We have come together to express, to exercise, to witness that we are still "holding the fort"; that we are still determined for God to be recognized here upon this earth; and that this earth, among the innumerable planets, is still the property of God, for His Own to inherit, for His Own to use, that God's designs may continue to be perpetuated even in a moral sense, in the objective, for to that end the Infinite Intelligence issued forth from out of its own Pivoting Point: from out of its own Center it has entered into the circumference of Infinitude, there to prove limitlessness of possibilities. For this purpose the Intelligence has entered creation, exercising the creative energy to the fullest extent of exhaustion, filling Space with planetary systems. These planetary systems, retouched with Infinite Thought, call out designs; these designs take on form through processes of evolution, to which processes of evolution there is no end. They are continuous wherever substance turns into matter, matter taking on forms according to

Infinite designs; all the lines of evolutionary processes at last collecting into forms, so as to prepare an abiding place suitable for the Infinite Intelligence to carry out its plans and reach in matter the same estate as enjoyed in Spirit. Such is the object, end, purpose; such are the designs of Infinite Intelligence. Were it not so, then all the operations through the processes of evolution, then all the exhaustion of the creative energy, would prove useless, futile, valueless. But God is not a failure; the God-Intelligence cannot miss the mark; His designs are Infinite; the Goal must be according to Origin—its Beginning, the First Cause.

And to us, each and every one of us, once we find within our being all these processes and operations of evolutions and creations exhausted, a new realm opens; there where one thing ends another rises. And what of that Intelligence within us? With the processes of the creative energy behind us, the evolutionary processes crystallized before and about us, what may the third step within and amidst all operations be? Misuse and abuse of the evolutionary accomplishments? Destruction of what the creative energy has brought forth? No! Then what is our next step? It is by virtue of the beating of the heart and the operation of mind that He lives on and on, generation upon generation throughout eternity. Then, God, to live, can live only through us. If we do not realize the meaning, the purpose and the object of life; if we do not find the thread of life, as to its beginning, its presence, its object, its purpose, its goal-then God does not live. And that is wherein we can agree with the atheist; that is wherein we can occupy the platform with the materialist, "There is no God." There is no God in matter; there is no God in substance; there is no God in space; there is no God in form, for God, to be such, must be conscious, must be alive. The rock is not conscious, neither is the plant, nor the animal. The plants are not conscious of the chemical compounds that fill Space, for where there is no consciousness of itself it does not know whence, where, or how it came, or whither it goeth. But man, he does know, and in that knowledge, in that understanding, God is present—He lives. And thus, from the atheistic platform issues a theistic platform. From out of substance, a Being that is capable and able of witnessing the presence of God. "Ye are the temples of the Living God."

But are there no temples on the outside? Perchance there are, but at best they are such by name only, for even the prophet of old admitted, he who received it by virtue of inspiration, that "God will not live in temples made by hands." No, He will not be confined to cathedrals and chapels. He will not be confined to edifices, though costly they may be. though the architecture may be grand, the handiwork within handsome, though to accomplish such work necessitated a great deal of energy and exercise of ingenuity; after all "God will not live in temples made by hands," for He has made unto Himself a tabernacle; He has created unto Himself a form; He has shaped it according to His own likeness: He has had His own ideas about it as to where He would make His abiding place. Thus as Moses in Genesis says: "In His own image, in the image of God created He him; male and female created He them." That there may be no doubt about it, that He can manifest not only in the form of the male but also in the form of the female, yea, that none may say God manifests only in the male, and that none may say that God manifests only in the female principle, Moses defined it: "Male and female created He them!"

Ainvahita, the incarnnation of love and wisdom, lived at the cradle of the Aryan Race, while yet evoluting out of the Yellow Race, consequently, she carried within her bosom the ancestral ties of all preceding races. 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Harmony Course Sixth Lesson

T N THIS COURSE of study we do not work espe-L cially for the repairing of the body but for the tuning of the same. It is the getting in tune that we want to accomplish, so all our exercises in this work must be toward that end. It must also be a mental training. In sounding the vowels that represent the scale, similar to the musical scale on the piano, we must be sure that we are making the sounds with the right positions of the mouth, also that we are making that distinction between the one and the other sounds mentally. When a musician learns a new song he first goes over it mentally, that is, he makes himself mentally familiar with the new piece before he attempts to execute it on the instrument. Likewise, we must be sure that we can make the mental distinction of all the sounds and their relation to each other before we can execute them properly and promptly. As we think the vowels and at the same time sound them, we place the outer being and the mind in harmony with each other or the musical system.

It is the object of this work to bring up this body to the requirements of the inner and finer forces of

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our being and thus establish the needed and required harmony, so that the hidden world may express itself through the visible. There is no need to develop the inner forces; they are all ready to use as soon as we can bring up the body to that state of refinement and sensitiveness, where it will and can respond to the finer forces. We do not have to develop the soul, the mind and the spirit, they are all ready to be used, but the body is not in a condition to respond in such a way that those hidden powers and attributes can manifest as they should and would do so as nature proposed and intended. We know that an instrument, although new and although from the factory, is of little worth until it is taken to an expert tuner and put into tune; then the value is placed thereon and not before. As long as it is not tested as regards to its harmonic adjustment, it cannot be used correctly by anyone.

SO IT IS WITH US. We may have whatever is necessary to know and realize all there is in the universe, but as long as we are not in tune or harmony we cannot use the powers that are within us. We do not know the secrets of nature that are for our use. We cannot climb to the great heights and know the workings of the innermost forces until we have so tuned our bodies that we can at any time and upon

the shortest notice throw ourselves into harmony with anything and everything that we want to fathom and know. In order to do this, the connecting cords must be set into vibration, and we must know how to do this. When we have forgotten some tune or some melody or some name that is familiar to us, we cannot think of it for the time being, it means that we are not able to touch the cord that makes the mental connection. At some other time when we are thinking about that particular thing or person, it will come to us all of a sudden and we remember. This is due to the fact that at that particular moment something in our surroundings has touched that cord, and it began to vibrate, and the name came to our mind. As a matter of fact we have all had the experiences of seeing things clearly at times that were or seemed supernatural, that of hearing things all of a sudden, when we would least expect anything of the kind. It is all due to the connecting cords being set into vibration by something in our environment that we are not consciously aware of, and for that reason it is not in our control to produce the same sensation at will, because we do not know the laws and have not the control over ourselves that is necessary to bring about these results.

From these experiences we learn that the memory

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of things that we have known is there all the time, but we do not know how to make the connecting link that is necessary to bring any detail of the past back to us. All of this can be done scientifically and conscientiously. All we need to do is to bring the muscular system up to the requirements where it becomes a fit instrument for the finer forces to work through it more advantageously, and the desired realization is assured. To do this we should refine and so purify this physical instrument, our body, that all the finer forces can work and express through it. All knowledge is at our command, for it is within us and only needs to be given the opportunity to express itself through this physical manifestation, and the way to the past and all it ever held is ours to recall and use. All there is in the universe is at our command when once is established this harmony that we call the tuning of the bodily instrument. But without this tuning we remain dense and ignorant, no matter how we work or how many years and ages we spend in the hardest kind of study. Even in our ordinary studies, it is in this way that we can obtain that which we seek, although it is very little, for we do not get at the bottom of things. In the ordinary college course, for instance, we are required to study some of the languages outside of the mother tongue, and in that

way, by using the vowel sounds of the other languages, there is an opening in the brain cells that enables us to comprehend something that we would otherwise be unable to grasp. So what little we acauire is derived in this way, yet we do not realize it. When we once commence to arouse the brain cells by means of the operations of the effect of the scale of sounds as presented in this Harmony Course, we can progress so much faster and work intelligently, where we only stumbled and failed before. Our senses will presently become so keen that we can see, hear and understand much that was before incomprehensible. We shall be able to get into the spirit and essence of the things that we want to fathom by having so cleared away the obstacles, that we can consciously connect with the thought realms of the mind, soul and spirit, and then we reach the real entity that we are. The ego or entity has gone through all the changes of time and eternity and belongs to the very beginning of the manifest world and knows whatever has happened from the very beginning of time, "To see all that is, was and ever shall be."

It is the coming into close touch with our own entity that we shall be able to come into true relationship and know other things and other beings. When we once know ourselves, all our component parts and the workings and the purpose thereof, we shall then be able to compare these with the workings and the relationships of other things and beings, and know them as we now know ourselves. Because we are an offspring of the earth as terrestrial beings, we necessarily correspond to our Mother Earth in the way of bodily structure. We have a structure of bones like Mother Earth. We have a cavity for all the vital organs, so has the earth. We breathe and move, so does she. We are a finer composition, but the similarity in the principle is there and it is through this similarity of principle that we simplify matters so wonderfully. We do not need to study each being in detail; all we need to know is the working thereof, the principle of life under different conditions, and the detail solves itself of its own accord. When we know that the same law works everywhere, and that the same results are due to follow the same causes, we can grasp at once a multitude of things that come under the same basic rule, and we thus comprehend the principle that operates throughout creation. In watching the pitch, the volume and the effect of the sound we produce, then we so train the mind to bring into harmony and into operation the inner workings with the outer, that we can observe the operations of mind on matter and vice versa. By watching the positions that are necessary to produce certain sounds, we get into the law of sounds, how they are made and how modified. This tells us the nature of the beings that produce certain sounds. We can tell at once, for instance, when we hear the roaring of the water in the ocean, that it is not the sound that the water in a river would make. The lake sounds still different, and the waterfalls again sound different.

Knowing the secrets of producing the higher and the lower tones, the sounds, we can soon distinguish by the sound that a creature makes where he belongs. Some of the wise of the earth have spoken of hearing the grass grow; this can actually be verified. Everything that is in the universe has its own peculiar sound, its own keynote. We will become so on the alert after a time, that we shall be able to tell by the sound of things to what category they belong, for we shall be able to get into harmony or unison with the same sound of things under consideration. It is the essence of things that we know and understand when we know the origin and purpose of the same. When, for instance, we get into the neighborhood of the tantalous plant and hear the strange sounds it makes gliding so calmly, we at once know that it does not belong to the ordinary line of plant evolution, for its sounds take us back to the slimy

region of the fern, and the watery and sunless places where the thing came from, where it projected itself from the water onto the land, and then crept along and along, until it finally became a plant, still retaining the former propensities to subsist on such life that it would and could make its prey. So we know at once that it did not come through and by the regular course of the evolutionary processes of the plant life in the plant world. Consequently, it does not come to us under the regular order or any classification of the regular plant life but stands alone and by itself as a product of the destructive elements in nature.

Thus it is with all sorts of things and beings. We shall be able to tell what is the genuine creation and what is counter-creation, even among the human beings that we meet. We shall be able to tell by the sounds they make where they belong and we need no longer be deceived by the professional charlatan. The point is, naturally, that we must learn to know our notes of harmony so well, learn to distinguish the sounds in our scale so perfectly, that all the parts to which they correspond awaken and become alive with vibratory action. Then we can tell at once when we hear or see something that does not belong to the ordinary category of things or beings. A thing may appear as silk, but we shall know at once that it is only an imitation, and from whence it came.

Faithfully we shall keep on doing our exercises and therefrom reap the benefits. Why should we get into the attitude of feeling depressed or blue? We should not allow such a feeling to take possession of us, for it behooves us to become master of ourselves now. The body is becoming more adjusted to conditions and for that reason we are not right in tune or in harmony. We should just commence to whistle or to hum and to keep it up until the unhappy feeling is gone, to never give up but persist until the victory is gained. We can pick up the body mentally and make it come to time. Even though we are weak, it does not take much effort to hum or whistle a tune, and to keep it up until the entire mental attitude is changed. We can hum according to some little melody using the vowels "Il Elohims," using this in addition to all the others previously given. When the body is so attuned that it can express the real voice, thought, mind, soul, spirit, and entity, then the glory of life will be gained and life will become a glad sweet song, to which nature will furnish the accompaniment.
