What Right Decision Can Do For You

OU HAVE power at your command through which to change your whole life's expression, if you will but believe in that power and choose to use it.

Everything in your life may be viewed in a three-fold way: as it is; as you think it is; and as it appears to be. An understanding of these three different conceptions in regard to your problem will enable you to choose how you shall regard whatever confronts you, and in making that decision, it shall be to you "as you believe"—just as you, yourself, decide.

Reality is the truth of the thing as it

is in God.

The way you think it is is the pattern that gives form to Reality in your experience, for Reality is God Substance, and assumes for man the form he thinks.

The form you have thought into manifestation is the appearance now facing

you—the problem to be solved.

To understand clearly we will assume Reality to be like the cloth out of which you wish to make a suit. Before the suit can be made, you must place a pattern upon the cloth—a pattern you have decided to use, one you have chosen for yourself, one you have thought desirable.

When you have cut the cloth, and by your act have pieced it together according to the pattern, you have the suit. The cloth assumes the form of your decision, and the suit becomes that form in your experience. You are to wear it—it is your creation.

Divine Substance is Reality, and is ever at your command. "All that I have is thine." "Ask and receive, for everyone that asketh receiveth." "Be it unto thee even as thou wilt."

What pattern in thought shall you lay upon Divine Substance? The untrue forms with which you wrestle are the result of your own untrue patterns of thought—because you did not "know the truth" about Reality.

God is Reality. In him you live and move and have your being. He is the **Eternal Sub**stance underneath all the changing forms you think into manifestation.

Do you think you are sick? Then Substance must assume that form to you, and you must manifest the lie about Reality, and suffer. Why not know the Truth, and let it make you free—healthy, happy, radiant? Turn from the lie to Reality. "Turn ye unto me, and live, for wherefore wilt thou die?"

Take no thought of the body. Think of the Spirit—Reality.

Take no thought of the doubtful tomorrow. Think of the Eternal Now—Reality.

Take no thought of evil. Think of God, the Unchanging Good—Reality.

Take no thought of poverty. Think of Universal Substance—Omnipresent Reality.

Take no thought of hate, fear, separation. Think of Love, Faith, Oneness—Reality.

No one hates you. God, Infinite Love, abides in you and in every living creature, between you and every living creature. God is all. All manifestation is of God and rests in God. God, Love, is above, and around, in, and between, and through all form.

You have not lost your position. You are placed eternally in God's Mind. No one can take your place, for he must fill his place—you yours. Your position is assured; your work is certain; its accomplishment gives you joy; your reward is unfailing. This is Reality.

Take all your problems to God. See them placed in God. To drop them in the sea of Reality is to find dark forms melt, and magically transform as your consciousness, your thinking about them, is lifted up to Reality—the Light that God is, and in whom there is no darkness at all.

This change of thought from appearance to Reality is the truth that makes you free. It is the "renewing of the mind" that "transforms" your body and your affairs, and molds them as you wish them to be—as you, yourself, have decided to see them, and have them.

HE other day I asked one of my associates—"Did you get a newspaper today?" She replied, "No, they were calling out nothing especial, so I did not buy one!" Then

we both laughed, for immediately we saw the same point—it takes something especial, startling, to arouse even truth lovers to a point of perusing the daily news. And the pity of it is that, usually, that "something especial" is in the nature of a calamity. The habit of human thought calls for it; papers go unsold to the mass man without it, and even truth lovers, off guard, expect it.

When we stop to think of the power of the word,—that it is creative, and, once sent forth, does not return unto us void, what can we expect for our world but that it shall bring itself to the point of destruction-unless that word be changed quickly from the destructive to the constructive? Just think for a moment of the daily headlines—think of the thousands and thousands of newspapers that bear those headlines in several editions daily! Think of the thousands of cities and towns and villages in which those papers are distributed! Think of the thousands and thousands of street corners from which the destructive word is sounded! Then think of the innocent little boys from six years old and older that are trained to shout destruction into the ears of negative passers-by, and, then imagine to yourself what that word is doing to passive mentalities, and will do through them to this world in which we live -our home, our devastated Eden,-unless we awaken to action, and shout differently!

Without the danger note is sounded, and the remedy broadcasted, how can our world escape an era of crime such as it has never before known? In the beginning—of crime as well as of everything else—is the word. Did not the Master say, "He shall have whatsoever he saith" . "Ye shall say unto this mountain, Remove, and it shall remove?" And did not the centurian so guess the power of the word that he said to the Master, "Speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed?"

Is it not time to shout the word that heals? I wish some newspaper in some city, or town, would try it just for one day. I believe even that short period would show its effect. One might try it on Thanksgiving day. Here, for instance, are three good headlines which could be used from the Bible:

Great Battle Won Through Praise!

Two Prisoners Escape from Jail through Praise!

Five Thousand People Fed in the Desert through Praise!

Three editions of that in any city on Thanksgiving might awaken the populace to an appreciation of what thanksgiving can do. All these many centuries the little tribe of Judah has had its magical deliverance unheralded through the newspapers, when it met and conquered hosts of its enemies through merely obeying the voice of the Spirit which told them not to fight but to go and meet the enemy in the morning, and appoint "singers' who should go before them in the way, "Praising the Lord in the beauty of his holiness." Surely that is better than mustard gas—less destructive, less expensive; and the army, that had the wisdom to follow Divine guidance and give thanks, did not lose a single man. It would make a good story-and think what it would do to the people who read it. How the wheels of industry would turn the next morning-joyously from such an inspiration! The mass expressing in joy and under inspiration, would certainly work more effectively; more goods would be produced, and better goods - and prosperity would loom larger than ever. Read about Judah,-2 Chronicles, 20th chapter.

Then think of the second Headline suggested-Paul and Silas in prison long ago-in the inner prison, with their feet in the stocks, and with guards over them-actually caused an earthquake, shook the prison doors open, and the shackles from their feet, through And they didn't even try to make praise. their escape. They made the magistrates come and take them out! That would certainly make a good news story, and startle a whole city, fed as it is already upon sensations. It would have good effect too. Jails might be abolished over night, prisoners might become law-abiding citizens—magistrates might cease to be, certainly would cease to be, if they were not needed. Read about Paul and Silas, Acts 16th chapter.

Finally, in these days when the financial question stands out with such importance in the minds of men-think what rest from hard labor would be conceived in the minds of men at the thought of one having the power to seat five thousand people on the grass, and simply by looking up and giving thanks, be enabled to increase five loaves and two fishes to feed a hungering multitude! What hope it would breed in the hearts of men! What relaxation would come to their tired limbs! True, there might be no business done for several days, but in that period of relief from anxiety, their rheumatism might heal; consumptive lungs might expand with God's purifying air; new ideas might be born

Parables Made Plain

A Revelation of the Secret Teaching of Jesus, Covered in His Parables

THE TEN VIRGINS-Matt. 25: 1-13.

HIS parable is a story given to convey to man the necessity of a complete consecration of all his senses of both soul and body to the Christ

within-his Real Self; and of their preparation for the use of this Christ—the "bride-groom", or "Son of Man", who is to be revealed to his consciousness, and will require expression through them.

Without all the faculties of body and soul are trained to express the Divine consciousness even though that consciousness should come, it could not be conveyed into visible manifestation, for the only channels through which it could be conveyed would be closed and unresponsive. Also, if just the soul faculties were developed, without the perparation of the physical faculties. expression of the Divine consciousness would be just as impossible. It is this in particular that the parable of the Ten Virgins is given to illustrate, for we are told in regard to them that "five of them were wise (the senses of the soul) and five were foolish" (the senses of the body).

In order that the Christ in man may manifest perfection, he, the Son, or Spirit, must have his perfected instrument, and this instrument has both its interior and exterior sides. The interior is the soul, and the exterior is the body. The Divine Idea in "the kingdom of heaven" is to be made manifest as Perfect Man in the "kingdom of God"the fifth kingdom in the great evolution of the Divine Being upon the earth. The time for this is "at hand," and it is important that those who desire perfection be wholly prepared, without as well as within, for as our parable tells us, "Ye know neither the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh." At any moment the Christ revelation may come. Are we mentally and physically prepared to express it, and so retain

The Christ Self in us, when sent forth upon the evolutionary path for expression in earth, is endowed with virgin faculties, five in soul and five in body, which should work in pairs, the soul faculties to channel the Christ Spirit-"oil"-and the body faculties to express it, so that the Christ light may "shine" in earth. These faculties, or senses, are referred to as "virgins" because when given to the Christ Self for expression, they

are, as yet, unmated and have not come together to produce expression. They are to go forth "to meet the bridgroom", or to prepare through experience for his coming, at which time soul and body will have complete union in Christ. This is the "marriage of the Son", and the "Marriage feast" is the great revelation of Christ in soul and body that will be made.

The five virgins of the body are plainly evident to us all—the senses of seeing, hearing, smelling, tasting, feeling. These all have their interior, or soul, counterparts. Jesus gives us the key to two of them in another Parable: "By hearing ye shall hear, and shall not understand; and seeing ye shall see, and not perceive." (Matt. 13:14). It seems easy to estimate what the soul-side of each of the others is. We smell our food that we may judge if it is good, and fit for the building of the body. We taste our food and so discern its ingredients. Through this power of discrimination our food is properly assimilated and distributed throughout the body. We quickly perceive that the sense of touch in the physical is related to the feeling of the soul-Divine compassion. We can thus relate the senses of soul and body somewhat as follows:

Body Perception Seeing Understanding Hearing

3. Judgment Smelling 4. Discrimination

Tasting Compassion Feeling

It is when these senses are rightly related through divine marriage that the Christ Self can be revealed in the physical man.

We are told the foolish virgins took no oil with them when they went forth. That is, they broke their connection with the Christ Self, and their lamps soon went out, or refused to shine, because they separated themselves from the Source of "oil" - the Christ Love-Light. The wise virgins of the soul kept contact with the Christ, but all were inactive because the "bridegroom tarried" and they "slumbered and slept."

Suddenly, however, we are told there came the "midnight hour"—a time of dark test when light was needed, and the cry was made that the bridegroom—the Christ light —was to burst forth, and must be given expression. All the virgins—senses—became immediately active and alert-"they trimmed their lamps." Then the foolish ones discovered that they had no oil-they had broken their connection with the Christ Self! When they demanded oil of the "wise virgins", they answered, "Not so-go ye rather to them that sell, and buy for yourselves." And while they WENT OUT to buy, the bridegroom—Christ light—came," and they that were ready WENT IN with him to the marriage: and the door was shut." Had the foolish given out, knowing Christ within, instead of seeking him without, they would have found oil.

Do you see the point of separation, and the great difficulty that will arise to those who do not realize the importance of soul and body acting as one, and all senses of both planes being open and responsive to the Christ Mind? This little story tells us of a soul illumination that had no bodily expression. The bodily senses, shut out by their own lack of preparation, could not manifest the Christ. The door was shut, and the Christ within had to say, "I cannot get through you to shine into the world, for you have closed me out."

The soul faculties cannot do the work of the physical faculties, nor those of the physical do the work of the soul. Each much buy for himself. Each must keep attuned to the Spirit within; each must respond to the Spirit within; and so attuned, must unite, as one, to channel and to manifest the Christ the Son of Man, or Real Self.

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The Word—John 8:1-11
As recorded by John, "the disciple whom
Jesus loved."

1. Jesus went unto the mount of Olives.
2. And early in the morning he came

2. And early in the morning he came again into the temple, and all the people came unto him; and he sat down, and taught them.

3. And the scribes and Pharisees brought unto him a woman taken in adultery; and when they had set her in the midst,

4. They say unto him, Master, this woman was taken in adultery, in the very act.

5. Now Moses in the law commanded us, that such should be stoned: but what sayest thou?

6. This they said, tempting him, that they might have to accuse him... But Jesus stooped down, and with his finger wrote on the ground, as though he heard them not.

Seeking to tempt him these masters of the law acknowledged by their very act that they discerned the difference between their mastery and that of the Christ—"The law commands us. . . but what sayest thou?" Jesus, by his refusal to answer, or to express in the letter of the word, his doctrine showed them what his doctrine really was—that of spirit and right action, rather than words.

This test of the Christ had doubtless been anticipated by him, and he had in the stillness of his hours on the mount of Olives prepared himself to meet it. Early in the morning" following the night of his communion he came forth to teach the people, and since his teaching was one of example, he was brought face to face with the experience that was to be placed on record as a testimony of his spirit, as a proof of divine love, as an evidence of the law of Moses superceded, intensified, in redeeming power.

7. So when they continued asking him, he lifted up himself, and said unto them, He that is without sin among you, let him first

cast a stone at her.

8. And again he stooped down, and

wrote on the ground.

The Christ gives us a splendid example. Before he judged, he, himself, "stooped down," and it was not until he had thus humbled himself that he "lifted up himself" to answer the question of the accusers. Another beautiful example is given us in the fact that he cast their judgment back upon themselves. They were the ones seeking fulfillment of their own law. He let them decide. When they were made to look into their own consciousness, each probably realized that he, the Christ, knew that they all were worthy of stoning under the law. Probably, the very words he wrote on the ground revealed this to them, one by one. At least, they made made their escape "one by one"-beginning "with the eldest, even unto the last." The eldest, having sinned first, was the first to have his sin uncovered to him.

9. And they which heard it, being convicted by their own consciences, went out one by one, beginning at the eldest, even unto the last: and Jesus was left alone, and the woman standing in the midst.

10. When Jesus lifted up himself, and saw none but the woman, he saaid unto her, Woman, where are those thine accusers?

hath no man condemned thee?

11. She said, No man, Lord. And Jesus said unto her, Neither do I condemn thee: go, and sin no more.

We are told elsewhere in the Bible, "All judgment is committed unto the Son"—and that this must mean the Son within each soul is evidenced by the fact that Jesus judged no man. This story clearly reveals to us that the Judge of each man is his own conscience. Here each condemns himself, or through Christ understanding is enabled to forgive himself, even as he forgives others. When one beholds in consciousness "The Lamb that taketh away the sin of the world", then for that one sin ceases to have charm, and ceases to be. Christ revealed dissolves all error, and neither condemns another, nor himself—he sins no more.
