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IRAN - Forward Through Turmoil

Following Iran's nationalization of her oil industry, Premier Mohammed Mossadegh addressed an appeal to his people to maintain national unity and to rest assured that his Government would not wane in the strict enforcement of the nationalization law. "Today, you, my countrymen, face two roads—the start of evolution or disgrace," the Premier declared. "I am confident you will choose the road of nobility and show the world once again you want to live freely in an atmosphere pure of foreign intrigues." He also said that Iran's fame in breaking the "bondage" of foreign economic penetration had spread throughout the world.

Such is the state of mind out of which the Iranian crisis developed. It is a state of mind that has now become universally prevalent among all backward peoples and all under-privileged classes.

Iran's revolution is but another uprising in an ever lengthening series of national manifestations of a world-wide quickening of the human spirit. It is a localized outburst of long suppressed aspirations on the part of multitudes of people to share more fully and justly in all those things that make life worth living.

The particular incidents accompanying such an upheavel as that presently experienced in Iran are altogether secondary to the spiritual issues out of which they arise. Under the up-welling of the tremendous cosmic energies that are impinging on all humanity at this cyclic point of its evolution, the undisciplined masses are likely to go to excesses of all kinds in their determination to right flagrant social wrongs and may thus in turn commit other wrongs for future righting.

But man progresses through trial and error, through effort and action. It is this that Premier Mossadegh brings to the attention of his aroused people who after centuries of lethargy are again astir. "Two roads," said

he, "lie before you: Evolution or disgrace," In other words, now that you have become aware of your backward status and given evidence that you are determined to improve it, the possibilities of evolution open before you; seize them, or be disgraced by your failure to respond to the upward call of the times.

These words of the Iranians' political leader echo those of the New Age Spirit as it calls all humanity to arise, go forward and "leave its low vaulted past," to recognize its innate divinity and eternal worth; to know that it was not created to grovel in the dust, but to live in the light; to enjoy freedom and to share equitably in the goods that this earth can

provide.

It is only as we recognize the nature of the spiritual causation underlying current happenings in the world that we can approach them in the attitude and with the understanding that will enable us to deal with them sympathetically and wisely. Only then will we have the patience, the tolerance and the insight to help steer the course of inflamed passions, hateful resentments over past and present wrongs, and incitements to physical violence into moods of moderation and areas of constructive action.

Circumstances Attending Iran's Uprising

As everyone knows, oil is the inflammable ingredient that led the Iranians to rise up against undue alien influence in their economic life and which in turn had the effect of lessening their political independence and depressing the social conditions of the masses. This natural resource was in foreign hands. Britain operated the industry and owned the controling interest. The business was conducted under a contract with the Iranian Government but under terms by which the greater portion of the wealth produced went abroad. That contract, which was of long standing and renewed in 1933 for a sixty year period, had 1993 as its expiration date. But in this year, 1951, Iran by unilateral action, disregards her legal obligation under this contract, and takes over sole ownership and control of her oil industry.

Long before 1933 something happened to Iran and in the world at large that was not foreseen in 1933—at any rate, apparently not by those suffering a blind spot from intense self-interest—even though at that time privileged interests had been violently overthrown in many parts of the world and nothing seemed more certain than a continuance of swift and radical changes in every department of life. The hitherto silent, toiling subservient masses were everywhere being galvanized into dynamic action by the forces now pouring into our planetary spheres from cosmic centers of power. They are on the march. And today it is in Iran where they have practically taken over. The government stands, but only because it acted in obedience to demands of an aroused public.

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There can be no question of Iran's justifiable grievance, writes Archer Upham Pope of the Asian Institute in a letter to the *New York Times* (June 23).

... The exemplary patience (of the British) is in general beyond praise; but they have been too patient with their own unsatisfactory record of exploitation, or unfair practices, and altogether too impervious to the plain sign of mounting Iranian resentment. Iranian poetry, art, political history, mystical and religious passions should make clear to the most superficial that beyond a certain point there comes extravagance, unreason and destructive wrath

Had the Anglo-Iranian Oil Company been anywhere near as fair and generous as the American oil companies have been in the Near East, the present dangerous situation would not have arisen. Iran was receiving 16 per cent of the net profits of the operation. The company kept its own books, and Persians and other foreign observers, including well-informed Englishmen, believed those books were "substantially cooked." Royalties provided in 1931 were just one quarter of those paid in 1930, because the Anglo-Iranian Oil suppressed the sale of the Persian oil to profit more from their holdings in Iraq and Venezuela. Protests of the Iranians that operations of the company were not in accordance with the contract were accepted by the British in 1948 and payment made of $3\frac{1}{2}$ million pounds in compensation. A million pounds was paid in 1930 in response to Iranian claims that such a sum was due them but withheld.

The concession was originally granted by a corrupt and incompetent Shah for purely selfish purposes. Such a contract, intrinsically immoral and indefensible, should have been more justly revised long ago. Great Britain supported petty chieftains, like Sheikh Khazal, in their defiance of the central Government and their refusal to pay taxes. Khazal was awarded titles, a salute and stipends—all calculated to infuriate the Persians. The concession, which was originally given to an individual, was, without discussion with the Persian Government, in large measure transferred to the British Government, and the Persians found that their partner was the most powerful sovereign Government in the world, that would not hesitate to use threats of military force and, despite denials, effective employment of diplomatic pressures.

This is a severe indictment. But it needs be in the record. British character rates high, "but there is not one righteous, no not one."

Britain's Reaction

Naturally Britain protested Iran's action. She did so not on the grounds of her nationalization of oil—Iran's right to such procedure was freely granted—but for scrapping an agreement and refusing to negotiate. But there was no reasoning with the incensed populace, and the government confessed its helplessness to prevent or to alter the course which events had taken. The nationalization of oil was an accomplished fact and there were no apologies for breaking a contract which the people had come to regard as morally indefensible. A human claim had arisen which to their way of thinking rightly superceded the property claim under the legal contract.

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Fortunately for Iran and the world at large, Britain has not only the self-control to meet fury with calmness and vituperation with dignified restraint, but it has also a wisdom and judgment that comes with maturity enriched by long and wide experience which enables it to recognize the human and spiritual forces underlying Iran's revolution, and moreover, to share an actual sympathy for the nationalistic aspirations of peoples as evidenced by the freedom she finally granted India, Påkistan, Ceylon and Burma. To be sure, these grants of freedom, these imperialistic renunciations were not altogether voluntary, but even so, they were not without compensatory gains of a spiritual nature.

It goes without saying that there are still influential elements in Britain that belong to the old school of imperialism and who call for show of power and use of force and that counsel military action to hold Iran to her bond and keep her oil safe for profits, for industrialization and for

military purposes.

But these are not in the majority in Britain today. These are not controling either her domestic or her foreign policy. However far short this nation may still fall of fulfilling a truly righteous pattern, it has demonstrated a capacity to give as well as to take; it has recognized the law of mutuality in its commonwealth dealings; it has been able to accept austerity living for the sake of principles and to endure hardship without losing courage or faith or good cheer in its own high calling and the ultimate triumph of humanity's battle for free, fruitful and peaceful living.

There was a time, and not so long since, when Britain would unquestionably have hurled her military forces into any area where her legal rights to property were in any way jeopardized. But it did not happen in Iran. Britain has made it clear that she will use her military arm if necessary to protect the lives of her nationals but not her property. There is to be no attempt to recapture lost privileges or other material advantages.

Britain's past record in this respect is not without dark stains and no one would claim that all her motives and actions are yet above reproach. But what should be recognized and recorded is that in Britain the world does have the example of a nation that is demonstrating increasing capacities for balanced judgments and reasoned procedures and that possesses a high degree of moral integrity and purpose together with a spiritual stamina that enables her to survive triumphantly trials that to peoples not so inwardly fortified would prove highly disastrous. Altogether they form a combination of qualities that may well earn for this nation in the days ahead the spiritual status represented in individual attainment by the Discipleship Degree. Such attainment would be a logical development under the Second or Love-Wisdom Ray which governs her inner or spirit-

ual being and also in accord with her esoteric motto, "I serve." Disciple-ship means consecration to service—and in the case of a nation, world service. It may also be added in this connection that in the Anglo-Israel reading of history, Britain is identified as "God's servant nation." With every sacrifice, every renunciation that Britain makes—and she has made many in recent years—there follows added revelation of the course she is destined to follow.

Iran's oil constitutes Britain's greatest foreign investment. It is a principal factor in her defense calculations. To withdraw may mean vastly more than loss of wealth, loss of profits. It may mean decreased production such as to cut off needed oil supplies at any price. It may mean decreased production of its flow from West to East. It might mean added chaos in Iran, the entry of Russia and the signal for the feared Soviet drive southward into the Mediterranean with "all nations gathered for battle at Jerusalem" as foretold by the prophet Zechariah. The stakes in Iran are vastly more than oil and profits. And yet, Britain is letting go. The logic of the situation compels it. But once recognizing the compulsion, there follows the virtue of being able to accept the necessity with willingness.

These are matters to be stressed because they promote confidence in the future. They point to an integration of forces going on beneath the disturbed surface of things out of which the world is one day to see the establishment of a peaceful, joyous, creative community of man.

Spiritual Impulse Underlying Social Upheaval

Cool calculations may go into the planning of a revolution but once it is set off and the populace rallies to the slogans of revolt, sober minds are no longer able to control it. This is true of the Iranian situation. As a measure of personal safety even the Premiar must remain for the most part in hiding. Most anything can happen when long suppressed emotions are loosed.

And so it is in keeping with the situation when the government of Iran under pressure from the people recklessly tears up a contract involving another government even if such action tends to undermine the very foundation on which stable international relations must rest. If we were to look no further into the matter, then we would have to conclude that the Iranian trouble signifies merely an increase of social chaos and moral deterioration bringing injury to all concerned, and perhaps most of all to the Iranians themselves.

But when a people's grievances accumulate past endurance as they have in Iran, then protest and revolutions, even if unreasoned in expression and violent and destructive in behavior, are nevertheless, a move indicative of progress in that they are basically an uprising of the spirit and a signal that man will not remain a mere animal, that he will not be held in perpetual slavery, that he will not be satisfied with ignorance and poverty, but that he is becoming aware of his true human status, responding to soul stirrings within and that he is sufficiently aroused to go forth and demand his rightful social heritage from those who have the power to bestow it.

It is this unquenchable spirit in man that guarantees his ultimate victory over all that stands between his lesser human estate and the divine glory yet to be achieved. Though the path to the golden goal be slow and hard, though in traversing it new wrongs are often adden to old, fresh strife engendered in the mistaken belief that it will enforce peace, and individual freedom denied on the assumption that dictation from authority above best promotes human progress, the final outcome is sure to far outreach present imaginings. In spite of all that holds humanity back there is ever present, and today in special measure, spiritual impulses of sufficient power to draw mankind upward to levels not hitherto attained.

Iran's Strategic Importance

Iran is a very small spot on the world map but like near-by Palestine it is of tremendous strategic importance to rival coalitions that are contending for world supremacy. Both sides need the oil that flows from its wells and both sides need a foothold in this land-link between the East and the West, as well as a preponderant influence over that sensitive area where Bible prophecy declares the final battle of this age is to take place.

With Britain's virtual expulsion from Iran these advantages have now apparently fallen to the Soviets. And it is with Russia that we will find her in the coming Armageddon according to Ezekiel. In the thirty-eighth chapter of this prophetic book, the people of Gog of the Land of Magog in the "north parts" are described as moving southward against "the mountains of Israel" with "Persia, Ethopia and Libya with them."

Iran's present revolution is another in a long chain of events that points to the fulfillment of that prophecy. A shift of power in favor of the East has already occurred in this area. Britain is out. Russia stands at the border. Anarchy threatens in Iran, and with anarchy at her door the Soviets can find ready reasons to take a hand in establishing order and in bringing this vital land within the orbit of her dictates.

If Persia, powerful Persia by virtue of her position and resources, has been lost to the West, it is by the West's own fault; no one has yet blamed Russia or the Communists for this revolution. It is clearly the product of greed—Iranian greed, British greed, Western greed. Said Maj. Gen. Patrick J. Hurley, former Ambassador to China, when testifying before the Senate Committee in the MacArthur hearing: "The trouble in Iran was

imperialism, not communism." The Russians, he declared, were proceeding in the the belief that Iran ultimately would fall into Communist hands "by reason of the greed, to put it mildly, of the Western World."

If these be facts, then it is of the greatest importance that they be kept clearly in mind, together with their many implications, if we want to combat the mounting passions and prejudices that accompany war, be it hot or cold, and to strengthen instead the rule of reason. Also it is important that we learn from past experience and begin to make the world safe for true democracy by abandoning greed, outlawing exploitation, and raising the standards of living in all backward areas to the limit of our ability. Who shall say that fifty billion dollars worth of food and clothing and housing and technical instruction and cooperation in impoverished lands would not yield us a greater defense against totalitarism than an equal amount expended for military equipment? Certain it is the present war will not be finally won on the battlefield but by the practical demonstration of a superior way of life.

A beginning at least has been made in the more constructive approach to the world's troubles in the gradual implementation of President Truman's Point Four program for economic aid to backward lands. But it moves slowly. We are late in starting and tardiness proves costly. Listen again to more of General Hurley's recital before the Senatorial hearing. As early as 1944 he told the Committee he had proposed to President Roosevelt the adoption of a program and one specifically applicable to Iran, such as that later presented by President Truman under Point Four. This received the approval of President Roosevelt but, says General Hurley, his State Department stigmatized it on a memorandum as "messianic global baloney." The General then wrote the resident that his plan was being destroyed by "men who were upholding imperialism, monopoly and exploitation."

These are the elements in our country and in Britain and in other free lands that become the destroyers of freedom. Sooner or later those who dismiss altruism as alien to business and the Messianic impulse as foreign to statecraft will find that without them there will be no safety, no enduring prosperity, no universal tranquility. Under the rule of the predatory instincts the few will rule for a time over the many until the latter will take their revenge as they have again and again through history rising in violent revolt against their oppressors.

It happens today in Iran. If the free nations of the world could take it as a warning and as a lesson learned, if they could still act with swiftness and boldness and generosity wherever there be a human need, humanity would presently win the greatest victory in all the long course of its struggle to create a world worthy of its high and divine destiny.

THE HEBREW ALPHABET

A Series of Cosmic Glyphs

Gimel, the third letter, is cosmically the Emanation formed by the outpouring of Aleph and Beth, the perfect blending of Fire and Water, or the Masculine and the Feminine conjoined on the highest planes of manifestation.

Gimel represents the inherent urge toward perfection which is discernable in all manifested form.

Astrologically, Gimel is fashioned through the cosmic forces projected by Gemini, the Twins or the dual forces of the Masculine and Feminine in equilibrium. Gimel is both action (positive, masculine) and union (feminine, negative).

This duality is also spoken of as God's inferior and superior nature, the former constituting His manifested Self, the latter His essential Being. Reads a classic commentary:

My inferior nature is the bond of union between myself and all created things. Hence it is likened to Gimel because the camel beareth rich and costly merchandise. And again, for that the camel betokeneth travel and communication because thus a symbol of change and of the flux and mingling of ideas born upon the stream of memory.

Happy is he who bestrideth the camel of my inferior nature which bringeth them who learn the secret of its mastery unto Me their lord. A task most difficult and laborious is the conquest of the power of recollection. Strength and courage and patience must they have who gain this victory; but these shall be as kings and princesses in this world and even as gods in the world to come.

Physiologically, Gimel is the throat, center of power for the spoken word. The throat is the vestibule of man's bodily sanctuary, connecting mind and heart. "Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh."

Gimel is the third power center in the perfect image or archetypal body, and it projects the threefold forces throughout the universe. As this is still a three-dimensional universe the Law of Three generally prevails throughout its progressive cycles.

Beth is the Word as it was with and in God. Gimel is the Word made flesh and dwelling among men as the head (intellect, understanding) and heart (love, wisdom) unite at the point of equilibrium in Gimel. Isaiah represents this attainment when he said, "So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereunto I sent it."

The Tarot hieroglyph of Gimel is a woman crowned with a circle of stars. A sceptre bearing the symbol of Venus is in her right hand and in her left she holds aloft an eagle. Herein we find a beautiful symbol of the coming of the Aquarian Age, when, by subjection of the lower nature through the will power of Aleph and its transmutation into soul power by the love of Beth, the emancipated one, Gimel, citizen of the new heaven and new earth, is born. Gimel is a symbol of power and of consummation, set amidst "the fullness of strength."

DALETH

The fourth letter is Daleth, the door.

Cosmically, Daleth is the point of transition from one world to another. It is the accumulated spiritual essence which opens the door to an ever ascending series of spiritual perceptions.

"Open the Door," chants the Psalmist, "that the king of glory may

come in." On this terrestial plane Daleth is the door of initiation through which the candidate passes when the attributes of the "king of glory" (the divinity within himself) have been sufficiently awakened to demand that this mystic door shall open before his spoken word.

Daleth is represented biblically by the vision of Jacob's ladder, upon which the angels of God descend and ascend as the consciousness of the Initiate (Jacob) expands to comprehend the meaning of various degrees of the evolutionary ladder which extends from earth to heaven.

Physiologically, Daleth connects with the cosmic enanations of Cancer, the doorway to celestial realms whereby the Ego passes from darkness into light.

Daleth is four, the sacred quartenary, the name of Deity in nearly all religions.

Yod-He-Vau-He is the mystic insignia which opened to Moses the wonders and powers of the seen and unseen. It conceals within itself the magical sesame of the word *Amen* as used by ancient Egyptians and later by early Christian Initiates.

Daleth sounds the keynote of G sharp. Astrologically it correlates with Cancer, the exaltation sign of Jupiter. Its keyword is Realization.

The Tarot glyph is termed the "Cubic Stone." A man is seated thereon holding in his hand the scepter of the Magi. His being seated upon the perfect stone is a symbol that his labor has reached completion. His left hand points downward to signify his conquest over matter. The dove upon his breast, like the swan of later ages, is a sign of the Initiate. The cat carved upon the stone denotes powers of clairvoyance which accompany this stage of attainment—the ability to "see in the dark," that is, to decipher mysteries.

TWILIGHT ON THE SEA

That such beings as undines (water sprites) actually exist is given but slight credence in the matter-of-fact world. However, despite our lack of vision and our dullness of comprehension, a glorious panorama of Nature's Ceremonials stretches all about us.

The undines are rightly called the spirits of the sea, for they embody all its elements in their make-up. Their lithesome motions and lilting

After birth the tone or shade resulting from the blending of these primary color notes reveals the ego's status in evolutionary development in an aura of gleaming color."

In relation to the Trinity, blue is the Father color, yellow the color of the Christ and red that of the Holy Spirit. In this Trinity, power is centered in the Father, love in the Christ and activity in the Holy Spirit. In prenatal development we discover, therefore, that the power of the Father is required to inaugurate the formation of a new body, the cohesive principle of love to carry it forward through its second stage and the activating principle of the Holy Spirit to complete the third or last stage immediately preceding its entry upon an independent physical existence.

It is only when we consider more than one series of attributes and qualities assigned to the Trinity and observe how they harmonize and support one another in relation to the logical processes in nature as we can observe them at certain points that we arrive at a conviction that the assignments of colors or tones or principles to Beings or aspects of Beings or phases of development are not of an arbitrary nature nor again pure abstractions invented by the human intellect. They are realities existing in the very nature of things.



Frozen Music

The architect tuned in on its pattern and bodied it forth in the tower that makes one reach after another skyward. "It was a beautiful story as it was related to me," adds the friend in the letter relating the spiritual genesis of Pittsburg's proudest monument.

"This is the music of that supernatural Fire," writes Corinne Heline

in her interpretation of Wagner's Music-Dramas, "which does not burn but exalts, for it is the celestial Fire of Spirit which produces not heat but light."

Writing of this music the late critic, Laurence Gilman, declared that "we come from a performance of The Valkyrie with a sense of dazed and shaken incredulity, the conviction that we have experienced some capturing of essences, some projection of reality that transcends art."

How literally the architect of the Cathedral of Learning did just this he captured an essence, an archetype, "a projection of reality that transcends art." He touched the realm of the pure ideal where all art forms merge into unity.

Roadblock To Peace

While the New York Herald-Tribune reports the existence of a "Communist Conspiracy in America," the Reds continue to extend their influence in all parts of the world.

The average man may well ask what this war between the Left and the Right is all about. To many it is a struggle for men's souls between the powers of light and darkness, though the side of the "light" seems to depend on the point of view. According to the leftists, it is a class-war between those who "own" and those who "work," the one side wanting the social order slanted in its favor, while the other wants only the handworkers in control.

The fact that no peace is possible between the Left and Right creates a situation that has brought progress in centralized society to a standstill. Until now it has got along in its internal affairs on friendly compromises, but faced with the newly awakened forces of leftist labor and its extreme demands, our society is bankrupt. Social life is split into militant factions and, in the international field, the nations separate into warring camps. Nationally and internationally men are thus driven to see the need for a non-centralized system in which the individuals belonging to opposing groups can once again agree as individuals.

The American Republic was designed by its Founders to be such a society. It was conceived as belonging to the individual, not to groups or classes. But the fact that its political parties have habitually paid off their supporters in "privileges" has opened this country, also, to the social corruption of battling groups that can only end in oppression and bankruptcy.

Groups will always fight for the management of social life. Therefore, the key to peace at home and in the world at large lies in the kind of decentralization that leaves the political arm no power to create privilege. Through the functional decentralization of society into spheres of culture, common rights and economics, the ideals of the Founding Fathers could be realized and the way opened for peaceful relationships with other lands.
