### Lily Dale's Fifty-ninth Season Opens on July 1; Hammond To Give Address

**Boy Scouts of Dunkirk With Lyceum Children To  
Preside at Flag Raising Ceremony.**

When Boy Scouts from Dunkirk and the Lyceum children of the assembly hoist the flag to the top of the pole in front of the auditorium on Friday, July 1, at 1 p. m., standard time, the 59th season of Lily Dale Assembly will be under way.

There is every indication that 1938 will bring new achievements to the world's largest Spiritualist camp and new triumphs in communication with the spirit world.

More than 100 scouts will participate in the opening exercises and spend the day in an outing on the grounds. Boy Scouts are not unfamiliar with the community for the Northern Chautauqua Council's Camp Gross shares the shores of the upper lake with the assembly. Boy Scouts and Lily Dale residents are neighbors.

Following the opening exercises Vice-President William Elliott Hammond will give a welcoming address in the auditorium—a greeting to Lily Dale's friends, as a new season opens up.

"Jack" Kelly, Lily Dale veteran, is scheduled for a ballot reading session after Mr. Hammond's address.

At 1:30 the Psychic Observer's new seance room will be dedicated by Mr. Hammond and Lily Dale's newest contribution to spiritualism will be ready for public use.

#### Maplewood Remodeled

The Maplewood, under the management of Mr. and Mrs. Bert Bullyment, will be the scene of a reception and dinner tendered by President Millard C. Knox and members of the official board. Several hundred are expected to attend and enjoy, not only the dinner and reception, but the comfort and pleasing appearance of the renovated and redecorated Maplewood.
