 12° 49' in Scorpio.

The good aspect between Venus and Uranus which reaches its maximum at 1:28 a. m., followed by the Moon's good aspect to Mercury culminating at 6:43 a. m., together with the Moon's good aspect to Jupiter at 2:48 p. m., form a combination of planetary vibrations which are of favorable nature for personal, artistic, business and professional matters. Good for things of progressive, humanitarian, occult, metaphysical, astrological and cooperative nature, as well as for communications, correspondence and financial affairs. Good for dealings with artists, milliners, dressmakers, beauty specialists, writers, publishers, merchants, lawyers, bankers, inventors, electricians, aviators and those in municipal or federal offices.

The aspects change after 2:48 p. m., growing steadily and decidedly adverse during the balance of the day and evening. They are unfavorable for matters of land, property,

plans, decisions, changes, risky ventures or artistic and pleasurable pursuits.

**Tuesday, 3rd**—Moon enters Sagittarius at 9:37 a. m., Pacific Standard time.

A series of four adverse aspects operate consecutively until 10:24 a. m., making the previous period unfavorable for new business or important transactions, plans, decisions or changes. The aspects suggest attention to health and caution in travel.

Conditions change and improve somewhat after 10:24 a. m., but favor attention only to minor matters and the usual duties. The period after 4:20 p. m. is somewhat favorable for communication, correspondence, study and light recreation.

**Wednesday, 4**—Moon  $10^{\circ} 45'$  in Sagittarius.

A parallel between Jupiter and Mars reaches its culmination at 7:05 a. m., producing vibrations which usually incline to haste, force, impulsiveness, aggressiveness, miscalculation and errors, together with danger of accidents and fires.

The remainder of the day and evening provides aspects whose combined nature is favorable for personal, social, business and professional pursuits. Good for dealings with those in high position; manufacturers, contractors, employers, bankers, merchants, shippers, edu-

cators, doctors and dentists. However, as the Moon is at the same time in adverse aspect to Mercury, use caution in promises, agreements or contracts, and pay attention to the details in all transactions, because these aspects are concerned with the larger things of life and incline to neglect the smaller, though important factors.

**Thursday, 5th**—Moon  $24^{\circ} 50'$  in Sagittarius at 4 a. m.; transits through the sign and enters Capricorn at 0:45 p. m.

Excellent aspects prevail until 11:53 a. m., favoring professional, agricultural, progressive and artistic lines. Deal with those holding high office in business or socially and politically; lawyers, doctors, bankers, agriculturalists, property owners, metaphysicians, artists, beauty specialists, dressmakers, inventors, scientists and educators.

Although no aspects actually reach their culmination during the remainder of the day and evening, this period, however, is influenced by two adverse aspects which reach their maximum shortly after midnight. These aspects are Mercury in adverse aspect to Mars and to Jupiter, which produce vibrations that tend to haste, force, aggressiveness, criticism, misjudgment and errors, as well as loss, trouble and difficulties. Be very careful in promises, agreements, correspondence and travel.

Fourth Lunar Quarter begins on 6th,  
at 4:50 p. m. Decreasing. Dark.

Friday, 6th—Moon  $8^{\circ} 58'$  in Capricorn.

The cautions suggested for yesterday afternoon and evening are applicable until 4 a. m. today, after which, until 9:18 a. m., the aspects are slightly favorable for matters relating to liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs and the sea, but not for matters pertaining to land, property or produce.

This is an inauspicious day for important transactions, plans, decisions, changes or risky ventures of any sort. A series of adverse aspects operate until 8:43 p. m. They are disturbing and aggravating in nature, suggesting much effort and self-control, tact and diplomacy while protective rather than aggressive tactics should be observed both in personal and business affairs. Avoid hazardous occupations and risky ventures of all sorts. Avoid excitement and protect the health; safeguard against fires and accidents.

Saturday, 7th—Moon  $23^{\circ} 06'$  in Capricorn at 4 a. m., Pacific time; transits through the sign and enters Aquarius at 3:43 p. m.

All of the cautions mentioned for yesterday should be observed until after 10:16 a.m. today, as at that time the Moon reaches an adverse aspect with Uranus, while in the early morn-

ing Mars opposes Jupiter. These make the preceding period inauspicious for sudden changes in plans or radical departures from the usual procedures. The vibrations incline to contention, strife, misjudgment, errors and radical or rebellious tendencies.

Conditions change and improve somewhat after 10:16 a. m., due principally to the Moon's slightly good aspect to Venus and a parallel between Mercury and Jupiter which reaches its culmination at midnight. These favor the usual Saturday afternoon and evening pursuits especially as pertains to hygiene, domestic comfort and light recreation.

**Sunday, 8th**—Moon  $7^{\circ} 13'$  in Aquarius.

The Sun afflicts Jupiter and Mars until 2:03 p. m., Pacific time, making the preceding period one in which discord and strife can easily arise. These vibrations are stimulating and exciting and incline to feverishness, therefore avoid excitement, be cautious in diet, practice poise, self-control, tact and diplomacy. Safeguard against fires and accidents.

Conditions gradually change and improve after 2:03 p. m., the vibrations favoring religious, educational and social matters as well as pleasure, recreation, sport and sociability.

**Monday, 9th**—Moon  $21^{\circ} 18'$  in Aquarius at 4 a. m.; transits through the sign and enters Pisces at 6:52 p. m.

The Moon's conjunction with Saturn is the principal aspect operating until 11:01 a. m., which is considered inauspicious for new undertakings and those things which require concentration for their success. However, for laborious matters, tedious tasks and things of unpleasant nature, this aspect seems to have affinity. It usually inclines to impatience, nervousness or anxiety and tends to delays, loss or disappointment.

Conditions change slowly after 11:01 a. m. and gradually become better and although not auspicious for new and important enterprises, the vibrations favor things of progressive, humanitarian, occult, fraternal or metaphysical nature. They incline to interest in new, curious, out-of-the-ordinary or adventurous nature as well as to sociability and pleasure.

**Tuesday, 10th**—Moon 5° 19' in Pisces.

The combined influence of the numerous aspects which operate until 3:26 p. m. is adverse for the commencement of new enterprises and for important plans, changes, decisions, removals or risky ventures. The vibrations generated are of stimulating nature and they incline to aggressive activity. Special caution should be observed regarding liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs, anæsthetics and the sea. If poise, discrimination and moderation are observed the energies may be turned to good

account by directing them into practical and necessary activities.

Conditions change and improve slightly after 3:26 p. m., favoring communications, correspondence, study, sociability and light recreation.

**Wednesday, 11th**—Moon 19° 15' in Pisces at 4 a. m., Pacific time; transits through the sign and enters Aries at 10:40 p. m.

The combined influence of the aspects which operate today is beneficial for mental and physical activity. Favorable for literary pursuits, correspondence, study, communications and general business contacts. Good also for matters relating to land, property, mines, and produce. Favorable for progressive, metaphysical, Uranian, fraternal and humanitarian affairs. The evening is very good for social matters, artistic affairs, amusements and psychic research.

**Thursday, 12th**—Moon 3° 03' in Aries.

Until 9 a. m., beneficent vibrations are in operation which especially favor personal and domestic affairs, comforts, refinements, education, health and the professional interests.

The aspects which operate from approximately 9 a. m. to 9 p. m., are stimulating and energizing, inclining to aggressive physical activity but attended with excessive haste,

force or aggressiveness. With moderation and discrimination these tendencies may be turned to good account in education or necessary tasks in business, mechanical or industrial affairs, but at all times moderation and poise should be observed.

The aspects change in nature considerably after 9 p. m., and suggest caution in dealings with others and also in travel. These vibrations incline to excess, extremes, extravagance or misjudgment.

**First Lunar Quarter begins on 13th, at 3:58 p.m., P.S.T. New Moon. Beginning to increase.**

**Friday, 13th**—Moon  $16^{\circ} 39'$  in Aries.

The man on the street quoted, says that Friday, the 13th, is unlucky and his dogmatism today will seem to have a semblance of truth due to the fact that in the early morning the Moon opposes Jupiter and when in conjunction with the Sun it is also conjunction with Mars and Uranus. This combination is certainly inauspicious in that it produces vibrations which are disturbing, disruptive and exciting. They tend to feverishness, radical, hasty, spasmodic and impulsive action. An unfavorable day for commencing new enterprises or for making plans, decisions, changes or risky ventures. This is a day to exercise moderation,

discrimination, restraint and conservation. Be poised, diplomatic, tactful, deliberate and calm in order to avoid nervousness, anxiety, impatience, anger or controversies and accidents.

**Saturday, 14th**—Moon enters Taurus at 3:56 a. m.

At approximately 6:30 a. m., the Sun reaches its partile conjunction with Mars which is highly stimulating and energizing, and is suggestive of the need for caution and moderation in all activities.

From 6:30 a. m. until approximately 10 p. m., conditions change and improve considerably due to the Moon's good aspects to Venus and Neptune. These are much more pacific vibrations, being soothing and pleasant in nature. They favor things of domestic, artistic and pleasurable nature as well as matters related to liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs and the sea. Music, entertainment, sociability and light recreation are favored by these two aspects.

**Sunday, 15th**—Moon 13° 08' in Taurus.

Several minor aspects operate until approximately 1:18 p. m. They incline to excessive mental and physical activity, nervousness, impatience or irritability and criticism. They suggest moderation in diet and caution in all matters relating to liquids, chemicals, oils,

drugs or the sea. Be careful in promises, agreements or correspondence as there may be confusion, misunderstanding or deception.

Conditions change and improve slightly after 1:18 p. m., but are not auspicious for important plans, decisions or changes although they somewhat favor the usual Sunday interests.

**Monday, 16th**—Moon 25° 57' in Taurus at 4 a. m., Pacific time; transits through the sign and enters Gemini at 11:41 a. m.

An opposition of Venus to Neptune reaches its maximum of influence at 1:30 p. m., suggesting caution in all matters relating to art, beauty, adornment, liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs, anæsthetics and the sea. After 4 a. m., the planet Saturn is well aspected which develops rays favorable for interests relating to land, property, mines, produce and also matters of standard, substantial, practical and lasting nature.

Conditions improve considerably after 1:30 p. m., favoring general business activity, correspondence, communications, literary matters, industrial affairs and property interests. But conditions are still unfavorable for the Venus and Neptune matters mentioned above.

**Tuesday, 17th**—Moon 8° 28' in Gemini.

The majority of aspects operating until 11:36 a. m., are of slightly adverse nature, continu-

ing the Neptune-Venus vibrations mentioned yesterday with the addition of slightly adverse vibrations from Mars, Sun and Uranus. This combination makes the preceding period inauspicious for new or important undertakings, plans, decisions, changes or risky ventures. These vibrations are stimulating, activating and incline to the abnormal, therefore, moderation and restraint are required for practical results.

The aspects which operate throughout the remainder of the day and evening are stimulating and exhilarating. They incline to over-enthusiasm, excess, extremes, exaggeration, impulsiveness and radical or immoderate tendencies; miscalculations, misjudgment and excessive expenditures. Moderation should be observed in diet and discretion with social contacts.

**Wednesday, 18th**—Moon 20° 44' in Gemini at 4 a. m., Pacific time; transits through the sign and enters Cancer at 10:26 p. m.

Mars reaches its maximum influence of parallel with Uranus at 11:39 a. m. and its conjunction with Uranus at 9:47 p. m. In the interim several favorable aspects operate. The adverse vibrations of Uranus ordinarily assume control, that is, human reactions if not properly directed, lead to disruptive conditions, unexpected difficulties and trouble with others.

However, as a number of favorable aspects also operate today, these unusual rays may be utilized for the execution of considerable useful, necessary work and business, especially along mechanical, industrial or agricultural lines. To transcend the disruptive tendencies and take advantage of the beneficent vibrations, it is necessary to maintain an ethical attitude, a feeling of cooperation, a desire to render service of genuine value by working towards your highest ideals. After 7:15 p. m., the danger of disruptions and accidents is increased.

**Thursday, 19th**—Moon 2° 46' in Cancer.

Although an adverse aspect between Venus and Uranus reaches its maximum of influence at 3:32 a. m., the influence is continued by the Moon forming an adverse aspect to Mercury which reaches its maximum of influence at 0:48 p. m., Pacific time. Therefore, this portion of the day is very inauspicious for new, important business transactions or risky ventures of any kind. The tendency may be to deviate from the normal procedures into radical or unconventional methods and they are likely to prove unavailing or disappointing. Be very cautious in promises, agreements, contracts, correspondence and communications.

Conditions improve somewhat between 0:48 p. m. and 6:16 p. m., but only for usual activ-

ities, although the vibrations slightly favor matters related to liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs and the sea.

While two minor adverse aspects operate after 6:16 p. m., the Moon is drawing up to a very good aspect to Venus, culminating after midnight. The evening is therefore favorable only for light recreation and amusement.

Be conservative in all matters, especially legal and financial; also in promises, agreements, contracts, and assume no heavy obligation. Avoid risky financial ventures, loans, bonds, guarantees, etc.

Although no other aspects actually reach their culmination today, the remainder of the day and evening will be tintured with the vibration of the oncoming adverse aspect between Mercury and Neptune tomorrow morning. These suggest caution in communication, correspondence and business transactions as there is likely to be misunderstanding, confusion or deception. Be very cautious also concerning liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs, anaesthetics and the sea.

Second Lunar Quarter begins on 21st, at 1:22 p. m. Increasing in light and power.

Saturday, 21st—Moon enters Leo at 11:10 a. m.

As several adverse aspects culminate before the time of the Moon's change at 1:22 p. m., the preceding period is inauspicious for new undertakings, important transactions, plans, decisions or changes. These aspects usually incline to haste, force, aggressiveness, contention, annoyance and dissatisfaction. As these vibrations are disruptive, it is necessary to retrench, be conservative and make a special effort to maintain poise and good humor. Attend only to minor matters of ordinary nature.

After 1:22 p. m., conditions change and appear to be better, but still are not auspicious for new or important undertakings. They suggest the use of considerable tact and diplomacy in all dealings with others as well as caution in promises, agreements, correspondence or communications. Pay attention to the health.

Sunday, 22nd—Moon 8° 18' in Leo.

From 4:10 a. m. until 8:30 p. m. the Moon's good aspects to Mercury and Jupiter provide favorable vibrations which incline to mental and spiritual interests. Good for educational, religious, philanthropic, scientific and humani-

tarian interests. Favorable for study, correspondence, communications, literary efforts, charitable affairs and visiting the sick. Favorable for short journeys and neighborly intercourse.

The vibrations change after 8:30 p. m., and become less beneficent, suggesting moderation in all matters and extra care in travel.

**Monday, 23rd**—Moon 20° 14' in Leo at 4 a. m., Pacific time; transits through the sign and enters Virgo at 11:20 p. m.

The morning hours are under a rather painful lunar aspect of the Moon parallel to Saturn which is accentuated by the Moon's opposition to Saturn reaching its culmination at 4:30 p. m., while it is also forming a parallel to Mars, reaching it at exactly 5:56 p. m. These vibrations are usually unfortunate for the beginning of new business and transaction of important matters, especially things which require quick consummation for their success. Saturn usually causes delay, disappointment and loss. Saturnine afflictions are considered especially adverse for matters relating to land, property, mines and produce, and in this case mechanical affairs should also be included.

While the Moon is forming those adverse aspects to Saturn and Mars, it is also forming a good aspect to Uranus, reaching it at 6:21 p. m., which tends to favor matters of progres-

The aspects which operate throughout the day and evening up to 11 p. m. are of beneficent nature. They tend to favor matters relating to liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs, anæsthetics and the sea, as well as literary efforts, communications, correspondence and general business activities. Favorable also for matters of spiritual and psychic interests and for art, beauty, adornment, health. Good for dealings with those of talent and refinement, artists, musicians and ministers. Also those engaged in professional pursuits, bankers, merchants and lawyers. Good for philanthropic and charitable efforts, visiting the sick or helping worthy projects.

With regard to financial activities and pleasures, a word of caution is required in that these aspects sometimes incline to excess and extravagance, so although the higher impulses

should be expressed, moderation should also be observed.

**Wednesday, 25th**—Moon  $14^{\circ} 47'$  in Virgo.

The Moon's opposition to Venus reaching its culmination at 11:47 a. m. and Mercury's parallel with Jupiter reaching its culmination at 9:44 p. m., develop vibrations which incline to carelessness and disregard for necessary precautions. They usually incline to extravagance, excess, extremes, exaggeration, overproduction, over-estimation and waste. Therefore, a great deal of moderation and discrimination should be employed in all transactions, especially where financial obligations are concerned, as well as in matters of art, sociability and correspondence. These aspects incline to sociability, gayety and amusements. They also increase gambling tendencies, riotous living, drinking, etc.

**Thursday, 26th**—Moon enters Libra at 8:32 a. m.

Several favorable aspects operate until approximately 6:00 p. m. These vibrations are considered beneficial for general business activity, commercial and financial affairs, as well as matters relating to literature and art. Favorable for literary efforts, correspondence, communications, consultations, conferences, plans, decisions and changes. Good for matters of art, beauty, adornment, sociability,

domestic comfort and improvements. Deal with those engaged in professional lines, especially art, literature and healing.

Conditions change gradually after 6 p. m. and are inauspicious due to the Sun's parallel with Saturn reaching its culmination after midnight, which suggests especial attention to the health.

**Friday, 27th**—Moon  $10^{\circ} 40'$  in Libra.

Adverse aspects to Saturn predominate until 6 a. m., which are generally inauspicious, but between 6 a. m. and 1:26 p. m., the influence of the Moon's conjunction with Jupiter grows in power and makes this period the best portion of the day for attention to important matters. Favorable for dealing with those engaged in professional pursuits, lawyers, doctors, bankers, merchants, metaphysicians and those engaged in public welfare, or holding municipal offices. Good for matters of progressive, occult, humanitarian, fraternal, inventive or metaphysical nature. As the Moon is applying to an opposition of Mercury reaching the culmination of its influence at 11:21 p. m., special attention should be given to the details of business transactions, especially promises, agreements, contracts, or other obligations.

The benign vibrations of the Moon's conjunction with Jupiter diminish in power after 1:26 p. m., and those of the Moon's opposition

to Mercury increase, inclining to nervousness and danger in travel.

**Saturday, 28th**—Moon  $24^{\circ} 11'$  in Libra at 4 a. m., Pacific time; transits through the sign and enters Scorpio at 2:07 p. m.

The Moon's good aspect with Saturn until 8:36 a. m., favors the preceding period for matters of laborious, commonplace or the usual nature. Between 8:36 and 11:32 a. m., a good and an adverse aspect operate with Uranus. One influence favors matters of refining, elevating, constructive and useful nature while the other suggests caution to avoid sudden changes, plans and decisions.

The balance of the day and evening is influenced by the Moon's opposition to Mars which inclines to haste, force, aggressiveness and conflicts. Danger through discord and accidents.

**Third Lunar Quarter begins on 29th,**  
at 4:45 a.m. Full Moon. Beginning to decrease.

**Sunday, 29th**—Moon  $8^{\circ} 03'$  in Scorpio.

After the Moon's opposition to the Sun at 4:45 a. m., the remaining aspects which operate throughout the day and evening are favorable for general Sunday interests, especially religious and educational affairs, as well as sociability and amusements. The period after

4:30 is especially good for neighborly and social contacts, visiting the sick and other charitable or humanitarian efforts as well as for entertainment. Good for psychic research, philosophical, religious and educational matters as well as meditation, consultations and conferences for making plans and decisions.

**Monday, 30th**—Moon  $22^{\circ} 13'$  in Scorpio at 4 a. m., Pacific time; transits through the sign and enters Sagittarius at 5:02 p. m.

In the early morning and until 10:24 a. m., approximately, the vibrations are fairly good for matters relating to domestic affairs, comforts, refinements, personal interests and matters relating to liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs and the sea.

From 10:24 a. m. until approximately noon the Moon is in adverse aspect to Saturn, after which it goes to a slightly adverse aspect with Jupiter, reaching it at approximately 6 p. m. These two aspects combine to make this period inauspicious for new or important transactions, risky ventures or financial obligations, especially affecting all matters which require quick consummation for their success.

After 6:02 p. m., the vibrations change and their nature is more favorable, especially for mental occupation, literary efforts, study, correspondence, meditation.

## INSTRUCTIONS

### For Using Favorable and Unfavorable Days

The daily influences described in foregoing pages are likely to affect every one to some extent. They will affect some people more than others according to how the vibrations of the day do or do not coincide with the indications and operations in the individual horoscope.

It is not intended that the things given in the foregoing list of favorable and unfavorable days should be the only ones attended to, but rather that they may be incorporated into the general daily affairs. However, from an astrological standpoint it is well to avoid adverse days and try to choose those which are favorable, in keeping with the old astrological axiom, "The better the day the better the deed."

By knowing the dates of favorable and unfavorable influences it gives us the opportunity to **think before it is time to act** and to set a day in advance for any affair which will be most in keeping with the good results desired, according to astrology.

The mathematical principles upon which astrology is based are scientific, but the delineations deduced therefrom are not always exact, due to insufficient knowledge concerning the planets and elements of the zodiacal signs, of which there is yet much to be discovered.

The principal aspects of the planets are therefore interpreted here only for the purpose of aiding investigation, study and comparison of events or conditions as they transpire, in the hope that by such careful observation students will be enabled to work more in harmony with the laws of nature for better results and greater progress.

Note: The planetary aspects given in the foregoing chapter are delineated from day to day regardless of weather indications which involve the branch of astrology known as Astro-meteorology, concerning which see chapter headed "Brief Weather Forecast."

### Planetary Positions and Principal Aspects

In a chapter preceding this page under heading of "Favorable and Unfavorable Days for April" a Daily Delineation has been given of the combined influence and effect of the planetary aspects. For the benefit of students who wish to refer to, or use, planetary aspects for horoscopal purposes, nine pages are devoted to them in the latter part of this issue under head of "Planetary Time Tables" which show the aspects and their nature in sequence.

Three pages entitled "Ephemeris in Brief" are also given for the benefit of those who have occasion to refer to the daily position of planets by sign and degree. In those tables it will be seen that—

**Mercury** transits Pisces from the 13th degree to the end of the sign until April 15th when it enters Aries, reaching the 25th degree of that sign by end of the month.

**Venus** transits the last five degrees of the sign Aquarius until April 6th when it enters Pisces, reaching the 23rd degree of that sign by end of the month.

**Sun** transits Aries from the 11th degree to end of the sign until April 20th when it enters Taurus at 11 a. m., Pacific Standard time, transiting to the 9th degree of that sign by end of the month.

**Mars** transits Aries from the 13th degree to end of the sign until April 22nd when it enters Taurus, reaching the 5th degree of Taurus by end of the month.

**Jupiter** retrogrades in Libra between the 19th and 15th degrees during the month of April.

**Saturn** transits the 24th, 25th and 26th degrees of Aquarius during April.

**Uranus** transits the 26th, 27th and 28th degrees of Aries during April.

**Neptune** retrogrades in Virgo in the 10th and 9th degrees during April.

**Pluto** transits Cancer from 22:30 to 22:37 during April.

**Moon's North Node** is receding in Aquarius from 16:47 to 15:15 during the month of April. **The Moon's South Node** is always at the opposite point of the zodiac.

Declination of the Moon changes from south to north on April 11th; and from north to south on April 26th.

Following the "Planetary Time Tables" is a page showing the aspects of Pluto. This is for the benefit of students who wish to trace the effects of Pluto's aspects.

The **Symbols** of Planets, Signs and Aspects will be found on a page headed by that title. It is advisable to become familiar with these in order to derive more benefit from the doctrine of astrology.



### HOW TO MAKE TIME CHANGES

Note: The time used in the "Bulletina" is Pacific Standard time, unless otherwise stated.

Rocky Mountain Standard time is one hour in advance or later than Pacific time.

Central Standard time is 2 hours in advance.

Eastern Standard time is 3 hours advanced.

When it is noon, Pacific time, it is 1 P.M. Mountain time; 2 P.M. Central time; 3 P.M. Eastern time.

People living in Mountain, Central or Eastern time zones should add 1, 2, or 3 hours, respectively, to the times given in the "Bulletina."

When "Daylight Saving" time is used, add 1 more hour to the time given.

The Moon's position given on each day is its place at 4 a. m., Pacific time, which is the same as 5 a. m., Mountain; 6 a. m., Central; 7 a. m., Eastern time.


## *Astrocause*

**LIBRA**, the twenty-seventh degree is rising on the eastern horizon at moment of New Moon, April 13, 6:50 p. m., Washington, D. C. The pacific

Venus rules Libra and as less than three degrees of that sign is on the ascendant its influence is waning while the influence of the next sign, Scorpio, grows in power, bringing into public expression its positive, aggressive, militant vibrations.

About five days prior to this New Moon the Sun is in opposition to Jupiter while at the same time the Sun is approaching conjunction with Mars and Uranus. Therefore in the period of about one week before and after the date of New Moon (April 13th) highly inflammatory vibrations are active.

The influence of this combination of planetary activity is greatly over-energizing and stimulating. Physically it inclines to feverishness, eye trouble, headache, brainstorm, heart failure. It tends to hasty, rash, impulsive, violent outbursts. It produces abnormal tendencies, the sudden release of powers, spasmodic, erratic, irrational and radical.

Politically these vibrations lead to trouble between nations. Diplomatic relations are overthrown, pacts are violated, boundaries are destroyed, territorial rights are infringed, commercial competition runs wild; crime, violence and general disorder reign. These rays are the sparks which touch off the powder magazines of the world. Only those countries whose statesmen exercise the finest kind of diplomacy and restraint can avert wars.

The foregoing has reference to the world in general. A chart made for the United States for the time of New Moon shows the luminaries in the twenty-third degree of Aries conjoining Mars and Uranus on the seventh cusp, denoting disagreements and trouble with foreign powers. This is a critical influence which develops sudden danger of war, and to enactments which eventually lead to warfare.

Fortunately, these four planetary bodies are all in good aspect to Saturn which acts as a brake and a deterrent to hold the combustible elements in check. It is devoutly to be hoped that our statesmen will heed and act upon the

Saturnine vibrations rather than to those of Mars and keep peace in our own land regardless of conflicts abroad. But with Jupiter retrograding over U. S. Saturn, and Saturn transiting U. S. Moon, there are plenty of conditions through which grief can manifest.

If our leaders in politics, business and religion would combine for concerted action during the powerful stimulus of the vibrations set up at the New Moon, they could utilize the active forces for effective efforts and results in burning out the dross, removing the debris and cleaning the way for a new order of things which would reflect man's humanity to man, establish a new deal for all the people and bring to manifestation in public life many of the principles propounded by Jesus of Nazareth who came at the dawning of the previous New Age. Here is a golden opportunity.

The position of Saturn in the fourth house of this chart, well aspected, denotes substantial efforts to establish well ordered development of land; new cooperative colonies and farming communities, the watering and fertilizing of new areas. Mining and building of habitations should also increase.

Venus and Mercury are both in the fifth space; Venus opposes Neptune, while Mercury afflicts Venus and Jupiter in the U. S. chart. Generally, such a combination denotes market activities of a peculiar nature. Interest in schools will increase but will not meet the

hearty support that public education should at this time when it has been neglected for so long a period. Teachers' salaries ought to be paid and thousands of new schools built.

Neptune in the eleventh space, retrograde and afflicted, denotes considerable scheming, plotting, conniving and political propaganda in parliamentary circles instead of honest efforts on behalf of the welfare of the populace. It usually indicates unsavory revelations and scandals among government representatives.

Jupiter is in the twelfth space of the sky, retrograde, where it develops some weak aid in prison reforms, criminal prosecution, suppression of crime and improved legal practice.

On the whole, this lunation is fraught with excitement and activity but, withal, actual progress gained through substantial developments relating to land improvement, building and mining. Industrial affairs may be hampered by strikes, riots and labor problems, but general business should show fair advances.

The aspects operating throughout the remainder of the day and evening incline to physical activity with tendency towards haste, force, impulse, aggressiveness, indiscretion, excess, misjudgment or extravagance. ### **How to Use the Daily Indications Effectively**

For information regarding the use of the preceding chapter of Daily Indications see "Instructions" on page 34.

Students will find that their efforts to work in harmony with the Daily Indications become more fruitful if they occasionally read the first chapter in each issue entitled, "Zodiacause." It presents ideas of the influence of the Solar swing through the signs constituting that season. The Sun's influence establishes the general trend of conditions and events for that quarter of the year.

Each month the Moon meets the Sun in conjunction which constitutes the New Moon. The planetary indices at that moment provide information of the particular conditions and events which will transpire in that one third portion of the season. When you come to the date in the Daily Indications which says, "New

Moon," turn at once to the chapter of "Astrocause" relating to it and read the indices for that particular month.

By thus becoming familiar with the quarterly and monthly trends you naturally enhance your ability to utilize the information in the Daily Indications more productively along the lines of your particular efforts and aspirations.

### Planetary Positions and Principal Aspects

In a chapter preceding this page under heading of "Favorable and Unfavorable Days for May" a Daily Delineation has been given of the combined influence and effect of the

planetary aspects. For the benefit of students who wish to refer to, or use, planetary aspects for horoscopal purposes, nine pages are devoted to them in the latter part of this issue under head of "Planetary Time Tables" which show the aspects and their nature in sequence.

Three pages entitled "Ephemeris in Brief" are also given for the benefit of those who have occasion to refer to the daily position of planets by sign and degree. In those tables it will be seen that—

**Mercury** transits the last two degrees of Aries until May 2nd, when it enters Taurus, transiting through that sign by May 16th, when it enters Gemini, transiting to the 28th degree of that sign by end of the month.

**Venus** transits Pisces 24th to 30th degrees until May 6th, when it enters Aries, transiting to the 27th degree of that sign by end of the month.

**Sun** transits Taurus from 10 degrees to the end of the sign until May 21st, when it enters Gemini at 10:35 a. m., Pacific time, reaching the 9th degree of that sign by end of the month.

**Mars** transits Taurus from 6 degrees to the 28th degree during the month of May.

**Jupiter** is retrograding in Libra from the 15th to the 13th degree during May.

**Saturn** is transiting in the 27th and 28th degrees of Aquarius during May.

**Uranus** is transiting Aries, the 28th and 29th degree during May.

**Neptune** is transiting Virgo, retrograde in the 9th degree until May 21st when it becomes direct in motion and remains so during the remainder of May.

**Pluto** is transiting Cancer from 22:37 to 23:07 during the month of May.

**Moon's North Node** is receding from Aquarius 15:12 to 13:36 during May. **South Node** is always at the opposite point in the Zodiac.

Moon changes declination from South to North on May 9th. It changes from North to South declination on May 23rd.

Following the "Planetary Time Tables" is a page showing the aspects of Pluto. This is for the benefit of students who wish to trace the effects of Pluto's aspects.

The **Symbols** of Planets, Signs and Aspects will be found on a page headed by that title. It is advisable to become familiar with these in order to derive more benefit from the doctrine of astrology.

**CANCER**, one degree thirty minutes is on the eastern horizon at moment of the New Moon, May 13th, Washington, D. C., at 7:22 a. m. The luminaries are in the twenty-second degree of Taurus, at the cusp of twelfth house in a chart of the heavens made for this data.

As the twelfth section has influence especially concerning jails, prisons, reformatories, asylums, charitable institutions and hospitals, this lunation brings to light many undesirable conditions relating to their operation. Public interest will also be drawn to the activities of criminals, spies and secret foes.

As the Sun and Moon are conjoined with Mercury in affliction to Saturn, it denotes considerable crime and illness, severe earthquakes and tornadoes. Trouble and discredit for the managers of institutions, scandal and arrest of officials in connection with graft in public works and for violation of codes. Our financial systems will be secretly and strongly assailed by foreign powers, together with considerable conniving to injure our shipping and commercial interests.

The indications of the luminaries are not entirely adverse because they form some good aspects to the U. S. horoscope, although adversely aspecting its Moon. They tend to bring reforms in institutions, the capture of bandits, forgers and grafters; the revelation of foreign plots and some striking financial gains.

Pluto is in the "house of money" in this chart where it is well aspected by the luminaries, Mars and Mercury. This indicates peculiar or unusual financial procedures but productive of financial activity and distribution which will be helpful to labor, farming, mining and incidentally to business.

Uranus in the eleventh house produces unexpected and extraordinary developments in legislative affairs, rebellion among members and trouble over distribution of finances.

New inventions, discoveries, researches, agreements, treaties and new deals of very helpful nature are also promised. The approaching good aspect of Uranus to Venus and Jupiter of the U. It is good also for general business and commercial activity, but as the Moon is in slightly adverse aspect to Venus until 1 p. m., moderation should be employed to avoid extremes, excess, extravagance or assumption of heavy obligations.

These vibrations favor humanitarian, progressive, fraternal, metaphysical interests; also research, investigation and invention. It is usually a good aspect in which to devise new ways and means, or improved plans and simplified methods. It also favors social, community and economic welfare.

After 2:38 p. m. the influence of the Moon's opposition to the Sun becomes effective and prominent during the remainder of the day and evening. It disfavors important transactions and dealings with those holding important or high positions. Not good for asking favors or co-operation. Be moderate and conservative, tactful and diplomatic in dealings with others.

**Wednesday, 27th**—Moon 9° 11' in Capricorn.

The Moon is in slightly adverse aspect to Saturn until approximately 10 a. m. and at the same time forming an adverse aspect to Jupiter until 11:11 a. m. These make the preceding period inauspicious for important undertakings, new business, plans, decisions, changes or risky ventures. Be very cautious in assuming liabilities and in all financial transactions.

June, 1934

Conditions change and improve slightly after 11:11 a. m. due mainly to the slightly good aspect operating between Mercury and Mars which favors general aggressive business activity, correspondence, communications and literary efforts, but careful attention should be given to details. The evening favors light recreation, drawing, designing, light mechanical or mental work, reading, study and lectures.

**Thursday, 28th**—Moon enters Aquarius at 1:02 p. m.

Between 3:30 a. m. and 2 p. m. the Moon is in slightly good aspect to Saturn and also in good aspect to Venus. These vibrations are somewhat favorable for the usual or commonplace duties and especially those things which are of refining, comforting or harmonizing nature. But the period is not auspicious for important or new undertakings due to the fact that several adverse aspects are developing at the same time whose influences extend until approximately 6:43 p. m. During this time the Moon is in adverse aspect to Uranus while the Sun is parallel Mars. These bring up forceful tendencies with inclination towards haste, abruptness or radical attitudes which should be moderated, subdued and transposed so as to avoid difficulty and utilize the energy for practical purposes.

June, 1934

After 6:43 p. m. conditions change and improve considerably favoring entertainment, light recreation, educational interests, correspondence or study.

**Friday, 29th**—Moon 9° 21' in Aquarius.

The Moon is in good aspect to Jupiter until 11:13 a. m. which favors general business activities and professional pursuits. Good for dealings with bankers, merchants, shippers, educators, doctors, lawyers and publishers. The next good major aspect culminates at 8:07 p. m., making this period favorable for aggressive business activities especially along mechanical or industrial lines. The vibrations are also good for correspondence, communication, literary efforts, study, amusement, sociability and sports.

Conditions change considerably after 8:07 p. m. becoming Saturnine in nature and inauspicious for important plans, decisions, changes or risky ventures. Pay attention to the health.

**Saturday, 30**—Moon enters Pisces at 1:28 p.

The influence of the Moon's conjunction with Saturn grows in strength until 10 a. m., Pacific time, making the preceding period very inauspicious for new or important undertakings, plans, decisions, changes or risky ventures. Attend only to ordinary and minor matters and give attention to health.

June, 1934

After 10 a. m. the influence of the Moon's good aspect to Uranus grows until 3:08 p. m., making this period favorable for progressive, humanitarian, fraternal and metaphysical interests. Good for research, investigation and matters of public welfare.

From 3:08 to 7 p. m. the influence of the Moon's adverse aspect to Venus becomes strong which is somewhat unfavorable for matters of art, music, adornment, beauty or sociability. However, this is not a malign aspect but it inclines to excess and to unconventionality. Conditions change and improve somewhat after 7 p. m. due to an oncoming aspect of the Moon to the Sun which makes the remainder of the evening favorable for light recreation and hygiene.

### Planetary Positions and Principal Aspects

In a chapter preceding this page under heading of "Favorable and Unfavorable Days for June" a Daily Delineation has been given of the combined influence and effect of the planetary aspects. For the benefit of students who wish to refer to, or use, planetary aspects for horoscopal purposes, nine pages are devoted to them in the latter part of this issue under head of "Planetary Time Tables" which show the aspects and their nature in sequence.

Three pages entitled "Ephemeris in Brief" are also given for the benefit of those who have

occasion to refer to the daily position of planets by sign and degree. In those tables it will be seen that—

**Mercury** is transiting Cancer from the 1st to the 24th degrees until June 28th when it becomes retrograde and continues so until July 14th. Note its daily movements in the Ephemeris in Brief.

**Venus** enters Taurus on June 2nd, transits entirely through the sign by June 28th when it enters Gemini, reaching the 2nd degree of that sign by end of the month.

**Sun** is transiting Gemini from the 10th degree to the end of the sign until June 21st when it enters Cancer at 6:48 p. m., reaching the 8th degree of that sign by end of the month.

**Mars** enters Gemini on June 2nd, transiting to the 19th degree by end of the month.

**Jupiter** is retrograding in the 13th degree of Libra until June 11th, when it becomes direct but because slow in motion it is apparently still in the 13th degree at the end of the month.

**Saturn** is transiting Aquarius, the 28th degree until June 9th when it becomes retrograde, reaching the 27th degree by end of the month.

**Uranus**, after a transit of practically seven years in the sign Aries, enters Taurus on June

6th and by end of the month reaches 0:53 of that sign.

**Neptune** is transiting the 9th and 10th degrees of Virgo during the month of June.

**Pluto** is transiting the 23rd degree of Cancer during June.

**Moon's North Node** is receding in Aquarius from 13:33 to 12:01 during June. The **South Node** is always in opposite degrees of the Zodiac.

The Moon changes from south to north declination on June 5th, then changes from north to south on June 19th.

Following the "Planetary Time Tables" is a page showing the aspects of Pluto. This is for the benefit of students who wish to trace the effects of Pluto's aspects.

The **Symbols** of Planets, Signs and Aspects will be found on a page headed by that title. It is advisable to become familiar with these in order to derive more benefit from the doctrine of astrology.

## *Fulfilled Predictions*

**T**HIS BEING the Vernal Ingress number it may be well again to examine predictions of the past year in general and perhaps take a glance into the future as illuminated by them. In the writer's estimation one factor of existing conditions is of much favorable significance. During the first ten days of November, 1933, Mars transited over the progressed Sun in the United States horoscope, opposition of the radix Mars and square Neptune. The disturbances which quite naturally arose during such a transit were however of a considerably milder nature than it would seem to warrant. Athens refused to extradite the financier, Insull ( $\delta$  ruler 2nd in 9th); also the Repeal Amendment was ratified (2nd and 9th) by the necessary majority of states, with the Carolinas registering the first negative choice amid some local bloodshed and violence. In Iowa the Farmers' strike nearly precipitated national guard action as well. As the Sun's opposition to Mars is several degrees short of completion yet, the foregoing occurrences mitigate the appearance of a somewhat threatening future. (See Inauguration chart published on page 131 of "Bulletina" for July-Aug.-Sept., 1933.)

The square between Uranus and Pluto has dissolved, and although the former planet receives an opposition of Jupiter more or less continuously during 1934, adversely affecting the interests of astrologers, they will probably prefer this affliction to that of Pluto.

The concluding paragraph of the Vernal Ingress discussion (page 5, April 1933, written October 1932) stated, "**Mars, Neptune and Jupiter, all retrograde and affecting Congress, should agitate the liquor question and bring action toward modification,**" which actually happened. Uranus was "**in the sixth house**" producing "**difficult conditions among the working classes and trouble for the Navy.**" There were incessant strikes, lock-outs, etc., from coast to coast in connection with the N. R. A. legislation, also the navy lost the air-ship, Akron, with her expert technical crew and the cruiser, Chicago, was severely damaged with accompanying loss of life. In the United States horoscope, here referred to, Neptune rules the sixth house (navy and labor), so in these matters, as well, the experiences of the transiting Mars give hopeful expectation.

On one point astrologers, whether in favor of retention of the Eighteenth Amendment or its repeal, will at any rate agree: The GREAT LAW OF COMPENSATION holds good in reference to it as it does to everything else. The wishes of the citizens of this country are at last definitely registered and they will now act as they vote, which will tend to eliminate the disorder of the Sun's adverse aspect to Mars and Neptune in the national chart, reducing racketeering and the bootleg industry. The horary figure for the Eighteenth Amendment becoming effective (O H January 16th, 1920) is worth close study as illustrating the fulfillment of correct astrological predictions: M. C.  $21^{\circ} \overline{\text{♄}}$ , Asc.  $18^{\circ} \overline{\text{♁}}$ ,  $\odot$   $25^{\circ} \overline{\text{♃}}$ ,  $\text{♃}$   $11^{\circ} \text{♋} 21'$ ,  $\text{♄}$   $13^{\circ} \overline{\text{♃}}$   $36'$ ,  $\text{♅}$   $15^{\circ} \text{♌} 14'$ ,  $\text{♆}$   $24^{\circ} \overline{\text{♁}}$   $2'$ ,  $\text{♁}$   $15^{\circ} \overline{\text{♄}}$   $15'$ ,  $\text{♂}$   $11^{\circ} \overline{\text{♃}}$ ,  $\text{♁}$   $29^{\circ} \overline{\text{♁}}$   $44'$ ,  $\text{♄}$   $10^{\circ} \overline{\text{♄}}$   $23'$ , Pluto  $6^{\circ} \overline{\text{♄}}$   $20'$ . The rising Mars, ruler of 7th and 2nd, square the Sun, forewarned of strife and loss of taxes resulting; and Mercury in the Third trine Saturn, ruler of the fourth, showed the continuous efforts of the "Literary Digest" and other publications by straw ballots and otherwise to secure repeal, which probably were ultimately more effective than even the campaign of

the powerful interests back of the Association against the Amendment. On December 5th, 1933, 3:31 p. m., (Mountain Standard time), when a single member of the Utah convention at Salt Lake City, by his vote repealed the world famous Amendment, the 18th degree of Taurus rose, Pluto was in  $22^{\circ} \text{♄} 57'$  close M. C. and  $\square \text{♁}$  of Amendment figure, and the Moon was conjoined and applying to the parallel of Pluto. Next day the Sun and Venus were parallel to the new planet, in conformity with the strong fiscal influences motivating repeal.

The damaged cruiser, Chicago, was launched at Vallejo, California on April 10th, 1930, at 11:02 a.m. (P. S. T.) M.C.  $1^{\circ} \text{♁}$ , Asc.  $20^{\circ} \text{♄}$ , Pluto  $17^{\circ} \text{♄} 30'$  and  $\odot \text{♁} \text{♃}$  in  $20^{\circ} \text{♁}$ ,  $\text{♁} 18^{\circ} \text{♃}$  (9th house)  $\text{♁} \text{♃}$  in  $18^{\circ} \text{♃}$ . Again the planet Pluto is found associated with financial interests, for it was conjoined to the ascendant (bow) and a **paymaster** was fatally injured at his quarters in the bow. The lunation of October 19th, with its adverse vibrations, took place over angular points of the ship's horoscope, and the disaster occurred on October 24th, as "Bulletina's" Astrocause comments and advice for that day predicted. (page 38, last paragraph and page 25, Oct.-Nov.-Dec. number 1933.)

The lunation discussion also noted (page 38, bottom paragraph) the diplomatic correspondence, and other "**third house matters of a like nature,**" which would characterize the events of the month. Germany had just terminated her membership in the League of Nations and Armament Conference, and Hitler with inflammatory eloquence instructed the German populace to dig bomb and gas proof basements (Neptune was in the earth sign, Virgo, at lunation, square the conjoined Mars and Venus.) On October 20th, probably influenced partly by these ominous incidents, the State department announced that it had invited the Russian Soviet Republic to send representatives to Washington to negotiate terms for a resumption of diplomatic relations between the two countries which had been

discontinued for a period of fifteen years. On page 39 in the first paragraph it is stated **"the luminaries . . . opposition to Uranus indicate sudden, unexpected, radical and disruptive reports arising from foreign powers, etc."** The French government fell and armed troops patrolled Paris, the Siamese ruler fled from his capital, the English debt conference at Washington failed, the King of Afghanistan was slain, and renewed uproar broke out in Cuba.

The lunation of November 17th had **"Neptune in the eighth, indicating an unusual number of mysterious deaths, suicides through drowning, etc."** On November 26th the body of a kidnapped resident of San Jose, California, was recovered from San Francisco bay, and the same night at 11 p. m. his confessed murderers were lynched in that city. The lunation was in the eighth sign (Scorpio, death) and in the twelfth house (prisons) of a lunation chart for San Jose. The editor stated that Mercury in the Midheaven would bring criticism of the government. The Governor of California engaged in a recriminatory dispute relative to the lynching with ex-president Hoover, who was by inference supported by President Roosevelt. The governors of other states and influential public societies were drawn into a bitter dispute and Governor Rolph threatened in some quarters with impeachment or a recall referendum. Neptune in the eighth, trine Venus and sextile Saturn, through complicated translations of light and house positions, manifested as barrages of tear gas diffused by sheriffs' deputies and national guard troops in connection with this and other lynchings and smoke cloud oratory.

The lunation of December 16th, 1932, was notable, as the editor pointedly warned, due to the rising location of an afflicted Neptune, for threat of **"destructive storms . . . and great disasters on land and sea."** (page 12, Jan.-Feb.-Mch., 1934) The prediction was amply fulfilled in the "Bulletina's" home territory on New Year's Eve, when a torrential downpour of rain inundated the surrounding district, surpassing the

Weather Bureau's records kept since 1877, and inflicting enormous property damage and heavy casualties. On page 121, July number, 1933, "Bulletina" called readers' attention to the same strongly afflicted Neptune activated by subsequent eclipses and conjunctions of major planets as a primary cause of the seismic disturbance at Long Beach on March 10th, 1933.

Right on the Winter Solstice there was issued an exceptionally important announcement by the Treasury Department, both from American and world standpoints, that an agreement had been reached between the Government of British India and Washington for a mutual resumption of the use of silver coinage. In the Solstice horary for the District of Columbia the Sun (ruler of the 10th) was in the second house and the Moon (ruler of 9th) square to Mercury and opposed to Neptune, exciting the forces of the conjunction of Neptune and Jupiter of September 19th, 1932, and the three conjunctions of Mars and Neptune and two eclipses over  $\text{♁} \text{♃} 9^\circ$ . For several days thereabouts strong Pluto aspects were operative. December 20th, a most unusual occultation of the conjoined Saturn and Venus occurred only visible and widely observed in Japan. To astrologers it is significant that a few days later (December 23rd) a much desired Crown Prince was born to that great nation. The December lunation showed Venus ruling the third house (news) and tenth (rulers) conjoined to Saturn lord of the fifth (children).

On December 15th and 17th more Neptune and Scorpio disturbance took place at Chicago. Heavy gas explosions in about a mile of underground sewers shook the city. Venus originally in aspect to Neptune and Saturn, had then come by transit close over the latter. (According to "The Earth in the Heavens"—M.C. of Chicago is  $29^\circ \text{V} 24'$  and the Ascendant  $24^\circ \text{X} 48'$ , so that Saturn was in the 10th house originally and the conjunction of Sun and Moon opposed to the

IN AN ARTICLE on "Business Activity and Solar Variations" in the American Weekly of December 10, 1933, the statement was made, "No scientists and few economists doubt any longer that these two curves (Variation in the Activity of the Sun and in the Volume of Business) are somehow related to each other. The puzzle is to find precisely how."

The purpose in presenting the facts that follow is to show how the two curves are related.

**Variations in Business Volume**

Business activity is the production and distribution of products to feed, clothe, house, transport and entertain the people. As business is carried on for a profit, the volume of production and distribution is determined by consumption. The consumption of products is limited to the capacity of men to consume. The degree that men strive to use their mental and physical capacities to consume products is limited to the amount of energy they possess.

- Therefore, (1) Energy is the cause of all activity;  
(2) The Sun is the source of energy;

- (3) The energy of the Sun rises and falls in a series of cycles.
- (4) The activities of men rise and fall accordingly.
- (5) As the activities of men rise and fall the volume of consumption and of business rises and falls.

The artificial efforts of the leaders of men to control the major trend of prices and business volume by manipulation of money and other means have distorted, accelerated or retarded the normal movements but have not changed the major trend.

The major rise and fall in mass activities in the past have conformed with the variations in solar energy and in its distribution to the earth in cycles of 56 years, 18.6 years, approximately 11 years, and the secondary cycle of approximately 40 months.

### **The 56 Year Cycle**

Examining the business records of the past, we find three major boom and depression periods since the year 1810.

The revival in 1810 climaxed in a boom and panic in 1815 followed by more than 5 years of depression. The revival in 1863 climaxed in a boom and panic in 1873 followed by 5 years of depression. The revival in 1924 climaxed in a boom and panic in 1929 followed by 4 years of depression.

From the bottom of 1821 to the bottom of 1877 was 56 years. From the bottom of 1877 to the bottom in 1933 was 56 years.

The 56 year period of major booms and depressions corresponds with five 11.2 mean solar cycles and three 18.6 lunar cycles which return to a like relationship each 56 years. An explanation of these cycles was published in 1932.

It should be kept in mind that business methods were different during each of the three major booms,

panics and depressions, and that the accepted economic, political theories and parties in power were different, as each of these three major booms and depressions recurred.

Regardless of the difference in business methods, economic theories and political parties, the booms, panics and depressions corresponded with the cyclic return of similar solar conditions.

### The 18.6 Year Cycle

A further examination of the business records of the past shows that beginning with the bottom of the depression in 1821, a severe depression has climaxed near the end of each 18.6 year period thereafter, as follows:

December, . . .	1821,
July, . . . .	1840,
February, . . .	1859,
September, . .	1877,
April, . . . .	1896,
December, . . .	1914,
July, . . . .	1933.

With the exception of the depression of 1839 and 1840 which continued until 1842, a revival began just before, or shortly after, the end of each 18.6 year period.

The 18.6 year period is the time required for the node of the Moon to circle the ecliptic and to return to the same position in the heavens. It is a time cycle that regulates the distribution of the solar energy to the north and south hemispheres of the earth.

It is a time period within which the mass activities of each generation recapitulate, regardless of the theories of men.

The secular trend of business volume and prices for the final four or five years of this lunar cycle has been down regardless of economic and political theories or the efforts of our leaders.

A different cause has been assigned by the authorities for each of the 18.6 year depressions of the past. But there was only one cause.

### **The 40 Month Cycle**

Upon further examination, it is found that beginning in the summer of 1821, a mean 40 month cycle of about 20 months up and about 20 months down will account for all of the price and volume movements in excess of one year within each 56 year cycle between the major panics of 1815, 1873 and 1929, and the major depressions each 18.6 years since 1821.

The actual cycle of rise and fall has not always been 40 months. It has been as short as 32 months and as long as 44 months. At the beginning and ending of the 18.6 year cycles the trend of the 40 month cycle is distorted or eliminated.

The mean 40 month cycle appears to be the dominant heat cycle of the mean 11.2 year solar period.

### **The 9 to 14 Panic Years**

Major panics have recurred as the 40 month cycle finished its tops that corresponded with sunspot peaks.

In the past, minor panics that did not result in major depressions have come shortly after the beginning of a new solar cycle. The cause apparently was over enthusiasm of the mass pushing recovery faster than the resources of the people could support and bringing a relapse, fear and panic.

The major panics, however, have occurred on the sunspot peaks, or as the solar activity began to recede from its peak, as follows:

Panic of 1815, Sunspot top June and December 1815 and year 1816.

Panic of 1828, Sunspot top June 1828, 1829, 1830.

Panic of 1837, Sunspot peak

Panic of 1847, Sunspot peak October 1847 and top until 1852.

Panic)

War ) 1860-61, Sunspot peak

Panic of 1873, Sunspot peak 1870, last top February 1873.

Panic of 1884, Sunspot peak 1883-84.

Panic of 1893, Sunspot peak 1893.

Panic of 1907, Sunspot peak February 1907.

Panic of 1914, Beginning of new solar cycle just prior to ending of an 18.6 year depression period same as in 1857.

Panic)

War ) of 1917, Sunspot peak

Panic of 1929, Sunspot peak 1928 and 1929.

The panics that come at the beginning of a new solar cycle as a result of excess of optimism bring a relapse and a recession of short duration.

The panics that come after the maximum of solar activity as a result of the efforts of men to prolong a period of mass activity, (building up surplus stocks of materials that could not be consumed) have ended in severe depressions.

This was particularly true of the gold prosperity that ended on the long flat solar top from 1847 to 1853. There was a panic in 1847, a recovery, and then panic conditions started in 1853 and lasted to 1857 and ended in extreme depression in 1858-59.

### **Solar Heat**

The variation in the amount of solar heat as recorded and determined by the Smithsonian, the Carnegie Institutions and others since the year 1919, has been analysed into a series of cycles having time periods of  $6\frac{2}{3}$  months to 45 months as given in the publication of the Smithsonian Institution March 27, 1933, entitled "Forecasts of Solar Variation."

The dominating heat cycle as determined by the writer (from the planetary factors that control the

solar rise and fall), has a mean of 40 months. The minimum is about 32 months and the maximum is about 44 months and repeats from minimum to maximum and back to minimum in approximately 37 years.

The heat cycle appears to be the mean 40 month cycle of the statisticians. Excepting the seasonal cycle of each year, the mean 40 month cycle is the most frequent major cycle of rise and fall in prices and business volume. Heretofore, no explanation has been given why the 40 month cycle should be a dominant cycle in the rise and fall in business volume and prices.

In an article in the "Monthly Weather Review" of April 1933, the 37 year solar period has been traced by H. W. Clough of Arcade, New York, back to 300 A. D. The 37 year cycle is associated with the return of cold winters of Europe and the flood periods of the Nile other than those associated with the mean 11 year solar cycle.

### **Electrical Energy**

The Sun is a magnet. The northern hemisphere of the Sun has an electrical charge opposite in character to that of the southern hemisphere. The Sun with its satellites is a self-generating dynamo.

From the Sun streams positive and negative electrical energy as well as light and heat. Within the magnetic field that surrounds the Sun float the Earth and all of the satellites of the Sun.

Variations in the electrical energy of the Sun cause a rise and fall in the magnetism of the field of the Sun, in the magnetism of the Earth and in the atmosphere of the Earth.

The changes in the magnetic field of the Earth vary the magnetism of the air men breathe, cause variations in radio transmission and reception, storms and convulsions of the earth.

The major change in the electrical conditions of the Sun as observed and reported by astronomers is the reversal in the magnetic polarity of the sunspots on each hemisphere of the Sun near the time that solar activity is minimum, approximately each 11 years.

However, the electrical cycle does not appear to be the sunspot cycle, nor two single sunspot cycles, measured from the beginning of new spots of one cycle to new spots of the alternate cycle.

The electrical solar cycle, as defined by C. G. Abbott, includes one positive and one negative solar cycle of approximately  $11\frac{1}{2}$  years each. The period appears to be measured from the disappearance of the old sunspots of one cycle to disappearance of the old sunspots of the alternate cycle, approximately 23 years.

Each alternate sunspot cycle has been greater in solar activity and each electrical cycle is composed of two single sunspot cycles.

The electrical cycle of approximately 23 years, according to Dr. C. G. Abbott, dominates the weather. It is now believed that weather conditions in general can be predicted for 23 years using the timing of the solar variations for the double cycles.

How to time the beginning of each new sunspot cycle, the ending of each old sunspot cycle, and of the double or electrical cycles, was published in 1932.

### **Business and War**

From a business standpoint the negative electrical cycles have brought war, or destructive activity, either on the part of the mass or its leaders. The positive cycle is more constructive, or brings activity in defense of constructive principles.

For instance, the cycle that began in 1889 was a negative cycle of excessive solar heat and the activity

of the nineties was destructive to business. This country narrowly escaped war with England and engaged in war with Spain.

The positive cycle that began in 1901 brought constructive business activity. The return of the negative cycle in 1913 brought foreign war and destructive activity for which we are still paying.

The return of the positive cycle of 1923 brought the tremendous boom of industrial activity that climaxed in 1929.

While the time of the decline from 1929 was normal, the severity of the decline was accentuated, of course, by the unsound practices of our industrial and financial leaders as shown by the revelations of the Investigating Committee in Washington.

The return of the negative cycle in 1934 will probably bring foreign war either physical or commercial. Predictions of war and preparations for war are already on every tongue.

### **Planetary Angles**

The electrical solar cycle, as defined by C. G. Abbott, has the same time length as the conjunctions and oppositions of Saturn and Uranus, which recur approximately each 23 years.

The ancients taught that the force released at the formation of 30 degree planetary angles from conjunction to opposition had an effect on human affairs of a different nature than the force released at the angles formed from the opposition to the conjunction.

Modern students of astrology believe the conjunctions, oppositions, and 90-degree angles between Saturn and Uranus coincide with panicky and depressed business conditions, and that the 60 and 120 angles between those planets coincide with business prosperity.

The records of the past show that the ancients were nearer the truth than the modern views.

The prosperity of 1849 to 1853 was at its peak on the close conjunction of Saturn and Uranus from August 1851 to April 1852. When Saturn and Uranus were 60 degrees apart from October 1857 until August 1858, the panic and depression which started in August 1857 was at its worst.

The great prosperity of the seventies climaxed under the exact 180 angle of Saturn and Uranus in May 1873. The top of the bull market of 1909 came as Saturn made exact 90 angle with Uranus. The bull market of 1919 climaxed on Saturn 180 Uranus.

The prosperity tops of 1852, 1873, 1909 and 1919 corresponded with the solar-lunar tops. The bottom of business depression in 1858 and 1859 corresponded with the bottom of the 18.6 year lunar cycle which also measured the bottoms of 1877, 1896, 1914 and 1933.

The formations of conjunctions, 90-degree and 180-degree angles between Saturn and Uranus come at about the time of the maximum intensity of the electrical cycle, as defined by C. G. Abbott. However, whether these periods of intense electrical activity will indicate prosperity or depression are determined by the solar-lunar cycles.

The concentration of the solar force and energy by the Moon north and south of the equator of the earth is of primary importance in forecasting the major trend of mass activity.

### **Value of the Solar-Lunar Cycles**

A knowledge of the solar-lunar cycles makes it possible to predict the variations in mass activity which recapitulates for the mean 11 year and 18.6 year periods within each 56 years, regardless of the individual efforts of men to block the major trend.

### **Value of the Solar Lunar Cycles**

The greatness and prosperity of the United States was built on the ideal that industry, thrift and a use

of the natural laws that control nature and men would enable each one to acquire capital, obtain food, clothing and shelter, accumulate wealth and achieve independence.

During the past 20 years the original ideal has been replaced with the belief that the organized mass will, through some sort of psychological magic of its leaders, could control and dominate nature, and that organized wealth and money could control the rise and fall in prices and mass consumption of products and a high level of activity and continuous prosperity be maintained.

To achieve such a goal we increased our debt three-fold from about 70 billions to about 220 billions until the burden became so heavy that we now, with half of the world's stock of gold in our possession, have deliberately debased our money one-half in an endeavor to pay our debts and prevent bankruptcy.

Our individual leaders having failed to overcome the natural periods of rest and activity, we now plan to organize the whole nation under one head and director.

So to organize the nation and march this greater mass out of step with the rhythm of nature would invite even a greater disaster.

To insure the success of the New Deal and the present gigantic experiments, organized activity of men should be synchronized with that of nature.

I contribute my part to the success of the New Deal in showing the relationship between the rise and fall in solar radiation and its distribution and the business activity of men in the past.

As Professor Irving Fisher in *Econometrica* of October, 1933, has acknowledged that the daily and yearly rhythm forced on business are imposed on us by astronomical forces from outside the economic organization, it is probable that the greater astronomical forces that fluctuate the activities of men also will be recognized in carrying out the New Deal.

# The Planet Vulcan

IN RELATION TO EXPLOSIONS

SO FAR as I can determine, in the light of what research I have been able to make, the intra-Mercurial planet Vulcan is the cause of most, if not all, natural explosions on our Earth, and it also seems probable that artificial explosions would be more effective if they could be timed to occur when Vulcan is most active.

Recently (in 1929) an exact observation of Vulcan was recorded by the French astronomers, and by means of it I have been able to apply a correction to the original Tables of Vulcan that were published some years ago. With this correction I tried the tabular values for Vulcan on the date of the explosion of Krakatoa, in the Straits of Sunda, and obtained the following heliocentric longitudes, as of August 23, 1883.

(Here we find Vulcan at inferior conjunction with the Sun and by heliocentric angle square with Mercury, Jupiter, Saturn and Pluto. Uranus was at the opposition, while Mars was near the square, but Venus and Neptune were not in angle.)

It would require several pages for me to point out all the significant features of this planetary action, and I ought to devote at least one whole chapter in a large book to explain why the explosion occurred at Krakatoa and not at some other locality. But in a few words I might remark that the doctrine promulgated by Claudius Ptolemy in the Tetrabiblos that the planets have a "sympathy" with certain sections of the Earth is correct.

As some of the readers may not be familiar with the story of the explosion at Krakatoa, I will briefly outline its history. On August 27, 1883, the volcanic island of Krakatoa was blown up by the greatest explosion ever recorded in history. About eight square miles of volcanic cone was blown away and the noise of the explosion was the greatest ever heard by man. It was easily heard in Australia, nearly 3,000 miles away. Volcanic dust was shrown nearly 30 miles into the air and was seen as a fog, or haze, for more than a year after. The explosions began on the 23rd of August, 1883, and ended with the great blow up of the 27th, at just about 10:02 a. m. local time. Excursion boats from Batavia went out on Sunday, the 26th, to view the fire works and take photographs of the great display.

## *How Modern Customs*

REFLECT ANCIENT ASTROLOGY

"The curtains of Yesterday drop down, the curtains of Tomorrow roll up; but Yesterday and Tomorrow both **are**."



AS ASTROLOGICAL STUDENTS, we scarcely need reminding that the sacred books of all lands, the festivals and folklore, the epic poetry and sculpture, the heraldry and figures of speech are astrologically derived, yet constant usage seems to dull recognition of the fact that most of our ultra-modern customs record some astronomical phenomenon; that ritual and architecture, state and church ceremonials but thinly veil similar practices originating in ancient astrolatry, and that most of our more sensuous luxuries, adornments and habits reflect the star-worship of Chaldea, Babylonia, Egypt, India or Persia.

Vainly we have striven to incorporate in the present article replies to all related queries directed to this department,—queries, any one of which deserves a definitive exposition impossible to condense within the department's space-limits. The best we may do is to jot down fragmentary notes of high-lights glimpsed along this trail of inquiry connecting the present with the remote past. Too much territory is covered to recount hundreds of the best-known illustrations of this fascinating but inexhaustible subject.

### Astrolatry and Mysteries of Mithra

The ancient Mysteries were astrological, the initiators essentially adept in stellar science, hence their nature-secrets were perpetuated in ceremonial implements, every article of which employed a definite planetary substance and symbolism. Thus the seven-branched candlestick of modern use, the "seven lights before the altar," originally represented the seven spirits before the throne, the planetary rulers of opposite signs being appropriately placed at opposite ends of its branches: Saturn opposite Luna (rulers respectively of Capricorn and Cancer); Jupiter balanced Mercury; Mars opposed Venus, with the **Sun**, as always **centered**.

Similarly in the "Catherine Wheel," round window of ecclesiastical architecture, with its twelve radii issuant from a glorified center, again we encounter the symbol of the Sun, "the beginning of all things," with the twelve sections of stained glass typifying the Zodiac.

Likewise, modern churches unconsciously glorify the Sun in the ceremony of the tonsure, a practice descending from the priests of Mithra (Persian Sun-god) who in their tonsures represented the solar disc. Osirian priests of Egypt also shaved their heads in similar worship, while the Buddha in China, India and Thibet, as well as the Chinese Kwanyin and countless other deities were always represented with the halo, but another form of the Solar symbol. In a vastly later era the gods and heroes of Greece and Rome, for the most part Hellenized duplicates of Egyptian planetary deities, were similarly "crowned with the Sun."

"Twelve golden beams around his temples play  
To mark his lineage from the God of Day."

### "Everything You Think is New, Was Old in Egypt"

Can't you hear it echoing adown the corridors of time? Can't you just see those inscrutable old Nile

gods smile at miladi's complacent smirk as she adjusts a "futuristic" twelve-rayed halo upon her "permanent," smugly assured that she is several jumps ahead of the 1934 fashion parade. And "permanents" were out-moded in Egypt some 6000 years ago! Perhaps because of the discomfort and inconvenience of waiting for dozens of tightly bound strands of hair to dry on their wooden skewers in the sun-baked Nile mud!

And speaking of Egypt: of course you know that the word "pussy" derives from Pasht, cat-headed goddess to whom the cat was sacred? And that "**gone west,**" the terse expression used by the World War soldier to say that his buddy had embarked upon the great adventure, also originated in Egypt where the soul was believed to sail with the Sun, implying then, as now, a journey to the West.

The Sun, center of our planetary system, "ruler of the universe," naturally the most propitiated of the ancient deities, became the most frequently honored in ritualistic festival, and is consequently most commonly (if unconsciously) celebrated in modern holiday customs, such as the Maypole dance in which the garlanded Maypole is the Sun, his days symbolized by the radiating ribbons attached to the dancers who represent the planets weaving through the zodiacal dance.

Lion-heads universally decorate fountains bespeaking the astral influences of Leo which produce the ardent August rains, poetically regarded among ancients as discharges of the "sacred fountains," the "lion month" when the lions came to the rivers to quench their thirst.

The Sun-symbol is again recognized in the word **iris**, the inner circle of the eye, from Osiris whose ancient symbol, the all-seeing eye, is perpetuated in modern Masonry the traditions of which are but one of numerous allegories of the personified Sun among the twelve constellations of the zodiac founded upon a system of astrological symbols and emblems teaching

the great truths of immortality, the name Masonry itself derived from a Greek word meaning "I am in the midst of heaven," alluding to the Sun, its more ancient form being the Egyptian "Phre"-Sun; and "mas," child; hence, Mason, child of the Sun.

Greek letter fraternity escutcheons likewise display solar emblems such as the winged disc and the all-seeing eye. And the hot-cross-buns of Good Friday are likewise traceable to Nile Solar worship, in which sacrificial cakes, similarly scored, were sold outside the temples, the round shape indicating the Sun while the cross typified its movement, crossing from southern to northern declination. (See "The Sixteen Crucified Saviors.")

### **Astrology Reflected in Superstition**

And what endless superstitions carry some astrological significance, as witness: in the Mysteries there was used a ladder of seven steps, each round composed of a metal sacred to one of the planets, the whole representing the seven planetary spheres through which the soul ascended to liberation. Walking **under** a ladder is avoided even unto the present day as an omen of ill-luck, typifying in reality, a refusal to climb, one who dodges, ignoring the disciplines and effort imposed by the soul's ascent.

Again: the most common symbol of Isis (Luna), the crescent, was worn by the ancients on their shoes to prevent Luna-cy and to attract the good will of Isis, a habit that persists to the present in the horse-shoe nailed "horns upward" above the door, to "keep the luck it," for if the shoe is reversed, the luck is sure to run out!

### **Metals, Gems, Incense, Perfume Associated with Astrological Magic**

The Sun is alchemic gold; the Moon, alchemic silver. In the operation of these two mystic rulers of the world it was supposed, astrologically, that all phen-

omena were produced: an ancient belief paralleled and parodied by the present currency war in which gold and silver in a material sense seem actually to rule the commercial world. Round gold coins originally were made to represent the Sun, the silver ones sacred to the Moon.

We have alluded to the selection of implements of Magic, each appropriately employed according to its astrological significance. Thus combining the metal, gem, incense, perfume and name of a given planet in a magical ritual intended to direct the influence of that planet to the desired end gave the astrological magician tremendous power. Even today perfume and incense are two of the most potent agencies of planetary magic secretly employed by individuals and in associated groups, for "Scents are surer than sights and sounds to make your heart-strings crack." Better taught than we, people of many other lands use incense and perfume with greater discrimination and infinitely better taste than we occidentals. Thus the Mudras of Bali, the temple services of China and worship in the lamasaries of Thibet proceed through spirals of sacrosanct incense smoke for the orientals cherish the old astrological traditions, and

"Wonderful tales had our fathers of old—

Wonderful tales of the herbs and stars,

The Sun was the lord of the Marigold;

Basil and Rocket belonged to Mars.

Pat as a sum in addition it goes,

(Every plant had a star bespoke)

Who but Venus should govern the Rose?

Who but Jupiter own the Oak?

Simply and gravely the facts were told

In the wonderful books of our fathers of old."

An amazing literature on planetary magic is available. From it we may learn the origins of many customs of adornment. Rings, for instance, originally were devised from metals that transmit the forces of

## *Ominous April*

WHEN Mars, the God of War, reaches his perihelion in January, 1934, during a conjunction with Saturn in Aquarius, the rising sign on the Sun's eastern equator, a despicable conspiracy will be secretly formulated against Russia,—probably by Germany and Japan.

Furthermore, during the solar eclipse of February 13th (U. S.) which takes place between Saturn and the fiery Mars, there will be revealed a startling and sensational invention of a deadly poisonous explosive which further incites and increases the war-like tension.

Moreover, by April, this war-like situation will become ominous and sinister. Military violence increases as the Sun, Moon, Mars and Uranus, with Mercury following soon after, are conjoined on April 13th in the rising sign of Aries at the dynamic eastern equatorial angle. This four-powered group of planets, so complex in nature, will be in a formidable close opposition to the benefic Jupiter who is descending in Libra at the distributive western equatorial angle. However, Saturn, the only planet befriending Jupiter, will somewhat mitigate the adverse influence of this sinister opposition.

The focusing of such a tremendous concentration of light upon one side of the earth, which always disastrously unbalances world conditions, will bring to a head (during this month of April) years of accumulated hatreds and innate selfish greed for aggrand-

izement. This heterogeneous mass of inflammable tinder will suddenly burst into uncontrollable flames, thereby exploding the powder keg which for years has been recklessly dangling over the Orient as well as Central Europe. This means chaotic financial and political upheavals coincident with the vicious elements of unavoidable war. The United States is liable to be diplomatically involved due to the fact that most of her wars commenced in the month of April. (The culmination of this war will be the subject of my next article.)

April 12, 1861—Civil War.

April 4, 1865—End of Civil War, surrender of General Lee.

April 19, 1775—Battle of Revolution, Lexington, Mass.

April 11, 1783—End of war with Great Britain.

April 22, 1898—War with Spain.

April 6, 1917—Entered World War.

Noteworthy events are as follows:—

April 28, 1758—James Monroe was born.

April 30, 1789—George Washington became first president of the U. S.

April 2, 1792—The bi-metallic standard was recommended by Jefferson and Hamilton, and adopted by our government by a statute approved by George Washington.

April 18, 1792—Stock exchange established.

April 30, 1803—Treaty of France ratified.

April 4, 1818—Stars and stripes adopted by Congress.

April 1, 1841—President Harrison died.

April 14, 1865—Abraham Lincoln assassinated.

# The Art of Synthesis

THE HOROSCOPE to be considered in this article is that of a man, who though born under favorable planetary influences, has, up to the present, not made good.

Born in the Orient, of American parents, the native came to the United States sufficiently early to escape that deadly soporific influence of the East that makes lotus eaters of so many who remain there over a long period. Therefore such inertia and lack of ambition as he has shown must not be attributed to an exceptional environment tending in that direction.

The Sun in Scorpio gives force and power but these are latent. They have never been exhibited because the chart shows a retrograde Saturn rising in the lazy sign of Taurus with no less than six planets in the negative signs. Such a combination inclines the native to indolence and lack of ambition, the strength of which is increased because the planets are scattered over the map, and so far he has succumbed to this influence. Had Mars been more powerful his aid might have enabled the native to make a better showing. Up to the present he has apparently shown no desire to do more than mark time, having no ambition and no aspiration. He will work when work has to be done but has little or no interest in anything other than what he is told to do.

The key to this boy's failure and the possibility of continued failure lie in the negative side of Scorpio predominating. Scorpio can be a most powerfully positive sign or extremely negative. Many planets in Scorpio can cause the native to be keen, alert, aggressive, ambitious and forceful, but on the other hand it can be the exact reverse. The negative side will be demonstrated when negative signs are on the ascendant, especially Taurus, Virgo or Pisces, and when the Moon is in a negative sign. It is important to note whether the majority of planets are angular, succedent, or cadent, as the former will tend to bring out the positive qualities and the latter the negative qualities of all the signs and planets.

Such configurations as are shown in this horoscope lead to inertia and stagnation. If there were heavy afflictions from the angular planets it would help because it would bring necessity for greater effort,—the effort of self-preservation.

The boy's early environment has been against him and undoubtedly has been one of the factors which held him back. His mother is a good woman, but his father gave way to drink so the boy's home life was one of chaos (Neptune in the 4th house), and his education was much neglected.

He has considerable mental ability with Mars in Gemini and the Moon in Virgo, which also gives a quick, enquiring mind with ability to attend to detail. All of these qualities show latent powers and an exacting nature, though at the present time this later quality is used in a destructive rather than constructive manner.

In a chart of this kind I find that often the native is slow in developing and taking responsibilities upon himself. One might expect that in time the position of Saturn will bring him to a sense of responsibility that will stir him to show some interest in the performance of duties.

The position of Saturn in the ascendant and the Sun in Scorpio detracts somewhat from the pleasing personality given by Taurus with its ruler (Venus) in Libra. However, this strong Venus combination cannot fail to provide him with friends and contacts with those who will feel sympathy and kindness toward him; especially will this attention come from women. His mother now devotes herself to his happiness and welfare. As he grows older he will begin to realize the value of using the natural amiability and graciousness given by the Venus signs which will enable him to maintain friends and secure advantages from others in a way that is somewhat exceptional.

The many good aspects of his ruler, Venus, and of the Moon show that the boy has a soft and tender side to his nature and this is the main drawback for business success. He is no doubt too contented and too easy going: a state of mind which allows others with less ability but with more force to overtake him and secure the good things which have been his.

Contrary to the usual effect of Saturn rising in the money sign Taurus,—an influence which tends to endow one with a money consciousness, and to understand the value of the dollar, intuitively knowing the best methods of getting adequate returns for expenditure—this boy is likely to be extravagant. The posi-

tion of the Moon in Virgo, an economical and thrifty sign, will protect him from what would undoubtedly cause from time to time, heavy losses through careless expenditures and over indulgences in luxuries and the good things of life. Poor judgment in the matter of expenditures is readily seen by the position of Mercury in opposition to Mars, and also from the conjunction of the Sun to Jupiter. Note that Mercury is the lord of the second house, the house of money, and that Mars is close to the cusp of the second house.

If it were not for the position of the Moon in Virgo and trine to Saturn the boy would prove himself unworthy of trust and not reliable. This tendency comes from Mars in Gemini (a Mercury sign), opposition to Mercury, which is weakly placed in Sagittarius.

The Scorpio influence gives him strong likes and desires, so when he decides that he needs something it will be very difficult to restrain himself in its gratification.

The excellent position of the Sun in the seventh house conjunct Jupiter, sextile to Uranus, trine to Neptune and sextile the Moon, shows clearly that marriage will be an important factor in the boy's life and will no doubt be the influence which will save him from being a failure and turn the tide of his material affairs.

The conjunction of the Sun and Jupiter is an expansive influence, and those who have it show a great desire to have the best of everything. They dislike anything cheap, tawdry or inefficient. Good aspects of the Sun and Moon to Jupiter are not always to be desired for the Jupiter influence brings the good things of life too readily and the native is likely to be spoiled by the ease with which they come, leaving him without the incentive to make the most of his own abilities.

His wife will have dignity and standing in the world and he will find it hard to live up to her standard and maintain his position at her side. Marriage

should prove an incentive for him to make good through the inspiring influence of his wife and the necessity of keeping up with her ; but this will not be an easy thing for him after considering all the factors we have marshalled against the awakening of his progressive spirit.

There is nothing of the genius in this boy. There is nothing that will make him outstanding in the field of letters or anything outside of a regular business or profession. As an engineer he might do very good work, in fact he has some such ideas at the present, though unless he bestirs himself more than he has so far he is not likely to qualify for practice in this direction. Electrical engineering perhaps offers the best field of work. Note the strong position of Uranus in the midheaven.

If the boy understood his horoscope and played up to the possibilities of Uranus in the midheaven with so many strong benefic aspects, he would strain every nerve to make good, not only because it is right to do so but because in so doing it will open avenues of activity which will place him high on the ladder to fame.

The transits of Jupiter promise to be very good for this boy for the next few years and will bring him opportunities and advantages that few young men receive with so little effort on their own part. At the present time Jupiter is in Libra and not as friendly as he will be later. Before the end of the year Jupiter will come to the cusp of the seventh house and from that time on for the next six years life will be easy and he will have many opportunities to advance in the world. It will be very surprising if he does not consider matrimony seriously throughout 1935 and 1936. 1937 will be his best year when the transiting Jupiter will cross the midheaven and make many important benefic aspects.

Unfortunately there are few progressions or transits which will be powerful enough to force the boy to

learn the lessons that life holds for him. Perhaps the time of greatest hardship will come during the years from 1938 to 1942 when Uranus will cross the ascendant and make afflictions to Saturn, the Sun and Jupiter from angular houses. Saturn will transit the same place in 1940 and 1941. But even then the situation will be saved for him by the transit of Jupiter over the ascendant with Saturn, so if in any intervening years life has hit him hard, Jupiter will help him to retrieve his fallen fortunes.

There will be opportunities over and over again as Jupiter transits to favorable places in his horoscope. The early part of 1935 will be one of the best periods of his life; there will be another benefic period during 1937; and again during the first half of 1939. Readers, what do you think he will do with his chances?

The position of the Moon in 17 degrees of Virgo is not a happy one. This, according to the findings of diligent students is the degree of abortion; which adds another factor in the possibilities that he will abuse his advantages.

Many influences indicate a denial of children. The strongest evidence of all being the position of the Moon in 17 degrees of Virgo. The boy has an affectionate nature and a possessive one, so it may be a blow to him to have no family. The denial of children may prove a blessing for it may be the one thing necessary to set his mind to some really constructive work. Once he sets his face definitely in an upward direction the force that he can bring upon any undertaking is sufficient to send him a long way on the road to success.

Life will prove just as interesting for this boy as he cares to make it. The more active he is, the more progressive, and the more he allows his natural ingenuity and constructive ability to color all his actions the more successful and interesting his life will be.

It is quite evident that this soul had received enough light in a previous life to form a beacon to him in the present, and regardless of his handicap and many trials and discouragements, through the light from the inner consciousness he kept faith with his higher self and in spite of all obstacles has made a most remarkable record of strength of soul and progress.

Here is an individual with all the finer senses keenly alive, and with much natural talent along certain, definite lines. Analysing the chart, we find a born Chemist and Surgeon who, through force of circumstances, was thrust in an environment and confronted by conditions which hindered every tendency for expression in that line. Look to the place of Saturn in the chart and you will see evidence of all these obstacles.

He came from the nobility, his father having been disinherited because of his marriage. They finally

settled on a farm in the northern part of the United States where, not knowing how to cope with the hardships of life, they met with dreadful difficulties. The son was denied education and other advantages, doing the hardest kind of labor on a barren farm. They lacked many of the necessities of life, which is plainly shown by Jupiter and Saturn, a very difficult time in early life.

His difficulty in getting an education you can readily see from Mercury, also Jupiter retrograde in the sign Mercury rules and opposed by the restricting influence of Saturn. These aspects also show a very slowly working mind, one that is not quick to grasp an idea and slow to work out that idea after it is once accepted. It was only the keen intuition, which the lad learned to follow, that brought him to the great success he has achieved. Note the planets in the twelfth house, those in the watery signs and the Moon conjunction Mars. He learned in his boyhood to follow what he called his "hunches." In this way he ventured into things where people thought he was very unwise, but he succeeded. He was not afraid of work, and as you see from Saturn's location he also had abundance of patience and persistence: three elements quite necessary for success. This lad made the most of every opportunity.

Each horoscope is a law unto itself, dependent only upon certain general, vital principles governing all, and (as this chart shows so plainly) no chart can be correctly understood or interpreted unless it is studied in relation to heredity and environment; also certain physiological and psychological principles must be considered.

As this boy had very little education and no one even to suggest that he might do anything worthwhile in the world, the great urge within him to relieve the suffering about him,—the natural urges of the physician and surgeon, started him to look after his neighbors' sick cattle and horses, as well as his own, and

to use surgery in his crude way whenever it was seemingly needed, with a surprising degree of success. He seemed instinctively to know what was wrong and what to do to right that wrong, even to using the knife. Note the planets in Scorpio and their aspects. His natural desire to know more of the construction of the physical bodies he was interested in finally led him into the butchering business. Again nature trying to express itself.

He married a very delicate woman. They had six children, the mother became an invalid, so husband and father became nurse, cook and housekeeper. Had he not possessed the physician's tender instinct so strongly he would not have done that. All except one of the children passed on, also the wife, and the father cared for the one living child and raised her himself. Later he went into the banking business, where he learned much of bonds and securities and made a great success.

See how this great soul met life's problems bravely and improved himself, growing into a fine executive, with a fine personality, ever pushing forward and following the upward, constructive path against all adverse conditions. There never was a soul who felt sorrow and grief more keenly as you see by the depth of feeling and intensity shown in the horoscope, but he never lost faith, though heartsick and lonely, just forged ahead with greater perseverance and determination, ever seeking something constructive to satisfy his hungry, lonely soul. A weaker person would have broken but when you realize the great power within this soul, the sweetness, patience and endurance of the great God-spirit within (note the position of the Light in the Midheaven and its benefic rays to the Greater Light conjoined to the Swift Messenger of the Gods and the Goddess of Love), you know that it was light, reflected from past experiences, that was ever beaconing him to greater and greater effort. The last three planets casting a benefit ray to the powerful Uranus

certainly acted as a sign post to guide the wanderer. That, and the memory of the guidance of a most loving mother led him on safely.

When we look at a horoscope such as this and see what the world could have gained in service to suffering humanity had this child been educated along lines for which the Great Ruler gave him natural talents, then it is we realize the great necessity and advantage of the science of astrology. Latent talents lying within him, only awaiting an opportunity for development, and his soul denied the privilege and experience of their expression. Did the world miss a great surgeon?

Parents are in great need of the guiding principles of astrology so that they may give their children the advantage of the easiest way to success with the least effort, expense and anxiety. Let us be thankful that this soul was strong enough not to let the adverse winds of life, bitter as they were, keep him from following the teachings of a tender Mother as shown by the Moon and Venus. Why did he miss the great opportunity God fitted him by nature to perform? Note the influence of Saturn. Though big and strong physically this individual was tender, gentle and afraid to express himself. (Note Saturn and Mercury.)

Oh! the need of the intelligent use of astrology as a guiding principle to bewildered humanity.


# *The Measure of a Man*

## **Fourth Article in a Series on "Famous Criminal Horoscopes"**

 THE HOROSCOPE which is hereafter offered for study and consideration (No. 7 in the present series) has been selected as a basis and example for the study of future charts in relation to criminal tendencies as revealed by planetary positions. This chart is typically dishonest and homicidal but it is not violent as far as danger of violence to the physical body of the native is concerned. Please compare its positions with rules given in *Bulletina* #200, Oct.-Nov.-Dec., 1933, pages 143-149.

Since, so far as can be ascertained, no trace of criminality in the heredity of the native exists; since he comes of a family which is not only respected but eminent in the locality in which he was born and raised; since his childhood environment, treatment and training were equal to that of other men of success; since his mentality was above average; since neither privation nor want provided a spur to his conduct; since despite many advantages and incentives to a life of credit to himself and his family, he nevertheless sank to a level with that of criminals whose heredity,

environment and training were conducive to criminality rather than otherwise, it is evident that some factor other than these supplied the base of the tragedy.

This factor is to be found in the planetary energy operating at the time of his birth. There are three factors with which each one of us must cope throughout our lives: 1—Heredity, 2—Environment, 3—The horoscope.

In many cases of criminality the first two factors are largely responsible. In this case the third factor, the horoscope, appears to have been the sole cause of the tragedy. Hence, it is a valuable chart for the purpose of studying the type of astrological positions which incline to produce these tragedies.

It is a well known scientific fact that certain lines of heredity have progressed further in the scheme of evolution than have others. At a certain point in this development when the nervous system has reached a degree of perfection, planetary energy becomes most powerful in effect. When that point has been successfully passed and the **will power and understanding** have begun to combat it, planetary energy begins to lose its mastery of individuals and becomes the servant of the native.

The native of this chart had apparently arrived at the stage first mentioned in the foregoing paragraph. Given a more resistant line of heredity or given an understanding of the indications of the horoscope with a proper psychological training early in youth, the energy of this chart could have and might have been used constructively.

In order to protect the innocent from further humiliation, all names connected with this particular case are suppressed. It is not a widely known case and would be recognized by few readers in any event. The names used are fictitious and selected for identification only.

The earliest accurate record which I have of the case dates back to the spring of 1928, when the native (whom we will identify as W. R.) was engaged in accountant work for several firms in a western city. Latitude for all events is 39°. Time is Pacific Standard. In his work he was unusually skillful and swift.

Among his employers was a Mr. Elbee, who had a friend, Miss Murdock, a sincere and earnest student of astrology. To test astrology Mr. Elbee gave Miss Murdock the birth data of W. R. adding that W. R. had expressed a desire to know what the future held for him.

Miss Murdock was so frightened and shocked by the positions in the chart that she was reluctant to discuss it. Finally upon the insistence of Mr. Elbee she told him that the horoscope of W. R. appeared to be that of a criminal who would narrowly escape hanging; that he was at the very time (spring 1928) engaged in something questionable and that it would pay his employers to check his work and activities.

This opinion upon the horoscope of W. R. convinced Mr. Elbee that there was nothing in astrology. He argued that both of them knew W. R. to be an earnest, hard-working young man trying to support a rapidly increasing family; that if his horoscope indicated such disaster in the face of all evidence to the contrary, astrology must be the unreliable superstition claimed by its opponents.

Some eight months after this conversation (early in 1929) one of W. R.'s employers (a friend of Mr. Elbee) discovered a large deficit in his funds. An investigation brought forth a confession that during the entire year of 1928 W. R. had systematically forged the name of this employer. At forgery he was a genius. Neither the employer himself nor the bank officials could segregate the forged checks from the genuine ones. W. R. professed regret and was given another chance with a new position.

Until the summer of 1929 all seemed to go well. However, in August, he disappeared without warning from his home and place of occupation, leaving a new deficit of thousands of dollars. On September 26th, 1929, he was arrested in a distant city. It was rumored that during the period of his absence, he had eloped with a married woman, taken her across the border of the state and exposed himself to prosecution on the Mann Act.

Whether or not this rumor be true, he was not tried on that count; but was convicted on a charge of forgery and embezzlement. He served eight months of this sentence. He was paroled June 30th, 1930.

Another position was found for him. Apparently throughout the fall of 1930 and the early months of 1931, he lived a model life. However, during those months the town was terrorized by a masked bandit who held up restaurants and small stores invariably making a clean get-away. The police believed a skillful eastern professional had taken up his winter residence in town.

On March 14, 1931, 6:30 P. M. this bandit drove up to a small store in a taxicab, entered it, levelled a pistol at the store-keeper who was about to close for the night, and demanded his money. The store-keeper refused whereupon the bandit shot him, took the money and fled in the waiting car.

His victim, however, was not dead. Upon regaining consciousness, he identified the bandit as W. R. who once had worked for him. There had been trouble over stolen money, this store-keeper had incurred the enmity of W. R. and the latter had vowed vengeance some years before the actual shooting.

W. R. was located in a down-town hotel with a woman of loose character. His victim positively identified him as his assailant before death, which occurred at 4:30 A. M., March 16th, 1931. According to published reports, the only regret he expressed was

that he had not killed his victim outright, as he thought he had done.

In the trial which followed it was established that for many years W. R. had led a double life in which women, parties and drink played a heavy role. As a boy he had given endless trouble, worry and anxiety to his parents, but all through life he had been protected from the consequences of his own misconduct. This is a serious mistake in the training of young people.

At 8:47 P. M., April 20th, 1931, the jury brought in a conviction of murder in the first degree and fixed the penalty at hanging. Execution was later set for July 11th, 1931.

He declared that he would never hang. He said he knew this but he did not know how he knew it.

The appeal was taken to every court and was denied in every court. This automatically deferred the day of execution which was finally set for July 15th, 1932, at 10:00 A. M. On July 13th the sentence was unexpectedly commuted by the governor of the state to life imprisonment.

This horoscope is not a hanging chart although the verdict of judicial sentence of death is clearly indicated in the positions.

The peculiar thing about this man was that he was likeable and in prison was a model of conduct. Had Miss Murdock had the courage of her astrology and convictions, had she known enough psychology, she might have averted the sequence of events which followed by simple warning.

## *Are Earthquakes Predictable?*

THE ANSWER to this question is Yes and No! Earthquakes are predictable as to approximate times, but at present they are not predictable with accuracy as to place.

In this connection the following statements are of interest:

From L. A. NEWS, Jan. 17, 1934—

“Scientists brand quake ‘forecasts’ as entirely bunk. . . . There are certain lines of research in science which may ultimately make definite prediction possible, but the immediate outlook for this is not promising at the present time.”

And again—

“ . . . There is no law against guessing, but it is well to be reminded that predictions about an earthquake in any place at any time emanate either from **grossly ignorant sources**, persons of unsound mind, believers in the occult, publicity seekers or practical jokers.” (Emphasis ours.)

On the other hand, this from the L. A. HERALD-EXPRESS, Jan. 22, 1934—

### **Predicting Earthquakes**

Washington, Jan. 22.—(A.P.) Tilt meters, instruments the Japanese claim can be used to predict earth-

quakes a few hours or even days in advance, have been installed by the coast and geodetic survey at the University of California."

And this excerpt from bulletin of the New York Electrical Society, reprinted in the "Bulletina" of Oct.-Nov.-Dec., 1933—

### NEW FIELD FOR ASTRONOMY

**"Increasingly we are beginning to discover the effect on our own affairs of the cosmical conditions around us. We are learning that unsuspected solar radiations are affecting human affairs in ways little suspected until recently. Researches into the upper atmosphere and into the earth's crust indicate that at least the sun and moon are important in radio reception, earth movements, THE RELEASE OF EARTHQUAKES and perhaps, ultimately, WILL HELP TO SOLVE OUR ECONOMIC CYCLES. Solar conditions, tree growths, weather and the electrical field of our planet and its atmosphere all point to A DEVELOPMENT OF THE NEW FIELD OF COSMIC RELATIONS WHICH MAY BE IMPORTANT TO THE FUTURE OF CIVILIZATION."**

---

Let us first understand what takes place when the earth quakes, or cracks open. An earthquake must occur in rock formation; it cannot occur in soil or sand, therefore when we have an earthquake there is a separation of great masses of rock. Consider for a moment when the earthquake occurred in Long Beach, California, March 10, 1933. Far below the earth's surface great masses of rock extending in a northerly-southerly direction for many miles were pulled apart, probably four or five feet, because the earth's wave movements rose and fell fully four or five feet. The earth's waves were similar in movements to the ocean's waves. The earth could have made such wave movements only as the result of such rock separations as above described, for sand and soil are

not sufficiently rigid to cause such violent earth movements.

From the above it is very evident that the accepted scientific theory that earthquakes are caused by "faults" in the earth's formation; or merely a slipping or sliding of masses of the earth, is incorrect.

Now, if our hypothesis is correct, what is it that pulls rocks apart down beneath the earth's surface? From research we know that earthquakes occur when the planets bear certain relationships with the earth in the solar system. We know that when earthquakes occur there are two or more planets 45, 90, 135 or 180 degrees of the arc apart, in either zodiacal or mundane distances, in their relationship to the earth, or when the planets have the same declination north and south across the equator. Earthquakes cannot occur unless such relationship between the earth and planets exists. Astronomers tell us that certain relationships must exist between the planets and the Sun before sunspots can occur on the face of the Sun. Now, sunspots are sun-quakes, or cracks, on the Sun, produced by the planets, just as the planets produce earthquakes on the earth. It is the magnetic pull of the planets that causes sun-quakes as well as earthquakes.

Some scientist has stated that Jupiter has a magnetic pull against the earth with sufficient strength to break 26 billion bars of steel a foot square. He probably was in error in making the strength of the magnetic pull so definite, but the principle of the planet's magnetic pull is true. Take the time of the Long Beach earthquake to illustrate the relationship of the planets to each other and to the earth:

Pluto and Uranus were 90 degrees of the arc apart in zodiacal distance.

Pluto was in conjunction with the 11th house cusp.

Neptune, Mars, Moon and Moon's Nodes and the Magnetic Centre were all either 45 or 135 degrees in mundane from Pluto or Uranus.

Another fact found to be ever present at the moment the earth cracks open is that the planets "doing the work" are always—

In conjunction with house cusps,

Or bear the above mentioned distances from the mundane house cusps,

Or are in parallel declination with house cusps north and south across the equator.

The earth is apparently insulated against the magnetic forces of the planets and the mundane house cusps seem to be conduits of apparently three degrees of the arc through which the planets can exert their magnetic influence on the earth producing earthquakes, and other phenomena.

On January 15, 1934, at the New Moon, Pluto was opposite the Sun and Moon; Jupiter and Uranus were opposite each other and 90 degrees from the Sun, Moon and Pluto. Now, it did not require a prophet to predict accurately before that date that there would be earthquakes accompanying and following such a configuration of the planets. The earthquake in India, the one in Old Mexico and another one in Nevada were natural phenomena accompanying and following that celestial configuration of the planets.

There is no trouble about predicting the approximate time earthquakes will occur, but it is doubtful if it will ever be possible to predict both the time and place, for, in order to name the place where an earthquake will occur it is necessary to know that a rocky formation exists down in the earth, and it will be hardly possible to have this information over large areas of the earth. If the planets' magnetic pull centres over sand or soil there will be no earthquake. Also, unless the rock formation is such as to permit the rock to separate in an easterly-westerly direction, a crack cannot occur. Cracks in the earth run in a northerly-southerly direction, unless the quake is caused by the planets' magnetic pull north and south across the equator.

Stop at an auto wrecking place, pick up two old Ford horseshoe magnets and put them on a dry paper on a table in front of you. Then arrange two steel nails in angles of 90 degrees from the magnets so that the points of the nails come together at right angles. Then assemble a crushed steel ball between the points of the two nails and you will have an illustration of just what takes place when an earthquake occurs.

Einstein's hypothesis of mass and magnetism at any given time and place answers the question about what causes earthquakes. With Sepharial's Geodetic Equivalents and Johndro's planetary focal points one may determine where the planets' magnetic pull centres at any latitude or longitude on the earth's surface. It is not difficult to determine **when** the planets can produce earthquakes. The real difficulties arise in determining whether the planets' magnetic pull centres in soil or sand, or in rock formation that will permit of separation and therefore produce the quake or crack in the earth.

# *Pluto*

## **An Astrological Study**

**By Baron Otto von Bressensdorff**

(Translated from the German by "Cheiranus")

EDITOR'S NOTE: We have pleasure in introducing herewith the work of a young Austrian writer of promise, already known in his country by several publications of merit on occult subjects, as follows: "Sinn und Ursprung der Planeten Symbole" (Meaning and Origin of the Planetary Symbols), "Die Grundzüge der Hindu Astrologie" (Elements of Hindu Astrology), "Der Maya Kult" (Maya Worship), "Astrologische Farbenlehre" (Astrological Lore on Color), and others in preparation.

The present translator, known to "Bulletina" readers by her interesting presentation of "Uranus and Neptune, Modern Friends in Ancient Garb," published in this magazine in the first quarter of 1930, was asked to prepare the author's draft for publication, and has kindly handed the finished manuscript to us. We think that the time elapsed since its inception has in no way affected the value of its contents, and regret that limitations of space do not permit publishing the complete text. However, we offer these brief excerpts believing that our readers will find therein some novel and interesting thoughts. Although we do not agree with Baron von Bressensdorff that Pluto rules Aries, being inclined to the belief that he rules Scorpio, the "Bulletina" has always maintained an open-minded policy and we hope students may hereby be stimulated to serious research along these lines.

It is a very interesting fact, that the merit of discovering Pluto, not only on the physical plane, but to have foreshadowed him spiritually, is due to American enquirers. As early as 1847, when even Neptune's existence was hardly thought of, A. J. Davis, the famous physician and seer, and a devoted champion of astrology, wrote in his book, "The Principles of Nature, Her Divine Revelations and Voice to Mankind," as follows:

"We must cling spiritually to the opinion that the circle of the Sun's atmosphere extends as far as the orbit of the ninth planet of our solar system." . . . .

Even if we look upon astrology as something vastly more than science pure and simple, more than astronomy and physics, we have no right to neglect the actual facts of the cosmos. Astrology may be a religion, but it must be a natural philosophy first; it must be built up on observation and application of the reality, never on dreams.

To sum up: we have, then, the following series of bodies: Sun, Vulcan, Mercury, Venus, Cybele, Earth (Moon), Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Navre, Uranus, Neptune, Cupid, Hades, Zeus and Kronos.

Now for astrological considerations the Sun and Moon have to be deleted from this list. They reign supreme over the planets and may be visualised as the two poles of a planetary sphere, with the chain of planets suspended between them. The Sun is established as the great central source of energy, whose existence is the essential condition which makes planetary influence possible. The Moon, on the contrary, appears as the medium for conveying and distributing the separate influences to the Earth. The Sun may be compared to a central radio station, while the moons of the individual planets act as receivers. With Sun and Moon set apart, there remains a twofold series of planets, the second one of which cannot be

better described than as an octave of the first, as shown in the following table:

Vulcan . . . . .	Navre
Mercury . . . . .	Uranus
Venus . . . . .	Neptune
Cybele . . . . .	Cupid
Mars . . . . .	Hades (Pluto)
Jupiter . . . . .	Zeus
Saturn . . . . .	Kronos

This table, erected on a speculative astronomical basis, with its 16 units (allowing for Sun and Moon) throws new light upon the rosette of 16 petals which was used in the elamitic picture of the world, and on which is built up the Cabala. And in as much as every planet has two aspects, a positive and a negative one, we here find a clue to the "32 paths of God's wisdom" mentioned in the Bible. The number 32 may also be arrived at by correlating the seven centres of the hermetic natural philosophy, but that in itself does not prove much, since the number seven stands out most conspicuously in our table.

Certainly, there arises the pertinent question: what **scientific** value has this table for us today?

There is no doubt but that conditions in the cosmos have undergone far-reaching changes in the course of the ages; changes, due to a tendency—at any rate since the origin of organic life on the individual celestial bodies—to **simplification**. The astronomical elements of the cosmos are decreasing in number. According to Hoerbiger and others, the moons were once independent planets, outside the sphere of those great stars to which they now belong as satellites. They were captured by the large planets, and therefore now belong, astrologically and astronomically, to the sphere of their captors. Hence the planets and their moons should not be separated: they form a unit in the map of the universe. It is not only the body itself which sends out certain vibrations, but the whole of its surrounding sphere, including anything revolving in

it. Thus the four moons of Uranus (Ariel, Umbril, Titania and Oberon) are astrologically blended into one unit with the planet. The same applies to Saturn and its moons. And this because the sphere of a planet may undergo a marked change by the capturing of a new moon, thereby modifying its astrological influence more or less, especially so, if there happened to be a shifting or joining of bodies autochthonous within our solar system, and which had not entered it from outside, as did the comets or the asteroids. . . . It seems to us therefore an error when people speak of the **extreme** antiquity of the doctrine of the stars, as if it had been handed down through hundreds of thousands of years. Astrology as it is used today presupposes astronomical conditions belonging to a comparatively recent past. It was not possible before the capture of our present Moon, which involved the destruction of Atlantis, and it is not without a good reason that the "World Horoscope" has Cancer on its Ascendant. We may safely maintain that modern astrology which is based on the hermetic knowledge of numbers, owes its origin to the Nordic races and is therefore in its very beginnings not older than 15000 years. . . . . If so, Pluto is not really identical with Cupid, in spite of all the speculations of Witte and his disciples, but rather with the body which Witte elected to call "Hades." And after all, was not Pluto the ruler of Hades? So if the identity of Pluto and Hades is established (in our opinion a matter beyond doubt), Pluto astrologically becomes the octave of Mars. Now with Mars begins the series of planets exterior to our earth, which bears out Pluto's character as that of one who breaks with the old and inaugurates the new; as that of a door, a gateway—a hiatus, a cesura, in the chain of the planets. This conclusion is all the more justified as the earth not only astrologically but also astronomically occupies a unique position in the cosmos. . . . .

From a purely astronomical point of view Pluto appears to be somewhat of an anomaly in the series

of planets on account of its size corresponding to that of the Earth. Astronomers were in the habit of looking for an increase in size and circumference in direct proportion to the distance of the planet from the Sun. Thus Pluto seems to strike a discordant note in the cosmos scale. As it is, even purely astronomically, it gives the impression of a fresh start, as if it were, so to speak, at the head of a new chain of planets. Hermetic science has always correlated external facts to hidden inner principles, and therefore it had to choose the name of Pluto, the ruler of Hades, the god of the world beyond, whose link with our world is reflected in the very fact that he already outwardly marks a new departure, a break, a change of conditions. If Pluto be not merely a body caught from another solar system and dragged into ours, if he really developed in, and forms part of, our organism, then he is the door, the gateway, the symbol of something new.

### **Pluto's Rank in the Hierarchy of the Planets**

Students who are acquainted with various Theosophical theories, will know that many hermetists uphold what is known as "Bode's Law," because it makes Uranus the true limit of our Solar system. Uranus represents in many respects the Sun. Its symbol is a representation of the druidic, or better, nordic sign describing the deity of the solar year, of the path of the Sun, of its whole sphere, and therefore of our cosmos. The diameter of the orbit of Uranus stands in a definite relation to the height of man's body; his revolution in 84 years symbolizes the ideal length of one human incarnation; the seven years which he needs to pass through one sign of the Zodiac correspond to the rhythms of the physiological and psychological development of man, and, last but not least, the approximate movement of Uranus is typical of the intra-uterine life of the embryo, as also of the lunar Zodiac with its classic sub-divisions. All this can be found in our study "Zahl und Kosmos," in

## *Brief Weather Forecasts*

Temperature and Rainfall for Second Quarter of 1934

By L. H. Weston

A VERY BRIEF general weather forecast is given here by means of a table, in which the normals for the calendar months are given and the expected departures from those normals expressed by an algebraical sign. That is, a **plus** would indicate that somewhat more than the given normal is to be expected, while a **minus** sign indicates an expected deficiency, below the normal. Where the \* is inserted no very appreciable departure from the given normal is expected.

The fundamental essential of a weather forecast is to give the probable departure from the seasonal normal of temperature and rainfall. The normals are well known even to close fractions, but as a rule absolute normal weather only rarely prevails, and if we could estimate beforehand the probable way in which the variation would tend, no very much greater refinement is likely to be required.

The 15 stations used in the table are closely representative of the 14 "Aviation Districts" adopted by the U. S. Weather Bureau, but are here extended to include the western provinces of Canada.

The forecasting is by a system derived from the statistical study of the records, but is based upon strict astrological doctrinal, namely, that the Sun, Moon and planets cause weather changes.

Keep in mind that the figures in the table are the station's normals, while the algebraical signs are to indicate the forecasted deviations in the second quarter of 1934.

## *The Economic Outlook*

THE possibility of decided interference with the indications which marked the constructive side of the sharp recovery in security prices between 1932 and 1938 (outlined in these pages in 1932), was strongly hinted in the 1933 forecasts of this department. The extreme breakdown in July 1933, forecast in these pages months in advance, was followed by a period of financial lethargy, uncertainty and an increasing lack of confidence for several months. Finally under the major trine configuration of October, 1933, a renewed urge to optimism accompanied by rising prices was allowed to function by a partial settlement of the monetary uncertainty. However, the plans were sufficiently indefinite to prevent the complete expression of a natural period of rising prices to function entirely, again proving Napoleon's quip, "One can stop when mounting but never when descending." However, as another extremely critical point in mid-January approached, monetary uncertainty was further alleviated and the approaching crisis delayed with a comparatively small rally accompanied by huge volume in security markets. This stop-gap balanced the sluggishness of the preceding weeks so that the goal was reached only two weeks later than we had expected some six months before.

There is little to change in the observations made on the general outlook in recent issues. Only this, that the third quarter of 1934 has developed a far

more critical portent than was first considered in our long range view made in 1932. The question of whether or not prices, instead of higher wages and profits, is to be the practical way to repay debts can remain a moot question for the present, along with the multiplicity of new economic problems. At any rate students might well note that since August 1933 planetary interaction has been working in almost exact reverse marketwise at critical points of the minor trends. The points of affliction continue to time news events of violence and tragedy but marketwise they have been timing sharp rallies. On the other hand strongly favorable minor aspects have been timing declines. To an observer it indicates a fear complex of the masses marketwise. A clue to the basic cause may be had by a review of the events which immediately followed the August, 1932, eclipse and the conjunction of Jupiter and Neptune about the same time.

The second quarter of 1934 is expected to be sensational so far as the financial world is concerned. Tremendous activity is expected to be delayed until immediately following mid-April, however, when the climax is passed of the three-sided struggle of labor, capital and politics. In the period transportation investments are expected to receive the greatest attention. Communication and commodity items will be particularly favored. During the remainder of the quarter upward progress is expected to be made in business activity and prices. As soon as the end of June is approached another period of caution begins which is expected to lead to events which culminate in the crisis expected early in the fourth quarter of 1934.

The most critical days to be noted for accentuation or reversal in market trends are:

**In April**, the 2nd, 7th, 14th-16th, 19th and 23rd.

**In May**, the 3rd, 5th, 7th, 15th, 17th, 23rd and 31st.

**In June**, the 1st, 10th, 16th, 21st, and particularly the 28th.

## *A Coincidence*

CONSIDERING the fact that some of the French, Italian and Russian statesmen have recently given voice to a string of what is technically called "balderdash," in the form of war talk in which the United States government's name is particularly mentioned, it may be of some interest to note that this really is the "open season" for calamity howlers and war prophets of the loose-jawed variety, because, as is well known, April is the war month for the United States government. That is, this government always starts its major wars in or very near the month of April.

Strictly, the period is that part of the year between April 9th and May 16th, when the Sun is in 35 degrees of ecliptic longitude lying between 20° and 55°. This may be seen from the following list of nine government wars, published a number of years ago in several newspapers. The dates are supposed to be those of the opening of hostilities or the formal declaration of war:

Battle of Lexington and Concord . . . . .	April 19, 1775,—30 Deg.

The Sun's longitude is given in order to show that the grouping of dates is near and usually just after the Sun reaches longitude 30, about April 19th. It is also to indicate the astronomical feature of the coincidence.

It would be like denying the perfectly obvious to affirm that there was no coincidence here, for it is one of the very best examples of the kind that we know of, and unless we wish to abandon all of the commonest rules of ratiocination we must assume there may be an astronomical cause connecting such coincidences.

As a matter of fact these mere solar groupings of war dates, while of the highest significance, are by no means the limit of astronomical coincidences easily shown to be connected with the case. For instance: We can see at once that Mars is peculiarly and significantly situated on each of the dates. Take the battle of Lexington and Concord; when war was opened on the reigning government by a revolutionary foe, Mars was very near the planet Neptune. At the battle of the President and Little Belt Mars was near Saturn. At the Baltimore Massacre Mars was exactly in conjunction with Uranus. At the battle of Manila Bay Mars was exactly opposite Jupiter. At the occupation of Vera Cruz (to suppress a rebellion), Mars was again in conjunction with Neptune. When war was declared on Austria Mars was near the Sun.

In tonight's "Herald" under the heading "Next 67 years to be Warm, Dry, Claim," is an article about the talk of H. W. Clough and Clayton at the meeting in Cambridge, Mass. I trust that "Bulletina" readers noted what he states about the 37 year heat cycle and the price of wheat. Also that he mentions the 83 year cycle and states that the last of the wet period was about 1860.

Turn to your ephemeris and you will note that in 1860-61 Neptune crossed the first point of Aries. As the period of Neptune is 165 years, one-half of that time is 83 years.

In a letter recently received from a young, ambitious student is exemplified the impatience with known and exacting methods now and then encountered in the

novice, which usually manifests in neglect or imperious treatment of them, which redounds to the discredit of astrology. It is unwise to snatch a handful of seemingly objectionable features and try ruthlessly to demolish or eliminate them by rushing to the nearest lecture platform or pressroom to denounce them, especially when the charge is principally that they retard speed or are seemingly complicated. Those who have made a careful study of astrology over a long period of time realize the necessity of **utilizing**, rather than eliminating, all the known elements which are avenues of influence, in order to derive a simple but accurate deduction of their probable effects. But read the following extract from the letter:

Dear Sirs:

If astrologers would cut the inconsequential aspects, namely vigintile, quindecile, semi-quintile, and bi-quintile from their work and thus make it simple enough to use accurately in the prediction of an event, the improvement would be marked. It is an error to use too many aspects; it resolves to a needless state of complication.

The fact is **there are no inconsequential aspects**. Ptolemy is credited with preserving for posterity the major aspects used by the ancients. But Kepler discovered the minor aspects and careful astrologers have since proved the value of their use.

The birth chart is a diagram of the zodiac appropriately drawn for a certain time and place to portray the vibratory relationships of the planets as qualified in strength and character by their angular relation to the earth. Hence there are minor and major aspects, or rays of influence, designated as favorable (anabolistic) or unfavorable (katabolistic) in accordance with the particular angle formed with rays focusing upon the earth. In other words, astrol-

ogy is the science of life's reactions to planetary vibrations.

Deducing the effects of major aspects in natal charts in relation to the reactions expressed as character, is not difficult, as they are positively expressed in the metabolism that so largely influences thought and action.

The influence of the minor aspects indicated in a natal chart are more subtle or obscure in their effect upon an individual, but their action upon the metabolism is far from inconsequential; they may be small but they comprise necessary activating elements in the delicately balanced human organism.

For the reason that it is difficult readily to discern in an individual the working of most of the minor aspects, and the fact that the action of major aspects supplies so much material for study and observation in the mental, physiological and psychological expressions, it is not insisted that the student rigidly observe some of the lesser aspects in a nativity.

It is in the progressed horoscope that the effect of the minor aspects is most readily apparent. Their effects upon the mind and body are easily detected when it happens that no major progressed aspect is in operation at the same time. Therefore careful astrologers, aware of this fact, take the time to calculate and include these factors, which among the slower and more ponderous planets operate over a long period of time, and are a feature that to some extent influences moods, tendencies, attitudes, resolutions, actions and events. Consequently in the effort to give a client **all the information possible** these elements should rightly be included in the progressed horoscope.

To do justice to astrology and properly present it as a means of guidance to meet the changing conditions of life more intelligently and adequately, as they appear in sequence, all the known astrological elements should be observed. Fortunately, practical experience

in horoscope work teaches discriminating astrologers the importance of utilizing these factors and the value of their use as occasions indicate. In some cases their use gives the simple explanation of conditions that occur, while the omission of such an aspect might create the quandary of a condition without an indice!

Dec. 28-29-30, 1933—William Penn Hotel

Briefly cited, the high lights of the program were as follows—

### Lectures

**Henry J. Gordon, M. D.**, President of the N. A. A., outlined the meaning of the terms ASTROLOGIAN and "Astrologist," the object being to educate the masses as to the true meaning of a horoscope, and what is real and useful as distinguished from that which is false and useless. He also spoke on "The Solution of our Crime Problem Through Astrology" and "How to Plan Children with the Aid of Astrology."

**Attorney P. M. Cancelliere**, Vice-President, spoke on "Legal Phases in the Practice of Astrology." Other addresses were—

**Cedric W. Lemont**, State Chairman for Ohio, "Applicability of Astrology."

**Paul G. Clancy**, Editor of "American Astrology."

**Burton N. Brooks**, Pa. State Chairman, "Planetary Positive and Negative Polarities."

**Attorney W. G. Negley**, "Cost of our Crime Problem," quoted statistics showing that not less than 13 billion dollars is wasted annually in connection with our non-producing prison population, and how astrological training in youth would result in enormous saving to taxpayers.

A Code of Ethics was read and submitted for discussion, and the assembly took up the serious task of formulating a set of standard examination questions in connection with the creation of a National Board of Examiners for the purpose of securing legal protection for qualified and honest astrologians.

### Experiences of a Tyro

Dear "Bulletin"—

If one has always had a sneaking likeness for the occult, some day it is going to come out all over like the measles.

One day to my amazement and delight, I ran across an advertisement of a College of Astrology in Los Angeles.

That day a letter was sent with a request for their "cat" and a check for the current "Astrological Bulletin."

The Bulletin arrived, and was promptly devoured from cover to cover, and then came the invitation to visit some friends at their summer home on Boston Harbor.

You know the old saying: "Fools rush in....." the last chapter entitled "Relations between Cosmos and Microcosmos." Hermetically this view is only justified, when we consider the Sun as distinct from the group of seven; Uranus then becomes a kind of representative of the Sun. In that case Neptune does not belong strictly to our solar system, or merely to its "aura." But in one way or another, Uranus always begins something, or ends something, be it the "aura," or the octave.

So also does Pluto. Astronomically, as we have said, he inaugurates something new; he is a gateway, a break, a cesura. Symbolically, as we shall see presently, he sums up the whole evolving world, as a reflection of the divine spirit. This leads us on to enquire on what basis we shall assign him position in astrology. Esoterically the planets—like everything else that can lay claim to spiritual relations—arrange themselves into a trinity. Frank Glahn in his essay on a "Symbol for Pluto" ("Zenith" March 1931) divides this trinity as follows: "Urseits," or "Being Everywhere=(the state **preceding** manifestation); "Diesseits," or Being Here=(manifestation in the **here** and **now**); "Jenseits," or Being Beyond=(the state of the **future**, of four dimensional consciousness, that which succeeds manifestation); a division based on apparent function in time. And indeed, we concur in this view, inasmuch as the Sun and Moon, as well as the somewhat indeterminate Mercury (but **not** Jupiter, as Glahn thinks) partake by their astrological effects more of the hidden side of existence: the growing, the springing-up, the coming into being. On them depend in a map the mental and spiritual foundations of the individuality. The planets which rule the "Being Here," i.e., Venus, Mars, Jupiter and Saturn, determine mainly the external details and circumstances. (To be continued.)

Many other dates could be brought in to show the reality and also the peculiarities of these coincidences, such for example as the great quadruple conjunction of April 17th to 19th, 1850, when the famous Thirty-first Congress was seething upon the fires of the Omnibus Bill, but since Mars was not present at this conjunction the worst that happened was the prophesy of war by John C. Calhoun, the declaration of war by Bob Toombs, the fulminations of Henry Clay and Daniel Webster and the sudden death of President Taylor.

However, we may see for ourselves what things look like at the next "coincidence," on April 19th, 1934, when there will be a triple conjunction of Sun, Mars and Uranus exactly on the United States Government's justly famous "red letter" day. Of course, being in the midst of an era of profound peace, real old war can hardly be expected, but the "coincidence" would be reasonably satisfactory if the Government received a disagreeable jolt or two and did some fancy dodging to keep out of diplomatic entanglements.

## *Planetary Phenomena*

According to Astrology.

NOTE: The times stated in the "Bulletina" are Pacific Standard time unless otherwise stated.

### APPARENT DIFFERENCE BETWEEN "BULLETINA" and "MOON SIGN BOOK"

The planetary aspects as given in the "ASTROLOGICAL BULLETINA" (quarterly) show the time of their exact **culmination**, or the moment of **maximum intensity** and are given in the order of their astronomical sequence without reference to any other aspect.

In the "MOON SIGN BOOK" (annual) the favorable and unfavorable days are indicated by the **combined** astrological influences of planetary aspects, just as the chemist finds that by mixing certain elements a compound is produced; so in reality there is no difference between the indications in these two publications, nevertheless it is improper to check the daily indications of the "Guide" against the "Bulletina" culminating aspects.

The aspects in the "Bulletina" may be said to represent **volts** in electricity which stand for **force**; the aspects in the "Guide" compared to **amperes** which represent **volume**. Volts and amperes are entirely different conditions of the same principle and, therefore, although registering the same element, are not to be checked against each other.

### CONDENSED LIST OF IMPORTANT DAYS

On the dates marked **good**, be active in advancing your interests in business and personal matters.

On dates marked **adverse**, retrench, conserve, safeguard the health and avoid risky ventures.

On days marked good in "**Condensed List of Important Days**" it is well to spend extra time in recreation, in reading an inspiring book, or in doing something interesting; do something you really **want** to do, which has the influence of interest, recreation, harmony, progress, business, friendly cooperation or philanthropy.

Whenever one of **your** good days happens also to be one of the good days in the following list, it is especially favorable for making important efforts and tends to insure progress in those things which are possible for you. Your destiny is in the making.

## PLANETARY TIME TABLES

### Instructions for Practical Application

The **Planetary Time Tables** show in **Pacific Standard Time** exactly when every planetary aspect is **complete** each day. At times stated the aspects are at maximum intensity.

Suppose you receive a business proposition, or a letter stating that someone is ill. You are anxious to know the outcome. Turn to "Planetary Time Tables" in "Bulletina" and note the nature of the aspect which occurs **NEXT after the time you received it**. If it is beneficent in nature it is an indication that the matter should terminate beneficially or the sick recover. But if the next aspect is of adverse nature it is an unfavorable indication for the matter.

It should be clearly understood that the time taken must be when you **FIRST** hear the news, receive the proposition or **READ** the letter. In other words, the **time of the birth** of the idea in your mind, will show by the next oncoming aspect what to expect of the outcome. Do not use an aspect that has **passed**.

Suppose you receive a letter saying that someone is about to lose their business, and reference to the Planetary Time Tables shows that the next aspect after reading the letter is benign in nature. You have reason to believe that the matter would not turn out so badly as your correspondent expected and that there is a chance to avoid the difficulty. Whereas, if the next aspect had been of adverse nature it is quite likely the dire news would prove true. In either case the advance information thus gained may be made of immense value.

If you note the hour and date that you meet a person for the first time you can tell how that acquaintanceship will terminate by the nature of the **next oncoming aspect**, in the "Planetary Time Tables."



given planets, powers directed to definite ends. To the circlets were attached the corresponding gems, both gem and metal being of the same chemical content. The Mars bloodstone, to name but one example, was invariably affixed to the arms of ancient soldiery and by them used to staunch the flow of battle wounds. Superstition? Perhaps, but the iron pyrites to which the bloodstone owes its color is precisely the same chemical employed in modern surgery for the same purpose.

And electrum, that ancient metal to which Assyriologists and Egyptologists vaguely refer as a "compound of gold and silver" was in reality a composition of the **seven** sacred metals, the tediously exact formula for which is in the writer's possession. Minute directions for its progressive manufacture carry one through a year or more, each ingredient being added only when governing planets are propitiously aspected. (To be continued.)




