#### THE EDITOR'S OBSERVATORY.

#### Volume XX.

With this issue we commence the twentieth Volume of the JOURNAL. In the last issue we mentioned about the programme for the coming year. A series of monthly articles on "New Factors in Directing" commences in this issue, and articles on the influence of the planet Neptune also appear. The 1927 editions of these two publications, separate and combined, are now ready and can be obtained from the publishers of the Journal. No student of Astrology can afford to be without the Ephemeris, which contains all that is necessary for Astrological requirements during the year. The publications, which are now in their 107th year are well printed on good paper, their contents are excellently arranged, and they contain a mass

of information useful both for the student of the science and the man in the street.

May we, however, respectfully suggest to the compilers that more care be taken with the maps. Those on page 63 are unreadable, are not proper maps, while the figures are mere scrawls. The Astro-picture gallery map is both carelessly and slovenly drawn, many of the figures are indistinguishable, and out of alignment, and the whole figure compares very unfavourably with the neatly drawn horoscopes of earlier issues.

#### The British Astrological Society.

The autumn session of this Society commenced on September 23rd, with a General Meeting, and an address by the President, on the subject of "The Practical uses of Astrology in everyday life." The attention of London students is drawn to the Lectures, which commence at 8.15 p.m. every Thursday evening. They are open to the public and are not restricted to members. 
## HOROSCOPE OF THE MONTH.

By E. H. BAILEY, F.A.S.

#### RUDOLPH VALENTINO.

Rudolph Valentino, the great film star, whose untimely death has recently taken place, was born at 3.30 a.m., May 6th, 1895 at Castellaneta, Italy. Standard time having been adopted on 1st. November, 1893, the correct local time would be 3h. 37m. 48s. a.m. Correction by the Prenatal Epoch gives 3h. 36m. 1s. a.m., for which the accompanying map is drawn.

Rudolph Alfonzo Raffaelo Pierre Filibert Guglielmi di Valentina d'Antonguella was the



son of an Italian physician of Castellaneta. It is stated that he was a "wild boy." Mars ruler of the ascendant in Cancer, conjoined with Jupiter would well account for this. At 13 he left college with honours. Mercury sextile Caput would give good intellectual abilities, and at this time the ascendant would be sextile Jupiter and trine Fortuna. Before he was 18, he had had many an escapade at Monte Carlo and Paris.

At the age of 18, his mother gave him £800 and sent him to America. He squandered this money immediately—Mars conjunction Jupiter in Cancer in the fourth. He then obtained a position as landscape gardener to a Long Island

millionaire. Afterwards he was penniless and homeless; slept under the bushes in Central Park, New York, and, it is said, cleaned brass to earn his supper. After many vicissitudes he obtained a small part in the Hollywood studios. Here Rex Ingram, who produced "The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse" came along, gave him the leading part in his film, and he became famous in a bound. It is stated that his face was worth £26,000 a year to him.

The horoscope shows cardinal signs on angles, a sure indication of fame. The Leo navamsa of the Leo decan of Aries rises, giving additional power to the Sun and the fifth house—dancing, drama, etc.—Leo being the fifth sign. Venus is in the Aries navamsa of Gemini and therefore throws its influence on to the ascendant, and having the conjunction of Neptune—the planet ruling cinemas, is typical of his success in this sphere. The Moon on the cusp of the seventh, is in a Sagittarius navamsa of Libra, and with the former sign on the ninth cusp denotes his public success in foreign lands.

He was unlucky in marriage. The Moon on the cusp of the seventh applies to a square of Mars; being in a navamsa of a double sign, ruled by Jupiter, he married again after divorce from his first wife, and his second wife divorced him in 1925. Saturn in the seventh house, and with the Aquarius decan of Libra on the seventh cusp, this planet played an important part in these events.

His great fascination over women was due to the Venus sub-influence on the ascendant and its conjunction with Neptune. As the Editor of the Daily Express states "For seven years he ruled and reigned over women of all ages and races—possessed a mysterious power over their imagination which they were incapable of resisting. In every nation they were enslaved by his smile, by his gestures, by the glitter of his eyes, by his manner, by his gait, by his amorous airs." And in spite of it all, there was not one woman at his death bed.

He died on August 23rd, 1926, from complications following an operation for appendicitis—note Uranus in Scorpio on the cusp of the eighth house. Scorpio rules the appendix.

Venus is conjoined with Jupiter in Gemini, in the ninth house, another indication of his success

in foreign lands, especially America, ruled by Gemini. The Moon is in the seventh house, conjoined with Mars and opposition Saturn, the two planets being dignified, but all three well aspected by Neptune at the time of death. Mars had progressed to a square of the radical

Sun.

I note that our contemporary, Modern Astrology has published Valentino's Horoscope for 3 a.m., but the map is loosely cast, and the planet's longitudes are very incorrectly computed. The time of birth, 3.30 a.m. was given to me by Mr. George J. McCormack of the American Academy of Astrologeans, and was received from Valentino direct. The time given may therefore be accepted as correct, as it is confirmed by his father's death at the age of eleven, the ascendant being then in opposition to Saturn, ruler of the tenth house.

# THE KALEIDOSCOPE.

By SEPHARIAL.

ASTROLOGY CONFIRMED .-- My readers will bear in mind—I have never given them a chance to forget—that from purely astrological data, the Great Tribulation, which is the burden of all the prophecies, is to begin in 1928. Premonitory signs are found in the lunar eclipse of December, 1927, which falls in opposition to Saturn and Mars, and is followed by a significant partial eclipse of the Sun, which falls on the place of Mars in the World Horoscope. In the same horoscope for 1928, we find a conjunction of Sun, Mars and Saturn in the sign Leo. Then in January, 1929, there is an opposition of Saturn and Mars on the horizon of the Great Mutation horoscope of 1842. Whatever else may be determined upon, it is certain that this configuration of the planets will bring chaos to the world. In this connection it is noted that Rev. M. P. Baxter fully expected the termination of the present Age in 1929, and dates the 1,335 Mohammedan years (1,295 solar) from 634 A.D. Here I think he erred, for the Hegira was in 622. and the calendar of 1,335 years dates from then. Accordingly the 1,295 solar years (1,335 lunar) would terminate in 1917, and this accordingly happened, not in the termination of the Age, as suggested, but in the liberation of Palestine from the voke of Islam. This was anticipated by Gratton Guinness as far back as 1879, when he specifically affirmed that Jerusalem would then be liberated from the Turks. This event happened on 9th December in 1917. Baxter has affirmed that the last day of the present Dispensation will coincide with the last day of a Passover Week, which comes at the end of seven years of a covenant made between Israel and Judah and "the prince of a people" that should come. He suggests that this may be from 13th April, 1922, to 25th April, 1929 (taking a day for a year), and hence by the addition of seven literal days, he reaches 2nd May, 1929. But it is at all times obvious that Baxter's chronology is faulty, or perhaps I should say, his notation, and starting from incorrect data he arrives at incorrect conclusions. Now the Treaty of Locarno was one that was formed "with many for a week," and it was signed on 1st December, 1925. It is this Treaty that forms the basis of the prophecy of the final "week" as I have shown in the detailed statement of "Prophetic Periods." I refer my readers to the prophecy concerning the

last seven years, published in August, 1924. It is there shown that the "week" determined upon Israel and Judah for their sins, began in -588. i.e., in the 6th year of Zedekiah the king, in the 6th month, and the 5th day of the month. Consequently, it will end in October, 1932, if the dating is from the Sacred month, or in April of that year if the Civil month be taken. In either case the year is 1932. Various interpreters prefer the Passover, which falls in April, others the Feast of Trumpets, which falls in October, and in 1932 on the 1st October. But from the prophecy that in the Millennial period, the Feast of Tabernacles will annually be observed as the one great day of Assembly throughout Christendom, it would appear that some great and signal event is going to happen on that very day, and if we are justified in regarding the 6th October as the date of the Nativity in the year -3, this being the Feast of Tabernacles in that year, the significance of the anniversary is obvious. For Christ came and "tabernacled" among us as the Son of Man. Hereafter He will again tabernacle among us as the Son of God. for "the last enemy to be overcome is death," and having overcome Death and Hell, all power has been given to Him in heaven and on earth. That power is at work now, and a mighty "sifting" is going on throughout the world, so that at the end of two years the nations will come under judgment. Then the order will go forth: "Prepare war, wake up the mighty men, let all the men of war draw near and come up. Beat your ploughshares into swords and your pruning hooks into spears, and let the weak say 'I am strong." The visionary project of Disarmament which economists and politicians insist upon is condemned as strongly now as when it was advanced by Lloyd George in 1914, when Budget proposals for reduction of Army and Navy estimates were put forward, and which would have been disastrous to the Nation, but that the First Sea Lord was providentially prevented from dispersing the Fleet after the Naval Review. Our proverbial unpreparedness for war has ever been the cause of enormous expenditure of life and substance, which might have been avoided. Wars are not a part of the Divine plan. They are expressly the fruit of our own disregard of that plan, the results of our greed, lust, selfishness and extortion. It is not for us to rush into

war, or to devise schemes of aggression upon our neighbours—for it is written that he who "takes to the sword " must perish by it—but it is for us to be prepared like "a strong man armed that keepeth the gates of the city, that he who dwells therein may abide in peace." Those who preach disarmament at this time are the enemies of their people. "They prophesy out of their own hearts, saying: Peace, peace, where there is no peace. But they have not gone up into the breaches nor filled up the ranks of Israel for the battle in the day of the Lord." If any man was entitled to regard war as an effectual means of putting down the oppressor, it was Lord Roberts. He it was who in 1912 went up and down the country preaching preparedness for war. He was a prophet in Israel. The rulers of the nation turned a deaf ear upon him and the inevitable holocaust happened. Russia has now 2,000 aeroplanes and 70,000 aeronauts in regular training. The Romanoffs have betrayed a people, but the Romans have betrayed the world. This is a saying that will not be believed except by those who have been "listening in." The Locarno Treaty will be broken "in the midst of the week" of years, and astrologically we have set the time for October, 1928. Now let us ask the Prime Minister what he is going to do about it, and pass on the same question to that large body of Socialists whose placent policy is disarmament. The law of the oppressor is that the unarmed must pass into slavery without distinction. What do the leaders of the people say to it?

GEODETICS AND CHRONOLOGY.—It has been said that ancient records show that the stars jumped into new positions after the Flood. I have no authority for this statement, but there is more to be said for it than at first appears. In connection with the prophecy; "Behold I make all things new. . . . And I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the former things were passed away," I have suggested that a change in the inclination of the earth's axis to the plane of the orbit, would produce both a new earth and a new heaven, the former by a change in climatic conditions over all parts of the globe, and the latter by the incident of declination of the stars which would be thereby changed. is Biblical authority, for such as recognise it, in regard to the change of axis. "Behold the Lord maketh the earth empty, and maketh it waste, and turneth it upside down, and scattereth the inhabitants thereof." That idea of turning the world upside down may have a spiritual interpretation, but if so, it has also a physical application, for the world of matter is subject to the

world of Mind. Now we know approximately the area involved in the Biblical narrative of the Flood. We find the inland salt lakes all within that area. The Dead Sea is one example, and there are vast quantities of salt in deposit all over the surface of the land there, and in the beds of the rivers. Another example is the lake discovered by Sven Hedin, the Swedish explorer in Thibet. There he reports to finding a Salt Lake that is at least ten times larger than the Dead Sea, and which contains a greater degree of salt in suspension, while the bed of the lake, when sounded, was found to be an unbroken bed of salt, which, on being bored, showed a thickness of no less than 800 yards. Well then, we are bound to ask how this great salt deposit took place if not by evaporation of seawater? The Caspian Sea, the Aral, and other lakes in that area are salt, and the surrounding sand deserts are highly impregnated with salt. Again, the chalk deposits of the Cretaceous period were formed by an accumulation of microscopic shells, showing that the continent having a chalk deposit of nearly a thousand feet in depth must have been a very long time under water at some period in the earth's history. In other words, submarine beds had been brought up to the level of the chalk strata, or even to the surface of the land, and afterwards covered by the accumulation of soil and other deposits. This agrees with the statement that at the Flood, the "fountains of the great deep were broken up." The conclusion come to is that as the chalk beds are on top of the coal beds in England, the whole country must have been under the sea for thousands of years before it was brought up by some great submarine upheaval. What has happened here may have happened in most other parts of the world at some time or other in the long history of our earth.

The question then arises as to what effect any such change of inclination in the earth's axis may have had upon chronology since the Flood. The obvious reply is, absolutely none. Any change of axial inclination of the earth would not affect the relative positions of the Sun and Moon in respect to one another, but only in respect to declination. We have no authority for even suggesting that the Sun and Moon were in any way affected by the terrestrial cataclysm at the time of the Flood, or that the ordinances of the Sun and Moon were in any way altered. On the contrary there is superlative evidence to show that ever since they were set in their appointed orbits in the heavens they have preserved the same relationship, forming their conjunctions and oppositions with perfect regularity. Thus days



and months would continue uninterruptedly as from the beginning of time, and the only difference observable would be that eclipses would affect different latitudes. Unfortunately we have no predeluvian eclipses on record, and have no means of showing the change effected by the presumed alteration in the axial inclination of the earth, i.e., by change in the obliquity of the ecliptic.

Applied to chronology we find a direct line through from Adam to Christ. The conquest of Babylon by Cyrus was in the year -536, which was the first year of Cyrus as supreme monarch in Babylon, and the year of the Edict. Through Nabonidas 17 years, Nergalsharezar 4 years, Evilmarduk 2 years and Nebuchadnezzar 43 years, we reach the first year of Nebuchadnezzar in -602, and as it was in the 10th year of his reign that he deposed Jehoiachin at Jerusalem, this event took place in -592. Thirty years earlier the Israelitish captivity began under Nabopolasser, in -622 or 623. Judah was under kingship for 506 years prior to the burning of the Temple in the 11th year of Zedekiah -583, and therefore the 1st year of Saul was -1089. Prior to this Israel was under Judges for 397 years back to the time of the Exodus -1486. From the Exodus to the Call of Abraham was 430 years, -1916, at which date Abraham was 75 years of age, so that he was born in -1991. From Abraham to the Flood was 352 years, -2343, which gives the birth of Noah in -2943. The genealogies from Adam to Noah give a total of 1,056 years, so that the Adamic date is -3999. As this is an astronomical epoch when the Full Moon occurred at the autumnal equinox, it serves as a starting point for all chronology, more especially as it is a Full Moon that happened on a Sabbath. The fact that the Ark moved on the face of the waters for 150 days under the direction of a "strong wind," clearly shows that Mount Ararat where it finally rested was far away from the original site where it was first lifted up by the waters. It was upon a new world that Noah emerged after 365 days in the Ark. Geography dates from the Flood, chronology from Adam.

Here follows the astronomical proof that the Sun was on the meridian of Greenwich at Date, 24th October, -3999 (4000 B.C.), at noon, and at same time on the equinox at Full Moon.

THE GREAT LAW .- Fundamental to all interpretation of Scripture prophecy, we have to admit the working power of Pi, which is the function of the Great Equator. As Equator it is co-extensive with the whole sphere of existence whether spiritual or physical, to both of which it stands in direct relations in the capacity of Atoner. Hence, Pi is the numerical expression of Christ, who is the Great Equator. diameter stands in relation to the circle as the Equator does to the sphere. The relativity is expressed by the number 3.1416 in extenso The digits of this mysterious number add to 15, which in the Hebrew are Yod 10, and Hey 5, together giving the name Jah, as in the doxology concluding with the word "Hallelujah" i.e. Let us praise Jah, according to the injunction "Praise Him in His name Jah, and rejoice before Him." The part that this factor of Pi plays in all chronological and prophetic enumeration can only be realised when it is brought into evidence. has not escaped the notice of Pyramid students, with whom it is a prime factor. In this connection we may note that the value of Pi is usually expressed by 357/113 or 3.14159 etc. Its completed expression is 3.1416 and this is derived from 357.357/113.75. These values are found in remarkable evidence in Pyramid relations. Thus the Great Step, which is 36 inches and which stands at the South end of the Grand Gallery and affords access to the horizontal passage leading directly to the King's Chamber, has been found to have a chronological value of

65 years, the Grand Gallery terminating in 1844 and the horizontal passage beginning in 1909. This hiatus is referred to as the period of Restitution. The H.P. ends in 1936. The six thousand years will end in 2001 A.D. If we add. the years of Restitution to 1936, we obtain just 2001. Taking the Great Step as 65 years, half this period is 32½ which are the years of Christ's life on earth during which He tabernacled with Half this period is 161 years, which is the extent in inches of that remarkable feature called the Granite Leaf, but better expressed as the Portcullis or Gateway. It is a symbol of Election, for none can pass that Gateway except he give the Sign and Password. Even so, that Portcullis is at this present day held up by Divine grace. But the day will come when a great earthquake shall shake the Pyramid, the suspended Granite Leaf will tremble in its sockets and fall. Thereafter none may pass. There shall be a time no longer. In spiritual Numbers the number of the Elect is 153, symbolised by the Fishes (ichthues) and the Net (to diktuon) from the right side of the Ship. The Elect are otherwise known as "Sons of God" which in the Hebrew is Beni-ha Elohim, the numerical value of which is 153. When the number of the Elect shall be completed, and it is known only to the Great Enumerator, the Door will be shut. Then will begin the Great Tribulation "such as was not since the world began, nor ever shall be."

Now this number 153 is represented in the Pyramid by the length of the two low passages leading on the horizontal level to the King's Chamber. They are respectively 51.2 inches, and 101.8 inches. The first answers to the number of months in the duration of the Great War, 4th August, 1914-11th November, 1918, namely 4y. 3m. 6d., while the latter answers to the period of 3½ years or 42 months, or 1,260 days. There are just that number of days between the 6th October, 1928, and the vernal equinox of 1932-20th March inclusive. We know that "power is given unto the beast to continue for forty-two months" and therefore the last low Passage of 101.8 inches = 42 months. The relations of the two passages may be correctly expressed as 51 to 102, so that the First Low Passage is just half the length of the Second Low Passage. Hence we find that certain features of the Pyramid structure appear to bear definite one-seventh relations to one another. Thus, in the measure of 113.75 inches, one-seventh is 16.25 inches, the measure of the Portcullis; two.sevenths is 32.5 or years of Christ's life on earth; three-sevenths is 65 inches, the time interval denoted by the Great Step.

Again, the two low passages together amount to 153 inches, the Antechamber is 77 inches, and the Bridge including the Portcullis is 39 inches. This Bridge extends from the end of the First Low Passage to the South side of the Portcullis, and its floor is half of limestone and half of granite. Referred to their true proportions we find that they are 153,76.5 and 38.25 inches respectively, and are in the relations of 3,2 and 1 sevenths. Their full value is therefore 267.75 which is the measure from the beginning of the Great War 1914, to the King's Chamber entrance. Although this period measures to the autumn of 1936, we have to remember that our Lord specifically stated that "those days" should be shortened. He was speaking directly to the days of the Great Tribulation and not to any period of time either before or after it. When further it is said that he who cometh up out of the Pit, whose number is 666, and to whom the Evil One shall give his power, must continue for 42 months as head of a political Power symbolically called "the Beast," we are assured that the period of the Tribulation will not extend beyond  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years, i.e., to Easter 1932. Now let us consider the spiritual side of this matter. Two principles exist in this world, Good and Evil. Each springs from its own source and is the fruit of a tree seeding seed after its own kind. You cannot get figs from thistles. The accumulated forces of good and evil must finally come into conflict, light against darkness, the seed of the Serpent against the children of light who by redemption are the Sons of God. The idea that the world can continue indefinitely with the heaped up forces of good and evil side by side, is to suggest an eternal dualism against which both religion and reason protest. As there was a beginning, so there must be an end. We are assured by all the prophetic writers that there is a time set for the end. That time is now at hand. Think for a moment what this means. It means, if you believe that it means anything at all, that hundreds of thousands of people now living will be swept away by earthquake, famine, pestilence, tempest, war and persecution in one form or another during the next six years. Either that, or you must repudiate all prophecy, and not the Word only but its two witnesses, the Stars in heaven and the Pyramid on earth. Preliminary warnings have been given in every part of the world. There have been extraordinary earthquakes and tempests, "These things are the beginning of sorrows." Assuredly these are days for the lifting up of heads.

GREAT BRITAIN AND THE PI RATIO.

Here are some notes communicated by a correspondent whose investigation of the functions of the Pi Ratio are unique and probably more extensive than those of any living person. I have no means of checking the decimal values cited in illustration, but if found correct on investigation, the conclusion to be drawn is astounding. [S.]:—

"A well known student of the Great Pyramid recently stated that the Pi ratio, or 3.1416 was the sign of the Man-God Jesus Christ, as it is the key to the Great Pyramid's mathematical and symbolic message. It is rather remarkable how the Pi ratio comes in as regards Great Britain, and if we take a good map of London, or Elyondun, as the ancients called it, and draw certain lines on it, we get some interesting results. Taking the Salt Tower in the Tower of London as a centre, draw a line east and west through the Salt Tower centre. The Salt Tower is the south east tower, and nearest to the Tower Bridge. It is easily picked out from the Bridge as it has a great cross on the wall, but how it got there is a mystery. Also draw a north and south line through the Salt Tower and then commence to measure. Greenwich Royal Observatory, or Greenwich O, the first meridian of longitude is exactly 3.1416 miles east of the Salt Tower. The Cenotaph is exactly .31416 of a mile south of the Salt Tower, and Buckingham Palace and St. Paul's Cathedral are respectively .416 of a mile south and north of the Salt Tower, the .416 being the Pi ratio lacking the 31. or EL in Hebrew script. St. Mary Abbott's Church at the corner of Church Street, Kensington, is also .31416 of a mile south and on the same line as the Cenotaph, and Lambeth Palace and Cleopatra's Needle are on a 3.1416 mile radius from St. Mary Abbott's. Whatever meaning may be attached to it, the fact remains that Lambeth Palace is exactly 6.66 furlongs south from the Salt Tower line, and also the great Roman Catholic Cathedral, and the exact distance between Lambeth Palace and the Roman Catholic Cathedral is 6.66 furlongs. London is stated to be in 51° 31' north and Rome is 41° 54' north, and when we subtract one from the other we get 9° 37' and this multiplied by the length of one degree which is 69.177 miles, we get 666 miles as the distance between the Salt Tower and the City of Rome. A fine collection of sixes. Glasgow is exactly 11 times 31.416 miles from the Salt Tower, or 345.576 miles. If we try the Pi ratio over Glasgow we get results just as remarkable. Take a good map of Glasgow, the one issued by the Post Office Directory is a very accurate one, and through the Tolbooth Tower at the head of the Saltmarket, Salt is always coming in, draw a line east and west through it. Do the same through the spire of the Cathedral exactly .416 of a mile north of the Tolbooth Tower. Draw line north to south through both the Tolbooth Tower and the Cathedral spire. Where the Cathedral north and south line cuts the east to west line through the Tolbooth Tower make a point and from there through the Cenotaph in George Square, just outside the main entrance to the Municipal Chambers, draw a line which should cut into the east and west line through the Cathedral spire at 55, West Regent Street. Now measure from 55, West Regent Street to the Cenotaph and we get .31416 of a mile, exactly as we got in London, That is, the Cenotaphs are both marked as .31416 or Pi/10.

It is worth recording that the Great War broke out on 1914.666 A.D. as we went into it on the 216 day of the year, and 216 is exactly 6 by 6 by 6, and as August is the 8th month, and 8/12ths is .666, so we get the sinister row of sixes no matter how we look at the war commencement. But the Armistice occurred on the 314.16 day of the year, or 11th November, 1918. The terms of the Armistice were signed on the early morn of the 11th, and the last signature was appended exactly at 5 a.m. according to the official record. That is, the 10th November was the 314th day and the .16 of a day ran into the following morning. Perhaps it is also worth mentioning that the Fairfield Shipbuilding Yard is 4° 19.6' west of Greenwich while the first meridian of longitude as adopted by the French is 0 Paris, and 0 Paris is exactly  $2^{\circ}$  20' east of Greenwich. Adding the two we get 6.66°, so it looks as if the God of Israel does not look with approval on the French meridians of longi-It is to be noted that map makers have all combined to mark the Arctic Circle with the number of The Beast of 13th Revelation, as it is exactly 66.6 north. "The harp that once through Tara's Hall" languished away on longitude 6.6° west, and Berlin lost the War on longitude 13.416 east, not 31.416. nearly a Pi ratio, but get lost with the sinister 13 or LE in Hebrew script, which means "not" or negation, while 31 means EL or God. Those who are interested in the size of the earth may be interested to have it pointed out to them that the diameter of the globe at 66.6 north, the Arctic Circle is exactly 3141.6 miles. Great Pyramid students know that the length of the Grand Gallery, 1883.25 inches, when subtracted from the date of the Great War 1914.666 A.D.

is exactly 31.416. Thus do we see that some mighty hand has been at work laying down the various objects and centres to His own number, the Pi ratio.

ASTROGEODETICS.—The course of seismic and meteorological events has entirely justified the astrological concept of planetary interaction, . and has confirmed the theory of Geodetic equivalents. The great storm of 31st August was accompanied by a very severe earthquake shock in the Azores. Reference to the ephemeris will show that Mercury was in opposition to Jupiter and in quadrature to Saturn, by geocentric longitudes. The earth was in Pisces 7, geodetic 23 W. Mars formed the geodetic parallel with Jupiter at the Full Moon of the 23rd August, Mercury being at the same time in geod., par., to Saturn, and the same par., was formed by Venus on the 26th. The geocentric aspects operating to produce atmospheric discharge were: 25th Mercury 135 Uranus, 28th Venus 90 Mars, 29th Venus 135 Uranus, Mars 45 Uranus, Jupiter 90 Saturn, 31st Mercury 90 Saturn and 180 Jupiter.

Referring back to the earthquake in England and the great thunderstorm that immediately followed it on the 15th and 16th August, we find Mars and Jupiter both at 37 from the equinox, and both Saturn and Mercury at 130 from the equinox. Hence there were two geodetic parallels formed on that day, while at the same time we find the earth passing the square of Saturn, conjunction Jupiter, and approaching the opposition of Neptune.

The devastating typhoon in Japan on 4th September was attended by Mercury conjunction Neptune, Venus opposition Jupiter, Venus square Saturn, all by geocentric longitude. Note the configuration of planets to Venus in geodetic longitude 141 East, the scene of the devastating typhoon! Science is opening the eyes of men to the fact of interplanetary action.

THE SIGNAL BOX.—Very adverse indications prevail this month. Storms will be frequent and violent in the Temperate Zone, and from the 16th onwards to the end of the month a series of seismic influences affect the earth. They begin on the 12th with Mercury par. Neptune, and continue 16th Mars 90 Jupiter, 20th Mercury 180 Mars, 21st Mercury 90 Jupiter, 28th Mercury 90 Neptune, conj. Saturn, finishing on 31st with Mars par. Jupiter.

The political outlook is dangerous, especially

from 21st to 28th. From the meridian position of Mars in opposition to Saturn at the Autumnal Ingress in long. 118 East, it was auticipated that a crisis would occur in China, additional warning having been given from the eclipse of 9th July last. These influences will affect action on the part of the British Government about the 12th November, and we may therefore expect events to lead up towards this end. If we escape from the net that is being so warily laid by our adversary we shall indeed owe it to direct intervention from above. A punitive expedition seems imperative, but quite wisely the Government will hesitate to embroil the country in the Far East. It is up to America to cross the Pacific in defence of her rights and give us a strong backing. The 10th or 11th November this year may find us ill prepared to celebrate the Armistice. Russian influence in China is at the root of this great International danger. While Mars remains in Taurus there will be continual danger of the war-fever spreading. Defection in the Labour world is much in evidence at Home during this month, and there will be an increase of violence and lawlessness among the people. Many accidents occur by road and rail.




#### A "BIRD CHILD."



# NEW FACTORS IN DIRECTING.

By E. H. BAILEY.

The subject of directing has received considerable attention in the nineteen volumes of this JOURNAL and practically every known method has been examined in detail and illustrated from well-known horoscopes.

The more, however, we investigate this subject, the more do we come across factors which appear to have been lost sight of. Not minor indications, not secondary influences, but factors of primary or major importance from which definite and distinctive events can be predicted.

I propose, therefore to deal fully with some of these "New Factors in Directing," and illustrate them from well-known horoscopes. Some of them have already been used in various horoscopes, but no detailed explanation has been given of the method of calculation involved.

The first of these has been touched upon several times in these pages. It is that of:—

MID-DISTANCES.

Mid-distances as the term suggests are the points in the ecliptic equi-distant from two planets, and each pair of planets has two middistances. Thus, if Venus being in Aries 20° and Mars in Leo 20°, the distance between them will be 120°. Half of this is 60° which added to Aries 20° gives Gemini 20°. This latter point is 60° from the two planets. Sagittarius 20°, the opposite point will also be equi distant from the two planets, by 120°. This is to be considered in all cases.

1. Now the first step is to compute the midpoints between the planets only—omitting the Sun and Moon. These points should be tabulated.

When the meridian ascendant, Sun, Moon and Part of Fortune come to these points directions are formed. Planets coming to these points are ignored.

- 2. Calculate the mid points between the Sun and planets; when the meridian, ascendant, Moon and Fortuna meet these points in their progress, directions are formed. The Sun and planets are not considered.
- 3. Calculate the mid-points between the Moon and planets; when the M.C., ascendant, Sun, and Fortuna meet these points by progression, directions are formed. The Moon and planets are not considered.
- 4. Calculate the mid-point between the luminaries. This is a special calculation which will be explained later when the M.C., Ascendant, Fortuna and planets meet these mid-points,

directions are formed. The luminaries are not considered.

- 5. Calculate the mid-points between Fortuna, and the Sun, Moon and planets. When the M.C. Ascendant, Sun and Moon meet these mid-points directions are formed. The planets and Fortuna are not considered.
- 6. There is no mid-point between the meridian and ascendant, or between these points and the Sun, Moon, Fortuna and the planets. This fact should be particularly borne in mind.

In the next issue, the rules for computing the mid-distances of the luminaries will be given in full

showing the trouble to exist in the left speech centre of the brain.

It is also to be observed that the Moon is conjoined with Cauda, in forming its square with Mercury, that Uranus is conjoined with Fortuna, and that Saturn in Aries opposes the mid-point between the luminaries. These are significant factors.

The investigation of this case does not end here. The chart of descent must be examined to determine the actual affliction at the time of the shock. This will receive special treatment in the next issue.

# MUNDANE ASTROLOGY. By E. H. BAILEY.

THE SUN IN LIBRA. SEPT. 23rd, 1926.

The Sun enters the sign Libra at 7.27 p.m. on Sept. 23rd, when Taurus 19.19 will be rising, and Mars will be in Taurus 19.15, just on the ascendant in opposition to Saturn in Scorpio 22.17 setting. The Moon in the end of Aries, and Uranus in the end of Pisces are in the twelfth house. Jupiter is in Aquarius in the eleventh. Neptune is in Leo in the fifth, Venus in Virgo on the cusp of the sixth, and the Sun and Mercury in Libra in the sixth house.

The rising position of Mars in opposition to Saturn, and square to both Jupiter and Uranus is a dangerous influence and points to rioting, incendiarism, outrages against authority, Bolshevic outbreaks, much crime, murder and fires. Falling in fixed signs, there are indications of earth tremors in this country, and danger of mining disasters. With Saturn in the seventh house disputes are threatened with other powers, and international complications are denoted. The position of Neptune in the fifth points to immorality and vice among women, crimes against women and children, scandals in schools and places of amusement, as well as accidents in cinemas. Venus on the cusp of the sixth house well aspected favours the conditions of female labour, and an improvement in factory life is indicated. The ingress in the sixth with Mercury slightly favours the working classes, but as these planets are somewhat afflicted, the promised good is likely to be hindered by the workers' own actions. Deaths of members of parliament are Trouble is denoted in shipping circles. The affliction of Saturn, ruler of the tenth is evil for the King and Government, and a serious crisis in political and international affairs is denoted. Jupiter in the eleventh house, elevated, but afflicted, points to heavy expenditure in insurance matters, debates in connection with religious and financial affairs, and threatens great waste of public funds. Reform is shown in prisons and institutions, and hospitals will considerably benefit.

In long. 118 E. Mars will be on the meridian, and in 120 E. Saturn will be on the nadir. Violence will reign in those parts. Grave troubles are threatened in China, warfare and fighting. Violent earthquakes and storms are shown in the East Indies, in the longitudes named.

From 60 to 62 W. long., these positions are reversed, Saturn being on the meridian and Mars on the nadir. Storms, volcanic and seismic activity is shown in those regions. These meridians touch the West Indies and S. America.

It will thus be seen from this arrangement, that Saturday, positive is succeeded by Sunday also positive. Further, the last hour before sunrise, which may be either positive or negative, is always succeeded by another positive or negative hour.

The next point to be considered is that as each planet has a number allotted to it, so this number is applicable to the hour ruled by such planet.

The numbers of the planets are:—
Sun 4 and 1 Moon 2 and 7
Mercury 5 Venus 6
Mars 9 Jupiter 3
Saturn 8.

As the Sun and Moon have two numbers, they are used alternatively according as to whether the hour is positive or negative. In a positive hour of the Sun the number is 1; in a negative hour 4. In a negative hour of the Moon use number 2, in a positive hour number 7. There is a hidden truth in this Kaballa of numbers. Uranus is number 4, and Neptune is number 7. When a negative hour of the Sun is ruling, consider the planet Uranus. When a positive hour of the Moon rules, Neptune.

# THE INFLUENCE OF NEPTUNE.

By E. H. BAILEY.

The time has now arrived, when I feel I shall be justified in placing on record the results of a series of observations respecting the influence of the planet Neptune, a planet which is exerting a tremendous influence over Humanity and the world at large, and is, in the main, the indication, or cause of the present chaotic and unstable conditions which are to be found in almost all departments of the world's activities.

No matter what we look into, whether it be science, religion, politics, art, music, education, commerce, literature, dress, morals, society, yes, and even in astrology itself, we find this same inversive, delusive, chaotic and disturbing influence which arises from this planet's misunderstood action.

Not that there is no good in Neptune's influence. Far from it! Its beauties are beyond the ken of human mind and imagination to depict. They are too great, too grand, too sublime. They are not of earthly beauty or grandeur, and therefore, those who, like myself, have seen a little of Neptunian beauty would fail utterly, if they attempted to express it in commonplace lan guage.

To get a general idea of the highest aspect of Neptune's influence, one must work their way, first, through its lowest expression, and this latter seems to be coming universal throughout the length and breadth of the world to-day.

Neptune stands for Maya or delusion. Its influence is delusive, subversive, misleading and chaotic. It turns a lie into truth, and truth into a lie. It inverts a noble ideal into a loath-some delusion, and exalts fanaticism to the level of an honourable pursuit. It is devilish in its intensity, soul-damning in its action and the ultimate result of its power is a gradual diminution and loss of the moral force.

It is very slow in its action—slower even than Saturn, and diametrically opposed to the sudden and explosive action of Uranus—but its effects are more certain, more subtle, and more effective. The hashish taker, the drug fiend, the dope maniac, the white slave trafficker are all members of the Neptunian cult. The frequenter of night clubs, as well as the food fanatic, and the Pussyfoot, are all under the influence of this delusive planet. The writers of sex novels; the promulgators of Birth control; the socialist with his

wonderful Utopian paradise for workers; the Bolshevist who would turn everything upside down, and inaugurate a reign of rapine and terror; the street corner tub-thumper with his ravings against the "hated capitalist"; the tin-pot Labour leader who struts up and down the country, deluding the workers with vague promise and parrot-like "slogans," even to the great Emperor with his "God and Me," are all tarred with the same brush, and that brush is a Neptunean weapon of the Black Forces.

All these facts are perfectly plain to those whose eyes have been opened, and whose spiritual vision is not corrupted or inverted by the poison gas of Neptune. We need not go far to see it. We have only to look in the streets of our towns and cities, night after night, and we can see the spectre of Neptune walking up and down whispering in the ears of young and old alike. We have only to observe the actions and behaviour of young men and maidens, the loose flippant talk, the disregard for modesty, the lack of regard for Divine things, and the mad craze for rush, speed, sensationalism, inordinate amusement and self-indulgence, and Neptune is there all the time.
