## Three Great Mantrams

Among the important aids given to mankind for its spirtiual development by Illumined Guides and Guardians of the race are mantrams ensouled with divine light and power. Among the peoples of the Western world, the three mantrams that stand supreme are, in the chronological order of their release, the Twenty-third Psalm, the Lord's Prayer and the Great Invocation.

These three inspired utterances, while sharply differentiated one from another, are equally designed to draw the souls of men closer to each other and into an ever increasing consciousness of union with the Divine. They have other important features in common. They are all short, phrased in simple language and, once heard, never forgotten. Also, besides their clear and obvious meaning they embody very much more which is not superficially apparent.

That this is so may be surmised from the very structure of the mantrams. The Psalm is twelvefold in form, being keyed to the twelve zodiacal Hierarchies. The Lord's Prayer is sevenfold in structure in keeping with man's sevenfold nature and our septenary scheme of evolution. The Great Invocation is threefold in harmony with the triune nature of God and the corresponding trinity of man. Thus we may see how all three mantrams are keyed to certain aspects of the cosmos and their reflections in man, the microcosm.

The first of the three mantrams is a triumphant chant, a glorious affirmation. The second is a prayer. The third, an invocation. The Twenty-Third Psalm came into circulation some three thousand years ago; the Lord's Prayer was given two thousand years ago; the Great Invocation was released in our own day. The first embodies the sublime faith of Ancient Israel; the second voices the supreme prayer of all Christendom; the third invokes the most powerful energies humanity has yet been privileged to call forth from the heavens.

Each succeeding mantram finds adoption by increasing numbers. The use of the Psalm was once confined to the Hebrew nation; the Lord's Prayer quickly spread to all nations adopting the Christian faith; the Great Invocation has already found wide use among the faithful of every religion the world over. (The last line of the second stanza of the Great Invocation, calling for the return of the Christ, varies according to the name given by each religion to the Coming One.)

The first of the three mantrams did not pass out of existence when the second was given. Christians retained the Hebrew Psalm. Nor do the first and second of these magical formulas fall into disuse with the gift of the third. The three are important spiritual aids to modern disciples.

Universal humanity will some day recognize the spiritual potencies of each and utilize all three for cultivation of their divine potentialites.

Throughout the world and in every language and in every age mantrams have been given to serve a definite purpose and to meet humanity's special needs at its particular stage of development.

## The Twenty-Third Psalm

The Twenty-Third Psalm served to instill in the Israelites an absolute faith in the omnipresence and omnipotence of the Lord their God. Their trust in His guidance and protection was to be complete. The people were then at the stage of development where they needed to be led by the hand like a child.

The Psalm as a whole affirms the all sufficiency of God for their every need. It was and is a declaration of faith which made for obedience required by the Lord God Jehovah of His people that the divine law then being established in their outer lives might be inscribed in their very being so they could become a law unto themselves.

Esoterically, the Twenty-Third Psalm draws into the aura of a person using it the magnetic potencies of the twelve zodiacal Hierarchies to which the mantram is structurally related. Logically, it commences by contacting impulses of the first sign of the Zodiac, Aries, the ram, "The Lord is my shepherd," and continues through the heavenly circle until it concludes with the last of the signs, Pisces, the all enveloping, saving force in the universe. "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever."

## The Lord's Prayer

As the work which Jehovah had to accomplish in the Old Dispensation found a mantramic focus in the Twenty-Third Psalm, so the work which the Christ came to perform for the New Dispensation found formulation in the Lord's Prayer. That work consisted in calling forth the individual egoic consciousness from out of the racial group consciousness previously prevailing. Consequently, the Lord's Prayer consists of seven petitions relating to man's seven principles. The threefold spirit turns prayerfully to the triune Diety from whom it seeks whatever it needs for its threefold expression. The lowest of the three aspects of the spirit-self (Human Spirit) addresses its parent aspect with the prayer. "Hollowed be thy name." The next higher aspect of the threefold egoic nature (Life Spirit) petitions the second aspect of Diety, the Christ, in the words "Thy kingdom come." The third aspect (Divine Spirit) looks to its higher counterpart, the Father, and prays, "Thy will be done."

For its earthly counterpart, the physical body, the Divine Spirit in man petitions its related aspect in the Godhead, "Give us this day our daily

bread." The Life Spirit turns to the Christ aspect of Diety and pleads for the etheric body, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive them that trespass against us." Then the Human Spirit appeals to its higher counterpart in the triune Diety and pleads in behalf of the desire or astral body, "Lead us not into temptation."

Finally, all three aspects of man's being join in asking all three aspects of Diety that the mind, the link uniting the immortal triad above

with the mortal triad below, be delivered from evil.

After even such a cursory glance at the significance of this prayer of all prayers, who would say that it is not divinely inspired and scientifically designed to serve a definite purpose in the spiritual evolution of man?

### The Great Invocation

The Tibetan, frequently referred to in these pages, is authority for the statement that the Great Invocation has been in possession of the Hierarchy since its founding on earth, and that human evolution has now reached a stage where it may become generally available. We are also told that records in the Archives of the Invisible Government of the world reveal that this is the time marked for its release. The implications of this fact are at once revealing and comforting, especially at this time when we have need to realize that in the midst of upheavals and distruction a Higher Order is resolutely shaping all things in accordance with Divine Will.

The Great Invocation is suited to modern minds and will, therefore, find acceptance with great numbers who have ceased using the older forms of traditional religionists. Yet it voices in simple phrases of great beauty and strength the basic spiritual needs of humanity as set forth in all religions. It is an invocative appeal to the triune God for more light to illumine our minds, more love to resolve discords, greater strength for carrying out the will of God. It is the first time all three aspects have been invoked simultaneously.

It also relates to the three planetary centers, the first of which is presided over by the Father. This is Shamballa, the centre of Power where "the will of God is known." The second centre is the Hierarchy where Christ rules and Love reigns. The third is that centre "which we call the race of men." A closer relationship is being established between these three centers than has ever existed before. To help perfect this alignment and strengthen these bonds we have at this time been given the new invocation.

May we draw grace from its beauty, strength from its power, ennoblement from its spiritual substance. May we avail ourselves of its invocative appeal and by its use bring closer the hour of earth's great Restoration.

From the point of Light within the Mind of God Let light stream forth into the minds of men. Let Light descend on Earth.

From the point of Love within the Heart of God Let love stream forth into the hearts of men. May Chrsit return to Earth.

From the centre where the Will of God is known Let purpose guide the little wills of men-The purpose which the Master knows and serves.

From the centre which we call the race of men Let the Plan of Love and Light work out. And may it seal the door where evil dwells.

And I looked, and behold a pale horse: and his name that sat on him was Death, and Hell followed with him. And power was given to them over the fourth part of the earth, to kill with sword, and with hunger, and with death, and with the beasts of the earth.

The gray horseman is the spirit of Scorpio, the eighth sign of the zodiac and Lord of Death. He is spreading death and destruction by fire, hunger and sword, often in the wake of invading armies. It is the death of *form*, the dissolution of the old order. A map showing the nations that have been recently or are now involved in warfare verifies the declaration of John that one-fourth of the world has been given into the power of the gray horseman.

Scorpio, the sign which compels the world to pay its cosmic indebtedness, wields a terrific power for good or evil in accordance with how its forces are used. This sign carries a dual symbolism: the eagle which flies closer to the sun than any other bird and the scorpion that crawls along the ground with the sting of death in its tail. John makes frequent use of this second aspect of Scorpio as it is manifesting on our planet today.

It is of vital significance to note that dictators of totalitarian states were or are prominently centered in the dominant warring influence of Scorpio. True it is that the stars mark the course of human pilgrimage. One who apprehends the meaning of that pilgrimage can read a clear message in their flaming script.

Hitler was born with the last degrees of Libra on the Ascendant. In early manhood he came directly under the Scorpio influence. As he had a grouping of planets in Taurus, he was definitely a fixed Scorpio-Taurus type. The Third Reich, formed and dominated by his martial will, recognized no law higher than material night in its national policies and ambitions. As this same influence became operative through other personalities in positions of national leadership, the terror of subjugation spread to smaller nations the world over.

Hitler's Axis partner, Mussolini, had Scorpio's influence still more prominently on the Ascendant. The forces of Mars and Saturn opposed the Scorpion from the seventh house — the house of public relations including those with other nations — revealing plainly the ruthlessness that characterized this dictator and his war machine.

Stalin of Red Russia bears the signature of Scorpio upon his tenth house, obscuring the Venus influence resident there. The opposing forces of Pluto and Saturn from the fourth or home house describe his subtle and sinister way of dealing with intimates who move contrary to his will.

The Spanish dictator, Francesco Franco, also had Scorpio on the Ascendant at the time of birth, with Uranus, the planet of chaos and

## BOOK OF REVELATION and the WORLD CRISIS

The current reaping of previous sowing in the life of nations is too extensive a subject to be dealt with in any detail. It is worth noting, however, that Belgium's tragic fate in World War I and after was traceable in part to the terrible atrocities committed by that nation in the Congo. The sad plight of Germany followed upon the choice she made in allying herself with forces that are dominantly materialistic. Russia is paying for remaining deaf to her high calling of Brotherhood and true comradship and for her continued aggressive demonstrations. France has paid heavily for crimes of the Napoleonic era. She now experiences political subserviency following surrender of high spiritual values to the dictates and desires of the purely personal self.

With the loss of a million lives Spain cancelled something of her appaling causation generated during the Inquisition and by crimes perpetrated during her conquest of the New World. England is not escaping repercussions from her exploitation of colonials and her broken pledges in the Near East. Both Italy and Japan are in the process of reaping where they have sowed in violating ruthlessly the sanctity of weaker nations. Poland is again dominated because she has not yet learned the lesson of proper consideration for minorities. The eagerness with which she pounced upon helpless Czechoslovakia and in annexing the Tsjechen area so weakened her that she was unable to defend herself against aggression.

Austria played a high-handed game with Serbia and in turn became the victim of another country's imperial ambitions. India's aspirations to freedom will never be fully realized until she completely releases from bondage the millions of untouchables so long held in subjection.

Nor are we as a nation guiltless. We incurred a great debt, far from liquidation, by driving the American Indian into literal concentration camps and putting Negroes under the yoke of slavery. Our failure to support the ideal of collective security, and to assume our fair share of responsibility for international law and order after the first World War, reacts upon us in the form of local, national and international violence and anarchy, the end of which is not yet in sight.

As the seals of John's Book of Vision are opened, the reader is filled with amazement and awe at the close analogy between the events described therein and those of the present day. The daily press and Revelation practically parallel one another.

Throughout Revelation John draws two distinct pictures: one in black outlining the path of the transgressor, the other in luminous white marking the path of the redeemed. The servants of God (Good) are surrounded with an aura of protection. They are immune to fire, pestilence and plague, the inheritance of those who bear the mark of the beast (material living).

We who live in these fateful days are the confused, suffering and battling multitudes of which John speaks. Some bear the mark of the Christ; others, the mark of the beast. The former are drawn spiritward; the latter are enamoured of the world. Yet in both groups there is a mingling of light and darkness, so all must submit to the process of purgation before attaining spiritualization. The sorting is not so simple as God vs. demon. The choice is determined by an individual's outreaching toward things of the spirit or in-drawing for self-gratification. ## THE HEBREW APLHABET

## A Series of Cosmic Glyphs

The eleventh letter of the alphabet is Kaph and its keyword is

Strength.

The first ten letters outline the Way of Attainment. With the eleventh begins the tests and experiences necessary to enable one to become "One of the Way." Remember that early Christians were so designated and for the above reason. Every disciple, ancient or modern, must walk the same Path. This Path is outlined and described by the mystic meanings of these twenty-two Hebrew letters. Hence, as we proceed we realize increasingly their importance to an adequate understanding of the truths concealed within their biblical names.

Numerically, Kaph is Eleven (11), the number of mastery through equilibrium when the higher nature (Mary) is in the ascendancy; the number of separation and degeneracy when the lower feminine (Mary Magdalene) holds sway. For ages humanity has lived under the dominance of the latter, with the present world chaos as the result. In other words, when mind is united with spirit, the higher feminine comes into expression and the higher aspects of Eleven manifest. When mind is chained to the desire or emotional nature, the lower feminine controls and the baser aspects of Eleven show forth.

All Temples of Enlightenment have their two columns (11) — one black, the other white — between which a disciple must pass at a specific stage of his progression. These, the Yachim and Boaz of Masonry, are

represented by Kaph.

Its Tarot figure is a maiden fearlessly closing the mouth of a lion, typifying ultimate higher attainment. The two contrasting columns represent the opposing natures that both attract and repel each other.

Cosmically, Kaph is the magnetic urge which becomes the drive of action in human life. The lower operates in isolation and separation until, through sorrow and suffering from misdeeds and their inevitable reactions, soul-wisdom is born and the lower is transmuted into the higher.

The biblical Mary Magdalene is one of the most beautiful examples of this wonderful transformation. When the powers misused by the lower nature are redeemed and united with those of the higher nature, the two columns (11) become the columns of Love and Wisdom. Then the strength of Kaph becomes the power to bless and heal.

Physiologically, Kaph is one of the double letters and represents hands in the act of holding. The hand is a channel for the inflow and

outflow of spiritual power; the attitude of holding suggests its keyword, Strength.

Kaph is correlated astrologically to Saturn.

Its keynote is D Major, the tone of its exaltation sign.

The vibratory rhythms of both C and K belong to Kaph. C contacts more of the outer world forces; K contacts the inner world rhythms.

## Art As a Mediator Between Races

In 1946 a handful of business and professional men in the university town of Princeton, N. J., organized an interracial art center "where races and economic levels could forget their differences in working together." A successful Negro artist is its director. The center holds an annual art exhibit which has found wide community acceptance. Among other prominent Pricetonian entrants in the last showing was Margot Einstein, the daughter of the physicist. The harmonizing influence of such an institution is of no little importance when considering the fact that a fourth of Princeton's population is colored.

### NEGRO COMPOSER WINS HIGHEST AWARD

When the Music Critics' Circle of New York met last January to vote its awards for the best new composers in various classes heard in the previous fifteen months, it cited as the most interesting orchestral composition a symphony by the American Negro composer, Howard Swanson.

"This vote has special interest," commented Olin Downs in the New York Times, "Because it was the first season in which the Music Critics' Circle had broadened from a national to an international perspective its rules for the annual bestowal of awards."

## TRANSITION MARY GRAY

Another Light Bearer was removed from our midst with the recent passing of Mary Gray, author, teacher and lecturer on Oriental Philosophy and Christian Mysticism. More than that, she was a "doer of the word."

Mrs. Gray was born in France, lived in the United States, became a resident of Ojai, California and Cambridge, Mass., but traveled the world over. For half a century she studied and taught in almost all the principal countries of the East and West and in numerous less known lands in Africa, the Near East and the islands of the sea.

In 1919 she founded the School of the Open Gate in Hollywood; in 1935 the Gateway School in Ojai; and in 1949 the St. Francis Book Center in Ventura, California. Her school in Ojai was the first Theosophical Center in that community, and Krishnamurti came to America the first time as

her guest.

Mary Gray was a close friend of Annie Besant, whom she went to India to see before her passing. In earlier days of her Theosophical activity she was for a year manager of Krotona in Hollywood. For the last fifteen years of her life she was particularly active as a lecturer in the British Isles, speaking on education, philosophy and Anglo-American cooperation. She also used the radio for speaking on such subjects as World Police for International Order, The Mission of Spiritual Centers in the World Crisis, Spiritual Significance of War and other vital vital topics.

Among her more important writings are The Gateway of Liberation, Echoes of the Cosmic Song, The Temple of Amon Ra, Heavenly Choristers,

The Chalice of the Heart and Spiritual Laws.

Through her spoken and written word and manifested ideals in her life, Mary Gray left the world a precious heritage, the influence of which cannot be estimated. Her life was motivated by the great ideals of serving humanity and helping to bring about that Universal Brotherhood, without which there can be no true happiness.

#### DEATH OF THE BODY IN RELATION TO THE LIFE OF THE SOUL

"To the initiated, the very death of the body was proof of the immortality of the soul; for it signified that separation in which a stronger nature deserted a weaker. The body and the soul are likened to two runners, the first being subject to fatigue, but the second tireless. For a little while they keep abreast of each other. The body, however, having exhausted the vitality that had been loaned to it, soon lagged behind; but the soul, being tireless because its vitality was inherent, rapidly outdistanced the body which was forced eventually to discontinue the unequal struggle because of exhaustion. Thus, while it is natural for forms to perish, it is also natural for the soul to continue in a vital state for a long period of time, by rational unfoldment gradually inclining towards spirit until it finally mingles its own essence with those of immortality. In Platonism we find the soul continually engendering forms and, after having accomplished the purposes for which the forms were designed, casting them aside to redirectionalize its own enregies. The Greeks held that both life and death were administered by the soul, declaring that so-called acts of Providence were but the will of the soul for the body which it had fashioned and of whose destiny it was the arbiter." -Manly P. MAN ANSWERS DEATH—An Anthology of Poetry Edited by Corliss Lamont. Cloth. 294 pp \$4.50. Introduction by Louis Untermeyer.

From centuries of poetic inspiration Corliss Lamont has culled a truly fine collection of verses expressive of the materialistic tenet that there is no life after so-called death. It goes without saying that we give hearty endorsement to this volume as poetry, and we agree with its philosophy of making the most of Here and Now; but we do not subscribe to the deathends-all conclusion of either the compiler or his selections.

YOU, A SELF-IMPRISONED MASTER. Alberta Highlands. The Christopher Publishing House, 1140 Columbus Ave., Boston 20, Mass. Leatherette on boards. 144 pp. \$2.00.

What one subject is most vital to (1) the individual, (2) city, state, nation, (3) the world? The answer appears above the portal of the Greek Temple at Delphi: MAN, KNOW THYSELF. Too many books cannot be written on this all-important theme and too much study cannot be given to it, so we are happy to present another inspired volume for your consideration. Yours the privilege and power for remaking the world, whether the personal or collective world. As one God-Man started a widespread spiritual revolution two thousand years ago, so can a few God-like men fulfill its promise in this day and age through releasing the "SELF-IMPRISONED MASTER." Alberta Highlands presents many new suggestions for developing a technique to this end.

A compilation of "psychic information on world affairs," from the readings of Edgar Cayce, ranging from 1932 to 1945.

GOD WITHIN AND GOD UNFOLDED. Flower Newhouse. Inspiration Magazine, Box 116, Vista, Calif. Paper. 31 pp. Fifty cents.

It is breath-taking the amount of printed material pouring into the channels of distribution on the Godhood of man. From sources old and new, known and previously unknown, come the products of inspiration on this predominiant subject, and we are enthusiastic in welcoming them as harbingers of a nobler humanity and better conditions in the making.

In this spirit we call attention to God Within and God Unfolded, the latest of this author's writings designed to call forth the God-self in so-called "common clay."

HIDDEN SPLENDOUR by Margaret Irwin. The Christopher Pub. House, 1140 Columbus Ave., Boston 20, Mass. Cloth. 177 pp. 1952. \$2.25.

The keynote of this book is found in its introductory quotation from Browning:

"There is an inmost center in us all where truth abides in fullness."

Each chapter is a gem of wisdom. Most of them are signed by the high source of projection, and all of them point out self-disciplinary practices whereby "the imprisoned splendour may escape." Whether at a desk, a forge or a cradle, self-help may be applied by such simple steps.

SPINOZA DICTIONARY. Edited by Dagobert D. Runes. Philosophical Library, Inc., 15 E. 40th St., N. Y. 16. Foreword by Albert Einstein. Cloth. 309 pp. \$5.00.

The influence of this seventeenth century master mind on the thinking world is incalculable — and would be greater were his works more widely understood. That they may be, Editor Runes has brought together quotations from various Spinoza writings on a common subject and listed them under a common heading, all alphabetically arranged for easy reference. He introduces his volume with a short biographical sketch which highlights the background from which Spinoza emerged. The book is a real contribution to philosophical literature and a find for either student or casual reader.

YOUR INDWELLING PRESENCE. E. Wesley King. Willing Pub. Co., Box 51, San Gabriel, Calif. Cloth. 215 pp. 1951. \$3.00.

If an earnest young person should suddenly ask you, "What is the Christ Consciousness?" could you give an answer that would satisfy? Have you ever wondered how you would recognize a Master? Or what power one lone individual, yourself, has for bringing order out of present-day world chaos? Such vital questions call for answers that are as uninvolved as they are comprehensive.

The need for a clear understanding of essential wisdom teaching and its commonly used terminology has been met by this author. The subject material will focus one's own thinking and will clarify basic concepts for the individual who is just beginning his search for Truth.

THE CONQUEST OF MIND, The Science of Mental Health, Spiritual Development and Leadership. Frank M. Bazl. DeVorss & Co., 520 W. 9th St., Los Angeles 15, Calif. 523 pp plus a 31p topical index, Foreword and Table of Contents. Was \$6.00, now \$5.00. Pub. 1951.

The one attribute wherein humanity transcends all other earthly kingdoms is its power of thought. And thus it follows that "As a man thinketh so is he." In orderly sequence comes the next statement: No nation or race can be greater than its individual units, nor can the world be better than its component parts.

YOUR DAYS ARE NUMBERED. By Florence Evylinn Campbell, M. A. Pub. by Tora, Inc. 682 Arber Drive, Hollywood Calif. \$3.50; postpaid \$3.65.

Students and teachers of the sacred science of numbers will rejoice in the re-publication of this work which has been out of print for some time. It is generally recognized as one of the finest treatises available on the subject.

Here is an invaluable aid in coming to a better understanding of one's self, one's innate nature, gifts and capacities. It also helps a person to know other people better with the rewarding results of ever happier and more harmonius relations.

MID.CENTURY APPRAISAL OF CIVILIZATION. Willis D. P. Warren. Philosophical Library, Inc., 15 E. 40th St., New York 16, N. Y. Cloth. 80 pp. \$3.75.

A study of the graphs in this book would incline the student to become quite pessimistic about our present civilization. They do, indeed, provide food for serious thought, especially when one learns that in the last half century religious bodies have increased their expenditures from about eighteen billion dollars to two hundred and twenty billion while the divorce rate has jumped from less than one per cent to over four per cent. This raises a question: were the huge sums invested in the religious field put to as wise a use as they might have been?

Similar trends are depicted in other fields of our national life with startling effect—the most startling, perhaps, being the drop in our economic security, which makes us realize more definitely that the only security is

security in Truth.

MANNA. Emma K. Yingling. The Christopher Publishing House, 1140 Columbus Ave., Boston 20, Mass. Cloth. 78 pp. \$1.75.

As Corinne Heline so emphatically maintains, the Bible is the greatest of all Wisdom literature but the least understood. Apparently, Emma Yingling was motivated by the same realization for in her book she interprets, in the light of deep insight and spiritual sensitivity, certain selected phases of biblical teachings. And she sends the volume forth as Manna for hungering humanity.

This woman, who was president of the Professional Directors of Religious Education of Greater Boston for four years, and is a member of the Women's New England Press Association, the Professional Women's Club and the Boston Authors Club, is exceptionally well qualified for her self-posed task of making survival after death both plausible and practical. She weaves her convictions into a tapestry that is truly of eternity: strong in substance, fine in texture, artistic in coloring. Dr. Leonard Carmichael of Tufts College writes in his introduction to the book: "Mrs. Friend has performed a definite service in again calling our attention to a great and insistent problem. The answer to this question may indeed be fundamental in our whole legal, ethical and moral system."

IN THE LIGHT OF THE ORIENT. Lowell Paul Wadle, D.D., 218 Mira

Mar, Long Beach, Calif. Paper. 28 pp. \$.50.

This booklet is a compilation of direct statements, numbered for easy reference, outlining progressive requirements for living the spiritual life. Section One is given over to Gnostic Aphorisms patterned after Patanjali; Section Two, to an outlining of the preliminary steps; Section Three, to the functions and discipline of mental processes; Section Four, ditto of action.

This small brochure can be best described, perhaps, as a recipe for spiritual attainment, each ingredient having been carefully selected and

then all combined with consummate skill.

## Occult Anatomy and the Bible

One of the seven keys to the veiled content of the Bible is the anatomical. Biblical grounds for this statement rest on the declaration in Genesis that God created man in His own image and likeness.
