AVING interpreted the popularly called "unlucky" number 13—which is really a very happy number because it opens the door to higher development—we now turn our attention to 14 (5).

Number 14—This is a number denoting change, new things, variety, movement, but it also carries with it the threat of natural forces; of the destructive elements of Nature. Fire, tempests, floods and other causes menace,-but only to the careless and foolhardy. Just as fire can be man's best friend or his worst enemy, so the number 14 can be helpful or harmful. Just as one does not allow fire to be spread uncontrolled so one must be cautious in handling the number 14. When 14 occurs prominently in a calculation, one must examine his methods, aims and attitude carefully and be sure he is using his abilities rightly and not opening the door to detrimental influences.

You will remember that in last month's articles, I explained that numbers in themselves were neither lucky nor unlucky; but that so-called "luck" was merely an expression of harmony. If we work in harmony with our vibrations, success comes to us. If we are out of harmony, then we meet with what we call bad luck. 14 is not a number of actual bad luck, but one which calls for caution, reconstruction, and shows a lack of balance or harmony which must be met positively. If we meet this vibration negatively, then bitterness, loss and trouble are likely to overtake us. We, who meet 14, must not fight change nor try to sidestep it, but welcome it, knowing that only by change do we advance

14 is a higher expression of 5 (the letter N). Change, regeneration are indicated and this vibration is particularly powerful when found in the Personality, or purely physical vibration denoted by the consonants in one's name. In this position 14 usually indicates an excess of physical influences. The Biblical symbolism of 14 is found in the story of Pharaoh's dream which Joseph interpreted. The number 14 is associated with the sign Taurus, the bull, and kine or cows were sacred to Taurus. The seven lean kine or years and the seven fat kine or years equal 14-a period of regeneration in which the years of plenty were used to bridge over the years of shortage. This dream was a warning. Had it been disregarded, great suffering would have followed; but all during the time of plenty, food was gathered and stored up, so that when the lean years came there was an abundance of food in the land of Egypt.

Another example of the 14 vibration was when Jacob served 7 years for Rachel, only to find, at the end of that time, that Laban had deceived him and given him Leah instead of Rachel for his wife. Then Laban made Joseph serve another 7 years, which was 14. The first seven years brought him victory on the physical plane, in that he did receive Leah as his wife. But he did not love her and was not happy till he had served another seven years and attained the spiritual happiness, typified by his love for Rachel. 14 being the number of regeneration and advancement to something higher than the mere physical plane.

When rightly understood and divested of its vulgar interpretation, sex is the creative force of the universe. The number 5 (the letter N) is the fundamental sex number. 14 is sex raised to enthusiasm, affection, love, devotion, etc.; or else degraded to lust, passion, and mere physical gratifications. Meet this vibration positively. Make your aims pure and high and follow them persistently if you would advance and profit by the changes which the number 14 always indicates.

Number 15—This is often a difficult number, and is always a number of mystery—yet of power as well. It can bring success and fortune, or exactly the opposite. It usually indicates a good talker and in forecasting is favorable for obtaining money or favors. It indicates that the possessor should follow some concrete business enterprise, such as real estate, building materials, mines, food stuffs, etc. In fact, something that can be actually handled. It is not a highly mental num-

ber; it emphasizes the "safety first" element and is exactly opposite to the speculative and "take a chance" influence of 14.

While 6 expresses love and affection and is honest and reliable, 15 is Kaballistically interpreted as evil, black magic; and astrologically as stagnation and death.

15 is a crafty number, and shows an inclination to pervert. It indicates waste or useless matter that must be discarded and left behind. It is a purely physical number indicative of the physical body as contrasted with the soul. It is heavy, static, greedy, selfish. It typifies Saturn or Satan, the prince of darkness; never a beneficial influence.

The Bible story of the devils that were cast into the swine is illustrative of 15. Swine always typify greed and when the elementals or devils entered the swine, the swine cast themselves into the sea and were destroyed. 15 is always symbolical of Satan, evil. Greed always leads to destruction, and 15 indicates lies, poison, deceit-the selfishness which must be comquered before the soul advances. It is the number said to be used by Black Magicians for evil purposes. It smothers spirituality and encourages despair and wickedness. It indicates the lust and wickedness connected with buying, selling or exchange. It profits by human wickedness and stands for all phases of evil.

We do not have to go back to Bible history and tradition to illustrate the evil influence of the number 15. 1932, 1 plus 9 plus 3 plus 2 equals 15. We carelessly speak of 1932 as a 6 year; but the deeper interpretation shows that it is a 15 year, and I think almost everyone will agree that this has been a year when evil influences have been rampant. Greed, deceit, failures, privation, suffering and all satanic powers have prevailed. Astrologers, Numerologists and other students of the occult understand this. No one man, no group of men have been to blame. Cosmic influences have made this a time of regeneration, of "taking account of stock". Pride, extravagance, greed, selfishness, political and private corruption-all must be considered and trampled under foot before humanity can rise from the depths of despair to which it has sunk. For convenience, we shall refer to the writer of our first specimen as "Mr. A," and that of our second specimen as "Miss B." It must also be borne in mind that these are not intended for detailed analyses by any means.






