Food for the Layman

THE question this month vibrates to those seeking the understanding in a language for the busy man and woman and the quick grasp of impatient youth. Occultism and Psychical Research are so complicated! Not at all, my friends; the complication arises through your trying to grasp too many laws. First, eliminate all instructions, all previously conceived ideas, about the subject. Retain only one word "Life"; write it down on a piece of paper; prefix the word "all", add the words "is" and "Eternal" and you have the sentence All Life is Eternal. Follow this sentence by another "and governed by one Law."

Death is change, not annihilation. Birth is change, therefore Birth and Death are the same law operating at intervals of Time. They are the entrance and exit of our Physical expression giving us our experiences in Physical or Earth evolution. Now picture yourself as a seed back in time before there was any Life living as we know Life, even before the point of Creative light threw off the seed that later became the first stages in your evolution of Mind.

A point of Light is created by two opposites manifes-

tating as one force, known as male and female energies. Meditate on this and picture yourself as that Point of Light brought into conscious Life through many births and deaths on worlds upon worlds until you reached your present habitation the world of known cause and effect. THE SPIRIT PAINTING

An Experience From Life

The winter of 1927 was a memorable one in my life. For it was shortly after the Christmas holidays of that year that a most peculiar experience caused me to become a firm believer in psychic phenomena and spirit manifestations.

I said the experience was a peculiar one and that it certainly was, for not only was it witnessed by hundreds of keen eyes at the very moment of its occurrence, but it thoroughly convinced one of the world's most ardent skeptics—myself. Further it made me a part of it—which was exactly the one thing on this earth that could possibly have caused me to surrender my creed of unbelief.

In order to clarify this statement I must emphasize that from the time I was twelve years old, at which age I first read Thomas Paine's "Age of Reason", I had become more or less hardened and materialistic until finally I arrived at a point where Schopenhauer's "Force and Matter" and Voltaire's "Riddle of the Universe" were my only bibles.

Universe" were my only bibles.

Then also, my profession is—or rather was—that of a vaudeville magician. I was an expert exponent of the art of trickery, exceedingly adept in sleight-of-hand and thoroughly familiar with practically every type of device or mechanical apparatus used in the art of deception. During the period that the late Harry Houdini was president of "The Society of American Magicians", I obtained an honored membership in that organization, and thereafter became an avid follower of his numerous "exposes" of mediums, seances, etc.

So taking my work, associations and taste in literature all into consideration, is it strange that I deemed hallucination or rank fraud a necessary requisite of all forms of psychic phenomena? Is it strange that it required a super-extraordinary psychic manifestation to normalize my point of view?

This extraordinary manifestation of which I shall write, occurred, to be exact, the night of February seventh, 1927, on the stage of the Garden Theatre in Kansas City, during the last performance of my week's engagement there—in full view of the entire audience! My act featured an illusion known among magicians as the "Famous Spirit Paintings". I shall describe the effect in more or less detail that you may better understand exactly what took place that never to be forgotten night.

Following the rising of the curtain and the delivery of a brief lecture along anti-Spiritualistic lines, I would proceed to pass a number of blank canvases such as artists use for oil paintings among the audience for examination, requesting them to write their names or initials on the canvases for future identification. Next the audience was given (what they thought to be) their choice in the selection of any subject such as that of a famous painting or the name of any noted

individual. Even the name of a friend or relative, living or dead!

I would then place one of the examined canvases on a display easel where it was rendered perfectly transparent due to a powerful electric light placed at the rear. With the house lights off and while all eyes were intent upon the white illuminated canvas, slowly and faintly at first a dim shadow would appear. Gradually this shadow would grow larger and become more distinct and in a few short moments a perfect, finished oil painting in all its brilliance of color would be completely produced.

It was then my custom to remove the painting and pass it down to the person whose name or initial it still bore. Thus proving that it was the very same canvas which was examined in its original blank condition. As for the details of the "modus operandi" suffice it to say that the audience did not have free choice in the selection of the subject. That invariably the paintings were produced upon specially prepared "trick" canvases—the developing process being chemical in nature and brought into action by the extreme heat from the powerful light rays focused at the rear of the easel.

However, in spite of the fact that the entire exhibition was nothing more than a clever fake, I know for certain there are many persons, among the hundreds who witnessed the show during my various tours across the country who still cherish a firm belief in my powers as a medium of great ability. That such is actually the case is attested by the many letters I constantly received when on tour, from persons requesting—some even beseech-

ing me to produce the likenesses of their loved ones on the "other side".

I usually disposed of such letters as fast as they arrived in the waste-boxes back stage. To me they were but written evidence of my oft stated contention that seventy percent of the people were either ignorantly superstitious or childishly gullible. But the letter I received in Kansas City I shall never forget. It was from one whose mother-heart ached for a glimpse of her dead baby daughter and the story it told was so pathetic that it shamed me and filled me with disgust for my work.

Her baby had been joyously riding a'top a flower decked float costumed as the tiny fairy queen of the city's memorial day parade the year previous. The float had suddenly caught on fire—the flames enveloping the helpless child and before her rescue could be effected she had been burned alive!

With the statement that no picture had ever been taken of the child, during its brief life time and assuring me in unmistakable terms of her great faith in my ability, the note concluded with a passionate appeal that I materialize her dead baby's image for my last performance—that she, the mother, would be in the audience praying for my success.

Perhaps because it was my custom to do so I tore the missive up and threw it away. But try as I would I could not tear the memory of its appeal from my mind. Throughout the balance of the day it harrassed me constantly. Everything I did seemed to recall the lines of that fateful letter and mentally I repeated them over and over.

In fact so deeply was I affected that when the curtain arose for my final performance I was actually ill. Feverish and nervous, I had difficulty in commanding sufficient courage to step from behind the wings and face the audience. My uneasiness mounting with every word and faltering terribly I somehow managed to get the performance under way.

Fearing that you, my readers, may misjudge my feelings at the time I wish to explain that in the ordinary sense of the term, at least, I was not stage frightened. To me the audience had ceased to exist. The fact that hundreds of pairs of eyes in that vast theatre were intently watching my every move did not affect me a particle. But from somewhere out in that multitude I seemed to feel the gaze of but one certain pair of eyes! Uncannily I even sensed their direction and as I moved about on the stage I knew I was their focal point.

If you accept as possible that one person or one pair of eyes can cause another to be stricken with stage fright, then perhaps that was my true condition. I, however, believe I was but experiencing the truth in that naive expression of the

A Remarkable Demonstration of Spirit Drawing

WO materialized spirits, emerging from the cabinet at the same time, carried on a conversation together, and walked into the center of the room in the subdued rays from an amber light. Excepting for the fact that both spirits were tall and slender, they had distinctly individual characteristics and mannerisms, and neither spirit resembled in the slightest degree the medium, Thomas Lacey, who is short in stature and of stout build. All through the seance the medium sat within the cabinet in a trance-like sleep, his regular breathing being distinctly heard by the ten sitters present and his physical outline being faintly silhouetted on the cabinet curtain.

All this took place during the regular weekly seance conducted by Lacey, noted Canadian trumpet and materializing medium, on the evening of November 5, last, in the home of Mr. and Mrs. E. W. Sheldon, 26 Poppler street, Waterloo, Ontario. During the course of the seance

many spirit entities, male and female, adults and children, and all decidedly different in appearance, voice and mannerisms, emerged from the cabinet, one by one, walked about the room, and held conversation with the sitters. Most of the spirits thus manifesting were recognized.

The outstanding phenomenon of the evening occurred later in the seance, when a demonstration in spirit drawing was presented, an Egyptian spirit drawing a pencil sketch of himself, embellished with a line of Egyptian hieroglyphs. This entire demonstration occurred within the brief space of less than four and onehalf seconds. spirit, in typical Egyptian head-dress and flowing robes

of a diaphanous, gossamer-like material, stepped briskly from the confines of the materialization cabinet, and began talking in a strange tongue, believed to be early Egyptian. Walter, the medium's spirit control, acted as interpreter.

The Egyptian spirit declared his earth life dated back more than fifteen hundred years before Christ, at which time he was a ruler of considerable power and prominence. His mummified body, he said, was one of those exhumed at Luxor in recent excavations. He made no effort to hide his resentment for the work of the excavators, which he paraphrased as "wanton desecration of the sacred crypts of Egyptian kings." He seemed considerably agitated while expressing his displeasure with the work of these gloryseeking archeologists.

Taking a blank sheet of paper upon which initials had been inscribed by one of the sitters as a mark of identification and a stub of a lead pencil, the spirit walked to the far end of the room near a subdued amber light and placed the paper on the wall so that the sitters could

plainly see that the sheet was blank and that it was the same piece of paper that bore the identifying initials.

At a given signal, the Egyptian began his demonstration, manipulating the pen-cil so rapidly that little was heard save what sounded like a series of continuous rasp-like scratches. At the close of the demonstration, the spirit walked to a table in the center of the room, handed the sheet of paper to this writer and then dematerialized within full view of the assembled sitters. The paper was found to bear a perfect profile, pencil sketch of the head and shoulders of the spirit, sur-mounted by a line of fantastic hieroglyphic characters. It was the general opinion of those present that the drawing could not have been executed by one who was not an artist. The entire drawing, bust and hieroglyphs, was executed in the brief space of four and four-tenths seconds, according to a stop watch held dur-ing the demonstration by one of the sitters.

S.", which had been placed on the blank paper before the seance by Mr. Steiss, to insure against the spirit using a specially-prepared paper for the demonstration.

Esoteric Meaning of Spiritual Numbers

(Continued from last month.) Spiritual Numbers 22 to 30.

N THE LAST issue of the OCCULT Digest we described the number 21, which we found denoted success, attainment, power and individuality. But we did not have the space to bring it down to a practical basis by means of examples. We mentioned that 21 is the 3rd octave of the number 7 (perfection) but it is also the 7th octave of the number 3; and 3, you will remember is the number of artistic self-expression. People with this number 21 in the Destiny or Birth Path are essentially artistic. They may show it in their love of gardens and landscape gardening, or in their taste for interior decorating; or in their study of plants as the basis of perfumes; or in the artistic preparation and serving of foods. They are the youthful, buoyant type, and at the same time have the drawback of youthful carelessness. They usually are rather happy-go-lucky, easy-come-easy-go. Concrete things seem to slip away from a 21. One would never expect to find a millionaire with a 21 vibration. But artists, and musicians, yes, indeed; many of them have this vibration. The singer Patti (71229 \pm 21 is an example; as is Clio, the ancient muse of poetry. As an example of a reverse 21, symbolizing unhappiness, baseness, ignorance, darkness and misfortune, we have Pluto, the mythological king of Hades. 21, according to the Hebrew Kaballah, expresses artistic

power, poetry, literature, success.

Number 22. This is a strange number, embodying super strength and super weakness. When lived in its higher aspect

it denotes supreme power and mastery. When lived in its negative aspect (4) it indicates drudgery, selfishness, routine, limitation; often with no intellectual development. Just here let me caution you not to confuse a positive four with a negative 22. Always consider the numbers carefully and never reduce a 22 to lowest terms until after you have examined its higher aspect.

A reverse 22 uses all its masterful powers for evil ends. Many gangsters and racketeers are 22's, using their great powers for nefarious and unlawful purposes. Many of these criminals, if they turned their talents into good channels would be great financial and executive leaders. For the same qualities which make them the head of a gang, if rightly used, would make them the leaders of some big corporation or humanitarian enterprise.

Those of you who read my course of lessons printed in the Occult Digest last year, will remember that when 22 is found in connection with another digit, it gives that digit super power. For example a 22-2 would probably reveal a master musician, statistician, diplomat with the underlying influence of 6 (22-2-6), which would undoubtedly give a fine speaking or singing voice and a helpful disposition. 22 is the number which often denotes a love of travel, especially by water and encourages enterprises connected with the water such as commerce, vogages of discovery, etc. A typical 22 is Richard Evelyn Byrd whose Destiny is 9-22. His first voyage around the world was taken alone at the age of 12, and as you know he is an officer in the United States Navy, an organizer, leader, explorer-in fact a 22 on the highest plane of achieve-

Another angle of 22 must not be overlooked since many authors recognize it. Cheiro calls it a "warming number of illusion and delusion" and false judgments. Dequer says that some writers designate it as the zero number, or negation—the condition which precedes action. "In music it is silence; its mineral is earth and its color black." But he explains that 22 is not essentially evil; it is negation-a warning-the last letter of the Hebrew alphabet. On the other hand, other authors call it the number of mastery which helps all other numbers to greater success and power. 22 is always a leader (or should be) but always in the material plane, not on the spiritual. Unless other numbers give softening, altruistic and sympathetic influences. Even at

the height of worldly success, 22 is apt to be hard, selfish, brilliant, rather than humanitarian or sympathetic.

When we consider that out of nothing (or chaos) all things are created, we find that considering 22 as negation is only an indicator of danger which may lead to either of its dual characteristics—great success or great failure; great power or great weakness according to the way in which it is lived.

With 22, we reach the end of the Hebrew alphabet, which has 22 characters, and we get no more help from the Kaballan in finding the esoteric meaning of numbers higher than 22. But other great occultists have worked out these meanings through number 52, on the scientific basis of the solar year which has 52 weeks. Few people realize that our common playing cards have their origin in the Egyptian Tarot cards, which were and still are used for devining future events. 52 multiplied by the mystic 7 gives 364 which the ancients recognized as a year. The 365th day was a festival-an occasion of great rejoicing when no work was done either by man or beast. These numbers are not arbitrary but are based on the passage of the Sun through the 12 divisions of the Zodiac. This is the basis of the calendar year found in all ancient civilizations. The esoteric meanings of all numbers above 10 may be interpreted from the symbolic pictures on the Tarot cards, whose origin is so ancient as to be lost. Therefore each of the numbers up to and including 52 has a hidden influence, as well as the exoteric or obvious meaning of the primary digit to which it can be reduced.

The Hebrew Kaballah alphabet carries us to 22; the Tarot (Egyptian) carries us to 52; and the Chinese Yi-King (to be taken up later) carries us to 64. Beyond, is repetition.

Number 23—This number, like a primary digit (5) expresses versatility and cleverness; a quick brain; easily learning new things. It gives a natural hardihood and daring; is gifted in speech and writing; it is a success number and indicates that help may be expected from those higher in authority. In dealing with future events it denotes changes, with the opportunity for betterment.

Number 24—This number denotes a person usually fortunate in everyday matters, yet it carries the warning of danger from falls, especially from a horse. I personally know a 24 person who has suffered falls from a horse and other falls

Handwriting Reveals Character

"By Their Handwriting Shall Ye Know Them"

HE MORE independent habits, individuality and personality children acquire, the more their style or form of writing changes by getting farther and farther away from the copy book style, all other things being equal, all to the horror and despair of the patient and painstaking teacher.

Although a child writes with much more difficulty and self-consciousness than the experienced grown person, and a child's character is naturally much more immature than that of a grown person, yet the incontrovertible and irrefutable fact remains that the handwriting of children does reveal many traits of character with just as much certainty as that of grown persons. It has been my privilege to examine numerous specimens of the handwriting of youngsters, ranging from the primary grades to college. Some of them displayed a similarity of traits common to their ages, and some the influence of their teaching, but every one has had the marks of his or her individuality definitely stamped upon the handwriting, and has shown the graphological indications which corresponded with certain traits of char-

The very fact that no two persons write alike, even though they may be twins and taught by the same teacher, is the best proof that handwriting is an expression of individuality. Even though certain handwritings may appear similar, yet all of them bear certain divergences, variations, differences, little marks and signs, hooks and loops, which correspond with the writer's character, and are readily recognized by the experienced graphologist.

Children and others do not write exactly alike. It is impossible for them to do so. This only appears to be the fact to the person unacquainted with the principles of Graphology.

OBJECTION NUMBER 5: Handwriting does not depend upon the character of the writer, but upon the shape, size and structure of the hand.

It is a well established fact, both in America and Europe, that writing with the right hand or left hand, or with the foot, the mouth, etc., is in a psychological sense not handwriting, foot-writing, nor mouth-writing, but represents one and the same brain-writing. The graphological signs which correspond with your individual character will be the same in each writing.

That the handwriting does not depend upon the shape, size or structure of the hand, so long as there is no crippling or impediment of any nature affecting the natural and uninterrupted action of the hand and arm, as has been proved beyond all doubt by numerous experiments. Many persons with large hands write very small, and many with small hands may write very large.

Just now I have in mind an acquaintance of mine, who, as a young man started out in life as an excellent stenographer, but had the misfortune to meet with an accident that deprived him of both hands. But this young fellow had the stamina and fortitude not to allow this to long interfere with his advancement. He had hardly recovered when he, having something of a mechanical turn of mind, had constructed a pair of mechanical arms and hands which enabled him to eat, write, drive an automobile, and attend to business as any one else. He took up law, completed it, and became quite successful as a lawyer and jurist. Since he has entered the commercial field successfully. His writing by either his mechanical arm or mouth is the same graphologically.

As I write this I have on my desk the writing of a young fellow who is an artist, who, being without arms, writes and paints with his mouth, and his writing shows as distinct character as any one having the use of his arms and hands. He displays remarkable talent, and is also an expert wrestler and a great lover of sports, all of which is revealed in his writing.

Frank N. Freeman, Professor of the Educational Psychology School of Education, University of Chicago, in "The Teaching of Handwriting," says, "A close analogy exists between the child's writing and the attempt of an adult to write with his toes. This is not at all a fantastic illustration. Any one can learn to write with his toes who will expend the same amount of time and effort which the child expends in learning to write with the fingers."

OBJECTION NUMBER 6: Handwriting is affected by the materials used.

Naturally the character of the handwriting is temporarily modified by the attendant external mechanical circumstances of the writing and the materials used.

The kind of materials which a person uses are to a certain extent indicative of the character. It is the choice of pen which does actively affect the matter of

pressure in handwriting. Writing done with a fine pointed pen looks different from that written with a round pointed, or a heavy pointed pen, or with pencil or stylograph. On rough or absorbent paper the ink has a tendency to spread, and on grained paper the writing will appear more or less uneven, whereas on smooth paper it remains clear and sharp. Two persons using the same pen will produce lines which are quite different in character. But the choice of the pen used and the manner in which it is held and applied to the paper does affect the results produced. For this reason, I always request, if possible, a specimen of handwriting in ink, on smooth, unruled paper, written with your accustomed pen.

OBJECTION NUMBER 7: Members of the same profession or trade frequently write a similar hand without possessing similar characters.

It is only to those who are not familiar with the principles of Graphology that there is an apparent similarity. Merely because persons belong to the same trade or profession does not mean that they should possess similar characters or similar handwritings. And indeed they do not. In the whole world there are no two persons who have the same handwriting. A minute, but usually a most superficial, analysis of their handwriting will readily prove they do not write alike. Their handwriting shows many differences. Any similarity in their handwriting would likely be more indicative of their fitness for their trade or profession than of character traits, in so far as vocation is concerned. Quite naturally, should they possess any similar traits of character we should expect to find the evidence of them in their handwriting. They may exhibit some mental traits in common, but not necessarily character traits. There is a vast difference in the two.

OBJECTION NUMBER 8: How can handwriting accurately reveal character when each country has its characteristic type of handwriting?

It is quite true the national handwriting must be taken into consideration. Just as each nation has special external characteristics, so it is only natural to find these variations and differences in the national handwriting. In analyzing the handwriting of various nationalities, I have often found displayed, to a more or less degree, the





poets, "the eyes are the windows of the soul"—I was soul frightened! So much so, in fact, that when the crucial moment arrived where I was supposed to switch one of the examined blank canvases for the "trick" canvas (concealed under the table top upon which the image of Abraham Lincoln was invisibly prepared), I inadvertently picked up the very same one the audience had just examined and placed it upon the easel. My assistant, who was as ignorant as I of my error, immediately turned on the light behind the canvas and gave the electrician his cue to extinguish the auditorium lights.

Save for the light glowing weirdly through the white canvas on the easel, the entire theatre was now in complete darkness. And although this was a setting of my own creation, on this night it seemed strangely oppressive, seemed to settle about the atmosphere in a damp shroud of true, eerie, mystery.

I sought to steady my shaking legs by resting a hand on the table top at my side. Reaching in the darkness my hand fell an inch or so short of the top and immediately came in contact with the projecting end of the prepared canvas which I had neglected to change for the blank one. Instantly a flood of confused thoughts raced through my brain—the canvas on the easel was a blank! painting could possibly be produced upon

I stood there stunned, desperately endeavoring to formulate a means by which, under some pretence or other I might yet switch canvases. resulting in sprained ankles. Both these experiences have been repeated several times.

Number 25-Here we find strength through control, experience and wisdom. Yet this very strength is usually attained only through mastering obstacles and disappointments. It gives strong intuition and often prophetic dreams or second sight. It dominates occult subjects and finds its solace in Nature. It is safe on water and a 25 is often an expert swimmer. Note that Annette (25) Kellerman, the famous swimmer falls under this vibration. 25 shows power acquired by experience; mastery of mysteries; perfection. On its lowest side it brings black magic or the harmful use of occult power.

Number 26-This is a number of warning - indicating possible disasters or money losses or unsuccessful partnerships. But it also brings the power to control others, or leadership. It brings self-confidence, although some unusual event may be needed to develop this quality. It is a good number for diplomacy and secret service. It makes energetic, compelling

speakers and in its lowest form (8) may indicate burglars, racketeers and lawbreakers, treachery and evil. On its highest side it brings honor, faith, security. It is a strong number whether for good or bad and in either case tends to the accumulation of wealth and worldly goods.
