Message from H.P B.'s Grand Nephew

Success and achievement come from one-pointed concentration of efforts towards the goal contemplated. One-pointed concentration of outward efforts is the result of inner harmony and the equilibrated balance of opposite yet corelated and mutually complementary energies. If the Theosophical Movement is to retain its rightful place in the world of thought and culture, as the leading spiritual-intellectual Movement of the age, it requires unity of effort.

If its representatives and its members wish to keep in mind the *real* purpose for which the modern Theosophical Society was started in 1875, namely, to become in future the nucleus and seed of a new religio-philosophical system of thought, the fountain-head of genuine esoteric knowledge—then our combined efforts should be bent towards achieving *here* and *now* a unified and unshakable front of sympathetic, real, creative Brotherhood within our own ranks.

Signs of Growth or of Decay?

Decay and internal disintegration of component elements of structure are the signs of decrepitude brought about by old age; creative upbuilding, growth and dynamic effort, courage and leaping aspirations towards one's Vision and Ideal, are the signs of the Spirit of Youth, undaunted yet self-controlled.

This inner Flame of Spiritual Youth, beyond and outside of any physical distinctions of age or position in life, for it is a power manifesting itself through the secret movements of consciousness and the daring flights of one's spiritual imagination, rather than through the illusory appearances of outward form and shape—it is this inner Flame which must remain the very heart-life of the Theosophical Movement, if the latter is to be the surging power of spiritual illumination in the world of men. What Counts in the Great Cause

What counts in the Great Cause of the Masters of Life is WORK done for mankind; not work for this, that, or another idea; not work for this, that, or another individual; not even work for the Theosophical Society; but work through the Theosophical Movement and for the human race; and it is by and through this WORK, as distinguished from talk, argumentation, hopes, desires, intentions, plans, and competition, that the Masters who are the symbols of the Great Divine Law, will judge our worth or our worthlessness in the Cause of Light and Peace.

As H. P. B. has written—and let us remember her words—"there is a power behind the Society which will give the strength we need, which will enable us to move the world, if we will but UNITE and WORK as one mind, one heart." And if H. P. B. were to come in our midst again, as indeed she may, what a splendid thing it would be to show ourselves worthy of her trust, and to give her at the very start that unshakable foundation of a united body of workers, which she labored to build up in the world when she was with us!

The Moment of Dedication

Is it nothing to you all ye who pass by?

Is it nothing to you that at this most critical moment in the world's history,

Theosophy remains apathetic?

Traitorous Stewards are they in the Lord's Vineyard, who have sold out to the Forces of Evil; to the Warmaker, to the Money changer, to the Profiteer.

Stronger than ever by reason of their Re-Dedication before all Mankind for Open Alliance with others throughout the World who tread, even unwittingly, the Noble Eight-fold Path, and for Open Defiance of Exploitation of weaker Brethren—of War-makers—and of the Power of the Printed Inexactitude calculated to rouse hatred in men's hearts.
