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

Man has many lessons to learn as a humble dweller on the earth, before he has any right to attempt to reach other planets or worlds. He cannot worship God without constant disagreement over creeds with his fellow man. He cannot control disease, poverty, war, or a million other things that disturb his life here. By what right does he wish to go out into space and carry his discord and inharmony to other worlds:

There is no single set of rules or standards on this earth by which man can find total agreement in his material, physical, mental, or spiritual expression. We have lived through more wars in our lifetime than we like to think about. What have they ever accomplished, out-

side of death, heart ache, and a growing National debt that can never be liquidated. Man never seems to learn. Perhaps he does not wish to learn. Unlike the prodigal son, he does not sit down and examine his own heart and mind. It takes too much effort. Then too, there have been many copies made from original manuscripts. laboriously, by the use of a pen in the hand of a scribe. In our own personal experience, we find it impossible for us to copy page after page of any material. and not allow a word of our own mind be used instead of the text we are copying.

Paul wrote to Timothy admonishing him to "study", that he might rightly "divide" the word of Holy Writ. This, we also must do, using our inner sense of wisdom, always listening to the voice of our ever present inner guide.

There is a game we play for relaxation when we are tired from hours of work at our desks. It is called "Scrabble" and has many little wooden squares with letters with which we build words. Many times there is a temptation to invent a new word when it would help to dispose of a difficult letter. We have a very easy solution to this problem. This is by making a sentence using the word. This proves its correctness. Of course, there is always a dictionary to refer to, but this is seldom necessary.

If we will remember that this rule can be applied to that which we read in books and magazines by asking ourselves, does it make sense? Is it in keeping with sane thinking? Messages, both written and orally given, can be tested by this simple rule.

I believe this to be true. I also believe we can have a psychic connection with another living person, usually of the opposite sex. How many times have you met someone, by chance, and had the feeling you have seen them before? For weeks, this thought will haunt you. You will search your memory, and finally give up, explaining to yourself that perhaps it was just a strong resemblance to someone you have seen in the movies.

Deep in your subconscious mind this haunting memory had been filed away, with perhaps millions of such memories. Your subconscious mind is a vast filing cabinet. It contains the record of everything you have ever heard, seen or experienced. Some of these memories are buried so deep in the mind that they cannot be completely recalled. Only a vague echo reaches your conscious mind, not strong enough to be recognizable.

Often we meet a person, and immediately have the feeling of being well acquainted with them. You have similar ideas, tastes, etc., in fact you seem as perfectly matched as two individuals can be.

sensations became stronger. At the other end of the line, Marion was having a similar experience. Cool breezes, and the feeling of being touched by invisible hands, became increasingly stronger. These phone calls took place every evening at exactly twenty minutes to five.

Soon, I noticed a feeling of drowsiness take hold of me, until the very strength of these Spirit forces made it difficult to remain awake during the conversations.

Due to an unfortunate circumstance, our friendship came to an end, but each evening, at the usual time, I continued to experience this trance-like sensation.

As I live alone, I did not think it wise to surrender myself to the feeling. A person alone should not become entranced, for to do so, without adequate protection, can be a dangerous thing. So, I fought it off.

However, one evening I was relaxed in a chair, deeply engrossed in a book. Suddenly, a pleasant feeling of complete ectasy came over me. It was such an exotic sensation, that I laid down the book, and closed my eyes. If I had known what was about to happen. I would not have done so.

The first feeling was that of weightlessness. My body seemed to defy the pull of gravity. I felt the effect of drifting upward, so I let myself go, having no desire for further resistance.

The Great Mystic, Kahlil Gibran

More than any other great poet. Gibran, in combining the highest artist, or prophet, the Syrian seer, spiritual concepts of both East and West, could be called the Spiritualists' poet. His writings have circled the globe, ministering to the weary and bewildered of the nations of the world. One of his books, The Prophet. ° ° ° has been translated into thirty different languages and dialects. This book of universal appeal touches and stirs the spirit with a finger of fire. According to the need of each, it speaks to the heart: solves problems, answers questions, and brings each to his fulfillment.

Youth says, "Herein are all the things I have in my heart', and goes on to give an example of what the Seer said about Love - to follow love when he beckons, though his ways are hard and steep; to believe him, though his voice may shatter dreams, as the north wind lays waste the garden; to remember that even as love crowns us, so shall it also crucify us, for love is for our growth and also for our prun-

Then Age, speaking of *The Prophet*, said. "All my days have I sought, knowing not what; now in my Winter time I find my treasure in this book", in what the Sage affirms concerning the soul, death, and God - that he declared that we "are spirits, though we move in bodies, and though like oil that burns in the dark, we are flames held in lamps." Often he spoke of the "continuity of life", periods of existence of the human spirit that are all in the pattern in the inevitable design, for nothing is small in this earthly life, and nothing happens by chance.

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And, about death, he would make it clear that "death changes nothing but the masks that cover our faces", for the woodman is the woodman still, and the ploughman the ploughman still." He told often of the treasures of the spirit, and said of himself beyond the door called Death: "I shall live beyond death and sing in your ears. I shall

sit at your table, without a body; I shall go with you to the fields, a spirit invisible, and I shall come to your fireside as a guest unseen. He would go on to say how he longed for Eternity where he would meet his unwritten poems and his unpainted pictures — there, he de-clared, "I will rise and strip me of time and space."

Of the Infinite One he spoke, saving that God is our all, the heart that contains all hearts, the love that encompasses all loves, the spirit that envelops our spirits, the voice that enfolds all voices, a silence deeper than all silences and timeless, a beauty more enchanting than all the beautiful - a song more vast than the songs of the seas and the forests.

The uniqueness of the great mystic was evident in all stages of his development. When Kahlil was four years of age, he dug deep holes in his garden and planted

small torn scraps of paper so that they might take root and grow into a tall bush that should produce fair sheets of paper for him to write and draw upon! It was his habit later, as he began his books, to pray, "Help me, O Lord, to write thy truth enfolded in thy beauty in this book.

When he was six, his mother gave him a volume of Leonardo's reproductions. After turning the pages for a few minutes in silence. he burst into wild weeping and ran from the room to be alone. His passion for De Vinci possessed him from that hour, and even in times of childish stress and strain, when rebuked, he would say, "What have you to do with me? I am an

As he grew older, in a few words he summarized his attitude toward different periods in his life. When he was born, he said, "I will go back." When he was three years old, a tempest visited his town that tore his clothes and he shouted. "I go with the storm!" When he was twelve, he remarked: "I will stay here awhile; I have something to At twenty, he had forgotten what to say, but at thirty-three, he began to remember the message he came to bring to the world. He often said that he was a strange child that only his mother understood, that he "was a small volcano, a young earthquake." Yet, he would lie perfectly still while his mother sang to him the soft, wild, plaintive songs of his native desert and mountain in a voice of enchanting beauty. Gibran said of his mother, that she lived countless poems but never wrote one. But, the song that lies silent in the heart of the mother will sing upon the lips of the

While he lived his own countless songs, he sang also, both her songs and his own. His first poems were not written in words, but were modeled in snow and fashioned in stone. Figures of strange, childlike beauty grew under his hands in the winter in his garden. Passing neighbors would remark, "See what the young Gibran has done!" His own exper-ience later led him to realize, re-*************

garding beauty education, that a child may be taught to draw a bird as easily as to write the word. A child may make rhymes while he is learning to make sentences, and he may model clay when he learns to build with his first blocks. Such a program could accomplish outstanding results, had we not forgotten that there is only one universal language, and that its voice is

Then suddenly it seems that the little Gibran could write. But he tore up his work because it was not what he wanted to say. Likewise, with colored pencils and pigments he drew and painted, but destroyed the pictures because "they were never like what I saw when my eyes were dark." Later, he called it all "green work". He rewrote The Prophet five times until it satisfied him.

As a young child, Gibran learned Arabic, French, and English, He came to America when eleven years of age, with his mother, halfbrother, and two sisters. He did not find all that he needed in America, so insisted on returning, when fourteen years of age, to Beirut to study and get his degree from the School of Wisdom. He graduated with high honors, and besides the prescribed curriculum, he studied medicine, international law, history of religion, music, and other subjects. At fifteen years of age, he was writing, and had completed his first draft of The Prophet, had edited a literary and philosophical magazine, The Truth. After traveling in Greece, Spain, and Italy, he studied painting in Paris. It was work, work, work and more work, but he tells us that "work is love made visible.

He wrote profusely for two years, but was called back to America by the illness of his family, where he wrote and painted for a time, until he returned to Paris for more art study. When he finally came back to America, he founded his own Academy of Art in Boston, and later went to spend the remainder of his life in New York City where he lived in the first studio building ever built in America exclusively for the use of painters and sculp-

Gibran's works indicate that he had a mind excellently trained, limitless in range and depth, a thinker inspired that came through the years to a profound scholarship. Once, for a prank, he dictated to three secretaries at one time, in three languages and on three different subjects — to the amazement of all concerned.

The Spiritual Centers Of Man

In the 12th chapter of St. Matthew, verses 30 to 32, we read the words of Christ, in which He rebukes Blasphemy:

"He that is not with me is against me; and he that gathereth not with

me scattereth abroad.

"Wherefore I say unto you, All manner of sin and blasphemy shall be forgiven unto men; but the blasphemy against the Holy Ghost shall not be forgiven unto men.

"And whosoever speaketh a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but whosoever speaketh against the Holy Chost, it shall not be forgiven him, neither in this world, neither in the world to come.

Because of the prevalent ignorance among people concerning things of a normally invisible nature, it is understandable why mankind is being increasingly induced and beguiled into believing much of the atheistic ideology being propagated, subtly and otherwise, in the world today. Not only do we discover more and more people, collectively and individually, disputing the existence of God, the Supreme Intelligence governing all creation, but they are going a step further to deny the reality of their own spiritual-self; their unique immortal soul! Children generally are not taught, as they should be from the time they are sufficiently mature to comprehend, that they are essentially a Spiritual Being, temporarily housed in a mortal body. They are not learning that besides the physical body their young consciousness resides in, they also have a duplicate etheric counterpart, constructed of too fine a substance to be discerned through ordinary vision. The fact that this etheric double, or psychic body, is a connecting link between this and the world of spirit, is being neglected also. Minds, from young on, are not being instructed, and admonished, that their fundamental responsibility and obligation to the Heavenly Father, to other personalities, and to themselves, is to commence the building and fashioning of their incorruptible spiritual body while dwelling upon this mundane sphere.

People who have been born with, or develop, psychic abilities and spiritual gifts - those who have personally experienced the certainty of a superior, transcendent form of life, and who have often been able to prove, by demonstration, this fact to others - have always been the object of ridicule and scorn. Why? Simply because there has been contention transpiring down through the centuries between the positive and the negative, right and wrong, good and evil, the Christ and the antichrist; dualistic opposing forces that can never co-exist in harmony with each other. One will eventually have to be subdued, and, judging from the indicative signs currently manifesting, the time is not far off when this will be brought to pass.

Many souls can testify to the conflict occurring from within and without their individual consciousness. A multitude has succumbed to the satanic influences of wrongdoing, becoming participants in the attempt to intice others into their tainted observances. Think not that the spirit world is free of these obiectionable conditions. It will not be so until the earth plane is cleansed of its immorality until mankind becomes so loathful and intolerant with the debisement he sometimes finds himself enmeshed in, that he will willingly seek the intervention of the all-powerful One to help lift him above his despair. Let us hope, and pray, that more souls will turn to God (who is ever waiting to enter into their hearts and minds at the least beekoning) to receive the compassion. forgiveness, and strength they are in need of, before it is too late! "Know we not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of (I Corinthians 6:9)

We frequently hear it quoted: "With God all things are possible." But, how do we obtain the spiritual power imperative to become in rapport with the consciousness of God, to enable Him to perform His miraculous works through us? Ultimately the seven main psychic centers, also known as the chakra force or energy centers, must be magnetized and imbued with the power of the spirit; or the power of God, if you please. The chakras belong to the usually invisible etheric body, and are allied with the spinal column; the channel through which the kundalini fire rises. The lowermost chakra, located at the base of the spine, absorbs the lowest scale of the undulatory essence of life from the cosmos, and each succeeding chakra draws in a higher range of vital force. This assimulation of the divine spark, necessary to express the diverse phases of life, is a continuous process. However, after we have sufficiently developed our psychic vehicle, we can, by concentration, ingest a larger than customary amount of animated spirit energy through a particular chakra, to produce a desired effect.

The seven psychic centers, or chakras, in the order of their locations, are: the Root Chakra, the Splenic Chakra, the Solar Plexus

Chakra, the Heart Chakra, the Throat or Thyroid Chakra, the Pituitary or Brow Chakra, and the Pineal or Crown Chakra - also known as the "Thousand-Petaled Lotus". People who lead a life mostly bent upon carnal pleasure, sometimes have the second chakra situated over the prostrate gland, instead of in the splenic area.

The chakras all have their distinctive coloring, which varies according to the plane of consciousness an individual is primarily attuned to. They transmit the energies that give an impulse to such attributes and talents as: love, faith, courage, mercy, intellect, intuition, aspiration, inspiration, trance, astral projection, clairvoyance (spiritual seeing), clairaudience (spiritual hearing or attunement to the "inner voice"), psychic or spiritual healing, etc.

The Root Chakra is a murky red color when undesirable traits are dominant such as wrath, malice, covetousness, sensuality, etc. It becomes an orange-red with the expression of estimable qualities. This chakra intromits energies essential for man's physical functions. It is the starting point from which the kundalini is activated.

In those who have the second chakra located in the Prostatic region, the chakra reflects a red color, but in those who have it in the Splenic area, it is a rose color, because the sexual force is then used not only for reproductive purposes, but toward the achievement of other commendable creative endeavors as well.

The Solar Plexus Chakra, or abdominal brain, is the emotional center wherin man strugles to resist the tempations of evil. It contains a combination of benefic and malefic desires, and frequently changes its color, though it is principally green.

Both human affection and divine love is expressed through the Heart Chakra. Its color is yellow, which turns to a golden hue when the Self is overcome.

The Throat or Thyroid Chakra, usually a light blue color, may take on a silvery appearance in those who are eager for spiritual progression.

The Pituitary or Brow Chakra is a dark blue. In those more spiritually advanced, both the pituitary

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and pineal glands are within this chakra, starting the formation of the Crown Chakra.

Finally, the Pineal or Crown Chakra: the "Thousand-Petaled Lotus"; which radiates a color that varies from violet to the glorious white brilliance of the Christ Consciousness, in its higher expression,

Thus is the power of the spirit made manifest.




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THE LIGHT WITHIN YOU

cursing in their bitterness. Yet, some stay, weeping in agony, for their hearts have been touched. They see their errors and wish for the truth. They have resolved to reform, and do not wish to remain with this dark group. Now they are going away with the messengers. How bright they are! To gaze upon them fills me with pleasure.

"I have now risen to a higher plane, the sphere of the good and the just. Such an exaltation fills me that I find words inadequate to express it. 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The telephone rang loudly in the night, and upon answering, our daughter told us that our six weeks old granddaughter Carolyn was in Children's Hospital in Oklahoma City with influenza-meningitis, My husband and I dressed hurriedly. and soon were on our way to see if we could be of any help. Carolyn had had a cold, but none of us thought is was serious.

I did not see Carolyn until they brought her home from the hospital. Her appearance at that time was unbelievable, and although we held our emotions in check, it was hard to ignore her enlarged head, due to fluid on the brain. She could not move her head, and when we needed to do so, we had to use the utmost care. A brain surgeon talked of grafting nerve tissue, for it was thought that the eight cranial nerves had been damaged by the drawing of many spinal specimens. This also affected her balance.

Carolyn had entered the hospital the last of October, 1946, and the doctor who treated her told us she was given the very first streptomycin ever given anyone since World War H. We were all much concerned about this precious child. but were compelled to leave her in the hands of God and those trying so desperately to save her life. Remembering others who had suffered with this disease, and the resulting deformities, I prayed, "Dear Lord, Thy will be done", many times a day. She was truly in God's

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hands and in the care of the Spirit helpers who seek to aid the sick.

After three months of hospitalization, the parents were called to the hospital consultation room and told that all had been done that could be done for Carolyn. They were told to take her home and make her as comfortable as possible until the end. No hope of recovery was given.

We have known children who have become ill from lack of love, for we live in a world where man's inhumanity to man has grown to such an extent that his entire outlook has become overshadowed with selfishness and greed, and man goes about his tasks with a nonchalance of self importance that

is not unlike the self satisfied Romans with their schemes for world control. This world needs love and understanding to battle the ills we have today. Each has a place to fill, and even the difficult. each must strive to fulfill his or her own destiny.

Any cure may be sparked, helped, or even achieved by means of spiritual communication if one has faith and knowledge, and we have proof of love, faith, spirit healing and medicine all combining to cure Carolyn.

We talked the situation over the evening Carolyn was brought home from the hospital, and decided to give Carolyn much of the love and affection she had missed while away. We dressed her in pretty clothes, so that she might look more normal. We felt that Carolyn had been left with us for a purpose. God had given us a challenge!

While in the hospital, Carolyn had been fed intravenously and when she began to eat in a normal way, she became ill. The pediatrician prescribed boiled milk and Carolyn began to gain weight and look better. Carolyn did not die as had been predicted, and several trips were made back and forth from the hospital, but these resulted in little change.

About this time, Carolyn's father was laid off, and moved his family to Tulsa, where he found intermittent employment. Carolyn went with them, but during the winter suffered from recurrent colds. Then Jennie, the baby's mother, had to have major surgery, and I brought Carolyn home with me, as her mother was too ill to care for her. Carolyn was then fifteen months old and weighed thirty-five pounds. I kept her with me for two months. though she was hard to care for, being limp in body, with no grip in her hands. Having been a nurse, I had some ideas about helping Carolyn use her body, so began to make plans. We felt exercise would help, but when Carolyn began to tire, we laid her down. Then, she began to try to pick things up with her hands. We were making some progress! Other exercises were used, and progress continued. Carolya seemed alert as far as her mentality was concerned, and equal to children of her age. Everything a well child could do we were anxious for Carolyn to do also. It was often an effort to accomplish these things, for it was necessary not to overtax her nerves and strength. She still could not walk alone.

Then on May 30th, 1949, it happened! Carolyn was then nearly three. The big family dinner was over, and all had settled down in the living room for the usual visiting. We heard a commotion at the other end of the room. Carolyn had risen to her feet, looked about,

EMBROGENE and ECTOPLASM by Ed Bodin

In reviewing my writings and lectures during the past forty years for condensation in a book entitled My Best Friends Are Ghosts, I found that more inquiries were recorded from intellectual people and scientists than from any other field, on the subject Origin Of Ectoplasm, which first appeared in Spirit World magazine in 1947 and which was copied extensively around the world.

This information is even more timely than ever, on account of Russia's recent progress in science; for the medical doctor (a woman) who gave me the information during an interview in New York City, began her experiments in Russia nearly twenty years ago. I assured her I would never reveal her name. although I can vouch for her standing in the world of medicine and medical science.

The term this doctor used was "Embrogene", which to me meant ectoplasm — for she felt it was a combination of glandular matter and radiation surrounding the child in its mother's womb. In the few cases where this fluid had been secured from a pregnant woman killed by accident, it had been cultured and used for experiment.

One of these experiments in Russia, where the embrogene culture was injected into the veins of a man, resulted in the man having clairaudient powers for several minutes; and he was able to "listen in" on a conversation of a group of scientists six miles away. The man had never had mediumistic power before. When Stalin heard of this experiment he feared its danger in espionage, and disciplined the Russian doctors; but the American doctor associate fled to Paris, where she continued the experiments and even brought health to aged persons when she returned to America before her death. As far as I can learn, her records were never revealed to the public. She had long feared persecution and perhaps hid the records or even destroyed them.

However, I know she believed in survival and communication. From conversation with her, we concluded that embrogene is absorbed by the unborn child, becoming part of the glandular make-up of the child at birth. Most of the embrogene seems to be contained in or around the solar-plexus. Children born with veils or cauls, have more embrogene in their chemical con-

stitution, due to the veil holding the liquid in more concentrated form, allowing much to be absorbed by the body. This might account for the old belief that a child born with a caul is psychic and more fortunate.

While all human bodies carry a limited supply of embrogene since birth, those who possess a supersupply by natural causes, are your mediums. One theory is that the main purpose of embrogene is God's Plan to encompass the spirit body at death, as it leaves the mortal body, enabling the spirit body to withstand astral pressure and rise above earthbound vibrations into and above the astral plane, and many higher planes of spirit frequencies, because the embrogene has been refined during life, by spiritual progressions which after all is the real purpose of high Spiritualism, and not the fortune telling divination which Saint Paul denounced in Acts 16:16 to 19.

One hypothesis by investigators, is that Embrogene can be dissipated by evil thought and action, and by association with low spirit influences, to such an extent that a spirit body at death becomes permanently earthbound and unable to reach higher planes of vibratory energy, and is thus limited to the astral flames of psychic fog which some call Hell. Evidently Jesus the Christ knew much about the science of embrogenic energy and the higher frequencies called Heaven. The doctor felt that the New Testament carried many scientific proofs far above theological mis-interpretations by creedists and religionists.

Thus, scientific Spiritualism can reveal the truth; and the truth can make us free from ignorance and disaster, and the bigotry of creed. So mote it be.

A QUESTION TO ED BODIN

Question: I possess a knowledge of shorthand. Last summer and the summer before, I attended a Spiritualist Camp and made a careful analysis of messages received through a number of mediums. I was pleased with the identification of my loved ones in spirit and their greetings and spiritual help - but was greatly displeased by the errors on predictions. How do you account for it?

Answer: This is not a strange condition. Too many sitters believe that second-sight means secondinsight. Most mediums have second sight, but very few have second insight which, according to St. Paul in Acts 16:16, can be unholy if not for spirituality rather than fortunetelling.

The condition you mention is really the fault of the sitters who go to mediums mainly for futuretelling rather than spiritual guidance and comforting greetings. God gave us free will and we must make our own decisions with the aid of prayer and spiritual guidance and righteous motive. Do not expect a Spiritualist medium to be a pagan oracle as did those of the Old Testament.

SUSAN B. ANTHONY by Dr. Eric G. Hagen

In a biography, Susan B. Anthony, by Rhea Dorr, published in 1898, there is an interesting anecdote about Spiritualism.

When Susan B. Anthony, the great crusader for abolition and Women's Suffrage was in London for an International Conference on legal reforms, she met Annie Besant, the noted occultist and theosophist. The conversation centered around Charle Bradlaugh. who was rejected by the British Parliament as an "infidel", but who, to his death, was a great admirer of Annie Besant.

When Annie Besant spoke of her astral journeys to the realm of spirit, Susan B. I am not a medium, but have had some interesting psychic experiences, my first one being when I was twenty-three years of age. My father was taken very ill in August of that year, but we who loved him were reluctant to admit the seriousness of his disease, and were, of course, hopeful to the very last.

One Friday afternoon, I was sitting in my bedroom writing a letter to my uncle. Suddenly, I heard the low toned voices of several women, as tho they were talking over some matter among themselves. Then, one voice spoke up clear and distinct, saying, "Your father will die next Tuesday at

Naturally I was startled, and just would not believe that what I had heard was correct. I began telling myself that I had just imagined the voices, in fact, the whole thing! Yet, deep in my heart, I knew I had not.

Father did die the following Tuesday at 12:10 noon. I have believed in spirit communion ever since, and often feel the presence of loved ones, and know that they help me over rough places.

Soon, I must have surgery on my eyes, but know that my unseen helpers will stand by with their wonderful help, as they have many times before.

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Don't Let Them Blame My Brother!

"This is not a murder, Judge DeWitt. I ask you to hold the sher-iff in Kenton. This family has suffered enough already. I beg of you, Judge, to let me handle this.

In part, that was the telephone conversation one afternoon between myself and Judge Guernsey DeWitt of Hardin County, Ohio. I was prompted to make that phone call to the Judge by the Spirit Voice of a boy who had just died. It hap-

pened in this manner:

I was at my desk in the Methodist parsonage in Forest, Ohio, working on my sermon. In that quiet room, surrounded by my books, I always felt a great spiritual power present. But, that afternoon it seemed strangely different. The Spirit Forces seem always present with me in my study, hovering over my desk, as if suspended above me. That afternoon, they seemed to be in motion. Of course, there were no physical sounds of fluttering about me, but my spiritual sensitiveness told me that many Spirit Helpers were moving about on swift missions of great importance. Under this condition, I stopped work on my sermon, closed my books, and bowed my head on my old walnut desk in prayer.

I have learned the importance of knowing when to sit still and listen to God. As Isaiah tells the

people:
"Their strength is to sit still." And then added:

"Thus saith the Lord God, 'In returning and rest shall you be saved; in quietness and confidence shall be your strength." Isaiah 30:7.

This was one of those times when I did not talk to God, but waited, asking God to speak to me through His Spirit Helpers. I knew that something extraordinary was about to happen, and I needed detailed instructions from the highest spirit sources. Prayer is a two way telephone. I sat at my desk with eyes and mouth closed, straining my spiritual ears to get every word from the Spirit World.

Many people ask me the question: "How do I get messages?

You cannot hear Spirit Voices unless you listen for them. You cannot hear Spirit Messages if you are talking all the time, or complaining all the time. Just as you listen on the telephone for the other voice to speak, you must find time to sit in silence and listen for Spirit Voices. This I did at my desk that afternoon.

I had no idea of what was coming. I only knew that under such spiritual activity, unusual things were about to occur, and I was to be right in the middle of them.

Spirit Forces began to assemble

a picture before me that I must describe to you. I had organized several groups of young people in my church and often took some of them, or all of them on camping trips, or hiking, and fishing. We had a two story cottage used just for our young people that was set in a beautiful twenty acre woodlot. On one of these fishing trips, I had taken about 15 boys there one afternoon when a near tragedy occurred. The boys were scattered along the river bank, fishing, and I had been walking up and down

the stream watching their activities. I heard a loud splash in the river, and rushed toward the two brothers of the Hart family. I saw the younger lying face down in the water, and his brother grasping his clothing, trying to hold onto him. I was able to get a good grip on him and we pulled him onto the bank. The boy soon recovered and appeared to have suffered no harm. He was soon fishing again. But, I had seen enough to know that he had fallen into the river because he had suffered a seizure that rendered him unconscious. I questioned his older brother about this, but he seemed quite certain that he had not been so afflicted before, and thought this was the first time. Thereafter, when out with the boys, I kept a closer watch on the young Hart lad.

As I sat with my head bowed on my desk that afternoon, a picture of young Hart lying in the river was painted for me by Spirit Hands. And then a Voice:

"You remember the day you took the Boy's Club fishing? My brother didn't push me into the

river, did he, Rev. Chancy?"
"No, my boy," I answered the Spirit Voice. "You became ill and fell in."

"Don't let them blame my broth-

er for this, Rev. Chancy! Please, don't let them blame my brother for this!" pleaded the boyish spirit

What I have related to you seems to have covered a great deal of time, but I am certain that I received all I have reported here in a space of five minutes; so clear and vivid are spirit manifestations. All this could mean only that the Hart boy had suffered another seizure and had died. But, under what circumstances, or where, was not clear to me. Neither did I understand why the boy's spirit asked me to clear his older brother of blame for his death.

Hurrying from the parsonage on Gromley Street, I ran to the Hart home and found everything in confusion. The family was weeping. the mother near prostration. learned that the undertaker had just left the house with the boy's body. The story that the mother pieced together for me was this:

The Hart family was eating their noon meal, when, as often happens in a family of youngsters, a quarrel began between the two brothers sitting on opposite sides of the table. In a burst of anger, the older boy threw his fork across the table and struck the younger in the chest just over the heart. The boy tumbled off his chair onto the floor under the table, and was dead when picked up, with the fork still sticking in his chest.

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



Mary Fitzgerald; and Rev. Rafaela Galvan. Special music was played by Rev. Ethel Archer.





five acres and is off the main highway, three miles from the town of Canby, and a short drive from Oregon City.

The hotel is old but comfortable. In the lobby, the Articles of Incorporation are hung, "First Spiritual Religious Association Of Clakamas County". The date is November 8th, 1873. Thus we see that this Camp is eighty-eight years old and was organized only twenty-five years after the advent of Modern Spiritualism, which took place through the mediumship of the Fox Sisters in Hydesville, New York, in 1848.

The hotel lobby is often used for evening services and message circles, also for entertainments. It has a piano and rostrum and a friendly atmosphere prevails.

There is a large dining room, where meals provided by Mrs. Vigelius are served at regular hours. Among those who help her is her husband Bill, a very fine Spiritual healer. Dinners are \$1.00 per person; Sunday dinners are \$1.25. Breakfast and lunches according to what one desires. Bedrooms are \$2.00 per night or \$12.00 per week. An extra bed is \$2.00.

The Camp is surrounded by trees and there are many beautiful shade trees on the grounds. Pretty cottages are along part of the driveway, all with flower gardens. The church, which is quite large, is in the center of the grounds opposite the outdoor Healing Shrine.

The Shrine itself is circular, with seats inside, shaded by large trees, lovely flower beds encircle the Shrine and people stop to admire their beautiful colors.

We were told that other cottages are going to be built, and when completed, the Camp will resemble a little English village, the village green being overlooked by the church. On Sunday, the church bell rings for services, creating a vibration of peace and security,

Spirit Forces Want To Save Mankind

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Man is helpless without outside forces to help him. He is placed in a world filled with so many things that he cannot understand them all. He has temptations on every side, he desires to learn everything he can; he seeks for love and power and money. He has all kinds of desires and distractions. But, without some spiritualization in his life, he can get nowhere, and without some guiding principle, he will come to little or nothing. It is here that the spirit forces come in to help him, not only to organize his life on earth, but to teach him to understand why he is living here and what he will find when he leaves the present body.

There is no way out of the mess man has made for himself now except thru divine help. So it is to us. his spirit friends, that man must come for the help which he needs badly. People have failed to listen to what the Great Teacher taught so many years ago, and so they are in a world filled with fear and hatred – because men have forgotten God and hate each other. But, we could put them on the right road if only they would listen to us.

But how are we going to make men listen to us, or even to get their attention? It is our hardest task, and even those who are in contact with us do not work earnestly enough to spread the truth, so that more men will know about us and will seek our help. Something must be done about it, for chaos may break over the world if it is allowed to go on as it is, with ignorant, selfish men running things. There is no spiritual insight in government today, no thought of bettering mankind, but only of getting more for each group of people.

We offer so much which will aid man, and man does not know of our offer or is unable to understand us. We want so much to help you there on the earth plane, but you have gone so far along the wrong path that it will be doubly hard for us to bring you back to the right road. It is like talking to someone who cannot hear and who does not want to hear. But, if men could once get a glimpse of the wonderful possibilities of life on earth after they had gotten rid of their fears and hates then they would know that we were the only source of spiritual truth and knowledge of God.

No one is destroyed, but civilizations can be destroyed, and mankind could be wiped from the earth. But, this is not according to the divine plan, and for that reason it must be avoided. Other earths have been depopulated for the same reasons that yours may be, so do

not think that I am writing merely from imagination. What a great loss it would be to have all that has been created and developed suddenly destroyed, leaving the sphere as though no race as man had ever lived there! It is not to be borne, and we will do all we can to avoid it. But, without the cooperation of more men we may not succeed in saving it. We are hoping to do so, but only by helping us, by preaching the gospel of love versus hate, and spirituality versus materialism, can there be any chance of our succeeding.

Losing One's Desire for Physical Things

Man's environment is physical. so of course he must have physical or material things to sustain life. This is as it should be. He must take care of his body, he must eat, he must raise his offspring and make a living. All this is very necessary, although it is not so in our world or life. So man cannot be blamed very much if his chief interest is in physical things. They are the most important part of his life and must be attended to.

But, many men find that material things alone do not satisfy them. That is also natural, because he has this feeling from God, who does not want him to lose entire contact with the greater or spiritual life. But, the road to spiritual understanding or development is so difficult and so vague that many people are discouraged and give it up, while others are content to follow the false teachings of those who proclaim that they have the key to spiritual development.

Now, it is one of the most difficult things in the world to persuade people that spiritual things are of more real value than the material. For, of course, material objects can be seen, felt, heard, and enjoyed and it is not so easy to enjoy, much less perceive, spiritual facts. Therefore, it takes a great deal of study, thinking and experiencing for people to come to realize the real value of spiritual understanding and its great influence on the physical. For the spiritual is stronger than the physical, and can overcome it in every way. That is because the spiritual understanding comes right from God, whereas the material is a means only of giving certain experiences to struggling souls.

It is with a great deal of concern that many people give up or try to give up material pleasures in the hope of finding more spiritual ones. For they always seem to have a doubt in their minds as to whether or not they are doing the right

thing. Many have gone to extremes. such as religious fanatics, but they have simply cut themselves off from normal development, since they have *denied* physical pleasures without overcoming them. This is not real development, but simply a state of passiveness wherein they try to calm desires which have never been really subjected to the higher principles of the spirit.

It is necessary that men learn to overcome an excessive desire for material things by their study of spiritual evidence, and by trying to live lives based on such evidence. Then, they are not simply denying themselves certain pleasures and satisfactions, but are substituting greater pleasures, ones which are longer lasting and more satisfying. And, if they only knew it, they are preparing themselves for this highly spiritual world or life which they will enter when they leave their bodies.

The only way in which one can overcome his desires for physical pleasures is to develop a liking for spiritual ones. In this way his taste changes and he will, in time, wonder how he could have liked the former pleasures. A taste of spiritual truth makes material truth forever unpalatable. He has not really lost anything, but gained a great deal. He will be forever thankful that he has learned the way toward truth, the way toward progression, and the way toward God.

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

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A 7ime For Sowing

Creating within people a desire to learn more about the subjects of Spiritualism. Occultism and Mysticism has been, for the most part, a question of introducing the subjects in forms palatable to the open minded, ready-to-be-convinced seeker of the truth. We are now coming into an era wherein we must, figuratively, go out into the highways and byways and bring an understanding of our beliefs to those who are more or less unwilling to even listen to the reasons for stepping away from the path of orthodoxy and into that of Mystical

The road is fraught with pitfalls and genuine danger to the occultist who is "Bull in-the-China-Shoppish", and equally dangerous is the road which the over cautious individual tries to follow. Therefore, a middle of the road policy must be sought.

Since it is always easier to say "Don't" than it is to say "Do", let us start with a few don'ts.

Don't wage a vocal campaign that is going to put you into everybody's Black book. It is just as easy to keep a still tongue around militant "anti-everythings" as it is to get into a quarrel. Quarreling over one's religious beliefs never gained a convert, and has done much harm to the Cause by causing our entire group of organizations to be branded as a bunch of crack pots, without the first degree of refinement.

We know in what we believe, so "Don't" make an issue of the other fellow's failure to believe as we do. It may be that he has never had a psychic experience, so how can he accept our belief on word of mouth

evidence alone? Agree with him that what he has always believed in has been good for him, but slip in a quiet word that says you would like to have him go to a service in your church in exchange for him taking you to a service in his. If you have never been to his church you stand to learn as much as he will, and what is more, when you understand his religion better you will be better prepared to lead him to see your side of the story. Remember that Spiritualism and Psychic Science are religious forms of Science and Philosophy. We have just as deep and sincere a theological background as any of the Orthodox religions, and unless we can show something besides the magnificent phenomena with which we are blessed, we cannot expect to lead new comers into our fold. Don't, therefore, overdo the phenomenal angle. It is of no use to talk about materializations unless you can produce one for your listener. There is no use in showing psychic photographs to strangers, unless you are able to explain their production and prove that they are not retouched pictures, therefore fakes. It is of no use to display even the most beautiful apport to the untutored unless you are in a position to demonstrate how they are produced.

You can do much to increase interest in our Beliefs by concentrating on the Theological, Philosophical and Metaphysical angles at any and almost all times. There are places where such subjects are not discussed, and if they are, the results are degrading not only to the subject but to the person so foolishly discussing it. Beer halls, taverns, dance halls and other places of revelry are not places in which to make a mock of that which is, or should be, nearest and dearest to you. We have those in our numbers who do drink, both publicly and privately. So be it. Let them not make sport of our religious beliefs by dragging them through the mud when in their cups. There are those who are fond of dancing. It is a healthful exercise, and creates a mood of fellowship among those at the dance hall or ballroom, but let them not drag the subject of philosophy up by its shoetops to be booted about like a lost corsage. The theatre is as good a place as one can find to spend a relaxing hour or two, but it is not the place to harangue an unwilling captive audience into a state of exasperation. None of these places can be called suitable for such conversations, but private confabs over the luncheon table or knitting needles can provide opportunities to introduce the subject without

making a nuisance of one's self.

Establish in your own mind the where, when and what of timely discussion, then go out and be a missionary in the field of that which we know is the best and most beautiful religion in the world.

HE KEPT HIS PROMISE

Ed Note: This account is taken from the magazine, "Yours Fraternally", the International Spiritualist Federation Magazine, published in England, in which we found this interesting account of an apparition, as related in the Protestantisk Tidende, of Denmark, reported by Rev. Kirkegaard, well versed in psychic science.

Apparitions of people shortly after their death are observed in the East as well as in the West. The Rev. Kirkegaard, who tells the story, writes: "My old student comrade and army physician, Carl Holdt, became acquainted with an old Brahmin, Ali Fezi Kahn, who was about 100 years old. He was a well educated man, who knew more about European savants and their scientific works than the physician himself.

Dr. Holdt was the learned Brahmin's guest three times, for over a half year in all, and they became close friends. The last time, when Dr. Holdt left to return to the military hospital in Batavia, where he worked, he told the old man that he expected to see him in a year, on his way back to Europe. "That will be too late," replied

"That will be too late," replied the Brahmin. "I shall not be here anymore, but I hope that I will be allowed to announce my death to

you."

Back in Java, Dr. Holdt worked for sometime in barracks in the mountains, about a day's journey from Batavia, where cases of contagious diseases were treated. Three months after leaving Ali Fezi Kahn, he was resting there on his camp bed at 5 p.m. Suddenly, feeling the presence of someone, he looked up and saw the old man, who greeted him with the gesture of Brahmin blessing.

Dr. Holdt jumped up, accepting the greeting respectfully, and called out, "Why Father, have you travelled this far to see me?" The Brahmin looked at him with a peculiar smile, and answered gravely, "God, our Father, has mercifully taken me home, but I was allowed to come to you to say farewell, as I promised, and to give you my last blessing. You have set your foot on the path of Truth; follow it and God will bless you and be with you."

Again, the old man joined his hands in blessing, and Dr. Holdt bowed his head. When he looked up, the Brahmin had disappeared, though the door had remained

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SO-CALLED DEATH

Let us today take another step in exploring Man's age-long attitude to so-called death. We have seen much of his slow apprehension of life through the ages.

What is called "death" is actually no more than the dispersal of leaf and blossom which occurs in preparation for further growth. It is not a matter for sorrow when all the green earth loses its verdure, for experience has shown Man that in due time a greater fullness will be made manifest.

This is, however, not equally demonstrable when Man's so-called "life" departs from its material vehicle. Even the discarded vehicle becomes distasteful, whereas, up to the very moment of dissolution, it had been a source of happiness and

Why then, in this case, is the attitude so divergent? No one shrinks from a barren tree in winter. To be sure, the discarded physical vehicle of Man does not again resume its former activity. But, Man cannot, as yet, see that the essential factor is one with all force, which to him is invisible. How can Man know that one force is not at once dissipated as others appear to be? He has no evidence which will prove to him that each force is indestructable and forever itself.

Yet, in spite of this lack of socalled proof, Man has cherished an unshakable belief or hope that the

force of personality does not cease to exist. The terminology accepted by the several bodies of religion is, as you know, immortality.

From remotest antiquity, even among primitive tribes, Man has never accepted the possibility of annihilation. Each race has had golden dreams of a here-after, but such have had singularly slight effect on daily life and thought. You are reviewing the countless ideas of the here-after which have appeased somewhat the questionings of the human heart.

But, all of them fail to achieve ordered and vital relationship between the entity as manifested materially, and as he is to be after

the material is discarded.

It is at this point that Man must reorganize his thought and his daily conduct of living. The change is so much less than Man has ever imagined that he thinks vaguely that he will, at once, become someone totally renewed and totally unlike his present self, as he assumes it to be. As Man learns to identify himself with the great forces, he will more and more learn to walk now within the area of those forces.

May I use a very imperfect illustration? A student does not, for a moment, contemplate an entire change of personality when he enters an institution of learning of a more advanced grade. Greater fields for his exploration, to be sure, but it will be himself, and not some curious distillation of personality who enters them.

This then, is one aspect of our teaching. Man learns that all matter is mobile, fluid, and transitory as vapor, his own physical agglomeration as well. It is he who uses matter so-called, he who experiments and discards, he who goes on to other experiments, just as a child experi-ments and diseards, only to grow into a seasoned maturity.

We strive to liberate the heart of Mankind from all sense of limitation. When the almost universal fear and horror of termination of physical manifestation shall have been accomplished, think, if you can, how sorrow and mourning will be as nothing. Learn to see only vaster freedom at hand when the sense of restriction to the material is no longer operative. Use the physical envelope as other forms of the material are used, and when its use is accomplished, lay it aside as any garment no longer adapted to use, and with as little sense of loss.

Man is one, here with us and on your plane. He grows there from infant to adult, and here on our plane, his growth continues unabated.

Freedom is the last, best hope of earth.

materialization, and apport, among others. Rev. Aldred came to Chicago for just one day and held two seances, both packed with interest and outstanding phenomena. In the afternoon, the group enjoyed participation in a Master's Circle where each was privileged to receive consultation with their own master guide on matters concerning their development or on personal problems. One of the outstanding features of the services offered included magnificent singing by the group, as well as by spirit. Among special manifestations were the rendition of a Mass by a nun in spirit; Polish and German speaking spirits; partial materialization with ectoplasm readily discernible; profound advice where needed; re-cognizable evidence through spirit, and other features.

Most remarkable feature of Rev. Aldred's work is that he is not tranced, and his comments of explanation and clarification were proferred during the manifestations of spirit. His patience with the seekers for truth and guidance is out-

standingly modest.

In the evening, the service was devoted to more personal manifestations, and presented other unusual characteristics. Rev. Aldred used only a collapsible student's trumpet nevertheless, much power was expressed. The folded trumpet was placed in front of him, several feet away. We heard it rattle as it unfolded; we heard it swerve around the room, and some even discerned it in the dark. A bowl of water and a glass for the medium's use were placed beneath his chair, and drops of water were dispersed as the

From appearances, everyone quickly reached the decision that the boy's heart had been pierced by the fork, and that this penetration of his heart had killed him. That was the reason for the call to the sheriff and the coroner.

I knew that under such circumstances the sheriff would have to take the brother to jail until there was an investigation, and that this would be an additional shock to the mother, who was already breaking under the strain. Furthermore, it would leave a stain on the brother's record for life. I had been clearly informed by the boy now in spirit that I was to prevent this second tragedy from befalling the family. And, since I had been asked by Spirit to do this, I could count on every Spirit Helper to assist me in carrying through successfully.

First, I rushed to the Shield's Funeral Home, and asked Mr. Shields to help me examine the body. We did examine his chest wound carefully and both of us were positive the fork did not go deep enough to injure his heart. I hurried back to the Hart home to explain to the mother what we had found in examining the boy's chest.

I had only minutes to head off the coming of the sheriff, and the telephone call must be made quickly to Kenton, Understand, that there was no time to make plans, but had to be led by the Spirit Guides that were also interested in helping the Hart family. Across the street was the big brick house that was the home and offices of Dr. Mundy, one of the town's physicians. The doctor was out, but his wife, a very kind hearted woman of about seventy-five years, offered me the telephone for the call.

The message was definite that I was to phone Judge Guernsey De-Witt. He was the one man who had authority to keep the sheriff in Kenton, and spare the Harts all the ignominy of a court investigation. I knew Judge DeWitt was a man who always put human interests above legal code, and to him I made the strong plea that I quoted at the beginning of this article. I described to the Judge the seizure I had witnessed on that fishing trip. The Judge agreed with me that the boy could have died from shock, and that when he saw that fork coming toward him, he suffered a seizure so severe that he died. He promised to phone the sheriff, and to let me handle the matter.

When I turned from the telephone, the white haired doctor's wife came over, squeezed my hand, and said, "Rev. Chaney, God is with you today. I never heard anyone make such an eloquent plea

as you just made to Judge DeWitt to spare the Hart family more suffering.

Late that afternoon, the family doctor confirmed what Spirit had told me in the beginning, that the sharp fork had not entered the boy's heart, but had stopped just short of it.

With a heart full of thanksgiving, I went back to the Hart home to tell the parents that the sheriff would not come, and that the family doctor's verdict would be accepted, thus sparing all of them more suffering and grief.

You can easily understand my emotions when I officiated at the boy's funeral. One can speak with great certainty of the survival of human personality at a funeral, after one has heard that departed person speak in direct communication, as I did with the Hart boy in my study. As I stood by his casket in the church filled with relatives and neighbors, I knew that this boy in spirit was rejoicing that his brother had been spared, and his dear parents saved from further suffering.

And, above all, I realized so well that the body before me in that easket was only the house in which a precious little boy had lived for twelve short years, and that even then, as we said prayers over his casket, he was observing us from his spiritual plane in his glorified spirit body.

Yet, his contribution to philosophy, religion, mysticism, is his greatest achievement, and in the East goes by the name of Gibranism, a new word coined to recognize his special gift to the world, the character and depth of his influence. To English readers, this means mystical vision, netrical beauty and mastery, a simple and tresh approach to the problems of life, including extraordinary power, deep erudition, lightning-like intuition, with an emphasis on beauty that permeates the entire pattern in everything he touches. The latter emphasis is so great that Gibran often cried, "Create beauty, and let everything else go to hell."

When he was asked, "What is a mystic?" He smiled and replied. Nothing very secret or formidable - just someone who has drawn aside one more veil." Then he casually mentioned the times he had been reborn and added, "Three times have I seen Him, our Lord and Brother. I have spoken with Him." When writing Jesus, The Son Of Man, he tells us that he knew the twenty-seven characters and the events be narrated from actual experience. Sometimes, he would tell how his young heart longed to go back to the "above world", rather than to stay here where he felt a strange loneliness and an unchildish sorrow. The whole world was built on foundations that were not his own and

was lost in his atmosphere. He told that there were "whole days at a time that I feel that I have just arrived on this planet — human contours and sounds are strange to me." Again, after long moments of pre-occupation with some thought far removed from the present, he would ask his secretary. Barbara Young, to forgive him, "for so much of the time I am not here." To sit in his presence meant an exaltation of spirit.

Amidst all his literary and art work, Gibran carried on an overwhelming amount of missionary counselling. His purpose was to help bring about a world in which there is one great fellowship of understanding and sympathy. He was occupied throughout life with the depths he knew that the spirit of man was able to plumb, and the heights man was destined to scale, though he was ever conscious of the mental, spiritual, and physical poverty of a large proportion of the world's people. He knew their blindness. Over and over again he has painted The Blind, and he meant not the blind-eyed, but the blind-hearted. The sorrows and the stumblings of humanity cngrossed him wholly with a burning passion. He knew them well as he had ample reason to know.

The years in his studio were a succession of endless ministrations to human trouble and woe. Day after day, those who were in perplexity or anguish climbed the long flights of stairs and handed over their burdens to this man from another country, another world, and it seemed from another time. His quick apprehension was never failing, neither was his almost instant finding of some way to solve the problem, or at least to renew the courage and endurance of the troubled one. It was simply and beautifully done - a quiet reminder of some timeless truth, some law of life which, from his lips, had nothing of dogma or doctrine, but came as healing for the unseen wound. Then he would often say, "Out of trouble, perplexity, and happy anguish comes poetry that eases the heart."

Simplicity is a word that would characterize Gibran and his work, complete and entire — a word that applies to Socrates, Jesus, Joanne d'Arc, and Lincoln — to Gibran "the four most beautiful persons the world has ever known but put to death!" But, up his flights of stairs trailed the sorrowing ones. "If at the beginning, I could have understood about children, I would

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have avoided so much trouble," wailed a parent. Then Gibran would quietly remind such a one that children are not really our children, though they come through us, but that they are the sons and daughters of Life's longing for itself - that we may give them love, but not our thoughts, for they have their own thoughts; that we may house their bodies but not their souls, for their souls dwell in the house of tomorrow which we cannot visit, not even in our dreams. Also, we may not seek to make them like ourselves, for life goes not backwards nor tarries with vesterday.

Then, among others, would come one who would ask how to live a life among trials, frustrations, among the boorish and the foolish of this world. The great seer would tell such a one to go on his way with singing, but to let his song be brief, for only the songs that die upon the lips live in human hearts. He was to tell a lovely truth in little words, but never an ugly truth in any words - to tell. for example, the maiden whose hair shines in the sun that she is daughter of the morning. But, if he should behold the sightless, he is not to tell him he is one with night. Then Gibran would tell him instead to listen to the flute-player as if he were listening to April, but if he should hear the critic and the fault-finder, he should be deaf as his own bones, and as distant as his fancy. And he would go on to tell his visitor that on the way of life he would meet men with hoofs, but he was to give them his wings. There would be men with horns to which he would give wreaths of laurel; men with claws, to whom he would give petals for fingers; men with forked tongues to whom he was to give honey for words. All these and many more he would meet. 'I teach you your larger self which contains all men," would say the counsellor. "Call none among you foolish, for in truth we are neither wise nor foolish. We are green leaves upon the tree of life, and life itself is beyond wisdom, and surely beyond foolish-

As to frustration, discouragement, anguish, often Gibran would say to a visitor that when darkness was upon him, the darkness was his dawn yet unborn; and though the night's travail were full upon him, yet dawn would be born unto him as unto the hills. Truly, the dewdrop rounding its sphere in the dusk of the lily was not unlike himself gathering his soul in the heart of God. It is well to remember that life sings in our silences, and dreams in our slumber - even when we are beaten low. Still, life is enthroned and high, and is free even when we drag our chains. But, if your heart is a volcano, how can you expect flowers to

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bloom in your hands?" he would ask.

Often the great Syrian scholar and mystic was asked. What is religion? He would reply that he knew only life, that life meant the field, the vineyard, the loom, that Church is within us and we are our priest - faith was an oasis in the heart, never to be reached "by the caravan of thinking". If we are to know God, we are not to be a solver of riddles. Organized religion had no attraction for him nor creed or dogma. When some sought to convert him to orthodoxy. he would follow the Upanishad maxim, "Never argue with the once born". He was absolutely certain about reincarnation and speaks in his books of some of his memories of other times and other lives. If in this life he does not get certain truths uttered, he tells us, Forget not that I shall come back to you", for after a little while he would gather dust and foam for another body - "a moment of rest upon the wind and another woman shall bear me.

Though not orthodox, he was thoroughly Christian, a follower of the Master Jesus. In his wonderful little book of aphorisms, Sand And Foam, in a sentence or two, he hints at the difference between man - made religion, orthodoxy, churchanity, and Jesus' religion, true Christianity. He tells about the time when, once every 100 years, Jesus of Nazareth meets Jesus of the Christians in a garden among the hills of Lebanon, and they talk long; and each time Jesus of Nazareth goes away saying to Jesus of the Christians, 'My friend, I am afraid we shall never, never agree.

Gibran wrote inspirationally. Frequently he would say after some utterance of shattering power, "My God! I did not know I was going to say that." His books are not books, but rather a host of living entities, breathing and vocal. His secretary, Barbara Young, who probably knew him better than any other living mortal, said that it seemed that all the pages of The Garden Of The Prophet came directly from some infinite and informed consciousness, and were, as Gibran said poetry is, "the inevitable words in the inevitable During creative hours, he would often remark, almost under his breath, "There is a new whisper of life upon the firmament." Thus he spoke when he had uttered a truth of such power and beauty that his own heart was torn within him.

When eighteen months of work had gone on with Jesus, The Son Of Man, Miss Young, taking down the notes as he uttered them, one night saw a radiant Light shine upon Gibran's countenance, from which she was constrained to turn away. His real soul was laid bare; he was transfigured and not to be

regarded by human eyes. At other times a Light, tenuous but clearly visible showed above and about the poet as he walked up and down the studio dictating. Once the secretary alluded to the Light. He had stopped pacing to speak a low, slow sentence. She looked up and saw the Light, and in spite of herself, said, "Kahlil, the Light!" It was unbearably clear and dazzling white. He turned away and began pacing again.

Each of the 70 characters in the book came alive in that place; each voice spoke through the lips of this man from Lebanon, Often, the drama of some incident was so overwhelming that she felt and said, "It is so real; it seems as if I had been there!" The answer from the mystic came almost like a cry, "You were there, and so was I. This faith in the "continuity of life" was a reality to him, changeless as day and night.

It was when the poet and secretary were working on Sand And Foam, that she piled cushions on the floor and sat upon them rather than in her usual chair. She exclaimed that she had a strange feeling of familiarity about the gesture, saving, "I feel that I have sat beside you this way many times, but I haven't!" He waited a moment and then replied, "But you have. We have done this a thousand years ago and we shall do it a thousand years hence.

His parable in The Madman, is a revelation of his timeless memory when the mystic tells how he has climbed for three thousand years a holy mount to speak with God, but for each of the first two thousand years, his words did not move the Infinite to a reply. The third thousand years, he spoke thus to Deity: "My God, my aim and my fulfillment: I am thy yesterday and thou art my tomorrow; I am thy root in the earth and thou art my flower in the sky, and together we grow before the face of the sun. This time, God answered him and seemed pleased with his words.

Words are timeless entities and one should utter them with their timelessness in mind. Gibran felt that we would never understand each other until the language was reduced to seven words. He asked others what theirs would be if they had only seven words, then gave his own list as "You, I, take, God, love, beauty, Earth." Going over the words, one sees they are everything, all of life and all of death, which is a part of life, and of eternity, which is God. He put them

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together as follows: "Love take me. Take me Beauty, Take me Earth, I take you, Love, Earth, Beauty, I take God.

Space permits but a word about Gibran's art. He captured bits of eternity and placed them upon canvas, painted man as the divine human, as a thing of sensitive beauty. flesh that is not fleshy, body that is disembodied of earthliness, spirit thinly veiled. How unlike he was to William Blake, whose subjects were saints, angels, demons of myth and legend! Gibran's were never these. but dreams of perfection without fault or blemish, his spirit motif being the poised revery of a soul wandering in dreams of infinity. serene, harmonious, controlled. In one of my talks with him, I told him that I thought he was much greater than William Blake, but he replied, "No. William Blake is greater." Of course, this could be Christian courtesy, humility, the considering of every other soul as better than oneself, according to Scripture.

To the Syrian artist, a work of art was a mist carved into an image. Just as simple as that. He considcred art as a step toward the Infinite. He, himself, took the step firmly and beautifully, grateful to those who accepted his gathered fruits, whether they might be wise or foolish, the scholar or the shepherd. The qualities of the East and the West were blended in him with a singular felicity of expression so that while he was a symbolist in a

true sense of the word, he was not fixed to traditional expression. He disliked the word symbolism and preferred to say of his work, it was truth made visible, it was tangible beauty - simplicity, not symbolism. He considered simplicity a divine quality, for lack of which the world of human beings is lost and wandering in time and space. Likewise, there was no conflict in his art as to whether the idea should prevail over the emotion, or the emotion sway the thought — both were so equally established that one was not conscious of the dominion of either. In this fusion, Gibran's art transcends the conflicts of the schools and is beyond the fixed conceptions of the classic or romantic traditions. His drawings include many portraits of notable persons, - Jesus, Socrates, Edwin Markham, Masefield, Paul Barrett, Henri Rochefort, Debussy, Maeterlinek, Edmond Rostanr, the younger Garibaldi, Rodin, and a host of

Besides being a poet, artist, missionary counsellor, Gibran was also a prophet. He saw that a vast value was being lost in America by the close and constant contact of men with machines, and the standardization that had descended like a plague upon the country of his adoption. He said that we had harnessed the Earth to the fiery steeds of science and they were running away with the planet into a hell of machinery, and that this monstrous misconception called progress must be stopped in its tracks before the minds and spirits of men can once more be freed to their rightful inheritance.

He declared that destruction and desolation would visit the lands of Earth, and that the young men and the maidens would go down in their path like buds stripped from the almond and olive trees and no fruit therefrom, However, he believed there was an Angel mindful of America that would bring back the eventual integrity and nobility of the country that had wandered from the road of great and good men, that had the disease of "faster and bigger", young and drunk with the gadgets it had achieved. It would "go back to the road of Jefferson, Franklin, Emerson, Whitman, and of Abraham Lincoln, the blessed." He was confident that a

new day would dawn, for the earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, and His is the kingdom of the heart. "In Him," Gibran often remarked, "is our power and fulfillment, and we have eternity."

The contribution of the great Syrian mystic is immeasurable. The power of his individual consciousness has penetrated the consciousness of the age, and the indwelling of his spirit is timeless and deathless. From the four corners of the earth, though he is in the above world, still come the words: "Gibran is more alive to us than ever."

With other people, we enjoyed the many varieties of flowers, and great credit should be given to Mr. John Bruijn, who gives his time in keeping the grounds beautiful.

Scenic drives can be taken

through the surrounding country and there are many places of historical interest. The McLaughton House on Main Street, in Oregon City, is well worth a visit. It was built one hundred and sixteen years ago, and the furniture is authenic. One of the most beautiful treasures is a velvet rug one hundred and fifty years old, the colors as brilliant as the day it was woven. There is a spool bed and a lovely Ming bowl, both over four hundred years old. In one of the bedrooms there is a canopy bed made in New Orleans in 1790. In another, a cradle over one hundred years old. This old home is a treasure house of antiques, and is open to the publie every day. The admission is only twenty-five cents.
