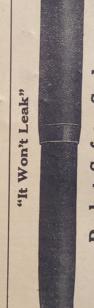

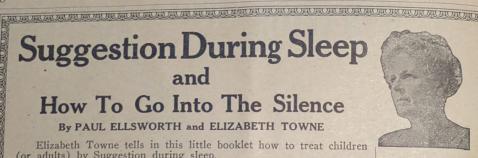

NEW THOUGHT is the school-master to bring the individual unto the Christ within himself. Once finding the Christ within, the source of truth and love, then life becomes a continual evolution of the fine art of living.

The first thing that the New Thought does when it gets hold of you, is to turn the world right side up for the first time in your life. You begin to see that the real things of life are not *things* at all: that the *things* of life are ephemeral, fleeting, illusory, ever changing and giving place to something better.

You come to realize that the real things of life are unseen: they are ideas, thoughts, emotions, principles. Paul told you that two thousand years ago, and it is only just beginning to percolate!—"the things that are unseen are eternal, the things that are seen are temporal"—which means temporary or changing.

New Thought keeps you continually reminded that all your powers, your wisdom, your ability to do, comes from the unseen and real side of life, and expresses or reflects itself in the world of things.

New Thought sets you to realizing your infinite supply of ideas, will and wisdom, with which you can work out in the world of form all the things you desire. "Whatsoever things you desire when you pray believe that you receive them (now) and you shall have them."

The words, "When you pray," simply mean when you turn to your infinite

self, to God, as the source of what you desire. "Prayer is the heart's sincere desire," uttered God-ward. And many times we utter our prayers God-ward when we don't realize that we are doing it.

Occupational Diseases.

NEW THOUGHT first makes over your mind, so that you see the world in its true relation to yourself, and to all other human beings.

From this comes instinctively a new adjustment of yourself to the experiences of life, relieving you of strain, physical and mental.

With a new understanding of life come new ideas, new inspirations, new ways of doing things, which rest soul, mind and nerves.

THROUGH new understanding of life comes a new adjustment of the individual to his environment and to the universal.

And this new adjustment is a fluid thing; it is the flow of life itself from the universal through the individual and out into the world of things.

In the old thought man is ever conscious that environment makes the man; but in the New Thought man's ideas are busy with the true understanding that it is man who makes the environment that makes the man.

This fills the individual with the joy

of thinking creatively, of doing good work, with the certain knowledge that what he desires is sure to be fulfilled, if the desire persists and if he faith-fully insists.

In Memoriam.

THIS is to ask the readers of Nautilus to send their most loving and Good-Willing thoughts to bear up the soul of Mildred Bohmer Bailey in the New Life which she has recently entered.

You all know her in spirit, if not in name. For several years she has been sending her best love and Good Will to all the *Nautilus* family, in her capacity as my own secretary. And many of you know her by name, for she has answered hundreds of the letters of inquiry which have come to me. And many a letter of gratitude is now resting in our files, elicited by her answers to these

questions. She took care of all my correspondence when I was away on lecture trips. She wrote book reviews, signed M. G. B., many of which are still to appear in our columns. She helped arrange *Nautilus*, and hundreds are the mishaps in makeup which she has saved us and our readers.

For more than one-third the lifetime of *Nautilus*, Mildred Bohmer, since 1914, Mrs. Harry Bailey, was actively connected with its activities.

She worked her way from the lowest position in the office to the highest and most useful place ever held by one of our employees.

Her position was a special and individual one which she herself largely created by her own initiative, versatility, executive ability and loyalty to the business and to her employers.

She was deeply interested in everything connected with *Nautilus* and the New Thought movement in general. She was almost as familiar as myself with the name and work of every prominent New Thought teacher, healer and writer.

Her warmest sympathy went out to those perplexed ones who from time to time seek the advice of our Family Counsel department. The answering of many of these appeals was a regular part of her work.

Her place can never be filled, though of course her work goes right along growing, by the life-momentum she gave it plus the will, wisdom and love of others who are already bearing it on.

For the crowning virtue of a good helper was hers: she so organized her work that others could pick it up anywhere without a break.

Mildred Bailey was essentially and always a friend, not an employee. We

ourselves thought of her as friend and she treated us as friends. She was not only my right hand but she was also heart and head for me, and an extension of my ideals and purposes for good. She multiplied me by two. And she was loyal and faithful to a fault as well as brilliant, versatile and reliable. She was one of the most unfailingly good-willing and persistently kind persons I have ever known intimately. She was closer to me in spirit and in my daily life than any other living being outside my immediate family and I am heartbroken over her untimely death. She was too vital and radiant a personality to be cut off like that.

What Was the Cause?

M ILDRED was only twenty-eight vears old. Nobody realized there was anything serious the matter with her until the week she passed out. She sat at my right at our annual banquet at the Nonotuck Hotel, Saturday evening, January 20, though she was not feeling very well. She worked nearly all day Monday, with a "sore throat" coming on. I told her not to come in Tuesday but to rest up. Monday night she was taken to the hospital, where she died Friday morning, her husband and her father with her. After fearing first diphtheria, then scarlet fever, the doctors settled on "quinsy sore throat" and "systemic intestinal toxemia" as the cause.

I think the latter came nearest the truth, and that it had been coming on a long time, due to the strain imposed by the responsibilities she faithfully carried, for the *Nautilus* family, as well as for her own loved ones. (She had no child of her own.)

Her Good Will was so great that no-

body realized she was flagging seriously. Now we see that she was "run down" under duties she had assumed as new joys and had carried years enough for them to wear channels in her brain and body that drained her life forces too low. She had not been "throwing off" fatigue poisons fast enough.

The joy of doing had settled almost unconsciously into the habit of doing certain things.

"The joy of the Lord" God within thee "is thy strength" to do anything.

Mildred "needed a change" six

months ago. I see it now. She forced herself to keep on earning for the plans she made with and for those she loved. Her husband and her father wanted her to rest. We gave her shorter hours and time off.

But it was not enough, and nobody realized what was happening.

Nobody could know she was pushing herself beyond her strength except herself. God was warning her, through her flagging powers, her tiredness at night, night after night; God warned her to change her work.

But she *loved* her work, she loved her husband, her home and the ideals she was working for. She ignored the daily repeated warnings of *God within* her, the occasional warnings of relatives and friends.

And nobody realized until too late what really was happening: that for some months she had been living on will power instead of life power. And because she did not realize it she "laid down her life for her friends." Greater love hath no woman than this; and love is the "greatest thing in the world."

But greater wisdom we can all gain

from this tragedy—that is why I am telling you about it—wisdom to:

- 1. Heed the repeated signs of flagging energies within ourselves.
- 2. Change our work, that the *habit-ually* used nerves may rest, recuperate, regenerate; while unused areas are being developed and vitalized through new activities.

For our bodies are *intelligent* organisms, and we should heed their demands and change conditions when necessary.

How and Why New Thought May Help Along a Tragedy.

A PARTIAL knowledge of any subject may be a dangerous thing.

When it comes to the subject of how to live long and well no human being can rightfully claim more than a partial knowledge. We may know that the law of being is self-expression, or God-expression, but when it comes to applying that law to our daily problems we all make mistakes.

We are like Peter, learning the art of walking by faith on the waters of materiality.

We are venturing on the "brittle edge of the moment."

We are skating on the thin ice of experience over the unproved depths.

Many of us go down into cold waters of serious sickness and come out again, wiser by a little more knowledge as to how to apply our New Thought. Twice I have done this: once about eight years ago when I "demonstrated over" nervous prostration—with the aid of a doctor who taught me a few things about diet; the second time, in the winter of 1914-1915 when I "demonstrated over" neuritis—with the help of a second M. D. who rubbed in what the first

taught me and added a compelling lesson on exercise.

Both these lessons I meditated upon in the silence, long and oft, and the results I am passing on to our readers from time to time.

Out of my own experience I cautioned Mildred repeatedly not to push herself too far, to listen to the demands of her body as INTELLIGENT demands, to treat her body fairly, as one human being should treat another. She tried to, she thought she was making change enough to relieve the strain. I took her word for it. If I, with my experience, could have got inside of her and heard first hand her internal complaints I might have known what was coming, and forestalled it.

On the other hand I might not. Why didn't my first serious illness enable me to forestall the second?

Affirmations That Inhibit Pain.

A FTER much going into the silence I have come to this conclusion:

New Thought or Christian Science positive statements of being may be applied so persistently that they practically silence for the time being the little voices of the organized intelligence that knows the needs and limitations of the body. The Word of Truth Absolute may be used so exclusively as to obscure the fact that too great and prolonged strain is being imposed upon the body. Sickness and even death may thus come without warning, or nearly so, because the "I-Am-allright and-cando-as-I-choose" affirmations have actually inhibited the messages of local disease which would otherwise have come up to the consciousness with sufficient insistence to compel attention.

It is my belief that William James

died because of this very attitude of mind. I have heard of a number of Christian Science practitioners and one or two New Thoughtists who have gone out, from the same cause, as I believe. Not to mention the numerous lesser examples of sickness that did not eventuate in death.

Doing Violence to the Body.

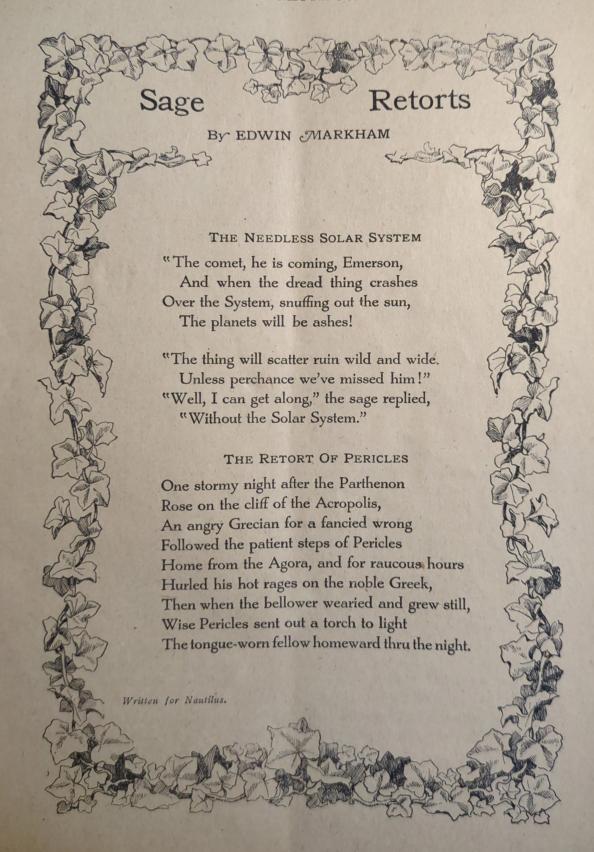
It is a mistake to do violence to the body by defying persistently all the laws of COMMON SENSE: i. e., sense common to the mass of human beings, based on consensus of human experience and judgment.

And it is a mistake just the same, whether we do it from sheer ignorance of common sense, or from a Christian Science determination to declare all common sense as fool-sense, without intelligence or truth!—for that is what it amounts to, as I see it, to say the "laws of nature" are "carnal mind," non-existent in truth.

If they are "nothing," they should be ignored and abjured instantly and wholly.

If, on the contrary, the "laws of nature" are what I believe they are: i. e., an expression of as much of the divine law of being as man has proved out by experience and reason; a consensus of experience and judgment, of the one divine law of being, then they SHOULD BE RECKONED WITH IN OUR THINKING AND ACTING.

In connection with this subject I shall have more to say in April Nautilus, showing the Christian Science point of view and the New Thought one, and applying it to the social body as well as the individual one. My secretary's experience has again impressed me with the importance of this message,





TAKING GOD INTO PARTNER-SHIP

THE new thought of God takes God into partnership, and then it is "we," not I."

The very consciousness of being reinforced and buttressed with infinite power, supported by infinite wisdom will give you a wonderfully increased sense of power, will enlarge your life and multiply your effectiveness, because it will take away from you all that sense of uncertainty, the feeling of your helplessness to buffet the storms of life, of hopelessness in the presence of overwhelming odds. It will give a new meaning to your life because you will know that you are not a victim of Fate or a gamble with destiny, but that your life is founded upon infallible fundamental principles. You will then know that if you want success you must take the material into your mind which will build success.

There is surely something wrong when multitudes of the sons and daughters of the King of Kings, who have inherited all the good things of the universe, starve on the very shores of the stream of plenty, of opulence unspeakable, which flows past their very doors and which carries infinite supply.

God's children were not made to grovel but to aspire; to look up, not down. They were not made to pinch along in poverty, but for larger, grander things. Nothing is too good for the children of our Heavenly Father; nothing too beautiful for human beings; nothing too magnificent for us to enjoy. It is the narrowness of our thought that has limited us. If we had larger and grander conceptions of life, we should attain grander things. We are made in God's image and we are His children and as His children we are heirs of all that is His, all that is beautiful and useful in the universe. The very holding of the mind open toward all the good things of the world, expecting and appreciating them, will have everything to do with our obtaining them.

There is nothing which the human race lacks so much as unquestioned, implicit confidence in the Divine source of all supply. We ought to stand in the same relation to this Infinite Source of things as the child does to its parents. The child does not say, "I do not dare eat this food for fear that I may not get any more." It takes everything with absolute confidence and assurance that all its needs will be supplied, that there is plenty more where these things come from.

We do not have half good enough opinions of our possibilities; do not expect half enough of ourselves; we do not demand half enough, hence the meagerneses, the stinginess, of what we actually get. We do not demand the abundance which belongs to us, hence the leanness, the lack of fullness, the incompleteness of our lives. We do not demand royally enough. We are content with too lit-

tle of, the things worth while. It was intended that we should live the abundant life, that we should have plenty of everything that is good for us. No one was meant to live in poverty and wretchedness.

Suppose a boy should try to become a lawyer without expecting to be admitted to the bar, or while really believing that he would ever amount to anything as a lawyer. He would fail. We tend to get what we expect, and if we expect nothing, we get nothing. The stream cannot rise higher than its fountain head; no one can become prosperous when he expects or half expects to remain poor.

The man who is bound to win believes he is going to be prosperous; he starts out with the understanding with himself that he is going to be a successful man, a winner, and not a loser. He does not say to himself all the time, "What's the use? The great business combinations are swallowing up the chances. Before long the multitude will have to work for the few. I do not believe I shall ever do anything more than make just a plain living in a very humble way. I shall never have a home and the things that other people have. I am destined to be poor and a nobody."

There is no philosophy by which a man whose mind is filled with fear of coming to want or horror or failure can attract the thing which will relieve him, because he is facing the other way, he is working for one thing and expecting another.

The man who is suffering with fear because he does not know where the next dollar is coming from is in no condition to earn or to attract dollars. Fear always makes a man think he is weak, a nobody. It always pictures the worst; sees no light ahead.

It is the man who has faith in himself, in his own resources, and who spends his last dollar fearlessly because he knows the law of supply and is in touch with a flow of abundance, that gets on. The one who spends his last dollar in fear and trembling and who always carries a vivid picture in his mind of the wolf at the door is in no condition to conquer poverty.

There is a very intimate connection between the thing we fear and that which will come to us. According to the law of attraction, the habit of expectation or desire, tends to draw to us what we concentrate upon.

When we think of a thing, when we hold it in our minds, whether we love it or fear it, admire or dread it, we establish relations with it and tend to work it to us.

Everybody ought to stand erect with face toward the sun of hope and prosperity. Success and happiness are the inalienable rights of every human being. Let your ideals be those of plenty, of abundance. Let us hold the thought that God is our great supply; that if we can keep in tune, in close touch with Him, so that we can feel our at-oneness with Him, the great Source of all supply, abundance, will flow to us and we shall never again know want.

Lack and want do not fit man's divine nature. The trouble with us is that we do not have half enough faith in the good that is in store for us. We do not dare fling out our whole soul's desire, to follow the leading of our divine hunger, and ask without stint for the abundance that is our birthright. We ask little things, and we expect little things, pinching our desires and limiting our supply. Not daring to ask to the full of our soul's desire, we do not open our minds sufficiently to allow a great inflow of good things. We do not fling out our soul's desire with that abundant which trusts implicitly-and which receives accordingly.

We are not dealing with a Creator who is impoverished by granting our requests. It is His nature to give, to flood us with our heart's desire. He does not have less because we ask much. The rose does not ask the sun for only a tiny bit of its light and heat, for it is the sun's nature to throw it out to everything which will absorb it and drink it in. The candle loses nothing of its light by lighting another candle. We do not lose but increase our capacity for friendship by being friendly, by giving abundantly of our love.

One of the great secrets of life is to learn how to transfer the full current of divine force possible for ourselves to ourselves, and how to use this force effectively. If man can find this law of divine transference, he will multiply his efficiency a millionfold, because he will then be a co-operator, co-creator with divinity, on a scale of which he has never before dreamed.

When we recognize that everything comes from the great Infinite Supply, and that it flows to us freely, when we get into perfect tune with the Infinite; when the brute has been educated out of us and the dross of dishonesty, selfishness, impurity, cleaned out of us, we shall see God without these scales which now make us blind to good; we shall see God (good), and we shall know good, for only the pure in heart can see God.

One of the greatest evils of the world is the belief in the necessity of poverty. Most people have a strong conviction that some must necessarily be poor; that they were made to be poor. But there was no poverty, no want, no lack, in the Creator's plan for man. There need not be a poor person on the planet. The earth is full of resources which we have scarcely touched.

The fact is, we live in our own worlds, we are creations of our own

thought. Each builds his own world by his thought-habit. He can surround himself with an atmosphere of abundance, or of lack; of plenty, or of want.

Resolve, that you will turn your back on the poverty idea, and that you will vigorously expect prosperity; that you will hold tenaciously the thought of abundance, the opulent ideal, which is befitting your nature; that you will try to live in the realization of plenty, to actually feel rich, opulent. This will help you to attain what you long for.

Many people keep themselves poor by the slavish fear of poverty, allowing themselves to dwell upon the possibility of coming to want, of not having enough to live upon. The minds of the children in such families are saturated with the fear of poverty; they hear of it from morning till night. They see povertystricken conditions everywhere. They hear everybody talking about limitation, lack. Everything around them suggests poverty.

Is it any wonder that children, brought up in such an atmosphere, should repeat the poverty-stricken conditions of their parents and environment?

Did you ever think that the terror of poverty, the constant worry about making ends meet, the fear of that awful "rainy day," not only make you unhappy, but actually tends to bring about the conditions that disqualify you from making real progress?

True prosperity is the inward consciousness of spiritual opulence, wholeness, completeness; the consciousness of oneness with the Divine source of abundance and infinite supply; the consciousness of possessing an abundance of all that is good for us, in material things, and a personality of character which no disaster on land or sea can destroy.

THE REMEDY FOR MEDIOCRITY

WE ARE indebted to Dr. McCosh for the analysis of an emotion, and according to the principles set forth by him, I would suggest there are four phases to an inclination, or spring of action manifesting as in skill, facility, accomplishment, aesthetic, artistic or other specialized expression:

1—The inclination or original idea, or cause.

2—The reason or incentive for wishing to express the idea.

3—The feeling aroused by the desire to express the idea.

4—The physical manifestation—the result.

A simpler formula would be:

1—The idea.

2—The motive.

3—The emotional state.

4 The expression.

If I have a desire for musical expression, it is evident there exists in my mental combination a certain inclination, bent, or aptitude toward music. I proceed in the usual way to realize this inclination, but find after much patient toil and lavish expenditure of time I am able to give only feeble ex-

pression to what I consider a great passion or desire.

Upon reflection I discover that my devotion and attention have been centered almost wholly upon what I have been trying to produce instead of the cause that prompts expression in a muscial way. Therefore my efforts are doomed to failure, or are at least indifferently colored. I use this merely to make clear the point I wish to emphasize. The principle applies to any natural adaptation, and I conclude that the reason for mediocrity or indifference in expression is that too much attention is centered on results (4) instead of causes (1).

It is a well-known principle in psychology that any faculty or phase of the mind responds at once to attention and inclines to bring about the condition suggested by the form and quality of such attention. Applying this principle to the development of an inclination we find that in order to realize the fullest, freest and best expression attention must be given the idea itself—the wellspring or fountain-head, which is the first of the four phases named. If too much attention is given the second phase, the primary cause is apt to be obscured. Too great development of the emotional phase leads to waste of energy and weakens physical expression. If physical expression ranks first in importance, results are spiritless, technical or mechanical.

I think every one will agree that the faculties or phases of the mind, or peculiar points or qualities, are very sensitive, and ordinarily require little to either suppress or stimulate; so if there exists a purpose to develop a quality, the kind of attention that should be given it is of first importance.

The strongest element in the human organization is attachment. Every one is attached to various persons ideas or

objects so that nearly all action of whatever nature finds its prime cause in an attachment of some kind. generally speak of attachment as love, and this term expresses more clearly than any other the strength that may be found in human attachment. It is impossible to imagine the different ways this power expresses itself, and if it is considered a matter of sentiment by some it is well to note that the most fervid enemy of sentimentalism, the callous, the stern, the hard-hearted, the indifferent have ideas and objects to which they are devoted. So we see at once that we are dealing with a force and not a sentimental fancy.

This idea of attachment, which is a quality of singular power and strength, we may with equal facility apply to our mental faculties, powers and properties as to exterior things. If the imagination will permit one to assign a personality to each mental quality whether of the form of a gift, endowment or special inclination, or any quality which may be of service in building, fortifying or strengthening the character, the power of attachment or love will be found to be wonderfully effective in developing such quality. Results then as produced in physical expression are superior in effect than when attachment or devotion is centered upon the result. This too, is in contradiction to the besetting weakness of limiting, belittling or underrating one's mental powers and qualities.

Radiation proceeds from a center. We would consider it unwise to attempt to intensify radiation by applying force to any other than the source from which radiation proceeds. Let a talent, gift, endowment, capacity or inclination represent centers of radiation. Let attachment represent a force. Apply the force to the source from which the

predilections spring, and the impulse toward expression is so powerful that it becomes almost irresistible.

I pour the quality of love without stint into the passions I wish to develop. The effect is electrical. Instead of laboring arduously to produce the things I wish, I find that I can scarcely check the impulse to express what I feel. I know, of course, that to acquire familiarity or facility to a perfect degree with anything or in any direction, patient and ceaseless application of objective attention is necessary, but if I can intensify the cause with love, the reaction is automatic, and my effort is given without thought of drudgery or labor. I apply the power wherever I chooseto my mental faculties, to my physical members, to my desires, to my emotions, to whatever gifts I may have. I find placed at my disposal an instrument of great power, and I proceed to apply it systematically and with intention to develop and expand my consciousness and my possession. Life, rejuvenation, exhilaration, follow immediately.

We may feel that the idea may be disposed of by considering it merely suggestion, or the effect of suggestion. We might with equal facility dismiss the thought of wireless telegraphy, or the electric light, or the telephone, as merely the effect of electricity. Suggestion resolves itself to the simple process of planting an idea in the subconscious mind. But ideas vary to a wide degree in force, subtlety and power. Effective results cannot be obtained by the application of suggestions which do not represent forceful ideas. As love or attachment conveys the idea of infinite power, it follows that if it is concentrated on the mental and spiritual powers an immediate response will take place, because the more potent the idea suggested, the more definite and powerful the effect.

9. THE GIFT OF TONGUES.

WHEN we gain the power to go beyond ordinary human experience we meet many strange possibilities; and among them we find the possibility of contacting all kinds of states
of life or action that obtain upon the
deeper, the higher or the finer planes of
being. And during such conscious contact we not only receive, as if by inspiration, direct information concerning
those states of life but also give expression thereof in various modes and manners.

We know that some of the greatest productions in art, music and literature have been the result of direct inspiration; that is the mind contacting the higher and the finer realms of action, thought or melody, and giving expression thereof in a tangible manner. And this power constitutes one of the phases of the Gift of Tongues, the reason for which we shall understand presently.

When we examine this possibility, we realize that it becomes a source of much power, knowledge, scientific information and even higher wisdom; and we

shall also find that it is not an uncommon gift. The truth is, that the majority have this gift to some extent because whatever our state of development may be we frequently contact through consciousness, inner or finer planes and give expression to ideas or thoughts that we never worked out in our own objective mentality.

Indeed, we all are to some extent, living in touch with those states of life and action that are beyond the ordinary; and almost at any time light, wisdom or melody may come forth from those higher realms in our own consciousness; and we may give expression thereof just as if we were speaking through inspiration.

We know, through personal experience that we frequently think things, write things or say things that seem to have come into the mind by themselves; or that seem to have arisen into consciousness without our knowing exactly where or how the phenomenon took place. Indeed we all have experiences of this kind every day; and it is such experiences, together with a number of kindred phenomena that have been described in sacred literature as the Gift of Tongues.

When we consider life as it is in all of its immensity we find that there are innumerable modes of expression and as many channels through which speech, audible or silent, may find its way to the conscious world. But back of all expression we find first, innumerable sources of life, action, thought and melody; and back of all these we find the Word. And to become conscious of this one source—the Word—and at the same time have the ability to give expression to the Word in any number of ways or modes, this to be gifted with diverse kinds of tongues.

The Gifts of Tongues implies the power to express life in many ways, or

to bring forth our understanding of things through many channels. But to apply this power, consciousness must be in touch, at least at times, with the One Source of expression, and must almost continuously be in touch with higher or finer planes of life and action; in other words, to be conscious of the Word and give expression in many ways to the meaning of the Word.

And herewith we should remember that the Word does not merely represent thought expressed in speech, but represents every phase of consciousness, however expressed, whether in thought, in speech, in ideas, in concepts, in music, in art, in formulated states of mind, or in any and every mode of personal expression—or through the fine arts of living.

Briefly, the Word is the coming forth of the All that is in the soul; and as the one Word embodies all the qualities, desires and aspirations of the soul, we realize that when the Word is expressed in many ways, or in all possible ways, we will not omit a single mode of expression, from the simplest actions of conscious living to the highest expressions of music, thought, truth or wisdom. And when we have the power to give expression to the Word directly, as if by inspiration, and through any or all of these channels of expression, then we possess the Gift of Tongues.

Considering another phase of the subject, we know that there are numerous instances of responsive minds being able to speak in languages that they have never learned objectively; and this one phase has usually been looked upon as the only evidence of the Gift of Tongues; and although this is one phase of the power, it is only one of the simplest, and one of the most literal expressions of this great gift.

However, the power to speak in languages that have not been learned objectively is readily explained, and is accounted for through the law of mental sympathy; that is, if your mind is very responsive to the finer forces of deeper or higher consciousness, you may be able to contact consciously the subjective activities of other minds, and thereby receive, directly through the transference of thought, practically everything that may be held in store upon the subconscious side of that mind that you consciously and sympathetically contact at the time.

To use a very tangible illustration, we find that when we take a wire and have it connected with a live wire, then the current that is flowing through the live wire will also flow into this other wire so long as the connection continues; and this very same circumstance is constantly taking place upon the subjective planes of life, thought and action. We are living, literally, in a vast sea of thought, activity and substance; and the finer wires of our inner mentality, to use the same expression, may contact the live currents upon the inner planes, thus making it possible to receive a great deal of information that we could not know objectively. And if we should at the time continue in sympathetic responsiveness with a certain mind that was in possession of learning or wisdom that we positively knew nothing of, we might, for the time being, actually borrow fragments of that learning or wisdom, or give expression to it through our own objective thought and speech.

Phenomena of this kind has been met with frequently, and has been described as the Gift of Tongues; but it is only a very simple phase of a marvelous law—the possibility of any mind contacting, for brief periods of time, other sources of wisdom or knowledge, or inner realms of life, light and power.

Furthermore, we find through personal experience that we all do, to a cer-

tain extent, enter into sympathetic touch upon the mental plane with other people, and thereby literally borrow, for the time being, their feelings, their desires, their sorrows, their joys, their aspirations—an experience that we all meet frequently, and a situation that must be handled with great care.

Indeed, if we are very sympathetic, or mentally responsive, we may borrow, mentally, more than one-half of the thoughts, feelings, desires or mental states that we entertain during the day. And although this fact illustrates a very interesting law, and a possibility that is far greater than we may think in the beginning, nevertheless, it is a situation that we should not enter unless we understand how to master every phase of it, and know how to rise above those conditions connected therewith that may not be desirable.

Turning our attention again to the possibility of contacting the mind with other minds, and, for the time being, receive fragments of their learning or knowledge, we must remember that there is practically no gain to be derived from that phenomenon or experience in itself; although it illustrates, in a most tangible manner, possibilities in the human mind that we should study and analyze further.

However, it is when we apply this possibility in conjunction with the higher law that we shall profit directly; that is, when we proceed to contact consciousness with higher sources of wisdom, and with an ever-increasing number of higher and finer planes of life, thought, realization, beauty, harmony and melody. Indeed, it is hardly possible to conceive of more wonderful or richer experiences than those that follow when we enter into mental harmony with the wonderful states of melody, beauty, light, wisdom, inspiration, and higher states of being that surround us

all everywhere; because when we enter into such states of harmony, we naturally receive, directly, rich portions and vast portions of the actual realities that exist in loftier regions of the life sublime. And if we can give expression through poetry, music, thought, written language, spoken language or personal living—if we can give expression to these higher things in any or all of these modes or manners, we are making use of the Gift of Tongues in one of its many phases.

Generally speaking, the Gift of Tongues implies the power to be inspired by anything that comes from higher sources, and not only to receive such inspirations in the mind, but to give expression to them all in actual thought, melody or speech. However, in its highest phase this gift implies the power to understand the Word, and give expression to the meaning of the Word through thought or speech, or in every conceivable manner.

To illustrate: If you could enter into the consciousness of all the elements of the Word and also give expression in a tangible manner to the highest music imaginable, to the highest thought imaginable, to the greatest aspirations imaginable, to the most beautiful expressions of art and poetry imag

8. You are the Eternal Energy.

Is This claiming too much for you?
Not if you are one with God-Substance, and you certainly are, since there is only One Substance in the Universe. You are bound to be one with that Substance unless you are Nothing, which you will hardly admit, and if you do admit it Science will not endorse your admission.

Substance is practically Energy. It is the Eternal Energy that sub-stands the Universe and all that therein is. There is the Energy of Position as well as the Energy of Motion, and both are essential to hold things in place and to keep things moving.

If you are one with God-Substance, you must be also one with this Eternal Energy, and if you are one with it YOU ARE IT. You do not seem to be IT except in moments of clarified vision when you see yourself as Eternal, Immortal Spiritual Substance.

The vision passes, of course, and you see yourself then as common clay, but the Divine Monad is in and over that common clay. The Spiritual Substance illumines its house of clay. The Spirit-

ual Energy gives it its urge on to perfection.

You have heard of the "Second Wind," which means that when a man is utterly exhausted there sometimes comes to him a fresh spurt of energy. Professor James of Harvard saw more in this occurrence than is evident to the casual observer, and he called it, "Tapping Higher Levels of Energy."

After giving the matter a good deal of thought Professor James said this: "On usual occasions we make a practice of stopping an occupation as soon as we meet the first effective layer, so to call it, of fatigue. We have then walked, played or worked enough, so we desist. That amount of fatigue is an efficacious obstruction on this side of which our usual life is cast. But if an unusual necessity forces us to press onward, a surprising thing occurs. The fatigue gets worse up to a certain critical point, when gradually or suddenly it passes away, and we are fresher than before. We have evidently tapped a level of new energy masked until then by the fatigue obstacle usually obeyed. There may be layer after layer of this experience. A third or fourth wind may supervene. Mental activity shows this phenomenon as well as physical, and in exceptional cases we may find beyond the very extremity of fatigue distress, amounts of ease and power that we never dreamed ourselves to own, sources of strength habitually not taxed at all, because habitually we never push through the obstruction, never pass those early, critical points."

Professor James goes on to say: "Most of us continue living unnecessarily near our surface."

This, coming as it does from a great psychologist who spent his life in observing mental processes, is pretty strong evidence that man's store of energy is not so limited as it has appeared. Professor James saw this from the scientific viewpoint. Emerson saw the same from the spiritual when he said, "We lie open on one side to the deeps of spiritual nature, to the attributes of God."

The practical mind may be but little impressed by the vision of a seer, and yet be fully convinced by the fact that second, third and fourth winds are possible to the exhausted athlete, and be willing to acknowledge this fact as proof that larger stores of Energy are open to Man than has been supposed.

by Professor James' statement, especially as I have had some remarkable experiences in getting a renewal of energy. Times without number I have worked far beyond my natural limit, and reached the point of utter exhaustion, but pushing on I have suddenly caught my "second wind," an influx of fresh energy that enabled me to do better work than before, and proving Professor James' point that the second wind is tapping a higher level.

All Energy is one, of course, but it flows through us with greater intensity according to the height of the level at which we tap it. For instance, high thought calls forth greater Energy than low thought, very much as a 40 Watt lamp calls out more electricity, and gives a larger flame than a 25 Watt, a 60 Watt calls out more than a 40 Watt, and so on up the scale.

You can be a human 25 Watt, or 40 Watt, or 60 Watt or higher, according to the drawing power of your thought. As you rise to higher planes you tap higher levels of Energy.

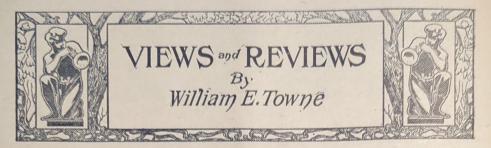
Right here let me utter a word of caution. I would advise you not to work beyond your strength, either mentally or physically until you are fully convinced that your store of Energy is not limited. When you know beyond a doubt that you are one with the Eternal Energy, you can draw upon it to

any degree, and always be sure of getting your second wind. On the same principle I would say: Do not jump into water beyond your depth until you know how to swim, or,-do not fancy yourself to possess the strength of the oak while you are still a sapling. Be satisfied to advance slowly in your achievement. When you have reached the point where you are absolutely certain there are higher levels of Energy to be tapped, then is the time to push beyond your fatigue obstacle. and not till then would I advise it. When the disciples tried to walk upon the water, they were not prepared to do so hence they sank. Cultivate the persistent will to push on beyond the fatique point, long before you try it. Put yourself in training and when the emergency arrives you will stand the test, getting your glorious second wind and turning life into a song of triumph.

If you are sick the energy to combat and east out disease has run low and you need to tap a higher level. When I say combat I do not mean fight, but to cast it out as Jesus cast out devils by the dominance of Spirit over Matter.

If you are in adversity and feel that you have reached the end of your effort, call for more Energy and push beyond the fatigue point with renewed courage and hope, and you will surely find your second wind and with it win the race. When your faith and hope are at lowest ebb you are on the eve of victory, for you are at your fatigue point and to pass it is to find your second wind awaiting you. A young officer despairing of promotion, put a bullet through his head. His heart had barely ceased to beat when his commission arrived. A little more patience and faith would have witnessed his heart's desire realized, but he stopped at the fatigue point and missed the goal. Remember that in your hour of despair.

How to Deal With "The Blues."

"I have been blue and despondent for years."

Unless due to overwork or a rundown physical condition, feeling blue is mostly a bad mental habit.

What you need is constructive activity. Stop sozzling about in negative thoughts and feelings. Apply your will in turning your thought into constructive channels. Spend a great deal of time in walking. Breathe plenty of fresh air day and night.

Regular work is one of the best antidotes for the blues. But you must put yourself into your work, enlist your concentration and interest in order to get the best results.

If you will watch the trend of your thoughts you will probably find that you spend much time in thinking about the past, in worrying about the future or in idle day-dreaming. Your thoughts are seldom active in the *present*.

To bring your thoughts right down to the present moment, to keep them actively employed in connection with your work, will do more than almost anything else to free you from the blues.

It will be necessary, at first, to arouse yourself and use your will to keep your thoughts in the right channels. You will get up in the morning and the old thoughts and feelings will come crowding into your mind in the old familiar manner.

DRIVE THEM OUT!

They may stay out only a few moments at first, but keep on centering your thoughts on what you are doing. Don't allow your thoughts to drift. Bring them back to something concrete and definite.

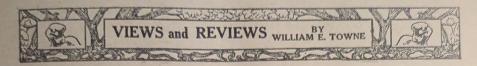
In this connection, start yourself off in the morning with some such affirmation as this: "I express my thoughts through my hands. My thoughts today will naturally and easily center upon my work. They will be pleasant thoughts; constructive thoughts. I am ONE with the Life of the universe and this Life expresses itself in and through me NOW in the JOY OF ACTION."

Do not expect to effect an immediate revolution in your thinking. The results will be cumulative. Good results will at once become apparent, but it will require time to get your thoughts wholly trained to follow the new channels you desire them to follow.

Remember that doubt and distrust will help to keep you in the depths. Try to eliminate them from your thoughts by affirming your oneness with the One Life and Power of the universe.

Do not make a direct attack upon your negative emotions but try rather to ignore them and crowd them out by physical and mental activity and by the expression of your thought power along constructive, hopeful lines as directed above.

Learn to say and feel, "I am Life NOW; I am Joy NOW; I am Peace NOW; I enjoy my work NOW."



Go forward steadily with the thought, not that you are making a hard fight to overcome adverse conditions, but that you are NOW expressing the One Life which fills you to overflowing with power to accomplish. Learn to abandon yourself more fully to your work. Put a little vim and daring into your efforts until you have taught your thoughts to center around what you are doing. Get into the rhythm and swing of your work.

You are undergoing a process of selfadjustment to new habits. See that your whole mental attitude is adaptable to the new conditions and go forward with courage and backed by will.

How to Use Your Own Energy.

Most people waste a large amount of power through misapplying their own energy.

Perhaps more power is lost through lack of direction, through lax, negative habits of thought and action which lead to a life of general drifting than in any other way.

Then power leaks out through worry, fear, envy, and mental friction. You cannot conserve power and have plenty for all legitimate purposes if you are constantly fighting something.

The over-indulgence of the emotions will more quickly dissipate power than anything else.

One needs to watch his thoughts to make sure that he does not inhibit his power through negative thought habits.

Faith is the great power liberator. Faith in the One Life of the universe which is expressing itself constantly through man's individual life, opens the channels to power.

Physical and mental tension soon inhibits power. Most people can realize greater power through the regular practice of relaxation of mind and body.

To allow the thought to dwell continuously on action which is inexpedient, or which for any reason, one's judgment condemns, is also the source of a great deal of power waste. It leads to suppressed desire which burrows in the subconscious mind and finds its way out through abnormal expressions. Suppressed desire is one of the most common causes of nervous difficulties. If you consider it inexpedient to gratify desire, turn it into some other normal channel of expression. Do not let your thoughts and your acts run contrary to each other. Put your will on the side of what you decide to do.

Recognize the truth that your own power is nothing but the Divine Life, the Universal Life, in you, and hence your power is limited only by your own recognition and expression of the One Power.

Habit and Happiness.

How carelessly we deal with habit and yet how powerfully it influences our happiness.

We thoughtlessly create habits which take such hold upon us that we become like a person grasping a live wire who cannot let go if he would.

I know a woman who says she never allows any habit, good, bad or indifferent to dominate her for long. If she finds herself sinking into a rut of habit, she immediately takes steps to effect a change. No doubt this partly accounts for the fact that this woman is younger



at seventy than most women are at, fifty.

There are many minor habits to which little attention is paid which loom large in their cumulative effect upon efficiency and happiness. For instance, the novel and candy habits to which many women are addicted are, in their way, when carried to extremes, as destructive as the drink habit in men. Then the habit of over-eating and under-exercising deprives vast numbers of men and women of normal happiness.

If each one would check up his habits once a week by the list given in Mr. Warman's splendid contribution on page 19 of January *Nautilus*, what a revolution in the direction of happiness and efficiency might be accomplished.

Whatever is poured into the brain as suggestion tends to come out as action. When a suggestion enters the brain, if there are "tracks" already formed by previous action like that suggested, the impulse follows the "track" previously created. Repetition deepens the "track" and action becomes more and more automatic. Thus are habits formed and thus do they burrow into the nervous system of a man until they become a part of his very life.

If we wish to avoid undesirable habits we must inhibit and avoid suggestions which we do not desire nor expect to carry out in action.

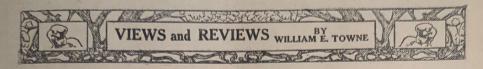
The habit of playing with ideas and suggestions of conduct which the conscience and will will not allow to express in action is even more destructive than active indulgence in the forbidden acts. The suppressed impulse, given power by the suggestion entertained, seeks to find an outlet in action, and

when its normal course is forbidden it often leads to abnormal and morbid conditions in mind and body producing unhappiness and ill health.

In replacing undesirable habits with new brain channels suggestion is a powerful helper. Repeating aloud many times a day an affirmation of your freedom and power to replace undesirable habits with desirable ones will in time deeply impress the subconscious mind and lead to action impulses in the desired direction. Such affirmations are doubly effective if repeated (either silently or aloud) just before going to sleep at night. The suggestion at this time gives the mind a little push in the new direction and the effect carries over into the sleep condition and grows and takes root in the subconscious mind while you sleep. Do not look for quick results and above all do not watch yourself to see what effect the affirmations are producing.

Don't let up on telling yourself that you are going to realize and express that which you are aiming at. Repeat your statements to your subconscious mind several times daily. Thus you will gradually build up within yourself the attractive power that will make realization possible. Your nervous system will have been trained to respond to those lines of expression which lead toward the end you are aiming at. You will have taught your subconscious mind. through repeated impressions given by suggestion, to look for, grasp and act upon every opportunity for expression in the direction you desire to go.

Habit gradually builds around you the conditions of success or the reverse, according to the direction you give it.



How Do You Practice Your New Thought?

You say you have affirmed and affirmed and yet you are poorer and more unhappy than ever.

The trouble is that you have used New Thought as you would a rabbit's foot or any other form of charm.

You have made your affirmations and then expected a special dispensation of Providence in your behalf.

And in the meantime you have not really believed and felt that New Thought could help you. You have hoped, in a weak and halting way, that it might, but you have never given it a vital living faith and then acted accordingly.

If you had really believed that New Thought could help you you would have applied it constructively in every act of your life and proved it.

It does you little good to know, or believe with your intellect, that there is One Principle of Being in the universe, the substance of all life, power, intelligence, and that you are an expression of that Principle, one with it, if you do not feel and act accordingly, if you do not go out and do things, work creatively to answer your own prayers, in the faith that this Principle of Life is expressing itself through you and will help you to greater and greater achievement. You must use the power that you already have, believing and confidently expecting that more power will come to you from the One Source.

Your affirmations are only the pattern for what you desire to accomplish. You, yourself, must co-operate in filling in that pattern. You must earn by applied, constructive effort, whatever you desire to realize.

There is, fortunately, no way by which you can reap where you have

not sown, whether you invoke New Thought or a rabbit's foot.

See that your thought and action is constructive. It is easy to tear down by destructive, negative thinking the results of much positive thought and action.

When you tell yourself constantly that you are a failure, that your affirmations are ineffective, that everything is against you, you are creating about yourself an aura that will attract just what you are affirming. You are smothering within yourself those forces and powers which, if given expression, would bring you greater success and give you a more positive grasp on life.

You will need to make a systematic attempt to divert your mind from the old, negative, hopeless channels of thought and turn your mental forces into active, constructive effort toward the needs you desire to achieve.

Practice the development of concentration. This will give you control of your mental forces and lay the foundation for constructive activity.

Arouse your desire for success until you can actually feel yourself successful and picture yourself as acting successfully. Awaken within yourself a very passion for success. "It is not ideas, but passions that move and transform the world; and an absurd passion is a thousand times more potent than a wise idea," said Ferrero. When you can arouse a strong desire for successful action you will have at your command the necessary driving force.

But above all, never neglect to do the least thing that you can to promote yourself toward the fuller success you desire. It is by directed action that you become strong. It is by drifting in though and action that you become weak.

NEW THOUGHT is old thought in a new dress. We catch glimpses of it every little while in olden literature, for instance, Philipians 4-8, the words of St. Paul, "Whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are holy, whatsoever things are of good report, if there be any virtue and if there be any praise think on these things." Could there be a better definition of New Thought than these words, written nearly two thousand years ago?

Upon an ancient Greek temple was graven this inscription: "Renew Thyself Each Day." This message has an especial significance for us now. We have learned many things and accomplished seeming miracles, but we also have forgotten much that is of grave importance. We rush hither and thither, performing the seemingly impossible, until at last we die, without ever having really lived.

Among the things of vital concern that we have ignored or forgotten is that the act of renewal is the gospel of life. Nature understands this perfectly, and after the repose of Winter, she renews herself in Spring with a beauty all the more alluring through the period of rest that she has undergone.

The Greeks renewed themselves in pilgrimages to distant shrines, great festivals and world-renowned games. The Egyptians made a national festival of the rising of the Nile. The Oriental to this day withdraws himself from the haunts of men and opens his soul to the spirit.

It would, perhaps, be neither possible nor advisable for us of the Occident to follow his example, but there are other ways of renewing one's self and not to take advantage of them is foolish. When the average American has taken two weeks' vacation in the summer and has hurried from one city to another or tramped weary miles with rod or gun, he returns home for the most part completely worn out, mosquito-bitten and chugger-infested, wondering why he feels so dull, listless and stupid. And yet the change has been a beneficial one in many ways. It has thrown him out of the rut that he has been in, and he is a better man for the change.

But we are enjoined to renew ourselves each day. The potato, turnip or beet that you have stored in your cellar, upon the approach of spring feel the call of the great Mother and begin to put forth delicate filaments of pale green preparatory to their life task of renewing themselves. With man, who has wasted so much vitality in ceaseless energy in frantic efforts to nab the nimble nickel or chase the elusive dime, he will not find time to withdraw himself from himself and he suffers accordingly.

There are three great ideals that have governed the world. The Greek ideal was To Know, and their philosophers pushed the realm of thought to the realm of omnipotence. Their writers and thinkers will be a beacon light of inspiration as long as the human race lasts, and their temples and statues

are miracles of beauty that lift us.

The Roman ideal was To Have. The lust for conquest and dominion filled them, and in obedience to the call they ravaged the world and brought what was rarest and costliest to their mistress the City of the Seven Hills. Succeeding ages have been filled with their strength, their coarseness and their cruelty.

The Hebrews' one ideal was To Be. They were in harmony with the Eternal Cause. As the Chosen People of Yahveh, by fasting and prayer, by abstinence and awe-inspiring ritual they were permitted to approach the Ineffable One and perchance bear from thence a message that would thrill the people and draw them nearer to God.

And they have been true to their ideal, dispersed, despised, beaten, racked, burned, boiled in oil, tortured with every fiendish malignity known to man. As soon, however, as the chains of the oppressor are broken they raise aloft the Talmud and the Torah and with Mishna in hand cast their eves longingly toward Zion, for their ideal never dies.

None knew better than the Jew the necessity of renewing oneself. Imprisoned for centuries in filthy ghettos, his obedience to this law is all that has kept him from being swept away. In proportion as the Jews were persecuted, so the more closely did they cling to the rules laid down by the great lawgiver, Moses, who provided that once every seven years, even the land should have a period of renewal. Palestine, that is now almost a desert, was then a land overflowing with milk and honey.

The Jewish ideal culminates in the Christ. We see in the Man of Sorrows, the divinity of man and the humanity of God, and we see how even the Blessed Master went apart for

prayer and renewal of the spirit.

We have learned that even inanimate thingsare better, work better and last longer, for a period of rest and renewal, that the locomotive runs better after it has stood a little while; the steamship sails faster and easier after a few days' rest; that the telegraph and telephone works better after the Sunday rest it has received. Then you who are of flesh and bone, and infinitely more complicated than any man-made machine, do you not see the need of a few moments' rest for yourself?

In New Thought we find this rest and renewal. It teaches us to withdraw ourselves. In New Thought we renew ourselvs daily, and this daily baptism of the inner self strengthens the life within and enables it to cope with the life without.

In both these figures of speech we see illustrated one of the primary laws of nature. We see the lily opening its heart to the sun's rays, and we know that it is all the time, while it seems to be so idle, busily absorbing food from the air and the soil. Similarly we watch a child at play and know that its whole life and growth depends on its receptivity. The child that absorbs pure air, pure food, good suggestions and a helpful mental atmosphere in general is in the straight line of progress. A less happy child who has to choose what he will receive and what he has to reject is to some extent forced to live an unchildlike life.

If we carry the principle here illustrated into the spiritual world we shall arrive at the profound truth uttered by Jesus, and so often reiterated by him in different ways, viz., that the first concern of a soul is to take into itself the spiritual food provided for it, the love, the wisdom, the power of the Infinite Mind; until it has reached this attitude of receptiveness, the soul of man cannot show to the world the fruits of healthy and vigorous growth.

New Thought concerns itself chiefly with the teaching of its disciples to become receptive. Its first lesson is the lesson of the silence. Not until physical and mental disturbances can be quelled, not until the voices of the world can be for the time stifled can the ear of man hear the cosmic voices that whisper to him of the higher life, a life of power, and love, and wisdom beyond all his most extravagant thought, a life, moreover, that is by its very nature harmonious and unending. This is the life that Jesus spoke of when He said: "I am come that you may have life and may have it more abundantly." It can only be lived by men and women who have learned to listen for the voice of the spirit in the silence. In other words, by men

A MIRACLE HEALING AND HOW IT WAS DONE

THE following is my experience, written down soon after I was healed. While it is written somewhat differently from what I would write now, I have carefully avoided making any changes, except a very few minor changes in wording, because I do not want to brush aside or hide the ladder by which I climbed to health. It was first written for an introductory talk on "The Power of Suggestion," given before the Open Forum of The Union Temple Association, and afterwards rewritten for publication, but, up to this time, has never been published.

I was about thirteen years old when Dr. J. W. Marsee, since passed over, said to my mother, "There is no possible chance, Mrs. Andrews. I lost my little boy the same way, after doing everything for him that it was possible to do. I have made a special study of these cases, and I know there is no possible chance for him to get well."

She turned to him and said, "Doctor, what would you do if he were your boy?" and he answered, "I would fight—fight, as long as there is a breath of life to fight for."

That was the beginning of a long drawnout battle, with many ups and downs, the doctors all agreeing that there was no chance for a cure, though they encouraged and cheered us the best they could.

But at last the victory came, and I have grown from a little crooked, twisted cripple, going about on hands and knees, to a strong, straight, well-formed man.

I told this story to a family who were waiting for the end to come at the bedside of a loved one, a young man wasting away with tuberculosis of the stomach and bowels—the doctors said he could live only a few hours more at the most. A few weeks later I talked to that same young man over the telephone, and he told me he was on his feet again, had gained twenty-five pounds and was growing stronger every day.

The story has an almost magical affect on those who are losing their grip on life, so I am repeating it in print where it can reach the most people and do the most good. I found myself at the age of thirteen, in the grasp of one of the worst diseases known to man, commonly called "spinal trouble," "Pott's disease," or "tuberculosis of the spine." This affected my spine in three places, eating its way through the bone until there were two sections of the bone perfectly loose, so that they could be moved with the fingers. Finally one end slipped by the other, forming what is known as an "acute curvature." The pus formed by the decaying bone and other poisons which collected there found its way between the muscles of the flesh, coming out in two abscesses, one in each groin. These are what is known as "Psoas abscesses," because they travel along the psoas muscle close to the psoas artery, which is the large artery that feeds the lower limb. The doctors said it was only a question of time until one or the other of these arteries would become punctured—then I would slip out of life instantly.

As the disease developed the cords of my limbs drew up until I walked on my tiptoes, and I finally became so weak that I could not stand or sit up and was perfectly helpless for some time. Then I was able to go about on my hands and knees, then on crutches, and finally discarded both braces and crutches. Of course my parents tried every doctor and every known means that seemed to suggest any hope of a cure; but the doctors frankly told my parents that there was no cure for me. My limbs were drawn until, when I lay on my stomach, I could not kick down hard enough to force my toes to touch the floor. So I lay on the floor by the hour, kicking down and trying to force my toes to the floor, determined that my limbs should straighten out again. Here I was using the power of auto-suggestion without realizing what I was doing. I was left to myself a great deal and I spent most of the time dreaming what I would do when I was well. All my plans and dreams were founded on the perfect health that was going to be mine some day. So, again, without knowing what I was doing, I was using the strongest kind of constructive suggestion for myself. spite of the doctors' verdicts, I gradually grew stronger and straighter, until finally I was able to join a boys' military brigade.

Then I was hurt again by a stone which was thrown and struck me in the back right at the weakest point. An awful suggestion of fear and anger took hold of me at this

time-fear that I would have to suffer again that which I had nearly conquered, and anger at the boy who threw the stone. As a consequence, I got just what I expected. I had to go back and suffer it all over again. As I look at it now, I know I brought this all on myself by the feelings of fear, hate, anger and revenge which I harbored and nourished at that time. I am sure I would have gone on improving in health, instead of retrograding, if it had not been for these strong destructive suggestions which I allowed to enter and develop in my own mind. But I needed the lesson and I got it. Down, down I plunged into the depths, but not of despair. I had nearly conquered once and I could do it again. Finally there came into my hands a copy of "Hudson's Law of Psychic Phenomena." This opened to my eyes a new vision of health through the power of suggestion. I had become thoroughly convinced of the continuity of life and this was another strong support, for it took away all fear of death.

Still I had my "ups and downs." Today I was better and full of hone-tomorrow worse, but not without hope. Then a copy of the White Cross Library, by Prentice Mulford, was put into my hands, and this opened up to me a new world indeed. One of the strongest helps I got from this was, that I did not need to have absolute faith in my suggestions, if I were only willing to keep my mind free from prejudices, and persistently affirm for myself the things I most wanted. Then it was that I began to practice suggestion with my eyes open, and a new hope to buoy me up. I read all the New Thought literature I could get hold of. Then I had my doubts and perplexities about affirming that which did not seem to be true and denying that which apparently was true. The more I pondered, the worse mixed up I became and I went down, down, down to the very threshold of despair, still fighting and struggling, but apparently fighting a losing battle. Down, down, till my own mother, who had been my strongest support and greatest help in all my conflict, almost gave up the fight-in fact, she confided to others that it was a hopeless cause and that the struggle was about over.

Then a new light came. I began to realize that I was God's own child, created by Him in His own image and likeness—that it was not His will that I should be sick and useless, and I began to be ashamed of myself

for the stand I had been taking. Right here I wish to note that a year or two previous to this someone came to me with a statement that God was punishing me for my sins. I rose up in my wrath and said: "I don't believe it. I don't believe God has anything to do with it, but if He has (and I swore a dreadful oath to myself) He can't punish me enough-I can stand it as long as. He can, and when I see Him face to face, I will take pleasure in telling Him what I think of Him." I had swung from being an orthodox Christian to a complete Atheist, and back to indifference. I didn't know whether there was a God or not, and I didn't care. I felt that if there was one He would reveal Himself to me when He was ready; and if there wasn't, there was no use to worry anyway. I was convinced of the continuity of life and nothing else mattered. All this time I had been fighting my battle on the purely intellectual plane; but, when I began to realize that man is really a threefold being-spirit, mind and body-and that the spirit is an emanation from the Creator, and, therefore, perfect, that God was not punishing me, but that I was punishing myselfthat I was really the sum total of the thoughts that passed through my mind-when these truths dawned on me with their full force and significance, I was ashamed of myself, that I should have made so little of such a rich inheritance, and I began to get well so fast that, after twenty years of suffering, I was entirely healed in six months.

Now, I know you want the formula, and I will give it to you as briefly and quickly as I can. Just before I began to get well there came to me a young minister who, in about fifteen minutes' talk, made a very deep impression on me-not so much for what he said, but for what he was. I saw him only that one time, but I got his picture and put it up in my room, and every morning and every time in the day when I had a few minutes for silent meditation, I looked at that picture, and said, "Bruce, God created me in His own image, a perfect being with all the rights and privileges that every other being has. I have a perfect right to be all you are, and more. You are my standard. I will attain all you have attained and more." And I prayed over and over again, "God's will be done in me," knowing and fully realizing that the Father's will for me was that I should be a perfect man, physically, men-

tally and spiritually. I built up an affirmation for myself, taking the qualities I most needed, and affirming for myself over and over again, "I am whole, perfect, strong, powerful, loving, harmonious and happy." I kept up this affirmation, always the same, never varying, till I could wake up in the night and find myself repeating, "I am whole, perfect, strong, powerful, loving, harmonious and happy." It was the last thing on my lips at night and the first thing in the morning. Not only did I affirm it for myself, but for others that I knew needed it. I want to emphasize this point-whatever you desire for yourself, affirm it for others, and it will help you both. We reap what we sow. If we send out thoughts of love and health, they return to us like bread cast upon the waters; but if we send out thoughts of fear, worry, jealousy, anger, hate, etc., we will reap the results in our own lives. It used to be said that man is completely built over every seven years, but some scientists now declare that we build ourselves over entirely every eleven months; so we are really only eleven months old. If we build the old defects back into our bodies year after year, we have no one to blame but ourselves. Man is the sum total of his own thoughts; so the question is, how are we going to entertain only the good thoughts and reject the evil ones? At first we can't keep the evil thoughts from coming, but we can keep from entertaining them. The only way to do this is to forget them-which means, get something for them. This is where the ready-made affirmation comes in. When a thought of anger, jealousy, fear or worry creeps in, just start your affirmation going. It is said that Jesus on the cross repeated the Psalms. You can't concentrate on two thoughts at the same time; and, while you are paying attention to your affirmation the other thoughts will disappear. Whenever you catch yourself singing "All this world am sad and dreary, everywhere I roam," or "You're always in the way," or "Poor little Joe had no Mother to love him and no place to go," or repeating any other combination of destructive thought, just start your train of constructive thought, and it will shove all others off the track. The way to fight darkness is with light—the way to fight cold is with heat-the way to overcome evil is with good. For myself, I never could find any help in denials. Affirm the good, and the bad will vanish. Around the camp fire at the

Sheldon Business Normal one summer night, the boys were singing some doggerel verses the last line of which was, "The smoke goes up the chimney just the same." I always take the last few minutes before dropping off to sleep to set my mind in order and determine the thoughts that shall dominate my subconscious while I am asleep. This night I caught myself singing over and over again those last lines-"The smoke goes up the chimney just the same." I set my mind right and went to sleep. In the morning I inquired of the boys if they had gone to sleep with those words in their minds, and everyone of them owned up that he had. So you see, if man is the sum total of his thoughts, how important it is to have the ready-made affirmation to use the last thing at night and the first thing in the morning.

Arthur Frederick Sheldon says: "The first great law of health and character is, to think right." And how are we going to think right if we don't know what to think? This is the secret of the morning and evening prayer. It helps to set the mind right. A little girl said to her mother: "Why don't we pray at the table, Ma, the way the neighbors does?" The mother's answer was: "Emma Jane, the Lord's got something else to do 'sides listening to folks pray that don't want nothing."

Pray for what you want. Analyze yourself as a chemist analyzes the compound, and find out what qualities you most need. Affirm these qualities for yourself, over and over again; also for others. The secret of success in life is, first, to have a goal, an ideal. "No one is ever successful who hasn't had a vision." If you haven't a purpose in life, pray for one; and, as Old Miss Means said in the "Hoosier Schoolmaster," "git a plenty while you're gitting." It's free. There's enough for you, and me, too. Set your aim high. Ask for enough, then set your eye on the goal and keep moving.

One question naturally comes to your mind, "Did I use any physical means?" and the answer is, "Yes." Man is a threefold being, spirit, mind and body—and the spiritual, mental and physical man should work in harmony together. If there is any good in suggestion, it will lead you to the natural means that will be most helpful. The person who has gained complete victory over self has no more use for outside helps than the expert swimmer has for a cork jacket or swimming wings. I also adopted a vegetarian diet, which

I have since learned is very helpful, especially in the appearance of wasting diseases.

Never give up, no matter what the doctors say. They don't know—they just think they know. They can judge the future only by past experience; and if everybody did that there would be no aeroplanes or wireless telegraphy today. Follow the doctor's advice wherever it seems to help, and depend on Prayer and Affirmation for the rest. God always answers the prayer of faith.

The secret is hope, faith, good cheer and persistence.

I HAVE just been asked to try to do something for a woman of middle age who has a lump under her arm, that physicians pronounce cancer.

HOW NEW THOUGHT HELPED ME TO PERFORM AN OPERATION IN CHILD BIRTH

A LTHOUGH this experience is one related with Hypnotism, I want to state clearly, to begin with, that I am not a "Hypnotist." I have studied the Power of Mind and its laws—naturally, that includes the phenomena known as Hypnotism.

I am a Mental Science Healer and Teacher by profession and do not include Hypnotism in my daily practice. Neither do I use drugs of any sort, never having been able to understand how one can have *Health* by taking *Poisons!*

She complied willingly and many a beautiful lesson did I learn through her, for she turned out to be a splendid clairvoyant and clairaudient.

Joe, I must explain, was an orphan and the only relation she had, on her father's side, was an Uncle who, with his family, lived in Peru. One day, Joe received a letter from this Uncle offering her his home and talking of a possible trip to Spain where he hoped to settle down. Needless to say, she accepted his kind invitation—much to my regret.

A few days before sailing, I put her off to sleep, with her consent of course, (I never did so, otherwise), and asked her to see if we should ever meet again. After a little while she said: "I will marry in Peru and return to make my home, for a time, with you. You will then be living in the city of Santiago in a much better position than you are now." At that time I had not the faintest

idea of a change and, in fact, forgot all about

this prophecy.

In November, 1910—four years exactly since these words were spoken—Joe arrived at my home, in Santiago, not only married, but expecting to become a happy mother in the course of a few months.

As the time drew near for her confinement, I called in a splendid old midwife, Mrs. X., who has had forty years' experience. As I have said before, I do not believe in drugs, so I did not want an M. D. around, for anything, and besides, Joe's husband being out of a position, they could not possibly see their way clear to meet the heavy expenses that medical attendance incurred. I asked the midwife if she could manage the case alone and she answered: "Yes, if it should be a normal affair." I felt pretty certain it would be a "normal affair," for Joe had adhered strictly to Mrs. Alice B. Stockham's advice upon the subject.

This was 12:30 p. m.

When Mrs. X left, I did some quick thinking, I can assure you. I went to Joe and said: "Look, Joe, Mrs. X, says these are your labor pains, but I don't believe her. I think it's just a slight indigestion. Suppose I put you off to sleep and you see for yourself?" (You see I had to tell a "white one" like that because I did not want to frighten her or make her nervous.) She thought I was right and consented. As soon as she was sound asleep I asked her to look and see in what position the child was. She said the baby was coming feet first—exactly what Mrs.

X. had said. "Well, Joe," I said, "you can turn that little child to its natural position, please do so. I will see that no one disturbs you while you are at work. I will come back to you in a few minutes." (I had never heard or read of this being done before, but I did not see any reason why it shouldn't be done.)

I asked her husband to stand guard at the door of her bedroom so that she should not be disturbed.

In half an hour I went back and asked her how she was getting on. She answered: "I am doing what you told me to, but have not finished yet." In half an hour more I went in again and she said: "The child is now in its normal position."

The whole thing done in an hour, without

pain, fuss nor a big fee!

When Mrs. X. came at 4, she proceeded to examine the patient and as she did so, her eyes expanded like two good-sized saucers! It was a treat to see her face!

I tried to look serious and concerned and said: "Well, have you thought what doctor shall we call?" "Senora, (Madam), she answered, a miracle has happened, the baby has turned itself into its normal position!

I looked surprised but deep down in my heart I reverently thanked the Father, the giver of all good gifts, for the knowledge and inspiration which permitted me to work "a miracle!"

R ELY on God. Who wills may one day

Following this paragraph comes President Edgerton's own statement. It is planned to publish one or two of these statements in every number of NAUTILUS until June or July, and it is suggested that NAUTILUS readers read them all very carefully with a view to a ballot in July, stating which declaration you consider best, what changes you suggest. Perhaps you can send an entirely new statement of principles of your own that can be considered by the committee. We invite all New Thought people everywhere to help us in the formulating of this statement of principles. The Alliance must have a creed limitless, and it will take all the souls and all the brains of all the New Thoughters to work it out. The Alliance is the organization of all the people, for all the people and by all the people, and we ask all the people to help in the wording of its proposed statement of principles. Thinking about it now and for the few months to come, will enable us all to vote more intelligently when the Congress convenes.—Elizabeth Towne.

DECLARATION OF PRINCIPLES

Proposed for The International New Thought Alliance.

WE affirm the freedom of each soul as to choice and as to belief, and would not, by the adoption of any declaration of principles, limit such freedom. The essence of the New Thought is Truth, and each individual must be loyal to the Truth he sees. The windows of his soul must be kept open at each moment for the higher light, and his mind must be always hospitable to each new inspiration.

We affirm the good. This is supreme, universal, and everlasting. Man is made in the image of the good, and evil and pain are but the tests and correctives that appear when his thought does not reflect the full glory of this

We affirm health, which is man's divine inheritance. Man's body is his holy temple. Every function of it, every cell of it, is intelligent, and is shaped, ruled, repaired and controlled by mind. He whose body is full of light is full of health. Spiritual healing has existed among all races in all times. It has now become a part of the higher science and art of living the life more abundant.

We affirm the divine supply. He who serves God and man in the full understanding of the law of compensation shall not lack. Within us are unused resources of energy and power. He who lives with his whole being, and thus expresses fullness, shall reap fullness in return. He who gives himself, he who knows, and acts in his highest knowledge, he who trusts in the divine return, has learned the law of success.

We affirm the teaching of Christ that the Kingdom of Heaven is within us, that we are one with the Father, that we should judge not, that we should love one another, that we should heal the sick, that we should return good for evil, that we should minister to others, and that we should be perfect even as our Father in Heaven is perfect. These are not only ideals, but practical, everyday working principles.

We affirm the new thought of God in whom we live, move and have our being, that He is nearer than hands or feet, that His mind is our mind now, that realizing our oneness with Him means love, truth, peace, health and plenty, not only in our own lives, but in the giving out of these fruits of the Spirit to others.

We affirm these things, not as a profession, but practice, not on one day of the week, but in every hour and minute of every day, sleeping and waking, not in the ministry of a few, but in a service that includes the democracy of all, not in words alone, but in the innermost thoughts of the heart expressed in living the life. "By their fruits ye shall know them."

We affirm the Heaven of the here and now, the life everlasting that becomes conscious immortality, the communion of mind with mind throughout the universe of thought, the nothingness of all error and negation, including death, the variety in unity that produces the individual expressions of the One-Life and the quickened realization of the indwelling God in each soul that is making a new heaven and a new earth.

Alliance News From Headquarters:-

On January 22, 1917, the International New Thought Alliance became a corporation under the laws of the District of Columbia fon the purpose of federating "various groups of people throughout the world, who are teaching and practicing spiritual healing and applied spirituality, and to that end send out lecturers and organizers, hold conventions, issue bulletins, collect and distribute funds,

conduct circulating libraries, and do all such other things in general consistent with the purposes of this institution, that it may secure standing before the business world to com-mand the admiration and respect of all people."

The board of trustees for the year consists of James A. Edgerton, Miss Emma Gray, Miss Grace Wilson, James Lee Bost of Washington, D. C., Mrs. Mary E. T. Chapin and R. C. Douglass of Boston, William E. Hutton of Cincinnati, Mrs. Rose M. Ashby of Atalnta, and John H. McGonigle of Pittsburgh.

This board met at headquarters Friday, January 26th, and formally adopted the consti-tution and by-laws as revised at the 1916 Con-gress in Chicago. The same list of officers was also elected for the corporation, and now the International New Thought Alliance stands before the world as a corporate body. This step was taken in pursuance of the instructions given the board at the Congress in Chicago. This is a corporation not for profit, and no stock will be issued, the object being to give the New Thought Alliance a definite position in the world.

The aim and objects of the Alliance as a corporate body are identical with the spirit which has been manifested in the Alliance, and it is not the intention to build up an institution, or an organization in the old sense of the word, but principally for propaganda and fellowship. While the spirit of the Alliance is primarily inclusive rather than exclusive, it was decided that at the 1917 Congress a declaration of principles should be adopted, which would set forth clearly just what the New Thought movement stands for.

In order to further promote the New Thought principles, it was decided that a book department be established at headquarters, the purpose of which will be three-fold: First, to select New Thought books considered standard; second, for the sale of these books; and, third, to co-operate with the various centers belonging to the Alliance in establishing circulating libraries. Many inquiries are received at headquarters as to books along the New Thought lines. Mr. Edgerton appointed a committee to make a list of books considered standard, and these will be on sale. A list of these books will be published and orders sent in to headquarters will be promptly

One of the very interesting items of the past month has been the fact that the majority of group memberships received have been from the southern states. There has been very little interest so far in the New Thought movement throughout the South, so that it is especially gratifying to receive these

memberships.

Dr. Julia Seton spent a short season in New Orleans, and established the International New Thought Alliance Center, with Mrs. E. J. Graham, 2104 Milan street, as leader. Dr. Seton also held a two days' conference in St. Louis in association with Miss Harriet C. Hulick of the New Thought League, and everything is being done to make the 1917 Congress in St. Louis in September a success. During the month of January Dr. Seton conducted a course of lectures in Kansas City, Mo., with the usual crowded classes.

As an indication of the interest taken in the New Thought movement in foreign countries, two letters were received this past month from the southern part of Africa. This is surely an unexplored field from the New Thought standpoint, and it is hoped that some field workers or teachers will feel led to take up this activity in the southern hemisphere.

Already plans are being laid for summer schools, one in the West, which will be conducted by Dr. Julia Seton in Colorado, and one at Sterling Junction, Sterling, Mass., under the supervision of Louise P. Perry of Springfield. Mrs. Perry has had much experiment in this work and maintain that the state is a second of the supervision of Louise P. Perry of Springfield. These will be ideal places for students of New Thought to spend their summer vacation and secure instruction along the higher way of living, receive "new courage, new convictions, and consciousness of power." These schools will open June 1st, and close the 1st of September in time for all students to attend the Congress in St. Louis September 16-23.

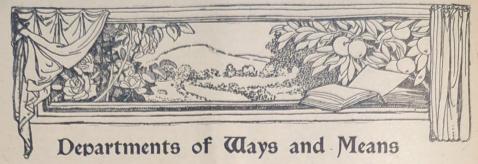

MRS. L. V.—Read the article by Martha Helmes, page 34 of January, 1915, Nautilus. Try making over your own mind and don't worry about your husband's mind. If you effect any changes in his mental attitude it will be because he responds to your own changed attitude. As long as you go off and sulk and cry when he says harsh things, you simply attract more harshness. If you want simply attract more harsiness. If you wanter to win and keep his love, first free him in your own mind. Love never responds to the rattle of chains, the crack of a whip, or physical or mental bonds of any kind. Avoid self-righteousness. You may be better than the other woman in spots, but the same is true of her as compared with yourself. Prayer and self-suggestion are effective upon the individual in changing his relation to persons and things outside himself. Prayer cannot think they ought to do. If you ever affect the action of another person by prayer it will be because you pray in the spirit of love and charity and in recognition of the fact that God works in through the other person just as he does through you. MRS. J. J. M.—Perhaps your trouble comes from the fact that in your mental attitude you are constantly trying to make your husband do something. You want to change him, to make him over. The first thing to do is to drop all thought of criticism of your hus-band from your mind. Try to get at his view-point so that you may understand him. Never mind if he does not reciprocate. Try to recognize in him that which you desire to see manifested, but do not try to force him to want the things you want. See the article by Martha Helmes, page 34 of January, 1915, Nautilus. Try to approach your problem in the way Miss Helmes suggests. Read "Mental and Physical Ease and Supremacy," by C. Franklin Leavitt, and learn something of the subject of self-adjustment. Remember that your husband reacts to your attitude. You can change him only by winning him to want to act more as you desire. Do not be too sure that your view is altogether truth and his view is altogether error. The truth usually lies somewhere between two extremes. And remember that "whoever walks a furlong without sympathy walks to his own funeral dressed in a shroud."

GERTRUDE.—The first thing you ought to do is to free that man entirely and completely in your own mind. Do not allow yourself to think or feel for one moment that you want to bring him to you against his will. To do so is the surest possible way to keep him from coming. The next step is to affirm to yourself many times a day that nothing goes out of your life but to make room for something Persistent practice in keeping your mental attitude as nearly as possible in line with what I have said above will free your forces which are now going to waste in worry and unhappiness. See that you keep busy every waking moment either at work or play. Get plenty of physical activity. Active physical work will help you to forget your trouble. Work will help to draw your forces into creative channels and free them from the hyp-notic treadmill of worry. Proceed to live your own life, and if this man is really related to you by the law of attraction he will come back to you, but from what you tell me I would not advise you to count upon his doing so. Look well to the present and forward to the future and ignore the past.

Y. Z.-Whatever you do must be done in the realm of the silent, sub-conscious forces. See the article by Martha Helmes in January 1915, issue of Nautilus (page 34). I would suggest that you adapt the plan of treatment suggested by Miss Helmes to the woman whose husband was a drunkard and apply it to your son's wife. If the mental attitude of yourself and wife toward her is really full of good will, and you regularly direct your thought currents toward her charged with this good will, free from any trace of criticism, she will in time react, I think, to your thought currents. But in attempting this form of treatment you should endeavor to rise completely above the plane of intellect into the realm of love. Intellect will show you the faults and weaknesses of others. This must not enter into your attitude toward your son's wife if you are to be successful. may feel that you have already done all that I have suggested. Have you made a systematic, purposeful effort to talk to her regu-larly in the silence and express the attitude and feeling I have outlined? If not, try it for a time, and I am sure you will get results.

During the Civil War someone asked Lincoln if he thought God was on his side. He replied that he had been so busy trying to make sure that he was on God's side that he hadn't had time to consider the other matter. See that you are on the side of the Law of Attraction by making yourself a radiant center of love, good will and dynamic power through the free expression of your real self. Practice on every man, woman and child you come in contact with. Forget yourself when you talk to others. Get their point of view, an understanding of their thoughts and feelings, their hopes and aims. Men are bound to like you if you are radiant, sympathetic and dynamic, which you will be if you let yourself out into expression. I do not know of any general New Thought emblem.

Mrs. Margaret H. Sanger, returning from Europe to face trial on the charge of misusing the mails in connection with "birth control" literature, made her appearance before Judge Henry D. Clayton in the Criminal Branch of the United States District Court, New York City. She was cheered in the court room by a crowd of prominent persons, including Mrs. Elsie Clews Parsons, Rose Pastor Stokes, Fola LaFollette, Maud Malone, Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Abbott, Dr. William J. Robinson, Mrs. L. B. Beck, Mrs. Zelma Corning Brandt, Jessie Ashley, Florence Lewis and others. The court was offered a petition signed by Mrs. O. H. P. Belmont and Mrs. Harriet Stanton Blatch, among others, asking for a jury including six women, for the sake of a fair trial. The

trial was postponed to a later date. A dinner was given Mrs. Sanger the evening before at the Hotel Brevort, attended by many sociologists, physicians and social workers.—Physical Culture.

"A man's life is not the product of his heredity, but of the things in his heredity and environment to which he chooses to attend. If a man is a man he is his own environment." "Bob Allen" says this to his friend Blake, in Miss Charlotte Chorpenning's new prize play, "Between the Lines," produced at the Castle Square Theater, Boston, under management of John Craig. The author is a young Radcliffe student.

An approach to full acceptance of the principle of single instead of dual Federal and state regulation of railroads in this country distinguished the speech by Senator Underwood of Alabama before the electric railway men's convention in Chicago. In discussing the subject the senator said: "We must consider the wisdom of substituting one master for the forty-nine masters that regulate our commerce today." That utterance points to the virtual suppression of state regulation, leaving Federal regulation unchallenged and supreme. Senator Underwood's attitude is sound, and it is most significant that a southern senator, reared in the states' rights school of politics, should take such a position.— Springfield Republican.

Under the leadership of Commissioner Lamb of the Salvation Army's emigration department, an attempt is being made to raise a fund of \$1,000,000 to be used in assisting widows and their children to find homes in the British overseas dominions after the war. The preponderance of women over men in the United Kingdom, and the reverse situation in the dominions, have been regarded for years as a danger to social stability. 1911, there were 1,336,000 more females than males in the United Kingdom. When the war is over, the ratio of women to men will be even more unequal. To offset the ill-effects of this condition the Salvation Army is ready to undertake an ambitious scheme. The army proposes, under its own supervision, to find homes in the dominions for widows and their children, and assist them in obtaining a livelihood. If, after four years in the new country, the woman does not succeed, the Salvation Army will see that she returns to the place from which she emi-grated. Some of these women will probably become small farmers; others will become housekeepers for men farmers who are willing to afford advantages to the widow's children. In any case, the moral standing and humanity of the Salvation Army make an adequate guarantee that the woman shall not come to grief or suffer needless discomfort. In fact, the Army, with its religious and humanitarian principles, and its personal touch, is far better equipped than a government bureau would be for carrying out this delicate work of providing people with a new environment.—Springfield Republican.

and women who have consciously or unconsciously embraced the attitude towards truth which is, for want of a better name, called "New Thought."

When the New Thought disciple has taught himself to become receptive, he finds that there is another lesson to be learned. He must learn the second lesson of the lily and the child, viz., to build up what he has learned to take in and make of his soul an enduring structure. The truths absorbed in the silence must be translated into everyday life and must be tested in the fire of experience, for their fruits ye shall know them."

The adult must learn how to control his

objective mind, how to train his subjective mind before he can aspire to be completely constructive. The education of the objective mind consists in rejecting all destructive tendencies and strengthening the constructive ones. For instance, in trying to cure yourself of some obnoxious habit, the destructive way is to scold yourself continually for indulgence until human nature is weary enough of the scolding to mend. The constructive and easier way is to find some good habit that, if acquired, will make the practice of the obnoxious one impossible, and cultivate it with all your energy.

Although New Thought concerns itself chiefly with truths of a practical and everyday tendency, there is absolutely no department of life that is beyond its scope. Its primary message is, "The kingdom of Heaven is within you; let it show itself here and

now.'

Its message to the churches and the creeds "Love is the force that can reconcile all difficulties, quell all strife. We push out our chests and say, "Well, I had 3,200 calories today; that's plenty for any man," or "I've had a big beefsteak, very properly combined with the other foods that should go with it".

When a true expert inspects a cow which is not well, he does not inquire as to how many calories of food she has consumed each day, nor yet how or in what proportion her hay and corn were combined. In 999 cases out of one thousand that expert will try to find out wherein the cow is deficient in nutrition and will attempt to remedy the deficiency at once. In short the veterinarian has learned to look in the cow far beyond where we look in ourselves, i. e., to deficiency.

The History of

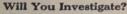

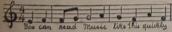
