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The Dawning Easter

What really happened to the body of Jesus on that first Easter? . . .

Mhat really took place from Friday to Sunday as the datum of Easter approached? . . .

ontius Pilate, governor of a rebellious Palestinian province, leaned against a column of his basilica, contemplating across the dreary gloom the scene of a the dreary gloom the scene of a few hours before when, "those fiends of Tartarus", as he expressed it, "dragged to execution the inno-cent Nazarene." All around him it was deserted. An air of desolation and sadness enveloped him. He was thinking of the warning message given him by the wife he had taken from among the Gauls. Weeping and throwing herself at his feet, she had cried, "Pilate, beware! beware! touch not that man, for He is holy. Last night I saw Him in a vision. He was walking on the waters; He was flying on the wings of the wind; He spoke to the tempest and to the fishes of the lake . . . all were obedient to Him. Behold! . . . the torrent of Mount Kedron flows with blood; the statues of Caesar are decayed; the columns of the interium have given away, and the sun is veiled in mourning like a vestal in the tomb. Ah - - Pilate, evil awaits thee. If thou wilt not evil awarts thee. If thou with not listen to the vows of thy wife, dread the curse of the Roman Senate; dread the frowns of Cae-sar!" (This quotation is part of the report of Pilate to Emperor Ti-berius, recorded in The Historical Records of Jesus the Christ, Messiah, from the manuscripts in the libraries of Rome and Constanti-ople, and the five hundred sixty thousand volumes in the Vatican.)

By degrees the day darkened like a winter's twilight. Black clouds lowered over the pinnacle of the Temple, covering it like a veil. Pilate's guards had joined the cavalry and the Centurian endeavoring to keep order, and he was left alone. Suddenly a loud clamor was heard proceeding from Golgotha borne on the violent wind of a sudden storm that arose; lightning threw down its spears of fire; wind shrieked over the hills, settling to a moan. The earth began to quiver underfoot, and the terrorized crowd, now in darkness, clutched at one another for support. This was the reverberation of an earthquake taking place somewhere in Egypt at the time, frightening the superstitious Jews almost to death. Among others, one Balthasar, an aged, learned Jew of Antioch and strong friend of the Nazarene, dropped dead.

Then, at the ninth hour, Jesus was heard to cry out with a loud voice, "Heloi, Heloi, Imana shabachthani!" According to the Aramaic Bible interpretation, this means, "My God, my God, this was my destiny for which I was born." But, the crowd misunderstood His words. Shortly after this moment of great drama had taken place, out of the darkness of that sunless day, a great flood of golden light appeared about His cross, and from the light there came a voice saying, "Lo, it is done!"

Jesus was then heard to say, "Father-God, into Thy hands I give my soul." (Aquarian Bible) A Roman soldier who had been

stand it no longer. "This agony is too great; relicf must come!" he cried. And, in an act of deep compassion, thrust his spear into the Nazarene's heart as He was giving up His last breath.

In shock the earth trembled and shook. Jerusalem reeled back and forth. The curtains of the Temple were rent from top to bottom. The rocks were split and the tombs lay open upon the hillsides. Many of the crowd saw white-robed beings walking among them in the streets below and thought the dead had risen to be with them. In the tumult and uproar that followed, with the continued shaking of the earth, the Roman soldiers that remained around the cross cried out, "This is the wrath of the gods, but He is the son of God that died!" Along with the priests, scribes, and Pharisees, they too hurried down from Calvary to seek shelter, the women following at a distance.

Jesus, alone now with the angels and Masters present, in His etheric body watched His physical vehicle pronounced "dead". He knew, however, that this earth body must yet be used to complete His mission and work on earth. From the time He was twelve years old, until about thirty, He had been studying to complete His Mastership. Even before His birth, the Essene Brotherhood had carefully planned for His training among the Masters and great of Egypt, India, Persia, Tibet, Etruria, and many other countries. Records of this are to be found in these places, as the writer well knows, having lived abroad for many years.

By the time He was thirty, Jesus became a Master through the teachings of the Masters under Divine Guidance, and by His work and initiation. It was at Easter that He was to become a Master superior to all others, for it was at that time He was to accomplish more than any other before Him had ever done. A Master has complete control over the physical body with all its functions. The physical body does not control the Master; he controls it. All Masters may control more than one body, for they are able to project con-

sciousness into many bodies at the same time (More of this later within the tomb).

As the crowds dispersed to their homes and to the shelters, Pilate, still leaning against a column of his basilica, saw his little Roman cohort mournfully returning, even he, the standard-bearer, having veiled his eagle in token of grief. He and his men were to have remained at Calvary until all were dead upon the crosses, so he assumed they had performed their duties. He overheard some of the Jewish soldiers murmuring strange words he did not understand. Others, he could understand, he heard recount miracles they had seen the Nazarene perform. He watched as some of the groups of men and women would halt . . then, looking back toward Calvary, remained motionless . . almost in expectation of witnessing some new prodigious event.

When Pilate returned to the Praetorium, sad and pensive, he perceived an old man in a suppliant posture, and behind him at a little distance, another . . . one Nicodemus . . . in the company of a few Romans who were in tears. The suppliant threw himself at Pilate's feet and wept most bitterly. It was painful for him to see an old man weep, and Pilate's heart - - already being overcharged with fear and dread, wept too. Relieving himself and explaining, he said, "Never did I witness such a revulsion of feelings - - those who betrayed and sold the Nazarene, those who testified against Him and cried. 'Crucify Him; we'll have His blood' . . all slunk off like cowardly curs and will wash their teeth with vinegar." Noticing again the man at his feet, and regaining control of his feelings, he asked, "Who are you, and what is your request?'

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"I understand, and your request is granted, Father. I will order Manlius to take some soldiers with him to superintend the interment, lest it be profaned."

Thus, with help from Pilate and the soldiers, in the presence of Joseph and Nicodemus, Jesus was carefully removed from the cross, wrapped in a fine linen shroud with temporary spices, and placed in Joseph's tomb in a garden rich with flowers. Then a stone was rolled against the sepulcher.

It was by then approaching the time for preparation of the Sabbath. One of the priests came to the Praetorium saving they were becoming apprehensive that the Nazarene's disciples intended to steal His body, hide it, and make it appear that He had risen from the dead, for Jesus was known to have said, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." So Pilate sent to the captain of the royal guard. Malcus, telling him to place as many Jewish soldiers around the sepulcher as needed; then, if anything should happen, they could blame themselves, not the Romans. Malcus placed his lieutenant, Ben Isham, with a hundred soldiers around the sepulcher. Before the watch began, Caiphas, the High Priest, sent a company of priests to the garden of Siloam that they might be sure the body of Jesus was within the tomb. Rolling away the stone, seeing His body there, they replaced the stone before the door of the sepulcher. Meanwhile, Pilate sent his scribe to place the seal of Rome upon the stone in such a way that he who moved the stone would break the seal; death would be his penalty. The lewish soldiers all were sworn to faithfulness. The watch began.

Within the tomb, Jesus was alone with the Masters, His teachers, guardians Moses and Elijah, and angel friends. All were now concerned with the matter of transmuting the physical body into a more spiritualized form that He could use on earth - - - a lighter, less solid one than the physical form He had left behind.

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with which He had severed connections. This body would have to be made over into one solid enough to be seen, heard, and felt, but one of a higher rate of vibration that could easily pass through matter and be transported, apported, or levitated from place to place. That, in essence, is the transmu-tation that had to be effected. Transmutation means a change in form or essence by means of adding or subtracting certain elements, as in alchemy ..., when we change mercury into gold by taking out two electrons from mercury. (This was done some twenty-five years ago by a Japanese.)

So, Jesus in the tomb, before His resurrection, was working with His assistants to spiritualize or heighten the vibration of His physical body so that it would be in a spiritualized form. Anything not needed in this form would be disintegrated, given back to the elements. The Masters knew how to do this. Jesus knew that in leaving His physical body many people would wonder if He were in reality truly a Master, would wonder if He would keep His word when He said, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." Some might think He was a glorified deity, and others that He was just an ordinary person of the street . . good, but common. He knew that part of His mission to earth was to demonstrate, or dramatize, the powers within man that, in time, every man could learn to do all that He did.

By His demonstration of supcriority over the physical world - something to which every soul may attain - - He also demonstrated the spiritualization of the flesh. When this has been accomplished, man has better control of rhythm, intelligence, and all else, being subject to the laws of both the physical and etheric realms, but Master of both so that he may stand above each and not violate them.

This etheric realm is composed of four ethers - - the electric, the *pranic*, the ether of *light*, and the mental reflecting ether. These ethers interpenetrate the solids, liquids, and gases of the physical realm - - the one unable to exist without the other. Thus, the etheric body penetrates and is a part of the physical body (the finer part). When the physical body dies, the etheric body in time disintegrates too. It is this disintegrating etheric form that is often seen around graveyards - - the spiritualized form of physical matter. It is this form of body that, after the physical passing, can eat a fish, as Jesus did. He, being a Master, learned how to put these elements together, to blend them, as was seen in His ascension. On the other side of life, people live in what is known as their astral bodies. As they advance spiritually, their bodies become ever more spiritualized and of a different quality.

In the tomb, as Jesus was getting ready for His demonstration of superiority over the physical world, changing His physical body into a higher vibration, He could feel that He was transcending the earth. He had work to do in the astral, but He also must take His transmuted body around Galilee and into other countries to dramatize to the people at large the reality of man's potentialities. His body was not an ectoplasmic or materialized body, but a trans-muted physical body. What really took place on that First Easter on earth, and the preparations that were made for it from Friday until Sunday morning, Bibles and various other accounts differ somewhat in giving the details.

The Lord Maitreya, who has charge of the earth planet and was the one who sent Jesus to earth, as well as the Great White Brotherhood and high ones of the Angel World, explained to the writer, not once, but many times, how all this took place. According to the Lord Maitreya, of all the Bible accounts, those in the Aquarian Gospel written by Levi<sup>e</sup>, taken from the akashic records, are the nearest to being correct. Briefly, we understand that all went well until midnight of Friday, when suddenly the tomb became a blaze. of light, and a group of whiteclad soldiers marched single file down the garden path, marched

"The Vanishing Scar"

"This terrible scar on my face, Rev. Chaney! I can never face the public; I can never teach again."

The woman before me was an intelligent, cultured person, the graduate from two universities. She had been a professor of foreign languages in an exclusive college before misfortune struck her down. But when she first wrote to me, she was a cleaning woman in an office building of a large city. She was scrubbing floors, making only enough money to exist, because with that unsightly disfigurement of her face she could not get a job teaching. The hand of misfortune is no respecter of persons, and strikes without regard for social status, prestige or intelligence quotient.

I will not give you all of the long story of disaster that brought this cultured, refined professional woman to this low estate, but I do want to tell you of the remarkable answers to our prayers from God in whom she did not at first believe.

A drinking driver ran through a red traffic light at a busy corner, smashed into Carrie's car, injuring her. From her account of the accident, I know there was much blundering by the ambulance men in giving her the proper first aid. There was more neglect, and blundering, by surgeons who should have done a better job in dressing her wounds. When she reached me, she was a nervous wreck . . . a defeated woman . . . her face blemished by scars. She had tried to get a job as professor of lan-guages, but all her applications had been rejected. That is the reason for her hopeless remarks with which I started this article.

Sitting with me in my prayer room, she told me bluntly that she was not a praying woman.


"I do not believe in God. In fact, I am not certain that I believe in anything supernatural. And as for those Jesus books you sent me called 'You Shall Have It', they all went into my waste basket."

Her attitude of *unbelief* was not so much that of a defiant, rebellious person, as that of one completely crushed by disaster. While her complete lack of faith was un-

ister is the building of faith in the hearts of people like Carrie. She lost her faith and felt that God had turned His back upon her, or that God did not even exist. My mail brings me many letters from people who tell me they have lost all the faith they had in their childhood. The struggle of life had brought defeat, disappointments, losses and disaster. They were crushed by the heavy burdens of life. They had prayed and prayed without receiving any help or healing. Many of them tell me when they arrive in Tiffin, "I cannot pray anymore. My faith is dead.

When Carrie had confessed to me her unbelief, I asked her, "Why

have you come to me for help? You did not read my literature, but you certainly know that whatever I hope to do for you, I must do through the Spiritual Forces of God."

"I had to turn to someone," she answered. "I must admit that your letters seemed to bring to me a ray of hope, and I was also impressed that you invited me to come to Tiffin although you knew I had no money. If I do not believe in God, I do have faith in you, and here I am." A minister facing a person like Carrie must know God personally. He must be rooted and grounded in the *Faith*. When you sit in your prayer room with a person whose whole life is shattered and ruined, you must *"Know IN WHOM You Believe."* (11 Timothy 1:12).

We can always depend upon God, and all the Spirit Hosts of Heaven, to assist us when we begin our efforts to heal a sick or crippled body. And we can also be certain that the Power to heal is sufficient for even the so-called hopeless cases. In Mark, chapter 9, there is an interesting story of the healing of a boy in a hopeless condition. The boy's father said to Christ:

"But if there is anything you can do, take pity on us and help us."

This brought forth from Christ a statement declaring the unlimited power of God to heal. Christ said:

"If there is anything I can do! Everything is possible for one who has faith." Mark 9:23.

The long scar on the left side of Carrie's face started near the mouth and reached almost to the eye. The bone structure inside her mouth, and teeth, had been damaged. Until this could be healed, teaching would be impossible because of her speech impairment. A trilingual instructor in foreign languages must have no speech defect.

I knew we had two jobs to perform - - - the healing of this scar, and the finding of a teaching position for Carrie when her face was restored to normal. I told Carrie that we must begin searching for a good teaching position for her in the fall.

the fall. "You certainly have a lot of confidence that I will be healed, if you start hunting a job for me before I can talk plainly," was Carrie's reaction to my plan. She repeatedly told me that she had sent nineteen applications to as many colleges for jobs, and every one had been rejected. I always came back at her with:

"We will send number twenty with a prayer and Spirit Help."

Each night at ten o'clock Carrie came into my prayer room and, with my hand on the disfigured side of her face. I prayed for healing. Usually we remained in the prayer room for one hour. The only comment made by Carrie to give me encouragement was:

"My face feels a warm glow when you pray."

I knew the Spirit Forces were in that room with us, and I knew they came every night with Power to heal. After a week of these healing meetings together, one night Carrie remarked:

"What is there about your house that makes it so peaceful? For the first time in my life I feel that every burden of my mind has been lifted, and I live in perfect peace, without worry and without cares."

I explained to her that was the vibrations brought by Spirit Helpers providing an environment that would contribute to her healing. Beyond that, I never tried to force my teaching or my faith upon her. I knew that when Spirit healed her face, the demonstration would change her doubts into faith.

Sp. It seems so terrible. If I walk around, I am so very miserable. I do not know what it is. Sometimes it seems as if my senses were being knocked out of me. Something comes on me like thunder and lightning. (Static treatment of patient.) It makes such a noise. This terrible noise - - - it is awful! I cannot stand it any more, and I will not either!

Dr. We shall be glad if you will not stand it any more.

Sp. Am I not welcome? And if I am not, I do not care!

Dr. You are not very particular. Sp. I have had so much hard-

ship. Dr. How long have you been

dead?

Sp. Why do you speak that way? I am not dead. I am as alive as I can be, and I feel as if I were young again.

Dr. Have you not felt, at times, as if you were somebody else?

Sp. At times I feel very strange, especially when it knocks me senseless. I feel very bad. I do not feel that I should have this suffering. I do not know why I should have such things.

Dr. You should not stay around her.

Sp. It is *my* body, it is not hers. She has no right there. I do not see why she interferes with me.

Dr. She interferes with your selfishness.

Sp. I feel I have some right in life . . . I think so.

Dr. You passed out of your body without understanding the fact, and have been bothering a lady. You should go to the spirit world and not hover around here.

Sp. You say I am hovering around. I am not hovering around, and I am not one to interfere, but I want a little to say about things.

Dr. That was why you had the "thunder" and "the knocks".

Sp. That was alright for a while, but lately it is terrible. I must have understanding.

Dr. You will have it now.

Sp. I will do anything to stop that terrible knocking.

Mrs. Burton: (Recognizing the spirit as one who had been troubling her). I am mighty tired of you. Who are you, anyway?

Sp. I am a stranger.

Mrs. B. What is your name?

Sp. My name?

Mrs. B. Have you one? Sp. My name is Carrie.

op, my name is carrie.

Mrs. B. Carrie what?

Sp. Carrie Huntington. Mrs. B. Where do vou live?

Sp. San Antonio, Texas.

Mrs. B. You have been with me a long time, haven't you? (It had been a number of years since Mrs. B. had been in San Antonio.)

Sp. You have been with *me* a long time. I should like to find out why you interfere with me. I recognize you now.

Mrs. B. What street did you live on?

Sp. I lived in many different places there.

Dr. Do you realize the fact that you have lost your own mortal body? Can you remember having been sick?

Sp. The last I remember I was in El Paso. I do not remember anything after that. I went there and I do not seem to remember when I left. It seems that I should be there now. I got very sick one day there.

Dr. Probably you lost your body then.

Sp. After El Paso I do not know where I went. I went some distance. I traveled on the railroad and it was just like I was nobody. Nobody asked me anything and I had to follow that lady (Mrs. B.) as if I were her servant, and I felt very annoyed about it.

Mrs. B. You worried me to death because you sang all the time.

Sp. I had to do something to attract your attention, because you would not listen to me any other way. You traveled on the train and took me away from my home and folks, and I feel very much hurt about it. Do you understand?

Mrs. B. I understand you far better than you do me.

Dr. Can't you realize what has been the matter with you?

Sp. I want to tell you that I do not want those knockings any more. I will stay away.

Dr. Understand your condition; understand that you are an ignorant, obsessing spirit, and that you have no physical body. You died, probably at the time you were sick.

Sp. Could you talk to a ghost? Dr. Such things certainly do happen.

Sp. I am not a ghost, because ghosts cannot talk. When you are dead, you lie there.

Dr. When the body dies, it lies there. But the spirit does not.

Sp. That goes to God who gave it.

Dr. Where is He? Where is that God?

Sp. In Heaven.

Dr. Where is that?

Sp. It is where you go to find Jesus.

Dr. The Bible says: "God is Love; and he that dwelleth in Love dwelleth in God." Where will you find that God?

Sp. I suppose in Heaven, I cannot tell you anything about it. But I know I have been in the worst hell you could give me with those knockings. I do not see that they have done me any good. I do not like them at all.

Dr. Then you must stay away from that lady.

Sp. I see her well now, and I can have a real conversation with her.

Dr. Yes, but this will be the last time.

Sp. How do you know it will?

Dr. When you leave here you will understand that you have been talking through another person's body. That person is my wife.

Sp. What nonsense! I thought you looked wiser than to talk such nonsense.

Dr. It may seem foolish, but look at your hands. Do you recognize them?

Sp. They do not look like mine, but so much has taken place lately that I do not know what I shall do. That lady over there, (Mrs. B.) has been acting like a madman, and I have taken it as it came, so I shall have to find out what she thinks of doing, and why she does those things to me.

Dr. She will be very happy to be rid of you.

Mrs. B. Carrie, how old are you? Sp. You know that a lady never wants to tell her age.

Dr. Especially if she happens to be a spinster.

Sp. Please excuse me, you will have to take it as it is. I will not tell my age to anyone.

Dr. Have you ever been married? Sp. Yes, I was married to a fel-

low, but I did not care for him.

Dr. What was his name?

Sp. That is a secret with me. I would not have his name mentioned for anything, and I do not want to carry his name either. My name is Carrie Huntington, because it was my name, and I do not want to carry his name.

Dr. Do you want to go to the spirit world?

Sp. What foolish questions you put to me.

Dr. It may seem foolish to you. but, nevertheless, there is a spirit world. Spiritual things often seem foolish to the mortal mind. You have lost your body.

Sp. I have not lost my body. I have been with this lady, but she does one thing I do not like very well. She eats too much. She eats too much and gets too strong, then I have no power over her body - not as much as I want to. (To Mrs. B.) I want you to eat less. I try very much to dictate to you not to eat this and that, but you have no sense. You do not even listen to me.

Mrs. B. This is the place I told you to go, but you would not go by yourself.

Sp. I know it. But you have no business to take me where I get those knockings. I do not want to stay with you if you take those awful knockings.

Dr. They are in the next room. Do you want some?

Sp. No, thank you. Not for me any more.

Dr. Listen to what is told you, then you will not need any more. You are an ignorant spirit. I mean, you are ignorant of your condition. You lost your body, evidently without knowing it.

Sp. How do you know?

Dr. You are now controlling my wife's body.

Sp. I never saw you before, so how in the world can you think I should be called your wife? No, never!

Dr. I do not want you to be.

Sp. I don't want you either!

Dr. I don't want you to control my wife's body much longer. You must realize that you have lost your physical body. Do you re-cognize these hands? (Mrs. Wickland's hands.)

Sp. I have changed so much lately that all those changes make me crazy. It makes me tired.

Part II Conclusion

In the works of Edward G. Collinge we are told that the world and its features that we know so well are only small portions of "Reality" . . . that the solid nature of physical substance is an illusion, resulting mainly from the sense of touch and the normal rule that matter cannot pass through matter where solids are concerned.

Orthodox science, however, is aware that the atoms of physical matter and their constitutional parts - - protons, electrons, neutrons and positrons - - are *anything but solid*. In fact, if we could only visualize our physical bodies as being made up of electrons - instead of complete atoms collected together to form molecules - we would see our bodies pass through "solid" physical substances without making any impression on the substances or on our bodies. It would



appear, then, that physical substance is solid only to a reasoning creature functioning through a physical body and equipped with the normal sense of touch and

sight. The Egyptians understood that our Fourth Dimensional bodies are composed of electrons, and is the reason why we continue to exist - - but they did not call it by that name. They had proof that our Fourth Dimensional bodies continued to exist. Priests of Atlantis and prehistoric Egypt demonstrated it more or less along these lines. Candidates, or Neophytes, were secluded for initiation ceremonies by the Priests of Osiris. Initiation into the "Mysteries" was the exteriorization of the subject in the astral body while fully conscious, thus passing the subject through the gates of "physical death". Certain experiences in the astral subplains would follow, as well as tests of courage and control. Memory of these experiences would remain with the Neophyte for the re-mainder of his physical life, affecting his conduct and outlook. He would know from personal experience that "death" was only a gateway, and in subsequent initiations would learn certain secrets associated with the use of natural forces and secrets concerning the nature of man. According to Collinge, he would learn that the God Osiris was his "overself", and he would come to understand the relation-ship between that "overself" and his temporary personality. This is said to be the real meaning of the word "Osiris".

The methods whereby the conditions of conscious exteriorization was obtained included hypnosis, as well as the occult effects of certain rituals and ceremonies. The motive was *proof*, rather than blind faith - proof at the first initiation being the evidence of survival and existence of the astral body and astral plane. The priests possessed the extrasensory perception necessary to assess the etheric, astral and mental condition of the Neophyte. Those selected each year had to undergo a strict course of training involving physical fitness, fasting, meditation, and control of selfish desires. Great rivalry existed amongst the people in the matter of the selection, but only those best suited were chosen. Each Neophyte selected was sworn to secrecy under dire occult penalties. Few ever attempted to break their vows, and those who did were dealt with by occult means - - probably rendered dumb or otherwise



afflicted - - before they had revealed their secrets. The purpose of such secrecy was to prevent the knowledge and power from being abused, and was not supposed to have had anything to do with exclusiveness. The Sphinx served as a mute reminder to the Neophytes of their vows of silence as they filed past it to their initiations. Each candidate was taken to the inner chamber of the Great Pyramid and placed in a stone sarcophagus and, by the methods described previously, passed through the gates of "death". After being expelled from the physical body, each would experience various astral states, converse with discarnate entites, and undergo tests of endurance and emotional balance. After these experiences, the Neophyte would be expected to return to the world and become a leader and worker for the good of his fellow men - - at all times preserving his secrets. Never had he any doubts concerning his immortal soul, as the veil had been lifted for him momentarily and he knew the Truth from personal experience.

Until recently, religion undertook to explain such knowledge from the religious point of view. Religion has had no more to do with it, however, than it has had to do with causing earthquakes, life or death. Until we realize that religion has nothing to do with the making of this universe, we shall never be able to get at the Truth of "life and death," for only by knowing the *Laws of the Universe* shall we arrive at the cause. Religion is most necessary for man at his different stages of growth, but let us get at the Truth of how this universe is constructed. What a different place it will be when people understand and know the Truth that we have this other body . . . the one composed of electrons of the indestructible higher vibrations that enable us to continue to exist in a higher vibration. What a tragedy could have been saved . . . what a different life we could have been prepared to meet joyously.

Until we actually see and hear the Fourth Dimension, it will be almost impossible to believe it is true . . . just as we did not believe it was possible to fly until we saw it accomplished. It is just a question of time, however, before it will be demonstrated on T.V. and radio . . . "too good to be true" though it may seem right now.

It is through the study of VIBRATIONS we are most likely to find the answer to the question, "Where do we go from here?"

**QUESTIONS TO ED BODIN** AND ANSWERS

Question: Do you believe the Holy Shroud now preserved in the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist, at Turin, Italy - is really the shroud that covered the body of Jesus Christ in the Tomb after His Crucifixion?

Answer: There has been much controversy about this Shroud, even among clergy of the Roman Catholic Church, as to whether the stains on the Shroud were made by blood and the wounds of Christ when He was laid away in the Tomb. There is scientific evidence based on tests made by authorities to substantiate the claims of believers - although others feel that the markings on the Shroud were painted in the 14th Century by an expert artist who possessed knowledge beyond his time.


Personally, I feel the Shroud is genuine, due to a statement I recorded some time ago from a high spirit entity speaking through an entranced mental medium. Here are the words recorded at that time:

"The Shroud was not lifted by mortal hands from the body of Jesus, but fell to the stone, suddenly emptied of the flesh and bones it had contained. The Divine Light of the Holy Spirit of God touched the body with power not yet known to mortal mind, changing it from mortal matter into immortal energy, capable of precipitation as visible spirit, or perfect matter, for moments of revelation leaving in the Tomb the imprint as a fossil for the observation of man. The Shroud reveals a truth not known to many mortals, that the nails pierced not the palms, but the wrists of Jesus that His hands might not be torn asunder and His body not fall to His feet.

#### Question: Is Spiritualism a righteous belief?

Answer: Some Spiritualists state that the belief in survival, and communication with spirits through mediumship, is always beneficial to the soul. But I am convinced that it is essential one qualify Spiritualism in order for it to be a

powerful force for good. It is not enough for a scientist to believe in the use of nuclear energy as a step forward by civilization. The progress of the world shall depend upon whether or not atomic energy is used for war or peace.



Spiritualistic phenomena is not proof of angelic communication, even though the existence of spirits may have been demonstrated. It is on account of unrighteous phenomena that many orthodox Christians fear unlimited Spiritualism, for evil spirits can cause degeneration of the soul even though they masquerade as angels. Therefore, a Spiritualist who hungers and thirsts after righteousness, should promote Spiritualism qualified for righteousness only. The great Master Medium of Nazareth decisively cast out evil spirits. We should be as careful of spirit associates as we are of mortal ones, for "By their fruits ye shall know them" - - - and often the medium is the fruit tree.

Question: I am not a professional medium, but I do have the gift of automatic writing. An Egyptian King is a guide who is writing a book through me about ancient Egypt. Do you think I can find a publisher?

Answer: Spirit dictated books are not considered commercial timber. Therefore, professional publishers will not handle them, although some will publish them if subsidized. Unless you can afford it or can have someone finance your book, don't expect a royalty contract. Dictation from spirits using great names is looked upon questioningly by publishers. There are so many imposters in the Spirit World. A sample of your dictation should be shown to an Egyptologist for an authoritative appraisal. I had one analyized sometime ago and it was reported as not being authentic as to knowledge of old Egypt. I had several manuscripts of dictation supposedly from George Washington, which proved ignorant of Washington's family facts. Evidently these imposters get a kick out of fooling mortals. Christ warned us about spirits claiming *His* name. So evidently it is a trait of lower forces. The more highly evolved spirits are humble and do not reveal their identity nor boast of their greatness.


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#### STRAWS IN THE WIND


#### DR. CHARLES MAYO CARRIES ON by Edith O. Waddell Long Beach, Calif.

n order to gain inner contentment, we have to establish order in our lives. If something obstructs the natural function of Divine Law, it becomes corrupt or impure. When a nerve impulse fails to reach a muscle, the muscle will not respond. When base emotions like anger or resentment flood our bodies, hearts are affected; lungs



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#### Rev. Dr. Wm. B. Owens

#### NEW TRUSTEE

Rev. Dr. William B. Owens, of Columbus, Ohio, has been appointed Trustee of the First Spiritualist Cathedral, Sixth and State Streets, Columbus. Dr. Owens has been serving as assistant pastor of the church for nearly two years and will continue in that capacity. Currently, he is serving as its pastor during the Florida vacationwork trip of the pastor, Rev. Ralph Whitney.

The appointment fills the va-cancy following the death of its oldest trustee, Rev. Mable Riffle of Chesterfield, Indiana. The remaining Trustees are: Rev. Ralph Whitney and Clyde Knisely.

The church building, valued at \$100,000 when transmitted in Trust Deed in July, 1902, was deeded in trust to three trustees to hold such premises for the ad-vancement of spiritualism, and in turn rent the premises to a Spiritualist Society. The deed of trust stipulates certain limitations and provisions to which the trustees as lessors, and the Society as lessees, must comply and conform.

When the present Society rented the church premises, it invested about \$25,000, Mrs. Anna Roesler about \$17,000, and Clyde Knisely about \$2,500.00 to improve the church to its present condition. Knisely has been a Trustee of the Church for over twenty years. At the time of his appointment, he was President of the Church Society and an active Spiritualist worker. The Trusteeship is a continuous contract, while the permancy of the Society is subject to unforeseen contingencies.

The appointment of Owens as Trustee of the church brings the church into more local focus and interest, as all are active workers of spiritualism in the church and community. Dr. Owens is also a wonderful healer.

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

Max F. Ellerbusch, whose fiveyear- old son was the victim of a hit-skip accident a little more than three years ago, never has regretted offering a new life to the young driver of the death ear.

In so doing, he says, he set up a new life for himself.

Held "at the depths of hate and sorrow" for the 30 hours it took to "cool off," the husky manufacturer of precision instruments emerged from despair into what he describes as a period of growth in his own thinking.

It was on January 6, 1959, that Max and his wife, Grace, appeared in Juvenile Court when Walter Kiser, Jr., 15, was called to account for the accidental death of Craig Ellerbusch on December 19, 1958.

Citing the "investment" of hope he and his wife had in their child, Max told Judge Benjamin S. Schwartz: "I would like to see this boy given the opportunity to finish that investment."

The judge ordered young Kiser put on probation and, true to his promise, Max gave the boy a job at his plant.

Max recalls he was mad enough to kill Kiser for a time after the tragedy.

"But the answer came to me in a 'psychic episode' that took less than a split second," he says. "It left me with a fantastic feeling of love, sensitizing my senses beyond imagination. From that time on I have been searching for an understanding of what I learned."

During that "psychic episode," Max feels he received this message: "Craig has more important things to do. See what you can do for the boy (Kiser)."

Commenting on his feelings after the experience, Max says: "Send that boy to the reformatory? Why? I had to have an answer. I forced an answer. If you can hate one moment and love the next, then the thing to do was love this boy as my own child. . . "

Max has found this "tremendous sensation of love" can be applied successfully in his handling of animals.

## "GLAD HE HELPED DEATH CAR DRIVER"

"If you can get close to an animal, give the creature love, the creature actually returns it," he says. "For instance, I have a 24inch red-tailed hawk—a whopper. When I received her, part of a wing had been shot off and she was vicious. She would put her claws through heavy overshoes and gloves. You couldn't feed her without leather gloves.

"I kept talking to her, gaining her confidence until she would eat. At first she would tear into chicken breasts. Gradually she developed table manners. Now she is gentle and won't eat until 1 cut the food up. She doesn't even drop any pieces.

"When you give love to an animal, and bring it to your own level rather than look down on it the results are terrific."

Born August 2, 1916. Max Ellerbusch attended Wyoming Grade and Hughes High Schools.

"My education beyond that has been mixed up," he grins. "When I went into the Army in 1940 I was in the infantry. When I got out in 1945 I was in ballistics research."

Max's company rebuilds surveying instruments, builds dial indicators, mechanical, optical and measuring instruments.

"We also build sub-miniature models which are very precise--



small microscopic items," he says. "We have worked with the American Heart Association in building synthetic valves for the heart."

Max has always tried to employ high school boys because he likes to train them in the business.

"It is practically impossible to find the personnel we want," he says. "We need people with creative ability, mechanically inclined, and with a desire to learn. Finding high school boys to train has its problems."

While admitting his theories about the creation of life are "away out" to many. Max is serious when discussing them. He often strives for expressions to present his thoughts.

A big man-6 feet, three inches; 240 pounds-he has early reddish hair and blue eyes, as well as a friendly smile. He is extremely anxious that his thinking not be misunderstood. He and Mrs. Ellerbusch, who have two daughters. Diane and Ruth Carrol, and a son, Michael, live at 6806 Kenbyrne Ct.

Does Max believe all boys should have a college education?

"No," he says. "I say that the child who has the mental capacity to handle a college education should be pushed all the way. If he doesn't have that, a trade system is the answer."

And what became of Walter Kiser, Jr.?

"He did work at the plant for a while," Max says. "Somehow or other I always thought he would wind up as a missionary. Today he is in a military institute in Oklahoma and stays on the honor roll. He acts pretty much like one of my own kids would. When he's home he comes to see us. When he needs money, he asks for it.

"And, he's going into social work. That's pretty close to being a missionary, isn't it? If I have been able to bring out that side of the boy-that's good."


and countermarched before the door of the tomb. The Jewish soldiers on guard, thinking friends of the Nazarene had come to steal His body away, charged the soldiers, but found to their dismay and astonishment they could not kill them . . . for they kept right on marching among the now thoroughly frightened men. These white-clad soldiers were of the Silent Brotherhood. They came, stood upon the Roman seal, then vanished. The Jewish soldiers, later returning to the tomb, found all m order, just as they had left them.

In our Bible we are told that during this time of Friday through Sunday, preceding Easter morn, Jesus descended into Hell to preach to souls in prison; this is also repeated in the Apostles' Creed. However, we are told all did not happen in exactly that way. Jesus did not remain in the tomb from Friday until Sunday, but went forth to teach in the realm of souls, setting prisoners free, breaking the chains of captive souls and leading them into the light. He sat in councils with the patriarchs and prophets of old; sat in great assemblies and told the story of His earth life and His promise to raise His body again. to walk again with His disciples. and demonstrate the potentialities of man. While doing this, He also projected His consciousness back to the physical body in the tomb and worked on its transmutation.

On the Sabbath Day, the garden of Siloam had been completely silent. But at midnight every Jewish soldier heard these words echo through the garden . . . "Adon Mashich cumi," which meant, "Lord Christ arise." Instantly, all unsheathed their swords, sup-posing Jesus' friends were coming to take His body away. The words seemed to come out of nowhere, vet from everywhere . . . and they could see no one. Affrightened. they stood their ground, for to flee meant death. The time was approaching dawn, and again the heavens blazed with light, and distant thunder was heard, seemingly heralding a coming storm. The earth commenced to quake and rock, and in the rays of the light. all saw an angel descend from Heaven, stamp on the Roman seal, tear it to shreds, and roll away the stone from the sepulcher Again, the words came forth. 'Lord Christ arise.'

The records show that Jesus opened His eyes and said, "All hail the rising sun and the coming day of righteousness." He arose, folded His burial clothing, and stood a moment beside the angel. The more thoroughly frightened soldiers fell to the ground, but the more resolute stood and watched the transmutation of Jesus' body as it changed from mortal to im-mortal, then disappeared. Then, words seemed to be heard coming from everywhere again, saying, "Peace on earth, goodwill to men.

The Lord had arisen as He promised. The soldiers hurried to

Ierusalem to tell the priests what had happened. Immediately, Caiphas called a council to suppress the truth lest people call Jesus the. son of God and all their own testimonies would be proven to be false. Then each of the soldiers was bribed with a piece of silver and told to say that the body had been stolen while they slept. They did what they were paid to do.

The coming of the women in the morning to anoint the body of Jesus and further prepare it for burial, Jesus' appearance to them, and other appearances in Palestine are much the same as in our Bible. However, in some of the Bibles, sacred works, and other historical records of other lands, we find evidence that the Master brought His Easter message to those people also. Numerous records and accounts tell us of much time spent by our Wayshower studying in India, even teaching school there. He was well acquainted with Prince Ravanna of India and with his palace at Orissa where many philosophers met. There chanced to be a feast in process at the palace in honor of these wise men at the time of Jesus' resurrection, and a vacant chair at the table remained facing the east. It was only natural that He should stop in and meet again with some of His former acquaintances and friends. As He entered and stood in their midst, a halo of light rested on His head that filled the room.

He then told them of His treatment and death at the hands of the Jews and Romans, showing them the marks on His hands and feet. He told them that in conquering death. He was the demonstration of the power of man. He was no myth . . . but flesh, bone, and brawn. He could cross the borderland of worlds at will. They talked long, and Jesus told them of their mission to make known His truth, that men who believe and live this gospel shall never die, and that the so-called dead shall live again. He sowed the good seed with words of life, and all India heard.

Then, to the ancient Persian city of Persepolis He traveled to visit the Magian priests in their silence. Kaspar had been one of the first to greet Jesus as a baby in the shepherd's home in Bethlehem. He sat with them, a crown of light upon His head, and they greeted Him as a Master from the Silent Brotherhood, asking for the message He had brought to them. Blessing them, He told them the problem of the ages had been resolved . . a son of man had risen from the dead, had shown that with the speed of light human flesh had been transmuted into the Divine. tion from the dead, that all power was His, and that they should go forth to teach His gospel to all peoples. He clasped Apollo's hand and said that He could manifest at will in the flesh or in the higher planes of life.

When Jesus arrived at On, or Heliopolis, in lower Egypt, He found the priests in the temple celebrating the resurrection of their brother, the Nazirite, for they knew He had arisen from the dead, the first man to make this demonstration. They greeted Him with, "All hail". The great bells of the temple rang and the temple itself became a blaze of light. After honoring the Masters of the Temple of the Sun, Jesus ex-plained to them how in the flesh of man is the essence of the resurrection which, when quickened by the Spirit of God, will raise the substances of the body to a higher vibration and make it like the bodies of the Heavens above . . . invisible to human eves. When the dense body disintegrates, then God breathes upon the pliable substances then left and life springs forth from death - - just as when God breathed upon the chaos of the deep and worlds were formed - - so the carnal form is changed to a form divine. Here we have the chemistry of mortal life, the ministry of death, and the mystery of the divine life. He spoke to them, saying, "You, my brethren, know of all my trials and victories, that all my life was one great drama for the sons of men to behold, a pattern for them for their lives. I lived to show the possibilities of man, for what I can do, they can also do, and what I AM all men shall be."

So He went from place to place. Before His ascension, however, He did not fail to visit the wicked priests, scribes, and Pharisees who had killed Him. On the Sabbath Day, when Caiphas, Annas and other important Jews were gathered together and, according to one report, a stranger in the garb of a fisherman entered the temple to inquire as to what had happened to one called Jesus who used to teach there. The answer that was given was, "the man from Galilee was crucified because He was dangerous, seditious and vile.' The fisherman then asked where his body was . . . in what tomb? But they did not know the answers to these questions . . . only that His disciples had come and stolen His body. They had a hundred men watching the tomb, and each declared that the disciples had stolen the body. Jesus then told the Jews that He had been a witness to the true facts, was in

the garden among the hundred men, and that not one of them would testify that he saw the body stolen from the tomb.

I will testify that the man of Galilee is risen from the dead!" He said. The Jews rushed upon Him to cast Him out, but as they did so, the stranger became a radiant form of light. They fell back in deadly fear, for they saw before them the man from Galilee.

The Master looked upon the frightened men and said, pointing to Himself: "This is the body that you stoned beyond the gates and crucified on Calvary. Behold! my feet, hands, and side. See the wounds the soldiers made. If you believe I am a phantom made out of air, come forth and handle me; ghosts do not carry flesh and bones.

Then He went on to tell them why He came to earth . . . that He came to demonstrate the resurrection of the dead, the transmutation of the flesh of carnal man to that of man divine. He raised His hands and blessed them, then disappeared.

He made plain His mission to earth to all to whom He spoke in the places He visited in His transmuted body. He who was sent to demonstrate the Christ spirit, or Christ consciousness, was the Christed or anointed one who had become the Way, the Truth, the Life, giving His life as a pattern for all the people of earth. He made it plain that His followers were to open up the gates of the dawn and point the way to light and life. He had painted on the walls of time a rainbow for the inhabitants of earth, saying that what He had done all men should do.

When the day came for His ascension, He led His people to Bethany. After He had given His charge to them, and promised to be with them always, He rose on wings of light, a wreath most brilliant encircling Him, and they saw His form no more.

Whenever I would drop by Carrie's room in the davtime, I found her sewing, or reading Spanish or German. I never stopped in to talk with her that she did not

say: "O, how peaceful this place! I have not been so carefree in all my life. I never liked to sew before, but I enjoy it here.

There is no better evidence of the presence of great Spiritual Forces than in an environment of peacefulness. The song of the Spirit People on that first Christmas morning was Peace on earth. During the materialization on the mountain that day, Peter had said to Christ,

Night after night at ten o'clock, Carrie would come into my praver room, and we would close the door and begin our healing, or Spirit Therapy. The tension on the face muscles gradually grew less, and she could work her jaws more freely. Her speech became easier, and her enunciation improved. I watched that scar night after night as it slowly shortened and became less conspicuous. I knew that Carrie looked into her mirror a hundred times a day watching for improvement.


All summer we continued our nightly prayer sessions faithfully for one full hour. Late in August, only a few weeks before the fall term of school opened, a letter from the President of a church college came, offering Carrie the Professorship in the Department of Foreign Languages, where she would teach German and Spanish. Only a very faint line was left of the unsightly scar that crossed her face when she first came to me, and a little face powder completely covered that last mark of her disfigurement.

I looked at the woman standing before me, a smile of self-confidence on her attractive face, and I compared her to the broken, defeated and disheartened woman who came to me in the Spring. Here before me was another example of the amazing power of God to answer our prayers. When the baggage was all packed, Carrie and I went into the prayer room for one last little praver together. Then, in the quiet and peace of that little sanctuary, there came to me the words of a great man of God, spoken long, long ago:

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There is another kind of spring from which bubbles the current of spiritual life. The symbolism of this living water recurs in story and scripture. We have the spring of cternal youth sought by explorers in far-off lands. The distant is always the magnet of men's dreams. This is probably due to the divine homesickness which draws us on and on to our real abiding-place in the unseen worlds from which we came. The Christ in man is the fountain of eternal youth, the well of soul-refreshing water, the "wine and milk without money and without price." How can we tap this source of strength? How can we seek it while it is near? The answer is, "Change your whole outlook on life and your relation to it." We center now on the material, not knowing that all material needs will be supplied once we tap the spiritual. The thought-pattern precedes the concrete manifestation. It is thought that builds or destroys. The power within consciously links itself with the Power without. "If God be with us, who can be against us?

This practice is not easy. We have to combat the race thought together with our own preconceived notions, which are destructive and altogether false. We must get right with the God within, the Christ force in the center of our own being, which, like a spring of refreshing water, strengthens, invigorates, and transforms us more nearly into the Divine likeness which we were made to express.

## Discovering One's Own Genie

It is strange how the art of concentration in any way could be compared with the Genie in the stories of the Arabian Nights, but if you look at the symbolism presented, there you will find many instances where such is the case.

For instance, in the story of Aladdin's Lamp, the Genie is required to grant every wish of the lamp's owner, provided the owner knows how to conjure him up with the proper words or gestures.

When we concentrate upon anything, we are merely impressing our sub-conscious mind with our problem. In nine cases out of ten it will obey us and come up with the solution, seemingly "out of nowhere," if we go at it in the right way.

While it is not necessary to know the proper words to get in touch with our sub-conscious mind, it is necessary to think deeply about any problem we wish to solve. This is one of the most valuable secrets of success we can learn. Strangely enough, once this lesson is learned, it, like the Genie, will have to obey our every command. Then, too, as we use the sub-conscious more and more, the easier it will be to command. In this way, it is like a child who must learn discipline. In the beginning it is hard for him to understand what is required of him, but as he becomes used to the demands made upon him, he responds more quickly because he can sense that which will please you or benefit him.

Men have studied the workings of the mind for years, trying to find out how it is able to do so many wonderful things, and why. While they look at the effect, they are trying to find the cause. Professors in many of our greatest universities are demonstrating that the sub-conscious mind is able to do feats which, when the conscious mind is in control, are done with less accuracy, less ability, and certainly less brilliance.

While a man may be in full command of all his faculties, it is rarely that he is also in command of his greatest faculty; his sub-conscious mind. When he is, the results are clearly visible to all. It is this part of him that is visible, for instance, when he becomes inspired. The great masterpieces of Art, Music and Literature were created under the inspiration of the sub-conscious mind, when, for perhaps a fleeting time, it is controlled by its owner. Man has always desired to create and invent, whether it be for Good or Evil. Desire is the mainspring from which comes the greatest feats man is able to accomplish. He can use it to suit himself once he learns how, for each of us possesses a Free Will.

Let us remember, however, that the use of this mind power is somewhat like that of an automobile. One must get inside and start the motor before being able to go anywhere. If a car is allowed to sit for any great length of time, it will require much more effort to get it going than it would if it were in constant use day in and day out. So it is for this reason that we usually have to *learn* to get in touch with our sub-conscious mind - because of lack of use.



Now then, let us say that we really do wish to use our subconscious minds - - knowing that it is our servant to command. How do we go about it? What was the constant run of your thoughts today? You should be candidly honest in this process, and thus learn to "Know Thyself." Generally, were your thoughts happy and cheerful? Or did they run the gamut of temper, dolefulness or just plain Casper Milquetoast? Did you feel that somebody used you for a doormat - then while you thought of that, did vou feel that you had just better get used to the idea? Your sub-conscious mind can make you as a mouse or a man, master or slave, depending on how you use it.

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
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
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## LESSONS FOR STUDENTS

"THE SILENCE"

Silence, that sacred temple Where a soul can hear Celestial music.

-MIRANDA SNOW WALTON

. . . .

One of the first obligations of students desiring spiritual unfoldment, lies in the training of the mind to obey instructions. Until ascendancy over the material mind is established, we cannot hope to cope with and master outside conditions, or bring about the proper atmosphere in which spiritual infusion may be experienced. This process of self-training is generally termed, "going into the silence," or "meditation," Its value to the psychic student cannot be overemphasized.

Let us understand that there is nothing in the least mysterious about such a procedure. It is as natural as breathing or walking or thinking, and bestows upon the individual who practises it, the greatest benefits, both physically and spiritually. The practice of the silence is simple. Yet because we have been schooled to the com-plexities of modern day life, we sometimes scorn the simple things, feeling that they are not worthy of our attention. The reverse is true. It is in the simple things of life that we come closest to the heart of Nature, or God.

As we begin the practice of the silence, it is necessary to set aside all material problems and worries, and enter into this period with anticipation and joy. It will become not only a means of resting and healing the physical body, but also a time of vital replenishment. In the silence, the light of Spiritual Truth glows brighter, and the shadows of fear and the testings of daily living are eased.

A regular hour for sitting always should be selected. Choose the most convenient time of day, when you feel confident that no interruption will occur. Sit always in the same room, preferably in the same chair, for the chair and room will, in time, become magnetized. Many teachers prefer a straightbacked wooden chair to one that is upholstered, for this allows the spine to extend upwards in a perfectly straight line, thus allowing the psychic currents to play fully on all the spiritual centers of the body.

A few deep breaths, drawn in through the nose, and exhaled through the lips, will assist in cleansing the system of toxic poi-sons and bring more complete relaxation to the body. Breathe deeply and easily, but never to the point of strain. Keep in mind as you inhale, that you are drawing into your body the divine essences of life which replenish and perfect. When exhaling, know that the breath is "washing out" of your body all that has served its purpose and which has become un-desirable and of no value. Three or four of these breaths, with the mental affirmations above, will be found most helpful.

At first as you sit, vagrant thoughts will flash across the mind seeking to distract your attention. The various parts of the body will make themselves known to your physical senses for the same purpose. Persistent training of the mind to obey will, however, overcome this early trouble. A soft light, or perhaps soft music, will assist in relaxing and soothing the busy mind which seeks always to retain its domination.

By relaxing the body and mind, we do not mean to infer that you must relax to the point of becoming drowsy. If this occurs, terminate the sitting at once. Every effort must be made to relax the physical body, while freeing and bringing to its greatest activity the soul powers of the mind. Keep the mind alert and watchful, for drifting into a comatose state without sufficient preparation may allow the absorption of influences that could prove detrimental or difficult to handle at this stage of development. At first the silence exercises are solely for the purpose of bringing the physical senses under control. When sufficient proficiency in this has been attained, the psychic senses will take over, and one will realize that the silence is peopled by many souls, and filled with a multitude of sound, unheard by ordinary ears.

The best time for going into the silence, provided it is compatible with your daily scheme of living, is after the day's work is done. At this time you feel peculiarly at peace with yourself and the outside world. No urgency is felt toward the accomplishment of tasks. and true relaxation is most easily accomplished. It is best . . just at first . . to sit with the eyes open, for this helps retain the necessary positive control of the senses. Some, however, find it more natural to close the eyes. If this is done, be certain you do not drift into a drowsy trance condition. This should never be allowed except under proper training, and only then, when others sufficiently progressed and capable are around you. When the psychic senses are fully developed, one can see as

well, or better, with the eyes closed as with them open, for sight then centers in the psychic "third eye .

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



'For this is the promise He hath promised us, even eternal Life.' I John 2:25.



that will help you, "not hinder", to achieve your desired goal. Then continue your ordinary tasks for the rest of the day. Again in the evening, repeat your thoughts, covering the same things you did before, and see if there is not something new and better to add. If there is, give this new thought praise for having come to you. In other words, praise your sub-conscious mind a little bit. It will not hurt you or your mind, and it will give you a feeling of enthusiasm and desire to continue.

After you have reached this stage of development, continue on to the next step . . . that of translating thought into action. Begin with first things first, step by step, to move toward your highest goal. A word of caution, however, never accept second best. If you do, it would be worse than never having started at all. You will have convinced vour sub-conscious mind that you will settle for just that every time. Do not think that by concentration alone you can achieve your desires. With such a line of thought, concentration becomes merely day-dreams, wasting time and energy, working havoe on the physical body by causing frustration, and eventually brings about lack of emotional control.

When one begins to use the art of Concentration, it will be noticeable that many unrelated and unnecessary thoughts creep in. While this should not be tolerated, it can be understood. If irrelevant thoughts seem to persist in entering the mind unbidden, empty it of all thoughts for a minute and start over. However, do not start over too many times during one fifteen minute period.
