

. . . the prize of life awaiting discovery . . .

ne of the great benefits derived from the religion of Modern Spiritualism is that its philosophy rouses one to think for oneself, and in so doing, helps to break down and rise above the limitations which have held

one in bondage.

Spiritualism has come to awaken man to the importance of doing his own thinking and opens wide the way through which, by personal experience . . . which is the greatest of all teachers, he may discover the real, the true, unalterable facts concerning his own spirit and its glorious destiny.

When one realizes that, in spite of the high opinion that mankind has of his intellectual powers, of the vast numbers on this earth, all but a few, occupy themselves merely with eating, drinking, sex, sleeping and making

Thus, they pass their entire time in materialistic ways, never taking time really to think, and thus, by meditation, get acquainted with

the real self.

What the world needs most is live, active thought which springs from the spirit of man, flashing true and fired with divine emotion. Too long has man been content merely to exist slightly above the animal kingdom, allowing others to do his thinking for him, a puppet in the hands either of clever religious politicians or ambitious, cruel dictators.

In Spiritualism, here at last is a religion which declares unto man . . . Awake, and think for yourself. Seek the spirit which lies within you and, as the Bible declares . . . "all things

shall be added unto you."

How beautiful, inspiring and supreme is that religion which encourages man in the divine right of using his own mind, awakening his spiritual powers, thus coming into harmonious direct relationship with the ministering spirits of the higher world.

To have to depend upon others no longer to receive God's light - - - "dimly as through a darkened window," but in opening one's own mind, man may receive directly the light of the Divine Presence. Spiritualism seeks to reveal to man the spirit within. Once that is found, one trods the true path and the light of the Infinite shines upon it. All confusion ceases, and that peace which passeth earthly understanding prevails. In lifting the veil which hid man's true nature to reveal his spirit as being something real, near, and strong - - man finds he is no longer lost amid a sea of uncertainty . . . beset by doubts and fears . . . but sees the way clearly with knowledge as his guide.

There is nothing so thrilling, so inspiring, so consoling, so invigorating as the realization of one's own spirit, to know one is deathless, to comprehend the marvelous possibilities of the soul, to see the delusion of the world's belief in limitation, and to know one can be what one wills to be.

The keynote of life is progress, the goal is perfection. Man, in seeking this high aim, has become lost in the confusion of outer things, in the effects of causes he does not understand, misled by the opinions of others, hypnotized by wordly authority, until he has lost his soul as one would lose sight of a friend in a crowd. Spiritualism has come to restore man to his real self, to his spiritual nature, to reveal to him the source from which all light, all truth and wisdom flow.

How can one expect to commune with the spirits of the departed if unable to commune with one's own spirit? How easy it is to do when one realizes the spirit within, for the spirit within each is related to all spiritual

As soon as he asserts himself and begins to use his own mind in a declaration of independence, he removes the shackles and blinders of other people's opinions; he sees things for himself from the standpoint of free and independent thinking. Thus he gives the psychic part of his mind an opportunity to express itself in strong impressions, serving as a guide and inspiration to him. How well Emerson realized the value of the psychic promptings when he wrote the following lines.

firmaments of bards and sages."

A real Spiritualist is one whose inner powers of insight and discernment are awakened to where he can perceive truth in all its various manifestations. One of our greatest Spiritualists and Seers, Andrew Jackson Davis, emphasized the value of free thought and free speech in the following lines.

trolled, unlimited. It is free to investigate and rise into lofty aspirations, and the only hope for the amelioration of the world is free thought and unrestricted inquiry. Any thing which opposes or tends to obstruct this sublime

God's Timepiece of Healing



"Can you do anything for me?" asked the man who stood before me in my prayer room.

... One That Never Fails ...

I looked at the pathetic face and hands, and I knew we had one of those so-called hopeless cases for prayer, because the man was a victim of what is termed Parkinson's Disease. He had a well-built physical body, and this made his condition even more lamentable. Sufferers of this disease often are spoken of as "pill rollers" because their trembling hands continually make motions of rolling pills with the fingers. This affliction is also known as "Shaking Palsy".

"I was hoping you could help me," the man said, speaking again to remind me that I had not answered his first question. Then he became silent as I studied his shaking hands and his mask-like

"You must have some kind of taith or you would not be here to see me." I said, "and Christ says, "Everything is possible for one who has faith"." Then I invited the shaking man to sit down beside me on the healing couch.

me on the healing couch.

"Then you feel there is hope for me?" he questioned me again.

"I believe there is hope for everyone who is willing to pay the price for healing," I told him.

"How much is your price . five hundred . . a thousand?"

"The price is not my price, but God's price. I am not talking in terms of dollars at all," I explained to him patiently.

"I am very sorry," he said, "I do not understand. You will have to explain to me what you mean."
"Many people never understand."

Spiritual Therapy or Spiritual Healing," I told him. "They think they can order healing just as they order merchandise from a mail order firm, but it is not as simple as that. To us, the healings of Christ appear to be accomplished instantly, as reported in the New Testament. However, back of Christ's power to heal the sick was a life of perfect harmony with the Father, and a preparation of prayer without ceasing. As we read through the Gospels of the New Testament, we are amazed at the references to Christ's praying. In Luke 6:12, we are told that Christ prayed on the mountain all night. Mark tells us of His habit of prayer in Chapter One. Verse 35: "Early in the morning, long before daylight, He got up and left the house and went off to a lonely spot end prayed there. If One so perfect as our Christ needed to pray constantly, even all night at times, how much more does our power to heal depend upon prayer?"

I reached over and took one of the man's shaking hands in each of mine. The trembling was so powerful that my hands shook with his. I asked him how long he had been shaking like this, and he told me that it had been ten years without a stop, except when he was sound

This shaking is caused by the breakdown of a nerve center in the brain. A tiny control center in the brain seems to quit working. and the nerves just keep the hands and face shaking constantly. The man told me that he had been to good medical doctors, and had been told of drugs that could bring relief, but honest doctors also had told him that permanent help from the drugs could not be expected as there is a tendency for the drugs to lose their effectiveness after a time. Doctors estimate that between a million and a million and a half people suffer with this disease - - - most of them past 50. The man with me in the prayer room that day was a young victim,

for his palsy had started when he was forty.

"How long can you stay with me today?" I asked him as we sat together on my couch.

"Oh, I took the whole day off to come to see you. I want as much time as you can spare me today. I will come back as often as you want me." This answer was most encouraging to me because I felt we had a long hard battle to fight together for his healing. So I began with Ralph as I begin with most of the sick who come to me. I began by building up his own faith in Spirit Healing, which includes an understanding of Spirit Therapy.

Recently, while reading a book on Modern Medicine that has had wide public acceptance and approval of a long list of medical doctors who have their names in it. I came upon this chapter: *The Mystery Of Faith*. I quote from pages 282 and 283 in that book.

"Throughout all the centuries, between the early Egyptian laying on of hands (and probably before that) to the present day in America, there has been an unbroken history of Faith Healing.

"The Biblical references to healing are common knowledge. The relics and shrines that have been accorded healing powers are well known in history. Accounts of miracle healings are legion.

"In addition to the religious leaders, there are lay persons, who, according to investigators and researchers, apparently have the gift of healing that they themselves cannot explain or control.

"The director of a large Chicago hospital states: 'As a doctor, I have seen recoveries after prayer and healing services that defy all present scientific knowledge.

"Dr. Robert Laidlow, Roosevelt Hospital, New York City, answered the question: 'Does a healing power exist?' with a positive answer: 'I believe we can answer with an unconditional YES'."

In my talk that day with Ralph, preparing him for Spirit Therapy, and in my talks with almost every sick person who comes to me, I draw upon scientific and medical testimony to furnish evidence of the *Reality* of healing powers. Then I turn to the Holy Scripture and explain that it is faith in God's love and power that brings the spirit forces of healing.

That healing power today is a mysterious force, we - who are in the healing ministry - admit. I firmly believe, however, that we are coming to understand better the laws that govern this Divine Power.

Two years ago I had as my guests for several nights two electronic engineers. We had many interesting discussions about the future of electronics, and in these talks I always brought in Spiritual Power: The engineers and I agreed that my definition for Spirit Power and the textbook definition for electricity differed very little. I give this definition to all the sick who come to me as Ralph did to show them the mysterious actions of Divine Healing forces. Here it

Spirit Power is an invisible Agent which manifests Himself in various ways. The precise nature of Spirit Power is not known, but effects produced by Him, and the laws governing His action are becoming well known.

Ralph and I began our healing efforts, agreeing on several points. We both had firm faith that healing forces are as real as the furniture in my healing room, and as real as the radio and television vibrations that bring the programs into our homes. We agreed that though we do not understand all the mystery of Spirit Forces, we do not need to understand it any more than we need to explain radio waves to receive a program. We agreed that there are certain laws governing Spirit Healing that

ENEMY⁵⁵

An Army officer who had received many awards for valor once told me what he considered to be the beginning of his courage. He had, he said, experienced the very last word in nightmares, had almost died of fright, and had come through with a lesson so well learned that it had changed his whole life.

His dream was one in which an enemy of great size, power and skill attacked him with black hate and the savagery of the worst of beasts. But worse, in addition to this physical man there was his ghost which accompanied him, dark, semi-transparent, and entirely hideous. The ghost leered and made the dreamer creep with chills of fear.

He fought the creatures madly, with a strength that seemed to arise from the depths of himself because the emergency was so terrible. He felt a dual fear of dying in the physical and of having his very soul devoured by the horrible ghost. As he felt his will and strength going he endured a mounting terror that was like nothing he had ever imagined could exist. He died a hundred deaths as he realized that there was no way out - - his body was going to be killed and his soul annihilated.

At last came the end. He was beaten down. The enemy placed a knee on his back, seized him by the hair, pulled up his head, and with cruel slowness cut his throat. He felt the pain subside and waited. He expected darkness - - hoped there would be no sensation when the ghost set about devouring his soul . . . but the things he had been fearing failed to happen. He found that he was still alive, even if the body had vanished - - and, most curious of all, the enemy and his ghost had vanished with the passing of the body.

After what seemed to him a very long time of waiting and watching, he came to a momentous conclusion: "Only the body can be killed," he told himself. "I am continuing, now that the body is dead. The soul cannot be injured. Now to

find out where I go from here." And he started to walk.

But the journey ended almost before it began - - he awakened. And although he stood in the forefront of battle many times after this experience, he never again was afraid. He had gone beyond the veil and had conquered the fear of death. "Which." he commented, "is, after all, the only thing there really is to fear."

The instinct to survive, which is planted deeply within all living things, and which can cause them to exert themselves to the uttermost for self-preservation, is -- in so far as man is concerned -- seated in the low self. When fear of death is felt, the low self is behind it. It is a fear which is a heritage of the physical rather than the spiritual or mental. The first step in conquering the "Last Enemy" is to see clearly where

fear is centered. The middle self of man can fear only in a reasoning way. He can, will and should fear within reason the troubles that his death might bring to those dependent upon him. He should look this fear in the face, consider all angles, put and keep his house in order so that all is done to insure against such troubles, and then go bravely ahead. Only when one has done his best to plan well to meet all possible emergencies of this nature, can he have peace of mind on this plane and an untroubled transition to the next.

In the past century we have rescued the naturally psychic from the toils of the witch-hunters who formerly burned them at the stake. The sudden fad of denying that there could be anything "supernatural" died a sudden death in the universities as many substantial professors took up the study of psychic powers, of ghosts and all things formerly flouted.

The adventurous scientists who organized the Society for Psychical Research, or who otherwise defied the materialism which had suddenly appeared in university and scientific circles, did humanity a great

service. The Materialists had shaken the religious world with their "scientific" announcement that all ideas of survival after death were part and parcel of the old mass of superstitions which were at last being cleared away.

Psychic Science developed rapidly and could not be shouted down. Men of high standing and of recognized ability and integrity observed the phenomena of the seance room and reported what they had observed there under rigid test conditions. The feeble effort to say that all had lied or been duped by tricksters fell far short of accomplishing a defense of the Materialism which was already seen to be on its way out.

Hundreds of books were written during the period in question, and even though Church and Press (excepting those working in the psychic field) still elect to continue scoffing at psychic manifestations the individual who cares to go to the library and read some of the most famous books on psychical research cannot but come away convinced beyond a doubt that survival after death is a fact, not just a religious promise.

To get ready to die manfully instead of cringing with fear, one needs, first of all, to accept the fact that survival after death is a basic truth. Of course, to the person who finds life so difficult that he dejectedly turns to the hope that death "ends all," the fact of survival is slightly hard to face.

George Bernard Shaw, one of the exponents of the belief that death is absolute, gave a message after his passing, repeating it through several spirit mediums, and saying each time, in effect, that dying had robbed him of his former hope that death would bring extinction. In discussing the conditions he had found on the other side of death, he reported that life continued there about where it left off here, although it was, he confessed, slightly different and greatly more enjoyable.

It was once objected that the survival of man as a spirit was untrue for the reason that the spirits who return to communicate with the living do not agree about what conditions exist on the other side of life.

There was no denying that each spirit described his place of abode as more or less different from that described by his fellows. However, when the matter had been called to the attention of several communicators who gave every evidence of being capable of answering any ordinary question, they explained that after death, one created his surroundings by mental picturing. For instance, a person who desired to be in heaven with gold streets, such as he had been taught to expect, automatically created such a heaven and peopled it with angels and the "blessed." Some, fearing hell and its fires, created a hell and occupied it with much suffering in mind, if not in actual physical body.

This creative ability after death, each creation being quite as real as the dreams which we nightly create and live in, has caused the recognized contradictions where the after-death life and its ingredients are concerned. The conflicting ideas of the nature of heavens and hells may be explained in a similar manner.

The well-informed, who know their Psychic Science, are free to say that when we die we create our surroundings for ourselves, but often meet and recognize friends and other spirits, sharing with them the dream-surroundings which they have created, as well as adding our quota to the whole. Occupations are carried on in the midst of these solid-seeming "heavenly worlds," and one may try doing and being all the things which were thought to be promising in physical life. In this way there is a chance for experience of a special kind, and for growth. The young who pass on are instructed and have the opportunity to grow up.

It is impossible to state with exactitude what conditions are for

MY LIFE AMONG THE HEADHUNTERS

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Chapter V "LIVING DANGEROUSLY"

God, the Angels, and Time were my counselors in planning the moments that made up the years. For results, we had to learn to labor and to wait with a safe memory of loving, diligent sowing - giving hostages to the future for the reaping.

One morning, very early, a member of our compound church sent us a message to visit at once, if possible, a woman in a distant village who was very sick. So, quickly I assembled the usual medication, Bible picture cards, a bunch of orchids, a few gift trinkets, camera, and a half dozen little books of Bible translations printed in the vernacular. Soon I was off on ponyloack

The breath of the air was sweet and fresh from off the Himalayas. In the wilds just before dawn, the golden silence distilled sweet music where the shadows were still aslant the forests, and one could almost see the color that flies from the heart of a flower to those who can love and appreciate it. Then suddenly the sun rose and transformed the world into many different tints and hues. The myna birds and the striped-throated bulbuls fluttered and twittered from tree to tree.

The hours slipped by as I traveled on. Then a strange dimness began to spread over the landscape which might foretell of rain and make the last steep part of the trip unusually difficult. At length I came to a particularly steep, narrow path that previously had been described as leading to my desti-nation. Above this path, I heard in the distance what sounded like the burden-bearing chant of a group of headhunters. Every moment brought them nearer. It sounded as if they were carrying a heavy log out from the jungle. This would make it difficult to pass them. There they were, coming right along. To make matters worse, the sky was growing dark. I knew I must make the village in haste before a deluge of expected rain fell. The trees and rocks on each side blocked the path as the group advanced and stopped in front of me. Judging by their attire, or its absence, and the cut of their hair, they were people from villages different from those I knew, and every fifty miles the dialect changed. They were pointing at the sky, and then at me.

Presently I understood that they needed a sacrifice for the "sky tiger" that was eating up the sun.

This was all important to them, for without the sun they would all die. Now I, the Memsahib, was just what the "pitris", spirit-gods, had sent so they would not have to take one of their own number for the sacrifice. Any human being would suffice - - - white or brown, man, woman, or child. Darker and darker the sky glowered and scowled . . . like a living menace demanding blood. All of a sudden I understood that this was an eclipse of the sun occurring. This always meant a sacrifice was demanded, without which they believed the sun would never shine again. Always they had made a human sacrifice, and always the sun had returned . . . what could be simpler?


I let the brethren talk as long as they would, until they got out their knives and started toward me. more. I spoke the truth, and Ao-Nagas among whom I worked would tell them so. Again I made the promise to give them back the sun.

They were amazed. Some among them had heard rumors of our work among the villagers, that we always helped, and always told the truth. Some of them nodded in approbation, but still the "sky tiger" threatened their lives.

Holding my hands toward heaven, in a loud voice I prayed for the sun to come back that they might understand it was the Great White God who controlled all things, even the "sky tiger". They must wait another minute or so to help me get the sun back for them, then never again would they have to make a human sacrifice.

More they talked . . . would they wait? But look! . . . the sky was

Then I spoke to them, promising to give them back the sun if they would listen and wait a moment. I would pray to the Great White God, the greatest of all the "pitris" and gods, to give back the sun, so they would not have to bother with a sacrifice. This God would take care of the "sky tiger". They would see this for themselves in just a moment; besides, the Great White God needed the Memsahib to work for Him - - for I was now on the way, I told them, to see one of their sick brown women - - and I must go. Furthermore, I told them if they harmed me, the Great White God would punish them . . . and that they knew they had enough troubles already without having

brightening. The Great White God was giving back the sun! The eclipse was over. Shortly it was light again. In a few more minutes the sun blazed forth, and they were happy again. The Memsahib had told the truth. The Great White God was the most powerful of all gods and spirits. They must hear more of him. Quickly I gave them a few of my colored Bible pictures and trinkets, which pleased them greatly, and told them of our meetings and village churches.

I hastened onward. Never again, down the years, as far as I have been able to discover, was there ever a human sacrifice to the "sky tiger". I found the sick woman I had been seeking, in great pain,

lying on a bamboo mat on the floor. She had a bad case of food poisoning. While I was preparing a cup of senna tea, I was also trying to keep on her stomach a weak mixture of apple cider vinegar and honey which had always proved to be effective in such cases when administered a teaspoonful at a time. She felt better very soon, sat up, and wanted help with her mental problems. She very much appreciated my coming the long dangerous ride to see her. It was her desire to speak to me of her uncle's death, about the unfriendly medicine man of an adjoining village she feared, and to seek the help of our Great White God to protect her family from more trouble which might come from evil practices. She went on to tell me that this hostile medicine doctor sent his spirit into his pet leopard one night, causing the animal to kill her uncle when he had no weapon with which to defend himself. Had the uncle possessed a weapon and shot the medicine doctor's leopard, the doctor himself would have perished, as they shared the same spirit. She told me further of a woman friend of hers at another village, who subsequently moved a long way off, who was nearly killed by a tiger that had been the pet of this medicine man. She was saved by her husband who, following her at a distance, happened to be carrying a box containing the gun of a Sahib. He shot the tiger in the right shoulder, disabling and frightening the beast away. It was discovered that night by certain villagers, not having left his hut at all, that the medicine man had a serious, fresh wound in his right shoulder. "That, Memsahib," she explained, "is what always happens. For instance, if the animal is shot in the left hind leg, then the man's left leg is also wounded; if in the left paw, then the left arm of the man is hurt. Maybe the Memsahib does not believe it, but we know."

"On the contrary," I assured her, "I have read of several such cases being reported by scientists to research and scientific institutions in my country in books on Psychic Science, and certain English government officials have observed personally experiences of this sort and reported the reality of such occurrences." In missionary work, I had found it was a great advantage to have more than a one-track mind, to be open-minded and scientifically trained, and to realize that unless we know all the cases in the world, we can never say that such and such a thing could not occur.

The sick woman raised her head and looked me straight in the eyes. "You are different, they tell us, than the other white Sahib folk. I can tell you things. I, Imala, know you will understand. Tell me what the Sahib people know about these things."

"Imala, you should rest now." I told her. I gave her some tea and promised to tell her of what some of the wiser Sahibs had discovered, and to make it as plain as I could in her language. So when she had rested a while, I told her the Bible story of Nebuchadnezzar - - how he was driven out of his palace, became like an animal, eating grass like the ox, his body wet with dew, his hair growing long as an eagle's feathers, his nails becoming as a bird's claws. Also, I told her that we had in our history books the story of Romulus and Remus who had been brought up by wolves as animals, who looked and acted like animals, Romulus killing his brother. Imala knew about tiger children - - human beings carried off by tigers, suckled as their cubs, that became like beasts that scarcely could be told from animals, except in some cases by their vaccination marks. They were transformed into animals. If I had seen Imala a few vears later, I could have told her that in Midnapore, Bengal, where my own daughter was born, two little tiger children were brought to the mission who never could be civilized or taught to walk upright. Harper's Magazine had an article about them. Yes, lycanthrophy was a very interesting subject, for it dealt with people's wills operating through animals, and human bodies taking on the semblances of animals. There were many scientific sources of information for this, among them the reports of the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, D.C., in later years known as the United States National Museum.

"Yes, Imala, some scientists tell us that, in time at least, human beings can look like animals and behave like them." I paused, lest I weary her, but she begged me to continue. I told her of the various accounts in the Journal of Psychical Research of different kinds of animals that were controlled by human beings. I remembered reading about a case investigated by a Captain Shott, and a Lieutenant, in Nigeria in which a raiding hyena was wounded by gun traps and traced in each case to the point where the hyena traces ceased and were succeeded by human foot-prints which headed for the native town. At each shooting of a hyena, a man mysteriously died in the town, all access being refused to the body. Immediately after the shot a death wail was raised. The Captain tracked the beast from the native village; he found its jaw lying near a large pool of blood. Soon after, he found the tracks led

to a path to the town. The next day the natives came to the Captain and told him, without any regret, that he had shot their lesser headman, who was then lying dead with his jaw shot away. The natives said that he was going into the bush when they heard the gun go off, then saw him return with his head all wrapped up. He was walking like he would drop dead with his jaw shot away. The next morning they found him dead. Many similar cases in different parts of the world have been reported.

"Wonderful, wonderful . . . tell me more and more . . I understand!" she cried hungrily.

"Imala, I should be telling you other things. I will tell you this, however, and make it plain in your language." I then told her of an experiment of a Dr. Paul Joir in . our country who was able to transfer the exteriorized sensitivity of a subject he was treating to a figure made of putty. If the hand of the putty figure were scratched by a needle, a corresponding red mark appeared on the subject's hand. If sensitivity could be transferred to a putty figure, certainly it could be transferred to an animal. What happened to the animal could happen to the human being, and the wound would be in the same place of both. Imala responded enthusiastically and was completely satisfied, demonstrating that many of the preliterate, uncivilized people in isolated parts of the world are quite as good thinkers and are much better, in many instances, than those in our own country. It was a joy to make this discovery.

"Now my mind's hunger has been fed," she said, "I would hear more about the Great Wayshower, the White God's servant." We talked

together until it became necessary for me to go on to the village where I was to stop for the night to hold an early evening meeting. show pictures and answer questions. When I had finished talking, words burst forth from Imala's lips as the tears streamed down her face. "Your words must be true. I have always thought that somewhere at the center of things there must be a Great Heart that beats with throbs of love for the brown people. Now you have come to tell me of such \ldots you who understand our needs. It makes me well. I have no more sickness. There is no more room in my body for pain when it is filled with joy. Yes, I will come to the meetings, and some day we will have a church and a school in our village like they have in some of the other villages. I will tell others about the Truth. You must speak to the women at dawn tomorrow morning before they go to the rice fields. I will try to meet with them and see the pictures. We all need so much to hear your words.

Half an hour's ride brought me to the little but where I was to find two of our school boys and was to be put up for the night. The boys brought along the portable organ and helped me with the evening meeting. A little ways from the but that had been vacated for me was a cleared space where the villagers would assemble. While they were gathering, I played the organ and sang hymns in the native tongue.

Soon the people gathered from the rice fields and from their homes. Even the monkeys, those great imitators, came down from the trees to join the procession, bringing their young with them, walking regularly, then sitting quietly on their feet in the back under the overhanging trees. If one of the little monkeys grew restless, he received a slap or a shaking, similar to those of the brown children. Many a time I have had a monkey audience in with the others.

The meeting began with the singing of many hymns that were requested; some in the audience had been trained to sing all four parts in our music class, Sosang, a school boy, read from a pamphlet some parts of the Bible that I had translated into Ao-Naga, which was followed by prayer by another school boy and a short talk. Then came my part to show the large Bible pictures and tell the story of the life of our Wavshower, During the last part of the meeting it grew dark, and here and there an occasional lantern and torch were

lighted. A lone star trembled in the night-blue space above us. The jungle birds twittered to each other and finally were silent in their nests. The mist-clad trees, still as stones, seemed wrapped in shadowy dreams. It was time to give way to questions after I had closed with the words: "The pictures have shown you that the way of Love is the guide to the good life. No one can come to the Great God of all peoples except by being kind and loving one's neighbor as himself. This is the Golden Path set for the followers of the Master Jesus, Love vields. Love gives. Love transforms. All the flowers of tomorrow are in the seeds of today. Sow well for the good harvest." I sat down on a rock and awaited questions.

Sosang made a few announcements about our work and our school. More hymns were sung, but it was found that the music attracted wild beasts, for many pairs of glaring eyes were seen at the edge of the clearing. More torches were lighted. The jungle began to vibrate with the savage howls of hungry jackals, while leopard's cries shook the hills. A spotted beast sprang into the ravine near us. The roaring continued as a tiger seemed drawing nearer to us. The school boys quickly gathered small sticks and dry branches and started a fire.

Many questions were asked about the Great White God of the Sahib people, then the queries came about the missionary and her country... was it as large as theirs? . . was the ocean as great as their river? . . and what kind of soap did she use that made her so white?... certainly she must be very ancient, or what made her hair so light. for people with light or golden hair were considered very old - theirs was black. So, they kept on asking questions, loathe to retire to their huts.

Said an old former headhunter, "The river of Time, Memsahib, will swallow us all up before we see vou again in our village. You are so busy with so many to serve. But you must rest now." He took me back to the hut in the late afternoon before which I stood with two of our school boys while another took our picture with my camera. In the hut, I was to spend the night alone. As soon as my lantern was extinguished and I lay down on a little raised platform covered with a bamboo mat, the great rats of the village entered through the holes in the bamboo walls and doors and began running over me. Finally I dozed off into a semi-sleep from which I was soon aroused by an enormous rat trying to make a nest in my hair. The mosquitoes also were abundant, strong and vigorous. About the middle of the night, someone coughed loudly outside my door - - a cough is the Naga doorbell. I had laid down with my clothes on and now advanced and spoke through the closed bamboo door A rough masculine voice bade me come with him to help his sick wife who was at the other end of the village. I was to bring medicine. He had a lantern.

Quickly I gathered up my simple home remedies, my colored Bible cards, and followed the stranger into the dark and gloomy night down a slippery, rocky path, a dew dripping trail, and into the wet darkness. Misty vapors were still rising from the ground. The trail went into a dark wood suddenly, with not even a fire-fly or glowworm to shed its tiny light across the inky black way. Occasionally a glimmer of the lantern ahead showed a snake lying beside the path. Growls were heard in the bushes. The way was fraught with wonder. The path seemed endless and filled with whispering fears. A lonesome pariah, a gaunt figure, crossed and recrossed our path, howling his hunger to the pitiless moon.

QUESTIONS TO ED BODIN AND ANSWERS

Question: Is there any proof of a so-called high and low plane in the spirit world?

Answer: We can only draw a conclusion that there are various planes in the spirit world based on Saint Paul's astral flight into the "third heaven" as explained in 2nd Corinthians 12:2. Paul also mentions "paradise" in the 4th verse, which evidently is another plane of the spirit existence - also mentioned by Christ as told to the thief who died with Christ at Calvary. Many people believe that Heaven is a universe of many planes or planets - whereas Hell is earthbound spirit atmosphere below the Heaven stratosphere. A heavenly or saintly spirit has to penetrate this earth-bound atmosphere to make contact with mortals on Earth - and oftentimes earth-bound entities are able to crash a seance and give false testimony, and push the saintly spirits aside; unless of course, the heavenly one has the great spiritual strength of a saint. Perhaps this is what is meant in the Apostles Creed which limits contact to "Communion of Saints". causing orthodoxy to disapprove of unsaintly seances.

Question: Does the Mormon Religion believe that at death of the body, man's spirit goes to the spirit world or sleeps in the grave until Resurrection Day?

Answer: According to the Book of Mormon, page 295 reads in part: "The spirits of all men, as soon as they are departed from this mortal body, whether they are good or bad, are taken home to that God who gave them life." It then goes on to say that righteous spirits stay in paradise, while unrighteous spirits are in darkness. Joseph Smith, who received the book from the Son of Mormon, was undoubtedly a medium of high order, as was Mary Baker Eddy a few years later.

Question: You have said that fortune telling is not good for Spiritualism. What do you mean by fortune telling?

Answer: Fortune telling is limited to dollars and cents, and earth-bound gains and emotions. But, true Spiritualism is for healing and comfort of the body and mind, the development of character and the progression of the soul. Some say: "Purse against progression." . . Or "Security instead of Spirituality. . . " The Spiritualism The Spiritualism Spirituality. . . of Christ as contrasted with fortune telling by the Witch of Endor.

Question: Do Roman Catholies respect mediumship?

Answer: If you want to know how far Roman Catholies will go in admitting the discerning of spirits by mortals, read the book entitled: "Too Small A World," the life of Francesca (Mother) Cabrini. published by the Catholic concern. The Bruce Publishing Company of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and sanctioned through the Archbishop of Milwaukee.

Mother Cabrini was indeed a spiritualistic medium, and many incidents of her mediumship are recorded in the book, although the author doesn't call them spiritualistic, but discerning of spirits. . . "a good deal more than psychological perception." As a child, Mother Cabrini was saved from drowning, referred to as by her guardian angel. The following letter was received from my daughter, Mrs. Harold F. Bable of Chelsea, Michigan. I am happy to submit it to *Chimes* for publication. The Jonne Miller she refers to was my twenty-one year old grandson who was killed in an auto accident outside of Jackson, Michigan, March 14, 1961.

March 31, 1961

"Dear Mother:

There was a sort of contest on Radio Station CKLW in Detroit, called 'Let Pat Pav' that went on for months. I sent in a card a couple of months ago, then on March 21st sent another. On the card was to appear the name, address, occupation, name of the place where the car payments are made, and the amount of payment. If they drew your eard, they would make your car payment up to \$80.00. So . . they drew our card. Our payment was \$72.00. The check for the car payment was to be taken directly to the place where the car payment is made, which was okay by me.

As you know, Jonne Miller was killed early Tuesday morning, March 14th. I was in Toledo Tuesday morning when I got the news, so I drove right to Jay's home, and that same night slept in Jonnes bed. Mentally, I asked him to show or tell me something. Here is the picture I received.

I am looking out a set of large windows somewhere up high in a strange building, thinking about something I am planning to do, trying to decide if I should do this thing or not. I turn my head, and behind a veil sits someone in a chair. I cannot tell if it's a she or a he, but have the impression it is an old woman in a rocker. She is shaking her head 'no' slowly from side to side. This all puzzles me, but the message comes . . . 'you'll know when the time comes, and you are standing before this set of large windows looking out over the activity below.'

So, it left my mind. On March 15th, or soon thereafter, I told Dot and Jay and a couple of others about this.

On March 24th, just ten days later, Harold and I went to Jackson to get a foot-plate to help Harold walk better. The address took us into a building I had never been in before. After he got the plate, we planned to go to the City Bank to extend the mortgage on our car so we could borrow some money on it. While I was waiting for Harold to be fitted, I found myself in front of this large set of windows. It all came back to me so vividly . . . like a flash . . . so we did NOT borrow any money. The next day we re-ceived word of winning that car payment. How about that?

the Feast of Assumption.

As the pilgrims wended their way through some of the most beautiful Roman ruins in the world, probably many of them did not know that a vision made such a trip possible. The vision even occurred in another country, at another time.

The faithful were making their way to the chapel called "Panaya Kapulu." It is said to be standing on the site of the house where, according to one tradition, the Virgin Mary died. It is near the place of her burial and the Assumption.

After the death of the Christ, legends sprang up in various



places. However, historically, it is known that the mother of Jesus did leave her home in Palestine. It is believed that in the company of a few faithful followers, and one of the disciples, they landed in Ephesus. The legend persisted, and then was almost forgotten.

Anna Katharine Emmarick, a stigmatic German nun, had a vision concerning the place where the home of the Virgin Mary would be found. She described it so accurately that John Gouyet, a French priest and Biblical scholar, was able to find the site. Anna died in 1824.





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PART I

Many readers have become familiar in the past decade with stories of strange and unaccountable disappearances of people in plain view of horrified relatives or other witnesses. One victim walked across the solid ground of an open field in broad daylight and "melted" into thin air, but his wife and children were able to hear his voice calling frantically to them for many weeks following this gruesome event. Another man disappeared from a tree top as his terrified wife watched his body apparently disintegrate, inch by inch, and slip into the void above. A school-girl was seen suddenly to be lifted by invisible forces into the air almost forty feet and then drop back to the ground, her broken body gasping for its last breath at the feet of her frightened play-mates. Details of these, and other well-documented cases, have all been published in magazines, newspapers, and books. About a year ago. TV watchers on the "Alcoa Hour" were shaken by the equally true story of the mysterious disappearances of several people in an old house in Connecticut.

Where did they go? More im-

portant - how? What conceals the truth?

With only one exception these men and women seem to have been snatched bodily by unseen hands and transported from this plane of existence. Or did they, in some unexplained manner, suffer an incoluntary dematerialization of their bodies and "step" up into another dimension? "Step." as I use it here. has a special meaning. The victims, if we may refer to them as such, may have somehow raised the vibratory rates of their body cells to a point of psycho-physical ecstasy like that of the rapture so devoutly anticipated by the religious of all creeds in every century. The rapture is an event which is expected to take place only upon the return of the Son of God for his faithful followers. However. many inexplicable phenomena occur which seemingly contradict prophecy and most certainly baffle all seekers of truth. So why can't we assume that perhaps some people may, on their own initiative or on the initiative of some greater and invisible power operating upon them and within them, bring about conditions conducive to the rapture or transport?

Transport? Semantics is not the veil, but it may be the "glass through which we see darkly,3 learned by consulting Webster for the meaning of this noun. Current usage has long obscured the old meaning, "a change or trans-formation," which is pertinent to our inquiry. Of rapture, he says, 'Act of seizing and carrying off by force; specifically abduction." Obsolete meaning? So much the better for our inquiry. Read on in Webster! "Raptus. Noun, Latin; a seizing, carrying off, (from rapere, to seize) . . . a state of trance or of spiritual eestasy accompanied by anaesthetic bodily conditions." Re-

member those last three words well, and bear with me for one more definition, "Rapt. Verb, transitive. Seized and transported up or away, especially into other worlds . . . hurried away or along . . . used literally or figuratively. (My italies).

Clues as to how.

Are there also clues as to where? II Kings gives us one in 2:11 as we stand for a moment with two great prophets, Elisha and Elijah, by the Jordan, in 896 B.C., as the elder prophet prepares to leave this planet. Then, "And it came to pass, as they . . . talked, that, behold, there appeared a chariot of fire, and parted them asunder; and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven." The Bible tells us Elijah was translated. Translated? Webster says, "1. to change from one place, condition, etc., to another; to carry over:" (My italics). He was not found after a three day search by the "sons of the prophets," but a clue is left to us in II Kings 2:16 as they pleaded with Elisha. "And they said unto him, Behold now, there be with thy servants fifty strong men; let them go, we pray thee, and seek thy master: lest the Spirit of the Lord hath

taken him up, and cast him upon some mountain, or into some valley And he said, Ye shall not

Even as Elisha knew it was useless to search for Elijah, we should know there is no need of searching for people who are known to have actually disappeared or dematerialized, as in the modern cases cited. For by supernatural means, and for reasons only partly evident, they have been removed from among us and presumably returned to their Creator.

These disappearances - very sobering phenomena to a thoughtful person - are to be distinguished from teleportation in which the object to be moved is first dematerialized, then "moved" to another location and materialized, a magic art the visible effects of which I have been privileged to witness on several occasions. None of these people was levitated, either, in the true sense of the word. I am personally acquainted with four people who have been levitated, one of them my own wife, and none of them suffered any violence. In every instance the levitated individual was gently set down to earth without injury, although one of them was badly frightened by his experience.

Of all the persons who were actually transported - not teleported or levitated - only the young schoolgirl returned, or was precipitated, back to earth ("cast . . . into some valley?") but her unobstructed fall fatally injured her and precluded the possibility of intelligent questioning. She died. Others vanished. The rapture of God?

In order to shed some light on the meaning of these previously unexplained disappearances of people, I shall have to diverge from the subject for a moment and recount some very strange experi-ences of mine which took place over a long period of years, and which at first will appear to be entirely unrelated to the subject. I am going to divulge personal experiences which, to the best of my knowledge, no one witnessed, and therefore cannot be corroborated, except in one instance. I do not ask any one to believe them, because, without having experienced them, I, myself, would find it difficult even to imagine, let alone understand, the fantastic phenomena to which I fell prey, if another were to allude that such had happened to him. Neverthe-

less, my experiences fit into the puzzle, provocatively adding to it. yet hinting the solution.

The first occurred in the quiet hours of early morning some fifteen years ago as I slept soundly. It was not like a dream, but very real and sharp in every detail. I got out of bed and walked over to the dresser. As I approached the dresser I saw a figure which I naturally assumed was myself reflected rather clearly in the mirror. a strange thing indeed in the dark of the night, but this did not disturb me nearly as much as the fact that I thought I must be sleepwalking, and I was quite chagrined at my unusual behavior. A deep impulse drew me toward the dresser. I was sufficiently "awake" now to sense the odd implications of the situation. A sleep-walker aware of his movement, vet unable to do the logical thing and go right back to bed! I was drawn irresistibly toward the mirror. Then to my utter amazement 1 found myself face to face with one of the most wonderful beings I have ever seen. Startled at the vision of another face where mine should have been reflected, I found myself fully conscious, my heart pounding with a deep joyful excitement.

It was much too dark to see anything, but there was someone, not myself, plainly visible, looking at me with a friendly, calm, reassuring smile. He was not merely a hand-some man. I sensed that "He," (or IT?) possessed the attributes of a Superior Being. It is almost a sin to attempt a description but I must in order to establish the contrast between The Person I saw in the mirror and myself. I had a very thin face, sunken temples, gray hair, but very little of it, and an almost perpetually dejected appearance due to an asthmatic condition of many years standing. Yet

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I don't know what impelled me to make the next move, but almost unthinkingly I picked up my hairbrush and started brushing my hair. If I was stunned by the appearance of the strange face in the mirror, one might say I was completely shattered by the discovery that I was running the brush through a heavy head of shoulderlength hair and feeling a strong pull on my scalp! There was a merry twinkle in the friendly eyes.

Up to now I had been speechless with astonishment, but the situation had become so incongruous that I did a perfectly natural thing; I asked, somewhat reverently, as though I were a little child being granted an audience before majesty, "Who are you?"

The twinkle in those lovely eyes changed slowly and they became very serious. The smiling face was gradually transformed into an earnest, thoughtful countenance as though its owner were preparing a deliberate and unforgettable answer for the man standing in front of the mirror. Then came this

Sp. I know ghosts and I know spirits.

Dr. They both mean the same thing. (Taking hand of psychic.)

Sp. Say, it's not nice for a man to hold another man's hand. If you want to hold hands, get hold of some lady's hand and hold that. Men don't hold each other's hands, -that's cold joy.

we must obey, just as we must meet conditions to bring in a television program.

Most of the time we were talking I held Ralph's hands in mine. A few times I had to release them, for the violent shaking kept my hands shaking also and it was too much for my nerves to endure constantly. I received quite a lesson as to the torture the nerves of Ralph's body had to take hour after hour from this involuntary trembling. I knew that if I were to be the channel for spirit forces to heal Ralph, I must hold his hands in mine until that trembling stopped. We both agreed we would hold hands until the hands shook no more.

Every day I receive letter's asking me how to pray for healing. People even ask me to write prayers for them that they may repeat in seeking healing. I think I do not ever use the same prayer twice. I do use certain verses of Scripture over and over in almost every healing service. I will give a few of the verses I quoted that day while Ralph and I prayed together. For my authority to heal, I quote:

"I tell you . . . whoever believes in Me will do such things as I do, and things greater yet, because I am going to the Father." John 14:12. That Christ meant by things, His miracles of healing is clear. The Greek word 'ergon' translated 'things' also means 'works'. It is used by Christ in John 9:3, when He healed a man blind from birth. and called the miracle of healing manifested works (ergon) of God.

That with God there are no impossible cases, even "shaking palsy", is promised us in Mark 9:23. "Everything is possible for one who has FAITH." Since Christ in this instance was answering the question of a heartbroken father, it would have been a cruel lie to have promised healing if it could not be done.

To hold the hands of a man with shaking palsy and expect those hands to stop shaking after ten years of trembling, one must believe in a mighty power. That there is a mighty power available is assured us in Matthew 21:21 and 22. when Christ says: "I tell you, if you have faith and have no doubt. you will not only do what I have done to the fig tree, but even if you say to this mountain, 'Get up and throw yourself into the sea. it will be done. And everything you pray for with faith, you will

It was about one o'clock in the afternoon when we began our prayer and healing effort. After starting to pray, I never released Ralph's hands. Patiently, Ralph sat with eyes closed and made not a move, except that constant shaking of his big hands in mine. We both lost all track of time by the clock. We were tuning in on God's timepiece of healing. I do not know how long we had prayed when I noticed a slight easing of the trembling. I felt one finger in Ralph's hand stop shaking. We continued praying, and after a while I knew that a second finger was still. So it came to pass . . one by one a finger in each hand would become calm. Finally, both of his entire hands were still, resting in mine, except for his two little fingers. They kept up a rhythmical action. Then, as we prayed on; I felt the little fingers slowing down their beat. They became quiet also, and the shaking palsy stopped! I looked at the clock on my old walnut desk and saw we had been in prayer for four hours and fifteen minutes.

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LESSONS FOR STUDENTS.

"THE SILENCE" Continued

One admonition is necessary here to the beginner because of the always present sense of urgency and eagerness to develop. Try to realize that over-enthusiasm only will retard your development. Curb impatience. School yourself to quietness of spirit. Sit only two or three times a week, and then for only short periods of time. Gradually these may be extended to a daily period of going into the silence. The length of time spent in meditation may be lengthened gradually. Remember that the new student is much like a child learning to walk . . . the desire to try, the bumps, the falling down, the trying again, the taking of one faltering step after another until experience brings confidence and bal-

Never, under any circumstances or persuasion sit "just to see what you can get." This frivolous atti-tude of mind will draw, through the immutable Law of Correspondences, frivolous and irresponsible types of spirits, whose influences only can prove harmful. Too many persons attempting to "play" with psychic power have found themselves possessed of conditions of which they fervently desired to be

While sitting in the silence (or out of it, too), should any evil or malicious thought cross the mind, dismiss it instantly. Erase it from the consciousness with a thought of beauty, love and good. Jesus, in His hours of agony and testings said, "Get thee behind me Satan," and we must learn to use positive good in the repelling of negation or evil. This practice, persistently used, eventually will become our greatest protection, for low or undeveloped spirits will not bother with those they cannot impress or use.

If the desire for true spiritual progress is sincere, one will not become discouraged if nothing apparent happens the first few times. Often we are being tested by the spirits as to our sincerity. Often we need these hours to make the necessary adjustments to higher frequencies. Whatever the cause of the apparent inability to establish psychic contact, we may be comforted by the knowledge that in these quiet periods our bodies have been replenished and our minds brought under better control. Our nerves and emotions also will be found to be less "jumpy" and irritable, and those problems so common to all the human race, mysteriously will have found their proper perspective and their simple solution more obvious. These are the material rewards of the silence.

The spiritual rewards may be longer in attainment, yet when the hours of silence are kept faithfully, and when the time is right, the spiritual development, which is our natural birthright . . . and which all upward evolving souls desire, will be manifested. Some will find that results are obtained at the very first sitting. This is probably due to previous soul growth, for nothing comes to any individual except that which is honestly earned. The first tangible evidence of spirit manifestation probably will be the discernment of changing vibrations around the sitter. One may feel cold waves, or there may be a shivering sensation. (A psychic shiver does not make a medium, however.) This is caused usually by the changing vibratory rate, and may be followed by the visible presence of ectoplasmic force. One may see lights, either golden or colored, and of various sizes and density. Faces may appear, or voices be heard. Perhaps music will be perceptible dimly. Any one of a number of things may happen during this period of silence.

Yet not all receive such physical phenomena, but rather derive their greatest benefits from the guidance and higher philosophies received during their periods of silence. Just as no one on earth is capable of becoming proficient in all the phases of daily living, so no person should expect to develop all the phases of spiritual gifts. Each has his own particular channel, his own gift from God to use and magnify. Each must accept the gift which is his, without regret or resentment over the fact that another has developed along different lines than his own. God put us all where He, with His greater wisdom, knew we could accomp-lish the most good. The essence of true humility and spirituality lies in accepting and using one's own particular gift to the utmost.

Our period of silence should leave us feeling uplifted and blessed, refreshed in body and refilled as to spirit. In fact, all contact with spirit, if it is to be of benefit, must leave us with an aftermath of good. Anything which leaves an individual drained of vitality or lowered in mind, should be discontinued at once. This is important.

One of the first tests of growing mediumship will be in learning to distinguish true manifestation from those which are false, or merely "wish fulfillments." It is inevitable

that mistakes will be made, for the conscious mind plays many tricks, and we must keep firmly to our resolution not to be deceived, but to accept only the highest and the true. Experience is the only guide here. Eventually the true manifestation will emerge clearly and unmistakably from the psychic mass.

Train yourself rigidly, and the reward will be shown later in accurate mediumship. Do not allow eagerness to override caution at this point, for this decision will influence and color all your work hereafter. Remember that God never gave any soul a task to perform without also arranging that it should have sufficient time in which to acomplish it.

1. Go into the silence earnestly

and prayerfully. 2. Breathe deeply, using af-

firmations. 3. Sit only two or three times

weekly, then as experience dictates, daily.

4. Sit at the same time, in the same room and chair.

5. Keep the mental faculties alert, while relaxing the body. Terminate the sitting at once if drowsiness comes.

6. Never allow trance unless experienced and capable persons are present.

Hundreds of stories are told of how the invisible helpers can go instantly to any place on earth, exercise their occult powers either as invisible or visible beings to heal the sick, stop suicides, resurrect the dead, rescue the ship-wrecked, save people from wild animals, and bring much needed help in all kinds of calamities.

If rightly used, the work of the invisible helpers can be spiritual dynamite to blast a way to human betterment. Reading this book as a textbook of instructions, it can be considered a course on "how to" work with and become one of those helpers working on the unseen planes to help those in distress.

Thinking for oneself develops individuality. This is the prize of life; it is the treasure of the spirit. It is immortal. Death cannot touch it, and eternity but gives it the setting for its fullest expression.

individuals, but we may be sure that the over-all picture of the "after life" is accurate enough for our purposes. We know that death is as much a part of the Great Plan of Creation as is birth. Each one of us must experience both, and they are equally good and equally necessary in their right place and at the right time. We can expect the next phase of life to be under the same good and perfeet law. The love and growth and protection we experience here is certain to continue over there. Under normal conditions, death is good when it comes.

If we can avoid carrying over with us in death a set of baseless and dogmatic fears, such as the fear of hell, we can proceed easily, safely, and with pleasure in the new freedom from the wear and tear of life in the physical body as we progress in this new stage of our evolution.

On the other hand, if one passes over convinced that death of the body is the end of life for him, he may become "earth-bound." In such a case, the one who has died cannot change his ideas of the after-death state. To him there may be no such state at all, and he may try for a very long time to get back into physical life by stealing the body of someone in the flesh. Failing this, he may attach himself to a living person and share his life vicariously as a "secondary personality." Such cases are frequently recorded in psychological textbooks. Sometimes several such spirits share the body of one living person to a greater or lesser extent. In this they have little satisfaction and make little or no evolutionary progress. It is only when, after a considerable time, they give up their former belief that the next world is but a figment of imagination that they can accept the help and guidance of wiser spirits. They can then be initiated into the art of making their own bodies and surroundings, by an act of mind, live in them and begin to grow in experience.

Death is made easier, whenever it may come, if we begin now to think correctly about it. First of all, we need to grow into the firm and serene faith in the love and guidance and endless care of the High Self. If we live the kindly life, we shall avoid the sudden qualms which come to those who fear they are about to die and who have not made amends for their hurting of others.

In the second place, we need to take the necessary steps to put our affairs into proper order so they can be handled by another; have our wills and insurance in as good

shape as is possible; and, if we are engaged in some project, have it continually in as good condition as may be possible for someone else to take over in case death should come accidentally, or unexpectedly.

The third step is the hard one. It is the one in which we make ready as best we may to leave those we love and those who depend upon us for love, care or support. Here we need again to develop the faith that the High Self Father-Mother of each loved one will never fail them, though with all our love we ourselves might falter. True, there would be readjustments and sorrow for them as for ourselves, but there was never a truer saying than that which sounds so cruel, "A hundred years from now it will not matter."

Time is the great healer of hearts, and we have at our disposal all the time there is. If one learns to look at all the sorrows in the light of centuries, instead of days and hours, the picture will clear and the unreal and transitory will fade away, leaving only the sweep of growth and evolution which carries each of us along toward the goal, always under the shadowing wings of the High Selves. Under that wise and loving protection, what is necessary can be done, the lessons learned. After the pain and readjustment are over, there is always the happy reunion with the new beginnings and the new progress. For those who have come to know the love of the High Selves, the difficulties pass quickly. One holds confidently to the hand of the Parental Self and goes happily forward..

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
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
