The Yearly Festival of the Sun

HE PEOPLE are each year becoming more keenly interested in the yearly spring festival Easter, but the Bible has at all times made mention of this yearly festival as the Feast of the Passover. "Then led they Jesus from Caiaphas unto the Hall of judgment. And it was early; and they themselves went not into the judgment hall, lest they should be defiled, but that they might eat the Passover." And this festival was always celebrated according to the passage of the sun. But our present day Christians do not observe this day according to the customs of the ancients, they do not associate the crucifixion and the resurrection of The Christ with the passage of the sun, they do not recognize this as a great Cosmic event.

Many of the early Christians were converts from the Jewish Church and had been accustomed to celebrate these Jewish festivals; naturally they found it difficult to discard these habits, regardless of the new faith which they had embraced. The chief feasts of the year among the ancient Israelites were the Feast of the Tabernacle, a thanksgiving in acknowledgment to Jehovah for the bountifulness of their crops, in the spring the Feast of the Passover or Unleavened Bread. These were sacrificial feasts which demand a sacrifice for every sin committed. The slaying of animals was essentially one of the requirements. The Israelites were taught that vicarious sacrifices alone could atone for their sins and only was this possible through the shedding of blood, for they knew that the blood was the seat of the SPIRIT. They believed that the shedding of the blood of animals washed away their sins, but unfortunately these dreadful sacrifices never purged the worshippers, their consciences were not cleared, naturally greater sacrifices had to be offered for even greater sins.

The poor animals which they offered up for sacrifices were placed upon the altar of the Temple with the sinners hand on the head of the victim; the Priest plunged the knife into its throat. The blood was then used by the Priest to sprinkle on the holy places of the Tabernacle or Temple. In this manner thousands of animals were sacrificed yearly, especially during the festival of the Passover which was held at the spring equinox. This was observed each time the sun passed from south to north latitude on the 21st of March, then the yearly sacrifice of the first born and the first fruits were offered to Jehovah to appease his anger, for their God was an angry and a jealous God.

This continual shedding of blood by

both the priests and the layman gradually developed into the greatest brutality. As Rome reached the zenith of her power her people also sank into the greatest degredation both morally and spiritually; idolatry and pagan worship were fast spreading through the land. The religion of the Jews was one of sacrifice and of ceremonial. This outward display was fast becoming a burden to the people who were taxed for this great display of religious ceremonies which had become only a shadow of the former religious worship which had been given to them by their former leader, Moses, and which had been used in the first Tabernacle in the Wilderness. On account of the selfishness of the Priests the religion of the Jews was gradually degenerating into the most cruel sacrifice of animals and at times they even demanded the sacrifice of the first born male child where extreme punishment was necessary.

At the beginning of the religious worship in their Temples the Jews used for their sacrifice young bullocks as well as young lambs, but the bullocks were later considered unclean showing that a remnant of the old Taurian worship was still mixed with the new religion of the lamb, for during the Taurian dispensation the worship of the Bull was used entirely in their religious ceremonies. It was some time after the sun by precession had entered the sign of Aries, the lamb, that the Aryan religion of the lamb was fully established and the worship of the Bull was classed as idolatry.

Two thousand years later as the sun by precession neared the sign of Pisces, the fishes (which was the beginning of the New Testament), when the world had sunk most deeply into the mire of materialism the religious peoples prayed that the prophesies which had been given for a generation that a great redeemer was to be born would soon be fulfilled. Both the Jew as well as the Gentile looked to the east with great expectations for the deliverer which they were told was to come to lead them to that promised land, out of the darkened condition, and into the light. At this time of extreme suffering, John the Baptist appeared. He refused both riches and titles, announcing the coming of the Great One and begging them to repent, thereby preparing numbers for the coming of the Messiah, the Lamb of God.

"And there went out unto him all the land of Judea, and they of Jeruselem, and were all baptized of him in the river of Jordan, confessing their sins."

"And John was clothed in camel's hair,

and with a girdle of a skin about his loins; and he did eat lotus and wild honey."

"And preached saying, there cometh one mightier than I after me, the latchet of whose shoes I am not worthy to unloose."

"I indeed have baptized you with water; but he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost."

"And it came to pass in those days, that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee, and was baptized of John in Jordan."

"And straightway coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens opened and the Spirit like a dove descending upon him."

"And there came a voice from heaven, saying, "Thou are my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." St. Mark, 1:2-II.

Jesus of Nazareth who had been prepared by the Essenes to receive the Spirit of The Christ, although he had no sins to confess, nevertheless he bade John to baptize him, stating that he came to represent the people whom he had come to save. He appeared before them in the simple garb of a Jew and he chose his followers from among the simple folks, not from the rich and the learned ones, but the power of his personality and simplicity and the purity of His life opened the way for his teachings and in the short three and one-half years which he inhabited the body of Jesus he launched one of the most powerful and lasting Teachings which any spiritual messenger has ever done. The people were stirred, and the Priests became fearful of his power. The Jews were dissapointed, for they had looked forward to a deliverer, a Messiah, who was to appear in kingly robes, followed by great armies, but when this lowly, meek, loving and compassionate one appeared among them teaching and preaching about a kingdom of GOD and not of men they repudiated Him.

With the coming of this Messiah, the ceremonial and sacrificial law of the Jews was broken up. He taught the religion of love, he brought to them a just God and a God of love whom man should learn to love and not fear. His sermon on the mount, if they would accept and live up to these precepts would redeem the world, but alas this message fell on stony ground and failed to take root in the hearts of these hardened people. "He came to his own, but his own received Him not." He broke down the barrier between Jew and Gentile; the changes that took place in the hearts and the lives of those who received Him were so marked and their lives so improved that the Priests began to fear the power of this new teacher; their evil influence was at stake and they must needs

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Psychurgy Develops the Latest Method for Organizing Thoughts

tact Divine knowledge is entirely his own fault.

By the use of this chart, one can learn to locate his thoughts and if desirable ones, he can bring about results of inestimable value that can be realized in no other way. On the other hand, when he is prone to dwell upon thoughts that are harmful, he learns how to avoid thinking upon them in order not to bring about the conditions that are the forerunner of the many Ills which are patterned and created by his thinking. 

The Law of Life By ALFRED GOULD

(Continued from March issue) ERE we have a personality-form permeating in every particle and earth-flesh body, of which it is practically a counterpart and which constitutes its expression in that denser earth-flesh we carry around with us during this phase of Life. We have this denser earth body reacting to one series of impressions from without and the personality-body reacting to another series of impressions, also from without. The ratio in the wave motions of the two series being greatly different, the two sets of impressions travel side by side, so to speak, but with absolutely no interference, just as different telegraphic messages travel simultaneously along a copper wire in either direction. This personality-body then constitutes the structural support on which hang all the parts and details of our physical body. At death, it draws away from the disintegrating body of flesh and stands alone by reason of the more ethereal composition of its parts. The reason for this latter assertion is that the "Will" is capable of moulding the more ethereal matter of this Life-Phase directly and without the interposition of special mechanism to that end; while, as we know, in earth flesh experience, after a thought has been born, developed and carried forward, yet, before it can find adequate expression in this series of activities, the mechanism of the flesh-body must be brought into play, in the admirable manner which we see. The result of this relation is that the "Will" can prevent decay as long as it pleases in this more ethereal series of activities. The next question comes: What is this "Will" you talk about? Ah, my friends, yes. Well may you put the question, showing thereby that the many thousand treatises on the subject have not been able to explain to you this "underlying" question. Let us push further on.

The earth-flesh body grows up to the average practicable size by constantly interpolating new flesh units, held by their more ethereal force-frame. The type of the mass does not change during this operation. This is the process of so-called "incarnation." With the personality-body the Life-directing Power, otherwise the Will-Power, moulds the Force-Matter of its body as it gains in strength and breadth of power of application to its surroundings.

How does this take place?

Through the increase in Life-intensity of the "Will," following the same law of growth which we find in lower stages, including the earth-flesh phase. This "Law of Growth" is the logical result of the

fact that our "consciousness", our "self", is slowly built up and kept in equilibrium by finding itself in successsive differing surrounding sets of influences. Each time these change, this change is registered as a reaction. The consciousness gradually becomes able to compare the succeeding reactions, notes their differences and similarities and, for convenience, separates them into "classes". After a prolonged consciousness of classes, it compares them, gradually noting their differences and similarities, with the result that the consciousness becomes able to seek out the thread which binds them and the manner of its binding, producing what is called a "generalization". Each time one of these steps is taken, an extra effort of the Will-Power is needed with the result that it increases in power of expression as the number of its experiences increases. Hence it finds itself capable of moulding more efficiently the Force-Matter body it is using as a medium of expression by increasing the Force therein and gradually eliminating the matter. This is the essence of Soul-Progression; so-called.

Thus far there is nothing mysterious about the processes we have described. Just as, at physical death, the former garment is dropped, causing a "rebirth"; so also, through the moulding of the matter and force components of the body, changes are brought about which, by bringing the Life into surroundings resulting from the growth to ever greater power of generalization, constitute again a true "rebirth", which successively recurs again and again as the Life continues to grow. During this growth and through an indispensable law of its nature, being a particular instance of the general law that like always seeks like through similarity of vibration-intensity of the unit particles; the Life joins its activity to that of other Lives, gradually coming into greater harmony so as to become a part of them. This process repeats itself, the first group joining with other groups at a similar stage of growth. These again join with other greater groups and so on ad infinitum in a chain without end. In the development of these facts of Life there is no room for the earth conception of "God", which implies power, force, direction, even although benevolent; all of which is directly opposed to the constantly increasing harmony which constitutes the LAW of, not only human, but also of ALL PROGRESSION.

So as to keep the stream of natureenergy we call Humanity from losing any of its units in its Path of Progress, it is found necessary to delegate "Personalities" from some of the above mentioned

Harmonious Groups, temporarily detaching them from their group and causing them to successively reverse the above process by dropping force in their makeup and taking on more matter. They thus, successively, come into direct active harmony again with the stages already lived through. During this process the full consciousness of the more advanced Life-Stages already experienced must be kept alive in the gradually materializing Personality if really efficient and pregnant action is to take place. This applies to every stage traversed in this reverse journey. This process has been carried out in all the growth stages beyond the earthlife phase and is now beginning also in the flesh of earth, this wonderful fleshbody having been developed to the necessary degree of sensitiveness through the ages.

The result is that, among the many who have just come into the fruition of physical earth-life, there is a large proportion who represent the aforesaid groups and are trying their best to carry out the duties demanded of them. Their earthbodies become more or less conscious of the fact of their origin. This accounts for their referring to their Greater Self. Thus also is Jesus Christ quoted in the Bible as constantly referring to his Father in Heaven.

We have said that LIFE is the consciousness of actions and reactions. What are actions and reactions? Let us investigate through the means of chemistry, as offering the most understandable symbolic combinations which our flesh senses can grasp. After trying many combinations of substances at different temperatures, we find some which change the initial molecular equilibrium of some of them by what we may call "interpenetration", sometimes mutual and sometimes not. What renders this interpenetration possible is the molecular attraction between the substances, as it has been called. This molecular harmony is purely mechanical in this that it rests upon the fact of the interstices between the electron centres being of suitable dimensions and the equilibrium currents holding the latter in place being refined enough not to be disturbed by the process of interpenetration. The result is, of course, a new "body", as it is called, possessing different characteristics from those of any of its component substances. The new equilibrium thus brought about may be either a relatively stable one, or may be such, supposing another substance or group of substances to be again in juxtaposition, that a second similar combination takes place, possibly either by amalgamation or expulsion, in

(Continued from March issue) Y PLANETS is meant those celestial bodies that move through the Zodiac. The Sun and Moon are not Planets, but their influence is very important in Astrology, and in the various lessons will be considered the same as planets.

The Planets have similar characteristics to those of certain of the Zodiacal Signs and in such signs are said to be at home and for that reason said to rule or be dignified and exalted. Planets in signs opposite to those in which they are at home are said to be in detriment or fall, and consequently weaker in their manifestation for good.

In the case of the malefic Planets, such as Saturn, Mars, Uranus and Neptune, their location in a sign in which they are out of harmony will tend to increase their power for evil.

The following table shows the strength or weakness of the Planets in various Signs:

very strong if elevated, that is near the Mid-heaven (in 9th or 10th House), and naturally it is better to have a benefic planet elevated than a malefic. Strength is also given to a planet by its being placed in one of the angles 1, 4, 7 or 10, and here also it is better to have a benefic planet than a malefic.

It is very necessary for the student to know the simple nature of the several planets in order to be able to arrive at an estimate of their effects in a horoscope.

The following is a short sketch of the general influence of each of the planets. Further details will be added as the studies progress.

SUN, \odot . Has a fiery, hot and dry, positive and masculine influence. It rules honor, fame, superiors, the vitality and constitution. In character, it confers

The Planets in their order of speed in the Zodiac are: Moon, Mercury, Venus, Sun, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune. The influence of the Moon, Venus, Sun and Jupiter, is considered good. The influence of Mars, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune is known as malefic. Mercury is neutral. Jupiter is known as the great fortune, and Venus as the lesser fortune.

The strength of a planet must be judged by the sign occupied, by house position and by influences received from the other planets through what is called aspects to be explained in detail later. A planet is pride, dignity, nobility, generosity, ambition, ostentation, strength of will and courage.

MOON, (. Is cold, moist, negative and feminine. It makes its natives changeable, imaginative, inconstant and capricious. It rules women, the public, water and water occupations. The Moon is receptive and takes upon itself the nature of the Sign it is in, or the planet with which it is most strongly associated in the horoscope.

MERCURY, ξ . Is itself cold, dry, airy, nervous and adaptable. Like the Moon, it takes on the nature of the planet in closest association, but when uninfluenced, its own nature is mental, nervous and intellectual. It rules the mind, writings, study, travel and messages. Natives under Mercury are high strung, restless and talkative.

VENUS, φ . Is a benefic or fortunate planet, and is warm, moist, and feminine in nature. It governs love, marriage, beauty, pleasures, the fine arts, gaiety, ornaments and makes its natives gentle, refined, pleasant, affectionate and artistic

MARS, 3. Is a malefic or evil planet and is hot, dry, fiery, forceful, positive and masculine. It rules fire, war, passion, fevers, wounds, iron and sharp tools, and makes its natives hasty, warlike, passionate, rash, self-confident, combative and very courageous.

JUPITER, 21. Is benefic by nature and is expansive, warm, moist and masculine. It rules churches, religion, law and the professions generally, also sports and brings success and protection. It makes its natives philosophical, philan thropic, humane, generous, prudent, cheerful, optimistic, sympathetic, just and lovers of sports of all kinds.

SATURN, b. Is malefic and cold, dry, hard, restricting and masculine. It rules old age, sorrow, melancholy, disease and chronic ailments, misfortunes, falls and dark things and places. Its natives are cautious, secretive, jealous, miserly, acquisitive, faithful, serious, steady and patient.

URANUS, H. Is malefic and cold, spasmodic and masculine. It rules unusual things, occupations and people, electric apparatus, occultism and sudden and catastrophic happenings. It makes natives abrupt, ingenious, original, independent and eccentric.

NEPTUNE, Ψ . Is usually malefic, sometimes very much so, but may be highly spiritual in nature. It is warm, moist and feminine, and rules mysticism, clairvoyance, trances and mediumship, hospitals, voyages and the sea; treachery, deceit, drugs, and can produce chaotic conditions in affairs. It makes its natives dreamy, senuous, musical, artistic, selfindulgent, unstable, sensitive and highly emotional.

From the above, it will be seen that some planets appear to be good and others bad. Each planet has both good and bad sides to its nature. For instance, Jupiter operating favorably causes generosity, but when unfavorable, produces reckless extravagance. Venus may cause love or sensuality; the Sun may be dignified or bombastic. The exact way in which a



VERY good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights." What are these lights? They must be very important or there would not be a Father of lights. The Bible, in many places, speaks of light. Due to the fact that we have not recognized clairvoyance as much as we have healing and the other gifts that the Apostle Paul speaks of, we have missed the true significance of their reality by not being able to see them.

When I first took up the study of truth, these affirmations were sent to me from a truth Center: "I am a perfect child of God. I am the illuminated child of God." 

It corresponds to the lost word of the masons, to the Word in the first verse of the first chapter of John, It is the Light, the Way, the Fiat. "He who knows it enters into the Supreme Soul."
- Om Mani Padme Hume The formula of six syllables. Originally it was a salutation addressed to a saint. It is a graft onto Om.
- One (1) It has been called the number of creation. It is the Divine mind, Supreme Being, Soul of the World, Star King, Stone of the Philosopher's Heart. Vibrations are solar. Symbols -The man Adam; Osiris; Apollo.
- One, The The Absolute, The God. Oneirism (o-ni-rizm) G. "A dream-like wakening hallucination"-Dorland.
- Oneiromancy Divination by means of dreams. Before one can interpret dreams he must have a knowledge of causes which produce the various dreams, especially must he be able to differentiate those born of one's self and those views of spiritual beings and things. 

The heat of angry passion is something with which we are all familiar. The heat of Divine passion was exemplified in the life Anointed Saviour: Christ Jesus.



This is only one of many peculiar circumstances that has come to me. It is food for thought.



such a way as to reproduce again the initial combination. As exemplifying this process in the science of numbers we have, for example, the periodical decimal fractions. 

remove Him, and to accomplish this they used one of the most shameful methods, for at that time crucifixion, the nailing on the cross was used only in the case of the worst criminal, guilty of the grossest crimes against the government, a most shameful death.

The Christ Spirit did not belong to our life wave, being an Archangel which belonged to a life wave which started prior to our scheme. begins her period of inhaling (for the earth has her breathing as well as man, this the Scientists in Pasadena, California, have reecntly been half-heartedly admitting, but they will sometime have to admit that the fall is the inbreathing and the spring the outbreathing of the Christ Spirit of the Earth), and enters into the night time of nature which must take its rest as well as man. This night time of nature (winter), is the time when the Christ Spirit shines forth more brightly and man is prone to awaken to his spiritual responsibilities. This same Spirit of the Earth also impregnates the seeds which lie dormant in the ground.

When the sun reaches its extreme southern latitude which is about the 21st or 22nd of December and when it turns northward the Cosmic Sun is reborn and is then hailed as the Savior. As He starts this northern journey he passes through the floods of the watery signs, Aquarius and Pisces, arriving at the vernal equinox on the 21st of March when he starts on his new year in the sign of Aries the Lamb. This time was chosen by the ancient Jews as the Passover, the crossification, the crucifixion, a cosmic feast of the Jews for ages even before the birth of Jesus. Thus we may see that the Cosmic Christ is crucified each year.

If Easter then is a Cosmic event, according to all Bible teachings, for the ancients celebrated this spring festival as well as the Christians of modern times, then why should not this day fall on the same date? Why do we celebrate Easter one year in March while at another time

it is late in April? Although the crucifixion of Christ Jesus took place at the Feast of the Passover, the present date of their feast is set for the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox. This is self evident that the day has been appointed in commemoration of the crucifixion and the resurrection of Christ Jesus.

So let us see why and when these changes took place. At the beginning of the Christian Era this festival created much discussion amongst the followers of the various religious movements. The Jews were most persistent in celebrating this Feast of the Passover when the Cosmic Sun crossed from the Sign of Pisces into the sign of Aries, which is the true time of the awakening of spring, or the outbreathing of the Spirit of the Earth when everything springs into new life. Pope Pius I of Rome ordered his followers to celebrate Easter on the first Sunday after the Passover, claiming that it should be celebrated on the Lord's Day. It was as late as the year 1752 after a long and disquieting dispute between the two Churches, namely the Church of Rome and the Church of England, that the United Kingdom eventually concluded that to end the dispute, Easter should be celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox. The Russian, Greek and the Oriental churches have not joined forces with these western Churches; they like the Jews still observe this festival of Easter on the day of the true crossing of the Cosmic Sun over the equinoctial point, which is usually on the 21st of March or when the sun crosses into north latitude.


