

Where Are Our So-Called Dead?

(Sermon delivered in the Church of Jesus Christ, Our Redeemer, Kansas City, Mo. Oct. 20, 1935)

Almost every one of us at some time in our life have asked this question: "Where is my beloved dead? Where are all the dead?"

Occasionally one comes to me for a reading, or for spiritual guidance, who say: "I am a queer sort of person. I have no one in the Spirit World. Funny, isn't it? But I haven't anyone at all. All our family are living."

To such a one, I replied the other day: "O, but you do have someone in the Spirit World. If not in this generation, then they belong to generations past. You may not know them. Your parents may not have told you about them—but they are there, grandparents, or great, or great-great grandparents, uncles, aunts, and cousins, loving you, and seeking to draw near to you, and guide you, because you belong to them through blood ties. Then there are friends and even acquaintances of your own generation, who, often indifferent to you here on earthplane, once they reach the Spirit Side of Life, and are able to judge you as God sees you—not the outward appearance, but the heart of you—they sometimes draw closer to you than your own kin. Why? Because they vibrate on the same wave you do—the vibratory wave between you and them may have been dulled, or obscured entirely by materiality, when they were in the mortal body.

Most of us agree with the poet Longfellow when he says:

"There is no flock, however watched and tended, But one dead lamb is there! There is no fireside howsoever defended, But has one vacant chair!"

And it is when we look at our dead lamb, and later, sometimes weeks and months later, when the sight of that vacant chair seems more than we can bear, we cry out in agony, "Where is my loved one?" Like Mary Pick-Pickford, following the passing of her beloved mother and brother, we ache for reassurance that somewhere all is well with our beloved.

Tonight, God willing, I shall try to prove to you that it is well with your loved ones, passed out of the body, and that they are ever near you, more vitally alive than when in their fleshy body. And, they, in turn, are aching to reassure you that God's promise of life everlasting is being fulfilled in them this very moment.

I came across a booket last week titled "Where Are The Dead?" Always eager to learn the opinions of others, I read much, pro and con, on religious subjects, to keep an open mind. I always come back to Christian Spiritualism as the Christ religion for me, and intended, I am sure, for everyone else.

The author of this booklet broadcasts radio sermons all over the country When I read his answer to "Where Are The Dead?" I decided then and there, to try to give the Christian Spiritualist's reply to that question. Only I call my title, "Where Are The So-Called Dead?" for all human souls are

created by God, and are eternal. When, later, they are taken out of the fleshy body, they cannot be called dead because of their God-given immortality of soul. God created each of us in His own likeness and image, therefore, we must be, as the Bible tells us, as He is—immortal souls from the beginning, and we cannot die. If the world in general insists on calling these people out of the mortal body "dead", then we Christian Spiritualists as emphatically insist that they should be termed the "so -called dead".

This author's answer to humanity's all-absorbing, vital question is this: "These Scriptures prove conclusively that when a man dies he knows not anything; that when dead he has no knowledge or wisdom, and does not work; that he has no memory; that he is in a condition of silence." A little farther on, this author says: "No man has a soul. Every man has a soul. God lid not make a man and then put a soul in him, as the preachers tell us. This is the way He made man, as stated in Gen. 2:7, God made man's body of the earth. Then God breathed into his nostrils the breath that all living creatures preathe, and this animated the body, and man stood up and lived. All the inimals are designated as souls. A cow is a soul. An ox is a soul." Now, our Bible says, Gen. 2:7-"And the Lord God formed man(that is, his fleshy body) of the dust of the ground, breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul." There it is-read it for yourself. And then turn back to Gen. 1:27-"So God created man in His own image, in the image of God created He him; male and female created He them." God does not say He created animals as souls. But He does say in the next verse, the 28th, that He gives man dominion over every living thing that meyeth upon the earth. And when one is given dominion-made a ruler-over others-that one is in some way superior to those he rules. I take it that since we created in God's image-which means we have eternal life and we are given dominion over all animals, then we have a soul a part of the Divine Intellect of the Godhead-and as a child of God, created in His likeness, the Spirit of Life within us is the Spirit of the Almighty, immortal, everlasing.

This writer seems to deem it very necessary to show that both man and animal have souls, and both, at the death of the fleshy body, go to the same place—the silence of the grave. This man goes on to say: "The preachers have made people believe that a man carries a soul around in him and that when he dies the soul hikes off to some other place. But there is absolutely no support for such a contention."

I am going to show you where there is absolute proof for such a statement, that man has a soul- an immortal soul—and that his greatest work is ahead of him—in the Spirit World—working out his own progression, and helping other spirits who need development, and reaching back to the earthplane through some medium to aid suffering, sorrowing humanity. Also I am going to prove to you that we Christian Spiritualists know where our so-called dead are, and we thank God daily that they can return to reassure us. We cannot go to them unless we are a Christian medium qualified to go out into the Astral Plane, and meet them on the higher planes of the Heaven land. But they, at any time, if they choose, and the conditions are right, can come to us.

The Spirit World is everywhere—in every space around about us. This Spirit World is divided into spheres. And between it and our earthplane is a gateway through which every soul, when it leaves the body, must pass. This gateway is called the Earth Bound Sphere, and extends out about fifty miles from and encircling the earthplane. You can vision how large it is by the stratosphere's record of eleven miles up in the ether. Compare that with fifty miles, and you will have an idea of the space occupied by the Earth Bound area. Conon Doyle, in his book, "The Vital Message", says: "The Bible talks about the "Outer darkness where there is weeping and gnashing of teeth". This "outer darkness" and the third heaven which Paul mentions in 2 Cor. 12:2 corresponds with the Astral Plane of the mystic, and is the Earth Bound Sphere of the Spiritualist, the gateway between this earth and the Heavenly Realms.

Beyond this gateway begins the First Sphere of the Spirit World. In all there are eight spheres in God's Kingdom. Rose, the Sunlight, one of my higher guides, and wife of Dr. Carson, head of the Spirit Healing Force in this church, says that the first five spheres are called the Spirit World. The remaining three constitute Heaven. In the Eighth, or Celestial Sphere, there are more degrees of spiritual development than in all the others put together. A spirit may be in that sphere thousands of years, ever progressing, attaining one degree after another, only to find there are always still higher degrees. The perfection of Spirit is below the perfection of Angelhood. and the perfection of Angelhood is below the perfection of Masterhood There is, also, a perfection beyond that of Masterhood, and—still higher degrees of perfection beyond that. There is degree after degree leading to the highest achievement. Man in the mortal body cannot concieve of the spiritual perfection to which man in the spirit body can achieve.

When man leaves his physical body, he goes straightway to the place for which he has prepared himself. God is ever just, ever merciful. Whatever a man sows here, he reaps hereafter. Always he is a free agent to choose whether he will follow the path that leads straight back to God, from Whom he came and to Whom he will eventually return; or, if he will take a side road—a detour—and only find the right path later in life—or possibly, not until he passes to the Spirit Side. If the latter is the case, then that man. now a spirit, tarries a while in the Earth Bound Sphere. How long he tarries depends upon the sort of life he lived in the earthplane, and his readiness to ask for help. Jesus the Christ says, "Ask and it shall be given you; seek and ve shall find." Always there are Ministering Angels eager to help us here or after we pass out of the mortal body, when we are ready for The Way, The Truth, and The Light, and we humble ourselves to ask for it. Some spirits will tell you they have been years, even centuries, earth bound. Othersthose who have endeavored to live as best they knew how under the circumstances-pass so swiftly through this sphere, they hardly know they do so. Their first stop is in the First Plane, from which they begin their progression upward. This First Sphere, Spirits tell us, is so much more beautiful than any idea of Heaven we can visualize that many prefer to tarry there rather than leave friends and kin who need to spend some additional time there.

A spirit has a choice of four modes of progression. He may remain in the First Sphere, and meet the bewildered spirits sent out of the body too quickly, as in case of accident, murder, or war. These pitiful souls are often unprepared for the Higher Life.. Or, a spirit may become a teacher, or a guide to other spirits over there; or, he may aid humanity by reaching back with his message, through a proper instrument—a medium; or, he may choose to learn of the higher teachers in Spirit, and spend all his time progressing upward. Most spirits choose to serve humanity, bringing heal ng. messages of advise and comfort, or inspiration to mortals for the creation of works of art and invention. You are ever a free agent, here and hereafter, to **choose what you will.**

Those on the Spirit Side of Life marvel at the mighty Washington and Lincoln remaining in the Fourh Sphere, by choice, knowing their country has need of their services. Those two patriots are regarded as very high spirits over there, yet they place service—national service—above the desire to go on to the higher planes to which they have earned the right to enter.

Many modern Orthodox ministers believe in spirit return. Dr. Hargett, in his radio service for the Council of Churches over WDAF, Friday morning of the past week, (10-18-35), preached a typical Christian Spiritualist sermon. He said that he, a minister, knew that there was communication between us and God and those above. Then he spoke of his mother, out of the mortal body twenty-four years. He said he knew she had been with him all those years for he felt her presence. The whole sermon could have been preached from this pulpit, and not a word of it at variance with our Christian Spiritualist belief.

Another famous preacher, Dr. Alexander Maclaren said, "The dead are the living. Every man that has died is at this instant in full possession of all of his faculties, in the intensest exercise of all his capacities, standing somewhere in God's universe, ringed by a sense of God's presence, and feeling in every fibre of his being that life, which comes after death, is not less real, but more real, not less great, but more great, not less full or intense, but more full and intense than the mingled life, which lived here on earth, was a center of life, surrounded by a crust and circumference of immorality. The dead are they who lived while they died; after they die, they live forever,"

If we but half try to live God's Law, while here on the earthplane, we shall be rewarded accordingly. The thief crucified on Calvary with the Christ is an example of the ready forgiveness of our Lord, when he asked sincerely "Lord, remember me when Thou comest into Thy Kingdom", and Jesus answered and said, 'Verily, I say unto thee, Today thou shalt be with Me in Paradise'."

The Orthodox church considers Paradise and Heaven synonomous, but we Christian Spiritualists know that Paradise is but the First Realm—the first step—to a greater, a more Celestial Heaven in store for us, and to which we must work our way before we can draw nigh to and realize the Presence of the Supreme God.

In 1 Cor. 15:44, Paul tells us our body "is sown a natural body; and it is raised a spiritual body." Also, in the same chapter, 50th verse, it says, "flesh (Continued on page 26)

Spiritualism's Challenge

By

(Sermon delivered in the Church of Jesus Christ, Our Redeemer, Kansas City, Mo., Sept. 19, 1937.)

The priceless knowledge and proof of immorality and constant spirit communication is no where more clearly and convincingly laid before the general public than in Dr. Edwin F. Bower's latest volume "Spiritualism's Challenge". The author presents conclusive evidence of survival, gleamed over a period of 35 years of investigation and study in which his own loved ones as well as beloved guides gave numerous, unchallenged demonstrations of the continuity of spirit existence after the death of the mortal body.

Dr. Bowers assures us his "book is not a defense of Spiritualism. For Spiritualism needs no defense. It is a challenge." He tells us what every Christian Spiritualist knows—that Christianity is based upon spiritistic phenomena, and a medium duplicates, in more or less perfect demonstrations these same manifestations, many of which are recorded in our Bible, and accepted and preached, without question, by the Orthodox. Yet when a modern seer endeavors to demonstrate that the power of the holy Spirit, manifested constantly in the seance room, is the same yesterday today and forever, these ()rthodox fanatics decry the results of facts about which they do not know even the fundamentals, the A. B.Cs.

Speaking of materialization, the author says: "To my mind the exact duplication of the body, the features, the speech, the photographic memory and identical personality of a man or woman whose physical body has long since been eaten by the grave worm, or incinerated into a few handfulln of ashes, is the most astonishing of all the miracles of psychic phenomena.

To see a man, in a fair ruby light, step from a cabinet, walk over to you even though you may be a dozen feet from the cabinet—give you a good strong hug or a hearty handshake, talk with you in a natural resonant tone of voice about events that prove him to have retained a perfect memory for details, and after a few minutes bid you a cheerful 'good bye', dissolve into the fog of dematerialization before your eyes and sink through the floor, is an absolutely unforgetable experience....Convincing and authentic materializations are admittedly rare. But they are to be met with occasionally. When they are, they will be found to be among the most marvelous and instructive experiences that can ever come to a living being. Pretenders there are and will be, but the real thing does exist."

Dr. Bowers had the thrilling experience of holding to his breast the fully materialized spirit of his mother, hearing her dear voice with its familiar Irish brogue, and feeling her kisses on his cheek. In June, 1935, he again contacted the fully materialized form of his mother, and in the presence of 17 people and 2 mediums,—Mrs. Ethel Post and Frank Decker—he cut from the head of his mother a lock of hair, 9 years after her body was laid to rest. This spirit mother took her son's left hand and guided it until it came in contact with her scalp. Separating a lock from her heavy mass of hair, she brought his right hand, which held the scissors, up to the lock of hair, and said, "Cut it here." He snipped off a lock of about 200 separate hairs (Continued on page 14)

about 3 inches in length. Later this lock of gray hair was examined by expert microsciopists, and it was found to conform, in every respect, with human hair. When touched with the flame of a match, the hair "burned identically as human hair would burn." To further block doubt as to the materialized spirit being one of the two mediums or some one else in the room, the author adds that Decker's hair is black and Mrs. Post's only faintly streaked with gray, while the lock cut from his mother's was almost white.

One of the most marvelous demonstrations recorded is that of experiences with "censigol gass", a peculiar gas unknown to scientists on this earth, which was discovered by the spirit guides of Frank Decker, and when used on him gives him exceptional powers which are steadily increasing. This censigol chemicalized gas is found in the center of the solar-plexus system, and orginally was extracted from the surrounding air, just as one flower draws those chemicals which produce red. Decker is a magnet, helping Spirit to draw this gas, mixed with his own ectoplasm, and the teleplasm from his sitters, causing the latter and the whole seance room, and all in it to vibrate as though in a medical vibrating machine. "We combine this gas (or chemical)'," Dr. Wilbur Stoddard, Decker's chemist, says, " with other chemicals which you are all giving out with every breath, and with it we produce the phenomena."

Some of you will remember Thomas A. Edison's promise to me to demonstrate a similar invention of his. The great Edison is now working on an invention whereby mediums may acquire the necessary chemicalization and vibration for phenomena in a much shorter time than has ever before been possible. He states I am to be the first developing medium to be given this henor, and that my students may demonstrate to the world the speed with which Spirit can develop mediumship. I pray God I may prove a perfect instrument for his purpose.

Farmer Riley, who was a master materializing medium when in the mortal body and Patsy, a young boy, two of Decker's guides, demonstrated splendid levitation and other marvelous phenomena that converted intolerant agnostics into dyed-in-the-wool Spiritualists. Patsy displayed marvelous harmonica technique, while the latter was held tightly in Dr. Bower's hand. The lad, too, could use the telephone, which he did one night in March, 1935, lifting the receiver and distinctly calling a number. The voice of the operator was heard answering the call, and Patsy was plugged in on a spectator's home phone, held a conversation with a mutual friend and his wife, then turned the receiver over to the auditor, who finished the conversation as a demonstration of what Decker's guides could accomplish when mortals cooperated. This experience was a demonstration of materialization, independent voice, and telekinesis. The author, eager to share his spirit experiences with others, wishes every one in the world could have a similar experience.

Spirit Master Masons materialized and gave signs, grips, and words as perfectly as from a brother in earth life. Farmer Riley was chosen by Spirit to demostrate this convincing phase because he was not a Mason, and thus the public could not say the medium was doing it. Conon Doyle materialized and demonstrated apport, by presenting one of the sitters, who had known him in the mortal, with an Egyptian scarab, evidently used as a seal on a

ring, and brought by Doyle from his collection in London. The demonstration was an example of the swiftness of spirit travel. One moment Doyle materialized in the seance room, and the next, after asking his earthly friend to wait a bit, disappeared. In a few minutes, Doyle returned with the apport most likely having gone to London, secured the scarab from his collection there, and returned in those few minutes.

Many more wonderial demonstrations of psychic manifestations are recorded, every one of which is a direct challenge to the ignorance and intolerance of those who deny and doubt the survival of our personalities after the so-called death. We haven't the time tonight to present more of this interesting personal record of investigation by one who does not refer us to past history of Spiritualism's challenge, but is able to give us names of mednums now living in the mortal body, and able to duplicate these psychic experiences.

The author, in answer to the question so often raised: "Why can't I receive messages myself?" gives us some very good advise, which I wish to pass on to you would-be mediums.

"Why do I have to go to a medium, who doesn't know my dear ones, nor cares a rap about what they mean to me?" There are two answers to this question, Dr. Bowers tells us. The first answer is another question. The question is why can't you **communicate directly** with those you wish to address and dispense with such stupid circumlocutory mediums as the mail, telephone or wireless telephone, telegraph, radio, heliograph, drum or flag signaling, semaphore, the deaf and dumb alphabet and Braile system, in order to communicate with one another?

The second answer is you can communicate directly with your loved ones. That is, you can, if you will equip yourself to receive these communications.. And if you happen to be a medium, even though an undeveloped one. But remember that true mediums are born, not made. And that very few persons-perhaps not more than one in one hundred thousand-has real mediumistic ability. These relative few may be trained or developed for mediumship, ... However, each of us is psychic, even though very few of us are mediums. And as psychics we can develop spiritual faculties, by using the methods proven most effective. These psychic powers are **inborn**—common to every man, woman, and child of normal mental development. Under certain conditions they can be developed so that we can hear clairaudiently, see clairvoyantly, and feel clairsentiently. . . As a rule, the great majority of well qualified mediums have had to "sit" for a long period of years, and sometimes give up many hours of time each day, before they came into their full power. Indeed, many mediums have found it necessary to continue their development even after they have gained national recognition... If you really desire to become a medium-granting that you possess mediumistic potentialities- you must approach this goal in the proper frame of mind. Remember, you are entering a field hitherto unexplored by your earthly senses. And in so doing you must become subject to its laws. You must go as suppliant-with humility and love not as a conqueror demanding proof. You must forget yourself, and seek to contact only the best. And right here, we might emphasize that while 'home development' or 's'tting alone', have frequently brought astonishing satisfactory results, you may be taking a foolhardy risk in throwing the doors of your consciousness wide open to any disembodied intelligence who may chance to be attracted by your invitation to come in and make himself

The God Who Speaks

The Christian Spiritualist knows that daily, hourly, the voice of God speaks to man—if the receptivity of the latter is attuned to the Divine vibration, which, in other words, is the universal vibration. The Christian Spiritualist, for many years, has been laboring single-handed to make this truth of man's proximity to the God-head common knowledge and recongized as a power available and workable **HERE** and **NOW** for all mankind.

It is a source of satisfaction, and one of great encouragement to discover that the provost of Queen's College, Oxford, England, Dr. Burnett Hillman Streeter, in his recent book, "The God Who Speaks," holds similar views. The author says: "We must discard the notions (a) that God thinks only in terms astronomic magnitudes; (b) that He cannot be concern with trifles; (c) that God and His activities may only be named in vague and abstract terms."

Then he makes this statement: "Between God's plan and mine there can be no compromise." Is this not the Christian Spiritualist's belief exactly? Our God is closer than hands and feet, closer than breathing, and certainly He is concerned with our daily affairs as is evidenced by the healing of our physical bodies, often of disease labeled incurable, and His care of us and ours whatever betides. We go direct to our Bible for confirmation of this for in Ex. 3:12, God speaking to Moses, promises him even as He does us today: "Certainly I will be with thee." In Deut. 33:27, Moses says: "The Eternal God is **thy** refuge, and underneath **are** the Everlasting Arms."

Dr. Streeter says: "The existence and character of God cannot be determined by the kind of reasoning by which we establish a historical fact or a scientific hypothesis. As fishes in the ocean, so are we in that all-embracing Reality in which 'we live, and move, and have our being'; and life is an adjustment to that environment. This adjustment must begin long before our power of conscious reflection on it; and it must extend to depths of the personality whict are commonly beyond the reach of such reflection. And only in proportion as there is in the seeker after truth a growing adjustment of the whole personality to that all-bracing ocean of Reality is his intellectual interpretation of it likely to be on the right lines."

We Christian Spiritualists emphasize the desire to do the will of God, the Almighty. We pray constantly, "Thy will, not mine, be done," and then we seek to learn what His Will, His Law, for us, individually, is, and we endeavor to do it His Way, and when He gives us the opportunity. Dr Streeter recognized this when he states: "A sincere attempt to do the Will of God will be a preliminary condition of knowing of the teaching whether it is true. The way to a knowledge of God will be through a re-orientation of purpose and desire, a constant re-dedication of the self to the highest that it knows." Every Christian Spiritualist should memorize that statement, and repeat it daily.

Continuing, the author reasons: "If that be so, we should expect to find that, at a certain point of Spiritual development, the personality will be sufficiently sensitive to the influence of the Divine to reach an awareness of God's Will which may find expression through a voice within." Isaiah (30:-21) speaks of this: "Thine ears shall hear a word behind thee saying, This is the Way, walk ye in it, when ye turn to the right hand, and when ye turn to the left hand."

Again this author is in line with the Christian Spiritualist belief when he writes: "-- provided always certain conditions are fulfilled, this voice within ought to be regarded as an automatic communication from the Divine dimmed, no doubt, and at times distorted by limitions in the mental and moral devenpment of the individual and his age, The evidence for this contention is made progressively clearer by historical study of that unique develoment of religion of which the Bible is our record, if this be taken in connection with and illuminated by certain phenomena exhibited in the lives of religious men through all the ages and in the present day." This fact, too, the Christian Spiritualist recognized and endeavor to comply with, if he would reap a worthwhile psychic development. You must be clear morally and physically. Do not limit your spiritual progression by lack of preparation for the biggest event that can possibly come into your life. A clean mind and a clean body, first; then "study", as Timothy advises, "to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." Prepare yourself by study that you may be qualified to interpret the Bible to others, and to demonstrate psychic phenomena truthfully and beautifully, at all times. Then, and then only, will God speak to you, through Spirit instruments or direct.

"Thus saith the Lord", the prohets of old reiterate. "The Word of the Lord came to me".thus saith the High and Lofty One that dwelleth in Eter-Eternity, Whose Name is Holy", "thus saith the Lord of Hosts". The child Samuel was a predestined priest of God, for 'the word of the Lord was precious in those days', (even as it is now, Christian Spiritualists..) and the Lord called to Samuel three times. The child "did not yet know the Lord neither was the Word of the Lord yet revealed unto him". How like our present day lack of knowledge! The Lord comes, and stands, and calls and we hear Him not because we do not know him; He has not been revealed to us.

Dr. Streeter says:—belief that God has a plan for each individual life, and nothing which affects that life is insignificient, demands not only intelligence, but an intelligent use of the imagination." The learned doctor believes that the individual, his suffering, and his doings matter much to the Power that produces and controls this earth. God, in Dr. Streeter's opinion, "differs from man precisely in the fact that he can give attention to everything, everywhere, always, and all at once." The Christian Spiritualist differs from this believe in that he knows, through contact with Spirit Realm, that every desire and every unuttered, prayerful thought wings its way straight to God, the Almighty. He hears, and He answers every call, but not personally. If He did answer personally there would be no work for the Angel and Spirit Worlds to perform, no opportunity for the spirits to serve mankind, and earn their evolvement up to higher planes. The sole purpose of any spirit's existence is that that spirit may develop a spiritual character, here

and hereafter. God, when He hears our pleas, gives His Will to the Son, the Mediator between the Father and us, His children. His Son passes God's Word on to the Angel World, and they in turn, give it to the Spirit World, our loved ones out of the mortal body. The latter give it direct to us, or if contact is not possible, they express God's Will for us through some earth channel—some medium, who is a willing instrument, a messenger of hopeful expectation and comfort in our need.

Quoting Mr. Streeter again: "—the idea that God has a plan for the working out of which man may become a willing instrument, comes to one like a flash of lightning in the dark. —There are, it is said, two thousand million in habitants of this globe; so long as everyone goes ahead on his or her own plan, or without any considered plan at all, is it surprising that the result is conflict and confusion? Rather is it not remarkable that things are not worse confounded than they are? Could they go on at all, unless there were some kind of directive influence which, partially, at any rate, counterbalances the stupidities, the egoism, and the iniquities of mankind—unless there were in Shakespeare's phrase, 'a divinity that shapes our ends, rough hew them as we will'?"

The beauty of Nature—which is another name for God—the glory of the heavens; and the wonders of the earth convince us that they are but the expression of an All-wise, All-protecting, All-providing Creator, ever mindful of His own. The Christian Spiritualist's contact with the Heavenly World, the loving supervision of the Spirit Guides, the consoling, truthful prophesies of the Angel messengers, place the believer in spirit phenomena in a position of postive conviction about his future life. Truly, he who has not this soul-satisfying belief is to be pitied. Just to be able to contact our beloved so-called dead in that world, which my father so often tells me is the reality, our earthlife being the dream—just to be cognizant of such a realm is to inherit the Kingdom of Heaven while we are still in the mortal.

Dr. Streeter stresses a beautiful truth—"Christ made possible an attitude, which we may call 'friendship' between God and man; in a sense he brought God down from heaven to earth." Then he says: "The modern world needs re-affirmation—of the conception of God's plan, and until the belief is revitalized that God has a purpose and a plan—not only for the world, but for every individual in it, and for the minutest details in the life of every individual," religion will not be a power.

Could we Christian Spiritualists give a better explanation of the aims of Christian Spiritualism, and the requirements necessary for successful contact with God and the Angel and Spirit World than this amplification of "The God Who Speaks"? From this pulpit you hear over and over again the admonition to learn to make the right condition. Whatever contact you make with the Spirit World depends solely upon the degree of your mental and moral development. Upon the intelligence and the sincerity of your quest will rest the results.

May God add His blessing to this message, and may some soul here, because of it, find The Way, The Truth and The Life that opens the way to "The God Who Speaks".

Hamlin Garland's 40 Yrs. of Psychic Research

Most of us think of Hamlin Garland as a writer of sagas of the Middle West. As an author, he holds a place in the literary world few have attained. So when we Spiritualists learn he has been delving into psychic research work for 40 years, we are surprised and elated for we know, sooner or later, another noted name shall be added to the list of men, high in their profession, who started out expecting to expose the fraud angle of Spiritualism, only to finish their task as converts to the greatest religion the world has ever known, with its knowledge and proof of immortality for every soul.

In 1891, at the age of 31, Hamlin Garland became a member of the American Psychic Research Society. Today, at the age of 75, in his latest volume, "40 Years of Psychic Research" he records his experience in what he terms "subnormal events". The Spiritualist calls them direct spirit communication, pure and simple.

B. O. Flower, the noted Spiritualist, in choosing Mr. Garland as a member of this experimental research organization told the writer the reason they wanted him was because "you are so young, logical in your thoughts, and a close observer. Furthermore, you are not a mourner. You can approach an experiment with an unprejudiced mind."

Up to this time, Mr. Garland had not given spirit communication much thought. He remembered stories his father had told of his mother as a young girl, in the early fifties, acting as a medium. She and her brother, Franklin a child of five, were the chief actors. Settlers from all over the country came to his grandfather's house to investigate the mysterious raps and table moving which seemed to occur of their own volution. Chairs followed Isabelle, Garland's mother, upstairs and little Frank, who could not write or spell, wrote on slates long messages full of cuss words and obscene threats. To the Spiritualist this child's experience is easily explained. When people are beginning their development in the psychic (which was what Isabelle and Frank McClintock were unknowingly doing), their protective bars against undesirable entities are down. The undesirable entities are not always evil spirits, but more often are undeveloped forces seeking to demonstrate their immortality before they are developed or prepared to manifest. The result is that the medium's health and faith are affected, sometimes wrecked, or both the medium and the spectators are so frightened that they want nothing more to do with what Grandfather McClintock called "work of the devil". The Spirit who did the slate writing through the instrumentality of the five-year-old child was evidentally an earthbound soul, and evil as proven by the language used.

One of Hamlin Garland's aunts, whom he describes as a gentle, lovely character, said, "These forces made my life a hell for two years".

We Spiritualists can see instantly that Mr. Garland, through hereditary, was cut out to be a psychic investigator, whether he admits the fact or not. the psychic experience of his mother's family was one of the main factors

in making his decision to join the Research Society.

The Boston papers announced the founding of the organization, and letters from people experiencing psychic mysteries began to pour in. The author says: "I became aware atmost in a day of an amazing world of hidden outlaw forces, a world in which miracles were every day occurances. On reading these letters it seemed possible for me to step at once into this region of the unaccountable. It was at my door—or just across the street."

The author's first experience was with a young girl of a laboring family, all of whom were intelligent, industrious, and pious. "All the members of this family accepted the tappings on the walls and the movement of a dead boy. "It is his way of letting us know that he is still among us, 'his mother explained. She talked to an invisible, intangible son, and the family were so serious of purpose and so happy in their faith that I had no desire to question it in their presence." Mr. Garland writes. "—recalling my father's stories of my mother's similar mediumship, I felt in this circle something of the same religious awe with which my uncles and aunts had approached the sitting in Grandfather's pioneer cabin fifty years before."

Again to the Christian Spiritualist, this demonstration is explainable. "According to your faith," says Jesus. This family approached the manifestatione with deep reverence, and they had absolute faith in the power of their little son to demonstrate. Therefore, he could do so.

Mr. Garland's next venture was with independent slate writing in the light. The medium and her husband, a skilled workman, were young and were in awe of the strange power they had developed. "We want to understand it. We are scared by it," they said.

A pair of hinged school slates, bound together with a strong cord, were held by the medium and Mr. Garland, who was determined to hold them so tightly they could not move. To his surprise they moved so furiously he was afraid they might be broken. When they were opened, a dozen lines of writing done by several different hands were written on the slates. Because none of th messages concerned him, Mr. Garland did not accept the test, thinking there might be a possibility of invisible writing, although the medium was little more than a child and had all the appearance of sincerity.

Materialization tests came next, but his experience was like that of many of us, and he, too, came to the conclusion that "some of the phenomena are genuine but they are so mixed with trickery that I cannot report on them."

Onset Bay, a seaside resort, something like Lily Dale, was Mr. Garland's next investigation. He talked with the elderly folk, from the farm, who had come down to talk with their beloved dead, and he found them so happy in their faith that he did not have the heart to disillusion them. They were serenely confident that their dead were sharing with them the pleasures of the summer outing. "The air is just full of loved ones. They meet us as we meet with them," they told him.

Mr. Flower when told of this colony, asked, "Wouldn't you like to get their religion?"

"Assuredly," Garland answered."-but my faith must be built on the rock of scientific experiment."

"Is there such a rock?" Flower demanded. "We take the so-called facts of science on faith." Then he cited the cocoon turning into a butterfly. "What is the cocoon but a dark cabinet?" Mr. Garland asked Prof. Dolbear, a member of the Society, if he had ever had anything inexplicable happen to him.

"Never but once," he replied. "One morning as I awoke and lay, dozing. gazing at the ceiling, I saw a cloud of vapor form above my head—and while I wondered and waited, an open hand came out of it and reached down toward me as if wishing to grasp one of mine. Thinking it an optical illusion, I reached up and grasped it. It was solid! With a yell I leaped out of bed and watched it disappear. That is my one contact with a spook. If the senses of touch and sight are worth anything, I saw and clasped a living hand. But with all that I won't swear it was not an illusion." (Not willing to believe his own eyes when Spirit went to all that trouble to try to convince him personally. Do you wonder, friends, at the patience of the Spirit World and God Almighty, Himself, with our stubborn mortal minds? Everything is shown clearly, before our own eyes, and—yet we doubt! "O ye of little faith!" Jesus says.

In Washington, Mr. Garland is surprised to find Socrates and Julius Caesar writing, in commonplace English, slate messages, to an elderly German doctor. The latter had no doubts as to the authorship of the messages, Mr. Garland, himself, admits that they "were on a very high level indeed. There was something touching in the doctor's wish to have me share in his conviction," the author says.

How many of we Spiritualists, eager to share our postive knowledge of immortality with unbelievers, bring forth abundant proof, only to have the investigator determined not to be convinced under any circumstances. Reminds us of one noted investigator, who declared he would not be won over, regardless of proof. From the Spirit Side of Life he now speaks, at every opportunity, about this determination of his not to be convinced of spirit communication. He tries, in this acknowledging of his stubborness, to make some sort of amends for his earthly acts.

A favorable test Mr. Garland reports is that of a 16-year-old schoolgirl medium, who was able to move a table in the light. Her work left no dou't in his mind that it "was being lifted by an unseen force and held suspended in the air for a minute, possibly longer." (Many of you know that I and many of my students are able to move a table in the light.)

The next recording is of a sitting with a man Mr. Garland calls "Kelly," who "had a performance which some observers considered a brazen piece of legerdemain while others called it inexplicable." The author goes on to say, "I had several sittings with Kelly, and while I was warned against him as a trickster I could not discover any precise deceit. His 'act' was profitable. He owned a comfortable home and was well regarded by his neighbors. —I regarded this (Kelly's levitation act whereby a guitar rose into the air and bells rang) at the time as an entertainment.—My feeling then was one of amusement, but I am now able to record the fact that this man continued for half a lifetime to earn his living in this way."

We Spiritualists take exception to that statement, "continued to earn his living in this way." Mediumship, true, is a God-given gift, but it is a profession, also. We spend much time, effort, and money in developing our phases. One of my guides said recently: Rev. Barker, people do not hesitate to spend much time and money in preparing for the profession of law, medicine, and the Orthodox ministry, and the public take it for granted that prospective lawyers, doctors, and ministers should finish a four-year high school

course and a four years' college course, and in addition, spend at least, four years in their choice of professional training. Yet this marvelous gift from God and the Spirit World is being regarded by the public and even by the prospective mediums, themselves, as something given full-grown and perfect instantly to anyone who expresses a wish to heal, give messages, and lecture. It is not done that way, Rev. Barker—not the quality of work to which you and your Spirit Band aspire. God expects every spirit in the mortal and every spirit in the Spirit World to work for—to earn—the higher phases of mediumship. Stand your ground! Be not moved from your purpose! Aspire to such, and we shall be victorious, and shall be able to give humanity a very high form of spirit manifestation. Why shouldn't this man, if his mediamship were genuine, earn his living this way? Jesus says a servant is worthy of his hire.

Old Mr. Vickers, the famous theatrical manager, was an open advocate of the spirit hypothesis. He recommended a medium, who was "able to produce writing on a slate under the bottom of a goblet filled with water."

James A. Herne, the actor-dramatist, asked: "Why under a goblet of water?" McVickers answered: "For the reason that most people go to a medium expecting to witness a miracle. We all want messages to come hard, that is, to say under conditions impossible to ordinary people. We argue that the dead being free from limitations of earthly life, should be able to manifest their presence in direct opposition to what we call natural law. Hence we insist on their writing on locked slates and reading sealed letters. The poor psychics are forced to grant these tests. So far as my experience goes and it covers a good many years—I have found most of them honest. Go see this woman—she is a wonder."

Garland went, and his tests were made under conditions of his own, "devised to make trickery impossible." This is his report on a slate writing seance that met every demand of his: "Whatever the character of the forces. I absolve the psychic from any deception." Later, he tells us: "—it was my policy to study, not to expose them" (mediums).

and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God; neither doth corruption inherit incorruption." If we are corrupt in our earth living, then we cannot enter the Kingdom of God when we pass out of the physical body, but must go to the Kingdom of Satan in Spirit—the Earth Bound Sphere—and remain there until we have redeemed ourselves and earned the right to enter the Kingdom of God.

In John 14:23, Jesus says, "If a man love Me, he will keep My words; and My Father will love him, and We will come unto him, and make Our abode with him." That is, if we accept Christ, and follow His teachings while in the physical body, we shall inherit the Kingdom of God in the Spirit Side of Life. We cannot hope to enter the Kingdom of God unless we, as human beings, live worthy of such a reward. The Angel of the Lord, guarding the tomb of Jesus, told those who came to the sepulchre, "He is not here: for He is risen. "Jesus promises us the things He did we can do also. He arose from the so-called dead, and so shall we, for we do not die, do not inherit a condition of silence, the silence of tomb, but inherit eternal life, for our spirit, the Spirit of God within each of us, is continous as was the Spirit of the Christ. BOOK CHATTER

Three books that should be read and reread by every Spiritualist, and every man and woman interested in the question of "Where do we go from here?" is Hamlin Garland's "Forty Years of Phychic Research", "Spiritualism's Challenge", by Edwin F. Bower, and "Eternal Verities", by Marcella DeCou Hicks.

The first two are reviewed as sermons, and published in the earlier pages of this number. The last will be reviewed as a sermon, and published in the next number of the Quarterly. You may wish to read this absorbing volume before the next issue is off the press, so we give you a brief review here.

Mrs. Hicks has spent, as she writes, "fifteen years in the most profound study of the fundamentals of authentic mediumship and Psychism in all its phases—developing my own mediumship during the process. I have come upon nearly everything which others treading the same path find disquieting aggrevating and contradictory. Doubts have assailed me hundreds of times because I could not logically reconcile this thing with that. I have been driven to disgusted distraction by seemingly utterly contradictory matter. But doggedly I have hung on and determinedly I have ploughed through and I have been rewarded at last with a clarity of understanding that has given me peace and security. I want to help the struggler, wallowing in the mires of uncertainty, to the same security and peace."

of uncertainty, to the same security and peace." "What Good is Spiritualism?" "Mediumship", and "Finally—What is Spiritualism?" are a few of the intensely interesting and instructive chapters, helpful alike to the professional, the beginner, and the investigator.

(Mr. Garland's book is published by Macmillan, \$3.50; Mrs. Hicks' by Aries Press, \$2.15; and Dr. Bowers' published at his own expense, \$2.00)

Margaret George, whose column, "I've Got Your Number", is a regular feature of the Quarterly, is eager to have you read and profit mentally by Mary Adams' "Count Your Numbers".

This little volume tells you how to make your numbers count for harmony, success, and happiness in your life. Finding and influencing people, discovering your personality, and your dominant traits, and finding your true mate are explained in such simple language a child could understand how to go about accomplishing it. The chapters, "The Power Within You", "When, Why and How To Change Your Name", "Best Days and How To Find Them", and "How To Set Up A Chart" will give you the urge to put the instructions into immediate practice. The author says: "It cannot be too emphatically stated that Numerology is not a cage into which you are locked by an inexorable Fate but a vast garden of opportunities where you can choose your path intelligently. If pitfalls are indicated, make a detour and avoid them. If you discover weaknesses, then it is up to you to conquer them."—(Aries Press—\$1.00)

"The Case For Astral Projection", by Syian Muldoon, will be reviewed

next issue as a sermon, as it is a very worth-while discussion of the subject.

Quoting from the astral experiences of a Mr. Oliver Fox: "Eighteen years ago, when I was a student at a technical college, a dream impelled me to start my research—Instantly the vividness of life increased a hundredfold. Never had sea and sky shown with such glamorous beauty; even the commonplace houses seemed alive and mystically beautiful. Never had I felt so absolutely well, clear-brained, so divinely powerful. The sensation was exquisite beyond words; but lasted only a few moments, and I awoke. As I was to learn later, my mental control had been overwhelmed by my emotions; so the tired body asserted its claim and pulled me back." The thought then occurred to the young man that he might try to force his dream consciousness further—He finally did so, and after a sort of **click** occurred in his brain, he no longer seemed connected with his physical body, and he made his first conscious projection.—(Aries Press, \$2.15)

Dr. Jacob Goldwasser's "Scientific Devolution and the Super-Man" was written during various stages of psychical regeneration, resulting in the author finally coming into a knowledge of the Absolute, the Source, which is Indestructible, Eternal. He is secretary of a tropical colony of Scientific Living in Panama, above Boqueron, in the Providence of Chiriqui. His book is an invitation to "Come all ye, gather round my table, and drink from the fountain of knowledge."

You may not agree with many of Dr. Goldwasser's views, but every one of them will make you think. He touches on scientific living, which has given him vibrant health, the perfect diet, how to achieve this rejuvenation of the physical body, God's little children, and the race of gods, and in between numerous other vital subjects that will aid man in his search after the perfect earth life.—(The author, Bouqueron, Panama, \$2.00).

"The Art of True Healing", by Isreal Regardie, is a treatise on the mechanism of prayer, and the operation of the Law of Attraction in Nature, the best book of its kind so far coming to our desk.

The author gives detailed instructions how to accomplish healing for yourself and for others. In the development of what he terms the Middle Pillar technique, he stresses acquiring power, spirituality, and color in the formulation of the centres. "The first step towards freedom and health is a conscious realization of the vast spiritual reservoir in which we live and move and have our being—cultivate above all the art of realization. Learn to address each tensed muscle from toe to head as you lie flat on your back in bed. Tell it deliberately to loosen its tention and cease from its unconscious contracture."

This is a book you will want to own, and follow as a textbook. (Aries Press-\$1.00)
