NO THING MOVES

ODAY amongst great scientists there is a query that constantly appears above the horizon of their mentalities, namely, "Is matter in motion or is it at rest?" Of course, to settle such a momentous question one must do so alone through the power of reasoning. In the time of Columbus the entire world sensed that the earth was flat. Reason taught the great Columbus that it was round. At that time as well as now, the sun seemed to move around the earth, but reason has taught that the earth moves around the sun.

Today when one seemingly gazes through glass and views objects on the other side great is one's amazement when shown that one does not see through glass, but that the light waves bring the impressions of objects through the glass to one's eyes. This force has been traced to the positive electron, known also as the proton, and that all matter is composed of these minute particles of matter. All life has been traced to the one cell, thus the religionists and the scientists practically agree in the above statement.

All agree that this force is universal, meaning that it is everywhere all the time; that there is no space where it is not. If this be true, then how can there be movement, as, first, there would be no reason for movement, and, secondly, it is very plain that One Thing that completely fills all space could not move, if one calls upon his reason to decide the question.

When mundane Life first thought to

move through space, it did not realize that it could move faster than a worm can crawl, yet at that time there was something that moved at the rate of 186,000 miles per second. Today man realizes fully that time will be annihilated, and when it will be obsolete, all distances will be present spaces. Even now, light waves are so rapid, as man thinks, earthly distances are practically overcome. It is practically known that there is a movement in the cosmos that is speedier than the speed of light waves, 186,000 miles per second.

All scientists, as well as every thinking person, admits that when one throws a stone up into the air that it must come to a complete rest before it again reaches the earth. As the earth is in rapid motion, when the stone leaves the earth, it describes a curve. Nature abhors a straight line, and the above shows why it never produces a straight line. If there be motion, all the planets and suns with their attendant fields of force are moving along curved tracks, hence a straight line could not be drawn by the planets and suns. Man upon the earth cannot draw a straight line, because while he is seemingly doing so, he is in rapid motion. Thus the old saying that curves are made up of minute straight lines is not a true saying; in fact, it is the reverse, namely, all seemingly straight lines are made up of minute curves, if there be motion.

Today it is well known that all intelligence comes to one through what is known as the afferent flow, or inflow. This afferent flow is always in the form of vibratory motion. Vibratory motion means the number of wave crests per inch and the number of times they are formed per second.

As far as this motion is understood under the guise of hearing and seeing, meaning, sound waves and seeing, or light waves, sound waves range from eight to thirty thousand per inch and light waves range from thirty-four thousand waves per inch for basic red and sixty-four thousand waves per inch for violet. Man never sees through the use of any vibrations other than within the range mentioned, namely, between basic red and basic violet. Here again man has to realize that seeing as mentioned above is merely a seeming to do so, for it is known that through certain methods of approach, infra-red waves may be conceived, that are below the red, and that ultra-violet waves may be conceived, that are above the violet, and that each of these conceivable groups change until they reach an infinite number. This means no vibratory motion.

As stated, vibratory motion means the number of waves per inch and the times formed per second. It is conceivable that no matter how many waves there are per inch, the waves are all in the form of curves. The times formed per second, means the electrons rising and falling to produce the wave forms. This rising and falling also is in the form of curves, because of the reasons stated.

When one considers a circle understandingly, and fully realizes that each minutest part of it if in motion is merely trying to reach its opposite point, and that all curves be they great or small, are but parts of a circle, one will grasp the fact that like the stone thrown into the air, from the earth, each part is in perfect rest, because it is at its apex of movement.

Thus one has to assume that each electron in the cosmos is in movement, and, for a fact, it is trying to move along a curved path, and that because of this movement, it is at perfect rest. Thus rest and movement are one Thing, Infinite.

Handwriting Reveals Character

"By Their Handwriting Shall Ye Know Them"

There is no subject in which we are so keenly interested as in learning something about ourselves, yet curiously enough, how many are aware of the fact that our inclinations, impulses, desires, capabilities, and many other character traits are all revealed by our handwriting, and that the character they express is the real nature of the individual? The ancient adage, "Know Thyself," is more applicable today than at any time in the history of the world, and just as by the study of nature and science do we gain the knowledge and power to master it, so only by the study of our own selves can we gain the knowledge to master our own lives and destinies.

Handwriting is the written record of the innermost self each of us makes that he who runs may read. No one doubts that every handwriting is characteristic of the person by whom it is written. The legal system in all five continents is based on the assumption of the identity of signature, and modern money transactions would be impossible if the least doubt existed that signatures could be disregarded in financial transactions. For example, when you purchase a traveller's check from the express company or your bank, you are required to affix your signature, and the cashier in turn affixes his signature as attestation of the fact that your signature is genuine. When you cash this check in some distant city or foreign country, your signature again written on the check is sufficient identification for payment.

The science of Graphology is divided into two main divisions, namely, Psychological and Forensic. Inasmuch as the Psychological deals exclusively with the analysis of the handwriting with a view of determining the character of the writer, his true vocation in life, et cetera; and the Forensic deals with all cases in which forgery and questioned documents are involved, as the realm of legal handwriting expertism lies beyond the range of this article, and it is not our intention to deal with questions relating to proof of identity, for the purposes of our study only the Psychological will be sufficient for our consideration.

It is not the purpose to go into an extended discussion of the science of Graphology, as these articles necessarily must be brief and concise. However, it will be my intention to present to you in this series of articles a general view of the science.

What is Graphology and How Does It Reveal Character, you ask

S ONE who accepts theories and dictums with much mental reservation until positive facts have proved them, I can readily appreciate the position of those who, from lack of interest or want of time, have not investigated the truth that the science of Graphology is not a modern fad but a proven and established science, founded upon 350 years of study and research and classified knowledge. The knowledge that character is revealed in handwriting is so old that we find the Emperor Nero, nineteen hundred years ago, in ancient Rome one day, writing to a friend that he fears a certain man at his Court-"I fear Quintilius treacherous for his writing shows him to be so," said the Emperor surprisingly, and here we have the first known judgment of the inner man according to the mark made by his pen. Later we find Seutonius making observations upon the handwriting of the

but wait for another hundred years, and thrive as well as it could on the lean diet of cultured interests.

Graphology was, up to a certain period of the world's history, like many of the other sciences, only the hobby of the curious and the preoccupation of the very few, who lacked data with which to pursue it in exactitude. Strangely enough Graphology had its ascendency along with the advance of modern medicine, and has been well received as a valuable adjunct by that science.

The first book on characterological interpretation of handwriting was written by Camille Baldo, an Italian, in 1622. A contemporary of his, Marcus Aurelius Servinus, a professor of anatomy, also wrote on the same subject in 1656. In time we find the Abbe Flandrin, a learned Frenchman and churchman, became the head of a movement which took up the science. He took nothing for granted. He compared, sorted, investigated, systemized, slowly building and perfecting the science. His

Emperor Augustus. Some traces of graphology we find in the Greeks.

Certainly you will want to know if there is anything to back it up, and this, perhaps, may interest you right here: that handwriting was already furnishing the chart for some first explorations in psychology at a time when even medicine was largely in the hands of barbers, and when it would have been considered fantastic, to say the least, to consider the state of a man's mind when giving him a pill.

There was another difficulty, too, in the way of a working science with handwriting, for at this time handwriting itself was still an art, and the great mass of people could not write at all. So, with Europe just emerging from the Dark Ages, there was nothing for our infant science to do pupil, and eventually his master, the Abbe Michon, carried the work much farther, who, unrestrained by theoretical considerations, collected, observed, ascertained, arranged, noted and clarified, and who wrote a number of books on the subject, and passed the mastership on down to Crepieux-Jamin, the great French Graphologist, who has given us many indispensable works on Graphology.

Lombroso, famous criminologist of Italy, Krafft-Ebbing, neurologist of Germany, and Havelock Ellis, English physician and pioneer authority in sex scientifics—these, among others, had based important researches on their experiences with handwriting. Sir Herschell of England, who entered the field of criminology and estab-

Swallows and Invisible Entities

It has always seemed so queer to me that the white people, claiming to believe literally in the Christian Bible, refuse to accept or even consider the statement that Jesus himself "drove out the evil spirits". There is no question expressed whether or not there existed any but the apparently completely recognized fact, that spirits, good and evil, existed in nature, in humans, and animals, (Jesus drove the spirits into swine).

When I was about 18 years old I lived with my father in Central-China on the very wide, interesting river Yang-tze-kiang with its ever changing currents, big and little whirlpools and beautiful, mountainous country on either side and occasional villages, or single huts, occupied entirely by Chinese. Not counting a Roman Catholic monastery, or a convent of the same creed, there were only between 30 and 40 white people living in the Chinese city of about 60,000 natives and none in the country for many miles around it. The white man's civilization had not yet reached this, at that time, peaceful part of the province of Hupeh.

When I arrived from Europe my father had lived for several years among the Chinese in a stone house built by and for white people and located immediately on the riverside. And, though the windows of the little back hall and the shutters of the upstairs verandah were never closed; swallows had never attempted to build their nests in or on this house. However, I had not been there a month when three swallow families insisted on making their home also within our house, one feathered family in the back hall and two in the verandah. In fact, another one desired very much the front hall where a window stood open most of the time. But we could not put up with the dirt and were forced to close the window, until Mr. and Mrs. Swallow understood and had chosen a place elsewhere.

This discrimination of the swallows was in the minds of our Chinese help, in fact of all those who knew about us, exceedingly important; for, swallows will live according to these Chinese—only where very good and strong spirits congregate around a person. Of course, they knew that space, invisible to us, is filled with superphysical entities.

We owned a summer-house in a picturesque canyon up the river. We never went there by boat but that we glanced inquisitively at a cave high up on the steep mountain side almost overhanging the river. From below we could only see the dark hole surrounded by wild, impenetrable looking shrubbery. Ascent was impossible. Could it perhaps be reached from above? It looked doubtful. We had inquired here and there regarding it and had heard merely a few odd ideas consid-

ered facts by the natives asked. Some said that the cave was inhabited by a dragon and nobody could enter it. Others told us that it was the gathering-place of evil spirits and that any human who risked to enter would not come out alive. Some stated that evil spirits in the shape of leopards lived there. This seemed more reasonable, if the cave could be reached. And if a leopard could enter it there was no reason why we, two good climbers, could not. Only, animals of that nature did not choose as a steady home any place near the living quarters of humans; and there were about half a dozen Chinese huts located about a quarter of a mile away, on a little mesa from which it was an equal distance to the river below.

Historically there were various caves all along the upper Yang-tze-kiang, which had been used in olden times by the then flourishing pirates and thieves. But, for a generation or two none had been seen. We decided to investigate, if at all possible.

When our servants, who were very faithful indeed, heard of our intention they begged us not to go because all knew that we should be killed by whatever lived in that cave. Still, we insisted and made the following arrangement: Our Lao-dah, the old boatsman, with his row-men should take us in our boat to the above named settlement near the cave, that is, to the trail. They should wait there four hours. If by that time we had not returned, they should immediately advise the Consul of what had happened. We knew that then a thorough investigation would be made.

Supplied with the necessary ropes, a torch that would burn two to three hours, (flash-lights were not in our possession), and plenty of curiosity and faith, we started the climb. Our first boy-so-called -the head-servant, Lee-Sr-Fu, went with us. He had attended my father ever since he had come to China and he and his wife were our most devoted servants and friends. Nothing worth while happened on the way, except that we did have to use the rope to make the entrance. Here our good Chinaman went down on his knees imploring us to go back, since we would be positively killed by the evil spirits. My father and I were convinced that the cave had been used by pirates who killed the people, or had spread that story in order to be left alone in their retreat. So we did not listen but asked Lee-Sr-Fu to wait for us and make sure that white people would come to our help, if necessary. He refused, preferring to die with us. I reminded him of his wife who would be left alone.

"She can take care of herself," he said. "Besides, she would be wailing for your death and sorrowing and we would be too unhappy. I come along." And he arose. In the darkness it was impossible to tell anything about the size of the cave which at the entrance looked very ordinary and unattractive. Not having any stalagmites nor stalactites, we concluded that there was no moisture of any kind in the various rooms of different sizes; rather a convenient hiding-place for evil-doers, if they brought food and water along. It was necessary in one place to crawl on one's abdomen through an opening in order to get into another very large looking room. Gingerly we continued our advance. I had gone ahead, followed by my father. The boy, carrying the lighted torch, was the last, walking a bit to one side so that we all might see.

Suddenly I saw a shadow move at a distance in front of me. It filled half the hall and in the uncertain light it was difficult to tell where the darkness ceased and the more palpable shadow of that something started. Keeping my eyes glued to the background, I made a sign to the others and whispered to my father who had stepped up to me:

"There is something alive."

We stood motionless. Ever since we had crawled through that hole, I was conscious of a peculiar psychic feeling of being watched by unseen beings. My father also had become aware of something, since we both had involuntarily stopped chatting and had moved ahead more cautiously.

I do want to mention here that it had not occurred to either of us to take weapons along, following, as I like to think, a reliable intuition. As in the other rooms of the cave, after glancing around we walked near the wall around the room to make sure of any exit, writing, or moisture, then crossed through the center so as not to overlook anything of interest. Thus in this room. Silently, carefully, we moved a few steps forward along the wall where there was a ledge about 5 feet above the ground, like a narrow shelf.

My eyes had never left the darkness ahead and now that shadow, grey-black and superhumanly large, condensed into something smaller and blacker, and still smaller and blacker. The next moment the shadow of something on the shelf was clearly visible in the torch light. This in



Mediums and Radios

By G. L. Barnes

LIGHT YEARS AGO, if we had a radio and tried to get KDKA, we fished around with three dials for from 5 to 30 minutes and maybe then quit in disgust. Those three dials had to be set to a hair and the exact spot the needle was on yesterday got a fearful squawk today. But 8 years ago science had recognized the radio and was working to take the squawk out of it, not to make the squawk final evidence of fraud. Today if we want KDKA we know just where to turn the dial and in a second we have KDKA if on the air and our radio is in order. Now before we turned on the radio the music from KDKA was in the room, but we didn't hear it because we were not using the medium (machinery) that made it audible. The music or voice was there in the form of vibrations and the receiving set caught, built up and magnified those vibrations so that we could hear them with our normal ear. The human radio or the voice medium functions as an avenue for voice communication with the so-called dead in much the same manner. The ectoplasm of a voice medium corresponds to the tubes of the radio in that in some way it performs the same function. We know what to do when one of our radio tubes burns out and when our radio battery runs down we recharge it or get a new one. But with our human radio we can't get new tubes yet and recharging that physical, or superphysical battery may need chemicals that we know little or nothing about-yet, this thing or force called ectoplasm exists in, generate from and emanates unconsciously from the physical bodies of all individuals, whether mediums or not and the physical body is a natural dynamo that constantly produces and stores it as a battery stores electricity. But its function at present is largely involuntary and it may work quite satisfactorily one day and the next day very poorly.

Now let us imagine that 50 years ago, the 100 leading scientists of the world all went to sleep one night and slept for 50 years, then were wakened to listen to a radio demonstration. Having been asleep for 50 years they do not know a thing about radio and such a thing can only be a fantastic dream to them. We have them all gathered together in a hall in Chicago. The one who is going to demonstrate steps out on the stage, points to the radio and says- Gentlemen, this machine I have here will reproduce music or voices from any distance and we will now demonstrate by starting this machine and you will hear a program now being produced in New York. This comes thru the air instantly from New York. Our scientific gentlemen pass knowing looks to each other, tap their foreheads to signify what a rattle brained fool is on the platform and wonder why they even came. The demonstrator turns on the switch and he gets music and voices as he said. Our scientists are mystified, but being experts in their respective lines and knowing this thing is not possible, they explain to the reporters present that it was a very clever fraud, probably done so and so, but beyond any doubt it was a fraud for voices can't be projected thru the air from New York; it's absolutely impossible and anybody who really believes it must be crazy.

Now we will suppose that the demonstrator had happened to make a mistake in the time and New York was not on, or a tube was out, our wise skeptics would have explained-we told you so. It simply can't be done. The fraud was so obvious that it's silly to try to pull such stuff before people of intelligence. About this time our unfortunate demonstrator finds he has a broken circuit and he steps out and starts explanations, saying the machine won't work under these conditions, come back tomorrow and we will try again. What a ha-ha his perfectly good excuses would get from those asleep for 50 years.

Our radio demonstrator would have been damned if he did produce and damned if he didn't. And this is very much the attitude of our present day scientists (except a few courageous ones who brave ridicule) in regard to voice manifestations from the so-called dead.


If a medium who can bring thru independent voice tried to give a demonstration before 100 scientific skeptics today, that medium would be a clever fraud if successful and a simple fool if not.

Yet some of the same causes that could stop entirely or badly hinder radio reception can stop or hinder the medium because the same force, vibration, is the active factor with both. The highly sensitized nerve system of the medium functions the same as the wiring and tubes of the radio in that it catches, steps up and makes audible the voice of the spirit entity. The medium has no more control over the conversation that may ensue than the loud speaker of your radio has over the program being broadcasted. The medium acts as and actually is a human machine being used at the time by an outside intelligence. With the independent phase the voice is not from the medium's lips and vocal cords but out of thin air and the medium's mouth may even be taped shut or kept full of water.



9, symbolizes the Planet Mars, the highest number, 3×3 , the inclusion of the three planes, perfect wisdom, a sacred number. No matter how many times it is added or multiplied it always can be reduced to 9. Added to any other number, the value of the number is not changed. It represents the higher and sacred powers of the Soul.

The simple meanings of the 9 digits were explained in the March, 1931, issue of the Occult Digest (Lesson II). In these more advanced articles we shall consider the esoteric and occult meanings of the 9 digits, and what they symbolize.

The question is often asked, "Why are there only 9 digits?" The only answer is "Because," that is all there are. The whole of creation, every angle of science, every phase of the physical world is based on the 9 digits. No number, however large, but can be reduced (by occult addition) to one of the 9 digits.

A look backward into the history of various nations and various centuries will reveal the fact that numbers, while always the same, have been interpreted by various methods or systems. There is the Kaballa (also spelled Kabballah, Caballa, Kabala) of the Hebrews; the Egyptian Tarot; the Chinese system, etc. There is much to be learned from all of them. Some of these ancient systems are wholly based on sound, but as "sounds" in the ancient tongues differ from those of modern languages, and even "sounds" in the present modern languages differ, we are forced to recognize the fundamental truth that alphabets (letters with sounds) are based on numbers; not that numbers are controlled by sound. To put it another way, it is the number that determines the value of the letter; and not the letter that gives a value to the number.

To illustrate what may seem a difficult point: The letter A in our own English language has several sounds, yet its symbol (A) and its number value (1) are always the same. In some words A is long and pronounced ay; in some it is short, as in rat; in some it is pronounced like "or," as in raw, etc. This difference in pronunciation or phonetic value appears in all vowels, as well as in some consonants (as C, S, TH, G). It is practically impossible to identify modern English with ancient Hebrew, therefore, since numbers are the basis of all calculations, it seems only scientific and logical to fit the alphabet to the digits-not the digits to the letters (or sounds).

It is precisely this method which has resulted in these different systems of enumeration. The Greeks set down the numbers and associated the letters with them, the first letter of the alphabet being identified with number 1. The Hebrews did the same thing. In fact, this was the method followed in all ancient tongues, and should be the method followed by

practical Numerologists today. In educational and scientific fields these by-gone tongues are known as "dead" languages. Let us then, learn all we can of these obsolete sounds and symbols, but apply them in a live, modern and practical way. There is too much to learn to quarrel (as they did in the middle ages) over "How many angels can sit on the end of a pin?"

There are differences among present-day Numerologists in the terminology of the various vibrations. Do not let that disturb you. If you pick up a book or an article which calls the Personality the Quiescent Self; or calls the Birth Path the Initiation, do not let it disturb you. It simply means that there are different names for the same vibration.

Another point of difference, but where there is really no argument, is in the relative importance of the Birth Path and Destiny vibrations. Some insist that the vibrations of the Total Name (Destiny) are more important than the Birth Path. Others consider the Birth Path the most important. Both, however, agree that the significant fact about the Birth Path isthat it cannot be changed, that it is the one thing about a person which cannot be altered. So, it comes down to a definition of what is meant by the word "important."

Those who stand for the superiority of the birth date vibrations, as a key to the character of a person, do so because they say, "The date of birth cannot be altered -therefore it is the most important." Those who claim that the Total Name vibrations are the most important say "The Name is the most important because it can be changed and altered to suit the development of the person."

All this resolves itself into a juggling of words. If you believe it is more important to be able to change a vibration, then in your analysis you will stress the Total Name and base your strongest conclusions on that vibration. If you believe that an unchangeable vibration reveals more about the character of a person, then you will consider the Birth Path the most vital fact. But, in reality there is no argument-just two people saying the same thing in two different ways; one emphasizing the quality of change, the other stressing the quality of non-change.

Your Total Name vibrations are of no value at all unless you have absolutely stabilized your name. Shifting from one name to another, or one form of signature to another results in unstable thinking and indecisive actions. Decide on the name (or signature) you prefer; be sure it harmonizes with your Birth Path and expresses the thing you want to accomplish in life. Then stick to it, study its possibilities, develop along the line you have chosen, make the most of your vibrations

lished the finger-print system of identification, had placed the highest value on deductions from handwriting, and Alphonse Bertillon of France, who devised the famous Bertillon system of identification, was making keen and brilliant experiments with criminal psychology in handwriting. Dr. William Hammond, of high standing in the medical profession in England, in his well known writings on nervous diseases, had stressed the value of handwriting as often a first warning of dangerous physical degenerations; and names like Clemenceau and Poincaire lent dignity to the movement, while Crepieux-Jamin did his brilliant work. In Germany, physicians of the caliber of Doctor Ludwig Klages, and Doctor Georg Meyer of Berlin, entered the campaign with zest; as well as being taken up by American investigators.

Among those who have, in one way or another, borne actual testimony to the utility of Graphology, or their belief in it, may be mentioned: Robert Browning, Mrs. Elizabeth Browning, Sir Walter Scott, Victor Hugo, Alexandre Dumas, Lavater, Goethe, Disraeli, Lord Lytton, Edgar Allen Poe, Nathaniel Hawthorne.

The writing gesture is thus reproducing the mental feelings or pictures, with the result that the thoughts are written and it will be easily seen that the handwriting is the expression of the mental self on paper. Writing doesn't belong to the hand; the hand merely obeys the brain and the result is not handwriting, but properly brain-writing.

Your handwriting is a picture of your innermost self painted by your own hand. The way you dot your i's, cross your t's, form your a's, make the upper and lower loops of letters, the shape and heights of your capitals, the direction of your line of writing, angle of inclination, the size of your writing, tells us the kind of memory you have, the kind of will power and temper you display, if you are inclined to put things off, whether you are generous or a tightwad, the kind of imagination possessed by you, whether you like to be flattered, the opinion you have of yourself, whether of a buoyant or depressed nature, the secrets of your emotional nature, your ability for concentration and detail, and many other things.

The writer of this very interesting specimen possesses a strong and spontaneous emotional nature, one governed entirely by the heart. She is a faithful, sincere, loyal, generous, sympathetic, warm-hearted and affectionate person, one whom you can depend upon and whoever has the good fortune to be her husband can be assured of her constancy in matters of affection.

The uniform upward trend of the lines tells us that she is a genuine optimist, that she really believes that to-day is a better one than yesterday. man radio in the same manner as the mechanical radio is affected. Static disturbance in the atmosphere may cause difficulty of voice enunciation, it may cause lessened volume and a shorter length of time that voice contact may be maintained after being established.

The health condition of the medium and also of the person talking with the manifesting entity may cause the medium to function to a lesser degree, the same as a loose connection in the radio lowers its efficiency. A weakened battery hurts radio reception and a tired out physically run down medium is affected the same wav.

All this tends strongly to show that the active operating element or force is vibrational and quite possibly it is closely related to electricity. We know how to recharge our mechanical battery, but the human battery is a thousand times more difficult to charge or keep charged. The current of vibration of a mechanical radio is carried thru wires and tubes and a break can usually be located easily, but with the human radio the current of vibration operates thru the sensitized nerve system of the individual medium and no two mediums are of similar physical or mental character and each and every medium has an arbitrary receptive wave length that may or may not be such that any certain entity can manifest over it.

A medium should not be condemned if he or she fails to bring thru the voice of some one with whom you may have talked thru another medium. The failure can be due to the fact that the strange medium tunes either too low or too high to take the vibration.

Our present day mediums may be likened to the radios of 8 or 10 years ago when everyone built their own and there were no two that performed alike. Very few of the people who built their own radios could tell why they worked-they just did-after a fashion-sometimes. Many of our mediums are that way today and don't know how they work or what really makes them work and they are largely satisfied to let it go at that. Then they wonder why the public mostly regards them as fools or frauds.





"Governed appetites.


Love of lonely study,

suffices; love, forgiveness, comfort and protection.


In the suburbs, racing towards my despoiled home I remember calling out in anguish. "Mother o' mine."
