

Eat What You Love. * *

Expression is life; repression is death. Love is expression. Fear is repression. Choice under love gives free expression to life. Choice under necessity represses life. Whatever is done without love causes life to withdraw from some cells of the body and these cells die; dead cells poison the body; this is disease. What is done in love stimulates Life's expression. Love and health, fear and disease are cause and consequence. Apply this thought to the question of food and there is but one possible answer. Eat the food you love. As much Love as is mixed with food so much benefit to the body.

The Ego knows what it wants. The blacksmith cannot advise tools or themes for the poet, neither can the hygienist advise food for an Ego that wishes brain cells for a purpose only known to itself.

Thought-expression in moulding a statue requires clay; sub-conscious thought in moulding body requires food. By experience I am led to choose the clay; by the stored up experiences of the race and by desire, which is the cry of the Sub-conscious Intelligence, the food is chosen. Both body and statue exist in Thought before they can have an objective expression. One is the expression of conscious and the other of Sub-conscious Thought. Conscious Thought chooses material for statue; Sub-conscious Thought chooses material for body. Obedience to this Sub-conscious Thought is health; disobedience is disease.

Body is an organism, and grows as an expression of the Self, is made from the

Self. A machine is made by the Self from that which is not Self.

Directions in food selection are efforts in Thought of body as a machine. Once one realizes that each body is an organism directed and built from within the occupation of the food reformer is gone, and mankind for the first time since he was savage is free to live and to enjoy.

Body is materialized Mind. Science recognizes all worlds as materialized from Ultimate Reality. Spirit, or Mind, is that Ultimate Reality. Body is materialized Mind. As well direct this Ultimate Reality what to use in building a world as to advise it what to use in building a body.

The results from same food varies with different individuals. Results differ as does the Thought of the eaters. One really eats the Thought which accompanies the food. Thought is Force, and Thought is the only Force one can use in and through the body. After breakfast of steak three men go out to *think*. One sees the ocean and paints a picture; one sees an over-burdened man and invents a labor-saving machine; one sees a beautiful woman and writes a love song. Did ocean, burden or woman enter from without into the intellectual or spiritual life of these men, or was that which was already in the man merely called into expression? This process is identical with the swinging of an Indian club. Strength is always in the man; club, ocean, burden and woman, merely called into expression, already existing possibilities. There is no less to club, ocean, burden or woman, than before. From the Self, song, picture, invention and body have materialized. As club has lost nothing through this use, so food has lost nothing. The force in the food returns to the Universal after being used. Using it the Ego has called into expression a body. If this is not true, modern metaphysics is false.

As there is choice of material and methods to the gymnast; choice of scen-

ery to painter; and choice of women to poet; and since only that which is loved, can call forth expression, so is there choice of food to the hungry. As one trusts himself in the other cases so he is to trust himself in regard to food. "She whom my soul loveth", has a meaning even in the choice of food.

It is not to be inferred from these articles that the diet of the average person does not need to be changed. There is a most pressing need of dietetic reform. But the change is not so much in the food as in the *Thought that accompanies the food*. Food is eaten for so many other reasons than from love of it. Food selected from habit, cheapness, wholesomeness, or because it is custom, easy to obtain, because it is a fad, is recommended, prescribed, or for any other reason than because the individual *loves* it, is disease producing food.

The masses eat from habit; eat as animals, because *they* have to; eat as do animals to satisfy hunger. MAN should eat as Man. Eat when he loves and what he loves. MAN should live above the animal plane; eat only what satisfies him. Domesticated animals having nothing else to do overload and fatten for the market. Wild animals having to hunt food keep in health. Man by adaptation has developed animal hunger along similar domesticated lines. Most of his food is taken from habit, and he eats too much. When he eats for love alone he will eat only what the Soul calls for.

Breakfast is a habit. Overloaded cars must unload before they reload. Charged dynamos must be discharged before they are filled again. Bodies are dynamos; fed at night they become loaded by morning and there is no call for food till by some physical, or mental, or emotional expression, the cells are discharged of their load of force. To the average person noon is probably early enough for reloading the battery. For a person to make it a rule to eat no breakfast and deny himself of any

desired food at any time, is a worse evil than to indulge in it. The only thought to hold over food is something like this. *I trust myself to desire what is best, and in so doing eat what I desire, when I desire, because I love it. The Ego knows what is best.*

In this Thought there will be a gradual and unconscious regulation of the diet. I outgrew eating breakfasts 10 years ago. Lost desire for them. Forgot them. The desire seldom returns. When it does I eat. So with meat. I outgrew desire. When I feel hungry for meat I eat it. But it is seldom. Race conditions sometimes call for it and then I as freely and happily eat meat as I do fruit. But to take meat away from any one because it is unwholesome is far more harmful than to let him eat as long as he loves it. Any sentimentalism about killing the animal is to be outgrown. I would as leave kill the ox I desire to eat, as to kill the tiger that desires to eat me. MAN has dominion over the earth and animal life is his to use as long as he needs to. When he does not need, that form of life will disappear.

The esthetic sense has more to do with the food of cultivated persons than any other factor. The ugliness of the slaughter house, butcher shop and cook-room, does more than all vegetarian teachings to create a dislike for meats. What the eye loves is food. Soon the nauseating thoughts that "dead meat" cause will relegate the butcher shop to some selected place. Tables beautifully decorated and food carefully served, feed us, where the same food otherwise served would be repelling. As we become artists we shall become more simple in food. The Art of Living will become the Art of Loving.

All one needs to do is to cultivate a *loving* appetite. Eat what you want if it takes your last cent. This mental attitude will bring other cents. Eat because it tastes good. Stop when you have satisfied hunger. Habit leads one to over eat. This is the present great

food danger. Do not be afraid to fast. Never crowd food upon any one, be it friend, guest or patient. Wait the desire then eat fearlessly.

Learn to trust yourself everywhere. "Trust the current that knows its way." Eat what you love.

A Unitarian minister tells this incident in his own life. He met a stranger on the overland train. He was a millionaire. In conversation he lamented his lack of early education, but took out of his pocket a well worn copy of Emerson's "First Series of Essays", and said, "Somebody left this in camp, and do you know that Emerson has put on paper just what I have Thought for years and wanted to say?"

It is Emerson's glory that he spoke not for a class nor a period, but for all men and for all time. He spoke Truth because it bubbled up from the Inner Life. All persons find in him, when they free themselves from the mummy wraps of culture and custom, prejudice and fear, that which they "have Thought for years and wanted to say." There is no better Ideal than is found in him.

**How to be Happy Through
Affirmation.**

Twelfth Affirmation:—I THINK.

Whatever things are true, whatever things are honest, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, * * * THINK ON THESE THINGS.
—Paul to the *Philippians*.

Emerson says, "Beware when God lets loose the thinker for then all things are at his command." This because Thought is creative. Life is all that is. It is the raw material out of which Thought forms things. In like manner Human Thought out of Itself forms its body and forms or draws to it, its environments. Every Thought effects the nerve cells, every Thought stimulates or retards circulation. Every Thought that passes through the mind of a person changes the brain cells already existing and controls the formation of new ones. Continued Thought determines the condition of body and estate. Continued Thought, constitutes the mental attitude of the person. In considering a person, it is only necessary to learn his mental attitude to know his physical, and social and financial condition. As Cuvier from a single bone could reproduce the whole skeleton, so from the mental traits, we may understand the whole life of an individual. Character is but Materialized Thought. Habit is but Thought that has created a nervous system through which it acts automatically. Thinking is the all-important work of man. This cared for, all else is cared for. Therefore after the Affirmation, I AM, the next of importance is, I THINK.

The whole duty of parent, teacher, preacher, author, orator, actor, is done, when they have caused their children, pupils, readers or listeners, to think. The whole duty of Man is done when he thinks. Thought does all the rest.

When the dynamo is all ready and the wires all laid, the whole duty of the operator is done when he turns on the current and keeps everything so that current can have unobstructed flow. Since THOUGHT IS POWER, all one's duty is done when he turns on the Thought-current. After that he has only "to trust the current that knows its way." Thought as Power will build our bodies, transport them, clothe and feed them; build houses and machines for them. Thought is ALL the power we have to use. We have but to think rightly, to have rightly; to think happily, to have happily; to think prosperously, to have prosperously. I have said in my books, lectures and lessons: *To know how to think and what to think, is the sum total of knowledge; to think what you choose is the sum total of duty!* This is the Human side of Life. The rest is the Divine side, and that Divine side through Infinite Power of Thought, does the work.

As this last Lesson in the Art of Being Happy, I wish to emphasize this Affirmation: *Thought is Power*, by telling you *what* to think. I have been teaching you all by Affirmation *how* to think, so that you now think in Affirmations. No other form of Thought is creative to desire. Other forms create undesirable conditions. AFFIRMATION is the only self-determined, self-creative method of thinking. I AM and I THINK, are the manifestations of that Intelligence which form the line of demarcation, of differentiation, between the Genus Homo and all other genera; it is the distinction between Man and beast. To the extent a person thinks he is Man, is Human; to the extent he neglects to think he is still in the evolutionary stage from brute to Man. He who repeats what he has read, or heard has not reached Manhood, but is still in the Simian (ape) stage of evolution. He will be Man only when he thinks for himself.

What shall he think? We have the

ground thoroughly covered by Paul in the extract at head of this lesson. Eternal Principles alone are worthy of our Thought. These Principles are Infinite. They will work for us when we think them. Think only that which you wish to manifest or to materialize in your objective life. Make no Affirmation you do not desire to have made an objective reality. The Affirmations that have been given in these Lessons are those which every one desires to have made manifest in flesh, purse and environment. Affirmation will as surely create them as sunlight and heat brings forth vegetation. *I am happy because I THINK happiness.* This is the Affirmation that will create and maintain a Heaven within you.

Evolution Of New Thought. ❁ ❁

Exodus for February, has an editorial by Mrs. Gesterfield upon: "The Future of the New Thought Movement," to which in commendation I call attention. While I do not agree with the unconscious reverence this wing pays to Bible authority, I do like very much what Mrs. Gesterfield writes, and her motive I like still better. She sees the limitations of some teachers and the materialism of others, but recognizes that in evolution, some unity in way of organization must come. This passage I particularly recommend to the attention of those who like to be called New Thinkers:

The future will demand the religion of Christian Science without its dogma and bondage, the science it has not developed, the explanation of the healing it and other methods accomplish, the willingness to look at whatever presents itself as for the betterment of mankind, the willingness to give place and recognition to facts as well as truth, surrender of the "I am holier than thou" position, surrender of the person to the impersonal truth.

Soon or late, demand for this union of elements, from both the orthodox and the liberal fields, will compel the union; meanwhile the little individual schemes will run their course, much money will be made, perhaps, the promoters will die and their work with them—in spite of all assertions of immortality of the flesh—the good they have accomplished will

endure, be its measure small or great. Others will take their places, and the old ills of humanity will stand forth with new generations, the work to be done for them as it was before them.

The time will come when higher standards will compel a higher quality of work with the liberals and a breaking of barriers with the orthodox, though the equivalent of Catholic and Protestant is likely to remain; but not so likely to remain is the shuddering avoidance by the new Catholic of the new Protestant, the fear of his "malicious animal magnetism" now so characteristic of the new sect.

The infinite Mind itself compels progress and its mighty tide sweeps on resistlessly. Happy he who moves with it, who is not caught and held by a snag in the way.

A few evenings ago while my class was gathering I was in a distant part of the building. Returning to the reception room, I passed several friends in the hallway and chatted with them. Passing into the reception room two lady friends who were sitting by the open grate greeted me. I had no conscious train of Thought in my mind. Editor and Doctors On Hypnotism. * *

The Editor of *Life*, in the January issue gives the following reply to a correspondent who asks if disease can be cured by hypnotism, "No, hypnotism only benumbs, puts to sleep, deceives and confuses the reason."

This is a surprise, coming as it does from one of the leading teachers in Mental-Christian-Science. Why, Brother Barton, all Hypnotic cures are performed just as yours are, by an appeal to the real, the Sub-conscious man. To deny one is to deny both. It is strange to find such ignorance of hypnotic law among New Thought people. Till they understand that Law they are still in a fog and are performers—healers, only. They heal, but do not understand the Law; workers by faith, and not by understanding. Mental treatments are just as much hypnotic as are the exhibitions on the platform. There is "One Law, One God, One Element" in all healing. A course in Suggestion is

recommended to all New Thought teachers. I do as permanent and as successful healing by Suggestion, and that without "deceiving or confusing" the patient, as any other healer does, and by the same ONE POWER, i. e. Thought.

But Truth is marching on in spite of those who would confine it to the sphere of their own limited knowledge. In the *Journal of the American Medical Association* for January 16 is a paper read at the fifty-fourth annual meeting of that association by Dr. H. W. Loeb of the St. Louis University in which he reports his success in the use of Suggestion in several cases of Hysteria, in which there was a loss of voice. Four physicians followed him with endorsement of Suggestion; one saying "I consider this paper one of distinctive value!"

The *London Lancet*, August 22, 1903, reports a successful amputation under hypnotism. The patient bore the effect of the anesthetic in a previous operation so badly that he wished to be relieved of the necessity, therefore hypnotism was successfully used. Recovery uneventful. The *Lancet* says, "It can only be regarded to some extent as a curiosity though the issue was favorable." The *Journal of the American Medical Association* commenting upon this says, "We believe that hypnotism as a therapeutic remedy has long passed its heyday, its occasional use will doubtless still be heard from and may be found of value. Few operators would ever now rely upon it."

Contrast this attitude with that of the profession toward X-ray and radium. Contrast this attitude toward hypnotism with the hasty, credulous, ill-considered, non-scientific acceptance and use by medical "practice" of toxins, X-ray, radium and many other new fads. Physicians tumble over each other to get each new thing and "cure" (?) for awhile, when lo! the matter is hushed up, till some one lets out the

secret—it did not cure. But suggestion after a test of over a century does cure. Why does not the Medical Profession adopt it? Very many individual doctors do and find it successful. Here is one.

Dr. Julius Grinker of Chicago writes in the *Journal of American Medical Association* for October 2, these words:

Hypnotism as now understood by men who have personal knowledge of the subject, is really Suggestion. As now practiced it is nothing but Suggestion administered during a state of susceptibility. To be of value it must be administered at such a time. Many people are susceptible in the waking state and these are the ones who are the proper subjects for the indirect waking suggestions by means of innocuous drugs, electricity, &c. * * * The so-called dangers from hypnotism are imaginary, and although I have hypnotised hundreds of times I have never seen any ill effects from its use. Bernheim, Libault, Ford, Wetterstrand and a host of others who have practiced hypnotism thousands of times have had similar experiences.

Spiritualism and the Eternal NOW. ✨

Spiritualism is the gospel of the eternal NOW! It teaches we *live* in our daily thought, act and consciousness. Yesterday is past, to-morrow has not come, to-day alone is. What is to be done let us do it now. We may prepare for to-morrow, but when it comes it will be the Now. Even in the other life the everlasting Now will be ours, for that future will then be our Now. We are spirits now and here, our perpetual expansion is but the continually enlarging Now.

I am glad to clip this from the *Banner of Light* for January 30th. It is the teaching of the Higher Spiritualism, but it is not the common teaching of the seance or of the platform. The chief attention of Spiritualists is given to phenomenon which demonstrated that we live after the death of the body. It deals in futures in the Sweet Bye and Bye. A. J. Davis's Harmonial Philosophy contains all the Principles of Christian Science, Divine Science, Mental Science and Soul Culture, but Spiritualist Societies have neglected this for the sensationalism of the seance, and by this choice made Spiritualism only a phase of one great movement, instead of making it *the* movement. The Truth

made manifest by seance has not been made practical, and organized Spiritualism has ceased to be a very important factor in present progress. Many of us hoped it was the Savior that was to come; it has proved to be the John the Baptist, who foretold the Savior, who is now present in the many New Thought movements. The degeneracy of public Spiritualism to meet the demand for sensationalism, has caused many of the best within its ranks to turn to other methods of promulgating and practicalizing the Truth the angels brought to those still in the objective life. If the *Banner of Light* can stem the tide of public Spiritualism, and make it a means of demonstrating that Man is Spirit here and now, it will enter upon a field of usefulness far beyond any it has hitherto occupied. I welcome its evolution into the Soul Culture army, and am glad that it rallies to the support of NOW in its efforts to make practical the philosophy of Spiritualism, in a demonstration of the Kingdom of God here and now. This is the purpose of NOW. It was so stated in the first issue. That principle has been on its banner ever since. The NOW motto, is the real banner of Light. It reads: *I am Spirit here and now with all the possibilities of Divinity within me, and I can consciously manifest those possibilities here and now.*

To your eyes it is a commonplace, yellow vehicle, with an ordinary motorman in front and an every-day conductor in the rear, but, to the man of God-given sanguinity, it is a chariot of gold with diamond-studded wheels, a seraph at the wheel and brake, and a cherub collecting fares.” —*Success.*

Andrew Jackson Davis has in a recent article made this statement. No better witness than he can be summoned in this case:

“I DENY UTTERLY THAT INDIVIDUALS ARE LED INTO EVIL, OR CRIME BY PERSONS IN THE OTHER WORLD.”

The only way a person can influence another is by the Law of Suggestion. This statement of Mr. Davis applies equally well to the charge that hypnotism can be used for evil purposes. "The instincts of these little moths and caterpillars cannot be chained," says Professor Loeb. "As soon as they come out of the nests the rays of light from the sun warp their bodies in such a way that they cannot help climbing upward"

He answered "No, no more than I could believe that a book describing them could grow by mere chemical forces." The fundamental basis of all Truth is the conception of Unity. All is One and the Principle of Attraction, is the One Principle of

the Universe. Supposed opposites are seen to be but contrasts; Oneness is found in apparent duality, and completeness is found to be inherent in what outwardly seems to be but fragmentary.—Eugene Del Mar in Spiritual and Material Attraction.

Since all reasoning in the past has been from duality, all the conceptions of man based upon that recognition must be changed when once the Principle of Unity is accepted. It has been matter and spirit, mind and matter, body and soul, heat and cold, attraction and repulsion. No matter what the condition, there must be, in the old thought, an opposite condition. God must balance devil, and good must balance evil. Whittier puts the old theology thus: —"As counterpoise of hell, heaven alone is possible."

But in the new conception the Universe is not divided. It is One. It is not Matter and Spirit, as opposites, but Matter and Spirit as extremes of manifestations of the One Substance. In like manner in all our Thought, we are to realize this Oneness. It has been very difficult to change the ethical idea so that men shall see that good and evil are but human conceptions; are merely relative conditions of more or less happiness, coming to him from his mental attitude towards the Universe as a whole, or to some manifestation of it. It is a more difficult task to bring the philosopher and the scientist to reason from Unity. The One manifests Itself as Energy. Duality born of God and devil, Good and evil, still exist in scientific thought in the conception of Attraction and Repulsion. But Unity must be Universal and apply in all fields of thought: the Universe is united by the One Principle of Attraction. Repulsion would divide it and destroy Unity. To hold in Thought the old conception of duality is to create a God-semi-verse and a Devil-semi-verse; the two warring constantly as in Zoroastrian philosophy. It is my purpose in these articles to emphasize this Thought of Unity, and to show by quotations that it is not

only in Harmony with modern Thought in other fields, but is the only logical conclusion to which it leads. Necessarily I have been able only to open the discussion. The field is too large. I make an outline, details of which the future scientist and philosopher MUST fill. He will be compelled to, for Truth takes every brain that is ready. I am laying the corner-stone of that New Philosophy which must come from the recognition of Unity. The Mental, Divine and Christian Sciences are each adding their contribution to a future Scientific-Religion and Religious-Science; of which the primary chapters are in Soul Culture. "Soul and Body", and "Man's Greatest Discovery" will remain a mental excitant for generations. Unity will at last bring all to see that Soul and Body do not exist as opposites, but as contrasts of one manifestation of the One, Something, which we call Force, Substance, God.

The Principle of Unity forbids that the Ego be in any manner separated from *all* else of the One. That Principle of Unity compels the Universe to be the space-body, in which I—the Ego—manifest. I am co-extensive with the Universe. I, as an Ego, I, as a manifestation of the One, am merely *Consciousness*. I differ from the rock, from the tree, from the brute manifestation in the One, only because I am conscious and can say, I AM. But all these others are one with me, and they have all the Universe as the space-body in which they manifest. We are One, and each manifestation of the One could say, were it conscious, "I and my father are one!" or since God and it are one, each could put it this way, "I am God," just as it could say, "I am Force", or "I am Substance", or "I am Spirit."

All these manifestation, which are but conditions *in* the One, and *of* the One, are occasioned by that Intelligence of, and in, the One we term the Principle of, or the Law of, Attraction. Solar systems are drawn together, and held

by this manifestation of the One Intelligence. There is no balancing force. The idea of two forces, a centrifugal and a centripetal, is an error.

Atoms are held together, and the manifestation of this One Universal Law, is termed, cohesion. In chemistry the same Law is termed, affinity. In animals it is termed, instinct. Among men it is termed, Love. No doubt angels have another manifestation. All these conditions of holding together, from sand grain to nations, are but conditions of the One, under action of the one Law of Attraction.

This Law produces all the conditions which men divide into mineral, fluid and gaseous. More or less Attraction, makes the distinction. Atoms that draw closely make the rock; atoms less closely drawn, having space to move about among themselves, make the fluid. Atoms so loosely held that they fly about among themselves like a flock of birds are the gases. But when they are so far apart that they are like solar systems they may be electricity, X-ray, "N"-ray, Radium. Thought atoms are still more free; still farther apart, but with more attractive power make the condition we term Love. Atoms require space from each other that they may manifest their power. Each atom being a center in Infinite Substance, has ALL of that Substance as a possible manifestation through it. It is the amount of Substance, or of Force, or of God, that is in manifestation, that causes us to say, rock or man. All of God is in each. Love is a form of Attraction. Attraction is the Universal name given to the methods in which the One manifests. Each method has a specific name. Therefore it is as great a mistake to call that form of attraction in the rock, Love, as it would be to call rock, man. There are those who talk of "Universal manifestation of Love" and speak of the love of plants and love of brutes. Love is found only in the Human. Not all in the Human form have much manifes-

tation of Love. The masses are living in the brute form of Attraction, which is the *instinct* of Life. Social Attraction causes them to unite for self protection. They are all drawn together in families by race instinct of reproduction. But that manifestation which causes propagation of the species is not Love. Love is developed out of it. The masses are born on the instinctive plane of nature's demand for reproduction. The race must be preserved at any cost to the individual. Man is *coming*; when he comes there will be a consciousness of attractions toward not one alone of the opposite sex, but toward the whole race; toward the One; toward all the manifestations of the One. This is Universal Love; Love of the Good, of the Beautiful and of the True. Under this form of Attraction the animal instinctive attraction will pass away and the coming Man will be here—a reality. Therefore "God is LOVE", only to the Human, and only in the Human. God is cohesion in rock. He is chemical affinity in the laboratory. He is instinct in brute. He is instinct in drinking saloon and in brothel. Where there is not choice and self-control God is not Human, God is not Love, but God is instinct. For God is the ALL IN ALL, and we name these conditions of Attraction according to the power, and the Intelligence God manifests to Human consciousness in each. Thus I, an Ego, am God manifest through Attraction. I am drawn to my fellows as sun to sun, and as atom to atom, but my form of Attraction is Love.

The depth of the Love I manifest depends upon my distance from my fellows. If I am individualized, I will like a central sun shine with bright beams from afar off. If I am not individualized I am merged in the mass and I will shine with dim rays of a near to. In this latter case I will claim ownership, and say "my home, my friend, my nation, my wife, my husband, my child." But when I have reached Indi-

viduality, I will find in every man, woman and child, some one to love. I will never think of ownership or return of Love. I will, like the sun, radiate. As he sends heat and light, I will radiate Love and Thought. "All the world loves a lover!" "Because he first loved you!" is the scripture reason. But I can send these love vibrations only through that medium which is my own body. I can only vibrate my own body. Since I can send Love and Thought throughout the Universe, the Universe is my body and I am co-extensive with it. My body is therefore that of which I am conscious. As I extend my consciousness, I am gaining power of expressing that-which-I-am, and which I have been from all eternity.
