Contemplation

HEN we contemplate the vast ignorance of the Press and Pulpit concerning Occult and Psychic subjects and consider their opportunities and control of all the peoples minds in the world today, we marvel at the stride that has been made by the handful of faithful ones who have labored unceasingly and without financial remuneration except the pennies that find their way into the collection box.

The opponents of our cause deliberately Lie to their public to frighten them into remaining in ignorance of the Truth about Life and the *sweet communion* with those we love who have passed beyond mortal sight. Occult and Psychic activities we would turn the world upside down. It is better to let them fall behind us and become obscure and obsolete because of the density of their powers of perception or the ability to grasp the greater Truths about Life.

What Develops Your Psychic Powers?

(Continued from October Issue)

PSYCHIC POWER is generated in you through contact with those who understand the Law sufficiently to function through or upon your Psychic faculties, which differ in each and every one according to the individual phases of activities to the sense organs.

First of all—cleanse your temple of all fear, jealousy and untruths that your indwelling Spirit may not be dismayed. Give yourself a very rigid examination as to your purpose in arousing this energy into activity that it may flow into proper channels for your well-being. Armor yourself with fortitude, patience and courage to do with a will to never give up, once you have set your foot upon the Path of Psychical development, for straight is the way and narrow the path for the traveler who seeks the Goal of Life. Endurance must be your greatest asset for if you are earnestly seeking you will find the task very trying and many times, mystifying. You will prove a law, only to find it was just a step in the process of the law which may take weeks or years to fulfill.

When you have determined to start your development and prepared yourself for the mission, choose a time when you can be alone and undisturbed for at least a half hour. Prepare a table with a drawer which can be locked; place in this drawer pencils (soft preferred), and several pads of paper. Number these pads as No. 1, No. 2, etc. Take block No. 1-put the date of first sitting in upper right hand corner; hold pencil as in writing a letter, ask for a master teacher to come to you and protect you. Sit in this position and attitude for fifteen minutes, no longer. If nothing comes, place pad intact in the drawer. At next sitting, date again, but do not tear off page. Continue this until you have recorded something; then remove pages and place face downward in the drawer of the table. Repeat this process until block No. 1 is completed. Beginning with block No. 2, sit for one half hour —until filled. Block No. 3, one hour. When you have completed the third block you may invite a friend to sit with you, adding friends as you progress. For the beginner, the foregoing will give balance, poise and protection.

Do not discuss your sittings promiscuously with friends. Keep your appointments with your Teachers as punctually and earnestly as you would with your business associates or friends. You may not get legible writing at first, but every stroke of the pencil is germane to your development. Each seeker after Truth attracts to themselves a *teacher* who, in time, will instruct you further in your studies. Once you become conscious of your teachers, your path is illumined and you are born anew each day.

Thankful—yes, thankful indeed are we that the "babes in the woods" have, we hope, at last awakened to the necessity of demanding something more to be *Thankful* for from their accepted Leaders than a handful of *chaff* and a mouthful of *gaff* on this, our Thanksgiving Day of Nineteen Hundred and Thirty-two.

Give us our daily *wage* shall be our petition to our almighty Statesmen whose duty it is in times like these to forget politics, forget party and attend to the needs of the Nation's idle and starving citizens, not for a day but for all future days to come.

Give us a Proclamation of Works-not Words, Oh, Mighty President.

Drawn properly its sides are equal and the five points equidistant from the center so that a perfect circle may be circumscribed about the figure through these five points, which will divide the circumference of that circle into five equal arcs. This provides a geometrical problem, which may not be easy to solve, but it is not likely that one who could not solve it would possess enough intelligence to get very far in the development of clairvoyant or magical powers. In actual practice the making of the star is a work of art and exercises the artistic faculty of the operator. Invoking often is the key to success.

Each point of the star has an elementary attribution. The star may be placed in an upright position or upside down in what is called the averse position. In the upright star the topmost point belongs to Light or Akasa, commonly referred to as Spirit. Then the upper right hand point is attributed to Water; the left upper point to Air; the right lower point to Fire and the left lower point to Earth. To determine the points of the Averse Star simply write the above attributions against the points in the Upright, then turn it upside down keeping it always on the same plane, a two-dimensional plane, for the Astral (Starry) Plane has only two dimensions. It would therefore be a mistake to use a third dimension while inverting the figure of the pentagram.

The pentagram is drawn in front of you in the air as though on a wall before you, or on a plane perpendicular to the floor and ceiling of the room and parallel to the vertical plane in which you are standing. You do not touch any part of your body while drawing it. If you were drawing it on the wall itself your wand would at no time leave the surface of the wall. Thus you make five straight lines uni-

cursally from point to point until you return to the starting point.

There are two directions which may be used in making the star. One is to draw it Deosil-or dextro-rotary, as the hands of a clock move, around to the right, sunwise; the other is to draw it Widdershins ----in the contrary direction, to the left. If you want to summons a force begin at the point which is attributed to the force and draw the star Deosil. Thus to summons the Elementary Force of Fire, called in occult science, a Salamander, if you use the Upright Star, begin at the lower right hand point and make five straight lines continuously from point to point in the following order: Fire, Air, Water, Earth, Spirit and return to Fire. To banish the Salamander reverse the procedure thus-Fire, Spirit, Earth, Water, Air and return to Fire.

Man being a microcosm his whole being has the same constitution as that of the universe. The elements present in external nature are the same as those within the magical being of man. The process of dealing with external powers is called invocation and that of dealing with internal powers is called evocation. For the rites of invocation we use the Upright Pentagram, for those of evocation we use the Averse Pentagram. In the former case we deal with the Upper or Supernal Gods and Powers; in the latter we deal with the Lower or Infernal Forces. The operator must be careful, however, not to attach any moral significance to these terms, for it is a matter of direction only. Both good and evil lie in both directions, no more so in one than in the other. Evil appears and frightens us only because we meet something which we are as yet unprepared to face. When we have perfected ourselves and prepared ourselves for any given ordeal what we meet is always to us good, true and beautiful. Fear arises from knowledge of our own weakness and unpreparedness to cope with the circumstance. What you are in your soul is exactly what you have made yourself either in this or other lives. As long as you remain in the temple of the body which has been built for you to dwell in by cosmic forces you are protected. When you leave that body or temple there remains nothing to curb the inclinations, passions and tendencies which you have acquired and unless they are already halanced and function in harmony with the universal trend you will find yourself in trouble. You will then find yourself in a very painful predicament which is simply the effect of the practical criticism of your self-made structure by the powers that be. They automatically work to rub off your rough corners and reform you. Unless you have the courage to learn the lessons they teach and the will to reform yourself and correct your mistakes, it is better not to pass the Threshold.

Your soul is separated from your body at death and also in sleep. The Threshold between sleeping and waking is the same as that between life and death and that between the material and the spiritual worlds. The Initiate crosses this Threshold before the death of his physical body and his sleep becomes illuminated and he is conscious of what goes on there just as the ordinary person knows what his senses reveal while he is awake. The Pentagram symbolises the actuality which while we are awake culminates in the Light we have from the Sun; in sleep the Averse Pentagram is at work and the Flaming Star which burns at the core of our being illuminates the Pathway of the Initiate. But whatever is exists whether we are conscious of the fact or not. The clairvoyance which perceives occult forces does not create them. The methods of willing, feeling and thinking which cause spiritual progress and equip us to endure the ordeals are generally known to all and consist simply in obedience to moral law and the voice of conscience. The methods which result in clairvoyance are particularly known only to those who enter a School of Initiation. Clairvoyance is not necessary to spiritual progress, but those who wish to become Masters or Adepts can do so and those who find this desire in them should begin at once to fulfill it.

As long as we continue to go about in our daily lives in the ordinary ways to which external circumstances have accustomed us we can never become clairvoyant. But the moment we begin to aspire and do begin to do something extraordinary that is different from custom, we plant the seed which will in time flourish and bear fruit.

Our sleep will remain dark and obscure as long as we allow external circum-

AST MONTH we interpreted the meaning of the compound numbers 10, 11 and 12. So the next number to be esoterically explained is 13. Let me again remind you that always, as a final step, in analysis, the compound numbers should be reduced to the ultimate digit-that is 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9.

Number 13 .- Contrary to popular superstition, number 18 does not carry any implication of ill luck. The evidence of socalled "Good Luck" is in one's harmony with the infinite forces of the universe; and being "unlucky" means being out of harmony. Another way to express it is this: We are "lucky" when we are working constructively with the vibrations at our disposal. We are "unlucky" when we are meeting these vibrations in a negative or reverse attitude. What people call "luck" is merely harmony and understanding. Some people seem to fall into good fortune almost unconsciously while others grope about making mistake after mistake and never reaching the point they desire. Numerology does much to show the road by which you should travel to attain your goal. Even the simplest analysis will help you find your proper vocation and harmonize your name so that all vibrations will work with you, instead of against you. But the deeper one goes into Numerology, the greater is the help received. And most of all, bear in mind that numbers are sign posts, pointing the way; not jail sentences from which there is no cscape. In the number itself lies the way

of escape from ill fortune and the pathSupper." John H. Dequer points out its to good fortune.

Thirteen is really the number of transformation, creative impulses and power. It is one of the most interesting of all numbers because of its many good and unfavorable aspects. The old adage says "Give a dog a bad name, etc. and this number 13, certainly has been given a bad name-wholly unjustified. A word about its history is most interesting because superstition and metaphysics are so closely interwoven.

In Numerology the physical plane is symbolized by the numbers 1, 2 and 3; and of course, 3 is the ultimate of 12. Therefore we have 3 (12) as a finishing or ending on the physical plane, and 4 (13) the transformation or passage to the next higher (mental) plane. Twelve is one of the most important significant numbers in the physical world, and wherever it occurs it carries the idea of totality. We are familiar with the 12 months of the yearthe 24 hours of the "day," made up of 12 daylight hours and 12 night hours, the 12 planets of the solar system, etc. The prophet of the Christian religion, Jesus, was born in the 12th (3) month; thus marking the end of an old and beginning of a new cycle. He had 12 disciples, while He, Himself, was the 13th (4) member of that group-the leader, the builder-the corner stone of a new dispensation.

In the Old Testament, Jacob had twelve sons, each of whom became the founder of one of the 12 tribes. Symbolically, Jacob was the sun, the ruler of the solar system and each son represented one of the 12 months of the year. Jacob, you will remember, was renamed "Israel," after he wrestled with the angel until break of day and thus became representative of the solar father (sun) while each of the sons became the progenitor of one of the great divisions of the human race. The name "Is-ra-el" is made up of three syllables. "Is," from Isis, the mythological god of nature; "Ra," the Egyptian sun god; and "El" meaning spirit, and taken together this word signifies the domination of nature and power through intuition or spirit. Just here do not forget that while all Jews are Israelites because they descended from Judah, the other sons who were the fathers of other great nations were also descended from Jacob, therefore also Israelites.

In the New Testament, Christ and his 12 disciples also typify the Sun and the 12 months or seasons. Almost everyone is familiar with the painting of "The Last

symbolism as follows. Six disciples are seated on each side of Christ who is the central figure. The six on his right, are shown in active position; the six on his left are passive and stern. Christ, typifing the Sun, is holding up his right hand, palm up, symbolizing the 6 summer months of Nature's activity, while his left hand is held, palm down, over the 6 quiescent months—a finished year (12 months) about to pass into or be transformed into a new year.

It may be that the fatal idea of 13 originated from the idea of the death of Jacob after blessing his 12 sons; the death of Christ on the cross after blessing his 12 disciples at the last supper; when in reality, both Jacob and Christ symbolize the progression or advancement into a new phase of existence. But do not understand that 13 refers to physical death, but rather to the beginning of a new cycle. In all cases, it is a symbol of power, which may be good or bad as you use it.

You will remember in my first series of lessons how 22 (4) indicates mastery and strength; how 4 in its good aspect means building for advancement; while in its reverse it means limitation; and in its reverse will bring actual destruction upon itself. Thirteen is the gate to a new birth and in the Masonic ritual is symbolical of the preparation for the building of the new Temple. The first nine numbers or digits refer to the physical aspect of things; 10 indicates the progress of the body onward and upward to a greater strength and 13 opens the way of spiritual advancement. The strongest position in which to find a 13 is in the Birth Path; yet it is also to be considered in the other three-Talents, Personality and Destinv.

The next combination of digits which equal 4 is 22, and is another step upwards, denoting in its positive aspect power, practical mastery of material things, and universal uplift. In its negative aspect it indicates indifference, an inferiority complex, narrowness and repression. In its reverse or destructive aspect its influence is actual evil, black magic, crime, danger and in the end, failure. The next combination of numbers is 31, which has a meaning similar to 22, and in its negative aspect is not fortunate from a worldly point of view. Forty is much the same. The esoteric value of numbers is not carried beyond 52 (7) which signifies the 52 weeks of the year when a new cycle begins.

stances to govern us. To begin making it bright in spots and intelligible we must determine to take our destiny into our own hands. The method is simply and easy. Set apart a few minutes each day and during that time act, think and feel in a manner quite distinct from the ordinary. Take a short holiday period each day and banish from your mind all the thoughts and emotions, worries and problems which usually occupy your attention and concentrate exclusively on something quite disconnected from your routine life. It does not especially matter what it is that you choose to occupy yourself with during this holy period. In schools of Initiation the Candidate is given something quite definite, but those who have not vet enrolled themselves in such a school can select something for themselves. One person might occupy himself with exercising the muscles of his fingers; another might strive to control his breathing and bring it completely under the sway of his volition; another might enflame himself in prayer to obtain the Knowledge and Conversation of his own HOLY GUARDIAN ANGEL. But whatever you choose to do let it be done right ---do not for one second permit yourself to slide back into habitual ways of acting, thinking and feeling. During this sacramental period do exactly what you will, surpass your ordinary self and put forth the best that you have within you. Actually be master of yourself. Set apart each day a short period of time and make it a perfect talisman. It will become like an oasis in the desert from which you can constantly draw forth spiritual nourishment and stimulation. It will act like yeast to leaven the whole of your life. And the rythm of this procedure will rest and recreate you. A short ceremony is one of the best ways of concentrating the attention on something quite different from daily affairs. Use of that given below will

serve the purpose even if you do it only in your imagination or mentally.

- (1) Stand erect in the center of the room and touch the forehead with the right thumb placed between the index and medius and say—ATEH (which means "Unto Thee").
- (2) Then touch the breast and say-MALKUTH (the Kingdom).
- (3) Touching the right shoulder, say-VE GEBURAH (and the Power).
- (4) Touching the left shoulder, say-VE GEDULAH (and the Glory).
- (5) Grasp the hands upon the breast, say—LE OLAHM, AMEN (to the Ages, Amen).
- (6) Now turn to the North, using the right thumb placed as described above, make the Averse Pentagram of EARTH. Then vibrate the following words, prolonging or chanting it--ARO ELOHIM (which means Powers of EARTH).
- (7) Now turn to the West, make the Averse Pentagram of WATER.
 Vibrate—MIM ELOHIM (Powers of WATER).
- (8) Turn to the East, make the Averse Pentagram of AIR. Vibrate— RUACH ELOHIM (Powers of AIR).
- (9) Turn to the South. Make the Averse Pentegram of FIRE. Vibrate—ASH ELOHIM (Powers of FIRE).
- (10) Turn again to the West, extend the arms straight out from the shoulders so that you stand in the form of a cross and say, chanting—On my right hand the Bull, Before me the Dragon, Behind me the Man, On my left hand the Lion. For about me flames the Pentagram and in the column stands the six-rayed Star.
- (11) Repeat (1) to (5) inclusive, which is called the Qabalistic Cross.
