The nature of spirits is human and their aim is to prove the continuity of life and then lead humanity to a spiritual understanding of life and the universe in which life struggles to adapt itself. Modern Spiritualism has been called into being to do this and with the mighty power of the spirit world behind it, neither priests nor prelates, principalities nor powers can prevent its accomplishment as long as Spiritualists are true to the spirit world, for the spirit world is always true to itself.

A mere conviction of survival is now no act of faith; it is the outcome of knowledge; it is established by scientific inquiry. The evidence goes on accumulating; we have not to appeal to something in the past which now ceased; here and now and continually the evidence is forthcoming. The survival of man is becoming an item of scientific knowledge.

Spiritualism as a religion bases itself upon the statements and disclosures made by the spirit-intelligence through mediumship and gives us a new philosophy of life. The organized Spiritualist church looks upon Christ as a very high spirit. With the cooperation of the spirit-intelligences, we propose to substitute proof for faith, and certainty for vague belief. By the testimony of the "dead" themselves, who send us long and coherent messages, giving their actual experiences, we achieve certainty.

World-Renowned Slate Writer



P. L. O. A. Keeler

MAKES HIS 47TH VISIT TO DALE

P. L. O. A. Keeler Has Rare
Record of Accomplishment

The most widely known slate-writing medium in the world, P. L. O. A. Keeler of Washington, D. C., is again at the Lily Dale Camp and will remain the entire season. This is Mr. Keeler's forty-seventh consecutive season at the Dale, he having occupied the same cottage and used the same room and the same table each summer for nearly a half century.

Mr. Keeler began his work when a very young man and has traveled quite extensively at times. At his winter home in Washington, he has contacted and sat for many world-famed persons; Senators, Congressmen, Foreign Ministers to the U. S. A. and other high officials of the Government.

Marked instances of positive results, following sessions with him are many. William Henry Crowell, U. S. Treasury Dept., in the closing moments of a fatal illness wrote a will so poorly that it could not be read and died before placing his signature. His wife went to Mr. Keeler and her slate-writing among other messages included a readable transcription of the will, properly signed. This was and still is the first case of a posthumous will ever being written.

Liliuokalani (Queen Lili) of Hawaii, while in Washington, presenting claims to our government in regard to confiscated territory in Honolulu, exhibited personally several of Keeler's slate-written messages to President Grover Cleveland. The President examined them carefully and much favorable attention and consideration was given to her case.

The most formidable volume ever given to the reading public against the report of the Seybert Commission of the University of Pennsylvania, was written by Hon. A. B. Richmond, the distinguished criminal lawyer and author, after being convinced of the fact of spirit communication in a series of sittings with Mr. Keeler.

Alfred Russell Wallace, eminent English scientist, discoverer of the principle of evolution, co-worker of Professors Darwin and Crookes, after several experiments with Keeler, published his great essay: "If a Man Die Shall He Live Again?"

H. W. Richardson, former trustee of Lily Dale assembly, followed the instructions outlined in one of Keeler's slate-writings and established the first electric light plant at Lily Dale.

It is reasonable to believe that these few high-lights and experiences during Mr. Keeler's interesting career prove without a doubt that Spiritualism deserves its ever-increasing popularity. Still people continue to ask the question: "What good has Spiritualism ever done?"

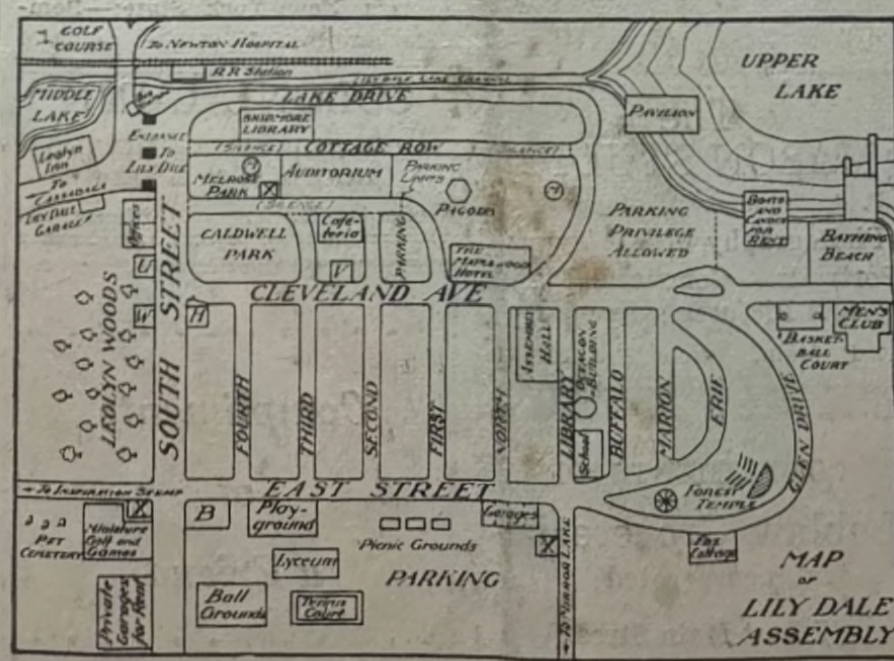

DECLARATION OF PRINCIPLES

Adopted by the National Spirit-
ualist Assn. U. S. A.

1. We believe in Infinite Intelligence.
2. We believe that the phenomena of nature, both physical and spiritual, are the expression of infinite Intelligence.
3. We affirm that a correct understanding of such expression and living in accordance therewith, constitute true religion.
4. We affirm that the existence and personal identity of the individual continue after the change called death.
5. We affirm that communication with the so-called dead is a fact, scientifically proven by the phenomena of Spiritualism.
6. We believe that the highest morality is contained in the Golden Rule: "Whatsoever ye would that others should do unto you, do ye also unto them."
7. We affirm the moral responsibility of the individual, and that he makes his own happiness or unhappiness as he obeys or disobeys Nature's physical and spiritual laws.
8. We affirm that the doorway to reformation is never closed against any human soul here or hereafter.

DEFINITIONS

Adopted by the
National Spiritualist Association
October, 1914, 1919, 1930

1. Spiritualism is the Science, Philosophy and Religion of continuous life, based upon the demonstrated fact of communication by means of mediumship, with those who live in the Spirit World.
 2. A Spiritualist is one who believes, as a part of his or her religion, in the communication between this, and the spirit world by means of mediumship, and who endeavors to mould his or her character and conduct in accordance with the highest teachings derived from such communion.
 3. A Medium is one whose organism is sensitive to vibrations from the spirit world, and through whose instrumentality, intelligences in that world are able to convey messages and produce the phenomena of Spiritualism.
 4. A Spiritualist healer is one who, either through his own inherent powers or through his mediumship, is able to impart vital, curative force to pathologic conditions.
- Spiritualism is a Science because it investigates, analyzes and classifies facts and manifestations demonstrated from the spirit side of life.
- Spiritualism is a Philosophy because it studies the laws of nature both on the seen and unseen sides of life and bases its conclusions upon present observed facts. It accepts statements of observed facts of past ages and conclusions drawn therefrom, when sustained by reason and by results of observed facts of the present day.
- Spiritualism is a Religion because it strives to understand and to comply with the Physical, Mental and Spiritual Laws of Nature, which are the laws of God.
