EDITORIAL

THE APPROACH OF CHRISTMAS

THAT does Christmas mean to each of us? Let us consider this question. To some it means a happy recurring occasion of enjoyment, feasting, the exchange of gifts—a brief halt in the long term of winter. To others it is the celebration of the birth of the Holy Babe venerated by all Christians, no matter what their creed. To others it is a time of wistful longing for the coming to the moment of the birth within themselves of the Christ-Child. While to some others—blessed ones indeed—it is a season of rejoicing marking the already awakened and conscious Christ Presence within their own hearts.

Wherever we may find ourselves on this Spiritual journey to our own Bethlehem, let us begin to prepare for the Event with definite expectancy. It has been truly said that the Bible may be read from several standpoints. Let us trace some of the features of the Gospel stories of the birth of Jesus, applying them to His coming anew to us.

It is noteworthy that Mary, His Mother, pure and dedicated maiden though she was, had to remove from her customary habitation and go to another heightened state of consciousness before Her own Son could be born to conscious life. Once in Bethlehem, she sought shelter in one of the cave-rooms hollowed out in the rocks, prepared for humble pilgrims for whom there was no place in the Inn. Withdrawn from the come and go of the world—hid in a secret place—watched over by dedicated hearts, and by humble creatures—the Christ Child was born.

Let us learn from this story how to prepare for this Great Event. Let us rise from our customary mental state to one of definite expectancy. The seed of the Divine Child has lain within us for long ages waiting the ripening and fruitage. We have all longed for this birth. Let us realize that by cooperation with Divine Eternal Law we can experience this conscious birth within. can provide the atmosphere—the spiritual and mental location in which it may take place. 
And they came with haste, and found Mary, and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger.

I AM THE TRUE VINE

I SELECTED for my retreat this early spring morning the great vineyard that covers the sunny slope above Grenoble, and which commands a fine view of the rich valley and the beautifully-situated city below, and the splendid chain of snow-white Alps beyond.

I know I am now in the very heart of an immense vineyard. but it does not look like it. The scene all around me is like anything but a vineyard. For the vines all around me are the most unpromising, and almost forbidding things possible. black, dry, twisted, knotted, gnarled; hacked at the root with the vinedresser's axe, and hewn close in all their branches by his pruning knife. The truth is, the vines all around me, both roots and branches, are more like brands plucked from the burning, than living things with any hope of life in them. The apple-trees are already covered with snow-white blossoms. The cherry-trees and the plum-trees also are perfectly gorgeous with their gold and purple plumage. But it is only here and there that I can discover the smallest bud of green promise in all these miles on miles of vineyard. As yet though I have not been able to tell you the half of this hopeless looking scene, if you were to come to this beautiful land in autumn you would find this whole hillside simply groaning under its immense loads of gold and silver grapes.

This scene has called to my mind the fifteenth chapter of John's Gospel. For in that most beautiful chapter our Lord says to us that He is the true vine, that His Father is the Husbandman, and that we are the branches. Now, when we read that, and think about what we read, we at once see that our Lord was indeed the True Vine in more ways than one. Do you remember what the prophet Isaiah said about our coming Saviour hundreds of years before He was born? "And there shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. For He shall grow up before Him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground. He hath no form nor comeliness, and when we shall see Him there is no beauty that we should desire Him. He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised and we esteemed Him not." Just as I

would have despised these vines all around me this morning had I not known better.

When our Saviour actually came to this world, all that and much more than all that, was fulfilled in Him. For He was born into a poor man's house. He was early put to His father's trade and worked with His hands till He began to be about thirty years of age. But all the time and in spite of appearances, He was the True Vine, and He was all the time under His heavenly Father's husbandry.

"I am the true vine, and My Father is the Husbandman." That is to say, no vine is ever a vine of itself. Every vine, if it had a tongue given to it, would say what the True Vine here says. It would say that it was the husbandman who had made it what If I am a vine at all, it would say, it is all due to my husbandman and not at all to me. And herein is His Father glorified, when the True Vine lays Himself down in this Scripture before His Father's feet. His holy birth, His holy upbringing, His holy life, and now His atoning death, which is at the door; all the planting, and all the watering, and all the watching that went to the production of the True Vine, is all recollected, and acknowledged, and comprehended by our Lord in that one word of His: "My Father is the Husbandman." "I the LORD do keep it," the Heavenly Husbandman had said as He administered His holy providence all through the earthly life of His Son. "I will water it every moment. Lest any hurt it, I will keep it night and day. Only let Him lay hold of My strength. Israel shall blossom and bud, and fill the face of the world with fruit." Till a whole world of untold things that had passed between the Father in heaven and His Son on earth, is all wrapped up in this one acknowledging word of our Lord: "My Father is My Husbandman." Think of all that also, all you thoughtful disciples of the Son of God.

Words would fail me to attempt to tell you the express and the immense comfort that came to me that Sunday afternoon in that vineyard above Grenoble. As I walked about among those hard, dry, hopeless-looking branches all, as it seemed to me, ready for the burning, and as these words of my Lord were then and there shed abroad in my heart, "Ye are the branches,"—what a comfort came to me! For that moment, as I remember well, and will never forget, every hacked and hewn and hopeless branch around me

suddenly took to itself a tongue and spake comfort to me. "Come back soon and see us," they all said. "Come back and eat abundantly of our golden grapes in their season. Let not your heart be troubled" that whole vineyard broke out all around me in a concert of faith and hope and full assurance to me. "Keep up your heart, sir," their thousand voices said to me. And I did it, till I came home singing the fifteenth of John to take up my own husbandry.

IN THE PRESENCE OF THE LORD

I HAVE sometimes thought that Leaders lay too great stress on meditation periods and on the Silence, conveying to some perhaps the impression that only during these specially dedicated periods we may, and do actually find God in real communion and conscious Presence.

Many years ago the Inner Voice made clear to me that always during crises the still Voice of Inner Spirit may be definitely heard if one listens; that spoken guidance is always forthcoming if one acknowledges the possibility of it: that during the crisis of death this loving Voice tenderly reassures one of safe conduct, of the Father's care and of Life Eternal: that if one trained the inner ear to the note of Spirit one might pass through the crisis of death conscious of the change and in joyous companionship, making it indeed a Holy journey.

I learned quite definitely of just the evidence of the function and activity of Spirit from an automobile crash. It seems worth relating as a sure witness of God's great care and Ever Presence. I speak of it with a sacred thrill of heart and soul and mind.

After the impact of an almost head-on collision I did not know on what plane I was functioning. Presently I became aware of the Joy of The Presence—the Inner Presence in body and mind. My first, my only awareness was this absolute consciousness of The Presence, and accompanying this was a healing Radiance flooding me with a confidence in the fullness of Life. Words, actual words of care and comfort and healing, combined with a joy so overpowering that it wiped out all physical pain, though there were fractured bones, gashes, bruises and all that goes with such an experience.

I speak solemnly the truth when I say that the joy of the nearness of The Presence was so overpowering that all physical pain was dissolved and utter calmness of mind reigned. Not for one instant was the mind or the body in panic. The ALL was in all. The hospital was not reached for considerably over an hour. There was transfer from the car that gathered us up on the highway to another car better suited to the need of wrecked bodies. Throughout the entire experience there was no pain. There was never any pain.

Through this experience I clearly entered a higher consciousness where physical distress is dissolved by Divine Love. In this consciousness I was held all through the surgical work. Make no mistake, it was not just bearing all that had to be borne, physically. It was not by affirmation, it was not by determination of mind. There was no thought or effort connected with it. It was an expanded consciousness and an experience of joy and happiness that extended into the mind of every cell of the body. The inspiriting of the body during years of dedication bore fruit and was in actual evidence.

I thought I knew before this experience what to abide in the Lord meant. I thought I had learned throughout the years to rest in the Lord really and actually. Now, I know that one passes from glory unto ever greater glory in the knowing of God.

A door opened on the highway that evening which to me leads ever to Light and more Light. Through this Light all life is seen at a higher level. There is no uncontrolled life after one enters this level of Spirit and Power in the Presence of the Most High. Ever after one must, by virtue of the Holy Radiance, be a Light Bearer.

THE STORY OF CHRISTMAS

NO OTHER institution, secular or religious, has taken such firm hold on the popular mind of all ages as that—now known as Christmas—which centers around December 25th, with its attendant gaiety and spirit of giving. For many centuries Christmas has been associated almost exclusively with the doctrines and dogmas of Christianity. The early fathers of the Christian Church exhibited a remarkable ability for adapting the festivals and services, as well as the basilicas, of the many religions which it superseded and which held a festival similar in many respects to our Christmas. Christmas Day has come to be regarded as the exclusive institution of the Messianic idea to such an extent that very few people have any thought of the origin of the festival, which has been lost, so to speak, in the dim recesses of the ages.

Its original inception was through religious channels, with a beginning that dates back to the remotest antiquity, to the very dawn of human civilization. Divested of its modern significance, the 25th of December will be found to occupy a very important position in the history of all the great world religions.

Man's first attempt to give his aspirations concrete form when he was groping blindly toward a knowledge of something which he felt intuitively was infinitely greater than himself, a personality of which he was but the creature, found its original manifestation in the development of a form of astronomical worship which for many thousands of years in Egypt, India, Persia, and China, dominated the religious and philosophic thought of the ancient world. These aspirations which gave rise to a worship of the heavenly bodies—aspirations common alike to the lowest savage who carves his deity out of the trunk of a sapling and of the modern cultured man, who, as a concomitant of his own existence, accepts the postulate of a Creative Intelligence—were not only the outgrowth of his ignorance, but were the first steps which led to the last and most wonderful of revelations embodied in the person of the gentle Nazarene.

To the ancient priesthoods scanning the heavens nightly on pylon and terrace tower from the Nile to the Euphrates, the stars told a wonderfully dramatic story. To those silent watchers of the night are we indebted for our astronomical year and the calendar much as we have it today. Indeed, practically all of the basic facts on which our modern system of astronomy is constructed are due to the work of many centuries of patient investigations by those priests.

They constructed the zodiacal circle of the heavens, dividing it into 360 degrees and four right angles of ninety degrees each, and into twelve signs of thirty degrees each, known as the constellations. These last were named according to the climatic changes taking place upon the earth at the time the sun was passing through them. Thus, from the storms and rains of January (it must be remembered that the weather conditions in southern Asia are tropical) the group of stars through which the sun passes during this particular month of the year is called Aquarius, the Washer, or Baptizo.

In February, the constellation receives the appellation of Pisces or the Fishes as a result of the accumulating waters which leave in their path famine and distress. In March, Aries, the Lamb, signifies the young products of springtime. In April, typifying the energy of the agricultural season the constellation receives the name of the Bull. The apparent reconciliation of winter and summer in May, when the blossoms and flowers appear, gives to the constellation through which the sun then passes the name of Gemini, or the Twins. In June, the seeming retrograde motion of the sun dubs its sign Cancer, the Crab, and so on, all the signs receive their appropriate names—Leo, the burning heat of July, the Virgin of August, the Scales of September, the Scorpio, or Great Dragon of October, the Archer of November, and the Goat of December.

From this celestial scheme the ancients mapped out a great drama, with the stars and their various time divisions as the principal actors which kept the stage throughout the solar year. In this group the sun (the sun-god) was of course the principal figure because of its life and light-giving properties. When he enters the sign of Aries, or the Lamb in March, he crosses the Vernal Equinox and becomes the Redeemer of the World—that is, dispelling darkness of winter and restoring the earth to fruitfulness, healing the sick and feeding the multitudes.

His divine mission is now begun. His career reaches its fullest glory between July and August, known to the ancients as the marriage feast of Leo and the Virgin. From now on, his mission seems to be evenly maintained during the reign of the Scales of September until he reaches October when he encounters the Great Dragon, Scorpio. Sorrow and lamentation prevail. The Solar Saviour must now be Crucified on the cross of the Autumnal Equinox—this is literal, taken from ancient rituals—and he descends into the South—the Hell, Pit, Sheol, Acheron, and Hades of many nations.

He is now between the two evil months, November and December, which like the Two Thieves, suffer with him on the Cross of the Autumnal Equinox. Just as Midwinter—the winter solstice—when the radiance of the sun is so feeble as to appear almost stationary, the ancients announced the reappearance of the Virgin of summer with her companion constellation Bootës or Joseppe, and from the fancied resemblance of a cluster of stars which to their eyes resembled a manger, during the ascendancy of Capricorn, the Goat, they announce the reappearance of the Sun-God as a newborn babe, December 25, once more given to mankind to give the blessing of bounty.

This in brief is the drama mapped out thousands of years ago and which has formed the groundwork of all the systems of theology which have since been erected. This traditional birth of a saviour on the 25th of each December looked forward to throughout the entire solar year and accompanied with a celebration of the celestial gift by feasting and exchange of gifts between the members of the human family, has come down to us through the creedal forms of all ages. Hence the births of the personal Messiahs and Saviours of all great religious systems have been claimed by their followers to have occurred on December 25th.

The name Christmas, Krystmas, Christ-masse, etc, has several origins. The term Mass, from the Latin, signifies a harvest, gathering the honey, bringing in the fruits of the reapers, and in one sense, notably that in which it is theologically used today, a sacrifice of the "greatest gifts." The Mass is an extremely ancient ceremony, greatly antedating Christianity, and always used in one or more of the meanings given above. Among the Greeks and Romans, it was used in the ceremonies of their Temples, and in

connection with the Astronomical worship. Thus the Venus Mass, Saturn and Jupiter Mass, and among the Algonquin Indians, the oldest tribes perpetuated the observance of the Moon-Mass.

Christ (from Chrestos, the "good one") is the name of the Great Sun Spirit, the Highest Initiate of the Sun-Period of human evolution and has been attached from the earliest times to Jesus, the name of the last human personification of the Sun-god (Son of God) drama, and thus the curious interweaving of the ancient astronomical ceremonial with the later philosophical idealism of Christianity has been continued down to the present time.

It is interesting in connection with this subject to trace the origin of the legend of St. Christopher and the personification of the Santa Claus of childhood which unfortunately seems to be dying out. Probably no event is so important to the youngsters as the annual arrival of Santa Claus and his reindeer team, laden with gifts for all good children, a tradition which has its origin in some of the old legends of Northern Europe.

St. Christopher was the Saint and Patron of Ferryman, a man of fine physique, markedly handsome, and a profound scholar. He suffered Martyrdom and torture under Decius, having been originally a so-called pagan, baptised by Babylas, Bishop of Antioch. Through his later life, he sought One greater than himself, to serve. Christopher attached himself to the services of an unbridged stream, carrying over those who were unable to cross alone. A Child presented himself. Christopher took him upon his back. As he progressed, the burden became very heavy. Christopher at last exclaimed that the whole world could not have been heavier. On reaching the other side, the Child said unto him, "Marvel not, for thou hast indeed borne the whole world and Him who created it."

In America no special custom outside of the Christmas Tree and the customary exchange of gifts can be said to prevail, but, in England, the Yule log or Christmas Block is still the signal for the annual gathering of all the members of a family group. In the cosmopolitan cities of America the observances of the Christmas season is marked by most gratifying conditions—the gradual breaking down of sectarian prejudices. It is not so long ago that the permitting of anything of a social or festive nature in connection with the gloomy ideas of puritanism with its plain, barewalled

churches, devoid of the esthetic embellishment of art, would not have been tolerated and would have subjected the offenders to the censure of the rigid elders and the custodians of the public morals. Now Christmas trees with their blaze of lights and colored globes bring happiness into the hearts of thousands of little ones annually, and happiness reigns supreme for at least one day in the year, in millions of homes throughout the land.

Sect cooperates with sect in the effort to bring the sunshine, for which the Christ-child stands, into the homes where darkness now prevails, and it is especially noteworthy that this same spirit of the day is being gradually adopted among the Jews with whom it is not founded on any special religious dogma.

In this brief glance backward through the long centuries, during which this custom has obtained, we may feel sure that, whatever may have been the origin of the day and the manner of its perpetuation through Christian ideals or even its possible future development, it will always remain an enduring institution, permanent because founded upon principles which make for a broader humanity, spreading the gospel of cheerfulness, charity, and love—the attributes of the Great Sun Spirit after whom the Day is named.

GOD gave His only begotten Son to this world on Christmas morning.

Jesus gave His ministry in the flesh, His victory on the cross, and His triumph over the grave as His present to the world.

In humble appreciation I offer myself; it is all that I have to give.

I promise to work patiently with my Soul, my mind and my body until they are cleansed of every last vestige of faith in that which is not God-like: that which, being not of God, is not real.

I promise to nurture my Soul, my mind and my body and to work with them, and to pray for them incessantly, as a mother tends a growing child, until the fever of doubt and unbelief is forever stilled, and I AM is established in me in the positive knowledge of the nothingness of the negation and the ALLNESS OF GOD.

THE DIVINE IMAGE

THE IMPERSONAL WORK as a whole is based on the consciousness of the Divine Image, or Son of God, living His life in and through man and in man's endeavor to train his human instrument—the mind—to cooperate in bringing forth into outer manifestation God's Will on earth as it is in Heaven.

Man being a threefold being, therefore there are three different and distinct phases of God's Consciousness within man, and in the life, thought and action of every man these phases show up, and classify him, revealing in which phase he is living.

These are Aspirants and they will soon know Him because of their earnest aspiration and faith in Him. For that urge that causes faith and earnestness is the very consciousness of the Divine Image pushing itself forth and preparing the way that He may come forth and be to the Aspirant what He is already to the Disciple.

The human mind of the Aspirant is a wonderful artist and has gathered from Science, Philosophy and Religion, as well as from life itself, the material from which to mold a mental image of God or Christ. He has painted within his consciousness a beautiful picture of God, of Christ, and of their Kingdom. It is natural, is it not, that the Aspirant's God should seem to be outside or above him, because of the fact that the material used in molding the image has apparently come from elsewhere? But let us remember that it was Very God Himself, through the Divine Image within

PREPARATION FOR INNER WORK

"MY FATHER worketh hitherto and I work." So said our Great Examplar—"The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he seeth the Father do." Let us in meditation ponder on how the Father works—"As above, so below." In prayer and contemplation let us open ourselves wide to some perception of how the Father works. Let us imagine—image—how this may be. Pondering, dwelling, remaining in this awareness—the possibility of performing in minature a similar creative function in our outer world of manifestation will dawn upon us. So we too may work together with the Father.

First let us begin with our own unregenerate nature, and then with our circumstances in home-life or in business. In these preparatory and purgative realms, let us create and outmanifest a minature Kingdom of Heaven. Having been faithful over a few things, the door of opportunity will open whereby we may become rulers over many things, in the wider spheres of our community, our country and the world. But none may hope for the wider dominion who has not first laboured faithfully and prayerfully and to some extent begun to win the victory over his own composite nature, viz: his body, his emotions and his mind. Every student, no matter who he is, and indeed every master, no matter how high his attainment—must tread, or has already trodden the same path, and every step of this path without avoidance.

there was no safe, swift flight into an enduring Christ Consciousness. He must recognize that it is easy to mistake a "zeal not according to knowledge" for the divine afflatus of Spirit.

He will learn that devotion and enthusiasm and zeal are not enough. He must KNOW HIMSELF, and detect in his personal make up that which may misinterpret or distort or stain the white radiance of Infinite Truth. This is what is meant by surrender.

There are many ways in which Inner Work may be and is already being accomplished, dependent on the extent to which the Disciple is coordinated with and obedient to the indwelling Christ. But right now there is, as never before, an urgent need that such workers, individually and collectively, should be "instant in prayer and meditation" for this trouble-wracked world.

As phases of the rapid change of alignment of forces on this earth present themselves, let the earnest Disciple first of all divest himself of all outer mind, opinions, or possible prejudices, laying these aside, as "the shoes from off his feet," and so prepare to enter the Holy of Holies. Laying aside all vagrant thought or personal emotion of any kind, let him see himself as a radiating

center of the Light which is the Life of men. Let him accept full-heartedly Jesus' words "YE ARE THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD." Let him then turn towards the selected problem, knowing without a shadow of questioning that he, himself, is a beacon light shedding the Will, Wisdom and Love of God on the problem. Let him pour in all the vitality of his devotion, aspiration and love for humanity, knowing that where this Light of Truth enters there righteousness, justice and good will on earth are brought into manifestation and the phantoms of injustice, hatred, evil intent, vanish. Let him consider for a moment the power of mere physical light turned on in a dark room. Let him. by the use of his imagination, stir his faith and ardor in recognition of the stupendous power available when the light of Spiritual Wisdom is turned on a problem. Let him realize that in a flash of thought, unknown and unseen, he may stand in the counsel chambers of the great of this earth, at one with God. He may uphold every effort towards the establishment of the Kingdom of Heaven on earth. However, let him remember that true and potent power lies alone in selfless love and in complete Impersonality which means that momentarily, at least, he must cease from judgment of right and wrong. He must stand above the pairs of opposites and allow the Light of Truth to make its own adjustments in the affairs of men.

EARTH SICKNESS

IT MAY be perceived that what we call the Earth, is but a great mass of consciousness, consisting of every phase of being, from the mineral state of consciousness, up through the animal and human, on into the etheric, astral and mental states.

Everyone who has done any thinking knows that what makes the mineral state is its slowed-down and very dense vibration; the animal a more quickened and forceful vibration: the human a higher and a "self conscious" vibration. While water, fire, air, the etheric, astral and mental states, all have their own distinctive vibration, each definitely in evidence on its own plane of consciousness.

Science has admitted that minerals have life, and their chemical reactions to each other indicate they have intelligence, which of

course is evidence of consciousness. Therefore we can see that the consciousness that is in all the different kingdoms of matter that comprise our Mother Earth is inextricably interrelated; in fact, it is the same consciousness merely active on its different planes of expression—mineral, vegetable, animal, human, etc.

It can be likened to the consciousness of man, whose consciousness, as we have shown, is really the soul of man; but it acts by directing the life expression of the minerals in the bones and teeth; of the vegetable nature in the nails, hair, eyes and ligaments; and of the animal nature in the flesh and blood by directing the life expression of all of them through the human mind—the soul's outer reflection.

Can we say that the soul of the Earth does not act in a similar manner? Let us show you how it must so act. First let us realize that the Earth, and all that is a part of it, is an entity, just as a man is an entity. That means the physical part of the Earth must be the body of that entity, and that the humanity upon it must be its brain. The soul of the entity must then direct the life expression of all the different elements in its body through the soul's outer reflection, the mind of humanity.

Therefore, whatever is the dominant consciousness in the mind of humanity is bound to affect and influence the consciousness of the cells in different parts of the Earth's body; even as the dominant consciousness in a man's mind is bound to affect and influence the consciousness of the cells in the different organs of his body. "As a man thinks, so is he," applies as well to what humanity as a whole thinks.

It is generally known by Truth students, metaphysicians, and by many doctors, that thinking untrue thoughts about life, one's self, God and things in general, feeding those thoughts with fear, worries, anger, bitterness, hatred, jealousy, condemnation, etc., or, in other words, thoughts and feelings always centered around self, wholly regardless of others' feelings, inevitably cause inharmony, sickness or disease of one kind or another in some part of the body, as well as in the general condition of the one so thinking.

In like manner must such thinking on the part of the bulk of humanity result in inharmony, sickness or disease in one form or another in some part of its body—the Earth. There is no question but what our old Mother Earth has been very sick during the past quarter of a century. What with the great war of 1914-18, the numerous earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, tornadoes, and now this great depression which she is feeling, it seems as if she has come down so low that the crisis of the disease has been reached. And nearly all her doctors fear for her recovery.

It is not difficult to trace in the different symptoms what the disease is, from which she is suffering. What was the great war but the breaking out in great festerings sores of the bad blood caused by the poison of selfishness and greed eating its way into her most vital organs—the various nations. What are the earth-quakes but the quakings of her soul at the evil thinking and actions of her humanity caused by its ungoverned selfishness? What are the volcanic eruptions but the poison of selfishness cumulating in enormous carbuncles and then bursting through earth's nature trying to free itself of this poison? Are not tornadoes the forces of the unbridled passions of certain sections of humanity running amuck? And what is this depression but the soul's giving up all hope of life—of recovery, apparently thinking the Spirit is about to depart because of such universal selfishness, and that Spiritual death must result?

But it remains to be seen what will be the outcome. Even as in the case of a man, sickness in humanity is caused by the battle between the forces of good and evil ever struggling for possession of the soul of the consciousness. And we know that good always prevails in the end.

Therefore those who have eyes to see, look not at the symptoms or what appears in the outer, except to determine how near the disease has run its course, knowing that the Life within is doing everything possible to throw off the impurities that have been befouling Its expression.

And they also know that Life is now being aided by certain faculties of the soul of humanity or certain Groups of powerful Spiritual Workers—that are now able consciously to co-operate with the Life within, and that will soon rid the consciousness, which means the whole earth body, forever, of all hindering influences.

THE RIGHT HAND TURN

WE CONTINUE to receive questions regarding the significance of the Right Hand Turn. We are asked what events should mark this change of direction and how one may know if he has satisfactorily made that change.

Some do not realize that dates marking the beginning or ending of an epoch, or a time-period, may not be accompanied by dramatic outward events such as are chronicled by the press. We must remember that Spring blooms into Summer. Summer ripens into Autumn. And while actual dates mark each change-over, yet the passage from one season to another is gradual in its accomplishment.

However, every alert and clear-minded Student has no doubt already noted many signs of the times taking place rapidly in his own life and nature, as also in the world around him during the past weeks. From our own observation, we trace definite happenings in the affairs of individuals and of the greater affairs of this planet, that show clear signs of the quickening change that is in process. We would refer our correspondents to the Editorial which appeared in the September issue of the INNER LIFE Magazine, entitled "Choose Ye," as it was written to lift thought from any watching for dramatic outer happenings to the necessary preparation of the heart.

We share with our readers the following comment from a spiritually enlightened observer:—

"In the article in the September issue, "The Right Hand Turn," there is given a very sane explanation of the date of October, 1938. Too many have believed that at that date great startling things would happen—just as they expected would occur on September 16, 1936. While outwardly nothing very startling happened in 1936, all the same we entered on that date into a new cycle.

Do not let us forget that the spiritual consciousness of the "Earth Spirit" was raised on that date at midnight: the consequences of which will be felt only by the mass of humanity in due time. The Elect are working with that influx of power now. And in time it may prove to be true that humanity passed an important sign post in October, 1938. The time between October, 1938 and June, 1942, will be a time of Illumination for those who respond to the increased vibration, but it will also be for undoing of

many. According to the Elder Brothers of the Rose-Cross, by 1942 the New Order of Things should be established.

My personal viewpoint is: Why should we worry about dates? All true Initiates know the time is close at hand. What difference does it make, ten years more or less? The point is, to be ready to face the "Big Parade" at any time, if necessary tomorrow morning, and to be ready, when necessary, to help clear up the wreckage, and usher in the New Order of Things—the Theocratic State, the Christian Commonwealth."

Search to perceive the Divine in any particular individual. It is not a situation to avoid but to court, for what it can bring to you in self discipline, love and Soul discernment.

We advise that you do not make efforts to arouse the sixth sense. These inner faculties have undoubtedly been ours in past lives. But these faculties are in abeyance—in many—in this life because we are gaining the dominion of Spirit in the realm of the conscious mind. Ponder this significant fact and you will see that there is a profound reason why you do not have this inner sight at this time. Your Higher Self is determined to have the control and the use of your whole outer being in full awareness. Note the editorial on SOUL AS CONSCIOUSNESS in the November issue of the INNER LIFE Magazine.

You have a great future of service ahead of you but do not rush the work of our Course, because you are building the foundation, brick by brick, and never should have to return to strengthen it.

We are glad to have your letter and in answer would say, that the Impersonal Teachings are not, in any way, an attempt to avoid facing reality. But what is reality? In its final analysis it is that which never changes, or the true unalterable facts of the Nature of God and man and the Cosmos. What your friends mean by reality however is probably the changing conditions of sorrow and joy, health and disease, poverty and riches, that surround us in this ever-changing world. Therefore, the term "reality" must be defined before a true understanding can be gained.

These troublous conditions may be altered in many ways. Sometimes legislation temporarily improves them; economic conditions definitely affect them. But all attempts to benefit them, change as rapidly as the phenomena of poverty and disease themselves.

We do not deny that the world is filled with trouble. But we know that this trouble is, in part at least, caused by fear of it, or by the acceptance of existing conditions as inevitable, or by agreement with the beliefs of other people, and that they may be changed by positive thinking. That is to say, by thought based on the unchanageable reality of God's nature: by a recognition that God is ever-present and His Power ever-available.

From the standpoint of the ordinary person everything is real which he perceives by means of his senses, or of which he hears and accepts as being true. But students of the power of thought, and religious believers have discovered that these effects may be changed and indeed removed by going to the root from which they spring. It has been proved that disease can be checked and wiped out by the power of prayer, and also by the action of right thinking.

As you proceed with the study of the WAY OUT Course, you will find that these questions will become much clearer to you because we do not offer merely a means of escape or avoiding any issue, but we also outline a definite means of controlling a situation creatively. We believe that you will find it wiser not to discuss these subjects too much with people who do not understand or agree with your viewpoint until you are more surely grounded yourself. THE STUDENT'S CORNER

FROM time to time, we hope to give under this heading, interesting experiences sent in by our Students, or answers to Questions in the Correspondence Course Department, which we think are of general interest.

THE WAY OF DISCIPLESHIP

"THE Aspirant or Neophyte stage . . . 'I will arise and Go.' This is the stage in which the disciple to be feels the first stirrings of his awakening soul as the wonderful truth dawns upon his consciousness that there are heights and depths of realization of which he has never dreamed and now he resolves to arise and go, to seek until he finds that which will satisfy his need though he knows not what it is . . . yet.

"The disciple on Probation . . . "and he arose." The disciple has started on his journey—having carried out his resolve—and started. It is yet to be seen if he will perserve to the end despite the many difficulties he will meet on his journey back to the Father's House. Until he proves that nothing will weaken his resolve to travel to the end, he is a disciple on probation.

. An accepted disciple has proved that he is in earnest, that he is, truly putting the Kingdom first. Consequently, invisible helpers guide him on his way. He is lovingly guided on his journey. He learns to love the Christ within and to serve Him only and on his journey listens to the voice directing him in service for others. 'While he was yet a great way off, his Father saw him and ran to meet him,—and provided him not only with food and raiment but luxuries."

"The journey back to the Father's House is a mental journey because it means mind control and discipline. The mind is but an instrument for the use of the Higher Self and it must be trained to efficient service, so that it willingly and quickly responds to the command, Be Still. The practice of daily Meditation is very necessary to acquire this. This is necessary also to teach the mind to accept and try to understand, without rebelling against new Truths that are given it. The Greatest need for daily mediations is, however, to acquaint the disciple with the Master Within. He MUST be able to shut the sheep, the wandering, straying sheep of his thoughts securely into the fold and learn to know and recognize the Master's Voice as surely as did any sheep that ever followed David."
