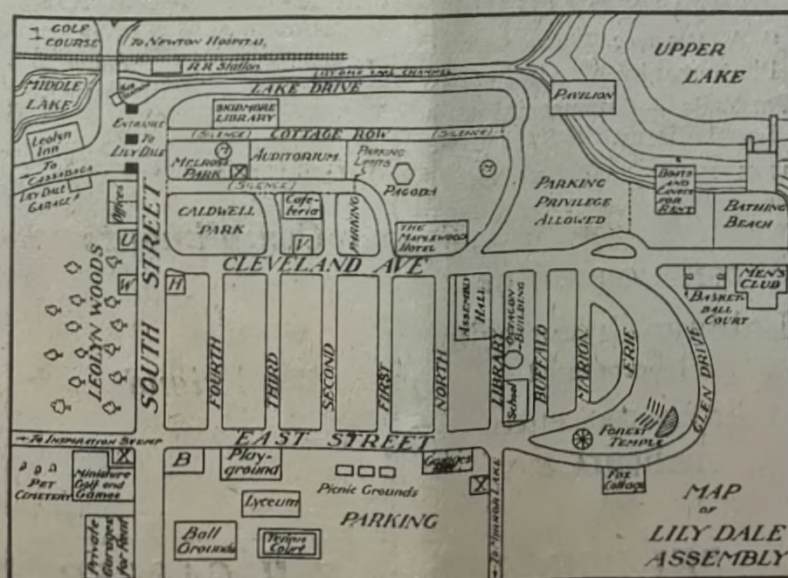

## Veteran Lecturer and Teacher



Thomas Grimshaw

Thomas Grimshaw, vice president of the National Spiritualist Association, and one of the most learned teachers of psychic subjects today, will lecture at Lily Dale Sunday afternoon, July 16, and another of his interesting talks is to be expected. Mr. Grimshaw, having been in public spiritualistic work for over 46 years, relates that during that time he has only missed coming to Lily Dale two of those years. Not many changes have taken place, so he says, with the exception of the fact that the people are enjoying every convenience—electricity, gas and a good water supply. Mr. Grimshaw remembers the time Lily Dale was a vast woods and when the first camp was pitched on the Leolyn Hotel grounds where people formerly arrived the first of June for what was called the June Picnic—this picnic, he says, officially opened the camp.

Dollar excursions from Buffalo to Lily Dale bringing thousands of persons, gate admission 10 cents, old timers with their oil lamps and pump water, are just a few reminiscences of Thomas Grimshaw, who, without a doubt is the most prominent and respected veteran in the ranks of spiritualism in the world.

Mr. Grimshaw was principal of the Morris Pratt Institute in White Water, Wisconsin, the only spiritualist college in the world for a number of years. He was also head of a correspondence course for the education of speakers and mediums who could not go to school and was well qualified for that type of work. He is today recognized as an authority on the subject of mediumship.

### MAGGIE WAITE

Maggie Waite, well known and popular trance medium from Chicago, Ill., is again at the Dale for the season. This is Mrs. Waite's 34th consecutive season at Lily Dale and marks her 50th year in spiritualistic work.

While in Chicago, she was pastor of the Metropolitan Spiritualist church of that city. She first conceived her mediumistic power at the age of nine and at that time was in the St. Gertrude convent at Rio Vista, California. At the age of 17, she began her platform work as a medium and was ordained a minister three years later at Oakland, Calif.

Her work then took her to Pennsylvania where she was ordained at Pittsburgh in order to meet with the laws of that state.

Maggie Waite has been in every state in the Union, visited nearly every spiritualist assembly in the country and has crossed the continent many times in order to fulfill her many engagements. Through her persistence in following her chosen life work, she was disinherited when quite young. Of the charter members of the National Spiritualist Association, there are only four living members, and Maggie Waite is one of them. The other three are Julia Walton, M. E. Cadwalader and Thomas Grimshaw.

Mrs. Waite intends to carry on with her work again this summer at the Dale and will reside at her cottage at the corner of Cleveland and Library streets.

Even the Christian Scientists would bar Him from their auction-block, at least until he had got a morning coat and paid cash for a revised copy of "Science and Health."

What would the Congregatio Sancti Official say of His theology? What would the Methodist Board of Temperance, Prohibition and Public Morals say of His ethics? What would Monsignor Manning say of His patriotism, or His economic views, or His probable opinion of the great spiritual station? What these high authorities would say, would be a plenty. 
