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

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

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A MID all the mysteries by which we are surrounded nothing is more certain than that we are ever in the presence of an infinite and eternal energy from which all things proceed," said Daniel Webster.

When your thoughts go out from you, they don't go into the "empty air," as we so often say, but into this "infinite and eternal energy from which all things proceed." There they take shape and materialize in your life according to their nature. Most of us have no idea that thought has more to do with determining our conditions, with shaping our circumstances and environment, bringing us poverty or wealth, attaining our ideal or driving it from us, than any other thing. Every one of us could be prosperous and happy if we only knew the powers locked up in ourselves and had learned to use our minds to back our efforts on the material plane.

Someone says, "Dare to fling out into the great cosmic mind greater assurance about yourself; dare to have greater confidence; dare to believe in yourself and your missions. Have a grander ideal, a nobler aspiration."

Some people are afraid to do this; they don't dare to think well of themselves, to aspire to things that would make them comfortable and happy. They think that poverty is a decree of Providence; that they were born poor and are destined to remain in poverty all their lives. While they ask the Creator to help them in everything else, they feel that it wouldn't be right to call upon Him for money because, they will tell you, the Bible says that money is the root of all evil.

Nowhere does the Bible condemn money or the right use of it, but only an inordinate love of it. We were all intended to live the life abundant, and not the pinched, starved, stunted lives of paupers. The Father never meant His children to grovel in poverty, to spend their lives in drudgery, lacking all that makes living comfortable and harmonious. The earth is filled to overflowing with the abundance of His riches and there is no need for any one to remain in a degrading state of poverty. We have a right to our inheritance of all that is good and beautiful, all that is needful for our welfare, to enable us to do our best work free from limitations and embarrassments.

Dr. W. John Murray says, "Not because we wish to have great prosperity and riches in order to live like fools, but in order to live like angels, blessing and benefiting others who do not realize the truth as we do. That's the reason why we want money. We are not making prosperity a God, we are making it a divine assistant."

Money rightly used is a blessing and not a curse. On the other hand, the poverty that condemns one to perpetual want has strangled more talent, blighted more aspirations, dashed more hopes, starved and stunted more lives than almost any other one thing. That kind of poverty is not a decree of Providence but a disease, engendered by our own ignorance of mental laws. It is the poverty to which the Bible refers when it says. "The destruction of the poor is their poverty." It warps and twists the whole nature; it fills men and women with bitterness, discontent, and unrest: it kills off tens of thousands of little children and drives multitudes of people to crime, to insanity, to death. In short, it is responsible for more human misery than almost anything else.

No one need remain in such body and soul-killing poverty as this. You can think yourself out of it, or your thoughts can keep you in it, just as you will. Of this you may be sure; you will never be anything but a beggar while you think beggarly thoughts, but a poor man while you think poverty, a failure while you think failure thoughts. The very hopelessness of such an outlook on life demoralizes effort and kills ambition. You cannot do your best, you cannot succeed in anything, while your mind is filled with failure thoughts.

The man who would succeed, who would have the good things he desires, must think success, must think abundance. He must think progressively, creatively, constructively, intentively, and, above all, optimistically along the line of his desires. If he thinks otherwise, negatively, destructively, pessimistically, no matter how hard he works,

he will not succeed in attaining his object. A great many people defeat the end they have in view, because their mental attitude does not correspond with their endeavor. While working for one thing they are really expecting something else. They drive away the very thing they are pursuing by holding the wrong mental attitude toward it.

The Idealized Process of Unfailing Methods of Healing

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PART I: WHAT CAN WE DO ABOUT "MATTER" !- INFINITE ENERGY.

Lesson 2. Giving Life and Motion to An Arm Paralyzed for Sixteen Years.

G OD is All and God is Life—these truths are as certain as the existence of Gibralter and the Himalayas.

Yet, after asserting the above truths, many of us put on the brakes and hinder the free operation of these two principles by contradicting them with this statement, "In matter there is no life."

Since God is All, He is matter as well as spirit: and since God is life, then true matter is life—a manifestation of God,—a manifestation of the infinite energy of God.

In the preceding lesson it was shown that even physical and chemical scientists now realize that so-called matter is infinite energy—an infinite number of infinitely small centers of whirling energy held together by an infinitely extensive attractive force. The recognition that these factors are infinite means that they are God.

In this lesson we take up the second false idea of matter,—that is, that matter is lifeless. So long as we hold the mistaken thought that matter is something apart from God, that it is something solid and lifeless, dense and energy-less, just so long will hindering doubts remain in our mind, no matter how much we affirm to the contrary.

Christ never asked us to affirm or deny; He asked us to know that we are God's!

Our present purpose, then, is to know the real God life—infinite energy in every form of God's manifestation—even in matter. When this is known, thousands of ills which now baffle us will be remedied as easily as a headache is healed.

In this lesson I refer especially to the case of a paralyzed arm—that of a young Frenchwoman, twenty-three years of age in 1913. At that time, she had been unable to move her right arm, from shoulder to finger tips for sixteen years.

When God energy manifests normally in life—whether in the single cell or the body of a human being—five primal activities are always in evidence: (1) movement; (2) sensitiveness to outside impressions; (3) taking in of all that is necessary to sustain the structure—food, air and life energy; (4) throwing out of waste materials and (5) growth—the increase of activity or structure.

When medical experts say that an arm or a limb is paralyzed, one of these five activities is subnormal—sometimes two or three of them, but never all five.

In some cases an individual is unable to move the part paralyzed; he may also be unable to feel anything when it is touched and the part may not have grown after becoming paralyzed. In such case three out of the five conditions are subnormal.

In other cases, the paralyzed part may continue to grow, but have no power of movement and no power of feeling.

But in most cases of paralysis, only

the power of movement is lacking. Pressure, heat and cold can be felt and the part grows normally in size. Every cell of the paralyzed part is fed by the blood and the waste materials are carried away by it.

In all cases of paralysis, the cells of the part affected, always take food from the blood and always eliminate waste. If this were not so, the part would decay and drop off. In such case, it would not be called a paralyzed part at all.

I cite these facts to give every person now suffering from this kind of trouble great hope, infinite hope.

When any expert says that nerves are dead, realize this: if dead, the millions and billions of cells would not receive impulses to take food from the blood or impulses to get rid of waste materials. Hence, no matter how serious the condition seems, it is undeniably evident that the nerves as a whole are not dead unless the part is decaying. Certain fibres of the nerves may be affected—may be asleep—but not dead!

Anyway, nerves are made of matter, aren't they? And matter, as we found in the last lesson, is but infinitely small centers of infinite energy held together by an infinitely extensive attractive energy—God.

And God is All Life!

Since it is God as attractive force that holds centers of energy together and forms what appears to be solid matter, God force can be used to change the form and condition of any substance—especially nerves, if they happen to be merely sleeping.

To arouse a consciousness of life—a consciousness of God life so impelling and stupendous that it lives in us—so ever present that we do not need to affirm or deny it—we should idealize the ever present and infinite energy of God in all existence, even in so-called matter,

Quite irrespective of what your opinion or mine may have been, or is, regarding President Wilson's official acts and policies, none of us in whom the passions of war have cooled to the point of reasonableness can fail to feel that he was a man of singular force, who contributed something of singular potency to the minds of men during a stressful epoch, and that thus to honor him in his life time is both to render the homage due to character and to render publicly, for all time-in the awardsthe homage due to idealistic service. I never voted for Woodrow Wilson myself -I voted for a man he put in prison. Yet I feel that the justice he so often spoke of compels me to plead for the purpose of the Foundation.

To me, at least, the Foundation is the recognition of what is greatest, not only in Wilson, but in any leader, in any man — the power of vision, and of

Pure Metaphysics: Knowledge vs. Ignorance

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THERE is no positive and absolute statement of God, Man, and the Universe except the word "PERFECTION." But owing to the fact that it does require effort on our part to Realize it and so make it manifest in ourselves, our environment, and our bodies, we are obliged to use many words and many explanations, all of which, however, simply lead us to this one basic fact. When the words and explanations do not lead us to this one basic fact, they mislead us, which is worse than having had no metaphysical teaching at all.

At their best, words do not convey ideas very correctly. And when one reads or hears a spiritual truth stated repeatedly in exactly the same words, it begins to lose force and effect. That is why, no doubt, the most successful metaphysical healers do not use "formulas."

There is a great tendency at this time, in a present popular interpretation of Truth, to split us up into two, a material self in a material universe and a spiritual self in a spiritual universe which is called "Heaven." Even the assurance in the next breath that both our spiritual self and Heaven are right here does not exempt us from the fatal sense of duality which this gives. After describing a material self, giving it a

sort of a history or reason for being, it is next to impossible to wipe it out of our consciousness by any other statement made. All that is accomplished is to fix upon us a sense of being two, or at best, a divided self. It is with difficulty that one twists his consciousness into accepting this even as a premise, and the effort to do so is often very pritful to one who has himself passed through this stage with its tortures.

I know I strike a sympathetic chord in the hearts of every Truth student when I confess that for weeks and even months I went around absolutely alone in my universe, with no body or even the assurance of having a universe. It was true, I seemed to have both, but never during this period would I admit them to myself.

Then it began to dawn upon me that, if my premise was correct, and the mind of the human man was wholly a falsity, there was no way for me to be sure its conclusions were correct about God. Even He might be an illusion.

The term "mortal mind" is used more particularly by Christian Scientists than any other body of people. Understandingly used, there is no other term which better covers the long range of false beliefs to which the race is heir. But used indiscriminatingly it is a confusing and almost dangerous expression. At the time to which I have just referred, I happened to open to page 9 of the book called "Rudimental Divine Science," by Mrs. Eddy. She wrote: "Mortal mind,—a false and temporal sense of Truth, Life, and Love."

With one mighty influx of understanding came such an illumination that even the mind's natural love of mystery and the occult could not again bring me into a position where illogical metaphysical teaching could tempt me away from my own spiritual convictions.

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Suggestion as an Aid in Equalizing Desire and Satisfaction.

THE conditions of modern civilization are such that man can give expression to only a portion of his desires in their original forms.

His waking hours are filled with decisions, many of which will result in repression of crude impulses, unless, where expression is not expedient, he is careful to provide a substitute outlet. Day by day the conscious mind is kept centered upon certain ideals and standards of action. With sleep comes relaxation and suspension of the waking inhibitions. Then it is that the unconscious, the archaic self, takes command and seeks to more nearly equalize desire and satisfaction by giving expression to repressed impulses through dreams.

Most dreams are the product of an effort of the unconscious to gratify (through the dream) some desire that has been repressed during the waking state. Dreams are usually symbolical to such an extent that their real meaning is not apparent, unless the symbolical aspect is understood and taken into account.

If we are overbalanced in certain states while awake, the various states are collected and a sort of balance struck, during sleep.

This process can be aided by an understanding use of revery and self-analysis during the waking hours. The idea of equalization should be reinforced by auto-suggestion, or affirmation, made with a definite object in view to equalize the more divergent mental states and to find substitute means of satisfying any repressed impulses that may be pushing for expression.

It is desirable that these substitute methods should be aimed at some constructive activity, or be of such a nature as to add to the growth and well-being of the individual without injuring society.

It is an axiom of practical psychology that one cannot resolve a mental conflict on its own level. Two opposing tendencies can only be united by a new objective, a new ideal of expression, a new symbol, which will lift the whole situation to a plane above that on which the conflict of desires arose. In general we may say that one's ideals and objectives should progress from a selfish and anti-social state toward the social view point of service to society, or toward such action as will promote the welfare of the individual without injuring society.

A concrete example of what is meant by uniting two opposing tendencies in a higher synthesis or objective, is found in the case of a young man of some means who had found life sadly disappointing. He had started out with high ideals, none of which had been realized. His ideals were alive, but in actual life he was drifting idly without accomplishing anything. On one side was his ideals, on the other the natural tendency to laziness and inaction, to give way to obstacles and discouragement. In this unhappy condition he consulted a physician who was a student of practical psychology. The physician discovered by analysis that the young man greatly admired his grandfather, who had been a successful business man, and suggested to his patient that he enter actively upon a business life as a means of giving adequate expression to his

tendencies and uniting them in a common constructive aim. The young man followed the advice and later became much happier and quite successful as a result of resolving the inner conflict of tendencies by constructive, directed action that relieved the pressure of repressed desires and turned his forces out and away from himself.

We may use the process of revery and suggestion (call it "going into the silence and making affirmations," if you prefer that term) to displace undesirable habits with more desirable ones. A French psychologist gives this illustration of the process: "Let us suppose the brain to be a board into which have been driven brads representing the ideas, the habits, the instincts which determine our actions. If we perceive that in any individual there exists a bad idea, a bad habit, a bad instinct-in a word, a bad brad, let us take another brad representing the good idea, the good habit, the good instinct; let us place its point directly over the head of the bad brad, and strike on it a single blow with a hammer; in other words, let us make a suggestion. The new brad will be driven a little way in, a millimetre perhaps, and the old one will be driven out for a corresponding distance. At each fresh blow of the hammer, at each fresh suggestion that is to say, the new brad will enter for an additional millimetre, and the bad one will emerge to the same extent. After a certain number of blows, the old brad will have been completely dislodged, and the new one will have taken its place."

The ideal condition towards which we should work is that wherein the life force flows freely out into the world of reality where it finds effective expression in successful action. There is then no lost motion, no mental conflicts to

exhaust the energy. Desire translates itself without conflict or delay into constructive and useful activities. Desire and satisfaction are equalized and we will then need no artificial methods of bringing this about.

NEED OF NEW IDEAS.

THE mind is like a stagnant pool and in the absence of any fresh current of images and ideas, it tends to stability."

Progress comes through the introduction of new ideas into the mind. The ideas may be brought forth by reactions to the outer world of reality, through experience, or arise from the great unconscious realm within.

Life is the expression of ideas. When the mind becomes fixed in certain habits of thought and action and its rigidity is not broken by frequent change through contact with the outer world and by a progressive mental attitude, the individual begins to lose his grip on life and go backward.

The only man who really lives is the one who is making constant progress. He may slip back here and there, he may make many failures, but on the whole he goes forward.

The dying man is the one who becomes more and more static in his mental habits. He knows exactly where and how to classify each new experience, he pigeon holes every idea according to preconceived beliefs. He is quite apt to be satisfied. Dissatisfaction is usually an indication of increasing life.

Where there is a static condition of the mind, the muscles of attention be-

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come atrophied. The attention is not readily turned to new ideas for a sufficient length of time to really understand them and their possibilities as food for growth.

We should, therefore, train our minds to adapt readily to changed conditions and to welcome new contacts and new ideas. The natural tendency to stick to the old, the familiar, until we are driven out of it, should be overcome.

It is especially inimical to progress to allow oneself to feel that he has arrived at ultimate truth along any line. As soon as he gets the idea that he has achieved a perfect formula in religion, philosophy, politics, the problems connected with daily living, and begins to pigeon hole every new idea according to his formulas, he is building around himself a wall that will shut him off from life.

It will help us to adapt ourselves to new ideas if we have a clearly defined objective toward which we are working. When the mind is dominated by an objective, it readily adapts to whatever conditions are necessary to make its attainment possible. If we set our objective well in advance, we thereby give ourselves an effective suggestion to insure our progress.

RECOGNIZING THE WORLD OF REALITY WHEN MAKING SUGGESTIONS.

WHEN we speak of recognizing the outer world of reality we do not mean that it is desirable to regard that world as something inflexible, a great and powerful enemy of man. We simply want to convey the idea that denial alone will not wipe out the ma-

terial world. We exercise freedom and dominion in that world, not by denying it, but by understanding its lawsand our relation to it.

The fact of denying disease, for instance, as a real condition, shows that we really regard disease as a great and powerful enemy, something to be feared and guarded against. By denying its existence we emphasize our fear of it.

If we zealously affirm the allness of health, instead of treating by the negative method of denial, our imagination is still filled with the concept of disease as a great and powerful monster. Under these circumstances if we allow the conscious mind to dwell upon our affirmations of health to any extent, we set in motion the law of reversed effort by which part of us questions, doubts and fears, even while we doggedly affirm the supremacy of health.

A suggestion to be most effective must be of such a nature and so presented that it will not be questioned by the conscious mind.

Wherever the will comes into action in trying to help out a suggestion, or the conscious mind begins to question, the law of reversed action becomes operative and neutralizes the effect of the suggestion or affirmation.

This is why general suggestions are usually better than specific ones. "Day by day, in all respects I get better and better" is far more effective than "I am perfect health now." The former affirmation takes into account the world of reality and allows for the fact that disease is a real condition, even though it has no foundation in reality, and therefore it does not arouse the oppo-

sition of the reason and the conscious mind so as to set up a counter suggestion.

Should you prefer such statements as "God is my life, my health, my supply," simply end your affirmation with "Day by day, in all respects," etc.

If your faith and understanding is great enough, you might secure success with such specific affirmation as "I am health now," but it would necessitate keeping your attention centered upon the fact that the affirmation represents potential truth, regardless of outward appearances. This would require mental effort. There would be lost motion. You would be under the necessity of interpreting the exact meaning of your statement to yourself, so that your conscious mind would not set up the counter suggestion, "but I am not health now." All this would waste energy.

Any one who has had an opportunity to observe the effect of suggestion or affirmation, as practiced by New Thought people, is familiar with that form of discouragement and failure to obtain results that finds expression in such remarks as, "I have affirmed and affirmed and still have grown worse. I repeat 'I am health' over and over and all the time I know it is a lie," etc., etc.

In such cases the effect of the affirmation has been completely neutralized by the questioning and doubt of the conscious mind, due to the fact that the affirmation was not worded in such a way as to make it appear reasonable and acceptable to this every-day mind.

The average person will make faster progress towards health and the realization of his ideals through the use of suggestion if he follows the methods are the result of many years of practical experiment and observation by men who have made the study of suggestion and

its laws (as applied in actual healing) the chief object of their lives for many years.

When You Need Money.

YOUR first and greatest need is to get out of your mind the idea or feeling that you are to coerce conditions in any way. When you plant a seed you do not try to force its growth by the use of your will power. You know that you cannot hasten growth by action of the will. All you can do is to make the conditions as favorable as possible for its growth and unfoldment.

Now what you need to do is to make conditions favorable for success. Affirm that the Spirit in you IS success, until your creative faculties become quickened and you conceive new ways and means of increasing your earning power.

To put it another way, the thing for you to do is to give all your attention and thought to *creating* money through a constructive use of your mind and hands, without trying to *force* or *compel* wealth to come to you.

One other very important point is to repudiate the idea that what you desire has got to come to you in a particular way. Also, avoid the feeling that if the amount you desire is not received by some certain time your life is going to be a failure. So long as you entertain these thoughts and these feelings you limit yourself and inhibit the results you desire to achieve. Your mind cannot create wealth when it is filled with thoughts of poverty. You cannot see the ways and means by which you might get money when you are thinking about your debts.

Let go all thought about appearances and get your mind filled with the thought of the *principle* of wealth.

The Stingy Consciousness Healed: Recognition is Power

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W HAT you recognize you give POWER to.

To acknowledge a quality is to cause more of it to become perceptible.

To perceive generosity in another is to assist more of that God-given quality within him to manifest. There is plenty of generosity in the heart of him, and your recognition of it encourages him to draw aside the veils that formerly hid it from you. Warmly greet the generosity that you perceive, praise it heartily in your thoughts, and the veils that obscured your own vision will be removed. Bless the quality in every way you can, and it will increase and multiply to the perception of everyone concerned.

When it comes to a question of stinginess, I know what I am talking about, as any member of my family could bear witness, except my mother. And at the time that I seemed to them to hold the world's record as a "tight-wad," I was continually making mental plans to buy them comforts, build them homes, make them happy: but I was AFRAID to spend all my meager earnings lest I become dependent upon them and so deprive them of some of the comforts that they had or bring them to actual want. I wanted "to amount to something" for their sakes, to take care of myself, and to give more to them. But I was AFRAID, always AFRAID that my poor health would fail utterly, always AFRAID that I might get where I could not give them even a small part of the big gifts that I wanted to give. I loved them so that I wept many a night because I could not do more to alleviate their sufferings from poverty. I walked on tired feet hundreds of times to save nickels to hoard until I had enough to buy my sisters or nieces shoes, and in consequence was dubbed "stingy" by my friends.

I sometimes look back with a most uncomfortable feeling of shame on some of the miserly little deeds that I then perpetrated, but I ought not to do so, I ought to freely forgive myself; for I WAS NOT STINGY; I was AFRAID.

My mother saw generosity in me, was greatly grateful for the small things that I could do for her, and how I loved her! Finally that love forced me (I was a quiet, frail, little homebody) a thousand miles away from her into a strange land with no acquaintance near. I could earn more there and, consequently, could send more to my loved ones.

Though I still worried from force of habit and was often wretchedly homesick, getting so far from the ceaseless petty trials and tribulations of our poverty-ridden household was the best thing that ever happened (?) to me, for I didn't see them nor hear much about them, and so, to a great extent, forgot them. There was no dwelling place for them in my mind, because it was occupied with my new work and adventures—though they visited any spare room that I had whenever I had time to entertain them, usually after one of the infrequent mails.

My health improved, I earned more, spent more, gave more, and saved more than I had ever done before. But the great thing the experience did for me was to start my courage working (for I maintain that I wasn't a COWARD in the God-given heart of me, either). It fanned the spark of latent fearlessness within me; so that the next year I went several thousand miles away and took a sick and dependent mother with me.

I continued to slave and worry, but for the first time in my life I dared to spend more than I earned; I used up my savings of the former year, and even borrowed a little, for mother's railway fare back home. We had run into a couple of relatives who were as deep in the poverty mud, due to bad investments, as we had been in the mire. We had crossed a continent, but we had not left our troubles behind; rather we took on their worries in addition to those we brought with us, mother's condition becoming so alarmingly bad that I had to send her back home.

My improvident relatives helped me; they loaned me money that they would otherwise have spent for "respectable clothes." But better than that, they taught me, by example, not to be AFRAID of poverty. They were then as poor as Job's turkey, but nobody could have called them stingy, for they were not afraid to spend

their last cent daily. I was shocked at this, and tried to reform them, but instead they started my reformation without trying. As soon as I had saved enough I helped them out of debt, and then we toddled on together for five years.

During that time we took a leisurely pleasure trip, first-class, across the continent and back, to see the folks and, incidentally, the sights by the way. We did many other interesting things together that have nothing to do with the main trend of my story. I may say that I was able to purchase two homes for needy loved ones as well as many other comforts, while my mother is enjoying a plenteous old age.

Next, opportunity brought me where I now am, a third of the way around the earth, an absolute stranger again in a strange land. The promising position that called me proved a bad joke on me—I've been "out of work" a third of the time during the past two years—but I'm sure that no one thinks me stingy; while several of my friends, including the woman who shares my home, declare that I am an object lesson in GENEROSITY and COURAGE!

(This isn't any plea for sympathy; I'm well and happy and "what is mine shall come to me." It is a wonderful place to live in; and while God has a variety of names here. He unfailingly takes care of those who trust Him to do so.)

Bless the heart of the woman who lives with me! When she came to me I pronounced her absolutely the stingiest person I had ever known and—misery likes company—rather exulted to think that she had anything I had ever seemed in the stingy line "beat a million miles." She skimped and saved, pleaded poverty from force of habit (for she had a fine position), and hoarded money, hoarded old clothes, hoarded everything, and for nobody under the sun but herself. She had no one to love her enough to believe her generous, to PERCEIVE her generosity.

She hadn't been with me long before a most terrifying thing happened to her in the night, and she called for me in the midst of it. I woke out of a sound sleep to go to a huddled heap of FEAR. A burglar had broken into her room, and her inarticulate cries of terror were the awfulest things I have ever heard—they scared the burglar away. She shook and quivered for hours, and it was weeks before she was anything like normal again. During that time I grew to love her—she needed me so. I came to know of her poverty-stricken, hateful childhood, the FEAR-FULL days of her youth. Once she asked me if I thought the experience with the burglar came to her as a punishment for being

stingy. When I replied, "You are not stingy, my dear," I was speaking TRUTH, and I KNEW it as I did so, though there were times thereafter when my eyes were veiled.

I didn't suddenly become and thereafter continue sweet and lovely to her. I criticized her in my thoughts as well as by word of mouth on occasions, that, however, grew further and further apart. I admit that I had to work hard to keep my thoughts free from blinding criticism; but work I did, for I KNEW under the surface of my own beveiled mind that she was generous in her heart. She responded little by little.

Yesterday morning I said aloud, though not to her, that I KNEW her to be generous, and I wasn't "kidding myself along," either; it was rather as if all veils of obscurity were removed. Last evening when I told her of a plan of mine (that would seem extravagant to most people) which I meant to carry out as soon as I realized the money, she volunteered to lend me \$500 of her savings for an indefinite period of time without any security!

WHATEVER you recognize you give POWER to. I have proved it time and again, and have known others to prove it, consciously or unconsciously.

One more example stands strikingly out in mind today: A very brilliant friend of mine who came of a large family of bright children. told me that the "fly in the ointment" of her childhood was her brother John. When he was three years old, she said, he was left in bad condition by scarlet fever, his mental development seemed hopelessly arrested, and as he advanced in years he was as slow in regaining physical fitness as he was swift in becoming more and more slovenly and unpardonably lazy. She and her brothers and sisters were always ashamed of him; in fact, nobody really loved him except his mother. My friend declared that she used to get out of patience with her mother because she never would see any fault in John; she would never say anything against him, and apparently thought of him as normal. As for the others they tolerated him with more or less patience, usually less, seeing only shamelessness and stupidity, and he responded accordingly.

Whatever you recognize, you give power to.

The mother, by the way, was an orthodox
Episcopalian, with no "new fangled notions."

Finally all the children but John left home. He remained his mother's care, a man in years, and maybe twelve years old, mentally. After he had lived alone with his mother for five

LESSON II. THE SILENCE: HOW TO ENTER IT— HOW TO CONDUCT A GROUP SILENCE.

ON THE basis of the month's experimental work which the study group has now done with the Silence, it will be possible for us to consider some of the typical problems encountered in connection with this subject. For instance:

What is the Silence?

How can I be sure that I have encountered it? How can I shut out the interruptions of the world?

What results can I expect to get?

As the last of these questions is the simplest, we shall get it out of the way at once. Into the silence you are to take all the problems, physical, mental, financial, etc., which are not easily solved by the routine of every-day living; and if you systematically develop the ability to use this master method, you can expect in the Silence to solve all of these problems. Remember, "Man's extremity is God's opportunity." The things which you cannot do as an individual or as a member of the race, you can do as a focal center in Divine Consciousness.

Now for our first question, "What is the Silence?" Before we can answer we must recall the fact that what we call "consciousness" is not a simple thing, but rather is a complex made up of definite parts. The concept of multiple personality helps us grasp this truth, for it teaches that every one of us is not a single self, but is rather a group of selves held together in a more or less loosely organized confederation. This principle is farther illustrated by the domination of what we call "moods." A mood is simply a little self, which at times comes to the front of the stage and at other times disappears behind the wings. During a period when the creative mood, for instance, is before the footlights of consciousness. the creator is able to do his work in a masterful way. When this creating self disappears into the unconscious, on the other hand, every creative effort is a stiff and an ineffective one.

With these materials for our definition, we are able to state that the Silence is simply that condition in which all our lesser selves are working harmoniously together. For practical purposes we can divide the many selves into six groups. Perhaps it will be better to define man as a sixfold being, with the understanding that each of the six sides of his nature must

be awakened and co-ordinated when he enters the Silence.

The first division is the physical. Man as we know him is partly an animal, functioning through a physical mechanism. And the first step that he must take in raising himself toward the perfect awakeness of the Deep Silence is to bring this physical mechanism into its most harmonious condition. What is this most harmonious condition? That of perfect poise. And as this matter of poise and relaxation is fundamental in every kind of work which man is called upon to do, the student should make a note of it in his assignment book and never lose track of it until the problem is really mastered.

Real mastery, remember, consists not just in mentally digesting a theory, but in transmuting that theory into a way of living; into a genuine

The first step toward mastering physical relaxation is to discover by experiment that posture or those postures best fitted to the personal equation of the student. No stereotyped directions can be given for this part of the work; eventually it will be discovered that complete relaxation is possible in almost any sort of chair, or lying on the floor or on a couch. No effort should be made to maintain any prescribed position. The ideal posture is one in which the body holds itself without effort, and in which the circulation and the movements of the chest walls are not impeded.

When this posture most favorable to relaxation is discovered a few minutes of deep, easy breathing with the attention turned into the body, particularly into the muscle groups of the arms, neck, abdomen, and thighs, will enable the experimenter to induce a condition at least distantly approximating that of relaxation.

This practice should be continued, however over a period of at least six months; for it will be discovered that tension is a matter of stratas, and that week after week deeper layers of stiffness and strain are discovered and released. Long continued discipline also is necessary to reduce theory and understanding to habit, or second nature.

How to Control the Emotions.

THE second department of man's being that must be brought into harmonious adjustment at the time of entering the Silence is the emotional nature. This is too big a subject to be treated fully at this time, but a simple method which will soon give a considerable control over the emotions can be quite briefly described.

- VORE PUBLIO This method makes use of a mechanism and human consciousness which may be compared to the tuning coil of a wireless instrument. There are many indications that each of us receives from the big cosmic ocean in which we are immersed, many of the thoughts and feelings we assume to have been engendered by the personal self. It is also true that all sorts of emotions are radiating back and forth and up and down in this cosmic ocean. Most of us are open to many of these heterogeneous feeling waves.

The result is that we are capriciously moved to fluctuations of happiness, doubt and sorrow without any definitely perceived reasons therefor.

An understanding of the "keying" mechanism remedies this. We learn that two steps are necessary in securing any emotional condition: First, we must express that emotion physically as fully as possible; second, we must saturate the conscious mind with the emotional tone desired.

In the present instance the emotional condition that will do the most for us is one of absolute poise and serenity. Physically we have already taken a step toward attaining this condition by our systematic relaxation. The mental step, which completes the process, is even more easily taken: maintaining the condition of relaxation, we repeat from six to twelve times slowly, aloud, and putting into this vocal expression as much as possible of the quality we wish to attain, the key-words: "Infinite Calm."

That is all there is to this second step. An earnest and systematic practice of this method will enable the student to place himself in the physical and emotional attitude most favorable to an experience with the Silence.

The third facet of human consciousness which must be considered is that which has to do with the intellect. Although it is true that "As a man thinketh in his heart so is he," it is equally true that the thoughts of the mind or of the head form the only portal through which the thoughts of the heart, the deeper thoughts, can be reached or influenced. Obviously, this matter of changing the thoughts of the head and of the heart cannot be treated in a satisfactory manner in the limited space available to us in this lesson. We shall, therefore, simply note the fact that as the student's thinking is systematically disciplined, his experience in the Silence will be progressively more satisfactory.

Man, the microcosm, impinges upon the social and upon the cosmic levels of manifestation. The requisites for entering the Silence as far as these two facets are concerned can be briefly stated. As a social being, man is part of a vast fabric made up of the isolated individualities of other men. In entering the silence he must be able temporarily to disentangle himself from this mesh of existence. The need here is for a concentrated attention to the within, so complete that everything in the outer world is forgotten. He is to enter the Silence as if he were the last man on earth, alone with God.

His attitude toward the WORLD MIND is one of friendly recognition and co-operation. He recognizes that there is a vast impersonal intelligence, or Soul of Things: and toward it he shows a smiling countenance.

The five phases of human activity which we have now considered are merely the foundation stones upon which the temple of the silence is to be erected. That temple is spiritual. Passing through the five ante-rooms of personal, racial and cosmic consciousness, eventually the seeker reaches that inner crypt where he is immersed in Eternal Being.

The keying mechanism must be used in this inner crypt also. The exact words used depend much upon the individuality of the student; he is to use that formulation of desire toward God which most fully expresses his own spiritual aspirations. The simple key phrase, "Thou art all," is supremely effective for those whose spiritual preparation enables them to grasp its inner meaning. For others some of the more extended aspirations found in the Bible, particularly in the Psalms, will be more satisfactory.

Perhaps the most important point in this whole method is to persist in the practice of each of the steps indicated until it is mastered, and then to remember to use the complete method on each occasion of entering the silence. If this discipline is persistently followed, within a reasonable time the complexity of theory will have become blended into a simplicity of application.

THE ASSIGNMENTS for this month's group study are an extension of those given last month. Each time the group meets a number of definite problems should be presented, preferably one by each member, and should be written down in the assignment book of each student. These problems may be connected with physical healing, or with financial, domestic or social adjustment. It is well to have at least one community assignment on the list—something which the group is doing for the benefit of the town or the city.

After these problems have been presented

they may be briefly discussed, if such discussion seems necessary to enable all of the members to grasp them clearly.

Next, one student should read from any book or magazine from which he has derived spiritual uplift. A practical method of handling this part of the work is to arrange the names of the members alphabetically, and to have each, in the order in which his name appears on the list, take charge of the reading for one meeting.

Following this reading comes the group Silence. This is simply a co-operative use of the method previously described. It should not be too long—from three to five minutes is ample, particularly during the first meetings.

In connection with the assignments or problems which the members have noted down in their assignment books, a record should be kept. These problems are to be taken into the Silence daily by each member of the group, at the time agreed upon for co-operative effort. At every meeting a verbal report should be made as to the results secured in each case. If this system is followed, it will add greatly to the interest and effectiveness of the club's work.

There it was, the simple truth in Mrs. Eddy's own words. The great, big thing which every-one was fearing was "a false and temporal sense of Truth, Life and Love." One could not throw an ink well at this, although, to many, the term "mortal mind" has carried no lesser meaning than the theological idea of Satan.

A "false sense" of anything has only the power of ignorance. Where ignorance is, there is always confusion. Nothing goes right, nothing comes out as one expects or plans it. And this is because there is no principle to ignorance from which to base a conclusion or from which one may accurately reckon with positive

If this ignorance is regarding the science of numbers, then one is liable to be what is known as "cheated." He can never know for sure whether or not he is being given right change, being overcharged, or what not. If this ignorance is of art, he may buy a worthless imitation of a masterpiece. And so on down the line of human activity. How much more are we being cheated when we are ignorant of the Science of Being?

But, when one tries to find a philosophical and logical explanation of what "ignorance" is, in whatever realm it is manifested, he is under the difficulty of trying to explain a negation. There is absolutely no reason that can be given for it. All one can do is to dispell it.

Now, two contradictory forces such as good and evil cannot exist at the same time in the same universe if one is omnipotent. Therefore, the only evil there is, is the seeming absence of Good. This seeming absence of Good is Ignorance, and ignorance is mental. By the law of externalization this ignorance of the law of our being appears objectively as sin, sickness and death in ourselves, and as decay in the universe.

Darkness is not real. Take a dark room, for instance, and press the electric button. The room is flooded with light. What becomes of the darkness? Does it go away some place? Does it hide itself? Has it any entity? Has it any power to gather itself together, reinforce itself, and come back into the room? Does it even pretend to wage war on the light? Is it anything occupying position or location?

When you have defined darkness, when you have found its origin, its location, its power, its entity, you know all there is to know about ignorance, whether it is manifested in the realm of numbers, art, or the law of our being.

In comparing spiritual facts with objective things, there is always a weak link in the chain of logic. The weakness in this reasoning is of logic. The weakness in this reasoning is that light has to be turned on in order to dispell darkness. God, Good, does not have to be put where evil seems to be, for this presupposes a time and place where God is not. No: God does not have to be put where evil seems to be, for He is already there, waiting recognition, Realization.

The Infinite does not have to be lifted from one place and put into another, neither does He have to be transferred from one mind to another. He is the Ever Present Truth, the Ever Present Life, the Ever Present Love.

A positive Declaration of this spiritual and metaphysical fact instantly brings into conscious experience either the Whole of God or the particular aspect of Him of which we have the most need.

The Congress Finds Itself.

HE Denver Congress seemed to (1) "believe in itself 100% as the law-making body of the International New Thought Alliance, (2) believe in *expressing* individual viewpoints, (3) believe in *every individual* present as a voice of the Spirit of Christ to be listened to carefully before making one's own decision, (4) believe in his own inner conviction as the urge of Christ moving him to vote, and (5) believe in the majority vote as the Decision of the Christ within ALL of us, for that time and

This Denver Congress is the first that has

found itself one.

The Congresses of 1915 to 1918 saw the building of the good ship Alliance practically accomplished. Cincinnati in 1919 found her moving on her own power-and creaking and shrieking her loudest! Kansas City tried her out and polished her up. And at this Denver Congress the ship finds herself, as Kipling ex-presses it in his story, "How the Good Ship Found Herself."

The working of the Denver Congress was like that deep, musical hum-m-m of satisfaction into which the creaks and squeaks and shrieks of the new parts settled, as all the parts of the ship found their adjustment to each other, as the ship found all her PARTS one with herself: not one with some of her parts, but with all, each doing its best in its place and finding itself valued equally with all others.

As I see it, the essential groundwork for this Congress was laid in Kansas City last year, where the Congress unified itself by considering and voting for two candidates for president, for the first time. So successful did this prove, that the K. C. Congress tried to insure two candidates at every Congress, by directing the Nominations Committee to bring in the names of two nominees for each of the six general offices.

This plan proved itself impractical at this Denver Congress: two names were put up for each office, and the second choice for each one promptly withdrew in favor of the first choice named! Of course. Wouldn't you? And if you were working on Nominations Committee

wouldn't THE SPIRIT lead you to favor THE BEST person for first choice? And then wouldn't THE SPIRIT of Truth, of Christ, lead you to select for second place the person BEST calculated to step aside and let the FIRST CHOICE man have the office? Of course.

You just couldn't do any other way if you followed the Spirit; for the reason that The Spirit never guides anybody to do anything short of THE BEST thing for that time and

The Spirit will guide you to vote for THE BEST man you know of. It will guide you to THE BEST method of insuring his election. But The Spirit never answers the question: "What is the not-best thing to do?"

So, dividing the responsibility of a committee results in the committee having to "play politics" in order to let the Spirit express!

The Spirit worked it out all right any way, but why create a devious and indirect channel through which the Spirit must move to guide a committee?

Therefore it was done away with, without discussion. Our Constitution again calls for nominations "(1) by Nominations Committee and also (2) by petition signed by five or more members present at the Congress. The Nomi-nations Committee shall present one name for

each office."

The Nominations Committee is made up of a chairman and two other members appointed by the President, together with all the District Presidents in attendance at the Congress. Two out of the three appointed members are required to be reappointed by the new president, to hold over.

Any five members of the Congress can re-solve themselves into a "nominations committee" of their own, and nominate whatever person or persons The Spirit within guides them to agree upon as THE BEST. Thus may several candidates be nominated, each by a "committee" (petition) of five (or more) who believe him to be THE BEST. Then the Congress can decide, each individual voting for THE BEST as he sees it; and the majority vote expressing the Decision of the Lord God for that time and place.

Steam had the power to run engines during all the ages prior to Stevenson's discovery of its use. Radium has given out energy for all time, though we have not known of it until recently.

All atoms are reservoirs of infinite energy all scientists recognize this—just as atoms of radium are reservoirs of limitless energy. I use radium as an illustration only because it is

the one form commonly known.

Atoms give off energy by what scientists call tiny impulses or explosions. The words do not give the true meaning, but as yet we have no

word that gives the true idea.

A grain of radium is a very small particle. Yet every single second every grain of radium shoots off 2,000 million impulses of energy, and after it has shot off 2,000 million impulses of energy every second for 1,700 years, it has used up but half of its energy—that is, it gives off 1,700,000,000,000,000,000 impulses of force and then has used but one-half of its energy of which we know at present.

The infinite energy in every atom of so-called matter! The infinity_of God in every atom! All so-called matter is alive. It is alive with

energy. It is God in manifestation.

To recognize and idealize life in every cell of the human body—in every one of the billions of atoms in every cell—is the second step in all healing. Once we idealize any part of the body as throbbing with billions of billions of impulses of divine energy every single second, there is no possibility of your mind believing that matter is dead or that sleeping matter cannot be revived or that so-called dead matter cannot be made living.

The power of resurrection resides in infinite energy of God in every cell and every atom.

It was the application of the truths contained in the preceding lesson—the truth of the non-solidity of matter—and the truth contained in this lesson that brought life and motion to the paralyzed arm of the young French woman mentioned in the preceding paragraphs.

But four steps were necessary:

First, there was no affirmation or denial of anything. For a denial of a paralyzed arm would have created doubt in the subconscious mind, even though the conscious mind declared such doubt did not exist. And an affirmation that the arm could move would have aroused doubt even in the conscious mind so long as the arm did not move.

Second, there was idealization of the matter of the arm as a manifestation of God's infinite

energy—little centers of infinite energy held together by God as infinitely extensive attractive energy. Thus there was created in the mind of the young woman an absolute knowledge that the condition of the arm could be changed. Idealization of these truths made denials and affirmations unnecessary.

Third, the matter of the arm was idealized as living. Every cell and every atom of every cell was held in consciousness as a reservoir of ininite energy of God, throbbing and pulsating billions of times per second with His energy.

Fourth, God was idealized as all and every-

thing.

Fifth, every idea coming from the preceding idealizations were used.

In three months the arm was normal.

The healing in this case was not instantaneous; we did not limit ourselves by demanding that it should be. God is All; therefore, He is tetrnal! Eternity is limitless time. How often we restrict God's processes manifesting through us by contradictions: we assert that God is eternal, and then we demand that he operate instantaneously. MRS. P. T. Le M .- The subconscious is the unconscious part of your mind—that part which is distinct from the consciousness of everyday life. The subconscious is the storehouse of the memory. In the subconscious is recorded the results of countless experiences of oneself and his ancestors. It is not necessary to define, or understand, what the subconscious mind is in order to use suggestion and obtain results. The method is simple. Every morning and evening, when you are relaxed mentally and physically, as between the sleeping and waking states, repeat a brief statement of that which you desire to realize or accomplish. Put the statement in positive form, if possible, but make it general rather than specific. You should do this for the reason that if you make a specific affirmation of something not yet realized, you arouse the doubt and questioning of the conscious mind. Word your affirmation so that the conscious mind cannot object. If you desire health, affirm "I am daily and hourly improving in all respects" rather than "I am well now." Repeat your affirmation from time to time through the day as opportunity offers, first relaxing mentally and physically. But do not watch yourself for results, do not let your mind dwell upon your condition or speculate about your improve-ment or lack of improvement. Most important of all, do not allow your will to enter into the practice of auto-suggestion. It is your imagination, not your will, that you are to exercise in making the suggestions, if you wish to realize Tension of mind or body through any results. attempt to exert the will in connection with the suggestions will defeat the very result you want. When you make an effort of the will by trying to force the realization of your suggestion, the conscious mind is immediately impressed with the idea that the desired result is exceedingly difficult, if not impossible, of attainment, and this idea, through the law of reversed effort, acts as a powerful counter suggestion, completely neutralizing the original affirmation. If you carry out the directions given above, the will itself will be strengthened by the suggestions, so that it will enable you to fulfil the conditions of realization without special separate effort of will on your part.

OLD MAID SISTER .- A few weeks' vacation would make you better satisfied with life. You could arrange it so that someone could look after your brothers while you are away, if you really have a strong enough desire to do so. If you stay at home it is because, all things considered, you really desire to do so. We all follow our strongest desires. Your brothers are inspired by the same primitive human desires that you are, and they react to environment according to their past education and experience, just as you do. It is only by understanding them, and the source of their impulses to particular forms of action, that you can really get their co-operation. You might get some light on this subject by reading "Getting What We Want," by David Orr Edson, M. D. Pub-lished by Harper & Brothers, New York City. You will find it worth while to look about for some avocation that will give you opportunity for fuller self-expression. You need something that will really interest and absorb you in creative effort. There are plenty of opportunities for this, right where you are. It might take the form of growing some particular varieties of flowers, or small fruits, raising blooded fowls, a mail course in some study that interests you. Try to find out what you really want to do and then adapt your wants to your environment.

F. R.-The author of "A Clean Slate" was presenting a certain viewpoint that many people need to cultivate. She was, I think, referring to the fact that the more you discuss your differences with another the farther apart you become so far as a point of agreement is con-cerned. "Never explain, admit, confess," re-ferred to verbal discussion rather than to the personal attitude. I do not think the author intended to imply that one should never admit a mistake or make good if he had done anyone an injury. It is a psychological fact that explaining, admitting, confessing, so far as discussion is concerned, arouses antagonism and leads to a greater sense of injury on one side and aversion on the other. Right action is the best remedy for such a condition. This and the forgetting of the whole matter. As far as happiness is concerned, it is purely a mental attitude, a matter of individual belief, faith, adjustment, and does not depend on whether one has or has not made mistakes in life. Many people who have lead the most impeccable lives, from the ordinary objective viewpoint, are the most unhappy.

M. J. H.—Do not worry about "the right one." You will not need to question and speculate when he comes, in order to make certain that he is the one. Affirm what you want just before you go to sleen at night and the first thing in the morning, but do not speculate too much upon the matter between times. Take up some avocation that will really command your interest and give you an opportunity for self-expression apart from your business. Self-ex-

pression means health and happiness. Repression leads to inharmony, unhappiness and disease.

H. A. F.—It is no more the girl's place than it is the place of the man to "set a good example." Quite possibly you were both somewhat at fault in this instance. It seems to me that you are wise to keep apart. Your reaction to her influence was apparently not the best.

DESPERATE.—There is nothing to prevent both of you from expressing love to the child. If you do not do so, it is because of some inhibition in your minds, and not because of any compulsion of circumstances. Possibly the inhibition is a hold-over of the emotional state engendered by the inharmony between husband and wife. A careful self-analysis might uncover the particular repression that is responsible. In the meantime, cultivate love, express good will. Read "Man's Unconscious Conflict," published by Dodd, Mead & Co., New York City. It will help you to understand yourself and to get rid of some of the inhibitions from which you are suffering. If the child's support and education could be assured, a separation might be better than life under such circumstances as you describe.

E. E. S.—Get out your back numbers of Nautilus and read all the articles on success and efficiency by Brown Landone. Keep in your mind the thought that there is some service which you can render to society which will bring you a good living and take stock of yourself, and of your environment, the opportunities around you for possible service, until you get an opening. Do not withdraw within yourself and keep away from people because of your need. You will find friends if you do not shut yourself off from your surroundings and the more acquaintances you make the more opportunity you will have to find some place which you can fill. Start out each morning with the affirmation that you are being led to the opening you need.

N. O. R .- Try suggestion in this way: Every night and morning affirm that this habit has no power over you, that you feel a positive distaste for the indulgence, that it gives you no pleasure, etc., etc. Make the affirmation rapidly, with as little attention from the conscious mind as will serve to enable you to repeat the words mechanically. Do not try to prolong the affirmation, to "hold the thought," and do not make any special effort to use your will in overcoming the habit. Be careful not to let your thoughts dwell upon the matter between times. The reason it is desirable to engage the conscious mind as little as possible, beyond making the affirmation, is that the conscious mind, in the case of a specific, definite affirmation regarding an objective aim, will set up a counter suggestion through speculation and comparison between the present state and the desired objective. It will list obstacles, picture failure, and thus neutralize the effect of the suggestion. I have known of several instances where such habits as smoking, drinking, etc., have been cured by the method outlined above.

the expression of a vision; the power of the idea. The history of the Peace (so-called)
Conference is yet to be written. Time will doubtless reverse many judgments, and alter many estimates. But certain ideals which Woodrow Wilson put into currency before the Conference, and certain ideas which he car-ried to it and endeavored to write into the treaty, to create a League of Nations, quite apart from any immediately practical results are the stuff which time does not alter except to augment, which men, even though at first discarding, come with the years to accept, and by accepting to move forward ever so little toward that "divine far off event." It is in no other way, indeed, that men do move forward. All progress is the slow advance of the masses of men toward the vision of a leader.

In how many minds, for example, had the idea previously existed that there is no victory in conquest? In a few, of course, always. But to the mass of men the idea was preposterous and even "pro-German." Peace without victory was a byword of scorn. Now that we have victory without peace, now that all have gone down together, conquered and conqueror, the idea put forward as wholesome leaven in unwilling bread, is beginning to work. It will go on working. It has set the whole world think-

ing on a new track.

The idea of the self-determination of nations, of course, was not a new one, either. But Woodrow Wilson gave it a currency it had never had before, and how far this idea will go. how much it will alter the world's map, the world's way of life, time alone can reveal. Certain it is that he set on foot a great stirring of many peoples, he roused dim millions to selfexpression.

But above all, it seems to me, almost as much by his own habit of mind as by what he saidcertainly more than by what he did-Woodrow Wilson put into the minds of his generation and the coming generation the idea that reason, not passion, can be a governing force in the world, or at least is the immediate goal of the world's struggle for government. Embody this idea in a League of Nations, embody it in a disarmament conference, embody it as you choose or can, the fact remains that to Woodrow Wilson, to his stubborn intellectualism, his habit of academic reasonableness, his ignorance, even, of "reality," is due the credit of making the common folk of this earth see the goal at last. To see the goal, to catch the vision, to be imbued at last with the idea—an idea as old as Plato and seeming sometimes almost as dead!is to have set one foot, at least, on the road of progress. Because the fund will help to keep alive this idea, and by its name to honor justly the man who did so much to spread it, heart and soul for the Woodrow Wilson Foundation.

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
