CAUSES OF THE GLACIAL PERIODS EXPLAINED BY THE PROCESSION OF PLANETS.

According to the theory of a procession of planets, the planet Mars is just forming its crust (See HIGHER SCIENCE Vol. I. No. 10, p. 1 to 5), but being smaller than a regular sized planet (105*) has cooled faster and is really much in advance of what the earth or Venus were at the same orbit, because they are so much larger. I have pointed out the fact that Mars is almost a level plain and has no mountains (109) as yet, of any consequence, as shown by its scattered lakes and canals; and that its winters while they are a whole year long, only make small polar caps of snow, which quickly melt away when the winter pole is turned to the sun, notwithstanding that there is but one-fifth as much heat from the sun at Mars as at the earth. This must show that Mars is very hot within itself. Now as Mars continues to cool, we can readily understand that the ice and snow of the poles will reach farther and farther towards the equator during its long winters, and we have on our own earth the sure evidence that such was the case here, by the ice deposits in circles parallel to the poles. This happened millions of years ago when the winters were much longer altho the earth itself was hotter. It is so much colder at the orbit of Mars, that if any portion is turned away from the sunlight for a whole year it must be very cold indeed and we can see that altho the interior heat is closer to the surface the snow and ice would reach as far as the shadow line per-

haps and the annual deposit of iceburgs might easily reach the equator after the planet's crust became thick enough to allow the water of oceans on its surface. We can see that the ice from the poles of our earth at one time reached farther and farther towards the equator and that later as the earth neared the sun and the winters are shortening and the sunlight getting hotter, these lines of ice drift have again receded towards the poles and are now actually perceptibly receding; at least showing that they have been comparatively recently farther south from the north pole. Even tho the earth itself was much hotter, we can readily understand how this could take place when we consider the larger length of its orbit and the consequent longer time of winter. We know that even now the last part of the winter is the coldest and we can imagine how cold it would be if the winters were continued say three months longer, as they were when we were half way between our orbit and the orbit of Mars. At that position the crust must have been formed and the water a permanent fixture on its surface, so that nine months of winter would no doubt be a much greater producer of ice and snow, than say half as long a winter now, with $2\frac{1}{2}$ times as much sun warmth, even if the earth itself was hotter. The rings of drift are also good evidence of the former existence of the facts, which the conditions of such a process would force.

THE PROCESSIONAL THEORY.

Mr. J. S. Steiner of Lexington, Ky., asks the following questions regarding the theory of a procession of planets, which we believe deserve to be answered thru the magazine as they are important to new students of the theory.

1. Is all we know of nature, its phenomena or methods of motion? Do we know what an atom is or whether it really exists, or is it simply adopted for the purpose of explanation?

We know that heat must change solid matter into

gas of thousands of times greater bulk and we know that white light vibrates one thirty-nine thousandths times in the length of one inch, therefore our reason can draw no other conclusion than that they are one thirty-nine thousandths of an inch in diameter. [See HIGHER SCIENCE Vol. III. No. 4, p. 94.]

2. Is all nature matter?

It is matter and the motions or vibrations of matter. Light, sound, heat, electricity, life, thot, etc., are motions of matter.

3. Is matter eternal (uncreated) with all its properties and forces.

Matter is eternal, but its motions are made by its expanding and contracting by heat and cold.

4. Is matter composed of atoms of various sizes and kinds?

Yes, the atoms of white light vibrates 39,000 times in an inch (238). The atoms of solid matter are crystals bounded by straight and parallel lines.

5. Is force, matter in motion?

Force is the phenomena of expansion by heat in the positive and the falling weight in the negative condition. The expansion of heat raises matter up from its center of convergency and when it crystalizes or contracts it falls back and creates the same force (which may be any of the motions of matter) which it cost to raise it by heat.

6. [See 5 which is an explanation of the same.]

7. Is the source of all motion in our solar system from the sun?

The origin is in the sun, except what little comes as the motion of light from other suns.

8. Are heat and electricity, when active, manifestations of matter in motion?

Yes, and they are always active because only motions or the jarring of matter.

9. Does the sun throw out by centrifugal force the atoms of electricity and all other atoms, to the limits of our solar system, the atoms prevading all other matter?

No. All space and solid matter as well, are composed of atoms either expanded by heat or crystalized, and the phenomena of electricity is but a jarring or motion or vibration of these atoms having its origin or creation in the center where the force of expansion is produced. When we "make" electricity we must create the friction of expansion by force originally derived from the sun. Once having created or regenerated this force in the shape of electricity we can change it into any of the phenomenas of force by changing the rate of its vibration.

10. Is the constant jar or waving of the atoms of gas by the centrifugal force of the sun the cause of light?

It is caused by the jar of expansion of solid matter changing into gas at the sun as solid matter falls back and returns the force which it cost to expand and raise it originally. The only influence the revolving of the sun has on the atoms of expanding gas, is to give them the motion of an orbit around the sun from right to left which they never loose (32), even when crystalized into dust in the region of nebula beyond Neptune where the new worlds are formed by the gathering of this dust into bodies.

11. Are atoms of electricity and their movements the most subtile and interesting to the student of nature?

No, electricity is only a slower vibration of the atoms of expanded gas of matter, light being the most rapid, producing illumination.

12. Have atoms of the same kind an attraction for each other, a tendency to get together or crystalize?

Atoms are repulsed from each other by the expansion of heat and attracted by contraction or cooling. The force of contraction is magnetism which is proved by the fact that magnetic attraction can be destroyed by heat (expansion).

13. Does the sun heat the earth not only by radiation but also by putting in motion the latent heat here existing?

Heat from the sun is transmitted to the earth the same as light, by the vibrating of the atoms of expanded matter. It is the force which is required to raise matter by expansion transmitted to the earth causing the friction of vibration. [See HIGHER SCIENCE Vol. I. No. 12, p. 3. Law XVII. Also Vol. III. No. 4, p. 94 to 98].

IS THIS A THIRD FORCE?

The Phrenopathic Jol., of Bangor, Me., republishes our comments upon the "powerful it" which operate the human mind or consciousness and says:

"The suggestion of a 'spook' seems to have much the same effect on our good friend of HIGHER SCIENCE as a red rag on a bull; he sees nothing but the 'spook' until he has downed it. Sometimes he thinks he sees the suggestion of a 'spook' where it is not and he hammers away at his imaginary spookship with all the vigor of his energetic mind, as in the above instance.

"The 'powerful IT' mentioned in the quotation from *The Phrenopathic Journal* is, as Bro. Heald truly observes, 'not a mysterious spook at all,' nor was such an idea entertained by the author of the article from which the quotation is made.

"We have not had the pleasure of reading Bro. Heald's book explaining his theory of the 'Procession of Planets' and cannot, therefore, say how far we may go with him, but with all due deference to his scientific scholarship we must say that his brief explanation of the 'powerful IT' does not in the least explain.

"We fear that when he sharpened his spear (pen) and sent it after us that he forgot to finish what he meant to say, for while he very concisely described the *mode of action* of this omnipotent IT, he neglected to state that the omnipotent IT is an IDEA. We feel sure a clear thinker must have recognized the fact that the Creative Human Ideal is now and always has been that 'IT' which has directed the action of the universal substance.

. . . . "That 'all nature is dual; male and

female ; positive and negative ; contracting and expanding' is without doubt true. This thought is not new for we have ourselves been teaching it many years, and before we so taught it had been the teaching of others. But if this were *all there is* of creation there would be no varying forms of life and activity for in mere contraction and expansion without intelligence there could be no basis for varying formations of sentient life.

. . . . "Contraction and expansion are modes of force but the formative power is always an idea. No rational reasoning can disprove the truth of this statement whose truth is proclaimed in every existing person or thing."

We are ready to admit that there is intelligence, ideas and ideals in life (in motion, not creation) but that it is the expanding and contracting of the ions of the protoplasm of the nervous system, which forces this intelligence, and that intelligence is but a force. We have shown how the worm is forced to crawl back and forth [HIGHER SCIENCE Vol. I. No. 8, p. 11]. When he is hungry he is forced by the pain of contraction to crawl towards the light for warmth and to eat the bud (Vol. I. No. 10, p. 7) and we call it intelligence. When he has eaten it and it is disintegrating and thus furnishing him with heat (force of expansion) he is uncomfortable in the sun and is forced to crawl back into the shade for comfort, and we also call that intelligence. It is not instinct, universal intelligence or anything "spooky" which tells him to crawl or the direction to crawl to find heat, when he is cold, or to find cold when he is hot ; he simply feels it, the same as we can shut our eyes and tell in which direction is warmth or cold. We feel the force of heat or the absence of it. The first motion of life is fermentation (so is the last) as of course the *Journal* will admit, which is the force or expansion of heat and what intelligence there is in it, is therefore a part of the same force and the evolution of the body of the animal or man which comes from it and the evolution of its nervous system or intelligence, ideas and

ideals must be by the same forces, *i. e.* expansion and contraction. Now if an idea or ideal, or intelligence, is really a force outside of expansion and contraction of matter by heat and cold, and Bro. Close can prove it, he is entitled to the \$1000 which HIGHER SCIENCE always keeps on deposit for the person who will produce a force or motion of any kind made in any other way. What we want is to get at the exact truth, and the question is not who is right or who is wrong, but what is true. If "the universal substance (matter) is now and always has been directed by the human ideal" (even before there were human beings), instead of the human ideal being directed by the expansion and contraction of universal substance, it must be a third force; just what the 50 double headed eagles on our \$20 gold pieces are looking both ways for.

THE TRUTH ABOUT LIARS.

The man who insists on telling the truth, is always in trouble and must expect to be, because people do not want to hear the truth and especially when the line drawn by truth, leaves them on the side of dishonesty. From birth we are taught to evade the truth by implication, word of mouth, action and example. Every example set before us from god, up to the president of the United States, or the honest (?) old farmer who puts the big potatoes on top, are prototypes of exaggeration. The thotless people who are the great masses (we might omit the m) will always encourage and cheer the man who misrepresents and deals out mystery, and throw filth at the party who tells them the honest, simple and homely truth. God tried to deceive Eve when he said "in the day she eat of the tree of knowledge, she would surely die;" but for all that and that we all know he told her a hardhearted, baldfaced lie of the worst character, in order that she would remain his trembling, ignorant and naked slave, all the unthinking (m)asses fall down before the great deceiver and murderer god, and hate the Devil who told her the truth. Why do they

do this? Because ignorance and indolence hate the truth. Almost all history is made up of the exaggeration of the deeds of heroes and untruth. If it were true, people would not believe it, or at least say it was not true and befoul the character of the man who was honest enough to write it. Take the history of our own "cradle of liberty" (?) and we find the "father of his country," Geo. Such men as Thomas Paine, Thos. Jefferson, Stephen Girard, Robt. Morris and Geo. Washington did not pray as a means of removing mountains, mustard seed or other obstacles or at all, notwithstanding the lies told to the contrary by the charity bed beggars who run the churches and deceive the lower classes for what there is in it. No man with even moderate intelligence ever asked god to do anything expecting him to do it, since he made the earth round and that it was flat. People who pray either do so to deceive and rob others of less mental capacity or because of their lack of such capacity. Of course we all know in our minds, that the bible is made up in the main of impossible yarns of the doings of impossible beings, and yet the lower stratum swallow it all, and if you put the plain, simple truth before them they instantly reject it. What they

want is mystery and untruth. All the impossible lies and nastiness of the bible is what they want. They want mystery, murder, abuse and sham. They like to be humbugged. This is why a president of the United States can be ignorant, religious and popular with the masses. They enjoy things which are unreal. What shall we say of the truth and veracity of the present president. In a book he wrote, purporting to be history he says of one of the greatest men ever produced by American liberty, and we might better say, the man who produced American liberty—Thomas Paine: "Tom Paine was a filthy little atheist," not a single word of which is true and he evidently knows it is not true. On the first page of Paine's great work "The Age of Reason," he says: "I believe in one god and no more." An atheist does not believe in any god. Paine was neither filthy nor little. He was not born in a stable nor warmed by a manure pile. There was no *Will-o-the-Wisp* floating over his birth place and he had a legitimate father. The old saw which says "cleanliness is next to godliness" is a lie which should take the leather medal and wear horns. Cleanliness is so far removed from godliness that there is no resemblance. You will always find the godliness and dirt together in the colored belts, backwoods, slums and far away corners of the earth. The more ignorance the more mystery, superstition and piety, and the more piety the more nastiness. It could not be otherwise when we remember that the religion of god and jesus christ are laid on a foundation of nastiness and built up by one layer above another of nasty stories and the crimes of priests and preachers (25c). There are hundreds of stories in the bible (no doubt all lies) which would return a dog to his vomit if he could understand them, and there are few sows that would not return to their wallow in disgust. Why people of any intelligence at all would rather believe these false fabrications of nastiness, rather than the simple truths of science and experiment is one of the problems of human nature

almost "past finding out." What strides of advancement humanity and civilization would make if we would always require and act upon the truth; if we would learn to think right and then do what we should do. The great trouble appears to be mental laziness. The muscular system is of a coarser quality than the nervous system and therefore more easily propelled, and it is naturally easier for us to work than to think, so we fall into or remain in the old ruts and work our muscles at so many cents a day and let the priest tell us what to think, while he lives on the charity of our women. Thinking is however very much easier than work when the nervous system has been exercised and strengthened by the exercise of thinking, and this strength becomes hereditary and is transmitted. I consider the kindergarten our greatest hope as its exercises upon the baby mind do not fatigue but strengthen it, so that after a few generations of such education and the transmission of the strengthened nervous system we may expect men and women who will be able to think right without such great effort and fatigue, and when this millenium arrives it will be as easy to believe and tell the truth as a lie.

Dr. B. A. Wright of this city says: "I read of a girl a short time ago who was apprehended by the society for the prevention of cruelty to animals. The girl's crime was scalding rats that she caught in a trap. What should such a society think of a god who tortures human beings in a lake of burning brimstone forever, for not believing that which is inconsistent with nature and their own reason."



And sadder yet is the sight of sweet-minded little children taught to revere a being as to whose crimes no language can be too severe.—*Truth Seeker (London)*.

But the *Examiner* has a savant on its staff who declares that the *Science Monthly* expert is away off; that aqueous vapor was at one time assumed as present in space, but since two celebrated French scientists went to the height of 30,000 feet in a balloon, to experiment with the spectroscope, but finding no aqueous vapor, this assumption has been abandoned. Likewise it was contended that oxygen existed in space, but, when the spectroscope was turned on the electric light of the Eiffel tower, at Paris, a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles away, the same oxygen lines appeared in the instrument.

"Speaking under advisement, this organ is of opinion that

no gas can exist at absolute zero, which is the condition of space, as here considered. No heat—no gas.”

Of course it is a great relief to HIGHER SCIENCE. We were afraid some one had overturned the Processional theory but it is only a difference of opinion as to kinds of gas. We agree thoroly with the *Examiner* that “no gas can exist at absolute zero,” but we do not believe that such a place exists. 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
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
