Calling your son or daughter a liar, stamps them forever in their memory chamber as something to be avoided and as the years pass they become unfit to carry the responsibilities of Life.

The Lord's Prayer and the Zodiac

In looking over some old clippings recently I came across several that linked up the Bible with Astrology in pointing out to all who had eyes to see the relationship between the Twelve signs of the Zodiac and the Twelve Apostles. The twelve months of the year and the twelve tribes of Israel. The seven planets, and the seven days of the week. Seven primary colors, seven notes of the scale in music. Seven years of famine and seven years of plenty. But the most extraordinary clipping was one taken from a 1912 issue of *Modern Astrology*, from a manuscript writing of "Zariel" stating the relationship of the Lord's Prayer to that of the Zodiac, which I give you in a simplified manner.

OUR FATHER WHICH ART IN HEAVEN.—The salutation to the Sun which is in Heaven, refers to the old testament as the "Father of Light."

HALLOWED BE THY NAME;—Refers to the Sun's transit through Aries, the Ascendant, which personifies and names the person. This is the sign of the Sun's exaltation.

THY KINGDOM COME:—Pertains to Taurus, an earth sign or kingdom, Taurus represents the stored up energy or substance, corresponds in the horoscope to the house of wealth and personal property.

THY WILL BE DONE:—Pertains to Gemini, the sign of the twins; corresponds also to Cain and Abel in the Bible, signifies conflict between the will and the intellect. It is ruled by Mercury, Ruler of Intelligence.

ON EARTH:—The sun in Cancer, ruled by the Moon which rules and is the Mother of all things. Cancer is the fourth sign in the horoscope and rules home, grave, real estate in a nativity. This is also the Nadir or lowest point in a horoscope.

AS IT IS IN HEAVEN:—The Royal sign of Leo, the celestial mansion of the Sun. The throne of God. Also symbol of the golden Age, wherein all things are perfect. Heaven is the center of the Heart (feeling) rather than of the brain or intellect.

GIVE US THIS DAY OUR DAILY BREAD:—Pertains to the sign of Virgo, Symbolized by the Virgin with the Sheaf of wheat. Rules the solar Plexus and the digestive system and corresponds with the house of work and service.

AND FORGIVE US OUR TRESPASSES AS WE FORGIVE THOSE WHO TRESPASS AGAINST US:—Sun in Libra, the sign of the scales and justice. In the horoscope it corresponds to the house of enemies, partnerships and marriage. Here we learn to give and take, forgive and make allowances for the shortcomings of others.

AND LEAD US NOT INTO TEMPTATION:—The sign of the Serpent, Scorpio, which governs sex and the generative organs. It also rules the eighth house, the house of death. Is Symbolical that Generation and death are one.

BUT DELIVER US FROM EVIL:—The sign Sagittarius, symbolized by the Archer who shoots the arrow high. It rules the house of religion, science and philosophy, to which man looks for deliverance from ignorance in himself.

FOR THINE IS THE KINGDOM:—The Sun in Capricorn, the earthly leader, means organization, blue-blood aristocracy; corresponds to the tenth house and brings honors, reputation, etc. It also rules the knees which must bend in submission and supplication.

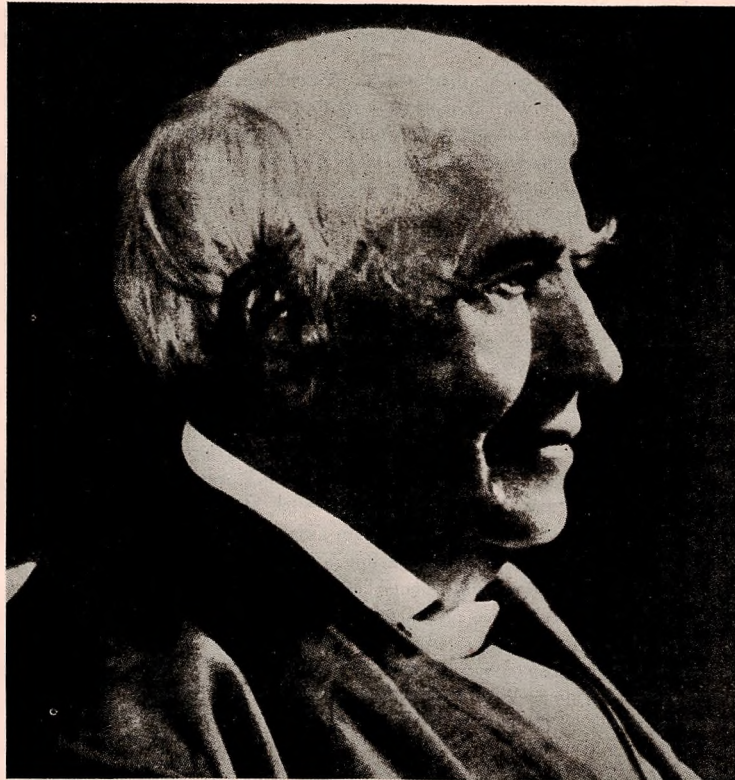
AND THE POWER:—Sun in Aquarius, the Sign of MAN; it bestows instinctive knowledge of human nature to those under it and gives power over their fellow men. It rules successful public men, politicians, salesmen, etc. It rules the house of friendship, hopes and wishes.

Complete Course in Astrology

ASTROLOGY! What is it? It is the study of the influences of the stars and planets upon the affairs of mankind. By stars we mean those that are fixed in the heavens, such as the constellations of the Zodiac and by planets, we mean those that move through the Zodiac, such as: Mercury, Venus, Saturn, Jupiter, Mars, Uranus and Neptune. The Sun and Moon are not planets, but their influence is very important in Astrology.

That the heavenly bodies do act directly upon this earth, is beyond dispute. Animal and vegetable life would be alike impossible without the Sun's vitalizing power. The ocean would be tideless were it not for the Sun and Moon. The feeblest star ray that reaches us from that great beyond, means the expenditure of energy by that star.

The physical solar system is as much one whole as the physical body of man and just as the latter contains separate centers which we call heart, lungs, brain, etc., so the former contains separate planetary centers, each of which is the focus for a special kind of vital activity. This solar system is one vast organized whole; nowhere dead, nowhere unconscious, nowhere useless, nowhere accidental but carefully gathered, ordered and supervised.

Just as the Sun is the center of the solar system, so the heart is the vital center of the physical body of man. In a horoscope, where the Sun is afflicted by malefic planets there is deficient vitality and an irregularity of heart action. Venus has to do with the emotions and Mercury with intellect and speech. Most of our human activities can be grouped under the heads: physical, or practical; emotional, or passionate; and mental or intellectual. Each of the planets has its correspondences in each of these classes, but most of them have a closer association with one class than with another.

The Ascendant or Rising Sign is that Zodiacal Sign on the Eastern horizon at the minute of birth. It gives the physical make-up and that part of the personality most in evidence in daily contact with others.

The houses 1 to 12, in Astrology, are fixed divisions of the earth extended out into space. A good illustration would be to consider the earth as the hub of a wheel and the house divisions as the spokes that rotate with the earth. Since the earth makes a complete rotation every 24 hours, it follows that the Sun, Moon, and every planet and every Sign of the Zodiac successively pass through every

one of the houses. A birth at dawn, would have the Sun in the first house; at noon in the 10th, at sunset in the 7th and at midnight in the 4th.

Each house represents a certain department of life and planets falling in these houses have much to do with the affairs represented by such houses. For instance, Saturn in the 2nd house, that of money, restricts and keeps the person who has this in his chart, grinding away for bare necessities; whereas, Jupiter there will bring money, and if Venus is there too, there will always be some one to spend it for him.

The 7th house has to do with marriage and partnership. If any one of the malefic planets, such as Saturn, Mars, Uranus or Neptune fall there, it does not speak well for harmony. Even Mercury there and badly aspected can make things unpleasant by way of a sharp, critical tongue.

Each sign of the Zodiac has its definite characteristics, modified by planets that may occupy them at birth. Each planet too has definite characteristics and is in harmony with certain of the Zodiacal Signs. It naturally follows, therefore, that when a planet falls in a sign where it is out of harmony that the affairs of the particular department of life affected are bound to go awry. A good illustration is Mars in the Zodiacal Sign of Libra. Libra is the natural home of Venus and when the warlike Mars falls in that sign there is bound to be a disturbance in love affairs. Furthermore, Libra is the natural seventh house sign and as before stated, the 7th house has to do with marriage and Mars there will make war.

We know that everything is at a certain rate of vibration and now that we have radio, it will require no stretch of the imagination to believe that we humans are ourselves radio receiving and sending stations, and naturally of a finer tuning

than our mechanical radio sets. Our human tuning would have to be finer to account for mental telepathy. We receive vibratory influences from the various planets that have varying effects upon the human system through the brain and nerves.

What is a horoscope? It is a map of the heavens with relation to our earth at any given moment. The factors employed are the Planets, Sun, Moon, the Zodiac and the twelve celestial houses. There are three movements of our earth and its one satellite, the Moon, to be noticed Astrologically.

First:—The revolution of the earth around the Sun, which is completed in one year.

Second:—The revolution of the Moon around the earth, which is completed in one month.

Third:—The rotation of the earth on its axis, which is completed in one day.

The first of these cycles furnishes our earth with its Zodiac. This begins at a point where the Sun appears to cross our equator, in a northerly direction, at the first point of Aries, about March 21st, each year (Spring Equinox).

We speak of the Sun as rising in the East, but we know that it only appears to rise because of the rotation of the earth from West to East. In the same way, we speak of the Sun as traveling through the various signs of the Zodiac when in reality it is the earth making its annual revolution about the Sun.

There are 360 degrees in a circle and there are 12 signs of the Zodiac of 30 degrees each. Since the earth revolves about the Sun at the rate of about one degree per day, we have the influence of the Sun in each of the 12 Zodiacal Signs for about 30 days. Each Sign of the Zodiac has its own characteristics which are reflected in the natives of the various Signs modified by the various planets and the Sign ascending at birth.

We find that the names of things are quite descriptive of their quality and this holds true with the planets; Mars—martial; Jupiter—Jovian; Saturn—Saturnine.

Individuals born strongly under the influence of a planet answer to the characteristics of that planet. If someone comes up and slaps you on the back in friendly greeting you may bet that Jupiter is prominent in his chart. If you know someone who is cold and distant, who stays much by himself, you may be sure that he is much influenced by Saturn.

Each Sign of the Zodiac has rule over a

World Depression—Cause and Cure

THE growing intelligence began to suffer from a guilty conscience, so for a compensation, rather than of repentance, it established a form of worship, which became the established religion, for the worship of the Lord. The growing intelligence imagines a creator outside of itself, so it searches the whole world for it, under the name of science. Science thinks of its own creation of religion as too ignorant to be relied upon, but its superstitious fears prevent it from discarding it, like it did the habitation of peace. It has now grown older and wiser, proud and too stiffnecked in self righteousness to admit its error. The waters were divided from the waters, by establishing a subconsciousness, and imagining a super-consciousness, or a supernatural, when there is nothing in the universe superior to the consciousness of peaceful innocence. As soon as there is an attempt made to organize the truth, it must either break the bonds of an organization or die because of being limited.

Religion by interpretation, is relating back, or binding back, to God, or Zion, or habitation of peace, from the mountain top of vision.

It will have to be remembered that Adam, the full grown intelligence, was in a deep sleep. That is to say: innocence, the child of God while asleep, dreamed such a world as now seems to exist, but he awakens to the realization that it was only a dream. When he does awaken to the realization that he is not the lord of creation, he will humble himself, and repent of his childishness, and return to his father. It is a childish thing to build a world entirely of knowledge, it is like a rope of sand, it will crumble to dust. Even labor that is done ignorantly, is more praiseworthy than knowledge that does nothing. Knowledge is the double edged sword, a thing that is not to be used carelessly. Knowledge is the manna from heaven, that is only to be gathered as it is used. If it is gathered in excess of what is used for food, in the week days or the weak days between illumination without understanding and illumination with understanding, it will go to waste, by being misapplied. The sixth day will be strong enough to gather and store up enough for two, which will bring rest even though the work is unfinished. To be certain of what there is to do, brings rest, but the uncertainty in a matter of vital importance, results in unrest.

It is not a crime to know how to pick a lock, but it is a crime to pick a lock with the intent to steal. Knowledge is the same in the spiritual, as money is in the world:

it is a means to an end, but it is not the end. That is why it has been said: "The love of money is the root of all evil" or the love of knowledge is the root of all evil. It is not that knowledge is evil; but the love of knowledge more than the love of innocence, is the root of all evil. The mind, or knowledge, is depicted by Egypt, which had to undergo the seven plagues, before the gods were given their freedom. When the mind instead of the soul, is given the rulership, all education will go for the development of the intelligence, to the neglect of its moral responsibility. When this is the case, knowledge is stored up to be used for private purposes, instead of for the good of all, which is to misuse it. Knowledge is universal, and must be so applied, or it will react upon itself destructively. Universal education is only an experiment, of very few days, when compared to the life of the human race. The theory that is entertained, by the educators is that with knowledge, and knowledge only, the world is to be conquered. This is only a theory, because even the educators that teach such a theory, have not yet conquered the world. Neither have the preachers that teach salvation after death, any tangible evidence that their theoretical teaching is true. They have been promising the same things for the past few thousand years, which is to have vision without knowledge. If it were possible to reform the reformers of the world life, a speedy recovery of both material and spiritual prosperity would be a reasonable hope, after faithful waiting, and the practice of charity.

It must be realized that we are now living in the harvest time of the world, as it is a time of gathering together all things into a state of tangibility, and winnowing the chaff from the grain. All that is theoretical, whether it be sacred or secular, must be cut off as fruitless branches. Everything is common to all. So long as some things are sacred and others profane, there will continue to be strife between the two compartments, as to which shall have the rulership. No one thing is to have the rulership over any other one thing, but he that gives the greatest service is to be the most highly praised. The idea is: what does man consider, of all the gods, to bring into service for the improvement of universal living! In all branches of produce, whether it be for the production of knowledge, or the production of potatoes, labor and nature are the greatest servants. Yet labor without love, or something more than self to work for, is slavery. When one is working with his beloved, to bring to birth a certain ideal, the labor is performed as if it were play.

The ideal of all ideals, the romance of all romance, depicted by all the sacred writings of the world, is the heroic feat of rescuing the heroine from the camp of the enemy. So long as the course of life is obscured by darkness and mystery, the light that is to lighten the whole world, has not yet been lifted up out of the subconsciousness into heaven. There was a time, for the sake of scientific research, and before universal education was enforced, such a condition was endurable, but now the time has come for a great change. There is no salvation by the law, it must come by the individual illumination and understanding, of the whole meaning of existence, the unknown is to become the known. Know thyself, is the saying of one of the seven wise men of the world, and this knowledge is wisdom. "If I be lifted up, I will draw all men unto me." So long as innocence remains in the underworld, the underworld is innocent, it is the overworld, or overlord that is guilty, which is law without justice to all. Spirit, body, soul and mind are to be treated with equal and undivided devotion and love, without respect of persons. That which is brought into service the most frequently, is that which is the most dearly loved, and the more it is brought into service the stronger it becomes.

This dual life of labor with love, cooperating in all the functions of life, is the conquest of the world, or the conquest of self. To turn everything over, to lift up the consciousness that has become submerged, and put the imagination down, would reverse the whole aspect of everything. That which appears as evil, would be transmuted into revelation, heaven (heaved up) to be rained down pure and gentle as the spring rains. All

Many will ask "What is meant by a '1' man, a '2' woman, etc." "Where must we look for these numbers?" "Which vibrations are the strongest?" In general, a "1" man or woman is a person in whose names the "1" vibration predominates, or in whose name the "1" appears in one of

strong totals. Of course you will remember that the Birth Path is the most important position or vibration of all because it is the only fact about a person's life that cannot be changed. Names may be altered or entirely changed—and should be, if there is inharmony—the Birth Path is unalterable. Therefore, a person with a "1" Birth Path is a "1" person. The Total Name or Destiny number is also very important. If this vibration should be a "1," and this number appears prominently in the Birth Path, or if it occurs several times in the name; if the Type of the person is a "1"; if his Pinnacle of success is a "1" or "10"; then, in these cases his pioneering instinct and creative ability should be considered, and even though the actual Birth Path might not be a "1," he still would have to be considered a "1." Here is an example. A man born on the 10th of January, 1909, (1—1—1—3) would have to be called a "1" man even though the Birth Path is "3." Here is another: Suppose his Destiny were "1" and his Birth Path "9," here again we would say that his pioneering talents would lead him into a wide field of activity. Actually, a "9" does not alter the value of the number with which it is associated as you can easily prove for yourself. Add a "9" to any number you choose and reduce to lowest terms and see what you get. If the Birth Path should be a double number as 11— or 22—1, that would indicate super power as a creator or pioneer. In the first case (11—=3) his artistic temperament would have to be reckoned with; in the second case (22—1=5) his selling ability and love of change would be considered.

With these examples, I think anyone will be able to determine whether a person is a "1," a "2," etc. Therefore, I believe all I have to do is to list the vocations suited to each number. This is in no way a complete list, but will serve to show the trend to be followed by the different vibrations.

Number 1—This is the pioneer number and those dominated by it must be free and unhampered to carry out their creative ideas. This vibration does not so much designate *what* you shall be as *how* you shall be it. Pioneers, explorers, inventors, designers, aviators, superintendents, teachers, leaders, managers, generals, captains, writers, heads of any sort of an enterprise, promotors.

Number 2—Persons with this vibration work well with others. They are never leaders, but always carry out the plans of others. They are painstaking, capable of

handling details. They are diplomatic and have much tact so that diplomats and politicians frequently vibrate to the number 2. This number is the rhythm number and expresses itself through music, dancing, poetry. A "2" should be a good statistician, bookkeeper, secretary, arbitrator, collector of facts and information for others to use, statesman, student detail worker, companion, one of a group of musicians or dancers or actors.

Number 3—This person is happy in lines which touch beauty, health or comfort and give opportunity for self-expression. He should avoid long hours of confinement or too close attention to details. Artists, lawyers, nurses, dieticians, entertainers, humorists, hotel and tea-room managers, beauticians, dealers in drugs, art goods, musical instruments, groceries, interior decorators and landscape gardeners. Threes are best in cheerful and artistic occupations.

Number 4—This number insists upon system, accuracy, logic, organization. Unless this vibration is handled in an aggressive and positive manner its possessor may become a drudge, a mere follower of routine, without ambition, a slave to habit. This number leads to high places if handled rightly. Builders, either in materials or ideas, efficiency engineers, mechanics, draftsmen, architects, electricians, technicians in any line, professors of logical subjects, buyers scientists, accountants, medical specialists and surgeons, chemists, manufacturers, stenographers, office managers, clerks, and any routine business requiring skill, perseverance, and energy.

Number 5—Persons with this number are "go-getters" for experience. They are

White and Black Magic and Magicians

White Magic

UNKNOWN to the majority of people, there is a force, a mental atmosphere that forever surrounds them, and vibrations that are constantly hovering over their mental faculties. THE ASTROLOGICAL STORY FOR JANUARY, 1932

Before saying anything about January, the first calendar month of the New Year of 1932, it might not be amiss at this writing (November 21st, 1931) to say something about the "wind up" of the very trying year of 1931.

21. Another good day up to about 2 P. M. From 2 to 3 P. M. be cautious in letter writing and contracts.

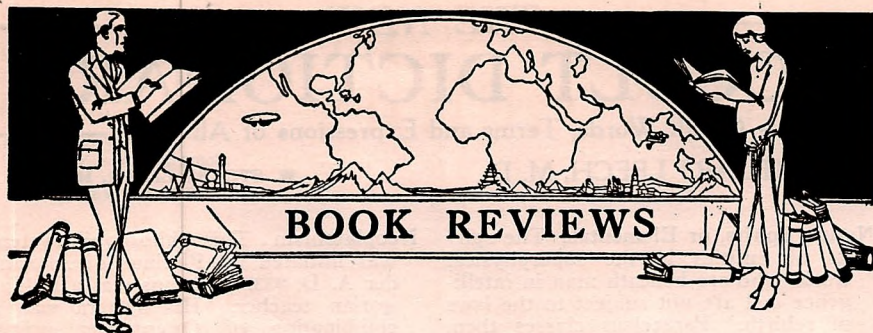

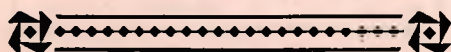

Nature Spirits, or Elementals The spirits or entities in the superphysical world who are beneath man in intelligence and are not subject to the laws of rebirth. Paracelsus classes them as sylphs, nymfs, hamadryads, gnomes, salamanders, and undines. I will state on my own authority that the most easily recognized or perceived are the undines, especially on the approach or during a storm. In rain, snow or sleet they are actively present. On the approach of a tornado they sound on the superphysical like a crowd applauding an open air speaker. Again they may give forth noises like thousands of excited geese. During an ordinary snow storm the noise they give forth has the effect of one similar to that of chickens feeding and playing. Popular Syn.—Elves, satyrs, kobolds, imps, goblins, trolls, pixies, peris, djinns, good-people.

Some of them have the power of changing the form of their body. The action of drugs will make them appear to some individuals.

Naya The holy serpent of the Singalese. The cobra dicapello.

Naylor, James This was an English imposter of 1656 who set himself up as the Deity. He was punished in Bristol as a Blasphemer.

Ndembo, The A secret religious order using magical arts existing in the lower Congo. Also called Kita.

Necromancy Syn.—black art, black magic. It was through its Italian form "nigromancia" that it derived the name of black-art. In the middle ages it was called sorcery. Levi in his Ritual of Transcendent Magic says "Evocations should always have a motive and a becoming end, otherwise they are works of darkness and folly, dangerous to health and reason."

Neesings In the book of Job the word is used in connecting with Behemoth and Leviathan.

"The neesings of Leviathan characterize what may be described as the whisking of the solar force through and about the initiate which at every pronounced increase of voltage causes greater illumination to the seer, actually visible as light." Comte.

Negative. One who is passive. Naioth or 'oth is negative.

Negro A relic of the Lemurian epoch.

Neith (Egyptian) One of the four gods. The earth. See Neph.

Nemesis G. Retributive justice. In mythology the goddess of chastisement and vengeance.

Neophyte n (ne-o-fit) G. A novice. Convert. Newly planted. Paul uses it in 1st Tim., Ch. 3, vr. 6.

One who has been enthused by a spiritual experience. One who has obtained a glimpse through "the crack of the door,"—and is in search of more light. One who is preparing to be initiated into the sacred mysteries. His first appearance on the astral plane is resented by nature spirits and they make bold attempts to frighten him, perhaps realizing the coming of a new master.

Neoplatonism This philosophic system was initiated by Plotinus of Alexander A. D. 233. Plotinus was a Pythagorean teacher. His system was a combination of Orientalism with Platonism: His system was a union of philosopher and priest. The founder was austere and leaned to asceticism. The system was a strong attempt to live an angelic life while in the flesh. Porphyry induced him to write the memorable tidings of Peace and Good-will to Flaccus wherein the practical part of Neoplatonism is briefly set forth in illuminating language.

Neph (Egyp.) The air with man, or the spirit.

Nephesh (Heb.) Breath of life, the vital soul.

Nervaura An emanation surrounding human beings.

Nervengeist A spiritualistic term meaning psychic body.

Nerves, Voluntary They had their start in the Saturn revolution of our earth-period, and were built by the forces of the higher part of the desire-body. They have transformed the dense body into an extraordinary instrument.

Nerves, Sympathetic During the moon-period they were the only nerves possible. The Ego controls the dense body through the blood, and at all times drives the blood in the direction of greatest activity or irritation. Starlyng and Bayliss, physiologists, have recorded some good experiments along this line showing action while the sympathetic system was blocked.

Neptune Called Vulcan by western mystics. This wonderful planet has great influence over us, but is not considered a member of our solar system, which is realized when we apply Bodes law of distances. It completes its orbital revolution in 165 years. See "nine."

The radiations rule and direct the ductless glands of our body. Like all planets it has two sets of vibrations. The tendencies of its higher vibrations are artistic, music, religious, devotional, intuitive, silence; while that of its lower are toward deception, cheating, stealing, and clandestine sexuality. Neptune's higher vibrations cannot reach the low and vulgar. Neptune people have blue eyes, soft silky hair, thin faces, nervous looking, and often wearing a startled look. It is the planet of Divinity and is the octave of Mercury, and often called the light bearer of the Spiritual Sun. By nature occult and it will eventually raise man from the human to divinity.

Neschamah (Heb.) The spirit.

Netzach H. Victory. Seventh of the ten sephiroth of the Kabbalah. The masculine potency.

New Cup, Wine Cup It appears as a flower-cup on the top of a stem in the region of the throat. See seed-cup, also Galilee.

New Existence of Man Upon the Earth Name of a spiritualistic journal which was published first by Robert Owen year 1854.

ever rendered me the unhappiest of all beings. And I—ignorant girl that I was—I accepted your guidance. I wish now I had never seen you.'

"The girl had grown more and more hysterical and excited as she continued, and finally broke down in sobs. Here was a dilemma. I reflected for a few moments. I certainly would not sympathize with her. At last, when she appeared to grow somewhat calmer, I began: 'My dear young lady, you are hysterical and entirely unreasonable. You came to me for guidance. You wanted me to save you from a difficult position. I did not invite you here. I gave you the exact truth. I afforded you all the aid possible to improve your situation and rescue you from the sloughs of despair into which you were rapidly sinking. The correct thing for you to do, continue doing what I outlined for you, and when you are confirmed as a city school teacher you will express your gratitude to me from the bottom of your heart.'

"She leaped to her feet, hastily brushed away her tears, cast me an angry glance and said: 'Never. That day will never come. You have completely destroyed my love and my happiness, and I shall never forgive you. I wish I had never seen you.'

Oh, I do not know to what state of despair this terrible mental torture is apt to conduct me. You must be a veritable monster, devoid of all human feelings, gloating over the misery of others like a vulture over a corpse, happy to have cast me into this terrible state of having ruined my life forever by having destroyed my love,

hope and happiness. I will insist on telling you, however, that I still love this man. I regard him as my only love, as my true husband. He does not belong to his wife. He belongs to me, just as I shall belong to him forever and ever. What pleasure could it afford you to destroy my happiness? Oh, I hate you, I hate you!' I calmly tore the letter to shreds and dropped them into the wastebasket. It is superfluous to state that I never even thought of answering any of these hysterical missives.

"And then, one afternoon, I received a surprise. The maid announced a visitor. Absent minded I told her to admit the caller to my study. Someone came in and closed the door. I looked up. There stood the young school teacher. I greeted her with a pleasant smile and invited her to be seated. She appeared quite calm, but I could plainly see the traces of recent grief on her attractive features. Evidently the storm had abated and left behind a sort of mental calm which might lead to a complete cure, or at least to a restoration of her equanimity. In humble tones she stated that she had again been forced to come to me for guidance. Would I forgive her for writing those awful letters? I dismissed them with a wave of my hand and then began to talk to her in a calm, encouraging manner. She listened with the greatest attention. At last, when I stopped, she uttered a deep sigh and said: 'You almost convince me, I need help. I am preparing even now for the next examination. But this time I suffer from the pangs of my conscience. I cannot forget that I am a dishonored woman, that I have lost something which I shall never be able to restore, the only thing worthwhile a woman possesses, namely her honor. And I have lost it.' Then she broke down again in sobs. When she had grown calm once more I began to talk to her, striking directly at the chief cause of her present grief.

"My dear girl," I commenced, "in order to aid you to completely regain your self-composure, self-respect and confidence, permit me to talk to you plainly and frankly. You, like all other women, are suffering from a delusion. What is honor? What is dishonor? You and others of your sex consider yourself dishonored when inadvertently you have had certain relations with members of the opposite sex under circumstances which you consider as unconventional. Whence came this false idea? For it is a false idea, as I shall presently show you. Throughout the history of mankind, and even in legend and tradition, a woman's honor seems to have been exclusively considered in matters pertaining to sex. This idea has been transmitted from generation to generation, until it has become so firmly implanted in the human mind that sight

has been completely lost of the actual truth of the matter. Honor, my dear young lady, while it may be an incident of, bears no absolute relation to, sex. Yet conventions, traditions, legend, would have it so for no apparent reason whatever. And again, why should a woman be called dishonored under certain circumstances and not under others? Why should a single woman be dishonored and not a married one? Yet both are participating in a similar action. But a married woman is not dishonored. It therefore depends on the social relation of those concerned. The only manner in which I could possibly permit the use of the words 'honor' or 'dishonor' would be if you, for example, had pledged yourself in marriage or were actually married, and then deliberately violated your word or promise by engaging in an act of infidelity. In the same way is a man dishonored, if he violates his pledged word according to etiquette or convention, or whatever it may be called. You see, therefore, that in the actual sense of the word you have not lost your honor, because you have not violated any vow or pledge or word. Neither have you betrayed anyone's faith or trust. You have simply engaged in an unconventional love-affair, from which you have now successfully emerged. If we wish to render justice where justice is due, then it was the man, and not you, who really lost honor, for he violated his marriage-vow thus betraying a trust. But you did not, because you were not in honor bound or pledged to anyone.

"As I proceeded with my elucidation, the girl's face gradually lighted up with understanding and renewed encouragement. I stopped talking. For a moment she seemed to reflect. Then she said slowly: 'If that is the real Truth about honor, it places my experience in an entirely different light.'

"It is the Truth about honor, my dear young lady," I replied. "My explanation may sound brutally frank to some people, yet when calmly and logically regarding it, am I not right? Have you actually lost anything? No, you are already regaining your self-respect. You regret your sentiment of the past, your momentary weakness, a feeling to which all humanity is subject. Simply bury the past in the oblivion of your mind. You are what you are and what is in you to be. Live only for the future and profit from past experience. Thus you shape your life according to the law of progress.

"She was profuse in her gratitude. Two weeks later she came again. I could hardly believe my eyes. Her entire appearance had changed. Instead of dejection I saw hope and enthusiasm shining in her handsome countenance. Her eyes sparkled with renewed joy of living. 'To-morrow the examination will be held.' she exclaimed, the moment we were en-

gaged in conversation. 'Oh, I feel so confident I am going to pass this time.'

"Of course you will pass, my dear," I said. "There is not the slightest doubt about it. Try and be as calm and collected as possible. Maintain your ideal. Never lose sight of it. Visualize yourself in your future position. Permit me to congratulate you in advance. I can see a bright and wonderful future for you."

"Another week passed. Then one day she came rushing into my study. 'Look at this,' she cried, handing me an official looking paper. One glance at it apprized me of the cause of her unbounded enthusiasm. She had successfully passed the examination, made a brilliant grade and had been awarded a well-paying position in one of the large schools in a neighboring city. I shared her enthusiasm as I congratulated her upon her success. She had in addition entirely broken with her former lover, and such without the slightest regret. She even despised him now, could not understand how she could ever have loved him. She was thoroughly cured of her mad attachment.

But the moment conditions are improved to the extent where the individual is assured of its survival, and need no longer fear the dread idea of perishing from poverty, the instinct of Race-Preservation once again becomes passive and is willing to wait indefinitely and only exert itself under ideal conditions, in other words, when pure and true love is possible."

natural salesmen of either ideas or merchandise. They crave change, travel, excitement. They must have freedom of both speech and action. They are the proverbial "good mixers" and excellent hosts (when someone else does all the work). They love the bright lights and crowds of people. They make successful detectives, salesmen, investigators, vaudeville players, athletes, lawyers (pleading), writers of adventure stories (not essays) and professional couriers. They make good "pep" men, public speakers for inspirational purposes, and psychology lecturers, for they understand human nature.

Number 6—This is the trustworthy, reliable number that can carry responsibility and give advice. These people are the regulators, adjusters, harmonizers, they make good doctors (general practitioners), teachers, home-makers, educators, writers, heads of hotels and hospitals, welfare workers, personnel directors, dealers in whatever touches the home, they succeed in conservative business. A "6" should use his voice. He should support his community activities and can successfully engage in anything which touches home, education, clothing or public service. Many writers and public speakers are "6s", but the nature of their work reflects their helpful, advisory and trustworthy nature.

Number 7—This is the professional and spiritual vibration. A "7" is a thinker, a philosopher, one who finishes any task with scientific exactness. Many professional men and women belong in this vibration. They must work alone—never in partnership. Quality and not quantity production appeals to them. They are law-makers, judges, clergymen, deans, priests, occultists, astronomers, scientists, scientific experts in mining and electricity, financiers, expert weavers, watch makers, technical writers, authority on religious ceremonials, horticulture or anything which brings them in close touch with Nature, real estate. And because he hides his real personality behind his work, many "7s" are superior actors.

Number 8—This is the big business man—the executive—the director—the commercial leader, wholly engrossed with material subjects from an executive point of view. We find him in presidential chairs, on boards of directors. He may be a corporation lawyer, a broker, a banker, an organizer, a commercial magnate, buyer or seller on a large scale, an engineer in some executive capacity. An "8" should be able to hold any position where executive ability and driving qualities are required.

Number 9—This is the humanitarian number who gives of his experiences, inspiration, kindness to the whole world. He may be an artist, writer, healer, reformer, doctor, philanthropist. This again is a number which shows not so much *what* to do, as *how* to do it. A "9" gives freely of himself to all, and service is his keynote. He must work in a wide field and have free expression in some artistic, large way.

Number 10—This vibration is of course like a "1" only more powerful.

Number 11—These people bring inspiration to all they do. They are reformers, ministers, teachers, charity workers, but are not adapted to commercial pursuits. This vibration does not indicate the character of your work but indicates that you bring inspiration to all you undertake. It shows super power.

Number 22—This is the master number, that reaches out to conquer. This person is the master builder in all lines, shown by his other numbers. Many "22s" who do not know their inborn power are found in inferior positions—clerks, bookkeepers—really vibrating to "4" instead of "22." There are no limits to what a 22 can accomplish.

Now, we come to the end of our twelve lessons in Numerology. I hope they have helped you. Please remember that we but scratched the surface of this vast subject; but we have made a beginning, and should be able to understand the basic facts which underlie all else.
