PROSPECTUS OF A NEW

SPIRITUAL NEWSPAPER.

It has become necessary for Spiritualism to reveal itself to man by all the appliances and agencies that can operate upon the human mind. The Mediums do their work; but, in the main, they influence only the individual who in each instance is addressed, and other agencies are wanted whereby the minds and souls of the millions can be reached at once, and they be induced to consider the great revelation which is now being made to the world.

After ages of spiritual blindness and degradation, the race have reached a point where old opinions, tenets and dogmas do not satisfy the cravings of the immortal soul; and the brilliant lights which science now kindles in the heavens, and the caverns of earth, themselves illumine and verify the facts and developments of Spiritualism. Religion and Philosophy, long divorced, must be married on earth, as they have always been married in heaven; and "The Banner of Light" will lend its aid, whatever it may be, in

Man must be told to look for spiritual truth, not in the logical syllogisms of creeds, nor in the cold maxims of a cruel theology, but in the Word of God alone; and Spiritualism but throws that light across the pages of the Bible, as will enable it to be read understandingly. It will be no fault of the conductors of "The Banner of Light," if Spiritualism is not relieved of one of the most false and grievous charges that is made against it by worldliness and skepticism.

To the friends and proselytes, therefore, of Spiritualism, scattered through the land, (and they are now numbered by millions,) the projectors of "The Banner of Light" appeal for encouragement and support. It is hoped and believed that they will respond in a manner worthy of the great interests which it is proposed to advocate, and the important truths that are to be expounded.
