THE HEAT OF THE SUN.

A conservative estimate (174*) of the heat of the sun's surface is, that it is 146 times hotter than the Drummond light (Elements of Chemistry, note 326). This estimate, and all other estimates made by chemists, physicists and astronomers are based upon the heat of sunlight falling upon a given surface, multiplied by our distance from the sun, according to the law of the diffusion or scattering of light. In this estimate it seems possible and very probable that there are large chances for error. We must in the first place, measure the heat of the sunlight falling upon a surface, inside of the envelope of atmosphere which surrounds the earth, because we cannot go outside of it to obtain a measurement, and when we consider this fact, that the motion which transmits heat from the sun to the earth (HIGHER SCIENCE, Vol. III. No. 4, p. 94), must create more heat at the surface of the earth where the weight of the atmosphere is 14 lbs. on each square inch, because it requires more power to vibrate it, than at higher altitudes (177) where it requires less power, we find our law working in exactly the opposite direction. For instance, if we measure the heat falling upon a certain surface at sea level, we get much more heat on the same surface than on a mountain top five miles nearer the sun. It would be ridiculous then for us to estimate the heat of the sun upon such a basis, as it would bring it down to billions of degrees below zero. When we understand the motion then, which delivers heat from the sun at the earth, we see at once

that the amount of heat depends upon the density of the expanded matter or gas at the point where it is measured, or in other words, the amount of power required to vibrate or jar it [see "Graduated Atmospheres"]. Judging by the difference between the heat of the sun at sea level and the heat at five miles above sea level, we must conclude that entirely outside of the earth's atmosphere, it must be very cold, as compared with the earth's atmosphere. The gas of expanded matter is light and easily vibrated or jarred by the continual expanding of matter into gas at the sun and therefore cannot create as much friction or heat, as in the atmosphere. As we go farther and farther from the sun, the gas of expanded matter must be continually lighter or more expanded and its vibration produce still less heat, because requiring less power to vibrate it. Under these conditions then, is it possible for us to accurately estimate the real heat of the sun, at the present time? Perhaps if we could measure its heat in a partial vacuum where the weight would be the same as the weight or pressure of expanded matter outside of the atmosphere, we could arrive at a close estimate, but what the weight of the expanded gas amounts to is an unsolved question. All we know of it as yet, is the speed of its upward motion from the sun as estimated by Maxwell years ago and as now measured by Prof. Lebedew.

THE LATEST DICTUM OF SCIENCE.

While ordinary mortals are worrying with such questions as the tariff, coinage and national expansion, the philosophers continue to hammer away at the old conundrum: "What is life?"

The great riddle was invested with fresh interest last year by the declaration of Professor Jacques Loeb of the Chicago University, now of the California State University, that "life is fermentation." Prof. Loeb gave seeming support to his theory by a practical test, in which he hatched the unfermented eggs of sea urchins through a purely chemical process.

The latest speculations along this line are credited to Franklin H. Heald, who publishes a magazine called HIGHER SCIENCE, published at Los Angeles, Cal.

Mr. Heald's ideas are collectively denominated by him as "the processional theory." He says:

"Consciousness or mind is a force. It is caused by the expanding or contracting of the protoplasm of the brain or nervous system, due to heat and cold. While it is a fact that mind or consciousness controls matter, and that we may, by the proper use of our thought or consciousness, direct and control our actions, yet at the same time we are compelled to admit that matter also controls mind and that consciousness is a force or motion generated by what we eat or drink."

To thousands of persons these speculations will appear as senseless jargon just as the heliocentric theory of the solar system did when proclaimed by Copernicus. But the hostile attitude toward scientific investigation is no longer popular. Science has "made good" in most of its undertakings. Therefore in its effort to deprive us of the divine spark to which theology attributes life, we find ourselves looking on with complacency.—*Kansas City World*.

Prof. Loeb is right in believing that life is fermentation, and is in line with the processional theory, inasmuch as it is the fermentation or disintegration of what we eat or drink, which, by friction, produces the heat or force in our body necessary to carry on life or the motion which produces the sensations of consciousness. What Prof. Loeb referred to and experimented particularly with, however, was the origin of life, which is also purely chemical or fermentation and from that all higher life has evidently evolved. It is a mistake to believe that science is endeavoring to deprive anybody of their theological spark of divinity; it is simply trying to arrive at the exact truth. If the truth should show that theology is wrong, no harm can be worked, because the truth can only do good. When we know the truth and awaken to fully realize it, we will drop all foolish and time wasting processes of asking and expecting some one else to save us and proceed on the common sense plan of trying to save ourselves. We will study the laws of life and nature and knowing that they must be obeyed, we will either obey them or expect to suffer the inevitable punishment due us. The theologian says in effect: "Never mind how you live, only believe what I tell you and you shall live a better

life after you are dead. If you live a very, very bad life and repent, there will be ninety-nine times as much attention paid to you in the life I give you, than as if you had lived the right kind of a life." Can the truth injure a man who believes a theology like this? The doctor says in effect: "Never mind how you live or what or when you eat and drink; I will give you my pills and physic and bring you out all right; but if I fail and you die, the preacher will send you to a better land." How much better to know the truth and realize that if we do not live according to the plain and simple laws of nature, we must suffer as we deserve and return to the great sea of expanded matter from which we come. The lawyer says in effect: "Never mind how you treat your fellow men, pay me a fee and I will get you out of trouble." When we finally realize the truth and cease depending on all these frauds to save us, we will at least advance the best interests of humanity. When we realize that it is a disgrace to get drunk or dissipate or be intemperate in any way, so as to cause sickness and trouble, we cannot but be benefited. We must realize that every person is his own saviour here and now, by his own effort and not by the mystery, pills or chicanery of those who live as parasites upon our credulity. Human beings are surely evolving to a higher plane of life. When man was originally a plant he had but one sense or way of receiving information *i. e.* touch; later he evolved the sense of taste; next the sense of smell, then hearing and finally sight, the feeling of light, and now in the fourth century of the era of man, he is developing a still finer and more wonderful sense of touch, whereby he will be enabled to use these five senses of touch through the medium of his own vibration of expanded matter, by the force of his consciousness.

Let none but Liberals be placed on guard.—*Philosophical Journal.*

WHERE LIFE BEGAN.

Some one has advanced the theory that life began at the north pole; that the primates, including apes, monkeys and lemurs who lived at the pole, were directly the ancestors of the human race. According to the theory of a procession of planets there can be no doubt that the crust of the earth first hardened at the poles (103) both north and south where it was the coldest and where the water could first fall, and where there was no motion of revolution to break up the gradual crystalizing of the crust. This happened when the earth was at about the orbit of Mars, and the winters lasted a year, instead of six months as now, on account of its greater orbit and slower speed requiring two years instead of one, to make a revolution around the sun (105). We have proof enough of this condition in studying Mars at the present time, although we must consider the fact that Mars is cooler, and therefore farther advanced in life than the earth was at the same orbit, because it is so much smaller and would necessarily cool quicker (106). We can see the rings of snow at the poles of Mars, as each is alternately on the opposite side from the sun, and we can see it rapidly melt away, causing the growths of vegetation along the lines of its "canals." We must expect that life commenced near or at the poles, but it must have been very meager and stunted on account of the cold of winters. This life would no doubt gradually move towards the equator as the crust hardened and become always better developed by the laws of evolution. (III.) If such animals as mentioned, are found near the north pole, they are more likely to have drifted there at a period long afterwards (see HIGHER SCIENCE March, 1903, p. 64) when they had evolved to that high order nearer the equator where the climate would permit such a development. The most rational conclusion which geologists have been able to arrive at in regard to the time elapsed since the forming of the earth's crust is 400,000,000 years (52) which gives plenty of time for

the first life to begin at the poles as vegetation and gradually reach the equator, develop into animals and as such again migrate or drift to the poles and be deposited in the strata or ice.

THE NEW STORY OF THE SOLAR SYSTEM.

ELECTRO-GERMAN ASTRONOMY EXPOSED.

Dr. Baur, in an article in the *Torch of Reason* February 5, says, amongst other reproachful things:

"There is an article in your *Torch* signed by a certain Heald, and treating the 'Nebular Hypothesis.' I should think that if anybody intends to write about such a heavy affair as this problem, he would first study the laws of electricity."

Answering, I will say, hoping to not give the impression of egotism, that I have studied electricity a great deal and find it to be the motion of a very subtle part of expanded matter. I also find that light, heat and electricity, like liquid, colloidal or solid matter are, all but manifestations of heat or energy and that they are interchangeable, inasmuch that either can be changed into either of the others. I find that all space is filled with expanded matter between the solid matter, and that electricity can be gathered from it by friction and stored for a time and used as needed, either as electricity, heat, light or power. I also find that solid matter contains the same properties and that when we make the proper combinations to cause the disintegration of solid or liquid matter the friction produces the heat or expansion which is power, motion, light, electricity, or whatsoever we wish to make of it. Continuing his complaint he says:

"I will say that the Nebular theory is very Nebular to Heald, because it does not start with a sea of red hot gas, but only with mists turning around a center according to the laws of electricity. According to these same laws the mists became more and more dense and then only they began to get red hot, in consequence to the laws of condensation."

Here he shows the fallacy of the Nebular Hypothesis, and also his own inconsistency in reasoning, or attempting to

reason in English. He has evidently manufactured a law for electricity which is contrary to nature, compelling a body of mist to become more and more dense as it heats. This is entirely impossible, because as matter heats it expands and occupies more space and can never condense or contract until it begins to cool. There can be no such a thing as red hot gas. As soon as matter is expanded into gas, it is entirely colorless and remains colorless until it is illuminated by the motion of light, or crystalized by cold into solid matter. He does not tell us where the mists come from, but they are condensed gas of expanded matter beyond Neptune, where the new worlds are formed and inherit or continue the motions of the sun which the atoms of expanding gas never lost as it was gradually pushed out in every direction from the sun by continually expanding matter or radiation at the sun's surface. The upward pressure of this expanding gas from the sun has been measured by Prof. Peter Lebedew of Moscow, Russia. It leaves the sun's surface at the equator principally, which is its most swiftly moving part, and travels with the same speed (4000 miles per hour) from right to left, and travels in an ever-increasing orbit around the sun until it becomes so cold beyond Neptune, that most of it is condensed into sparkling crystals, great clouds of which can be seen in a zone at right angles to the milky way, and on the plane of the sun's equator. Upon this plane are the planets, satellites, asteroids, zodiacal lights, and most of the solid matter which is gradually falling back to the sun in continually decreasing orbit, increasing their speed around the sun in the same inverse ratio with which they decrease the diameter of their orbits. What little matter is condensed too far out from the plane of the sun's equator to be caught by the newly forming planets as satellites, is attracted to the sun independently as comets.


Still continuing his foreign remarks, foreign to logic as well as to the American language, he says:

"It does now not matter whether we agree with one of two possibilities: First, we may accept that this immense ball threw off the so-called planets, or we may say that in this mist there were found several centers. Astronomy does not pretend to say that the planets were cast off after the condensation of the whole mist, because this would be nonsense. No; during the formation of the mists and their condensation

to a dense gas, the planets were cast off, for the earth was, on its beginning, a ball of red-hot gas. Now nothing hinders us to admit that the so-separated balls were subjected to different influence according to their size and density. There is no reasonable cause why we should not understand the different celerity of rotation of different planets and their satellites."

Like the votaries of Bible lore, he is willing to change the meaning of what the Nebular Hypothesis says of itself, making a day mean 400,000,000 years if necessary, in order to make it conform to new discoveries and dodge ridiculous situations. I agree with him that the condensation of mists into gas is the veriest nonsense and so also is the whole Nebular Hypothesis as originally propounded by La Place. When a mist or any other solid matter changes into gas, it cannot condense, but on the contrary, expands and occupies thousands of times more space than it occupied when solid. There can be no such a thing as a "dense gas." It is an Irish bull and all his juggling with these "balls," to which he is willing to allow any motion without requiring a reason, is unnatural and childish.

True, there is no reason why we should not understand the motions of the planets and satellites and all other solid matter on its return or falling back to the sun, provided we understand, that as expanded gas, swelling up from the sun, it has and can never lose the motion it had when a part of the sun. As a part of the sun at the sun's equator each atom of gas has a speed of 4000 miles per hour from right to left, and when separated by expansion, it kept right on in that direction with the same speed. The best and easiest way to understand the motions of matter is to study carefully the beautiful and startlingly simple theory or more properly, now established fact, of a procession of planets. This theory recognizes that matter can be in either of three conditions—solid, liquid or gaseous, depending upon the amount of heat to which it has been subjected, and that it has two motions, i. e., expansion and contraction, which are caused by heating and cooling. It recognizes the fact that when returning solid matter falls back into the sun, the collision of its fall (see "Heat as a Mode of Motion," Tyndal, p. 492) and the chemical friction caused by its disintegration or reuniting with the matter of the sun, causes almost exactly the same heat which it cost the



sun to originally expand it into gas. It recognizes the fact that the heat thus returned keeps the sun continually supplied with heat to be radiated away as gas of expanded matter and thus points out the reasons of the operation of the Solar System so simply that a bright boy of ten years old may understand. It shows why matter is in ceaseless motion; that the falling of solid matter creates heat, which again expands it into gas and swells it up or raises its weight to the great heights of Neptune, so that it can condense and fall again to create more heat.

The editor then makes the following comments in order to show the situation, with himself on the fence as an interested spectator, where he has a right to be, of course.

"Mr. Heald is the editor of the magazine HIGHER SCIENCE, published monthly at Los Angeles, Cal. (price 10 cents), in the interest of bold and free scientific exploration and extension. All of his works are instructive and delightful to the free inquirer.

Dr. Bauer, whose article we heretofore published, is a German scientist of great learning and originality (now resident of Philadelphia), who has put out a "Freethought Hand-book" of science, which is largely based upon his concepts of electricity.

Whether either of these gentlemen have hold of the true genesis of the Solar System it may take a very long future to show. But the trouble with all these hypotheses seems to be that they do not account for the origin of the sun and its motions, etc., as a part of the cosmos or milky way. As to that, Prof. Langley's new telescope, correcting the scattering vibrations of the atmosphere by counter agitation, may help immensely. But are there not many serious affairs on our little planet to be settled first?"

I must especially thank the editor of *The Torch of Reason* for his high opinion of the scientific research of both Dr. Bauer and myself, but I also wish to call his attention to an article in HIGHER SCIENCE, Vol. I, No. 11, p. 4, in which I believe the origin of the sun and its motions are perfectly accounted for in a most simple and rational manner, tho I can not see that it makes much difference about its motion or how, when or where it got them. As I said once before in this magazine, "it no doubt come by them honestly, therefore, without the assistance of immaculate conception" (Vol. I,

No. 11, page 2). Like Editor Wakeman, I concede that there are many serious affairs on our little planet to be settled but possibly not first and that possibly an understanding and adoption of the Procession theory of the motion of matter by expanding and contracting is going to make many of them more simple.

CONSISTENT CHRISTIANITY.

Dear Sir: I am in receipt of your letter in which this question is asked, "Has a young man or woman of thoro and consistent Christian character a better chance for advancement in life than one who makes no such profession, and will such a one be more likely to be trusted in responsible positions?" Without hesitation I answer, "no."

During the past twenty years I have had a large experience with this class of young people, especially young men. The most thoro christian young man I ever had in my employ, went to the penitentiary for fourteen years and several others have gone for shorter periods. If they are thoro and consistent christians they will "provide not for the morrow," which advice, when tomorrow comes, leaves no alternative but starvation or theft. I find that the young people to be trusted, are those whose mothers were honest atheists or who became atheists or infidels by their own reasoning after arriving at the age of maturity. In all my experience I have never found a consistent young christian, either male or female with much intelligence and without intelligence no person can be trusted. In the city of Los Angeles a recent examination by a christian journal, the *California Voice*, shows that every prostitute without a single exception, are daughters of christian parents and the "Millenial Dawn" a religious book, page 163, shows by the parliamentary report of England for 1873, that while there are nearly as many infidels in England and Wales as christians (7,000,000) the proportion of the inmates of the jails are as follows: Catholics 1 in every 40, Church of England 1 in every 72, Infidels 1 in every 20,000. This has been about my

own experience in the matter and I find that the christian teaching, *i. e.* that a person who has lived a very wicked life and repented, will receive ninety-nine times as much notice in heaven as one who always did right (Luke xv. 7) has a tendency to demoralize and ruin the moral character of the young who are taught to believe that it is true. Young infidels are taught to do right because it is right; they are taught that if they do wrong they will be punished by nature here and now, and that is the reason that so few of them are in jail, when compared with christians. The time was, fifteen or twenty years ago, when people imagined that the cashier of a bank should be a goody-goody member of some Sunday school, but after thousands of them have defaulted and gone to the penitentiaries for all kinds of crimes in robbing the banks and public, the people have awakened to the fact that as a class they have less honor than any other, and it is now almost impossible for a young man who has Sunday school connections to secure any kind of a position in a bank. I would therefore recommend young people to steer clear of christianity if they wish to succeed in business. Be honest and you will be respected and trusted.

MOTION, NOT SPIRIT.

The following is part of a very interesting letter from a Pasadena lady who is not a member of the W. C. T. U.

“ . . . You spoke to me so kindly that I would like you to help me to know and be a thinker and worker for knowledge. If you could only explain to us our inner lives, explain its intricate workings Tell us why every epoch of the race has run the same round, with perhaps the same difference that you so clearly explain of the material planet, whose speed is ever in the exact ratio, according to its distance from its center of convergency. If all is matter outwardly and all is spirit inwardly, perhaps friend

Heald, your genius can discover that law; it must be there, waiting for some one to turn on the light of knowledge. MRS. M. F."

Our inner life is the motion of expansion and contraction which runs through our nervous system (HIGHER SCIENCE, Vol. I. No. 8, p. 10), vibrating the atoms of protoplasm of which it is composed. Its intricate workings are caused by the food we eat, the air we breathe and all the things we do, and the things we neglect to do, which can effect its motion. For instance, if we do not eat food, these ions begin to contract, *i. e.* get cold and finally crystalize and can no longer move or jar or vibrate each other, when consciousness gradually fades away and we are dead. In order to have consciousness which is life, the protoplasm which composes our nervous system must be in this colidial, expanded or warm condition, so that it can move. The disintegration or rotting of food furnishes the necessary heat by friction, to keep it warm and expanded. It is easy then to perceive that there can be no consciousness, therefore life, outside of a nervous system. True the motion of consciousness, which travels by impulse the same as the motion of light (see HIGHER SCIENCE, Vol. III, No. 4, p. 94), may leave our bodies and travel thru the expanded atoms of matter which fill space, on and on forever, the same as the motion of light, but it can never return to us any more than light can return to the sun. The gas of expanded matter can return to the sun when it is again solidified but light is not matter and neither is thot or consciousness matter. They are only motions which always move farther and farther away from the center of force by which they are vibrated. When this center of force is destroyed, there is no more vibration, thought or consciousness going out from it, tho in a sense we might admit, that the motion it made before it solidified, is going on and on thru space unconsciously, the same as light. If then there was a nervous system in a far away planet, sensative enough to receive the

motion, it might be received and understood by the far away nervous system long after the one sending it was dead. It is admitted that if we could leave the earth far enough (to the point where light has now traveled since that time), and had a telescope large enough to bring the scattered rays of light to a point at the retina of our eyes, we could see god still in the act of smashing the brains out of the poor little Egyptian babies against the door posts of their homes, and the terrible anguish of their parents, altho it has been thousands of years since it happened. It is not happening now in fact, tho if it ever did happen, the motion of the light from it is going on, farther and farther away (thank fortune or rather nature) forever, and will never return (thank nature also). Now this is the only way that it is possible for the motion of consciousness to live after the nervous system which produced it is dead, and I cannot see where there can be any "spiritual" comfort to be derived from the condition, inasmuch as the nervous system which sent it out is dead, solidified and perhaps disintegrated and can neither send out or receive further vibrations, and the motion which it sent out is unconscious and could, in any event, only transmit its motion to a living nervous system.



All is matter, both outwardly and inwardly except the motions of matter which I have tried to make plain. What we mistake for spirit is our consciousness; a force vibrated by the expanding and contracting of matter by heat and cold. much stimulating food or especially drink, which acts quickly and vigorously in heating our blood and expanding the ions of protoplasm, our consciousness becomes active to the verge of insanity, while the stimulant lasts. If we can change our minds by what we eat and drink, and we know we can, then it is easy enough to perceive the source of consciousness without calling in any far fetched spiritual mystery. All these things are becoming better understood year by year. What was god last year is natural this year, and what was spiritual last year is wireless telegraphy and telepathy this year. Some of the greatest mysteries of nature when understood, prove to be astonishingly simple and in fact we are finding at last that all the workings and phenomena of nature are merely the simplicity of truth, the expanding and contracting of matter by heat and cold.

Astronomer Heald, of Procession of Planets celebrity, recently discovered a new small but grand sun, but he is too modest to publish his good fortune through his own magazine, HIGHER SCIENCE, but I have it confidently from his own lips. The new body, though quite small, is visible night and day, apparently rotating with the earth, and seems nearly stationary midway between the eastern and western horizons, in the southern hemisphere of Los Angeles.
