Obsession is a strong vibration passing over the psychic nerve—not necessarily from the so-called dead; not necessarily harmful.

Obsession and possession is the result of a strong mind or thought playing on the brain mirror. These cases are usually treated as insanity which is decidedly wrong. A person thus afflicted should be physically treated.

Obsession is a germ injected by a powerful thought wave. Insanity is the result of pressure on some vital nerve leading to a brain center. Nine cases out of ten could be cured by eliminating the pressure. Insanity is developed; obsession and possession are transmitted.

When the medical profession recognizes psychic science as a part of their curriculum they will be able to discern between these two maladies, enabling them to classify them, tracing each to its origin.

Obsession can be set aside by the obsessed. If the obses-

sion is a powerful thought being poured into your mind by an outside entity, refuse it, if it is harmful. If it is created by yourself as a result of an accident or contact with a stronger force, refuse to act upon the thought created unless it be a constructive one. Be persistent in demanding intelligent suggestions, and annoying entities will cease to approach you. They can not exist in an atmosphere of intelligence.

Terrors of the Voice Mania

S the church helpless in the latest malady? Can it help the benighted mind? Does it know how to cope with the latest menace to the human mind? Can it find a remedy for the rapidly increasing attacks of the voice mania? There has been an alarming increase of voice mania since the war, especially since the radio's popularity?

From every quarter of the globe reports are coming concerning this "voice mania" that is attacking people in all walks of life. These victims go to their minister, friends and doctors, but none help them. What is the trouble? Are these unfortunate people demented or have they simply "tuned in" on the *universal* voice radio?

Their ears are attuned to a vibration beyond the physical; that is all. This calamity, if it may be called such, is the result of a body chemical known as psychic power; when refined, it attracts intelligent and constructive voices; when unrefined, it attracts marauding and destructive voices.

In 1848, the world was shocked into recognizing there was a wave of these intelligences passing through the minds of those who were attuned to recognize them. The church, realizing the danger to itself, acted promptly to prevent its development with the result, that those who were interested met in secret places at night, giving stimulus to the old saying that "ghosts walk at midnight." Had the church at that time investigated this strange expression in life, they could have builded into the church's structure, a corner stone of greatest value which would have prepared the present generation for this voice culture that would have dominated constructive intelligences.

What can be done to help these unfortunates? Change the food properties, set a stronger mind to work over them; one who understands nature's law and can demonstrate it to the manifesting entity to their benefit. Such a menacing mind is like a microbe and must be dealt with by the same method. Destroy its bed and it can not live. Denying this psychic expression is not the remedy for this voice menace. Directing its expression by correcting its channel is the only remedy. Asylums are not the place for these afflicted ones; they must be watched and attended by those who can see and hear with them.

The minister has no remedy to offer them. The doctor looks wise and if the sufferer appeals too often he is directed to a hospital, treated with derision, or placed in a cell. If appeal is made to friends, they scoff and offer no help.

This is the day of scientific discoveries. Every school and church should have a class for the psychic children. When will the church awaken to the Truth; when will they learn that they must study this vital question and prepare themselves to meet the issue or be swept from their foundation? Those who are ignorant of psychic law are usually the victims of this voice mania.

Healing by Psychic Rays

Depressions And The Why

CCORDING to the Science of Numerology, the digit of this word — DEPRESSION — is 7, and SEVEN is the number of Creative Principles active in our Solar System, which represents the perfection of all there is in physical nature.

There are SEVEN planetary bodies revolving about our Sun, each of which has a potentiality all its own and a character functioning in perfect harmony with the others. These are frequently mentioned as "THE MIND ORGANS OF THE IN-FINITE," and so they are to those of us who recognize God as the Formless Spirit, manifesting Itself, and the CAUSE of all forms—celestial and terrestrial.

MAN, "the fearfully and wonderfully made" form, the temple of the living God, has SEVEN vital centers of consciousness in his body which correspond and vibrate precisely to the nature of the SEVEN heavenly spheres sailing continually and with the utmost regularity, through the electric field of the Sun's zodiac, and, as has been discovered, inspirationally at least, there is a constant reciprocal action of electric and magnetic mind forces at play between the unseen powers above, and their correspondents in the body of humanity below.

Happy Outdoor Life

The Law of Life By ALFRED GOULD

URNING AWAY from this universal childishness of the flesh, let us follow the process of perception further. When the wave impulse from without reaches the brain it loses its progressing wave character by coming in contact with the wave generating processes of that organ and the energy it represents is transformed into the reaction we call "Thought", otherwise "perception". How does this come about? Off the east coast of Tierra del Fuego is to be found Staten Island, Isla de los Estados, a few miles from the main land, with a strong antarctic current flowing north through the strait thus formed. When a strong north or north-east wind blows, it heaps up mountainous waves which, meeting this current, leap up into the air to great heights and serve to retard the momentum of the antarctic flow.

This will serve to illustrate, in a way, what takes place in the human brain when impinged upon by these outward currents of matter and force. When the brain is not developed to the point of intensity of producing new combinations, the wave from without meets little resistance, the wave energy passing through and on. When, however, the brain development grasps any waves reaching it, assimilating and transforming their energy into a new combination with itself, the wave energy is transmitted into what we call "thought," otherwise a stepping stone to the further development of the individual, although generally speaking a very small one. We have said that the wave impulse from without is transformed by that wonderful instrument we call the "Brain" into the reaction we term "thought," otherwise "perception". After the first clash, as above described, how does this come about? As with the water of the waves we spoke of, the elements of the two wave currents mingle together; combine with gyratory motion until the vortex produced creates a return impelling thought wave strong enough to bring with it external physical expression. To this order of brain action, mostly unconscious, belongs for instance the reaction of the prize fighter to the attack of his opponent. This denotes the action of what we might call the purely physical brain and includes all physically intuitive reactive thought. This is the simplest form of mind action and we have characterized it as being mostly "unconscious". What do we mean by this?

We mean to designate the fact of a "personality" behind this thought screen; a personality which, just as in a Punch and Judy show, pulls the strings as the result of decisions arrived at within itself,

sets aside some classes of thoughts as useless and puts forth energy in the development of other classes of thought which it deems beneficial to the furtherance of its progress. Here then we have come a step closer to what is looked upon as the "Mystery of Life." Of course anything we are not capable of analyzing and dissecting is "mysterious" to us. What is this personality and what are its component parts? When the semen of the male fecundates the ovum of the female, the process is essentially the same in principle and practice as the method of thought expression already described. So that the physical flesh-form may grow, it must needs have a support. Taking each atom of flesh growth, the particles, "electrons", which compose it are kept from touching each other by means of an equilibrium of forces which, in their interaction, form crossing stations, so to speak. These constitute the points which hold them within separate places. But the equilibrium of these coarser forces is dependent upon another equilibrium, of essentially like na-

ture but of forces of a more intense and refined nature, which, combining according to their resultant, symbolically speaking, constitute a frame around which the physical body is built up. Being in the same form as the latter and being progressively built up just ahead of it, they constitute a second body within the coarser physical body and one that is built on a more intense and refined combination of force and matter. This second body takes substantially the same outward form as the physical body but, on account of its differing makeup, follows a different law of development. This, then, is the "personality" we have encountered, the agent that activates this body of flesh and uses its wonderful mechanism for the gathering of ever more experiences of Life. To adopt a simile from steel building construction, this body, being constructed on the principle of main supports, at strategic points, holding up the finer network of interlacing physical life between them, in view of the well developed arrangements for renewing the particles which become used up, the instrument, the human body, should give full service until the agent using it can no more profit by the experiences it conveys, on account of the crystallization which holds each individual in its grip in every social scheme yet devised by mankind in the flesh of earth.

Our want of knowledge in tending its several parts causes unnecessary exposure here and there, resulting in the premature disintegration of the exposed parts and, soon, of the main supports, thus letting the whole structure crumble again into dust. This change, named "Death", happens at a relatively early age which, with care and knowledge, will be ultimately prolonged until the moment when the "personality" can no longer acquire adequate compensation in Life Experience for its effort in using the flesh body and will drop the latter through its own will power, like a wornout garment, taking up the thread of Life beyond. We say then that our "personality", our "self", is the seat of our "consciousness" and that it follows a different law of development from that of the flesh body, although the one completely permeates the other throughout physical life on earth. The Personality's organ of expression is the physical brain. Just as the physical brain reacts to the impressions from without brought from the physical outside world through the five senses, so also does the Personality-Brain, composed as it is of more ethereal matter, react to the impressions brought to it from a much larger outside world and through more ethereal senses than those of flesh, and their counterpart in the personality-body, including the more ethereal nervous system. The control of the physical body, then, lies in the decisions of this ultraethereal brain and the latter receives its development through the wider perceptive range the more ethereal senses at its service create for it. It is thus enabled to reach conclusions and make decisions which it would be impossible for the physical brain to attain to. It is this personality-form which disengages itself from the physical body when functionary dissolution overtakes the latter. We thus reach a point which is the "Ultima Thule" of the so-called psycho-analysts and specialists of today. However, let us forge further ahead.

"The Lord will perfect that which concerneth me. "-**Psalms** 138:8.

WAS a very small child when I began to realize that I saw things that other people around me did not see and that I heard things that they did not hear. I discovered that when someone spoke of hearing the voice of God that they referred to a still, small voice rather than to a distinctly audible voice, and that when they spoke of their dreams that they were without exception referring to things that passed in the night and not to the momentary visions that come to one upon awakening or during one's waking hours.

Perhaps we have all experienced that dream of Samuel's where he awoke out of a deep sleep to hear God calling to him, and I am sure that we have sometimes wondered why the call was given as nothing seemed to follow after it. That is because we did not wait for the command to be given. We are puzzled because we have no patience and then we have no patience because we are puzzled.

I believe that we never are called unless we are called to some purpose. Consequently, I have formed a habit of waiting for the voice to command, and then I have followed these commands without fail.

Often during my life I have awaked during the night, hearing my name distinctly called, not once but several times, and I have shaken myself out of my sleep to listen to the voice that guides me in my most perplexing problems.

There is just one thought that will drive this guidance away and that is an anxiety thought. Learning how to listen is our only problem.

Many of my visions are preceded by especially vivid dreams. Right Thinking Is Key

Dr. Edward Pittwood Gives Secret of Proper Method—Keeping Thoughts in Right Plane Is Necessary and Can Be Easily Done

(Continued from February issue) Answer. The act of thinking reproduces the thing that is first created by thought patterns. Therefore, to think persistently upon something eventually tends to bring about a manifestation of that condition or thing. If one's mind dwells upon the state of his health superinduced by fear of a particular disease, he is apt to become ill with the symptoms of that disease in evidence and yet have no physical ailment. This attitude of mind carried over a sufficient period of time will bring about the disease itself.

Fear Must Be Conquered

Q. Is fear a factor in disease?

A. In many instances, discase is due to fear created by environment. Now if this were generally understood, untold numbers would not be scared into contracting diseases that had caused the death of their forbears. When the disease is known, a study of the patient's idiosyncrasies, coupled with a survey of his environment, will reveal what type of fears have been the contributory cause. Leading the mind to a recognition of those fears, as such, and thence to a realization of their harmful effects tends to eliminate them and a cure results.

Q. Why do some faculties become sluggish?

A. Faculties that are unused or allowed to become sluggish by insufficient use do not possess the needed brain cells and mind power to tune in with the vibrations of creative thinking. It will be noticed that such a person soon becomes mentally tired and is incapable of sustained effort of any kind.

Q. How can cell numbers be increased?

A. The increase of power and cell numbers depends upon the vibratory impulse of the thought and the degree of concentration simultaneously employed. Post-mortem examinations of the brain have shown that the faculties through which time and tune function in the musical genius contained many more cells in the convolutions that coordinate with those faculties than in a person not so talented. Likewise the thief's brain was found to possess an excess of cells in the convolution that coordinates with the faculty of secrecy. In the latter instance, a special training is required to reduce the

number of cells to what has been found to be normal in the brain of an honest person.

Genius and Madness

Q. There is an old saying that genius is akin to madness. Is there a scientific basis for this?

A. Yes. The genius is often thought queer and not of a balanced mind. This is because he persistently thinks upon his talent and thus increases the cell and mind power of the mental faculties that coordinate with the thinking that develops that talent. The lack of thinking tends to reduce the cellular power of other faculties and causes lethargy, stupidity and lack of comprehension.

Q. What causes insanity?

A. Insanity, in most instances, except when from physical causes, is caused by constant thinking upon certain worries and fears to the exclusion of all other mind activity. This produces illusions, delusions and hallucinations. By carefully noticing the patient's actions and the words he utters during his irrational moments, the defective mental faculties can be located and the proper mental remedy applied. Here again, the excess of brain cells created by wrong thinking must be reduced to normal. This method of trained thinking, conscientiously applied, would release many unfortunate people now confined in public and private asylums.


Cures Not Difficult

Q. Is the cure a difficult problem?

A. Mental diseases are not the bugbear to heal that one is led to believe. The same law applies in their treatment as would be invoked in developing bodily strength. The method involves reducing the number of cells and energy in some faculties and increasing the number in others where needed. By increasing the number of cells in the convolutions of the brain coordinating with hearing and seeing, their powers for receiving vibrations of sound and light respectively are augmented in like ratio.

Q. Have you seen any positive results?

A. Some permanent and remarkable cures by the use of reorganized thinking have come under my own personal experience. For example: A partial deafness for 35 years and hearing restored at the age of 62; healing of insanity in one week after the patient had been adjudged hopeless by physicians and mental specialists; a case of moronism since childhood healed by locating the dormant mental faculties and the development of more cell power

to receive the thought vibrations which operate in those faculties; the effects of a stroke of paralysis eliminated by raising the thought vibration which dissolved the blood clot.

Q. How do vibrations figure in this?

A. Disease follows in the wake of an abnormally low vibration. Higher vibrations tend to kill or nullify those of a lower order. Cases could be cited, such as curing the criminally insane, pointing the way to business efficiency and child training.

Receiving Stations in Brain

Q. What are the mental receiving stations?

A. As thinking is a metaphysical operation which puts the brain cell machinery in order so as to contact things and conditions in the universal realm upon the various planes of cosmic mind it is vitally important to know something about the five primary mental planes or receiving states with which man is endowed for receiving thoughts and ideas. Q. How does the subsconscious mind work?

A. The subconscious mind takes care of the vital processes of the body. It does not reason, but accepts statements impressed upon it. It is the seat of memory and retains and records past events. It nurses all fears which frequently arise into consciousness to terrorize one's soul.

.Q. How does the superconscious plane operate?

A. The superconscious plane is the realm of knowledge, truth, wisdom and understanding which comes to man by unfoldment and impartation.

Q. Do we actually see with the eyes and hear with the ears?

A. It is the soul that sees and hears. The eyes, ears and other senses are the mechanical organs through which this is done.

Scriptures in New Light

Dr. Pittwood was asked to interpret some well-known biblical passages in the light of his studies of mental law.

Q. What did Job mean when he said: "The thing I greatly feared has come upon me."

A. Job was a victim of his fears. His thoughts dwelt upon them. In the end, the conditions he had been fearing all along and worrying about descended upon him.

Q. How do you explain the passage: "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he."

Is this a means of travel and sight into another land or possibly another dimension? What do you think? You are in doubt, yes, but you are the same as I. It is possible, who knows.



HE Zodiac is a circle of space surrounding the earth. It may be imagined as a belt in the heavens about 15 degrees of space wide in which the planets travel. It is the Sun's apparent path, called the ecliptic. The Zodiacal circle is divided into twelve spaces of 30 degrees each called the "Signs of the Zodiac."

The revolution of the Earth around the Sun once a year causes the Sun to appear to pass through each of the twelve signs in about 30 days.

Each "Sign" possesses a certain specific influence of its own that determines the general nature and character of people born into each one of the Signs.

The Ascending or Rising Sign is that Zodiacal Sign on the Eastern Horizon at the minute of birth. It gives the physical makeup and that part of the personality most in evidence in daily contacts with others, modified, of course, by the various planets.

The Rising Sign is not to be confused with the Sign occupied by the Sun at birth.

The Sign on the cusp of each house puts its stamp of influence on the affairs of each house modified by the house and sign position of its ruler. This inflence is, however, secondary in strength to the influence of such planets as may occupy a house.

For illustration, we will consider the Sign Taurus on the cusp of the Second House. Venus rules Taurus and this is the natural Second House Sign and has to do with finances. The position of Venus with its aspects from other planets would tell us, the financial fortune. If Mars was in the Second House, in Taurus also, we would have good earning power but an extravagance that might prohibit an accumulation of a competence.

Following is a list of the twelve Zodiacal Signs with their symbols—the symbols should be memorized by the student:

Sign, Taurus (\aleph) the Second, etc. Memorize the numerical order of the Signs also.

The following gives the general influence of each Sign, when rising, modified of course, by the position of the ruler of such Sign and also by such planets as may aspect the exact degree of such rising Sign:

TAURUS. Head and neck short; face broad and somewhat flat; chin strong; eyes large and dark; hair usually dark, sometimes blonde; lips full; body short, sturdy and plump.

GEMINI. Head and neck long; forehead broad; chin pointed; eyes expressive; hair light; lips thin; mouth small; nose aquiline; body slender; fingers long.

Mental qualities: Artistic, learned, dexterous in the manual crafts, inventive; curious, subtle, eloquent in speech or writing; much occupied; humane.

CANCER. Head large; neck short; eyes large; nose snub or full; mouth large; body heavy, especially above the waist; hands and feet small; walk labored.

Mental qualities: Changeful roving disposition; ambitions inclined to public life; prudent; sympathetic; imaginative and romantic.

LEO. Face broad and somewhat flat; hair wavy and usually light, inclined to frontal baldness; mouth firm; eyes commanding; shoulders broad; body well formed.

THE SOCIAL UPHEAVAL

The discovery of love's compound nature had been published in somewhat scientific language by several advanced thought magazines, but the general public unlearned in the technical terms of logic and chemistry gained no clear idea of its significance.

Hudson had portrayed in no uncertain terms, and had substantiated the fact, that the subjective mind of man and of nature is deficient in the power of inductive reasoning, being dependent for its conclusions upon deductive reasoning alone. This fact did not at first appear disconcerting, for Hudson, either betrayed by his own subjective mind, or being naturally deficient in a correct concept of infinite time, argued that while the power of deductive reasoning of the subjective mind multi-

plied by infinity would be Omniscience, the inductive reasoning faculty of the objective mind multiplied by infinity would only result in an Infinite Inquirer—not carrying the argument to the legitimate conclusion that an Infinite Inquirer would also become Omniscient in an infinite time.

Hudson, clinging tenaciously to dualism, in affirming that the subjective mind is, while erroneously denying that the objective mind can be, an element of Omniscience, so obscured the fact that the subjective mind is defective, in that it lacks the power of inductive reasoning, that this defection was at first not noted as a reflection on man's conception of a so-called "Supreme" Being, which Hudson had identified with the subjective mind.

It being a self-evident fact that the subjective mind can only evolve laws, but not the Truths or premises from which laws are established, it became evident to the true thinker that Hudson had made of the so-called "Supreme" being a back-seat driver laying down the law to man and thus stultifying man's intelligence. Even in the orthodox minds the confused and half-truth perceptions caused a wave of doubt to arise and overwhelm long-held dikes of dualism. Gradually the Absolute Truth began to penetrate the mind of many advanced thinkers, causing great dismay as their once cherished cradlefaiths dissolved into nothingness.

Man had for ages been paying homage and tribute to a Law Giver; now mankind began making obeisance to a Truth Giver. An intermediate stage began with the reign of Anarchy, the absence of Law, until Truth, or True Intelligence, could be enthroned, which evidently could only be a gradual, not an instantaneous, process.

In the history of recent years this process is recorded in detail.

A few high points stand out. The panic of 1907. The growing distrust among the nations. The war beginning 1914. The Sovietizing of Russia and the revolt there against orthodox religion. Unconstitutional constitutional amendments. Law in its struggle for existence degenerating into fanaticism. An increase of so-called crime and a concomitant corruption of the judiciary. Unemployment, depression, the dole. The overthrow of governments and political parties. The hoarding of money and valuables. The half-concealed sex war. Disasters arising from Nature itself, tornadoes, flood, drought, and the extremes of heat and cold. Utter human

heartlessness in the indifference to human life-multitudes starving amidst plenty. Increased brutality in prisons and asylums. A madness for travel and speed with tens of thousands of lives crushed out in preventable accidents. Revolutions, wars and rumors of wars. Then a few individuals withdrawing from the masses to think. A few others still fiercely driving trying to check the mad stampede of humanity into the gulf. Watch towers on the hills as it were, signalling each other alternately anguish and hope. Then at last signalling the coming of the end of Law -and its concomitant terrorism; the beginning again of the reign of the Ancient of Days-The Eternal Infinite All-THEIA-Truth-True Intelligence.

Among the so-called Christians there was a vain straining at a gnat of scriptural prophecy fulfillment. With the advent of the airplane man arose from the relatively dead earth and entered into Heaven-the air world. And verily the son of man was soon seen coming with power and great glory in the heavens. But the enemy did also likewise with their enchantments; they copied the high powered heavenly chariot of the son of man and dropped bombs and hot shot on their still amphibious fellows. Nor were the Mohammedans without signs of prophecy fulfillment, some of which were to be the speaking of beasts and inanimate things. Surely the phonograph and the telephone are inanimate things, and Maurice Maeterlinck in a remarkable book, "The Unknown Guest," now suppressed or out of print, recounted his personal experiences with the linguistic ability of the German Ebberfield horses and the talking dog of Mannheim. When the true sun of man refused to change the even tenor of its ways and rise from the direction predicted by Mohammed, were his followers nonplussed? Not so you would notice it. Taking as it were a leaf out of their rival's book, and to the chagrin of Pastor Russell and the hypocritical exponents of apocalypse fulfillment, a learned Moham-

medan disciple, Dr. Sadiq, came to Chicago, and lo and behold, the Mohammedan scripture was fulfilled to the letter, and the long-prophesied "Moslem Sunrise" took place in the "West"!

In modern mental fields battles were lost and won. After years of delay the Supreme Court of New York state declared the practice of so-called Christian Science to be lawful, reversing also the lower courts in deciding that a dietician in writing menus for health lawfully could not be considered practicing medicine without a license. The Chiropractors went to jail in lieu of paying fines three-quarters of which would have gone to enrich the coffers of the Medical Trust. Women handcuffed themselves to the King's gate, threw the keys away and shouted, "Votes for women," until the discomfitted "bobbies" could file off their shackles and bear the rebels away to durance vile-and the rebels won. Spiritualism took its place among legally recognized religions. New Thought and other cults came into existence and received abundant support from the fertile mental fields of doubt and dissatisfaction. Nor did the very elect of orthodoxy escape the turmoil. Dissensions, trials and ex-communications for heresy were common. To cap the climax an Austrian professor revived a compound of ancient Edenic and Greek myths with a pseudo-scientific name from which was evolved a camouflaged system of fortune telling to compete with the thunder of the prophet and to add enormously to the sales of dream books.

And while the history here recounted does not all appear in the censored text books of our institutions of so-called learning, nevertheless, it is faithfully recorded in the archives of the initiated.

SIXTY YEARS AGO

Gerald Massey on Spiritualism

(Reprinted from The Two Worlds)

"HE SUBJOINED was written by Gerald Massey in 1871, but has point and purpose today:

I cannot help laughing to myself at times as I think of what this much-maligned and despised Spiritualism is about to accomplish. How little they dream of the new dawn that is coming up the sky! Nay, it is already flaming in at the windows, and trying to look into the shut eyes of the sleepers, which are fast closed to the glory shining on their faces.

They are dreaming how to roll the world back the other way once more into the night of the past, even while they are passing face upwards beneath the radiant arch over their heads, of the dawn of a day that is not theirs; blind to the splendour of its coming, deaf to the birds of light that are up and singing, and senseless to this amazing apparition of God Himself-who is now on earth with a visible presence, perturbed and dissatisfied with the current representations of him which have been so unfaithful and untrue.

What will they do when they wake? Vainly clutch at their temporal possessions with a terrible tenacity, knowing they have no spiritual kingdom. If they could but comprehend what Spiriualism is going to do for real faith, instead of shouting for the fire-engines to come and put out this new dawn, they would embrace us and aid us all they could. For, see-just when scientific research is getting too much for the old creeds-When we have discovered the secret of life in protoplasm and are on the point of finding the mechanical equivalent of consciousness, just when we have discovered that force comes from the visible side of phenomena and thought is only molecular motion, and mind a property possessed by matter; just when the scientific report is that the deeper we dive the farther off recedes the supposed heart-beat of the eternal life; and to make up to humanity for the loss of our Father in heaven, we have at length, possibly at full length, found our longlost grandfather of earth in the fields or forests or floods of the fore-world-in breaks this revelation from the unknown and, as they assumed, unknowable. Just when we had proved that miracles could not be, and therefore never had been, in breaks the miraculous once more; we have our "Hume" answered by the other (Home), and the impossibility of a thing does not prevent its happening. The whole realm of mystery is once more thrown wide open, the partition walls will be thrown down flat, together with all who leaned their whole weight against them.

This time the existence of the spiritual world is going to be placed on a firmer foothold than ever-not a mere creed or dogma, but as a verified, enduring, everpresent, familiar fact. In truth, I believe the life here will be lived in the presence of the Unseen as it never yet has been, and the dim religious light which has been lovely as moonlight, and with no more life in it, will be changed into vital sunlight and vivid day, whilst all that is worth having in religion will be wrought out in a positive philosophy such as will speedily eclipse that of Comte, for we know it is in life as it is in language-Spiritual means Real.

Instead of the other world remaining dim and hopelessly afar off-a possibility to some; a doubt to others, a perplexity to many, and an abstraction to most, it will be a living verity, visible to many, audible to more, present with and operant through all. Now, this enables us to stand at starting where others hope to attain in the end. Science tells us that the time will come when our sun must decay and be no longer the light and life of its own brood of worlds. As a consequence, our world will no longer bring forth life in the present physical forms. On our side we see that in the meantime the earthly is putting on immortality-the material world is gradually assuming its spiritual form and its crown of life that fadeth not away-the world of matter will have brought forth its world of mind. Thus we can see how the prophecy shall be fulfilled and the heavens rolled together as a scroll, even as the author's manuscript may be when his thought has passed into print to take living embodiment in other minds, and there shall be a new heaven and a new earth.

NO TWO ALIKE

By MARY ADAMS ANOTHER ARTICLE SUPPLEMENTING "NUMEROLOGY IS PRACTICAL"

NUMEROLOGY teaches optimism. Disasters, losses, misfortunes are to be overcome—not yielded to. Numerology gives the two-fisted fighting spirit a real and practical weapon with which to combat adverse influences. It warns the person who "lies down on the job" of what is likely to happen to him; and it also shows what will happen if you live in the low or reverse side of your vibrations, instead of in the high or positive side.

Numbers in themselves are not evil—although some people seem to think that they are. Even the most powerful poisons found on this earth are transformed by wise chemists into helpful drugs and medicines. Numbers are guide posts pointing in the right direction, which we should be wise enough to follow. They are like barometers, thermometers, safetyvalves, etc., which the wise man examines and plans his actions in accordance with the information he receives. I repeat no number in itself has an evil influence; but any vibration can be distorted to bring about evil results.

Take "4" for example. Some will tell you that this number indicates disaster and all sorts of evils. So it may on its morbid, reverse or low side. But when used and understood rightly "4" is the logical, reasoning number. It shows that the true "4" is "on the square"; that he is practical; works well with his hands (mechanical) or with his brain (mathematical); that he has a resourceful and energetic mind. It is the number that denotes work under direction of the will which results in things accomplished. The greatest danger of a "4" is that he may become selfish because he looks within himself and not without. His interest centers in himself and not in others. He functions through system, and organization.

Yet do not overlook the fact that 4 may be the reverse side of 22. In that case, if a person with a 22 vibration does not live up to its great power, he reverts to a 4 and finds himself in a limited environment; held to a routine existence when he really should be doing big things in a wide field of activity. You remember that 22 is a super number and gives extra and masterful power to the other numbers with which it is associated. All of which leads up to the fact that all 4's are not alike. Neither are the 3's, 7's, 8's 1's, etc.

Take for example a man who is born on January 10, 1892 (1-1-2 = 4), or another born on June 2, 1895 (6-2-5 = 4). Or still another born on November 11, 1917

 $(11-11-9 \pm 4 \text{ or reduced}, 2-2-9 \pm 4)$. Do you think that they would be alike? Indeed, no. Undoubtedly all would have good reasoning powers and be able to handle details and submit to a certain amount of routine.

Let us examine the vibrations that make up the Birth Path of the first man, 1-1-2 = 4. He might be a diplomat and possess original and unique ways of handling difficult inter-national problems. He would have both a daring, pioneer instinct and the tact and diplomacy to obtain what he wants.

The next man, 6-2-5 = 4, shows the friendly, advisory 6; the co-operative 2; the versatile, restless 5, all together making the logical, painstaking 4, able to handle routine and details. What would he be? He might be an architect, a good character analyst, a teacher of some subject such as mathematics or chemistry, or logic.

The third man, 11-11-9 = 4, could scarcely help being a musician, a poet, a minister, an inspirational writer, a librarian or investigator of some romantic and elevated subject. This man could not be an accountant or a mechanic to work with his hands and get them all dirty and bruised. If he worked with his hands it would be in manipulating some musical instrument, which requires great mechanical skill and hours of practice—the organ, piano, violin, etc.

And so it goes. There are countless (literally countless to the average person) combinations of numbers that make 4, and each one has its own individuality. Let some industrious, clever, mathematical "4" figure them out and give us the result. Of course, there is an exact number, but it will be in the hundreds. Then added to these variations are the vibrations of the person's name—which are literally infinite. Now consider that there are 9 digits each with its hundreds of combinations which in turn are combined with the infinite possibilities of proper names. Does your head whirl?

What can the Numerologist or Character Analyst do about it? Simply remember that all 4's are not alike. Individuality is universal. The botanist tells us that on a single tree, no two leaves are exactly alike. We all know that in the limitless combinations of noses, eyes, mouths, chins, complexions no two persons look exactly alike. - Oak Tree Gideon saw the angel sitting under the oak. Jacob buried the idols of Sheckem under the oak. Under the oak Rebeka, a nurse, was buried. Abraham received the superphysical visitors under an oak. Augustine first preached the gospel to the Britons under an oak. The Druids worshipped the oak. Joshua made a covenant to serve God and set up a stone under an oak. Abimelech was made king under the shadow of the oak. The great oak unfolding from the tiny acorn has ever served to make this a sacred tree.
- Oannes This is the same as Dagon, the "Man-fish." A name for the initiates of Chaldea corresponding to the Nagas or snake kings of the legends who preserved and guarded ancient truths.
- Obambo In central Africa it means the ghost or spirit of the dead.
- Obeah Sorcery was practiced in Central Africa and the West Indies. Some-times called Oby or Obi and is a specie of witchcraft.
- Oberon Mentioned in Shakespeare's Midsummer Night's Dream as the king of the fairies.
- Obsession One under a siege. It is a psychic condition, the results of complete psychic control of one in the physical body, by a stronger mental force. The term would well apply to a subject under hypnosis while the actor is on the physical plane. Due to a physical inability to make a differ-ential diagnosis from the various nervous diseases the medical profession seldom used the word. Obsession seldom exists without being complicated with some disease. The physical bars must be down before it can enter.
- Occult Hidden, mysterious. Concealed from those who are not initiated. The real science of seeing things from all sides, physical, etherial, and spiritual.
- Occultism It is a matter of sight, and an individual experience, or unfold-ment of the conscienceness and attainment of the evolved soul. As it is used it is fantastic and very elastic and should either be restricted or be-come obsolete. No school of thought has any particular claim upon the use of the word. Rightly used it is a sacred word with a holy meaning. The word has been much abused by the secular press. It means in brief-Concealment, superphysical nature.
- Occult Hierarchy They are the rulers, teachers, guides of the human family graded in order from the Elder Brothers to the Supreme Being.
- Occult Schools See Western Wisdom Religion.
- Od, or Odyl Names for Odyl or odylic force.
- Odyle An imponderable invisible fluid

everywhere present and penetrating all things. Called Odyle by Richenbach; astral light by Paracelsus; sensorium Dei by Newton. Quartz or beryl are said to contain a large amount of od.

Ogre, Oger-Orcus Latin for hell. Orco was a surname for Pluto. This was a man-eating giant.

Ogress The feminine of ogre.

Oid. G. To see. Form, shape, model, aspect.

Oida I know.

- Oil, Magical The sacred fire and consecrated oil were indispensable to the efficacy of religious and magical rites from time immemorial. The oil for annointing was of the purest olive or compounded with myrrh, cinnamon, or galingale. Sorcerers and witches used ointments composed of human fat and blood of corpses. At times this was combined with aconite, belladonna and fungi to make them invisible.
- Ointment of Witches Some were made with juices of smallage, wolfbane, cinque foil, mixed with henbane, tobacco, hemlock, mandrake, opium and saffron or poplar leaves. The absorption of poisonous drugs produced dreams and hallucinations in some.
- Olcott, Col. Henry Steel Pres. of the Theosophical Society. Was much in-terested in agricultural schools. From 1875 to his death, year 1906, taught Theosophy and Neo-buddhism.
- Old Hat Used for Raising the Devil This was a caricature of magical ining a circle, throwing an old hat in the center of the circle and repeating the Lord's Prayer backwards.
- Old Scratch This old fellow was supposed to be half man, half goat, with horns. There was an old Teutonic faun or satyr called skrati from which the name is derived.
- Olympian Spirits They were the Seven Stewards of Heaven. They were the planetary spirits.
- Olympus We find in ancient literature that this name like Meru and Sinai represented a symbolical mountain and authors claim that all of the artificial hillocks, "high places" and pyramids were imitations of this fabulous mountain.
- Old Father Time Saturn. Age. Time. Generally represented by a man with gray hair and a mowing scythe. This veteran may also be seen cracking a whip over the traveler.
- Olympic Spirits Arbatle, a magical rit-ual was published at Basle 1575 in Latin text of Christian origin. In this Olympic Spirits who dwell in the air and who govern the world. We are told that there are 196 Olympic Spirits governing that many provinces in the Universe. Each spirit rules for 490 years. They rule over solar affairs and preside over the preparation of gold within our soil.

ing effect is the awakening in us of a reverent, even fearful, interest, while we still are clinging with a death grip to the fancies, faiths and fables of the past."

"The facts presented in this statement do not invite argument, but enjoin mental adjustment to Absolute Truth. The ordinal language of monism is correctly that of science and Truth."

"There are a number of dualistic words in common use that have no clearly defined meaning, and thus they often convey only a vague idea of some general action, being, or state, not permanently identified with a substance having a definable nature. General terms are also used to conceal ignorance, or to definitely refer to something unknown or undefined, as when the embryo scientist attributes the actual causes, processes, or details, of certain actions or non-actions of the objective or subjective world to nature, and the theologist attributes them to Theia, as did one writer in the time of scientific darkness, for he, in seemingly blissful ignorance of the fact that a word cannot be defined with a single term, or by substituting another word for it, being unable to solve the mystery of the nature and operation of the phenomena called love, affirmed that Theia (original Greek, Theos) is love."

"When the monistic thinker becomes able to penetrate deeper and deeper into the subjective mind, he acquires the ability to read the language that expresses itself as feelings and emotions; he thus can translate into plain, frank words, just what it is they reveal or conceal, or just what wish, request, resentment, rejection, anticipation, acceptance, etc., they convey; thus becoming able to tell just what is desired, lacking, incorrect, or depressing, and often in grammatical order give their cause or aim, the NEED and WHY, and by whom or what, when, where, in what WAY, with what MEANS, how much or to what extent, the preparatory activity is accomplished, and upon what quantity of whose or what substance or thing, and the quality or class of the substance or thing; of what the secondary or reflex action consists; the indirect object-to or for, from or of, whom or what, and the quantity, quality, and the kind of direct object, and the prophetic Truth, purpose, or subjective Reason for Existence, or the reason for bringing into existence, of the direct object, which thus becomes identified with its cause or aim, and the opposite cause or NEED, which is to manifest THEIA."

"Often it becomes known that a mental pain or depression is not a warning of disaster, but instead is a confused prophecv of something desirable coming. And until the sensations, emotions, and feelings of the subjective mind are translated into terms of intellect understandable by the objective mind, the latter is dissatisfied and discontented, and normally unable to attain complete Mastership. The chief difficulty which so long delayed a literal interpretation of certain expressions, activities or non-activities of the objective mind and the subjective mind content, or the discovery in just what way they originated, was overcome when mental chemistry or subjective sociology revealed the little suspected fact that they were often mystifying complex compounds, which like physical chemical compounds, as for instance, water, have, even upon a careful examination with ordinary means, an appearing nature so widely divergent from their component elements, that there is given no direct clue to the discovery of their ultimate properties. And when anything of Time or Space is incapable of being resolved into more simple elements or causes, analysis ends, and the thing appears self-existent. When the compound is not chemically pure, or is physically mixed with other elements, there is a subsidiary difficulty in identification or definition, until the compound is rectified or reclaimed."

"After subjective sociology had conclusively shown that the activity or product called Love, is a compound resulting from certain causes or conditions which excite simultaneously, or unite, two different memory reactions, or what in general terms is defined as the instincts of Selfpreservation and Race-preservation, it at last became possible to check and dissolve impure and transient love, and to replace it synthetically with an artificially pre-arranged or naturally inspired pure and permanent love, thus presenting a solution of the age-old social problem. The feeling called love is the mental sensation arising from the union, often below the threshold of consciousness of objective mind, of certain satisfied memory reactions of actual mental elements or instincts. It could with close analogy be compared to the electricity released, or the effect produced by it, when two atoms of hydrogen unite with one atom of oxygen to form a molecule of the compound, water. A reverse analogy is also indicated in that love is used up or disappears as does water in electrolysis, in which electricity might be pictured as a sort of wedge and maul with which the oxygen is driven apart from the hydrogen, thus breaking down the water molecule. When hydrogen

burns, that is, when it chemically unites with oxygen, the maul and wedge are given back to the general store."

"The thrilling joy of so-called love, experienced by two or more individuals, is the satisfactory feeling resulting from the actual, probable, or even possible integration of their interests and efforts toward the accomplishment of an Aim so Great that its true attainment is only possible from the harmonious union of their life and work, so that will come to them as a reward for their intelligent aligning, sometimes sub-consciously, of their individual aims with the Great Aim, the life-giving vibrations of true attainment."

"With the discovery that love is a compound or the effect of a compound, came the startling revelation that the ancient, obsolete dualistic conception of a "Supreme" Being, is just an analogous idea from the complex compound of the revered concepts of Time and Space, respectively, as The Eternal and The Infinite, from different viewpoints variously referred to as so-called Spirit and Matter, Action and Being, Force and State, Energy and Material, Thought and Thing, Law or Sustainer and Substance. From the Absolute Viewpoint so-thought dualism is just the Time and Space aspect of things, and in reality concerning Being Itself there cannot be any such condition as dualism. The idea simply belongs to the childhood of the human race, possibly requisite at that time, but long since worn out and useless, aye, deleterious. So-called Spirit and Matter are ONE, are actually only the respective subjective and objective manifestations of the ONE There is neither "evil" nor BEING. "good" in the universe, they are the respective manifestations of ignorance and intelligence. Whatever happens, has happened, or is to happen, is in harmony with the Universal Law of the expression of developing intelligence-from Absolute Ignorance or Unconsciousness to Omniscience."

"So-called expression from the absolute subjective world is but a reflection or projection into the outer of that which is within, and an entity as regards identity (idem- or id-entity) is that which from it is reflected or projected, and in literal projection there is no dividing line between objectivity and subjectivity; 'As is the outer, so is the inner,' is axiomatic. Thus when we have the Truth of the attributes or manifestations of an entity, we have the general Truth of the entity itself, or in more simple words, the Truth of a thing is the Truth we perceive about it, even as we can perceive the Truth of objects from their pictures recorded on a film, or in their projection on a screen.

to a bathrobe with a white silk cord tied around his waist, and these words were spoken to me, "When the robe of materiality is cast off, behold the Christ in him !"
