The Zodiac and Your Aura

HERE are seven planes of nature known among occult students as the Physical, Astral, Mental, Buddhic, Nirvanic, Paranirvanic and Mahaparanirvanic. These planes, or worlds, have no definite boundries. Ether interpenetrates all known matter from the most compact solid to the most rarefied gas.

Likewise, the substance of the astral world extends throughout that of the physical world and that of the mental world throughout both the substance of the astral and physical worlds. Of the seven planes the physical is most dense.

In order to function and manifest in a given world a creature must have a body composed of the substance of that world. A human being manifests in the physical world by means of the physical body. He also has an astral body which enables him to exist in the astral world. In all, man has seven bodies corresponding to the seven planes of nature. These bodies like the worlds have no definite boundaries, but permeate each other.

The outer portion of the cloud-like substance of man's higher vehicles is called the aura. The clairvoyant observing the aura of a man is able to see the play of colors which is always going on within it. If the chief color is yellow the clairvoyant knows that the man before him is an intellectual type, because yellow is the color produced in the aura by intellect. The person who has crimson as a predominant color in his aura is affectionate. The

sympathetic type has a prevalence of green in his aura.

The zodiacal position and aspects of the Moon at birth determine the nature of the personality and the personality determines the condition of the aura. The zodiacal sign Gemini bestows intellect of the type indicated by the pure yellow ray. Leo gives affection and Pisces, sympathy. If a man or woman has the Moon in Gemini at birth they will have an intellectual personality and their auras will have yellow as a predominant color. Likewise a person born with the Moon in Pisces has an aura tinged mainly with the green of sympathy and sensitiveness. When the Moon is afflicted the opposites of these characteristics are expressed, love becoming hate, ambition indolence and devotion, hypocrisy. In the following paragraphs the personal character conferred by the Moon's position in each sign of the zodiac is given and the type of aura corresponding to these positions. Although the masculine pronoun is used instead of the feminine, these paragraphs apply to both men and women. The descriptions apply to the aura in its normal state and not to the aura agitated by temporary states of the personality.

THE MOON IN ARIES indicates an aura tinged with bright red denoting courage and energy. The average person with the Moon in Aries is ambitious, energetic and enthusiastic. He is able to strike out his own path in life, being to a large extent enterprising and independent. When the Moon is afflicted in Aries the red is obscured by dark cloudlike masses indicating passion, avarice and intemperance. When well aspected the the Moon in Aries bestows both moral and physical courage, coloring the aura with a red similar to that of a glorious sunset, principally moral courage when in good aspect to the Sun, Jupiter or Saturn and physical courage when in good aspect to Mars.

THE MOON IN TAURUS gives persistence, devotion and affection. The personality is firm and patient; therefore able to surmount difficulties and not easily discouraged by obstacles. These traits of character, particularly devotion and affection tinge the aura with pale blue and orange which adds a certain amount of pride. Those born with the Moon in Taurus should refine the blue coloring in their auras by endeavoring to make practical as many of their noble ideals as possible, for then they will develop that unselfish type of love which flows out to all and endeavors to enfold all.

THE MOON IN GEMINI. This is the sign of intellect and therefore yellow is the predominant color in the auras of those born with the Moon in this position. Many lack concentration however, and the yellow is tainted with brown in consequence indicating a lack of profound knowledge. Those who have this position in their horoscopes should essay to overcome their natural changeability and restlessness and develop the faculty of concentration thus improving their mentality and changing the adulterated yellow into a pure ethereal yellow indicative of high intellect. The ethereal yellow is present when the Moon in Gemini is in good aspect to Saturn, Saturn being the planet of concentration, meditation and steadiness. When the Moon is afflicted by Saturn or Mars the mind is used for selfish ends and the yellow is marred by clouds of darkness.

THE MOON IN CANCER at birth tinges the aura with pale violet, the ray of sensitiveness. People with this position are readily affected by the feelings of others and vibrations from the superphysical planes. They easily feel the vibrations operating in their environment, especially when the sensitive faculty is developed by a pure life and the study of occult subjects. The ordinary person born with the Moon in Cancer is rather one whose feelings are easily affected rather than a person sensitive to psychological and psychic impressions. When the Moon is afflicted in Cancer the violet is pale and tinged with the grey of fear and cowardice.

THE MOON IN LEO bestows affection and vitality, coloring the aura crimson and light orange. Leo is the sign of the Sun, therefore the Leo native always aspires to that which is glorious, his aspirations giving him much ambition which produces the orange hue in his aura. Leo is also the sign of the heart and corresponds to the fifth house which is that of love affairs. The strong affection of the Leo native tinges his aura with crimson. The aura of the advanced native is colored with a purer crimson, more like rose and the ambition is mainly spiritual attainment.

THE MOON IN VIRGO bestows the faculty of discrimination and indicates an analytical, scientific and critical temperament. The aura is therefore chiefly colored with pale orange and yellow. When the intellect contents itself with things of a low order the yellow is dark and dull; as the mentality ascends to

liberate mental attitude. However, a rudimentary knowledge of some of the factors involved is helpful and to this end I will give a brief and abbreviated idea of the influence of five Planets and the Luminaries as follows:-

The Sun, (Positive) - Individuality, domination, egotism.

The Sun, (Negative)-Matieriality, carnality.

The Moon, (Positive)-Psychic qualities, intuition, popularity.

The Moon, (Negative) - Democratic publicity, indecision, variability.

Jupiter-Optimism, joviality, sion, increase.

Mercury-Intellectual power, commercial instinct, science.

Venus-Affection, art, music, poetry, harmony.

Saturn-Privation, delay, limitation, destruction, (in rare cases) philosophical thinking.

Mars - Intensity, energy, freedom, blood, fire, strife, eic.

These are only a few of the qualities of each of the above, but here is a fact I wish to stress at this time. Each has a high influence and a low influence and when by birth and name vibration one is placed more strongly under the influence of one of the Planets or Luminaries than any other, the individual's own thinking determines whether the influence is to be high and noble or negative and degrading. Whether he will occupy a high position with accompanying good circumstances or the reverse is within the subject's own decision once the way is shown. To proceed, it is easily seen that the solider, reformer, agitator and similar energetic and intense persons come under Mars vibration and THINK in Martian terms. Gunmen, gangsters, killers and homicidal maniacs represent the low aspect of this influence. I am speaking in terms understandable to laymen of course and I know that all these factors are subject to modifiation by impinging vibrations from other sources, but that does not alter the general conclusions I am stating.

Similarly, the artist, musician or dancer comes under the gentle, harmonious, rythmic influence of Venus and THINK accordingly. The man of science, the teacher and merchant THINK and act in accordance to Mercury's vibrations. The Moon's subjects THINK in terms of the public as lecturers, actors, public speakers, etc.

Seventh Lesson—How to Adjust Your Name to Your Birth Path

REMEMBERING that we cannot, by so much as a day, change the date of our birth we can readily see that this is the most important fact in every life. A name to be really a good tool for the carving and shaping of our lives, should be—

(1) An odd number (indivisible by 2) if the birth path is odd. For example, a 1,3,5,7 or 9 Birth Path should be found with a name which totals 1,3,5,7 or 9. A 10 is considered a 1. A 2,4,6,8 Birth Path should be found with a 2,4,6,8 total name. 11 reduces to 2 and 22 to 4 and are usually considered even numbers, altho 11 may be considered odd.

(2) In order to inspire us to higher and still higher achievement. The total name or Destiny number should be higher than the Birth Path. For example a 1 or 10 Birth Path should be complemented by a 3,5,7 or 9 name or Destiny number. A 2 Birth Path calls for a 4,6 or 8 Destiny. A 3 Birth Path needs a 5,7 or 9 Destiny. A 4 Birth Path should have a 6 or 8 Destiny.

(3) If the Birth Path and the Destiny have the identical vibration, there is harmony and no change is needed although it is advisable. You will be able to do the work you came into the world to do but you may lack ambition to do the best that you could do. Understanding this fact you can supply the ambition and not let yourself be satisfied with merely "getting by."

It cannot be too emphatically stated that Numerology is not a cage into which you are locked by an inexorable Fate but a vast garden of opportunities where you can choose your path intelligently. If pit-falls are indicated, make a detour and avoid them. If you discover weaknesses, then it is up to you to conquer them. Don't think, for instance, if you have an excess of 5's, in your Numeroscope that you have to be sex crazy or abandon your good common sense and self control. Too many 5's means "Stop—Look—Listen," and if you need a "break" to stop your speed, have someone who really understands alter your name so as to lessen this tendency.

If your Birth Path is I—the pioneer number—don't feel that you must find a new world to conquer every day or a new way of ruling and dominating your old world. Don't feel that you are too wise to listen to advice; too self-satisfied to learn from others. Just thank Heaven that you have the power to stand on your own two feet and walk forward without a cane or crutches.

Changing one's name is not a trivial matter. It is as important to your individual progress as good "gas" is to your automobile. Some kinds of "gas" will carry you miles further than others. Some names will carry you further than others. Just as you cannot get as many miles out of poor "gas" as you can from good, so you will be hampered by a name that is not adjusted to your Birth Path. And (to repeat) what is meant by this harmony? A name that is odd or even as the case may be and higher if possible than the Birth Path. Or, in any case, just as high-never lower. A Destiny number that is too small is a handicap difficult to overcome.

How is this adjustment made? I am almost tempted to say "With fasting and prayer," meaning with as much care as if you were working with explosives or poisons for many times a change is made which is no better or even worse than the name with which one started. Sometimes it is easy to adjust a name-sometimes it is practically impossible without making a radical change. Never influence or advise a person to adopt a name which he does not like for there is always some way of finding a name that is satisfactory as well harmonious. Quite often a slight change of the spelling of the first name, or a change of initial, will "do the trick." But remember that all three aspects of the name-vowels, consonants and total name must be taken into consideration. It is not enough to merely look at the Des-

People are very likely to think that if they can get an 11 or a 22 in their name they are right on the high road to success. These, as you will remember are super numbers and should only be adopted when the person is in a position before the public or where he is working in a wide field. A home-keeping wife should not be given a vibration suitable for a prima donna; neither should a bookkeeper be given vibrations suitable for a Byrd or a Lindbergh. Unless a person has a proper outlet, super vibrations are likely to cause restlessness, dissatisfaction and unhappiness.

Now let us see exactly how we go about adjusting a name to a Birth Path. For the sake of illustration, let us suppose the person in question has a Birth Path of 5. Thus:

He is versatile, creative, original, with a pioneer spirit and a love of the beautiful. He is an expansive person; one who desires self-expression. If his name were Chester Edgar Blair, which has a Destiny of 2, you can see at once how his name will tend to confine and restrict his versatility and reaching-out-after-things. The inharmony is quite evident. Now let us set about finding a bigger outlet for this "go-getter for experience." We shall try to find a name that has an odd number for its Destiny (to match the odd 5), and a number higher than 5.

First, print out the name clearly, putting the proper numbers over the vowels and the proper numbers under the consonants and add the results of each name separately

You see at a glance that this man has an executive mind or executive Talents lodged in an artistic, happy Personality. Now to find his Destiny write out all the numbers of each word. Thus:

So we have, Talents 8, Personality 3, Destiny 2 and Birth Path 5. The next step is to get a good sharp pencil, plenty of paper, and a super supply of patience. I know of only one method from this point on—try, try, again. Some names are easy and some are hard to adjust; but the




When they reached the spot where no one dared enter farther, the maiden looked into the water—there she saw the face of the Madonna—

THE AMAZING STORY OF ADELE LE DEU TOLD IN HER OWN WORDS

Y name is Adele le Deu. I was born at Oostacker, Belgium. Probably you have never heard of Oostacker. It is a small village near the town of Ghent. Ah, Ghent is more familiar to you, is it not? Ghent is one of the oldest and most widely known cities of Belgium, that part of the Low Countries which throughout history, from dim antiquity until quite recent times has been the battle field of Europe. There many nations have with destructive wars, settled their disputes.

Oostacker is situated on the banks of the broad canal joining Ghent to the Scheldt River at the Holland town of Terneuzen. Ah, that beautiful canal! I hold in memory a vision of it as I write these lines. Deeply and smoothly its waters are running through the evenly green meadows flanking it on both sides. Sailing ships, motor boats, yachts, are incessantly navigating it. And occasionally one may see the old-fashioned flatbottomed vessels, propelled by means of long poles, pushed into the mud of the canal's bed by brawny, weather-beaten skippers, walking from bow to stern, then dragging the poles back toward the bow to renew the operation, or pulled by means of long tow lines attached to patient horses walking along the banks. In winter we often skated on the smooth ice of the canal, by this means easily traveling into the territory of the Netherlands, to the North.

From Oostacker you may see in the distance the black, sinister-looking watch towers of Ghent, reminiscent of ancient stormy historical times. It is a quaint

ment of merchants and weavers who

town, pervaded with dark, silent canals, in some of which majestic swans move along in stately fashion. Medieval gateways appear at regular intervals in its walls. The streets are short and narrow, lined with antiquated, awry houses, with roofs containing small three-cornered windows, that seem to stare at the passerby. Hospitable but gloomy, ancient castles complete the picture.

What a history this ancient city has; a history filled with stirring and bloody episodes. The eighty-year's war, the ceaseless struggle for the possession of the Spanish Netherlands, and the various subsequent wars, all have contributed their share to its turbulent past. And yet, this city has produced its great men most prominent among whom is one of the greatest of modern writers, Maurice Maeterlinck, who was born there in the year 1862.

Modern industrial progress also has left its influence on Ghent. I cannot help frequently recalling the aspect of the beautiful old town, the City of Flowers, as it was the day before I left it. It was becoming modernized and aroused with increased business and intellectual activity. I will give a brief description of this ancient town. It is the old capital of East Flanders, situated where the Lys river joins the Scheldt. The Flemish call the town Gent, the French Gand, and we either write it nowadays Gand or Ghent. The suburbs and environs are immense gardens the abundant products of which gave to the town its nickname, the City of Flowers.

For centuries Ghent has been noted for its chief industry, that of weaving. It caused the town to grow rapidly and to become so powerful in the Middle Ages as to render its citizens almost independent of their feudal landlords. For a long time it was engaged in a brisk trade with England.

But in spite of its recent modernization Ghent still retains much of its ancient character. In the oldest part of the town, where the Lys and the Scheldt form an is and by their juncture, the Counts of Flanders erected the strong castle of Gravenstein, or Oudenberg as it is also called; it was built some ten centuries ago by Baldwin of the Iron Arm to defend the town against the Norsemen whose invasions and depredations exposed the Low Countries to constant peril. This castle was the nucleus of the subsequent settlegradually built up the town. The most striking feature of the town

is the Gothic Belfry. From its tower, which I twice climbed, one may see the green plains of Flanders and in the distance, the towns of Bruges, Qudemarde and Antwerp. The tower contains fiftytwo bells, the largest of which, named Roland, weighs nearly six tons. At the foot of the belfry stands the ancient Cloth Hall built in Gothic style in the year 1424. The next striking landmark of Ghent is the Hotel de Ville, built also in flamboyant Gothic style. One part dates from the fifteenth and the other from the sixteenth century. It is a building of rare beauty and exquisite charm. Such is the town of Ghent, the general outline of which I could see every day from our home at Oostacker.

My parents were people of the middle class, the bourgeoisie as it is called in my native country. Father had started out as a "small business-man," but he had gradually relinquished this in order to engage in the career of a writer. From his writings, sold to newspapers and magazines, he received a substantial income. Our modest country home was inherited by my father from his father, who in turn had inherited it from his. Thus these homes are transmitted from generation to generation always maintaining the same aspect, never changing, save for some occasional repairing or slight modern improvements. Even the furniture remains the same although it is of far greater solidity and use than the flimsy constructions of modern times.

Father's library was his pride. It was not a large one, but it contained the works of some of our most advanced writers. It was a medium sized room on the second floor of our neat country home, simply furnished with an old-fashioned desk and several chairs. Along one of the walls several large shelves had been constructed, containing a considerable number of handsomely bound volumes. The floor was covered with an exceptionally fine rug with a quiet pattern in duotone gray. Among the tastefully selected paintings which adorned the walls were two excellent imitations of our own Rubens and Van Dyck.

One of my greatest pleasures consisted of delving into the contents of the many books on the shelves. Here were the works of Villiers de l'Isle-Adam, of Fiction based upon Actual Experience and Scientific Facts.

d'Aurevilly, Mallarme, Verlaine, Bourget, Ribot, Binet, Darzens, Haeckel, Drummond, Paul Rou, Quillard, those of your own writer Thumas Jay Hudson and others; but already at an early age I was a great admirer of M. Maeterlinck's writings and the entire set of his books, autographed copies they were, bound in limp green leather occupied a preferred place in a glass enclosed cabinet near my father's desk. For father was a loyal friend and admirer of M. Maeterlinck whom we were fortunate enough to have for our neighbor; his villa could be plainly seen from the front windows of our home. I had read all of his books beginning with that delightful volume of verses, "Serres Chaudes" (Hot Houses), published in 1889, and furthermore including "The Intruder," "The Princess Maleine," "Pelleas and Melisande," "Monna Vanna," "The Blue Bird," "The Life of the Bee." his many essays and his masterful translation of Macbeth. Of all his books my favorite was the juvenile edition of "The Blue Bird," but when I grew older I also read the regular edition and later his essay, "The Soul Emerging from Darkness," and the chapter entitled "Luck," in "The Buried Temple" (which latter title to me meant the subjective mind or soul), made a profound impression on my receptive nature and doubtless had much to do with determining the course of my life. For my promiscuous reading in father's library and especially my constant friendship with M. Maeterlinck, created within me an early love for literature and dramatic art. To be a writer seemed to me the pinnacle of all human happiness and ambition. True, father was a writer, but I wanted to become internationally famous like M. Maeterlinck. Even when I was a small child, chiefly concerned with dolls, I used to run over to his villa and talk with him. And as I grew older my visits there became quite frequent. What a beautiful home he possessed, standing there all white and green in the midst of the most wonderful flower garden I had ever seen. There he lived with his wife and collaborator, the beautiful Georgette Leblanc whose own work, "Le Choix de la Vie," published in 1904, a book full of beauty and idealistic happiness was also in my father's library.

What a wonderful and learned man M. Maeterlinck was. In visual memory I can see him now, walking about his gar-

HE WORLD looks with so much jest upon those individuals whose consciousness can span the gulf between the material world and the Unseen Forces in Nature that I have refrained from opening my heart. 

only way to do is to work until you strike what you want, which in this case is an odd Destiny digit, higher, preferably 9, because unless a person is born with a seven or is an actor or a scientific worker, 7 is a bad number to wish on anybody. More about the "pesky 7" after we fix up this name.

Let us think a minute what a 5 man would probably do-something in the selling line. He would not be a professional man, nor a poet, nor a musician, so it is safe to assume that he would want a brief, easy, business-like name, or signature. C. E. Blair looks pretty fair for a signature. 3-5-6, would be his name total, or 5; the same as his Birth Path. Now let us see what has happened to his Talents and Personality.

10 5-10=15=6 C. E. BLAIR 5 3 - 5 6 =14=5

His executive Talents now find expression in his Personality and his Talents become that reliable, honest, home-loving number 6, which should be a good steadying influence for an adventurous 5. To be sure the Destiny is not higher than the birth path but a 5 hardly needs to be enthused and urged on-he usually has plenty of "pep."

If this man had wanted to use the name Chester, then he could have dropped Edgar and adopted Evan-Chester Evan Blair-which would have given his Talents 8 (like his original name); Personality 9; and Destiny 9. This would have kept the same initial, the same vowels, and strengthen the consonants and total name. The theory of changing a name is very simple but the actual doing of it often takes time and patience.

In the choosing of a pen name or stage name the task is easier. The best vibrations for literary work are: 3,6,9. If you are looking for a name that will be successful on the stage choose 7, either in Personality or Destiny. But if you run into a 7 belonging to a person who is timid, retiring, or who chances to have an expansive Birth Path you will probably find him unhappy and always trying to do things that he cannot quite acomplish. In three lines or professions, a 7 is good: the stage, the ministry, and science. As you remember, 7 stands for perfection, poise but is sensitive, reticent, easily hurt, often misunderstood. The reason a 7 is so good on the stage is because the person cloaks his real self behind the character he portrays. It is good in science because it is not satisfied with anything short of perfection. It is good for anything dealing with mental or spiritual forces because it is the metaphysical number.

If you find a person with a 7 Birth Path, try to give him a 9 Destiny so that he will be drawn out of his secretive

tendencies into a wider expression. Many people with 7's are very domineering, satirical, carrying a constant "chip on the shoulder." In other words, exactly opposite to what you would expect them to be-and that is exactly what has happened. They probably have what is called "an inferiority complex," and to hide their sensitive feelings become brusque and rude in order to make themselves feel that they are important. Just as a timid child will assume an attitude of bravado.

Of course everyone is anxious to know if his name is "right," but let me state again that changing a name is like handling dynamite. It may do a great deal of good but there is the possibility that it may also do harm if not handled properlyjust as dynamite will explode. Some of the general rules follow:

For literary work, 3,6,9 should be prominent.

For mental and physical well-being The Destiny (total name) should offer an outlet for the mental activities. In other words high vowels should not be repressed into a low Destiny.

For scientific work or philosophical pursuits 1,5,7 will help.

For business 8,9,10 is excellent. The 1 for creation; the 8 for executive ability; the 9 for publicity or a broad field of activity.


Two super numbers, as 11-11, 11-22, or 22,22 should not be adopted for any one position unless the person is before the public or engaged in some wide-reaching activity. A person with a 22-22 Talent vibration and a small Destiny would be almost sure to be either unhappy or in poor health or both. On the other hand a person with an 11-22 Personality and a 3 Talent vibration would probably be (as we crudely express it) so "full of bull" and would "put on such a front" that his power would be all in his Personality and he would not have any good sound common sense or keen mentality to back up his pretensions.

As so it goes. Volumes might be written on the various possibilities of good and bad adjustment of name and Birth Path. One of the interesting and instructive methods is to take some prominent person's original name and compare it with the new name under which their fame has been reached. Space will not permit me to do this, but here are some names with which you can experiment.



den engaged in deep thought on some new creation of his mighty brain, a creation aiding the objective and the subjective mental progress of mankind. Imagine a man about five feet nine inches tall, inclined to be portly. His large round head is surmounted by shiny silver hair, which inspires a feeling of respect, even reverence. His complexion is fresh, ruddy, almost like that of a boy. The lower portion of his face is full and gives one the impression of firmness and determination. His forehead is high and broad and below it are a pair of blue-gray eyes, now thoughtful, then again possessing a merry twinkle, losing color in the bright sunlight, then momentarily appearing startlingly hard. His manner is off-hand but in all he presents an interesting individuality with an outstanding powerful personality. Such is the picture of the man whom we are proud to call Belgium's Shakespeake.

His eyes brightened perceptibly each time I stopped to visit him. We used to walk among his multi-colored flowers and afterward would go to the house for a serious chat on literature and art. But his garden was my favorite place. It seemed to be in tune with myself. It created within me the true feeling of my Oneness with a Living, Conscious presence, a feel that grew in intensity as the years went by.

Monsieur Maeterlinck's villa was one of those charming homes which breathe a spirit of happiness, romance and poetry. I cannot quite understand why he changed his residence afterwards for the gloomy ancient monastery (concerning which, many of the natives will tell you that there ghosts of monks long dead roam about at night), but I suppose it is more in conformity with his mysticism. Mysticism is a characteristic Flemish trait, an outstanding feature in Flemish literature and painting and M. Maeterlinck most certainly is an exponent of Mysticism. Previous to purchasing the old monastery he lived during the summer at Saint-Wandrille and during the winter in his villa, Aux Quatre Chemins, near Grasse, and sometime later at his "Villa des Abeilles" (Villa of the Bees) at Nice, both in Southern France.

But his villa at Costacker with its large. tastefully furnished rooms, large library and paint study, seemed to me the height of perfection. Having discovered my interest for art and literature M. Maeterlinck had invited me to visit him whenever I felt inclined to do so. I vividly recall the first time he took me up to his study. I was amazed, almost awed at its bare and severe aspect. It resembled the cell of a monk such as I had often seen in picture-books. The walls were limewashed and tinted a hard blue color. The furniture consisted of a small mirror, a roughly constructed table with writing material and three chairs. There was not one single book in this room, all of the

books being in the gorgeous library just off the study on the second floor of the house. The study was a characteristic "chamber of meditation" and the influence of profound thought had left its indefinable impression on the very atmosphere. I was impelled to say somewhat hesitatingly that the bare aspect of the room did not exactly appeal to my fastidious taste.

"Yet this very bareness promotes meditation," he said soberly. "Here I am in the Silence, away from the noise and glitter of the world, both disturbing factors which interfere with profound meditation upon the actual splendor of existence. Here is the place to transmit in a limited way to paper those transcending thoughts which come to me as a receiving station of the Once Great Unknown."

"Ah, Monsieur Maeterlinck," I exclaimed impulsively, "then you are not a pagan or infidel as Monsieur Dumourin and Monsieur Claessens said the other evening when discussing with father your books 'Wisdom and Destiny' and 'The Double Garden.' Of course, father did not agree with them."

"I am very grateful to Monsieur le Deu for his kind defense," replied M. Maeterlinck. "You see, I am only antagonistic to religion as it is being applied by the socalled followers of orthodoxy who only know its exoteric or commonly accepted form. They are unacquainted with its mystic and esoteric teachings. Yet, some Truth may be found in all religions.'

Ah, those visits to the villa of M. Maeterlinck were indeed delightful and inspiring. I felt growing within my soul an ever increasing ardent desire to devote my life to literature and dramatic art. Could there be any higher ideal or aim in life than that of disseminating progressive knowledge among humanity? Inwardly I pitied humanity, even those termed bigots. Were they not all groping about in mental darkness, vainly attempting to discover the light of Truth, yet, in their ignorance or stupidity, turning their backs upon the light when catching a glimpse of its rays? By some inner sense like a vague memory of a former life I felt that the propagation of Truth would be my life's task.

The play also held a great fascination for me. When occasionally with my parents I visited the theater at Ghent, I found myself upon my return home in a state of partial hypnosis, in a sort of dreamy ecstacy of longing. To write worthwhile books and plays, perhaps participate in their performance as the leading character, such were my dreams. But I hesitated to reveal these even to my mother. I could clearly imagine her somewhat staid character would cause her to evince some indignation should I venture to broach my proclivities in this respect. To become a writer might meet with her approbation but an actress? I

world. We paid a last visit to the Mother Superior and the Father Chaplain and it was only natural that the Baron's death be evoked as it played such an important role in our lives. Father Chaplain, who, you will remember was the Baron's cousin had been greatly impressed by the sudden end of my distinguished parent. The tragic circumstances connected with it and those last words: "Those eyes-those haunting eyes, at last" had set him thinking and independently, he had made an inquiry about his cousin's habits. "Do you know," he told us, "that it appears the Baron had a sort of superstitious fear of large brown eyes-since 1870, when he was a Captain and fought near Metz. Although he distinguished himself in medicine and in Occult science and was quite an able hypnotist there seemed some mystery connected with an unknown person who evidently possessed eyes of uncommon charm. Even in his notes no clue was given as to the identity of their owner other than the word She. The Chaplain went to his desk and returned with a note book which he opened and handed to my mother who read the following: "She . . . did not take back her words, whose vehemence and fire were the result of righteous indignation. Before I knew it, She had hurled the curse at me,-and I was unguardednever an instant of peace have I known save when I am concentrating on work. Immediately I relax-I see them everywhere, those large haunting, condemning eyes-Oh! God that I could escape them -but I cannot-it is the law-it is the law."

Mother passed the book to me. We were greatly moved. Father Chaplain addressed mother: "Do you know, Madame, that I wonder sometimes if as the injured Sister Rita, you may not have said something which might be," . . . he hesitated. "I do not want you to judge me too rashly but I am getting to be an old man-and I confess I would like to elucidate this mystery before I die."

"Reverend Father Chaplain," answered my mother, I will clear this enigma for you, as I alone know to what these notes allude. And she recounted what she knew of the scene which had been enacted in the Convent parlor-that grey morning in November, 1870. The Mother Superior and Father Chaplain were dumbfounded. The priest said pensively: "It is evident that

there is more force and virtue in words than we generally imagine!... I thank you for telling me this, it eases my mind . . . and once more I see that often God's Justice strikes here below.

"This note book," I said, "you must value it very highly? Would you perhaps, give me one page? . . . he was my father after all." The dear old man took the book, then gallantly offered it to me: "With my compliments, Mademoiselle"and that little book is among my most treasured possessions. From the sentiments I have read therein I have come to the conclusion that the Baron had no bad intention in using his knowledge of hypnotism to bring me to him that night. I presume that my eyes reminded him of Sister Rita's-for although they are blue they are strikingly like my mother's in shape and expression. . . After a last benediction from the venerable Father we set forth on our travels. I was then a little over nineteen. From that day the study of Hypnotism became our most engrossing occupation; we bought the best books-attended lectures-in brief it was our main subject of thought. As we progressed in our studies new vistas were opened to our wondering gaze, and all the world assumed another meaning. . . In India we learned much on the Power of Mind and the Application of Thought. It was at Delhi that I met a young American who was also interested in the same subject. We had many tastes in common and it is not surprising that sympathy soon changed into love. . . higher levels the color becomes clearer resembling a primrose yellow. When the mind is devoted to the study of spiritual subjects areas of blue appear in the aura. The spiritually inclined mind is produced by the Moon in conjunction or in good aspect to Jupiter or Neptune especially if these planets are in their own signs or in their signs of exaltation.

THE MOON IN LIBRA, the sign of the Balance, gives good judgment and an excellent faculty of comparison. It colors the aura with emerald the symbol of compassion. There is also the crimson of affection and the green of sympathy. When the Moon is afflicted grey-green instead of emerald predominates indicating deceit and friendship that is mingled with selfishness. Bright emerald green prevails in the aura of the person who has the Moon well aspected at birth denoting versatility and quickness of resource which qualities are used for unselfish rather than selfish ends.

THE MOON IN SCORPIO indicates a strong personality readily moved to anger, jealousy, passion or pride. These characteristics produce a deep red color in the aura. People with the Moon in Scorpio should use the will power bestowed by this position to overcome these lower traits and change anger to love thus replacing the deep red by the crimson and pink of unselfish affection or altruism. The Moon in Scorpio afflicted by Mars or Uranus makes the person subject to fits of anger, high strung and irritable. When this is the case the aura contains flecks of deeper red and the rolling black clouds of malice. The Moon well aspected in Scorpio gives determination, executive ability, courage and self-confidence giving the aura a blood-red hue.

THE MOON IN SAGITTARIUS colors the aura with indigo and blue. The symbol of this sign, a centaur shooting his arrow toward the heavens portrays the aspiring and idealistic character of its advanced native. When he is devoted to a noble ideal the aura is mostly of a sky-blue color. A lovely deep hue is produced by pure religious feeling. The aura of the highly developed Sagittarius native has a light blue shade indicating high spirituality. When the religious feeling is combined with fear the prevalent color is a dull greyish blue which is found in the aura of savage fetish worshipers. Often the aura of a Sagittarius native is tinged with a beautiful primrose yellow indicating a strong tendency towards the development of the higher mind along the lines of philosophy or science.

THE MOON IN CAPRICORN shows that orange is the predominant color in the aura combined with some green. These colors are caused by the ambition for material advancement instilled by this position of the lunar orb. A character of this type is easily moved to pride or jealousy, so that the orange and green become muddy. When jealousy provokes anger there are flashes of scarlet in the green as well as clouds of utter blackness. People with the Moon in Capricorn should have spiritual and mental ambitions, for then they will become fond of knowledge and be gradually led to a more ascetic

THE MOON IN AQUARIUS indicates an aura containing many colors. Aquarius is a distinctly humane sign and the love which the Aquarian native feels for humanity causes him to have many and varied emotions. People with this position in their nativities are excellent judges of human nature and see the world from many standpoints. The thought forms which proceed from the true Aquarian have a very beneficial influence on less developed types. He has a strong feeling of good-will toward all mankind and he sends out his love in a effort to enfold all. His progress on the Path is rapid for the being that works for the benefit of his fellow creatures receives the blessings and help of those who are higher than him.

THE MOON IN PISCES tinges the aura with green and silver grey. The grey of the higher Pisces aura is not the grey of fear or melancholy but a radiant silver grey resulting from the highly psychic nature of the Pisces native. This position of the Moon produces mediumship in developed natives and a sensitive, impressionable nature in those who are less highly evolved. Sympathy is another important Pisces characteristic. The Pisces person is very compassionate having much sympathy for those who are sorrowful, ill or in distress, and for dumb animals. The lower Pisces aura however, contains the dark grey blue of superstition. When the Moon is afflicted in Pisces the nature becomes indolent, sensuous and lacking in moral strength. When well aspected the Moon here gives a nature wonderfully kind, sympathetic and compassionate and inclines the native to music, poetry and drama.


