How to Oust Persistent Fear of Failure.

G OD works in you to will and to do
His Good Pleasure, which is
ever more life, more perfection of life.
God is backing you in your desire.
God is working in you to will and to

do all that is needed to permit your perfect idea to come into expression. And God is all power, all wisdom, all love, everywhere present, and everywhere *He is concentrating* on the expression of abundance and beauty in and through you. All you desire is yours NOW in truth.

There is a "treatment" in that paragraph that you should live with every day. Take it into the silence with you the first thing in the morning, and again the last thing at night. whenever a fear happens to come into your mind, get out this statement of truth and read it over to yourself slowly, carefully, understandingly, three times. Every time you get to the end of it stamp your foot and grit your teeth and hiss, "IT'S SO! THOUGHTS OF FEAR CANNOT PREVAIL AGAINST MY DESIRE, WHICH GOD WILLS THROUGH ME." Stamp your foot vigorously, hiss your statements of truth with all your might! Declare insistently for God and His truth and life and perfection within you!

See that you concentrate on this truth the first thing in the morning and the last thing at night, and then as nearly as possible dismiss it from mind at all other times. The more completely you forget it between times the better. But whenever it does happen to come into your mind, repeat the statement over as I have described. Bye and bye you will find that you are not remembering it very often. Eventually the fears will pass out of your mind entirely, you will smile at your past fears. And then still a little later, you will forget to make your statement the first thing in the morning and the last thing at night. And you will forget it because the necessity for it has passed away.

Prenatal Fears.

I BELIEVE that any woman who ever bore a child has been cold-chilled many times by the thought that her child might be imperfect. Such fears are nothing unusual.

The fears themselves can do nothing toward malforming the child.

It is only when you say of these fears, "Oh, I know it is so—my child will be marked." It is only when you assent to, or "affirm"—as New Thought people call it—that your fears really begin to have an effect on you. Until you begin to affirm them they are like tramps passing your door. When you affirm them, when you assert to yourself that your fears are true, it is then that you invite the tramps into your household.

But what if you do invite a tramp into your household now and then? If you are gentle and kind the chances are 999 out of 1,000 that you will feed the tramp a meal and he will say thank you and walk out again and breathe a little blessing on you. But of course if you keep on inviting in the fear-tramps at all hours of the day and night, you will soon be overrun with them and they will make your mental household over into a sort of gink hotel! In other words, they will possess you and you will begin to express after their kind.

Never be afraid of fear thoughts. They have no power to harm unless you assert that they are true.

So when a fear comes into your mind that you will mark your child, simply assert that it not true! In making that positive assertion, you turn the tramp fear away, and he disappears into the bottomless pit whence he came.

Did you ever stop to think what a bottomless pit is? The bottomless pit is the pit of forgetfulness!—of non-recognition. No other kind of a pit could possibly be bottomless! And nothing could stay in a bottomless pit—it would fall clean through into the Infinite Truth.

So when a fear-tramp faces you just assert his opposite *truth*, and let the fear thought dump himself into the bottomless pit of Infinite Truth.

Your assertion of Truth is like the man of the house whose appearance at the door causes the fear-tramp to vanish.

So when any sort of fear-tramps come to bother you, just assert the Truth of Perfect Being Here and Now. Have special times the first thing in the morning and the last thing at night, for asserting and reasserting the truth.

It is the TRUTH that makes you free: believe it, receive it, affirm it.

Self Treatment For Success.

HERE is a treatment for you to give to yourself, the first thing every morning and the last thing at night. And whenever you HAPPEN to think of it during the day, then take the treatment over again; but don't try to think of it at any time except the first thing in the morning and the last thing at night. Here is the treatment:

The thing I desire is mine now in spirit and in truth.

I believe it, I affirm it, I know it.

The door of circumstance is already opening into the very sort of position I want! I may see the door around the next corner!

I will be ready for it!

Every day and every hour of the day I am preparing for this new position that I shall fill with joy—I am preparing for it by doing in the most beautiful manner everything that comes to my hand to do now.

I do each thing as unto Christ himself. I do it as if I were in heaven, and serving Christ.

I do it with joy, with intelligence, with good will, with loving kindness.

It matters not to me what I have to do, I do it in the spirit of loving service, of enjoyment.

Even though I do not always feel all this, I affirm it, I know it is true of me in spirit and in truth.

I now cast aside all my depressing thoughts, and put my heart, my soul, my Good Will into doing this one thing under my hand, in the most beautiful way possible.

I love to do it.

I LOVE to do it, whether I feel like it or not!

I choose to love it, I choose to do it like one angel serving another.

I am one with God, the Spirit of Love, and He works in me to will and to do this beautiful service in the most beautiful way.

As I work I become filled with the spirit of loving service. I become so radiant and so attractive that I shall quickly be drawn to my place in the delightful surroundings that match my loving service spirit.

SMASHED and the World redeemed for democracy? Of course not.

Seventh: Fix maximum day's work at eight hours, with heavy penalties for working over time or permitting others to do so. A long pull of war makes a rising head of vim imperative, and science has proved beyond doubt that no human can grow stronger on more than eight hours' labor daily.

Eighth: Run all munitions plants and other hard-labor plants twenty-four hours a day, with SIX TOURS OF FOUR HOURS EACH for all workers except foremen, inspectors, etc.; drafting men and women from all walks of life to do their turns of four hours each per day at these vital trades; thus training an unlimited supply of workers from which to recruit and increase the number of eight-hour-per-day skilled foremen and inspectors as required.

All four-hour-tour workers could, in

another four hours per day, carry on at low draft their present business, profession or other occupation.

Wanted a Job to Win the War.

IN SHORT, our government should set EVERBODY to work four hours a day to win this war, leaving them all free to pursue their chosen occupations the remainder of the day.

Do you know a man or woman in the land who would not be benefited in health and mental alertness by being drafted for four hours' labor per day?

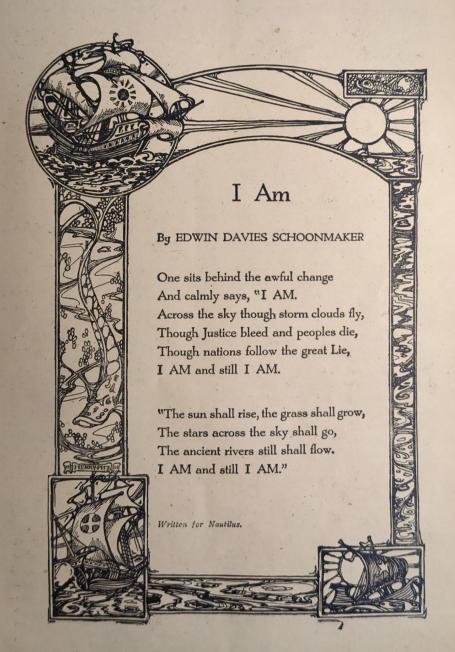
Personally I believe every one of us could do more and better work in three or four hours at our chosen vocation after—or before—doing four hours' active service for our country.

OT to know that within you there is something that is changeless and defiant of time and death," says a writer, "is not to know anything."

Not to know this is certainly not to know the reality of ourselves. For the things which are most real in our nature are the qualities we have inherited from our Creator; and our health, our success and happiness depend upon our consciousness of these changeless principles within us which are defiant of time, of chance, and of death. In other words, they depend upon our consciousness of our divinity, our oneness with our Creator.

The truth of my being, the reality of me, is divine, and when I affirm the ideal I long to be, when I affirm the perfection, physical and mental I long for, I am affirming the divinity of myself, the reality of me. I am asserting my inalienable right to health, to success and to happiness. I am affirming the truth of my being, the reality of myself, and in proportion as I am conscious of this changeless reality, this divinity of myself, do I tend to reflect

in body, mind and spirit, the perfection which I assert.

The divine injunction, "Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in Heaven is perfect," was not given man to mock him. We are beginning to see that there is material in every normal being to make the ideal, the perfect man, the perfect woman. If we could only hold persistently the perfect pattern, the perfect ideal, so that it would become our dominant mental attitude, it would soon be woven into the life, outpictured in a more refined flesh, and we should become perfect human beings.

In other words, the divinity of myself, that changeless reality of myself, the truth of my being, is my model which I must constantly visualize, idealize because that is my true self. Constantly holding in the mind the ideals which we long to make real, and the image of ourselves in all the wholeness, completeness, beauty, and efficiency which we wish were ours, will tend to make these things real in our lives.

Hamilton Wright Mabie says, "Nothing is so fundamental in creating a real and noble personality, as the choice of a high ideal. Let a man choose such an ideal, and follow it loyally, and he may give up all concern for his character: it will form itself. Such a man is emancipated, not only from the temptation to be selfish in his friendships, but from most of the fears that beset men of less clearness of purpose. * * * Such a man discards, one by one, all those things which belittle human life and fill it with weakening and corroding anxieties. He is not disturbed by the confusion of aims which he finds in the world about him; he is not concerned about his enemies, for he has none whom he has consciously made; he thinks generously and fearlessly of his friends, and he is lifted above all outward changes of fortune by the spirituality of the end which he has chosen."

We are just beginning to get glimpse of the immense possibilities of character building, of self-improvement, of man-building, in the persistent visualizing of ourselves as the Creator intended us to be. It was the ideal man, the immortal man without weakness, defect or taint, that God created and not the weak, sickly, defective, devitalized man we most frequently see. With the making of the dwarfed man, the scrub oak of a man the Creator had It is man who has nothing to do. marred the Creator's plan. We have created the dwarfed, starved, blighted specimens of humanity that He intended should be godlike.

A noted artist constantly enjoins his pupils not to watch their hands but to keep their eyes on the model. The master knows that it is only by keeping the model continually in mind that the pupil can make a perfect copy of it. We know that the greatest artist could not paint the face of a Christ, the greatest sculptor could not call out of the marble the statue of a Christ, with the model of Satan in his mind. The painting and the statue must correspond with the model. Christ or Satan, angel or devil, they must be alike.

It is by keeping our mind's eye continually on the perfect model, the divine model, by holding in mind what is meant by the injunction, "Be ye perfect even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect," that we touch central power, come into close touch with the Divine. It is this stimulation of the ideal and the effort to make it real that bring us into unison with our higher nature. It is holding in mind our wholeness, completeness, our at-one-ment with our Maker that tends to make us perfect, just as the contemplation of

the opposite leads us very quickly in the other direction.

What you think you are, believe yourself to be, you are gradually, inevitably, becoming. A person who becomes obsessed with the idea that he has inherited a tendency to insanity, that sometime he is going to be insane, causes changes in his brain cells which set to work directly toward the mental condition he fears. His terror of insanity fills his mind with pictures of the malady, creates the very mental attitude which tends to produce it. There are many people in our insane asylums today who started in their direction by thinking that they were not like other people and would sometime become insane. At first perhaps they began to think they were peculiar, that there was something strange about them, and they held this thought of their peculiarity until they automatically did the very things they feared they would do.

People who believe that they have inherited a tendency to tuberculosis and live in constant terror of the disease, keep their mind continually filled with images of its effects. They are constantly picturing the horrible symptoms which they are watching for, expecting-the loss of weight, the gradual wasting away of the body. Fear of the thing the mind so persistently dwells on impairs the appetite, injures the digestion, the assimilation, so that they do not get the proper nourishment from their food, and very soon they actually begin to lose weight, to waste away. The constant picturing of the suffering and the physical deterioration weaken the body and its disease-resisting power to a point where the tuberculosis germs, which exist in many perfeetly healthy people, have the very conditions necessary for their development.

Holding in mind a defective model or the model of the thing they do not want ruins countless lives. Many people do not realize that they are holding in their minds the exact opposite of the health model, the success model, the prosperity model, the efficiency model, the perfection model they would like to realize in their lives. That is, while they desire to produce a certain result they hold in mind another kind of a model altogether. If, for instance, health is a thing they desire beyond everything else and they hold the disease model or the disease fear in their mind all the time, they never can produce the opposite result from the model which they hold in their mind. If they hold the poverty model in mind when they desire prosperity. the failure model when they desire success, the model of imperfection when they desire perfection, of course the results will be like the mental model.

The life processes build into the life whatever we hold in the mind, whether it is fear, anxiety, jealousy, hatred, revenge, or love, success, efficiency, health, perfection. It doesn't matter what it is, the mental attitude becomes the model for the time being. This is as exacting as the laws of mathematics. Whatever you persistently hold in your mind will be reproduced in your life. There is no escape from it.

The man you see in your mental vision of yourself, the man you picture yourself to be, is the man who will match the vision with its reality. Is the man you picture yourself the sort of man who can do the wonderful things you desire to do? Has he the stamina and stability, has he the initiative and the courage, has he the pluck and the grit, has he the ambition and the enthusiasm, to fill out your dreams of your future, to match them with their (Continued on Page 40.)

NEW THOUGHT IN THE OLD BIBLE

THE Bible is the oldest text-book of what we call New Thought, the Divine manifesting itself in the human, "Chirst in you, the hope of glory," i. e. of character (Col. 1:27).

Whatever is good, constructive, lifegiving in the new forms of spiritual religion is found, in principle, in the Bible. To be sure, it does not contain lessons in breathing, for these, in themselves are nothing except as they teach how to open the body for the entrance of the Spirit. But the Bible offers that inspiration whose functioning will start the breathing from whose exercise the lessons are deduced. The Bible doesn't give instruction in the physiology of the solar plexus, but it effectually awakens it, as witnessed, for instance, in "Twice-Born Men."

Ever since the Bible began to be, millions of people who never heard the expression "New Thought" have used it as text-book for the invigorating life of the indwelling Spirit. For the Thought itself is as old as God's first idea of crea-

tion as a means of expressing himself. It is new, not because of its novelty, but because of the newness of life involved in its application in individual experience.

On the other hand, thousands have today lost the Truth out of their Bibles. because they read, not what has always been there, but what modern scribes tell them ought to be there. In the days of Jesus of Nazareth the scribes, the pedants of religion, had overlaid the Old Testament with a mass of dry Jewish tradition which obscured its real meaning. Jesus taught the people to dig aside the rubbish, and to get back to the Divine Father. We need the same lesson today. If we discard the burden of traditional theology and read for ourselves, taking the Bible to mean just what it says, we shall find there the Divine Love, the Fatherhood of God, the supremacy of the Spirit over physical conditions, the power of the soul to command the body and to maintain its health, the divine right of the human being to health, success, and happiness, and the power to achieve these through the indwelling Spirit.

Some people yet read the Bible as a textbook of science, or of history, or of doctrine, or of ethics. It is none of these. It is the story of God's progressive revelation of Himself, His fatherhood, His infinite love for all of His children. He is "the same, yesterday, today, and forever" (Heb. XII:9).

The Bible is a library of selected Hebrew literature, a collection of stories, biographies, and poems, all dealing with one theme, God's efforts to make men understand Him and His love. The men of the Old Testament were children, who often misunderstood, and misrepresented Him as a cruel taskmaster, but now we can understand and discard their misinterpretations, finding what He really meant to say—to us as well as to them.

What He said to Abraham, "Fear not: I am thy shield, and thy exceeding great reward" (Gen. xv:1), he says to you and to me. All the way down the ages he has been telling us to banish Fear-thought. He said it to the runaway slaves from Egypt, when Pharaoh's host had pursued them, and the Red Sea blocked their way of escape. Moses, who had learned part of his lesson, told them: "Fear not; stand still and see the salvation of the Lord, which He will work for you today. The Lord shall fight for you and ye shall hold your peace" (Ex. xiv:13, 14). Perhaps Moses expected the Lord to send angels to battle for them. But the Lord said: "Wherefore do you cry unto me; tell them to go forward" (v. 15). As they went forward, the leaders dipping their feet into the first ripples of the water, the frequent east wind of the region rolled back the sea and they crossed dry-shod.

God is still saying to every soul fleeing from the slavery of evil, and seeing ahead only the Red Sea of Hopelessness: "Don't sit down and cry for help. Go forward, and the Lord will send the East wind." Yet today, when we find ourselves in a tight place, we begin to tremble, and grumble, instead of going ahead. The East wind won't roll back the sea of difficulty until we have started with determined purpose to escape our slavery to circumstances.

Sometimes it seems to me that the whole Bible just echoes and re-echoes the lesson of Fearlessness, which is another name for faith.

One of my girlhood friends talked a great deal in prayer meeting about her faith. One night it fell to us to stay together in my family's camp, while the others went to town for supplies. I, who was brought up to fear nothing, should have stayed alone, had (Continued on Page 56.)

Popularity is, like other social attainments, gained in competition. If a girl is to be popular with men she must pay the price in understanding and sympathy. Even good looks will not take the place of this. Selfish, cold or superior aloofness will not get you anywhere in the way of friendship and popularity.

To win friends, make yourself worth while. Study others who are successful where you are weak and try to adapt yourself accordingly.

Self-Condemnation.

There are many over conscientious people who greatly hamper themselves by self-condemnation. It becomes almost an obsession with them. They worry over their smallest short-comings—and many of their short-comings are purely imaginary. Fear and worry are often developed by the victim of self-condemnation to such an extent that his health and general well being are seriously affected.

Now if you suffer from this distressing form of obsession I suggest that you take fifteen minutes off and analyze the cause for your self condemnation. In most cases it will be so trifling that you will yourself recognize the foolishness of wasting further time in thinking about the matter. But even if your self-analysis should leave you with the impression that you have really been remiss in some important matter, you ought to waste no time and energy in regret and self-condemnation. That helps no one.



If you can remedy the mistake, start in to do so at once and meantime don't worry over what is past for that you cannot help. Focus your forces on making good in the future.

A well-known practical psychologist says: "Fear confirms your weakness of character-increasingly enslaving you to your petty shortcomings." By worrying over your past mistakes you open the way for more. You bring to you the very experiences you desire to avoid. The little weaknesses or peculiarities of character which you condemn in yourself grow by that condemnation. They thrive on recognition. They are fed and kept alive by the attention you bestow upon them. You give them a large place in your consciousness and they begin to assume a large influence upon your life-a much larger influence than they deserve.

If you will turn your thoughts away from these short-comings, stop trying to judge yourself too exclusively by intellect alone, open wide the door to faith and hope and love and courage and confidence, fix your attention on those qualities which represent the opposite of your weaknesses, you will begin to come out from under your obsession and enter the path to freedom. For strength and courage and hope also thrive and grow by the attention you give them. Center your attention upon them instead of wasting your energies in useless regrets. Do not expect perfection. Rather find your happiness in meeting and solving the problems which come to you. You grow strong by experience. And do not despair even though you find that you have some peculiarity of temperament which amounts almost

to an obsession and which does not readily yield to the methods suggested above. Many good men, many geniuses, have been similarly the victims of obsessions and yet have accomplished their great work in the world.

The sooner you let go of your trouble in your own mind the sooner the trouble will let go of you. To again quote from an authority in practical psychology: "Experience proves that the vast majority of these psychic infirmities are due to some form of fear, and that they are in a large measure removable by the exercise of strong faith."

When Things Go "Wrong."

"Several times I have made a start thinking everything was all right and as it should be, but it seems that every time I do this things go unusually wrong."

Try changing your attitude toward life. Try to get the viewpoint that things cannot really go wrong, that when they seem to do so it is because you cannot have all the premises from which to reason, cannot connect up cause and effect fully because your own understanding is finite and nothing less than the Infinite could always know the reason for every experience which comes into your life,

The truth is that our lives are governed by exact laws and we attract each experience that comes to us. The unpleasant experiences we call "bad" and yet in an absolute sense they are just as good as the pleasant experiences. Through the unpleasant experiences we learn the laws of life and develop character. That is why we attract them. They are absolutely neces-



sary to our development at the particular time and place where they occur.

To develop a chronic mental attitude of resistance to unpleasant experiences is to bind yourself to a cycle of such experiences. Look for the lesson to yourself in every experience that comes to you and then center your attention on the next step ahead. Cultivate your faith instead of your fears. It is not what is outside you that has power to harm you, but only what is within yourself. Depend upon yourself, upon the One Life that expresses in and through you, instead of upon things which are outside you. Your source of power is within. Conditions do not master you but only your beliefs, your convictions about these things.

Within you is the power and wisdom to meet conditions, to adjust when needed, to direct and use the laws of life so that unpleasant experiences will have no power to harm you. Trust this Power within.

Do not assume that you know exactly how your good ought to come to you. Welcome each experience as good for the time and place, where it comes into your life.

When you set your heart on a certain thing happening in a certain way you are quite apt to find that it does not happen in just that way. Do not therefore conclude that the universe is wrong, and that everything "happens" without regard to law. Rather look within yourself for the cause of your failure to realize what you expected and affirm your faith in the law of Good working in and through you no matter how things and conditions seem to fluctuate. Hold the mental attitude that

if the particular thing you are working for does not come to you something else equally as good, or better, is waiting for you.

Do not postpone your life until some certain event has occurred. Live in the NOW.

Listen to Emerson: "He who knows that power is in the soul, that he is weak only because he has looked for good out of him and elsewhere, and, so perceiving, throws himself unhesitatingly on his thought, instantly rights himself, stands in the erect position, commands his limbs, works miracles; just as a man who stands on his feet is stronger than a man who stands on his head. So use all that is called fortune. Most men gamble with her and gain all, and lose all, as her wheel rolls. But do thou leave as unlawful these winnings, and deal with Cause and Effect, the chancellors of God. In the Will work and acquire, and thou hast chained the wheel of Chance, and shalt always drag her after thee. A political victory, a rise of rents, the recovery of your sick or the return of your absent friend, or some other quite external event raises your spirits, and you think good days are preparing for you. Do not believe it. Nothing can bring you peace but yourself. Nothing can bring you peace but the triumph of principles."

A United Soul.

If you are reading a book and some one addresses a question to you and you undertake to answer that question in a half-hearted way without giving it your full attention, your mind is distracted as a result. Part of your attention is on your book and part on



the question. Your forces are divided. A portion of your energy has been diverted from the original stream.

If you are nervous and cultivate your nervousness you are constantly the victim of similar psychic conflicts and division, within yourself. You have a certain piece of work to do, for instance, and while your forces are sufficiently centered to enable you to go ahead and accomplish it, yet you are divided in your mind and part of your forces are resisting at every step. The result is that this resistance, this mental division, is almost as exhausting as the work itself.

Many an employee goes home at night thoroughly exhausted because of resistance to his employer, his environment or his associates, where the work alone which he is doing might be easily performed. He has added twenty, fifty, a hundred per cent to his own depletion of energy by his divided mind in regard to his work. "No day is well spent if it contains any psychic conflicts that interfere with the united functioning of the entire psyche in an effort which brings at the end, and only at the end, of the day a feeling of thorough and satisfactory fatigue, a fatigue which is felt more or less as a surprise, and which prepares the mind for a complete relaxation in sleep."

Another cause of a divided self is the repression of desires. Driven back into the unconscious and denied expression, desires draw to themselves energy and create a conflict which results in unpleasant feelings, worry, nervousness, fear, indigestion, etc.

A person who is fully absorbed in his work or recreation, who does each thing with all his heart, will not hear nor be conscious of what will distract the one who works in a half-hearted manner with a large portion of his mental energy being employed elsewhere. You can see this demonstrated in any office where there are a half-dozen workers. Some will be so interested in their own work that the clicking of typewriters, the scraping of chairs, the conversation of fellow workers between themselves will have no disturbing effect.

Others will be nervous and fidgety whenever there is any unusual amount of noise, and will find themselves listracted every few minutes because their work furnishes, in their minds, such a weak attraction in competition with surrounding noises and occurrences. The ability to keep the soul united in the work of the day depends upon one's desire and willingness to forget self in work or service.

If you are to live your life successfully you must learn to face your problems with a united soul and not allow any side shows to distract your forces from the main theme. Distractions, whether within or without, should be avoided.

DIVIDING THE DENOMINATOR, OR THE SECRET OF HAPPINESS: MY OWN EXPERIENCE

I CONSIDER the most vital point in my life, as far as happiness is concerned, to be the day I read, in "Sartor Resartus," many years ago, what Carlyle wrote about happiness being like a common fraction.

In substance what he said was, that happiness is as the value of a common fraction, of which the Denominator stands for The-Things-You-Think-You-Ought-To-Have, and the Numerator for The-Things-You-Actually-Have.

For instance, if you think you ought to have \$100, and you actually have only \$10, you are one-tenth happy; while if you think you ought to have only \$10, and really have \$100, you are ten times happy.

Now, we learned at school the rule that "the value of a common fraction can be increased either by multiplying the numerator or by dividing the denominator."

Hence, if I have but \$10, and think I ought to have \$100, I can increase my happiness in either one of two ways: (1) by getting more dollars, raising my possessions say, up to \$100, that is multiplying the numerator;

or, on the other hand, by changing my thought, so that I think I ought to have only \$10, that is, dividing the denominator. In the first case the result is one hundred hundredths; in the latter case it is ten-tenths; which amount exactly to the same thing.

The secret of this wisdom is that by altering one's thought one can accomplish the same end as by altering one's circumstances. And as to this it is worth while to note, as follows:

1. It is always possible to divide the denominator (change one's thought), and often impossible to multiply the numerator (get more things).

2. It is easier also to rectify your notion of what you deserve (divide the denominator) than it is to get enough things to be your deserts.

3. The world is divided into two classes, the wise and the foolish. The wise strive to want less and the fools to get more.

4. Those who try to gain happiness by getting more things are foolish, because human nature is such that the more you get the more you want. Unconsciously when you multiply the numerator you multiply the denominator at the same time; the value of the fraction remains the same; you do not become any happier.

Thus it is of most common occurrence that the man who has worked his way up from poverty to riches, from low positions to high office, finds himself as miserable as he was at first. The wealthy Irish contractor looks back at the days when he worked with the pick, and wonders why he was happier then than now. The reason is simple; he wanted less; his denominator was small.

5. The human soul is insatiable. It is as impossible to satisfy it by giving it things, as it would be to fill the bottomless pit with a pint cup. Pour all earth and all heaven into a soul, and it will cry for more. The story that Alexander "sighed for more worlds to conquer" is psychologically correct. To gain the whole world is to lose your own soul, because you have gained nothing but a fever, that twenty worlds could not cool.

6. It took me a good many years to digest and assimilate this truth. It shattered all my preconceived ideas. It was directly contrary to the ambitions of all the world around me. It did not "convert" me in a minute, but grew like a seed, long and slowly. It entered among my thoughts and transformed them one by one, through years of experience. But I consider it the most vital truth I have ever learned.

7. I have discovered that this truth is the core and gist of all religions, as far as their man-word bearings are concerned. That is to say, that part of any religion that "helps" us, gives us patience, strength and wisdom (not that part that dogmatizes or speculates about the hereafter and the unknowable) amounts to just this:

Learn to adjust your thought to the universe, and cease striving to adjust the universe to your thought.

This, I take it, is the gist of Jesus. It is "the Christian's secret of a happy life." It was that which gave the early Christians such an experience, such a quality of joy, that they astounded the heathen when, as Matthew Arnold expresses it:

"On that hard pagan world disgust And secret loathing fell; Deep weariness and sated lust Made human life a hell."

This is the gist of Buddha, who turned his followers from the pursuit of pleasures to the reduction of desires (dividing the denominator).

I find the same idea in Confucius, in Socrates, and in every great illuminated soul that has helped men toward peace and poise.

It is the gist of the Mystics and of Mae-

terlinck, who has so beautifully interpreted their spirit for modern folk.

It is the valuable kernel in Christian Science, that portion of its teaching that brings tangible results.

And, above all, it is the gospel of New Thought, for the very essence of that system is its emphasis upon the value of the soul's control and mastery of itself (dividing the denominator).

In conclusion, I am not dogmatizing now, nor preaching to others, and I do not presume to say that this idea will mean to them all it has meant to me, for I well know that truth cannot be handed from one person to another, as one would hand bread or money, but is to be taken only into minds that are hungry for it, minds wherein it will live and grow and become flesh of its flesh and bone of its bone, if you will pardon the stretched simile. I am only telling my own experience, which, as I understand it, is what was asked for.

Every individual has within himself the power to conquer and control conditions. Successful men and women have used it unconsciously, and following this law has brought them their heart's desire. So exact and powerful is this law that it will lift anyone who works with it, up out of seemingly hopeless environments, into success and plenty. Ignorance of the law is no excuse; it is man's business to find and work with it, thereby gaining its benefits.

An electric car stands still on the track until the motorman complies with its law, by attaching it to the trolley overhead. This done, and lo! it moves.

Achievement is the most satisfying thing life holds; rich men all say the pursuit of

their wealth brought more pleasure than mere possession.

Getting what you want is not a hopeless dream, but a thing possible of actual accomplishment, when you know the law involved and work with it.

Concentrated, creative thought, applied to the Mental Image, is this law, and the first step consists in making a clear-cut, mental image or idea of the thing or condition you wish to accomplish. This will become a thought-seed or center, around which your thought-energy can build. In the imagination, that wonderful creative region of the mind, must your thought-seed or Mental Image be formed. You do not require extra money, nor change of location.

Begin now, right where you are, and as you are. Make a business of thinking about and living in this desire every day, especially when you feel blue and discouraged; turn to it and see yourself in imagination, doing the very things you desire, surrounded by what you love most. Earnestly wish for it; long for it with all your heart.

The natural laws of the thought world will thus be set in motion, to bring it to pass. This mental gardening is most important.

Do not question the whys and wherefores. Create it coming to you, just as you want it. Water this mental garden with interest and attention, while the sunshine of your faith, hope and love is warming it into life. Writing it out in detail will also assist you in definite concentration.

Do not, however, neglect your daily duties. Ere long, new ideas, methods and plans will flash into your mind, and by the law of attraction the people, circumstances and things able to help you, will be coming to you in seemingly miraculous ways. Not all at once, but steadily and surely, what you have sown you are bound to reap. This is the law and never is it otherwise.

By and by, an opportunity to do something towards it will present itself. Then act, and with whatever means are at hand: Be willing to start small; it will increase.

In planting a garden, you do not understand the silent, unseen forces that begin working to make it grow. Edward Walker says: "Every great invention, the locomotive, the telegraph, the electric light and the printing press, had its mental image, preceding its material construction. So are all business enterprises, the great telegraph lines and railroad routes, the powerful trusts and the great financial houses, but the results of those who first mentally created them." The architect builds the house in his mind first—then follows the one we see.

Meditate on this fact, till the truth of it dawns on you. It will give you faith. "Work out your own salvation, for it is God who worketh in you," is the command; and constructive thinking is the method.

I know a woman and her husband, who longed for a farm and the plenty it represented to them. They owned a little home in an Ohio town; the husband's wages were moderate, without future prospect, and land there was very high. They got hold of this law—their only hope.

The daughter and her husband also became interested; together they thought and concentrated.

HOW I HELPED MY DAUGHTER OVER-COME ANGER FITS AND STUTTERING

HAD often heard it argued that children of the modern minister were more nervous and high-strung than others. I flouted the idea. "A strong parent, a strong child," I quoted. Did I not have nerves like iron and sinews like whipcord? My physical strength was splendid; neither was I lacking in mental ability. My mind happens to be the spontaneous kind; it can go with a flash, and I will own up, when occasion requires it can also go with a flare-a kind of sulphuric brilliancy not becoming to a man in my profession. Leaving out this one besetting sin I am considered a strong man in my denomination, having filled some of the best appointments it has to offer, but even preachers of the gospel of Christ have their battles to fight and their victories to win.

When our daughter came, a child of love and prayer, I shouted "Hallelujah!" Her mother was a woman, calm with a deep sea calmness, and I visioned our daughter's whole life spent "in green pastures beside still waters."

But alas and alack! By the time she was three years old she had developed an alarming disposition, and a bad temper that positively refused to stay "put." In our private talks we called her "The Periodical of Protest." Her pet word was "NO-o-o!" She assumed a fighting attitude toward life, and her little fists were usually doubled up, ready to go after anything which came her way.

Physically, she was perfect, with the strength and tenacity of a lithe young sapling, but nothing we did or did not do—and many precious hours were spent planning ways and means—had any effect on her disposition.

At five years she began to stutter. And, horrors, it was the buzzing kind, so hard to control or overcome! You would think forty swarms of bees were about the house. I was much alarmed, and began at once to make my first mistake in dealing with the trouble. I talked about it constantly in her presence. "Dorothy, stop that buzzing at once and see if you can't say it as you should. Wife, how will she ever get through school with such a handicap? It is positively criminal to let this thing continue," and on and on. I wince with

pain, now, to think what torture this must have been to my sensitive child. Stupidly helpless was I, and, of course, the stuttering grew constantly worse.

The principal of the schools called, and the subject came up. He advised that we pay no attention to the trouble and, in time, she would outgrow it. He was very positive. He had had experience with hundreds of children, and he ought to know.

And right here I made mistake number two. Instead of facing the problem with an effort to solve it intelligently I did just what thousands of parents are doing! I shirked, and salved my conscience with the thought, "Oh, well, she'll come out somehow!" And she did.

At ten years of age it was an agony to listen to her. Her affliction—for such I had constantly called it in her presence—was the trial of our home. I had long noticed that her fits of anger aggravated the stuttering, and to my sorrow was now learning that the stuttering aggravated the anger fits. Her paroxysms of rage were terrible to see.

I had taken her to the best physicians; I had conferred with specialists; to no avail. Wife and I had always endeavored to govern her with tender love and firmness. I had never been an advocate of corporal punishment, but, feeling that these terrible rages required desperate treatment, I decided to try its efficacy.

The fact was my brain was decidedly addled in the things pertaining to child government. I thought I had reached my limit, and I am not alone. Hundreds of parents stand today where I stood. Inefficient and incapable when it comes to dealing with this great God-given problem of child training, and not knowing what move to make next, instead of asking God for wisdom and divine guidance, in baffled anger and over-wrought dignity, they rush for a gad.

I blush with shame, even now, as I write. I secured a peach tree switch, strong and wiry, and laid it on her tender young bowith energy. What mattered it to me that her anger was directed neither toward her mother nor myself! What did it matter that she was not a vicious child, and very seldom disobedient? Why should I stop to consider that her rages were usually the result of unavoidable circumstance—the overturning of an ink bottle, inability to express her thought, the failure of a friend to call? She had been

an especial trial that day, and my dignity as the head of that household should be upheld for once.

God has forgiven me, but I must always remember the piercing cry of terror, the wide frightened eyes, her choking sobs and violent trembling, as she promised to "be good." If that was what I wanted she was completely subdued.

And great was the victory! Two days later Dorothy was sent home from school, utterly crushed. Her teacher informed me that her stuttering in class had become so acute that she could not articulate one word which could be understood. Her excitement and suffering were so poignant she advised that we keep her at home until she was better.

Dorothy has a keen mind; she had worked hard to excel, and knowing how bitter was her disappointment to drop behind her little friends, as a father I suffered with her and, through suffering, perfection came.

I kneeled before my God and asked Him for light and vision. It came. And I saw how I had sinned against my little girl by punishing in her the same bad temper which I had all through my own life condoned in myself. I began at once on myself. For three months I passed through the most strenuous course of training which I have ever taken.

And here was set in motion the workings of a peculiar but perfectly natural law; some of the hardest tests of my whole life came to me at this time. Storm after storm swept over me, with winds, lightenings and hail. I had to face some of the hardest problems of church government; I was called upon to meet some of the most difficult people, but God knew my heart was in the right place, and I knew it, and after trial and testing I won out against quick anger. This incident is positive proof: To do odd jobs about the house had always filled me with disgust, which usually ended in hot words. Our base burner must be moved within an hour. The handy man was called and could not come. I went to work. I burned both hands; the pipe came down upon my head, covering me with soot, and, just before getting its ponderous weight into place, I sprained my ankle. I KNOW a man can control his temper. I came out of the ordeal with a laugh, and the surprised and glorified look on my wife's face paid me a

Now I was a free man, unchained. Now I

was ready to help my poor little girl. There is a very subtle bond between us—this little daughter with her frailties, so very much the copy of her big, brawny, Irish father. With the unerring instinct of a child, she stated it one day by naively saying, "Mamma is just naturally good; she's an angel, and we want to be good every minute—don't we, papa?—but this being good all the time don't appeal to us—does it?"

Since Dorothy was sent home from school we had surrounded her with all love and sympathy. I had completely won her confidence, and one day we had a heart-to-heart talk.

I told her of the victory that had come to my own life—and the joy. I told her this same victory was for her, and even a greater joy, for there would be the blessings that would accrue through all the years of her young life. She looked up at me with trusting eyes, exclaiming, "Oh, papa, I'll walk on hot coals; I'll do anything to overcome my naughty ways! Do you really believe I can?" And faith, great and glorious, stepped in as I answered, "Yes, Dorothy, I believe—I KNOW you can be free."

We arranged for a bed-time visit, and, sitting beside her those wonderful evenings, with her tousled, curly head upon the pillow ar her nightgown falling back from dimpled arms, as she talked to me in her buzzing, halting way of her hopes and dreams, will always be to me one of the dearest pictures in my house of life.

As sleep was stealing in I would begin to talk quietly: "And what a good day it has been, daughter. How strong and calm you were when brother pulled your hair. And how happy it made you to keep sweet. Tomorrow will be rich with victories. Christ will help you to be calm when anything hard comes up. You are winning out, my brave, sweet girl. I am praying for you and our Saviour is with us always to help us." So it would continue long after sleep had closed her eyes—faith, prayer and the suggestion of all things womanly and true.

Very gradually calmness and poise took the place of reckless tempestuousness, and, as the months went by, always a happier child looked up at me from the pillow.

At the end of one year—for this great good was not accomplished in a day—my little girl was free. Thank God! No more lack of self-control; no more rebellion; always now.

the little bird can fly with sureness, and poise without any help from the parent.

During this time I had intentionally kept my mind free from her speech trouble. And, although she was now back in school doing her work without difficulty, the old thorn in the flesh still remained. I was made painfully conscious of the fact, one day, by overhearing a conversation in my home. Aunt Kate remarked, "That child sounds for all the world like a country fiddler tuning his fiddle." And a lady caller answered, "It makes me think of a melodious frog pond in the springtime." I then and there decided that my little girl's speech should be no longer bound.

Our bedside visits had become too precious to be discontinued, and that evening I brought a different message: "How wonderfully you have been improving in your speech. Now, as your nerves are no longer shocked by anger, you will find it an easy matter to control your voice. It is in your power to speak as clearly and distinctly as I do. Tomorrow you will have perfect control of the face muscles. Your tongue will move at your bidding." And over and over, long after sleep had come, I would repeat this message and its variations, with a prayer in my heart.

There were days when her improvements was so noticeable that everyone would remark. And then there were the heartbreaking days when she would lapse into the old manner of speech. But very gradually the bad days diminished, and, after another year of patient, God-directed effort, there was a very permanent improvement.

On her fourteenth birthday, just four years after I began to use my heaven-illumined plan of child-control through suggestion, I listened to her deliver, in a clear vibrant voice, an address before the school. She closed with a funny little poem she had composed, and which everyone knowing her greatly appreciated, "My buzzing days are over," of which these are the last two stanzas:

My huzzing days are over,
A voice both strong and sure
To me, from out the darkness spoke:
"Thy voice is silver pure."
Rejoice with me, dear comrades,
I now no longer squeak,
And clutch the air and shiver
When I desire to speak.

LOVE NEVER FAILETH: SUGGESTION DURING SLEEP HEALS A SON'S CHARACTER

NEVER. All else may fail. Eugenics, prenatal influence, ideal environment, education founded upon sound psychological principles, carefully nurtured spiritual life—all these may utterly fail when the testing time of adolescence comes. During that period of storm and stress all seemingly stable foundations may be swept away. Yet love abides.

Fighting for our-son, we met many of the dragons that seek to drag down the human soul at that time, and, with the weapon of love, we vanquished all. This is the story.

To the best of our physical, mental and spiritual ability, we tried to bring into the world sound babies, and, after birth, to develop all their powers harmoniously. With the second son we succeeded, but not with Frederick, the older boy by two years.

Until he was twelve years old, he was all any parent's heart could wish. Then he began to be untruthful. At home we found that no reliance could be placed upon any statement he made, although he was apparently truthful in school and with his companions. A little later we began to miss money—Frederick had always had an allowance, and had kept his own accounts for years. Still later we began to find, hidden in his room, books taken from the public library, and apparatus carried from the chemical laboratory at high school. With

breaking hearts we acknowledged to ourselves that Frederick was a liar and a thief.

At that time we were orthodox believers, and we met the situation the best way we knew. We talked to Frederick and we prayed for him. Apparently the situation improved somewhat.

He was exceedingly energetic intellectually. Without special application he completed the four-year high school course in three years, graduating before he was sixteen. Throughout the course he was prominent in high school activities, especially in the Dramatic Club, the Debating Club and the orchestra. His physical education was not neglected, for he was a track runner, and fond of walking, swimming and horseback riding.

He graduated in June and entered college in September—for ours is a college town south of the Dixie line. Shortly before this time we had been led to adopt New Thought principles, and were trying fitfully to apply them in our lives.

We soon had need of our new faith. Frederick was too immature to meet the temptations of college life. The fast set taught him to smoke and to gamble—the town is dry, so the temptation to drink was fortunately absent. Frederick skipped classes to spend the time in pool rooms. As he intercepted all college reports, and we thought we knew where he was every night, we suspected nothing.

Our awakening was rude. One morning as he failed to answer any call to breakfast, I went to his room. On his bed was a note saying he had left home and would let us know when he was settled. From various sources we learned the facts I have stated above, also others that we cannot repeat, even behind this screen of publicity. All efforts to trace Frederick were fruitless. I pass over the week we suffered before, sick and penniless, he wrote from Canada.

Of course we brought him home. The turn of the knife that gave us the sharpest twinge was that he came only because he had to. Apparently he did not realize that we had suffered, nor that he had done wrong. His only regret was the failure of his plans.

His mental state was so peculiar that we took him to a psychopath, noted over the entire South. His observation and examination lasted three weeks, and his conclusions were:

First, that Frederick should be put for one month in solitary confinement in a hospital, with nothing to read, and no visitor but the psychopath; second, that following this month's treatment, he should be sent to a private psychopathic institution; third, that these procedures would only delay the inevitable end—insanity.

Would you, parents, have accepted this diagnosis as final? Nor did we.

By this time we knew the value of suggestions given during sleep. In fact, from the time Frederick left home, we had been trying to influence him in this way every night. We knew also that no imperfection must be admitted, that only the ideal self, the Divine Ego, must be recognized, and that we must think love, feel love, manifest love, and love alone, toward Frederick.

We set to work in desperate earnest. Our boy hed to be saved, and he had no earthly help but us. Not that it was easy to forget the past; to ignore his habitual sullenness and disrespect, to keep from resenting his supercilious airs, and occasion fits of mad anger. It was the hardest task we had ever been given to do, but, with the help of the Spirit, we did it.

We loved. To paraphrase Henry Drummond, we could do nothing greater, we dared do nothing less. We loved; day and night we saw the *real* Frederick; we sat up one to two hours every night giving suggestions to awaken his sleeping Real Self.

Bit by bit, his attitude toward us changed. To be quite frank, the change was so gradual and the slippings-back so frequent we just had to add to our love faith, faith in unbounded measure, the faith of God.

The change seemed almost imperceptible, yet, like Menelaus, we never let go. In two years—spent outdoors—he went back to college, where, ten years ago, he finished the course, "cum laude." He is now the soul of truth and honor, love incarnate, a leader in every movement for righteousness in his home city, where he is the executive head of an establishment employing six hundred men and women.

All these years, every night, while he has slept, we have emphasized to him his divinity, and always, day and night, we have felt toward him the love that thinks no evil, and hopes all things.

More Gossip About the St. Louis Congress

TO CONTINUE my gossip about the St. Louis Congress, I want to tell you first something about other new personages who appeared for the first time on the platform of the Alliance:

There was Rev. W. Frederick Keeler of New York, who spoke on "Intuition, a Key Method and Its Value in Healing," and who was elected Field Secretary at large, and is now holding Alliance meetings in Seattle and other points on the western coast. Mr. Keeler is an editor and writer of note, and he is a splendid speaker, direct and original in his thinking. And he talks right off the bat, and knows when he is through. Also he is good to look at, and very friendly.

Then there was Rev. W. John Murray of New York City, who is very widely known in the east as preacher of "safe and sane" New Thought. His is a pleasing personality, and his address on "New Thought and the World's Great Need of It," at the first session of the Congress, brought instant response from the large audience. His friends say that his meetings at one of the big hotels in New York—I think it is the Astor—are more largely attended than any others. He responded to the Alliance, just as the Alliance responded to him, and he is now Vice-President for the state of New York.

There was Mrs. Rose M. Ashby of Atlanta, Ga. Picturesque and prominent in the Eastern Star Order, as well as Vice-President for the Alliance for the states of Georgia, Florida and North and South Carolina. A large order for a vice-president, but if any southern woman can live up to it I think Mrs. Ashby can. She is an experienced lecturer, who knows how to express herself in unusual and clever sayings. And I envy her and Miss Leila Simon the ability to say it all inside of half an hour. By the way, I took down a number of her clever sayings and those of various other speakers, and they will appear in Nautilus when I can find space. This was Mrs. Ashby's first appearance before the Alliance, though she has been vice-president and a member of the executive board for some time.

Rev. H. H. Schroeder was another new speaker heartily received by the Alliance, and who heartily endorsed the actions of the Alliance. He is a thorough thinker and practiced speaker who has built up a splendid church in St. Louis, which has recently moved into their beautiful new auditorium at 3617 Wyoming street-where a number of Alliance speakers gave their messages during the Alliance and afterwards. "The Society of Practical Christianity or Divine Science" is what Dr. Schroeder calls his church, and he has established two other flourishing churches in other cities nearby. She is beautiful to look at, and nobody would guess that her wonderful books, that are built into the lives of so many of the teachers of today, including myself, could possibly have been written so long ago. She is charming, quiet, youthful. And she has been living in the Hawaiian Islands for a long time. I wonder if we would all grow young if we went to Hawaii? Mrs. Gordon is lecturing in this country now, and A. C. McClurg & Co., of Chicago, have just published a new book of hers on "The Illumined Life," beautiful in spirit, in words and typographically distinctive. I must tell you that she wrote these words in the front of the copy which she gave me: "To the One with the radiant smile, the big heart, the clear-cut mind and the busy hand for The One." I like that: it expresses what I want to be and do.

Robert Bryan Harrison is as directly opposite to Mrs. Gordon as you can imagine!hale, hearty, witty, breezy, good-looking young old confederate veteran of the Civil war. And so interested in children that he has been doing a beautiful work for them in St. Louis, and is going to carry the New Thought to the children all over the south, as Field Secretary for the Alliance. He is already working in the South. By the way, I think he was one of the founders of the Psychological Society of Atlanta, Ga., of which Mrs. Rose M. Ashby has been president since 1909. It was established in 1902, and is one of the New Thought lighthouses in the South. Mr. Harrison, president of the district council of St. Louis, with Miss Harriet Hulick, directed the local work of "putting on" the Congress.

One of the new personalities who found instant response from the Alliance, and who accepted the Alliance call to the Vice-Presidency of his own state, was Judge Wilson Riley Gay of Seattle, Wash. He is a big, bluff westerner with blonde curly hair and blue eyes, and he is related to his middle name! Also he has surely kissed a first or second cousin to the Blarney Stone. Everybody liked him at once, and everybody recognized him as a worker. A couple of letters that I have received from Seattle since the Congress say that he is already on the job, a devoted Alliance worker. Judge Gay is a Federal Court judge, and he is largely interested in that splendid Seattle newspaper, the Post-Intelligencer.. Among the letters of introduction which he had when he came to the Alliance, was one from that dear little "Comforter" of Portland, Ore., Florence Crawford; and another one from Paul Ellsworth, both of whom are his enthusiastic friends. But his best introduction was himself and wife, and everybody was pleased with them and eager to set them to work for the Alliance.

Another one who might be classed as a new speaker though she attended the Congress at Chicago last year, was Miss Louise Tahse, who spoke the last Sunday morning on "How I Gained Health." She is a dear, a devoted and loving soul, and her heart-to-heart story went straight to the hearts of her hearers. She is one of the most active and successful

healers in the Cincinnati Temple. I wish there were two of her, so that one of them could be working all the time as Field Secretary for the Alliance.

Among those whom a lot of us wanted to hear further, after hearing their sound ideas expressed from the floor, were Dr. Anna Gaines, of Waco, Texas, prominent business woman and club woman, and New Thought leader and speaker, and Mrs. Letitia Andrews, who, with her sister-in-law, Mrs. May A. Wiggin, are leaders of the California Truth Center, San Francisco.

By the way, I must tell you that we had a delightful visit from Mrs. Wiggin, who has been lecturing for a year in the East, and who has just given one lecture in Holyoke and several in Springfield. I like her immensely, and was delighted with her witty expositions of New Thought and her general all-round whole-ness. She was healed through Annie Rix Militz some years ago, and came out of the Episcopal Church. So she knows just how to appeal to those of high church proclivities. Mrs. Andrews has been head of the California Truth Center for the last year, and she is now Vice-President for northern California, for the Alliance. The Alliance wants to hear more from Letitia Andrews.

I want to tell you about the very first new personality presented to the Alliance, Mrs. James A. Edgerton. She is the woman behind the president, the sort of woman whose sterling and dynamic qualities do not advertise themselves. It takes her intimate friends to do that. After looking back over my life I divided into two groups all the causes which led, first, to my greatest pleasures and triumphs, and secondly, to my greatest disappointments. In every instance I can trace the cause of the best things which came to me to a concentrated effort by which I excluded all thoughts but the great desire to accomplish my aim, and by bringing my will power into my effort I was able to draw things my way. I came to realize that this will power which we use in any concentrated effort for good, is the same Great Power which God used to bring order out of chaos when the universe was formed, and it is ours to use now to bring order out of the chaos of our lives if we but grasp its great significance and put it into daily practice.

On the other hand, my failures have all, without exception, resulted from lack of concentration on some work which prepared me to "take a step ahead." and the desire for fleeting pleasure of the unwholesome or at least unuplifting sort. "The tractor for plowing needs immediate attention. We can save ships by sending tractors to plough the land in Europe to grow the crops there. The English, French, Italian and Russian women and children will help if the heavy work of ploughing is done for them by machinery. Using tractors now will teach the peoples a great lesson for after the

war.
"Business men must stop thinking so much about profits. If you shoot craps or play poker for money, it's gambling. To play for profits with the titles to factories in the stock market is gambling, too. Factory owners must think more about making their workmen strong and healthy and making products that are really useful to their customers.

"The greatest service you can do is to get off the other fellow's back. No man should live without working. We are finding out that all men are brothers and that no man should soldier on his fellows. I hear that at the front all hatred is gone. From the war the common people of all countries will

learn to understand one another.

"We all can cheerfully give President Wilson our full support. It is an act of Providence that he is our president today. His will strikes inward for power. He builds on the motives that are rooted in the hearts of the people."—N. Y. Tribune.

The Ancient and Mystical Order Rosae

Crucis, Supreme Grand Lodge of North America, was denied a certificate of incorporation by Justice Donnelly in the Supreme Court yesterday. The justice declared the organization appears to be a mixture of business and benevolence and that "it did not appear that the corporation was not being organized for pecuniary profit." Further information about the ancient and mystical order is contained in the rejected petition for in-corporation. Purpose No. 1 is "to unite in one body all men and women of twenty-one years of age or over (with occa-sional exceptions as to age) who seek to study under efficient and proficient guidance a definite and prescribed course in the analysis of all ancient, mediæval and modern religious philosophy and moral codes, with correlative facts revealed in the discoveries made in the various fields of art and science." The signers of the petition for the incorporation were Harve Spencer Lewis, Flushing, Long Island; Conrad Lindstedt, Lynbrook, Long Island; Dr. Frank B. Schanne, 173 Madison avenue; Albert B. Brassard, 327 West Fiftysixth street, and J. Eugene Binimelis, 349 West Forty-ninth street.—N. Y. Times.

London, Sept. 9.-The Indian government has announced that it was prepared to recommend the removal of the restrictions placed upon the activities of Mrs. Annie Besant, head of the Theosophical Society, and her co-workers, if it was satisfied that they would abstain from unconstitutional and violent methods of political agitation during the remainder of the war, says an Exchange Telegraph dispatch from Bombay today.

It was stated by Austen Chamberlain, secretary for India, in the House of Commons, on July 12 last, that the government of Madras, where Mrs. Besant then was, had made an offer somewhat similar to that now outlined, but that Mrs. Besant had declined the concession, on the ground that it was impossible to separate her theosophical and political work. For alleged preaching of revolt in India, Mrs. Besant was expelled from the presidency of Bombay last year, forbidden to lecture or take part in meetings, or publish her writings in India, and with her associates was restricted to residence in certain creek. was restricted to residence in certain areas.-Exchange.

reality? Or do you hold in your mind the picture of a very ordinary sort of a man, and yet expect that somehow he will be able to do the big things you have marked out for yourself? Does the man you picture measure up to what you expect of him, are

ambitious for him to achieve?

Don't deceive yourself. You can never do anything larger than the man you picture in your self-vision can naturally do. You will never reach beyond the limits of your mental model of yourself, any more than the lion reared by a sheep could reach beyond the limits of his vision of himself as a sheep. He was limited to his sheep nature so long as he thought he was a sheep and remained ignorant of the lion's force that was locked up in him.

Character, manhood, womanhood, like fortune, good or bad, is wrought in the forge of

thought.

"Dwell in thought upon the grandest, And the grandest you shall see. Fix your mind upon the highest, And the highest you shall be."

There is one thing we ought to hold in such sacredness that no consideration could induce us to dilute it, and that is the quality of our ideals. Whatever else we are careless about, we cannot afford to carry through life low ideals of ourselves, ideals of our inferior personality. However humble our homes or ordinary our environment, we should keep the quality of the life ideal, at the highest possible standard.

Everything,—character, manhood, achievement, depends upon the direction in which the ideal points. If it points downward, no amount of money or influence can redeem you from mediocrity, or even save you from a degraded life. Man is so made that he must follow his ideal. He cannot go up if

his ideal points down.

Every time you think of yourself, think of your ideal life, your God self. Do not picture your defects, your deficiencies. Hold the ideal of yourself as you would like to be-come, think of yourself as the superb masterpiece that your Creator intended you to be. You cannot make the most of your life until you do this, because you must see the possibilities in yourself before you can make use

Sir Oliver Lodge says the ideal is to be made real in each and in all, and that nothing is too good to be true; that our higher aspirations and longings for something better

are a sign that better things exist.

The trouble with most of us is that we don't believe in the best in ourselves. We estimate and measure ourselves too much from our defective, deficient side, and not enough from our ideal, from the God side of us. We do not sufficiently idealize ourselves, and it is the idealist, the one who holds lofty ideals of life, who comes nearest to perfection. The people who idealize themselves, who idealize

conditions, who hold the highest ideals of their fellow men, are the people who make the most of themselves, who come nearest the ideal of the God Man-the Christ.

Have you ever thought that whatever you call yourself, whatever label you put upon yourself, whatever estimate you put upon yourself, you are tending to outpicture in your life?

You can't afford to make derogatory or insulting remarks about yourself any more than you can about others. Every time you say such things as "I don't know what is the matter with me. I don't seem able to do anything right. I am always fumbling, blundering, making mistakes, I can't remember anything. Guess I am losing my mind," you are tending to fix upon yourself the faults or weaknesses of which you accuse yourself.

On the other hand, when making affirmations about yourself that you wish to be true, such as "I am doing this splendidly. I am getting along faster than I used to. How well I remember things today. My memory is certainly improving," you are on the same principle, making real the things you say

about yourself.

Remember that your Creator has an infinitely higher ideal of you than you have of yourself, because He sees the possible man in you, the divine of you, He sees your infinite possibilities. Just as a mother does not see the faults of her boy, which everybody else points out, but clings to her picture of him as a great man, influential, powerful, looked up to by others, so a loving Father sees only the best in us, the possible man, the possible woman.

Now, however you may depreciate yourself, your Father-Mother-God sees your possible self, and it is disrespectful, an insult even, for you to hold a more inferior idea of yourself than He holds of you. You must see yourself at your best. God never made a weakling. He never made a nobody or a failure, and you should take your cue, your estimate of yourself, from the God-standard.

Many a boy who was in danger of ruining his life has been reformed, even when everybody else has been denouncing and condemning him, by dwelling upon what his mother expected of him, thinking of himself as the boy his mother believed him to be, or would become as the man she believed he would ultimately make. The surest way to your becoming the man you long to be is to think of yourself as your Father-Mother-God thinks of you. Have the same good opinion of yourself. Think of the splendid possibilities the Creator implanted in you, of the Godlike career which is possible to you. Cling to this. Don't let any mean, contemptible opinion of yourself occupy your mind for a moment. It is unworthy of you, it is a reflection upon your Maker.

If you really believe that there is a God in you, that you are literally a child of God; if this is truth, a living reality with you and not a mere superficial almost meaningless

sentiment, you know that you must possess the qualities of divinity. You must know that if you are a child of God you are divine, and that your divinity is more than a match for animalism, or weakness of any sort in your nature, that it is able to overcome any beastly quality or habit, that it is stronger than any hereditary taint, any weakness or handicap, that would soil your life and drag you down.

Our divinity, to which we are apparently so indifferent, is really our most glorious possession, compared with which all other things are dross. It is the gold in our nature compared with which everything else is lead. None of us can afford to ignore it, to despise it, or to exploit the divinity within by un-

worthy conduct.

The divinity in you is the real you; it is all of your highest qualities combined. It is in virtue of it that you have inherited all the good things of the universe. This divinity is your personal Savior, and you cannot afford to cover it up, to drown it with drink or drugs or blur and dim it with any other form of dissipation. You cannot afford to stifle it in your mad mania for material things, in your chase for riches that do not endure. You cannot afford to lose your pearl of great price for that which only satisfies the animal senses and a cheap vanity. No man can afford to stifle the God within him by developing the brute, appealing to his animalism instead of his divinity.

God puts some grand ideal or glorious pattern in every human soul, and until you find this pattern and hold it as your mental model, the model upon which your life must be molded, you will not find that satisfaction in your effort which makes life worth living.

If you are paid for being something less than a man, less than the being God meant you to_be, if you are doing something against which your better self protests, something which is perhaps demoralizing and dragging other lives in the mire, you will get no peace, no true happiness until you find your right place and do the thing you were made to do. If we are not doing the thing that matches

our divinity, we have not found the divine pattern that was given us at our birth, and, as Phillips Brooks said, we forever "feel the thing we ought to be beating beneath the

thing we are."

It is this glorious thing we feel we ought to be perpetually beating beneath the things they are that makes the lives of our prisoners and criminals, the men and women who have lost their grip upon life, so miserable. They lost their way on the life path, made a wrong turn somewhere, because they did not keep the right mental model before their eyes. If they could only be made even now to see the divine pattern in their own souls, the model of the ideal man and ideal woman which God planned, and not the burlesque men and women which they, through their mistakes, have become; if they could only get one glimpse of their possible self, they would never again be content to grovel in

the mire of their lower nature. After they had once again tasted of the clean life, they would never return to the coarse, filthy paths to which they had strayed.

The unfortunate thing about these poor wanderers is that they do not see any hope in their situation. They get discouraged, disheartened, and feel that their case is hopeless, that it is no use trying to recover their footing. If only hope could be rekindled in them, if they could only see what grand things they could still accomplish by turning their backs on the black past and facing toward the light, their lives would soon be revolutional.

There is not one of these people so low today that he could not be redeemed, if he could only be given a glimpse of his better self, the better self that is still possible for him to be. Every man would start toward the light if he could see it.

One of the most unfortunate things in our civilization is the fact that most of us are so indifferent about our brothers and sisters who have lost their way on the life path, who have lost sight of their divine model, their other higher self, and continue to grope in the darkness, to wallow in the mire, because no one bids them look up or shows them the

way. "Poor fellow," we say, as we pass one of these dereliets by on the other side of the street, leaving him in his misery.

The radical change of character which often takes place in grown up men and women in some instances after the reading of an inspiring book, others by the transforming power of a great love, or again by reason of a great sermon, the encouragement of some friend who believes in them, shows how quickly the changing of the mental model affects the life.

If parents and teachers only realized the full significance of the law that a mental change always leads to a change of character, and would apply it to children and youth, it would, in a multitude of cases, make all the difference between failure and success, between a dishonorable and an honorable career.

Youths are natural imitators, and quickly take on the character of those they admire, whether of persons in the books they read or of those with whom they associate in daily life. We all know how quickly boys without training or good moral influence take on the characteristics of the bandits about whom they read in dime novels. The same is true of the opposite sort of literature.

of the opposite sort of literature.

I am a great believer in hero worship for the young. If every youth would choose some noble character as his ideal, his model, and try to measure up to his greatness, it would have a wonderful influence on his life. The struggle to attain to a high ideal is a perpetual uplift to all life standards. We inevitably tend to become like that which we greatly admire.

greatly admire.

Few of us realize how we are moulded by our reading, by the models, the heroes we hold in our mind, those whom we admire

and unconsciously imitate. I have known a girl who was so inspired by the lives of great men and women which she had read that she herself became a great inspiration to others. She completely changed the atmosphere and ideals of the little village in which she lived, just as Benjamin Franklin changed the atmosphere of the entire printing establishment in which he worked while in England.

Young people often boast that they cannot be influenced by bad associates, that the company they keep has nothing to do with their conduct. They intend to do what is right, and nothing can deflect them from their ideals. It is true it sometimes happens that a young person of high ideals will associate with one of low flying ideals and vicious tendencies for a long time without showing marks of deterioration; but it is only a question of time just as sometimes two streams running into each other, one an extremely muddy one and the other clear as crystal, will flow side by side with very little apparent commingling perhaps for miles, but gradually the muddy and the clear water intermingle and before long the clear stream has been entirely obliterated, lost in the foul stream which absorbed it.

It is natural for us to become like our environment. To live in the environment of dishonor, dishonesty, and all sorts of vicious dissipation is to look upon sin with more charity. Familiarity with sin makes it look less and less terrible to us, until finally we become so accustomed to the wrong that it does not trouble us much.

On the other hand, there are people of strong will and lofty ideals who when compelled by circumstances to remain for a time in an unfavorable environment persisted in keeping their eyes on the ideal perfection, on the Christ model.

We are all the embodiment of our ideals, of the models we hold in mind. These are the invisible environment and atmosphere in which we move and have our being. And if we really believe we are divine, that we are sons of God, we will not rest until we have taken every possible step to uncover and to develop our divinity, to come into possession of our divine heritage, which will sweeten and enrich all our lives.

There is everything in holding persistently in mind the pattern shown to you in the mount of your highest moment of inspiration, your grandest transfiguration. This was not shown to you to mock you. You can attain to this pattern, you can measure up to this divine ideal. But you can only do so by holding persistently, everlastingly, tenaciously to your highest ideals, not to the ideals of your discouraged moments when the blues have cast their dark shadow across the sky of your hope.

What we actually are is not so important as that which we ought to be, long to be, and can be. Not only refuse to think of, to picture yourself as a human dwarf, a little picayune, mediocre being, but hold a grand

conception of yourself, of your possibilities as a son of God. Think of the man or woman God made, and do not hold the little, dried up, wizened shrunken image of a man or a woman that you imagine yourself in moments of discouragement.

Make it a life rule never to dwell on your weaknesses or infirmities, never to think of yourself as inferior in any particular. Dwelling on these things, worrying about them, only makes them worse, destroys your confidence in yourself to overcome them.

You are all the time creating something mentally. Why not create the highest things possible to you instead of the common, mediocre, weak things which are suggested in your discouraged or despondent moods? Try to make your highest moment permanent, your highest conception real. Cling to your most perfect vision of yourself and ignore all others. You must look up before you can climb. Keep your life on the upward trend by climbing instead of grovelling. The habit of looking upward, striving upward, holding the right model always in mind, is what enlarges and ennobles the life.

If you hold a high ideal of yourself and vigorously try to measure up to it, to match it with reality, you will tend in that direction, whereas if you dwell upon your imperfections, become morbid over them, and obsessed by the convictions of your inferiority, you will never be able to outreach this narrow, self-prescribed limit.

It is your business to build up an unshakable faith in your ability to do what you have undertaken, to do in a superb way what the Creator sent you here to do. No matter what the outlook hold fast to the belief that you are going to make a magnificent contribution to the race, that you are here for a great purpose, and that you propose to be a star in the life drama and not merely a background filler.

Always see yourself as the man or woman you long to be. Say to yourself frequently, especially in moments of discouragement: "In the truth of my being I am a conqueror. The immortality of my being is God. This is the reality of me, and it is invincible. It is this reality, this invincible part of myself which I will always hold in the ascendency. This shall be the dominant note of my life.

"I am not a victim of conditions. I am superior to environment, because I am a part of that divine force which makes conditions. I hold the ideal of my higher, my divine self, inviolable. I will not visualize a model of my frail human self, but of my divine self. I possess infinite possibilities, invincible qualities, which I have inherited from my Father. I shall develop them. I shall be, I am, the man my Creator intended me to be."

she not been visiting me, and have slept soundly. Imagine my astonishment at her display of hysterical fright. We were in a mere little patch of woods by the lake, and close to a farmhouse where dwelt some of my best friends. Yet she insisted on my barricading the tent, keeping the candles burning, and both of us sitting up all night, she all atremble with fear lest "the boogers get her"there was nothing else could. Her boasted faith was only a belief that when she died she'd go somewhere to play a harp. She couldn't trust the Lord to take care of her outside the walls of a house!

and earnestly, finally deciding on some lands in Nebraska. Later, they sold their homes at literature, through which they searched long a sacrifice; this money enabled them to go and take adjoining claims.

They built warm little houses from layers of sod, smoothly plastered inside with a hard cement, made from the earth there, as the other claim-takers did. Then the men went to work farming and fixing things.

Sometimes they helped others adjacent, who, in turn, assisted them. Later came a chance to feed some cattle, for their land was rich with a tall grass, peculiar to that region, and for pay they took a few calves which became the nucleus for a herd of their own.

They were short of money, she said, but continually affirmed, "Everything is coming our way," picturing the success they longed for, and things did come, in perfectly wonderful ways, carrying them through; and "oh, the joy, the happiness, the sense of freedom we had as we worked, was greater than words can ever tell;" she exclaimed. "Of course we worked hard, but it was the life we loved; besides, the realization we were conquering an apparently hopeless future by a power within, which could never be taken from us."

"One thing we added," she said, "was many an earnest prayer for wisdom, guidance and divine blessing on our undertaking.

"'Acknowledge God in all thy ways, and He will direct thy paths.'

"We were wonderfully led and helped, all the way. We had such pleasant times with the many other eastern people who were there, also taking claims."

She and her husband had rented their farm and were having a year's rest and recreation in the city when I met them. They were prosperous and happy; but for this priceless bit of knowledge they would still be back in that little town, pinching along, heartsick and hopeless.
