Would you believe....A mysterious flying object factory high in Brazil's Andes Mountains--where Martian and earth scientists worked side-by-side--was described recently in Los Angeles by a former Air Force pilot. Many UFO sightings reported throughout the world involved craft manufactured by more than 100 scientists from 23 countries--and Mars--during the past several years, Mel Noel told an audience of a few hundred at the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics. Noel, who as an Air Force Saberjet pilot was assigned to track down flying objects reported in this country, said he was told of the secret laboratory by a university professor in Mexico. Furthermore, Noel added, he himself is scheduled to make a flight in an earth-produced flying object in November or December. The professor, whom he did not name, said he made a trip to Mars with several of the Martian scientists. Noel said he was told the laboratory stemmed from developments of Guglielmo Marconi's attempts to harness electro-magnetic forces in the atmosphere before World War II. After Marconi's death in 1937, the professor told Noel, the scientists working with him established the laboratory to continue his research. Martian space ships landed at the base, Noel said he was told, and, satisfied the scientists' endeavor were peaceful in nature, agreed to help them. Only visitors now allowed at the laboratory, Noel said, are those who renounce their citizenship and decide never to return home.

Maybe it was some of those earth made UFOs that invaded the skies over Minnesota on August 16. Mr. and Mrs. Harold Pikal saw two of the objects while fishing on West Battle Lake near Henning between 10 and 10:30. They described them as quite frightening as the first one seemed to come right at them out of nowhere. They were described as a large, misty light ball that changed colors for a moment. The UFOs appeared to hang over a beach to the north of them. A circular object with bright red, yellow and orange colors was seen by three Detroit Lakes residents about 10:30 p.m. About the same time, an "eerie" horseshoe-shaped object appeared in the Henning area. At 10:40 p.m., Jack Miller was driving near Big Mantrap Lake when he spotted an object approximately 2-3 feet in diameter, hovering a few hundred feet above the ground. He said the object appeared to follow his car. At the same time, Mr. and Mrs. Robert McDonough sighted a round, lighted object about 150 feet across which became elongated as it disappeared to the north. The sighting was made near the junction of U.S. 52 north and Olmsted 14. Mrs. McDonough said the object was lighted from inside and hovered about 300 yards from the road. "It looked like a small moon coming down to intersect with the road and seemed to be about the size of a B-52 airplane when viewed from the same distance," McDonough said. "It came down to within two telephone pole lengths from the ground. It was awesome, breathtaking and scares the hell

out of you." Radio stations in the Minneapolis-St. Paul area reported receiving approximately 75 calls from persons reporting they had seen one of the objects in the sky. Employees in the control tower at the Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport reported sighting "an object." At Flying Cloud Airport in Eden Prairie, several pilots reported an object that settled down on the east-west runway and then zoomed up and away. An egg-shaped, luminous silvery green object, moving silently just above the trees was reported by Bob Carmody, 17, and Pat Dermody, 17, as they were going east on Highway 34 between Whipholt and Walker, which measured an approximate 200 feet in diameter. A group of women in Walker also observed the huge white disc through the treetops as they were returning home. Several residents of Cass Lake sighted a peculiar light about 200 feet above the Erbe Drive-In. It was in the shape of a horseshoe. Another UFO was seen near Sleepy Eye about 10:50 p.m. First it appeared to be the moon moving out of the clouds. Then it kept descending, getting larger and larger. It appeared to be at a height of about 8,000 to 10,000 feet when suddenly the object disappeared and--poof--there was a cloud of vapor. Several persons in Rainier sighted an UFO about 11 p.m. The object hovered above the Rainier Community building and appeared larger than a water tank. The whole object was glowing a bright red which faded to a red rim around the circumference of the object.

About 11:40 p.m., residents of Ponsford observed an object which they described as being two to three feet in diameter, hovering a few feet above the ground and exhausting a blue flame. Several other reports were received but not times were given. At Hibbing an object described as a big ball was sighted by George Lehman, 14, and his friend Patrick McKenzie, 12. It glowed, turned darker in the middle, took on a horseshoe shape and then seemed to vaporize and soared away. Two UFOs were seen south of Roseau. Witnesses described the objects as looking like a moon. Then came the shocker. An eerie UFO hovered over a car in eastern Duluth, terrifying the four occupants. James Luhm, 720 Lakewood Road, the driver, said a spinning, globe-shaped object changed colors as it got to within several hundred feet above the vehicle on Lakewood Road. Luhm's said that his sister, Sally, and two nieces, Pam, 16, and Debby Lind, 14, were with him and also saw the object. They had just turned off Highway 61 onto Lakewood Road when they saw a light behind the clouds that "looked almost like the moon." As they drove on, the light dimmed but the object remained visible. Luhm joked to the other passengers, "I think the Blob is going to get us." Just then the object started to whirl and change colors, and to come toward the car. When it got within a distance of a few blocks, Luhm shoved the car into reverse, backed down the road to a driveway, turned around and headed toward the highway. Luhm and the others returned later, drove up the road a mile further, stopped and turned their lights out. This time the object raised up from behind the woods northeast of the road, and seemed to hover over the road before ascending again. The object seemed to be the size of a football field,

but that it was difficult to judge its size or its distance from the car, Luhm said. When it started spinning, he said, blue, green and faint red whirling lights could be seen. As it got closer it turned to a blue-green light, he said. Luhm noticed that as it got close to the car, the car's windows started to steam up.

During the early hours of the following morning (August 17), a farmer residing three miles east of Rice Lake, Minnesota--about 100 miles SE of Duluth--said that about 12:30 a.m. he saw an UFO as a ball of glowing yellow light emerge from the northeast, cloud height, and move in a southeasterly direction. There was no sound. His cattle, he said, became very disturbed. The light would appear, then screen out and disappear and then be seen again. "It was fascinating and frightening." At Rice Lake, reports were varied from about 15 persons who told their views of "a moon-like object glowing many colors in the heavens." Of these, the account of a Canton, Wisconsin couple who were among the first to report the incident was detailed. The farm couple, who wished to keep their identity unknown, said they were driving along a country road on the line between Barron and Rusk counties east of Cameron on August 17, when in the northern skies the object, like a "moon on a moonless night," glowed in many colors. As it approached it appeared to take on an oblong shape, they said. This was just before midnight. "It came closer and closer," said the woman. "In fact, so close my husband stopped the car and turned off the headlights. He broke out in a sweat of fear." She admitted that she too was frightened. They said the auto windshield steamed up as the object approached.

That same night three rural Duluth, Minnesota teenagers were frightened by an UFO as they were driving on the West Tischer Road between the Howard Gnesen and Rice Lake Roads. (Note: There is a Rice Lake, Minnesota and a Rice Lake, Wisconsin.) "I was scared stiff," admitted Dennis Tyo, 19, Rt. 3 Box 551-J, Arnold Road, who reported the incident to Duluth police at 10:45 p.m. Tyo, his girl friend, Bonnie Mattila, 17, and her sister, Carol, 20, were driving toward the Arnold Road when they saw a large dark object, moving northeast at a moderate speed. It appeared a few hundred yards above the ground. It carried bright orange lights that flashed on and off, Tyo said. Bonnie was crying and her sister had tears in her eyes, Tyo said. "It's one of those things that just don't happen," he declared.

The night before the UFOs zeroed in on Minnesota, they were sighted at several points in southeastern South Dakota. Highway Patrolman James Jorgensen of Tyndall was one of those seeing the unexplainable sight in the sky. Jorgensen and Patrolman Charles Nelson of Tripp were doing patrol duty at Parkston. At about 10:45, Jorgensen was alerted on the police radio by Game Warden Don Herrick of Tripp, who had seen the object over Tripp at about 10 o'clock. Jorgensen spotted the UFO over Parkston "going fast and up." It appeared about the size of a dime in the sky, with a pulsating red light around the edge and a pulsating green light above it, the patrolman said. It moved in a northeasterly direction, appearing to stop occasionally and hover and then move straight up at a fantastic speed before proceeding toward the northeast. Jorgensen called the patrol's base station at Parker and was informed that the patrolmen at Dell Rapids had also seen the UFO. Others who saw it included Chief of police Kenny Mudder of Avon and Sheriff Sid Mettler at Menno, as well

as numerous persons at Tripp, Jorgensen said. The Tripp residents who saw the object are reported to have heard a buzzing noise emanating from it. The UFO was said to be considerably lower at the time it was reported sighted at Tripp. On the following night, members of the Ray Allen family observed a "ball of fire" in a cornfield near the Flandreau, South Dakota Indian School. Several teen-agers in a car and other neighbors also watched the object about 9:45 p.m. It was described as a very large light which hovered over the field and changed colors from red to green. When the Allen children left the house for a closer look, the object moved up and away. At 11 p.m. the same night, Mr. and Mrs. Jim Fett and family were driving down a country road near Corwith, Iowa when a large and bright UFO came down from the sky and seemed to head straight for them and just seconds before it came to earth, it returned skyward and disappeared. About the same time several UFOs were reported over Sioux City and LeMars, Iowa.

Further south on the map, residents of Arkansas were seeing strange things in the sky, too. On August 15, a deluge of reports of UFOs were received between 9 p.m. and 10 p.m. by airport, law enforcement officials and radio stations in Fort Smith. At Paragould residents reported seeing what looked like a bright star traveling across the sky in an erratic pattern. The light would zoom ahead, then hover in one spot, moved up and down, and two smaller lights would break off of it, travel away, and return. Newsman Ken Beck of radio station KDRS said that he was asked to look at the UFO and he observed it moving in what he described as a "very tight circle." A couple living near Sulphur Rock watched the UFOs and said they seemed to appear in every direction and formed a ring in the sky. This activity continued into the next day with the following sightings reported to NICAP: 12:30 a.m.--Fort Smith--Formation of three UFOs in a horizontal line flying low. A total of six or seven appearances of the objects was noted between 12:30 and 1:30 a.m.; 1:15 a.m.--Fayetteville--Large UFO observed maneuvering in sky between 1:15 am and 2 a.m.; Dawn--Pine Bluff--A resident reported seeing four red UFOs, all appearing to be very high, with three arranged in a triangular formation; Night--Marvell--Many glowing objects seen in the sky. Some residents said they zoomed ahead, then hovered in one spot, moved up and down and then zoomed again; Night--Little Rock--Radio station KAAV said it received over 100 reports of weird UFOs making rapid movements and that they didn't resemble any aircraft. The objects seemed to sit still in the air, move in straight lines, make erratic changes in course and bob up and down; 8 p.m.--Forrest City--Witnesses observed a triangle-shaped group of glowing objects moving from west to east. One of the UFOs was bright and appeared to change from red to green in no particular sequence. Two dimmer objects completed the triangle. The group changed positions in relation to the larger object and crossed the sky with an erratic forward, backward motion; Later, the group of objects made a second appearance; 8:20 p.m.--Smackover--A large glowing UFO came from the northeast, made a sharp curve to the east, and flew until it was nearly out of sight. It then stopped, hovered for an instant, and vanished; 10:30 p.m.--Rogers--Several glowing objects seen in sky. Three or more darted around changing colors. Some of the UFOs emitted long shafts of white light which extended halfway across the sky. When the objects disappeared, one shot off to the north and one darted straight up, becoming smaller and smaller, finally "going out" like a lantern; 10:45 p.m.--Hiwasee--Huge UFO seen by Rev. Paul Seymore, Church of Nazarene.

A shaken Catonsville, Maryland physicist has told of seeing a large UFO that he estimated moved at 4000 miles an hour and at another time hung motionless in Prince Georges county skies. Dr. Vasil Uzunoglu, a 40-year-old electronics specialist, said the object was silent, as big as a house and equipped with lights whose colors were far more distinct than he had ever seen. "I have never seen an object like this before," he said in insisting the thing was not an airplane or conventional machine. Dr. Uzunoglu, who works for an Annapolis electronics firm, said he was driving on the Capital beltway near 11 p.m. August 1 when he first saw the phenomenon, estimated at 15,000 feet high to the west. The author of a book on a microelectronics topic said: "It had two very bright red lights and a green light. It made no noise. All of a sudden, I saw it move to the east about fifteen to twenty degrees. I estimated its speed at 4000 miles per hour." Dr. Uzunoglu said he lost the vehicle for a few minutes, then saw it again much larger and nearer the ground, perhaps 200 to 300 feet above some rooftops. "I now saw four red lights and a large yellow light. The colors and their shadings were far clearer than anything on earth," he said. He described the UFO as round at the bottom and somewhat pointed toward the top. Soon it slowly moved away, toward Alexandria, and vanished. Ten minutes elapsed between the first and last sighting. "I was so shaken I didn't know what to do," he said. One thing he couldn't do that night was sleep. "I've never had such an experience." He declined to speculate on the objects origin.

On the same day of Dr. Uzunoglu's sighting, a "terrifically huge yellowish-white UFO" was seen at Wilmington, Delaware. But the weird sound accompaniment which four residents said they heard at 1 a.m., defies all earthly classifications. "It is nothing I've ever heard except on television space pictures or chiller movies," said 18-year-old Mary Lou Eseltine of 116 Delaware Drive. Miss Eseltine also tells of going to the front window, putting on her glasses and seeing "a huge white light, like a big light bulb. It seemed to be circling. It came down and went back up, then went behind the house across the street." Mrs Doodin described the noise as a "chilling, whirring sound I'd know anywhere if I ever heard it again."

Residents near Lorain, Ohio are on an UFO alert which began about August 1. Many of the residents have seen the objects repeatedly. The UFOs have been seen quite close and some at considerable distance. When close, the objects can be heard making a humming or drone-like sound. Mrs. David Cambarare said the last time she saw one of the UFOs was about August 8.

"It was about 1:30 a.m., and I was lying in bed and reading when I heard the drone. I got up, called by daughter, Eleanore, and we watched the object for nearly two hours." Anthony Yenke said that for several nights he saw three UFOs at various heights over Plum Brook's NASA installation.

"One came toward us and that made a believer out of me right then and there." This was one of the reactions of Phil Rini, New Brighton, Pennsylvania patrolman, who was one of several persons who saw UFOs on the night of August 3. Like most people Rini was "from Missouri." "Show me," was his attitude. He was shown. Rini and Dick Rhodes, also a patrolman, were watching the sky after first laughing off calls about UFOs and then seeing them. While on routine duty the patrolmen noticed a man looking through binoculars. That's when the laughing stopped and seriousness took over. "You didn't need the glasses," Rini said, "you could see them with the naked eye." There were two "things" with flashing green and red lights. The objects stayed put for a while, then suddenly "one took off and came toward us. It seemed to come in at an angle and I never saw anything come as quick in my life," Rini said. "It got as big as a large car hub cap and the faster it came the faster the lights spun." At times it would have a red cast and later a green cast, Rini added. "It was plain as plain could be...weird." The UFO was high in the air, and as it got over the people who had gathered, "it shot off toward Beaver Falls. You could hear it humming. I was astonished...it shook me up." Later the other thing took over and seemed to go over a hill.

Reports of UFOs over Toronto, Ontario, Canada kept Metro and provincial police answering calls from citizens during the early hours of August 8. Most of the persons said they heard a strange noise that sounded as if it was coming from right over their homes but could see nothing. One man said he observed a large green object flying over the city. City police saw nothing. Metro Police Constable Alan Clark said he saw what appeared to be two stars moving slowly southward, parallel to each other with one higher than the other. Constable Clark said that after about 10 minutes they suddenly curved on a 45-degree angle toward the southeast and began moving erratically at high speed. "They were much too high up to be planes," he said. "They looked like two lights and when they started moving fast, they slithered down like a fishing lure in the water. There was no shape to their movement, although at the same time as they were moving they looked like they were looping like acrobatic aircraft."..... An important but less dramatic sighting occurred near Roxana, Delaware at about 5 a.m. August 11. Preferring to remain unidentified, the witness said he was on his way to work, driving near Roxana when a great deal of static caused him to turn his car radio down. As he did this he looked out the left window and saw a large UFO rising from the ground.

About ten flying objects were spotted in the McDonald, Ohio sky on August 13 by Mrs. Florence Krossman, 1001 Iowa Ave., her two daughters, a McDonald patrolman and nearby neighbors. Mrs. Krossman reported that the group watched the objects from about 12:45 a.m. until almost 5 a.m. The objects apparently kept a formation, although they changed so rapidly it was hard to follow, she said. One, which she believes may have been the "mother ship" was described as a "great big thing" with smaller

objects around it. "When a plane came over to the side," Mrs. Krossman said, "the small ones sort of raced toward the mother ship.".....What could have been a mass display of the so-called mother ship type UFO occurred on August 16 at Sallisaw, Oklahoma at about 11:30 p.m. Miss Pat Martin, office manager of the Sallisaw TV Cable Company gave this account of the display: "We must have located 25 to 30 large objects in the sky. Brightly shining red and green with a strip of white going between the two colors. It was evident that the objects were revolving as a small beam of light was visible. To the side of each large object was a cluster of smaller objects. At different times the larger objects would travel at a slow rate of speed, continuing to change colors, red then green. Many traveled as much as a third of the sky's orbit. They would travel in a straight line, stop, continue to travel then either turn or cease. Their shape appeared to be flat and oval or elongated."

A large silver disc about 50 feet in diameter was sighted near Ashtabula, Ohio on the afternoon of August 17. Mr. and Mrs. Helpon returned home and were greeted by their children with stories of seeing a flying object. Both parents laughed, and went about their business. Mrs. Helpon was writing a note, when she began hearing a noise. "It was like a low gas fire, a very definite humming," Mrs. Helpon said. "I didn't investigate it, but kept hearing it. About four minutes later, the kids ran in and told me it was out there again. I went out and looked over our lot. There it was. It was no more than 1000 feet away, over the trees. It was about 50 feet in diameter and was silvery." Mrs. Helpon said that the disc hovered there briefly, then dove down and to the right. It was the last time they saw it.

The so-called monster reportedly seen on the Erie, Pennsylvania Peninsula in July (NICAP REPORTER--September, 1966) has been reportedly seen at Edinboro, Pennsylvania just a few miles south of Erie. Brett Rutherford, of Edinboro and six other witnesses saw "a creature" near Edinboro Lake August 17. Rutherford claimed the figure resembled the drawing made by a Jamestown, New York girl who said a creature of indefinite shape approached the car she was sitting in after seeing a UFO land nearby. The six-foot-tall "person or thing" was seen by the seven on a peninsula jutting into swampy area at the north end of the lake. The witnesses fired at the figure on two occasions with the weapons they had taken along, Rutherford said. Apparently the so-called creature was not hit. Another report of a so-called monster comes from the outlying areas of Malvern, Arkansas by five persons. Additional confirmation of the reports came from Fabar Mills, a Malvern merchant. Sightings were reported from between 20 and 500 feet. "There is something very different from our form of life roaming around Malvern," Mills said. Reports came in first on August 22 of seeing a strange "thing" about 8 feet tall and changing in color from red to orange to yellow. This was six days after UFOs were seen in the area. Observation of the "thing" was made simultaneously by two reliable persons. Mr. Mills said he was able to snap a picture of the "thing" from his window. The local newspaper said they would release the photo as soon as it is cleared by authorities.

A glowing object, hovering for a moment and then fliding silently away, was sighted by Mrs. Eva Steele of 2428 Avalon Drive, Sacramento, Calif. on August 18. "It passed over the treetops in my neighbors yard, turned

around and then came back and hovered for several seconds," she said. "It stood still as if it were looking at the colored lights in the yard. It was all lit up underneath and seemed to pick up the yard lights of different colors. It was circular and not too far above the trees. Then it went back the same way it had come, from the east. I didn't hear a sound. It didn't scare me but it made me feel kind of queer not knowing what it was." A Sacramento radio station received several calls describing an object of the same nature. Officials at Mather Air Force Base said one man called Mather, near Sacramento, and said he saw a yellowish, oval-shaped object above the northern horizon about 9:35 p.m. as he drove along Interstate 80. It was silent and stationary.

Just after dark on August 18 attorney Harry S. McAlpin and his family were in their yard, talking about UFOs. Someone looked up and there was a mysterious airborne object, "moving so fast--a plane couldn't cover that much sky," McAlpin said. The McAlpins' sighting of the UFOs was one of a number of flying objects reported to Jefferson County police during the night. The air tower at Standiford Field also reported several sightings by pilots. Police who checked with Standiford said a plane reported that it had been followed by an object as far as Cincinnati. McAlpin, who lives at 13321 Aiken Road, Anchorage, Kentucky, said that his family went to bed but that he remained in the yard. "About 11 p.m. I saw another one. I went in and got everyone up. They all ran out and everyone saw it, moving behind a tree and then into an opening between the trees." He said the object hovered "clearly in view" but at a considerable distance from the house. "To me it looked like a top. There seemed to be a pointed bottom that was red and the upper, wider part changed from green to white." Police dispatcher George Schweinbeck said he received "four or five" calls of sightings. One of the callers saw a bright light over a pasture, illuminating cattle and changing colors.

A College Hill, Pennsylvania family is certain that the huge orange-red object they spotted in the sky on August 22 about 10:15 p.m. was a flying object. Mrs. W. Stewart Hughes, 501 McCartney St., had just picked up her daughter and was traveling west when she saw what she described as "a flaming object in the sky." Stopping the car, Mrs. Hughes and her passengers watched the object move back and forth in the sky. "All of a sudden it seemed to come right for us, so I told the children we were going to get out of here," Mrs. Hughes said. Mrs. Hughes said that when the object made a turn, she was able to get a good side view of it. "It looked like a great big half of a grapefruit and underneath there seemed to be a fine mist." She said the UFO hovered in the area for about 10 minutes and then took off straight up, disappearing in a matter of seconds.

Karen Claussen, 10-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Vic Claussen of Anita, Iowa is sure that she saw a flying object near her home on August 29. It appeared to gently settle down and land in a nearby cornfield. She described the object as egg-shaped, a bluish-gray color, with at least four very bright red and blue lights. It had several darker blue stripes and made an eerie, echoing hollow sound like loud humming. The noise was so loud it hurt her ears. At first she thought it was a meteor, then it came lower and lower until she got a good look at it. Karen was

unable to estimate the size of the UFO. It appears that no one else actually saw the UFO, but a neighbor heard the noise. Karen's mother heard the sound just briefly, and Marin Fries, local newspaper advertising manager, heard it also. Fries heard the noise for a reasonable prolonged length of time and said it sounded just like the wavy humming noise the science-fiction movies use for their carriers from outer space. His first thought was a flying object. Karen was so hysterical and incoherent that her mother could get only fragments of what she was saying. The incident occurred between 7:30 and 8 p.m.
