"t" Bar on Right Side of Upstroke=Enterprise, energy, initiative faculty, executiveness. "t" Bar on Left Side or Upstroke=Tardy resolution, caution, timidity, weakness.

"t" Bar of the Nature of a Serpentine Line=Gaiety, merriment.

"t" Bar of the Form of the Lash of a Whip=Effusive, fancy.

"t" Bar Tending Up=Optimism.

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# What the feelings do to the Face

Interesting Remarks of the Former Chicago Character Analyst, Conroy

#### How States of Mind Affect the Face

A LL kinds of emotions have their effects on the face. A certain state of mind improves or disfigures the countenance. Virtue beautifies the face; vice degrades it. Hardship, sorrow, misfortune, care and difficulties leave their imprints upon the face. Happiness, victory, success, comfort, peace of mind, hope, cheerfulness and tranquility preserve the features and make the face beautiful.

#### Laughter

Laughter opens the mouth and draws the lips far apart. It raises the cheeks in the direction of the lower eyelids. It is impossible, very nearly, to laugh with compressed lips. In laughter, the cheeks are powerfully drawn up in the direction of the eyes, and in a lateral direction, towards the ears, making heavy wrinkles in the fleshy parts of the cheeks around the mouth and eyes. The eyelids are wrinkled to such an extent that the eyes are almost hidden from view. The tear-glands are compressed by a strong pressure and the eyeballs, to such an



extent that the eyes are suffused with tears. When a person continues with laughing emotions for any length of time, he at last develops deep wrinkles at the corners of the eyes and in the cheeks. The wings of the nose are drawn up to a certain extent and the scenery around the eyes seem playful.

#### Weeping

Weeping affects the condition of the heart. It influences the respiratory function. It distends the veins of the forehead. It flushes the face. It gives rise to a spasmodic action of the chest. It draws the diaphragm upwardly and holds it. It expands the throat. It disturbs the breathing processes and gives rise to irregular sobbing, quick inhalations and slow exhalations. It fills the lachrymal glands with tears. It draws the lips sidewardly. It widens the nose at the wings. It draws the mouth backwardly with its corners and draws the under lip downwardly with its corners. It draws the chin upwardly. It closes the eyes and draws the eyelids down on the eyes. It pouts with the under lip in the center. It draws the head down on the throat producing a heavy wrinkle in under the chin. It compresses the skin in the central part of the forehead making a number of heavy wrinkles in the

forehead, and drawing the eyebrows close together. It draws the central part of the lips close together but throws the lips far apart at the corners of the mouth. It draws the mouth far back and into the cheeks of the face. It wrinkles the nose in its central part making a heavy wrinkle appear on top of the nose.

#### Sorrow

Sorrow depresses the face. It makes the face and eyes heavy. It relaxes the lips and draws the lower jaw downwardly. It causes the upper eyelid to fall and almost cover the pupil of the eye. It fills the eyes with tears. It depresses the angles of the mouth. It affects the inner extremities of the eyebrows.

In grief, the angles of the mouth are depressed. The outer angles of the eyes are not to such an extent as in laughter. In grief the eyebrows are strongly ruffled.

When a person is happy, or when admiration is playing in his face, his body is in a reclining attitude, his eyes have a tender lustre, his lips are half open, his respirations are long, his eyelids fall and his face presents a pleasing aspect.

But in pain we do not see these features. In pain, the lips are retracted, the mouth open, the muscles of the body rigid and struggling, the chest is spasmodic, the eyebrows are knit, the inner extremities of the eyebrows are raised, the nostrils are quivering, the pupils of the eyes are nearly concealed by the upper eyelids, the face is suffused with blood, the veins are distended in the forehead, the breathing is checked, the angles of the mouth are drawn strongly down, the jaws are fixed, the nostrils are dilated and the teeth grind.

This is also true about convulsions and spasmodic conditions of the nervous system, with the exception that, in convulsion, the lower limbs are extended, the eyes distorted and the pupils turned up under the eyelids. Sometimes the eyes are wide open in convulsions, and the person exposes the white part of his eyes.

In intense physical pain, the respiration is suspended, the body is fixed, the eyes set and unsteady and the movements of the person are undecided. In great pain the teeth are set, the teeth grind, the eyebrows are strongly contracted, the hair stands on end, the voice is forced out in groans and the forehead is strongly wrinkled. Then the eyes are drawn inwardly and rolled to and fro with great force.

In fear, the eyeballs are seen altogether in the center of the eyes, the eyes are open and staring, the eyebrows are elevated high as they possibly can

# The human aura

#### by Bessie Leo

DO not know if all astrological students are familiar with the idea that every human being is surrounded by a sort of luminous mist called the Aura. Those persons who have succeeded in developing clairvoyant sight tell us it has various lovely colors, denoting the mind, character and emotions, according as one or the other shade predominates, and also whether the color be clear or the reverse. The occultist tells us also that a luminous aura surrounds all trees, stones, animals, plants, etc., but of course its manifestation would not be so complex as is the case with man.

The life principle, that which the Easterns call Jiva, which is being continually poured on the earth from the Sun, is specialized by each one of us through the organ we call the spleen (under the dominion of Saturn), and the stronger and healthier the constitution of man or woman, the more of this life principle they both receive and radiate. A healthy man can give off an enormous quantity of this life force, especially by magnetic or mesmeric passes, and is of course constantly though unconsciously shedding strength and vitality on all around him. So also the man or woman who is not able to specialize enough of this life force for his or her own use, becomes a kind of vampire (of course unconsciously) to others, and sponge-like absorbs the specialized life-force of any sensitive person who is unfortunate enough to be thrown into contact with him. I daresay many of our readers have already noticed that some people "take it out of them" as they call it, after whose visit they feel tired, languid and good for nothing. Of course, this is often felt very strongly at a séance room, especially where a materialization has taken place.

Now the first misty outline generally seen by any clairvoyant is called the health aura, and is visible as a mass of "faintly luminous, bluish-grey mist." It is, in fact, almost colorless, and seems to be made up of an infinite number of straight lines radiating evenly in all directions from the body; that is, in good health; but in sickness or disease they are irregular and crooked, lying about in all directions —falling flat, as it were—for then the health aura is weak and the spleen cannot specialize sufficient life force. The foregoing are some of the causes that act upon the physical body, setting up disturbance and trouble; over-fatigue, extreme depression of spirits, any wound or injury, shock, etc., will also do it.

The next aura seen seems to be that of the desires, governed by the planet Mars, as the solar aura is governed by the Sun; the desires of the personality are seen by the color and fineness of this particular aura, which seems to change color and vibration almost from moment to moment. Mr. Leadbeater writes as follows respecting the aura generally:

"The aura proper-that which surrounds the body-is exceedingly complex in its structure. At the first glance it is seen as a luminous cloud extending to a distance of about eighteen inches or two feet from the body in all directions, and therefore approximately oval in shape, whence it is sometimes spoken of in occult writings as the 'auric egg.' In most cases it has no well-defined outline, but its edges fade very gradually into invisibility. A closer study of this cloud soon reveals not only that it has several distinct component parts, but that these component parts consist of matter in different states. Each of them is as it were, a distinct aura, and would if the others were withdrawn be seen to occupy the same space as the entire mass. No doubt to the eyes of the adept, the aura, like everything else, is sevenfold; but to eyes regarding it from the infinitely lower level of ordinary humanity, only five of its component parts are visible."

From the astrological point of view, man is a star, radiating into space seven concentric and to us invisible rings, or rather spheres, these being governed by the seven planets, while the life of the whole is the Sun. It might be expressed thus:

Of these seven concentric rings, beginning with the most material, the lowest is the one associated with the physical body, which may be called the health aura, as its coloring and appearance is largely determined by the condition of the physical body. The next line of demarcation denotes the magnetic aura, although practically the magnetic and health auras are one, being mutually dependent, and the conditions of the one acting on those of the other. Next comes the desire aura, and this is to clairvoyant vision the mirror in which are reflected every desire, every feeling, and most of the thoughts of the personality.

From this aura there are fashioned, by thought, living creatures (thoughts are things) either good or evil, forms created and set in motion by our desires and feelings. Good wishes, gratitude and love, send forth into the world beneficent elementals, who help it onward; while evil wishes, malicious

# Develop your sixth sense

#### A Simple Course in Psychometry

THE word "Psychometry" is taken from two Greek words, *Psyche* the soul, and *metre* to measure, meaning *soul measurement;* it is in one way named correctly, in another the meaning is rather too vague in its scope, for as a matter of fact the Psychometrist senses, perceives or views souls rather than *measures* them, and the sensing is not by any means confined to the soul of man, but applies to anything, or any object in nature.

Before entering into the cause of such phenomena, and the explanation of the same, I will enumerate the rules which must be obtained by students desirous of unfolding the gift, and of using it either as a means of obtaining an intimate knowledge of Nature, a revelation of history, in business, as a hobby or professionally.

Any very great excitement or upset in the daily life interferes a good deal with the development of this power and the ability to make use of it. So, as far as possible, try to cultivate an *even* and regular method of life, avoiding a great deal of gaiety, yet indulging in moderate recreation and amusements. Mind and body must be kept pure and healthy, and stimulants avoided.

Sit facing the East, when possible.

Do not psychometrise after a meal.

Let your room be pure and clean, with plenty of fresh air.

Sit at regular intervals for development, trying to keep the same time and place. Always write down what you may obtain; never *distrust* your powers or become overanxious as to results, for by so doing you defeat your own ends.

After you have developed your power to some extent, you may venture to practise in strange places, in fact, anywhere you happen to be, so that you can use your gift upon any occasion and in any situation.

But when first unfolding the gift of the spirit, such as this, regularity is a great assistance to the tyro, for spiritual powers yield easily to *habit*, so that at last some particular spot will nearly always enable you to obtain results. At the same time you will greatly curtail the usefulness of your gift if you can only psychometrise in the one place, so that I strongly advise you to learn to use your power in such a manner that you can be altogether independent of conditions.

Otherwise you are to a certain extent a slave to your psychic powers, instead of being the master.

You need not *reason* over the impressions you receive; once you do that you will go wrong. Accept all that comes to you, and leave it to time to prove your vision correct or otherwise.

Psychometry is the art of sensing the history and

surroundings of any object, such as the glove a person has worn, a letter they have written, a piece of silk that has been next their skin, an article of jewelry, or a lock of hair. A stone or mineral, a piece of wood (wood is not so retentive of auras as other articles, however), a curio, a fragment of tapestry, a coin, or anything else you can call to mind.

The object should be pressed to your *forehead* lightly, and you should close your eyes, for you see with your spiritual sight, not the physical.

For the early history of an object, place it just level with the eyebrows; higher up on the forehead will bring events nearer the present time.

The *reason* we can thus obtain the history of objects, and that with which they have come in contact, is as follows:—


Every animate and inanimate object gives forth a mist-like, and to the ordinary sense, invisible emanation which contains the history of all that it has ever done or that has been *reflected* upon it, by people, objects and events with which it has come into contact. This is the *soul essence* or aura of the object, which (radium-like) is continually giving forth these emanations, which attach themselves to everything they meet, leaving the history, hopes and fears, ambitions, aspirations and character of the individual upon each object touched.

In learning to read the aura throw all your heart and soul into it. Do not think that work, or love of business, is lowering. It is part of your education, and you glorify it by working to the best of your ability.

When you are not at business, try to *reject* all unpleasant or unwanted thought. Cleanse your mind and gain control over the thought currents at the same time.


The aura, which, as I have explained, is the outer portion of the "mind body," very readily responds to the command of the mind, which, in fact, is responsible for its appearance and colouring. It will respond to your suggestions readily, and by constantly suggesting that it will form a shelllike wall between yourself and the outer world, through which the thoughts of others cannot pass, in this way you can clear the decks for action and shut the door of your consciousness upon intruding and unwelcome visitors.

To do this, form the auric shell in your imagination, for in this way you draw round you the astral elements which form the protection. # Lips mean what they do not always say

#### By REDFIELD

AST, but not least, in our outline of Physiognomy, are the lips. These are expressive of character in their relative proportions and the form they give to the mouth, as well as in the position and motions which they acquire from the action of the muscles. Well-developed lips are indicative of certain mental faculties which are very necessary to the strong and vigorous action of the other faculties; and the reason why they are sometimes supposed to indicate weakness is, that they are not infrequently connected with a disproportionate shortness of the nose, as in the example on page 24, or with a disproportionate shortness of the whole face, causing them to project, as in the face of the negro. The length of the lips in these cases is no mark of deficient mental power, but contrariwise.

In some persons we see the lip coming down to a point in the center. This indicates the faculty of *Concentration*, or the tendency to observe minutely; but as this faculty causes the length of the lip at this place, the sign may be large, although there may not be the relative shortness on each side of it which causes it to appear separate and distinct.

In some persons, again, we see a descent of the lip about midway between the sign of concentration and the angle of the mouth, at the place pointed out in the figure on the following page. This indicates the faculty of *Application*, or the power of applying the mind to the solution of problems, or to anything requiring long labor and patient study. It is generally large in artists, who exercise application physically as well as mentally; and it is large in the negro, who is adapted to long and patient labors.

The signs of application and concentration, when relatively large, form what is called a *Cupid's bow*; but this form of the mouth depends partly on the signs of two other faculties which have their place in the under lip. The first is the length and projection of the under lip on either side of the center, and opposite the depression in the upper lip each side of concentration, as in the figure on the next page. This indicates the Love of Home. The second sign is the length of the under lip at the angle of the mouth, as in this figure also. This indicates Philanthropy. The form of mouth in which is seen a predominance of these four signs of character, is most common and most appropriate to the female face, as the faculties which they indicate are most common and most appropriate to the female character. Concentration, or the disposition and ability to attend to the minute and separate duties of domestic

life; application, or the disposition and ability to exercise patience in the acquisition of knowledge and the accomplishment of any duty; love of home, which makes the poorest cottage a charmed spot where woman's nature luxuriates in its richest perfection; philanthropy, or the love of human beings of every country and of every condition—these, to most men, are the Cupid's bow which they see expressed in the lips of women.

An oblique fullness over the angle of the mouth, as in the preceding figure, indicates the faculty of *Clearness*, or the power of perceiving and expressing truth clearly.

A manly form of mouth is more straigh than curved, as we see in the portraits of Sir Walter Scott, Silliman, Allston, Webster, Washington, Clay, and others too numerous to mention. The reason of this is, that the faculties which give that form to the mouth are stronger in man than in woman. The first of these is the length of the upper lip on each side of the sign of concentration, and between that and the sign of application. This indicates Comprehensiveness, or the ability of the mind to take in a large field at once, so as to contemplate objects in their relations to each other. The second of these signs is the length of the upper lip over the upper canine tooth, as seen in this engraving, which shows also the sign of the former faculty large. This indicates the faculty of Gravity, or the disposition and power to maintain gravity of mind and deportment, so that the individual feels little disposition to laugh or smile, and can easily restrain either.

A perpendicular fullness terminating the angle of the mouth, as seen in this engraving, indicates the faculty of *Precision*, which manifests itself in great preciseness, or a kind of formality of manner, and in great correctness of speech as well as behavior. It is cultivated very much by grammarians, school teachers, and governesses, and disposes a person to criticism and severity toward others.

The third sign is the length and prominence of the under lip in the middle, opposite the sign of concentration, as in the next figure. This indicates the faculty of *Love of Travel*, or of peregrinating. The fourth sign is the length of the under lip over the second lower incisor and opposite the sign of application, as in the following figure. This indicates the faculty of *Patriotism*. One who has it large will feel that—

"Of all the countries, east or west,

- He loves his native land the best."

# A character study of Pythagoras the father of numerology

PYTHAGORAS, of the sacred Samos, was formed by love and the spirit of beauty. Not long after Confucius, this inspirational person became the greatest among living men. We speed over the long stretch of ages, twenty-three hundred and eighty-three years, to where this divine genius first pressed the ground—five hundred and twentyfour years before the commencement of the Christian era.

Temperamental specialties are, in this person, far more congenial. What sublime stability of character, and suavity, and strength, and healthfulness, and simplicity, and profundity! How I love to attend this man's educational classes! His knowledge of the Chaldeans, Hindoos, and of the Magian doctrines of Persia, does not dilute his private inspirations. The ancient songs of gods fail in description of Pythagoras. His great earnest prophetic eyes "discounted the highest star." Earth, Air, Fire, and Water-he was master of these elements. He saw deeper, knew more than they, and so revealed their best secrets. With what religious veneration does each philosophical student gaze upon his master. But the master enslaves no mind. What divine friendship! The teacher is unselfishly lost in celestial Truth, which, by being communicated to the disciple, delivers him over to the largest liberty. No frowning dogmatism is known in the school of Pythagoras. Each mind is graciously introduced to itself, whereupon the divine usher departs for a walk.

Ideas within ideas, wheels within wheels, heart within heart! Something of Assyrian discovery is here, of the Egyptians here is something; and I behold in Pythagoras the first great eclectic philosopher on earth. He was too vast for Samos, too universal for patriotism, too truthful for selfish promotions, too large for any one age, too full for any isolated birth, and was too wise for a circumscribed origin. The blood of whole epochs beat like truth in his veins; and, swayed intellectually by this feeling, he gave systematic thought and statement to his "Pre-existence." Would that he had been profounder and more philosophical in his analysis. But why complain? Pythagoras was a master in synthesis. He gathered largely, and appropriated gracefully. Metempsychosis, or the science of pre-existence, was to his spirit what a cradle is to an infant. He was contained by it, and dreamily soothed, but not inflated and flattered. His followers affirmed of him a divine origin; that a certain celestial love-spirit, one of the gods supernaturally joining with the terrestrial mother, produced this golden-haired

worker of moral miracles. But the philosopher of himself affirmed, and conscientiously believed, that he could remember for certain that he was the son of Mercury, and that he was known as Ætholides in the first incarnation; subsequently, in another appearance, he thought that he was Euphorbus, and was killed at the siege of Troy; next, by a third incarnation, he became Hermortimus, at which time, as he supposed he could easily recollect, he entered the Temple of Apollo; then he was reproduced in the form of a fisherman named Delos; lastly, he was no other than the many-minded Pythagoras.

Let us graciously pardon the reminiscences and other personalities of this idealist, excuse the eccentricities of his synthesis, and dive beneath to the impersonal principle. He had the power of psychointuition, as I perceive, and the self-intelligent attribute of knowing more than a world of books could impart. But, although this power was adequate and available in a thousand directions toward the surface of his existence, the faculty failed when put to the test of self-examination and deliverance. The logician was psychological and truthful in general, until his own experience became the problem; then the error and defeat were only in conception and statement; for is it not true, that, by inheritance, a single human spirit is an abridged edition of the entire universe? We have worked at this question, and our answer is delivered-namely, that each contains, in focal concentration, the attributes of all. In IDEAS, it will be remembered, there is neither loss nor gain, time nor space, ignorance nor progression; consequently, when one human being comes to realize the unutterable opulence of his spirit, and gives revelations therefrom to others equally wealthy, but who yet remains unconscious, the receivers feel a congenial response upgushing from the recesses of their long-silent minds. But the revelator, as in the case of Jesus, may fail in self-investigation; the solution of his own experience falling amazingly short of the wisdom evolved at other points. So with Pythagoras, as I measure him; he dropped into superstition, by thoughts, at the moment when self-solution was attempted. His IDEA of metempsychosis, then, was simply the intuition of the impersonal and ubiquitous nature of inter-intelligent principles; of which all SPIRIT is essentially constituted.

As a religious teacher, the eclectic Samonian was subsequently influential. Upon this branch of human concern, his *thoughts* were many, incorruptible, but Oriental in statement and adaptation. His wisdom (Continued on page 21) The Prayer

After observing criminals for the last 15 years the conclusion is inescapable that most of the text books on crime now available were written by men who acquired their knowledge of the subject from the recesses of the family library.

So many of our criminologists attempt to classify the modern outlaw by analyzing his eyes, and invariably they agree that the person who does not return your gaze direct is not to be trusted.

Yet, the facts disclose that the "piercing, steady eye" has come to be a racket, practiced by the passers of counterfeit money, forgers and spurious bond sellers.

A forger, who was picked up in Chicago several weeks ago, explained the inner-workings of the system he followed, which, the police conceded, was eminently successful.

"We simply cash in on the copy-book maxims," he said. "You know people have been taught to



believe in persons who look them straight in the eyes. But at the same time it disconcerts them.

"Knowing that the penmen (forgers) will not attempt to put over a note unless they can impinge the victim with his eyes.

"Once that is done the rest is easy; that is, if you finish the transaction before he has a chance to reflect."

This particular forger was sentenced to the penitentiary for two years, but it was the first time he had ever been caught red-handed and he had been operating for five years that the police knew of.

His views are also concurred in by the fake stock

salesmen, and here again the sale depends on looking the prospect straight in the eyes.

Since the foregoing has been established beyond question it has not been amiss for many detectives and reporters to adopt the slogan:

"Beware of the man who looks you in the Eye."







and it is well if it does not act against his feeling of philanthropy. In the face of Washington we see very large philanthropy and patriotism combined, besides large comprehensiveness and love of travel, feelings which are easily seen to be particularly appropriate to the male character, as their expressions are to the face.

was pleasant, and his ways peaceful, to this extent, viz.: "War should be made only against five things: 1, Disease of the body; 2, Ignorance of mind; 3, Passions of the heart: 4. Sedition of cities; 5, Discord of families." But we must contemplate his cosmological revealments, in order to obtain a glimpse of his central IDEA; for we have not yet seen more than its auroral glimmerings and corruscations. Delivering himself of thoughts and systematic conceptions of creation, he said: "The universe is a divine harp. It was made in imitation of the lyre. The celestial spheres are musical in their motions; they emit melodious sounds as they roll through the abyss." Here, therefore, is the Pythagorean IDEA-to wit, the DIVINITY OF HARMONY! In accordance therewith, all his disciples were educated in music. The last sound at night was music, and music was the first sound in the early morn. Harmony of body and harmony of mind, therefore, was the logical prescription. We reject the "ways and means"; the thoughts, as a whole, also, and almost all the diverse conceptions of Pythagoras; but for the IDEA we experience perfect sympathy, shout Amen! a thousand times, and welcome the stranger heartily as our "Brother." His organization was most fitted to express the IDEA that "Harmony is universal;" and for this expression he will be immortally enshrined and throned in the Pantheon of humanity.

What a world of imitators! If your favorite God and adored Mesiah-be he Zeroaster, Pythagoras, Plato, Jezus, Mahomet, Budda, Krishna, or Brahma-does, or is, reported by certain supposed witnesses to have done a deed of private worth you must set up an imitation with great pomp and circumstance! If he ate and drank in a certain manner, so must you; if he waded into a river, and was baptized by a superintendent appointed to the office, so must you, for you are only good at mimicry and crouching imitation; if he prayed in a certain manner, so must you; if he walked, and conversed, and did his work for the world in a particular style, so must you; for you think that you are and have nothing else of more importance than this shallow faculty of mistaking some leader as Master, whose ways you are bound to adore and imitate.

It is against this abominable habit of yours that this protest is positively entered. You mis-educate the simple, make popular the most worthless imitative services, and sow the seeds of theological stupidity (and cupidity not less) all over the social soil. Suppose Zoroaster did wear a flowing robe of purple trimmed with gold, bedecked with costly diamonds, surmounted with jeweled emblems and symbols of his faith and messiahship, *must you do the same?* Suppose Mahomet did live in a forest cave six months, eating only the wild fruit and berries that

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grew near his hermitage, must you do so? Suppose Jesus did go into the wilderness, and live sequested there for forty days, or that he felt moved to the baptismal ceremony, and to break bread and drink wine just before his retirement from this sphere of existence, must you do and feel the same? Can you not discriminate now and for ever between the IDEAS of a teacher and his private personalities and particularities of temperament? His ways are not as yours, because he and you are two different individuals, living within a very different age, and enveloped by a different circle of circumstances. Yea, let the word go forth that a protest is hereby declared against any imitation. except where it is consistent and coincident with the nature you possess; and equally against the wholesale deification of any personage, save the Father-Spirit who does not ask this involuntary acknowledgement and lip-service of any living creature.

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
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# Philosophy of temperaments

#### According to ANDREW JACKSON DAVIS

THE philosophy of Temperaments is healthily and beautifully practical. By way of definition I would say, that temperament is the FORM of mental attraction. The attractions of Love and Intellect and Wisdom are expressed only through Temperament. In short, without temperaments, the soul would be inexpressible. You will recollect our proposition, that the essential principles of all souls are the same; no intrinsic, radical difference between men; that Nature is just, democratic, impartial to her children. How, then, can we explain the innumerable varieties among the earth's inhabitants? To this question I have replied, thus: there are two causes capable of explanning human dissimilarities-first, a disproportion in the quantity of the spiritual essence in men-second, different arrangements, or combinations of the same component atoms, producing what I term "different Temperaments.

According to the arrangement or relation of these temperaments, to each other in man, the *mind* will make its manifestations. By aid of comparison, you may see that Temperament *determines* the form of the expression of the plastic mental principle—just as the engine fixes and gives form of action to the indwelling steampower. But it is good news that these forms of expressions are subject to modification by cultivation or habitudes of mind.

These temperaments, by the ancients, were termed "Humors"—divided into *dry* and *moist*. Some theologically attributed their existence to the predominance of spiritual influence, good or evil, according to the *character* of the individual; others, less superstitious and more metaphysical, accounted for them astrologically—that different stars in the heavens, in different conjunctions at the *birth* of a mortal, produced and fatally *fixed* the differences of human dispositions and destinations.

Aristotle, a fine student of Nature, taught the existence of four "humors" in the body. Each, he said, is provided with a central seat of organic government: first, the *Choleric*—located in the liver; second, the *Melancholic*—centered in the spleen; third, the *Phlegmatic*—having its place in the head; fourth, the *Sanguine*—seated in the heart.

Modern phenologists seems to have followed, to an unwarrantable extent, the suggestions and classifications of the ancients. Temperaments, they say, "denote certain states or conditions of the body; or, the relative activity of particular classes of the corporeal organs." Although limited in this, yet they have rendered ineffable service to mankind—by pointing practically out the *dependence* of mind upon temperament; by showing, philosophically, how and when the soul loses or gains in purity and power. But the "nervous, bilious, sanguine, and lymphatic" programme of temperaments has an odor about it irresistibly reminding one of the age of Astrology—of the days when "humors" and "Vapors" were suggested by Aristotle when the doctrine of demoniac influence was accepted as gospel truth by the greatest intellects.

I say this, however, in no mood of disparagement to the developments of modern phrenological schools. On the contrary, the true import is : that all human investigation has a certain parallelism or resemblance through all eras of the world-implying the identity of all principles; and indicating not less the progress which man makes in the "Science of Explanation"-as he passes, from the Theological and Metaphysical, to the Scientific planes of mental development and discovery. The human mind approaches the true region of natural causes (of all visible effects) very gradually, as a child progresses toward maturity. Because such is the immutable order of Nature-sensation before thinking; creeping before walking; crying before language; swearing before culture; superstitution before intellectual observation; and experience before Wisdom. We will not complain, therefore, even if we do find, in the classifications of modern schools, the foot-prints of past error, and the vestiges of oriental imperfection.

By virtue of careful interior searchings, I have just discovered the existence, among men, of seven radical individual Temperaments. I will describe them, as they occur, in their natural order—commencing at the basis, as a tree grows, improving as it advances. The reader will, therefore, begin the scale, contrary to custom, at the bottom-line, which, in nature, is the order of growth —the inferior first and lowest.

- 7. The Harmonial.
- 6. The Spiritual.
- 5. The Mental.
- 4. The Muscular.
- 3. The Motive.
- 2. The Sensitive.
- 1. The Nutritive.

The different attractions of the different temperaments are important studies—more especially, when viewed in connection with human marriage and consequent parentage.

*First:* The Nutritive is first and lowest. All organic life begins with, and is elaborated through, this temperament. The heart, with its multiform appendages, is the first organ formed in the animal economy. Thence proceed arteries and veins innumerable; going from this organ to the minutest ramifications of the circumference. Through these channels appropriate matter is conveyed; and, with the beautiful precision of *attraction*, deposited here and there for the completion of the body.

The Nutritive temperament, also, superintends the (Continued on page 31)

spite, anger, envy and feelings jealousy send forth dark shapes of evil to work mischief and act as retarding forces in the world's evolution. This is a most fascinating subject to the astrological mind, as it explains the weaving of the web of fate, how we make our own destiny for ourselves, and how we alone are responsible for our future horoscopes. As we think, so do we become; as we have made ourselves by our desires and thoughts, so do the stars reflect us in our natal charts.

The occulist speaks of the Akasha, or Nature's living memory, and though the form we create by an evil wish will naturally fall to pieces sooner or later, still the living photograph of every instant of its life remains, and so all the wide-spreading results of its activities during that life are charged with absolute justice against its creator, "As a man sows, so does he also reap." However, this though a particularly fascinating by-path, is a digression from the subject of the aura.

Next to the desire aura, and very closely linked therewith, is the fourth, called the mind aura, and this to a trained clairvoyant would describe the record of the progress, or otherwise, of the personality.

In a way it may be said to represent the general average of the desire aura below it, though having much more than this in it, because through the mind aura there sometimes appear flashes of intellectuality and spirituality, which have no place in the desire sphere. Yet if the vibrations of consciousness corresponding with any particular desire are repeated strongly and continually, it will react on the mind and set up corresponding vibratory action therein, and thus tinge the mind aura permanently with the same color: for instance, if a person is on the line of evolution by devotion, continually sending out aspirations towards a very high ideal, and desiring to help and serve humanity, the mind aura will take on a beautiful light blue. If the devotion is of a personal character, a great and pure love felt for some relative or friend, then the mind aura will be colored rose-red, and so on. In this aura can be seen both good and evil personal characteristics.

The next aura, the fifth, is that belonging to the permanent soul, or individuality. Students of Astrology know that we symbolize the personality by the Moon and the individuality by the Sun, the one being evanescent, the other permanent. Mr. Leadbeater gives a most beautiful description of this aura. He says: "In those cases in which it is visible it is of almost inconceivable delicacy and beauty; it is perhaps less a cloud of color than a living light, but all words fail one in the attempt to describe it. 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





thought to take when it is no longer subject to the impingement of outside influences.

The aura possesses the quality of a sensitive plate, a psychic photographic camera, and the eye of the sensitive, or clairvovant, is the developing medium. This for practical purposes.

The auras of people will reveal the places they have visited, the people they have seen, all that has been reflected upon them.

The auric emanation from inanimate objects has this same property, and all that it has ever touched, all that has been reflected upon it, is indelibly stamped upon it forever.

The stone that has lain for centuries buried in the bowels of the earth contains the history of all it has ever passed through from the days when our earth was chaos.

The walls of our dwelling houses are psychic biographs and phonographs, reflecting our actions, our looks, and the clairaudient can hear even our words! For the walls, too, give off an aura, this sensitive substance which holds every reflection and sound that falls upon it.

Take a brick from that wall and bury it in the earth, throw it into the sea, or even pass it through fire, but it still holds its story.

The psychometrist will first get at the last surroundings from which it was taken (as a rule, this is not invariable; some would go back to the days when the brick was clay, and had not been formed), but, bit by bit, the whole history would be unravelled. and the secret of the brick become revealed.

Living plants give out light that is visible to the sensitive, especially in complete darkness, and human beings are in a similar way luminous.

Clouds of varied coloured light stream from the eves, the hands, the fingers, from every part of the body in fact, and this light partakes of the characteristics, actions and emotions of the body from which it flows.

It takes the form of an egg-shaped envelope, which surrounds the undeveloped man much as an egg-shell surrounds the yolk of an egg. Where he goes this invisible (but none the less tangible) influence goes with him, mingling with the auras of others, taking on from them certain influences, giving off certain influences itself.

As the ego unfolds and the man ad-

vances from material to mental, from mental to spiritual conditions, so the sphere of the aura increases, the confining egg-shape disappears, and its radiance extends for an enormous distance.

The sensitive is able to see and feel the nature of these emanations, and from the sensations received is able to describe the appearance, nature, and history of the body he is thus brought into communication with.

The psychometrist becomes sensitive only by development, by patiently unfolding the spiritual senses, and so growing into conscious unity with the finer forces of nature.

There is nothing uncanny or out of the way about it at all. Just as the trained musician can detect the slightest discord, which would pass unnoticed by an unmusical person, so the psychometrist becomes aware of substance finer and more ethereal than the coarser senses of the ordinary man can recognize. Patience is essential. Too many distractions of a material kind must be avoided. Let your mind beblank, shut out conscious come thought, and allow the voice of the spirit to make itself heard.

This is attained by allowing the spirit to assert itself and by withdrawing the mind from material things and interests, from the objective to the subjective world.

Aim to unfold a calm, serene spiritual consciousness, so that the impressions may be clearly and correctly received, and vibratory waves of thought may touch and unfold directly before you.

All thought is motion, and the forms of thought express and reveal their peculiar motion. To sense, to perceive, or to become aware of this, the innermost soul must be at one with the body, you must be concentrated and centralized, so as to reflect consciously the image or vibration that proceeds from and through the realms of the unseen. Never psychometrise when you feel sick, moody, mentally disturbed, or at all uncomfortable. Centralize yourself first, before attempting to pentrate the center of other souls.

Have the room in which you sit in order, clean, and filled with sweet fresh air.

The fragrance of flowers adds materially to a higher inspiration and an exalted and beautiful state of consciousness.

Submit everything to spirit, and when you feel able and ready, judge, and you will be able to decide upon impressions correctly.



open eye." In the coming centuries it is not unreasonable to suppose that this privilege may become the prerogative of the many rather than the few. Those who are willing to pay the price for occult gifts-a clean life, combined with truth, purity, and love, and entire abandonment of personal desire, together with earnest aspirations to serve humanity-may find the inner sight slowly unfolding, for such sight is often one of the earliest evidences of the opening of a supernormal sense. The following colors as seen in the aura are taken from Mr. Leadbeater's pamphlet and Mr. A. Marques' book on the subject. We have filled in the probable planetary combinations which would account for the various colorings.

Thick black clouds in the aura would usually indicate hatred and malice. (Saturn afflicting the ruler and the luminaries.)

Deep red flashes on a black ground show anger; but in the case of what is called "noble indignation" on behalf of someone oppressed or injured, the flashes are brilliant scarlet on the ordinary background of the aura. (Mars afflicted by Saturn.)

Lurid, flaming red—a quite unmistakable color, though difficult to describe—indicates a n i m a 1 passions. (Mars afflicting the Moon.)

Dull brown-red—almost rust-color shows avarice. (Mars afflicting Mercury.)

Dull, hard brown-grey usually indicates selfishness, and is unfortunately one of the very commonest auric colors. (Saturn afflicting Mercury.)

Heavy leaden grey expresses deep depression; and where this is habitual the aura is sometimes indescribably gloomy and saddening. (Saturn weak, afflicting ruling planet.)

Livid grey—a most hideous and frightful hue—shows fear. (Saturn weak, afflicting ruler.)

Grey-green—a peculiar shade of it which can hardly be described otherwise than by the epithet "slimy" shows deceit. (Saturn weak, afflicting Moon and Mercury.)

Brownish-green, with occasional dull-red flashes, seems to betoken jealousy. (Mercury and Saturn afflicted by Mars.)

Crimson indicates love. This is often a beautifully clear color, but naturally it varies very greatly with the nature of the love. It may be quite a dull, heavy crimson, or may vary through all the shades up to a most lovely rose-color, as it becomes more and more uselfish and pure. If this rosecolor is brilliant and tinged with lilac, it shows the more spiritual love for humanity. (Venus well placed.)

Orange, if clear, seems to indicate ambition; if tinged with brown, it shows pride. But in this color also the variations are so numerous, according to the nature of the pride or ambition, that it is impossible to give more than a general descrption. (Sun in good position.)

Yellow expresses intellectuality—a deeper and duller color if the intellect is directed chiefly into lower channels; brilliantly golden, rising to a beautiful clear lemon-yellow, as it is addressed to higher and more unselfish objects. (Mercury well placed.)

Bright green seems to show ingenuity and quickness of resource, and often implies strong vitality. (Saturn well placed.)

Dark, clear blue usually indicates religious feeling, and naturally varies very much, to indigo in the one direction, and to rich deep violet in the other, according to the nature of the feeling, and especially according to the proportion of selfishness with which it is tinged. (Jupiter aspecting the Moon.)

Light blue (ultramarine or cobalt) shows devotion to a noble spiritual ideal, and gradually rises to

Luminous lilac-blue, which indicates higher spirituality, and is almost always accompanied by sparkling golden stars, which appear to represent spiritual aspirations. (Jupiter and Venus well placed.)

It seems that all the colors in the aura are subject to infinite combinations and modifications, so that to read the detailed indications of an aura perfectly is a very difficult task. And we also, as students of Astrology, know that to perfectly judge and read a nativity, with all its various modifications and combinations, is a truly Herculean task. For although there is unity at the centre, diversity and complexity are the chief features in manifestation.

be elevated, the diaphragm is spasmodic, the breathing is disturbed to such an extent that there is a gasping in the throat, the nostrils are inflated, the mouth is open, the lower jaw is dropped low down; and although the mouth is open, the teeth cannot be seen; yet, the mouth is placed in such a condition that the tongue can be seen between the lips. In great pain, the cheeks are hollow, the nostrils quiver, the lips tremble and the muscles in the neck and chest tremble also. The respiration, in fear, is very short and rapid. The countenance grows pale, the hair is lifted upwardly and the skin in the face and on the head is moved to and fro by the muscles. A cold sweat is pressed out from the pores.

When a person is strongly excited, or terrified, his eyes look wild, the inner part of the eyebrows is elevated, the expression of the face is bewildered, the cheeks are raised to some extent, the mouth is kept partially open, the step is undecided and the angles of the mouth are drawn powerfully down. The nostrils are extended and the head is thrown backwardly almost in between the shoulders.

When the person is horrified, there is action in the body and mind. Every fibre, nerve and muscle is tensed. The flesh creeps and a sensation of chilliness fills the entire organism.

Desperation almost paralyzes a person. In desperation the eyes are fixed, the features of the face are shrunken and dark red, the muscles of the face are convulsive, the person is stupid and motionless and characterized by a wild look.

Joy raises the eyebrows to a certain extent; it enlarges the eye; it animates the countenance; it inflates the nostrils, and raises the angles of the mouth.

Admiration expands the eyebrows and raises them slightly upwardly; it lifts the eyelids; it relaxes the lower part of the face, giving rise to a pleasing smile. It opens the mouth to some little extent, relaxing the lower lip, so that the edge of the lower teeth and tongue can be seen. The attitude of the body is erect and the head is thrown back, giving us an attitude of admiration or wonder.

All kinds of depressing passions depress the face; happy emotions elevate the features of the face. Discontent clouds the brow, arches the nose and draws the angle of the mouth down.

In anger, the eyeballs enlarge, the eves roll and become red, the eyebrows are knit and raised at intervals, the forehead is furrowed by deep lines, the countenance is pale and almost livid,





the hair is sometimes raised, the nostrils are enlarged, the lips are dark and swelled, the corners of the mouth are drawn down and the entire countenance wears a threatening aspect.

When a person gets very angry, or when he is moved by a fighting desire, he holds his head forwardly and shakes it from side to side; he assumes an erect attitude; he clinches his fists; he tenses his muscles; his features are sharpened; his eyes grow dark, the pupils of the eyes enlarge; he draws down the eyebrows and his entire body is in a tense and threatening condition.

When a person is moved by destructive passions, his features are heavy; his blood is going to his head; his face is dark; he is restless in his movements; his eyes are inflamed; his eyebrows are knit. Such a man is dangerous. He has the human tiger in his heart and ferocity in his soul. A dark, livid face is not a good sign. Wild inflamed eyes indicate restlessness and brutality. Vacancy of expression means madness or else a wandering mind.

The face is the soul's map on which everything is written. All kinds of characteristics are recorded in the face. Emotions, passions, appetites, wishes, desires and states of mind are seen in the face, or recorded in the face. Therefore, also, a physiognomist paying attention to the face of a stranger, or to the face of a friend, can perceive the writing that has been written there.

Every person who wishes to become a first class character reader should pay the closest attention to faces, especially at such times when the people are moved by strong emotions, passions and appetites. This is one of the most effective ways of studying physiognomy. When a person is moved, almost overcome, by fear, then is the time to study his face. When a person is angry, full of revenge, then is the time to study his face. When a person becomes almost green with icalousy, then is the time to study his face. When greed has played in the face for more than fifty years, then that face is an excellent map to represent greed. When a person has loved for many years, and he has strong capacity to love, then we should study his face. Then the language of love is seen in his face. Just the same also with all other kinds of emotions, sentiments, passions, and appetites. This is a very effective way of studying character. A man who studies character from those standpoints will soon become a master in the character reading art.

subsequent development of all the organs -carefully and tenderly, as a parent of love, supplying them with the proper means of growth and perfection. Therefore, this temperament rests upon and embraces all the internal organs-heart, lungs, spleen, liver, kidneys, the entire digestive apparatus, and all the functions of vitality. The endless chain of vital processes-the links of which are absorbtion, circulation, secretion, digestion, respiration, and reproduction-is hung gracefully about the neck of this temperament. Every kind of fish, several lower animals, the sloth especially, and certain human beings, are illustrations.

Second: The Sensitive temperament comes next in the animal economy. There can be no independent formation without sensation. We supply our organs with food only because we feel the sensation of hunger. Immediately after the formation of the heart, there comes into being a nervous system; which commences from the circumference and proceeds toward the centre; and becomes the framework and basis of the Sensitive temperament. It gives sensibility to the various parts of the body; and renders those parts individual and discriminating. For example: the eye hath one sensation, the ear another, the tongue another, and so of all the internal organs -in accordance with which, each part and organ hath its own individualized needs, attractions, and supplies.

The Sensitive temperament, therefore, is based upon and embraces the entire nervous system; which system is composed of brain, the cranial nerves, spinal cord, the spinal nerves, and the sympathetic nerve. There, all, are telegraphic wires in the body—conducting the lifeprinciple from the brain through all parts of the organism, and the results thereof back again, faithfully and beautifully as the reciprocal workings of love and wisdom in the constitution of Nature.

Third: The Motive temperament comes next. As soon as sensation is organized and its function established, then are manifested the agents of motion and of power. These agents make their appearance in the shape, and with the title, of bones, sinews, tendons, ligaments, membranes, and a variety of less visible connections. In several forest animals this temperament preponderates over the nutritive and sensitive. For example: see the antelope, the zebra, the reindeer, and the domestic greyhound.

Fourth: The Muscular temperament next appears on the scale. The muscles are not so legimately and exclusively the agents of motion as philosophers have supposed. Because a certain effect is never seen separate from a certain cause, it does not therefore become legitimate to conclude, that the cause is made to produce that effect alone: for the cause may contain various other properties, not so easily determined. Thus of man's muscular system-informing of the mind which moves it.

The bones constitute the frame-work of the human temple; but the muscles. also timbers in the house, are quite unlike the former in property and function. There are in man two hundred and fortyeight bones; and more than four hundred muscles. Male and female, or positive and negative, muscles are everywhere seen. First, those nearest the surface: second, those nearest the bone. Physicians term them: the "superficial" and the "deep seated." Many quadrupeds possess this temperament stronger than the nutritive, sensitive, or motive. For example: witness the bull among the dogs, and the bull among cows, the ox, the tiger, panther, hyena, the bear, elephant, and the lion. The lion shows its preponderance in the breadth and height of his shoulders, in the thunders of his voice; and not less in the prodigious power he so easily exercises upon other tenants of the wilderness and mountains.

Fifth: The Mental temperament comes next on the scale. It is common temperament of both animals and man. It arises from, and therefore belongs exclusively to, the brain. The brain has two departments. The larger portion, the cerebrum, is composed of a whitish substance; and the lesser part, the cerebellum, of a grayish matter; the whole having a border of differently-colored material. It is a compound of nervous elements; full of glands, or infinitesimal galvanic centres. Internally, it is fibrous and nervous; externally, soft and gelatinous. More than seven times as much blood is sent to the brain as to any other portion of the system.

The human Brain is at once the mystery and the master of the world. It is a wonderful magnet—drawing, without thinking, the circumambient life of the globe to itself—a factory, so to speak, wherein is manufactured and individualized *sensation*, thought, motion, memory: all in man's nature which is simple, beautiful, complicate, sublime.

Sixth: The Spiritual temperament comes next. We now depart from the animal world, and hold converse only with the human. The brain is now seen to be in three departments. Behind is the empire of Love; Knowledge reigns in front; between and above these is Wisdom. This temperament separates the human from the animal world. We may find, among animals, the Mental temperament—that is, *knowing* faculties; but the Wisdom faculties, the spiritual temperament, is man's alone. It allies him to the angel world.

Man's love of the Beautiful—of the civil, tender, elegant, and sublime—testifies unmistakably of the existence of this temperament. It is unobtrusive and internal; is the last coronation of mind; hence, is rarely manifested in its purity. Yet it *lives* and *works*, more or less visibly, in all men.

For example: Man, in physical com-

fort and luxury, was once far beneath the polar bear. While he was cold and naked, the bear was folded in a rich and warm garment of fur. But man, feeling the promptings of this latent temperament, not only clothed himself in luxury, but built great beautiful mansions. The bear remains, in everything, exactly where it was in the beginning; but Man! Who can compute the miltiform degrees of his past progressions?


This temperament gives elevation and dignity, *love of* improvement and refinement, *attraction* toward poetry, music, and spiritual religion. In its *first* manifestations, it suggests yearnings for external splendors—beautiful houses and furniture, pleasure-grounds, ornamental painting, fashionable elegances, and refined manners. As the influence of this temperament unfolds and spreads outwardly, it admires the Beautiful in Nature—landscapes, cascades, flowers, mountains, oceans: and delights in witnessing "the untied winds"—

"Take the ruffian billows by the top, Curling their monstrous heads, and hanging them, With deafening clamors, in the slippery clouds."

It is this temperament which draws "the line of demarcation" between the human kingdom and all the worlds below. In vain we might search among the innumberable generations of hyenas for a Homer, a Milton, or a Patrick Henry. Richly clad bears, long before man in the world, can refer us to no Lord Bacon or Byron, to no democratic Burns. Neither can the family of cows refer us to a Correggia, to a Canova, or a Chalmers. Lofty though and chaste expression, all the wide world through, indicate the spiritual temperament. But, in this age, it is particularly exhibited in the physical refinements of art-in all the civilities, which distinguish the cultured man from animals, and from the world's lower inhabitants.

Seventh: The Marmonial temperament, highest on the scale, is seen in the equilibrium, the accord, between the subordinate functions and the mental faculties. In this we find all the temperaments equally mixed; and progressively elevated in the order of development. It is concrete—a compendium—the blooming out! For temperament harmony between Love, Will and Wisdom—for the pathway to true greatness and happiness above the world—for real genius and consistency of character—this temperament, in due relation to all its predecessors, should be steadily and energetically sought.






