FLYING OBJECT STORY 'HOAX' DENIED--Great Falls, Mont. (UPI)--The Malmstrom Air Force Base Information Office Tuesday denied published reports that the Air Force had concluded the Canyon Ferry "flying object" was an attempt by older children to frighten younger ones. An Air Force spokesman said, "We are not in a position at this time to say whether it was a hoax, a prank, or anything else." The five man evaluation team he said, that flew to the scene where the unidentified flying object was allegedly seen by several youngsters, will submit its findings to the Project Blue Book officer at Air Force Headquarters in Washington, D.C. The information spokesman said that office will further investigate and evaluate the case and was expected to have some conclusions at some future date. Credit: Mr. Carol Honey.

UNIDENTIFIED OBJECT REPORTED IN BADLANDS NEAR BURLINGTON--Burlington, Wyo. (UPI)--Seven persons, including the Big Horn county sheriff, spotted an unidentified object in a badlands area near Burlington late Monday which blinded them with a powerful light. Sheriff L.C. Brinkerhoff said Gary Brown and Richard Briggs, two Burlington teenagers, reported having seen an unidentified flying object near a pasture late Sunday. Brinkerhoff said himself, Harvey Balison of the Basin Republican-Rustler newspaper, Dr. Walter Fallon and Jim Haycock, all of Basin, accompanied Brown and Briggs, and an unidentified teenager to the area late Monday. "We saw something very strange, but I couldn't say what it was," Brinkerhoff said. He said it was raining and mud was thick off the highway. He said it was impossible to get to where the object was spotted because of the mud and rugged terrain. "But no wheeled vehicle could have been traveling across the surface of the ground that fast in that mud," Brinkerhoff said. "It stopped real sudden when I was driving more than 60 miles an hour (on the highway), then took off again." The Sheriff said he had an aircraft landing light on his car he uses for a spotlight. "It's good for 3,000 yards, and I turned it on. Then whatever it was shined the brightest light I ever saw into our car. It was 10 or 15 times as bright as my landing light."

The Burlington teenagers said they had been looking for stray cows in an isolated area near a pasture late Sunday. They said they heard shrill sounds overhead and from what seemed to be three different directions at once. They said they loomed over the pasture and saw a "greenish-blue glow." They said the object was on the ground, went into the air at about an 80-degree angle, and then came back down. Balison said that according to the boys, the object they saw late Sunday was the same as seen late Monday. "We couldn't find any evidence of anything having been there," Balison said, "and then as we were leaving--over in another field about a mile from where they had seen this one Sunday night--we saw this glow over there. We watched for quite a while, and it seemed to have a center object that was a brighter light than the rest of it," he said. He said when Brinkerhoff shined his spotlight, "whatever this object was turned a spotlight on us and it lit up the whole inside of the car. I

never saw anything like that," Balison said, "we couldn't get closer because the roads were just mud." Balison said the light would disappear then come back on, until "finally it went out and stayed out quite a while. We gave up and went back to town. We don't know what it was." He said none of the shrill sounds described by the boys were heard late Monday. "There's absolutely nothing that's supposed to be in there," Balison said. "It's just grazing land that's deserted. UFO ZOOMS FROM NEAR RT. 90 INTERCHANGE--An unidentified flying object near Geneva on Interstate 90 was reported to the Ohio State Highway Patrol at 11:51 p.m. Friday, the Patrol said. According to the Patrol's report a resident of Long Beach, Calif., eastbound on Rt. 90, observed a large object on the ground in the bushes on the south side of the eastbound lane between Rt. 534 and Rt. 45. It was the size of a big tractor trailer truck, he said. The caller said the object changed color, turning to a bright orange or flame color, hovered about eight feet off the ground and then took off and soared to about 300 to 400 feet. At this point the flame color became a blur and zoomed into the sky. This happened about 11:30 p.m. The motorist said a driver of a semi-trailer rig also saw the UFO and stopped. The Californian called the Patrol from a pay station near a service station on Rt. 45, the Patrol said...Ohio Highway Patrol Sgt. Rizzo Lisban, duty officer for the Ashtabula area, said a geiger counter recorded slight activity at the spot pointed out by the men, who were described by police as being perfectly sincere in their stories. STRANGE FLYING OBJECT REPORT STIRS RESIDENTS OF RIO VISTA--Reports of a flying object ran rampant in Rio Vista Thursday of last week. Many persons have reported seeing such a space vehicle touch down near the Rio Vista airport Wednesday night. Scorched earth, where the craft is said to have landed before again taking flight, was reported in the area. A Rio Vista police squad and Air Force officers are said to be investigating the incident. The appearance--broadcast on radio news--was first reported to KKIS station by a woman who is a teacher in the Rio Vista schools and who lives near the location where the object is supposed to have landed. Interviewed by the Tribune, she asked her name be withheld because of the ridicule usually heaped on the head of anyone who suggests seriously they have seen such a craft. She described the flying object as being "in the shape of a banana, flattened and thin, not circular, belching fire and streaks along its under side. "It had two white lights," she declared, "and came down close to the ground, hovering or touching the earth, then took off in a red haze at great speed. Next day several members of my own teenage class reported seeing it as did the wife of an official of the Rio Vista school system. At least a dozen neighbors in the vicinity also sighted the strange occurrence. "Crowds of Rio Vista people have gone out to see where the earth was scorched but someone has covered the spot over with a canvas. That some new and strange flying object touched down at Rio Vista there can be no doubt.

Police department headquarters in Rio Vista advised the Tribune it was investigating the incident and later sent a squad of officers to the scene. A trusted observer, however, was on the scene when the officers arrived and told the Tribune they took the investigation lightly and looked around with considerable jollity. "Bring on those little green men," was their attitude. "We want to meet them." An official of the Rio Vista Chamber of Commerce indicated he would head a welcoming committee to greet any visitors from outer space--provided they come to the river town peacefully. REPORTS FLYING OBJECT--A flying object was reported over Walsenburg about 5 p.m. last Friday. The local man who said he saw it is Ross Quintana, custodian at the Lenzini Motor Company. He told the Huerfano World the experience left him all "shook up." Quintana declared he was in his car, which was stopped for a train to pass on the Main Street railroad crossing, when he saw the strange object in the sky north of him and apparently preparing to land on the hill facing Hill School. But he added that he lost track of the object after a few minutes because of trees in his line of vision. The object was described as huge, white, and very shiny and coming in from the west. He added that it had what seemed to be a hook near the bottom. Quintana could not hear any noise associated with the object, possibly because of the passing train. In relating his experience, Quintana said he had planned to drive over to the area where the object appeared to be landing but he didn't get around to it at that time. The next morning, however, he did go to the area and reported that he saw a V-shaped hole in the ground but did not know if it had been made by the strange object he had seen the previous evening. 'HOT' OBJECT IS REPORTED NEAR BRIDGER--A "hot" falling object, called a "fireball" by the man who reported its descent, was noted in the area 20 miles south of Fort Bridger airport Thursday about 10:00 p.m. The man, identified only as Mr. Carpenter, said the burning and falling object burned brighter as it drew closer to the earth, and he reported he felt the heat on his face. It appeared to go down in the vicinity of the Federal Aviation Agency broadcast "homer" south of Fort Bridger, according to Carpenter. Questioned Friday, FAA personnel said the radar stations on Aspen Mt., 15 miles south of Rock Springs airport, and on Francis Peak, 30 miles southeast of Ogden, had indicated nothing on their monitors at that time; The Salt Lake City FAA center reported no missing or overdue aircraft at that time, either. FAMILIES SEE OBJECT IN WYOMING SKY--Green River, Wyo.--Two families peered into the sky here Thursday evening while a "silvery, shining, round" object hovered high over their heads for about 30 minutes. "We saw something--whether it was a flying object, we don't know," said Mrs. James Pace. "But we're not imaginative people." Mrs. Pace told the Desert News that she, her husband and two of her children were on the front lawn with a neighbor family, Mr. & Mrs. Robert Cameron, about 7 p.m. They were watching two airplanes--a commercial craft and a smaller private plane--cross paths in the sky, when the children pointed higher in the sky and shouted: "There's another flying object, just like the one we saw yesterday in school." Mrs. Pace had dismissed her children's stories of flying objects over the schoolyard the day before as creations of "kids' imaginations." Mr. Pace focused binoculars on the object in the sky and viewed a "shining, round light," standing on its edge like a silver dollar. It was very high in the sky, Mrs. Pace said. The Paces theorized the shiny effect was merely a reflection of the sun's light. After the Paces and Camerons viewed the object, which appeared to be hovering, for about one-half hour, dark storm clouds obscured it. "The day before when the kids were talking about flying objects, I thought they were just making it up," Mrs. Pace said. "Then I read in the Desert News of reported object sightings. I started questioning my children a little closer!" Mrs. Pace found that children throughout the neighborhood and those attending nearby Roosevelt Elementary School had reported viewing unidentified flying objects Thursday. LAKESIDE WOMAN SCARED BY 'BOUNCING OBJECT'--El Paso today had its first "flying object" scare of the spring season. Mrs. R.R. Reyes, of Lakeside, said she spotted a bright, shiny object which looked like an inverted dish plate hovering over her home this morning about 10:15 a.m. "It scared the hell out of me," said Mrs. Reyes with intense feeling. "I was just about to sit down and look at my favorite television program," Mrs. Reyes said. "I glanced out the window to see what the weather was like and I saw this bright aluminum thing up about as high as a telephone pole. "It really caught the light. At that distance it appeared to be about the size of a living room drum table, but I believe it was really much bigger, although smaller than an airplane." Mrs. Reyes said the object remained stationary for a few minutes, bounced up and down like a top, and slowly rose into the air towards Ascarate Lake. She said it made no sound at all. On first sighting the object, Mrs. Reyes called to her niece, Estella Reyes, and her six-year-old daughter, Elizabeth, to "come and look." She said they both saw the flying object in the air. "It looked like a dish plate upside down and spun away just like a plate would spin if you flung it into the air," Mrs. Reyes said. "It carried a light on the bottom, a bright light. I'm really suprised. I never expected to see anything like that around here. My husband and I had talked about the thing the people saw in New Mexico, but I didn't think I would ever see anything like that here. I'm still shaking," she said. RAWLINS MAN REPORTS SEEING UFO WEDNESDAY--A blinding flash of light followed by an egg-shaped object was reported sighted in the Rawlins area early Wednesday morning. Carl Hockman, an engineer for the Union Pacific railroad, sighted the flash between Rawlins and Creston Junction at 12:55 a.m. He said his train was stopped because of a turbine failure and while he was waiting for repairmen to arrive he saw the object while looking out the window to the north. He said he saw a tremendous white flash and then an egg-shaped ball of fire which appeared to descend behind a hill about a mile and one-half from the railroad track just north of Cherokee. He said a fireman, Norman Peterson, also saw the object as did Glen Wilkey and Tom McTamany of the repair crew. Hockman added he did not think the object was a meteorite because he has seen a number of them in the past. FLYING OBJECT IS SPOTTED OVER SPRINGS--Rock Springs school children sighted what appeared to be a circular, disk-shaped object in the western sky Wednesday. The object, described as bright in the sky with a halo around it, was visible Wednesday evening before it was obscured by a cloud. Roger Travis, Tim Macy, Bill Melton, Ricky McIntosh, Dan Zancanella, Leon Doan, Bill Hoff and Bob Fuller, students, watched the object through a telescope belonging to Travis. Richard Surline, junior high school teacher, and Keith Boyce also saw the object. "It looked like a black, flat disk at first," Surline said. "Then it gained altitude and turned silver. Keith Boyce called me at about 12:30 p.m. to ask me if I had seen it. I watched it until about 2:30 p.m. It was definitely higher than jet trails in the sky." The boys stated that the object seemed to turn, and present a flat side and an edge, and

that light came out of the sides of the object. Jack Hansen, another student, reported 10 persons in his group, watched the object; overhead to the west, and described it as egg-shaped, wobbling, green in color, and then turning to silver, before it disappeared. Mrs. De Weese did not see the object at that time, but about 10:45 p.m., after they had taken Mrs. Martin home, she and Mrs. Rose saw two more similar sights. "It was a great big round flash of light," Mrs. De Weese said, "and then it was gone. Then another came behind it. They were both the same size and very fast." Some children were in the car. BRIGHT OBJECTS REPORTED IN SKY IN ANTHONY AREA--State Police Officer Tells Of Lights--Several persons reported seeing strange bright objects in the sky over the southeast sector of the county Tuesday night in the continuing series of Unidentified Flying Objects stories. 'FLYING OBJECT' SIGHTING REPORTED BY EIGHT CROSBY SCHOOL STUDENTS--A flying object--more like a monster--has fluttered into El Paso while a rash of unidentified flying objects were reported in New Mexico. Eight students at Crosby School saw the El Paso monster. In fact, one girl, 12, reported it to police. She said she saw it out a window of the school yesterday. "It didn't have any legs," said Kathy Boone. "It seemed to be floating in the air, covered with something like a sheet. It was about 6 feet 5 inches tall, and sort of egg-shaped. Another girl, 11, told police she had seen it too, and said six more children had witnessed the monster. Police had theories the apparition might actually have been a weather balloon coming to earth, or some sort of parachute, or something else caught in the wind, though nothing was found on the school grounds. SHERIFF NEWT PERKINS CHECKS OUT STORY OF UFO IN OUR AREA--The Ouster County Sheriff's office today investigated a report of an unidentified flying object east of Miles City. Sheriff Newt Perkins reported that several days ago two Mexican farm workers on the R.J. McAulay place at Shirley, saw something in the sky, across the river from Shirley. They said it looked like a small egg-shaped white balloon. They reported it went up and down and up and down while they were watching it. After seeing the object on two different days, they asked to borrow field glasses, but then did not see the object again. McAulay questioned them and they insisted it wasn't a plane and it was not a big bird. He assumed they must have seen a weather balloon. Sheriff Perkins also said it may have been some type of weather balloon, mentioning that the men said it did not glow or burn. He also said that the country is very rough in the area above which the object was sighted, as it was somewhere over the Haughian ranch. It would be almost impossible to do much searching for a balloon, if one fell into that isolated area. A local FAA employee reported that the regular weather balloons sent up locally are black, not white. However, radiosonde balloons sent up by the weather bureau, at Glasgow, for instance, are white. EYEWITNESS REPORTS--UFOs HAUNT D.C. SKIES--Washington area residents report that unidentified flying objects are haunting the skies again. Mr. and Mrs. Nelson Rodeffer of Colesville spotted a "very brilliant star with reddish overtones" moving against a background of fixed stars in the northern sky last Sunday night. The UFO, also observed by the Rodeffers' guests, made a "sharp left turn, then a U-turn, zig-zagged, and stood still." The object rocked, moved again, and finally "shot straight up" out of sight, the viewers reported. The maneuvers lasted for about 30 minutes, giving the Rodeffers time to call relatives and friends in Rockville, who also spotted the object. The Rodeffers called the Goddard Space Center, which confirmed that the object "could not be either satellites or weather balloons." Just prior to this, two daylight sightings were reported from the same area. The UFOs, the viewers said, were bright silvery objects with a "greenish-blue halo," flying at jet height. Like the Colesville object, they were noiseless during maneuvers. When the object paused in flight, 10-power binoculars revealed details of a "strange undercarriage," the witnesses said. Another UFO sighting was reported by Mr. and Mrs. Fred Steckling, of Washington. They had just left a department store at 11th and F-sts nw, on March 28, -- 3:20 p.m., when they said they saw a silvery object with a "three ball landing gear" plainly visible. The Stecklings estimated the UFO was at a height of about

FLYING CIGAR SEEN OVER BRIGHTON, ENGLAND--See anything in the sky about 1.20 this afternoon? Something long and cylindrical?
