What Does Society Do to Prevent Youth From Becoming Criminals?

OCIETY demands Revenge—politely renaming it a Debt to society which must be paid, sometimes by a Life for a Life, despite the Master's (whom men call Savior) rebuke when He said "A new Commandment I give unto you."

The old law was "an eye for an eye—a life for a life," but the new law was "Love one another." Our State law says "The accused shall be held innocent until proven guilty." It does not say "until he proves his innocence" as it is now interpreted by our Courts and Public defenders.

Turning the Earth Into Eden by Astrological Birth-Control

How to avoid ill-fated children ... Your duty to your child and to humanity

Mankind goes on, haphazardly bringing children into the world, having them conceived at any old time and born at any old time without half as much thought and planning as is used in the breeding of animals, the raising of a crop, the building of a house or the organizing of a business.

VOLUMES upon volumes have been written about birth-control, yet the birth-rate shows little trend of changing. Why? Because the basic principles of birth-control have never been expounded nor explained. Many innovators have stressed the benefits of controlling the quantity of births; in this thesis I do not aim to rend asunder any of the good foundations of birth-control because I heartily endorse such a movement, but I shall strive to give a presentation of the underlying principles which go to create a better quality instead of a decrease in the quantity of births.

That the Stars control the destiny of peoples, of races and of nations cannot be denied by anyone who has made a study of the science of Astrology. Only those who have not studied the science condemn it; and no normal mind can investigate the tremendous power of the influence of the Stars, and then truthfully say that Astrology is not a science. Dr. MacDonald, in a series of lectures, said in part: "Astrology is the greatest as well as the oldest science in existence. It dates back to the time of Adam. 'For then it was that Adam obtained wisdom, even from the stars in the heavens'. Astrology must not be confused with fortunetelling, etc. . . . All its judgments are based on sound mathematical calculations. As a means of showing a person's adaptability to certain vocations and occupations it becomes a system of science against luck. It will point out a person's capabilities and defects, their fortunate and unfortunate periods, what diseases they are most liable to, how to select a husband or wife; in fact it will tell all about children, friends, enemies, divorce, partners, locations, investments, lawsuits, etc. An astrologer reads the future and tells of the past of a person's life, from his knowledge of the planetary influences that were exerted the moment the individual was born. There is no guess-work with a scientific astrologer; all his judgments are based on unfailing rules and mathematical demonstrations."

The judgments are arrived at from the year, month, day and hour of a person's birth; these judgments of a client are the result of old established rules, and the confusion that now exists is

caused by the ignorance of people as to their real use and place in the world.

This is not an essay in the defense of Astrology, for it needs no defense; all that it needs is for a person to study the elements of its teachings and put them into practice.

There is the geo-gentric system of astrology, which is the system that deals with the Earth being the center of the Universe and the planets which revolve around it. This is the system that modern astrologers use. Then there is the Heliocentric system which places the Sun as the center of the Universe. Either system is correct and the judgments arrived at are the same regardless of the point of observation.

Mundane Astrology deals with the experiences of a soul from the time of birth until death. This span of a person's life seemed the most important to astrologers of the past. Then it was discovered that the positions of the planets before birth had also much to do with the forming of a person's earth experiences and nature; this branch of Astrology is called the Pre-natal Epoch. There are not enough people, and certainly not enough astrologers who appreciate the importance of this period, from germination to birth!

Would it not be silly and foolish for the farmer or the gardener to plant his seeds out of season, when the ground is soaked with water, or when it is too dry? It would be a waste of material and he would reap a scanty, stunted growth of vine or stalk which would not be fit to place upon the market. Would it be wise for an aviator to start on a long flight when the weather forecasters saw a storm brewing? These are merely a few of the physical or visible laws of nature that man recognizes. There is a law that rules and governs the Universe that mankind responds to either consciously or unconsciously every moment of his existence. This law that permeates space is the law of cause and effect and is interpreted accurately and unfailingly by scientific astrology.

Mankind goes on, haphazardly bringing children into the world, having them conceived at any old time and born at any old time without half as much thought and planning as is used in the breeding of animals, the raising of a crop, the building of a house or the organizing of a business.

We have no statistical proof, but I dare to say that sixty per cent of the babies that are brought into the world are not wanted and have not been planned for. But after germination has taken place, the parents resign themselves to their "Fate" and do the best they can with their limited knowledge. Perhaps they will accidently raise a President, or perhaps they will raise a gangster, who knows? The astrologer knows, and had they known and used their God-given common sense and faculty for obtaining and using scientific knowledge, they could have prevented the latter. It is the duty of every parent to bring healthy, happy children into the world, and to give them a birthright so that they will have a chance to succeed in the world. And it certainly is the duty of every parent to humanity to give a perfect

The rigidity of the codes of the foreign aristocracies and the efforts to perpetuate the royal blood is a form of birth-control, not as important scientifically as astrological birth-control. The former aims at physical, and social maintenance from a purely material view-point; the latter aims at physical, mental, professional, spiritual and domestic perfection for the greater good of the human race. People, for generations, yes, for thousands of years, have been degenerating; bringing children into the world carelessly, freely, without the slightest idea that there is a Universal law to guide them and help them in the conception and rearing of children so as to create a super race.

The minds of the masses are so saturated with the customs of an erring world for so many, many centuries that some people will think I am not talking common sense when I say it is possible to bring any kind of child into the world that one may want. Go out upon the streets, into the country, or anywhere your conscience leads you. Give yourself a treat and observe the milling masses. You will find all types, from the highest to the lowest; and all of this humanity was brought into the world without the aid of scientific knowledge! You will have to tell your-

The Mysteries of the Compass Needle Solved By D. W. STARRETT 1—Why does the magnetic compass needle point north and south?

2-Why has it a north and a south-seeking end?

3—Why, for instance, if one approaches its north-seeking end with a strong magnet of opposite polarity does it become a south-seeking end?

4—Why does it assume a right-angle position to a wire through which a strong current is flowing, with its north-seeking end at one's right hand, if one faces the end through which the current is passing, from the body of the wire?

5—Why does a piece of steel cut into the form of a magnetic needle have, naturally, say, a north-seeking end when balanced upon its pivot anywhere on the earth excepting at the poles?

THESE FIVE QUESTIONS have not been adequately answered. The present writer will attempt a solution of them.

Speaking from a mechanical point of view, there never has been discovered but one law of force. This law is known as that of pressure-force. This force never acts, even in expressions of electromagnetics, unless there is a difference in potentiality or level. In heat, light, atmospheric, gas, water, magnetic, electric and gravity pressures, etc., one will find this difference before their forces exhibit power.

In reality, under the science of electromagnetics, there is no attractive and repulsive expressions of force as power, through other than a difference of potentiality or level. The mystery of these forces has never been explained, but that of pressure-force has been given to the world and it is thoroughly understood, excepting the ultimate mystery attending all forces.

The majority of thinking people of the world believe that there is but one Thing over and around and about all evidence of matter. If this is true, then that one Thing surely must be force; yet one finds it difficult to ascribe that Force as being the power-expression that revolves a dynamo, or the engines in an aeroplane. It is very esthetic to view the heavenly bodies when the moon is shining brightly as the Force, but not so when the thunders roll and the tornado rips beautiful cities to shreds and kills thousands. When the quakes rock the earth, it is quite easy to think of some other force in action. But, from a scientific point of view one must not diverge from one's starting point. Of course, if one does not agree with the scientific belief, namely, that there is ultimately but one force, regardless of its expression of power, then supposed "attractive force and repulsive force"

must be ascribed to another source of power.

The orbits of the heavenly bodies are eliptical in form, supposedly from attractive forces of other bodies. These elongations may be simply explained under the law of pressures. One should realize that 'want' is an expression of a pressure-force. When one hungers for anything it is a pressure force that is acting. When one goes to a city or to the country, it is pressure-force that drives one. The body is made up of electrons, all more or less intelligent, and this same body came from the earth. The earth as well as all planets and suns are made up of intelligent electrons. When one meets a friend, one desires to go to him. That desire embodies a 'want,' and pressure preceeds it. Thus when a planet revolving with great velocity, made entirely of these intelligent entities, crosses the path of another planet, a similar 'want' is there. They, under pressure from revolutions are assisted to reach out towards the other body, as a mass, pressure-want.

It is the same principle that causes the electrons of the oceans, as it were, to leap towards the moon and the sun, when they pass closer by, producing, seemingly, the action by the mysterious force, attraction. The force of the electrons of the sun and moon, pressure-force, plow a deep furrow in the oceans and after they pass then come high tides, because of the water rebounding, after filling in the depression to a higher level from the momentum of the water flowing in.

A magnet of great power will seemingly cause tons of steel to float to it by attraction, and there after contact, cling to it with no visible bindings to hold it in the assumed position. For instance, if one moves a sewing needle near a bar magnet, it will move to it or be repelled by it. These expressions of

work, both great and small, are said to be exhibitions of both attractive and repulsive, supposed electrical mysteries, as to why and how they so act.

If one were up in the air in a closed falling chamber, with no air inside of it, holding, say, a ten-pound piece of steel out from the body and dropped it, the steel would float beside one until the chamber reached its magnet, the earth. This 'floating' is comparable to the tons of steel moving to the great magnet. It really 'falls' to the magnet the same as the closed chamber fell to the earth. Each one is in a stream of electrons moving to the larger body. These instances illustrate the buoyancy of electromagnetic currents.

Mr. Chester L. Dawes, S. B., in his "Industrial Electricity," of 1924, page 9, shows a bar magnet and its currents, the direction of flow of which is indicated by the use of a magnetic compass needle. It is plainly observable, in this illustration, that the magnetic units move into and through the southseeking end and out of the north-seeking end of the magnet, and around continuously. Should a sewing needle be placed near the inflow end of the magnet, the south-seeking end of the magnet, it would seemingly, 'float' against the magnet. This would give, apparently, an exhibition of an attractive force; and by placing the needle near the opposite end of the magnet, the end through which the current is flowing outward, the demonstrationmystery would almost prove a repulsive force. Likewise, should one place a wooden needle in a stream of water flowing in and out of a pipe, the simile would be perfect. That is, in each case, the needle would be 'floating' in a stream of units of substance. In the first case, units of magnetism; and in the second instance, units of water.

The Oracle of the Sun

THIS six-fold figure is called the KIA ZAN Hexagram and is one of sixty-four similar symbols no two of which are exactly alike and which all together con-

stitute the text of the YI KING, or Classic of Changes, the Initiated Chinese System of Magick. It is called Chinese, for it is widely known as such, but its origin is much more ancient than anything purely Chinese. It actually came from Atlantis along with all other esoteric contrivances of an Initiatory use and power and was invented by the White Race and carried from its source to a geographical point later ruled by the Manchus before the Akkadian era. The secrets sealed in this Book have never been published otherwise than in this symbolic form except by oral communication. The secret society which has custody of this branch of the Atlantean Wisdom is popularly known as the Order of the Singing Fan; from the fact that its Members have a way of singing or intoning the Hexagrams which gives them tremendous influence in all Spheres. It will be impossible in this article to deal with the technic of magical intonation but we can at least get an idea of the preliminary study and practice necessary before one can become an Adept

Do not confuse this with some of the hazy theories current concerning the utterance of the Lost Word, whether it be AUM, IAO, IHVH, or of some other spelling. All Initiatory procedures, if correct, are based on balance, which may be analyzed into melody, harmony, rhythm and the function of the focal rite must be fully comprehended. Then, all the branches of occultism, like the Tarot, Astrology, Spiritism, Numerology, Geomancy, etc., shall be seen in their proper places off the main track but all leading into it.

A short and simple definition of Initiation is this: Establish and control contact between the cerebrum, which is the main organ of personal consciousness and memory, the cerebellum and the other brains, not only in the head but also in the spinal column and all the way down to the feet. Any form of Divination has been designed to help directly or indirectly by its catalytic action on the nervous system. The Spirits with whom you converse and who answer your questions are specific parts of your own brains. This thesis has been proved adequately by Sir Aleister Crowley in the introduction to his edition of the GOETIA so I will not dwell upon it here. But ordinary and ostensible methods cannot be called magical because they deal merely with areas of the cerebrum. This is that

brain which functions in the sphere of sensation and memory, is blind and stupid otherwise and cannot perceive supersensible facts. It is of use to us only in maintaining necessary relations with the Troglodytes. The Initiates have a secret script of their own which keeps the nature of life in their world from becoming common property. But the old tortoise shell has gone out with the old aeon, along with robes and abrogate are the rituals and ordeals which come not now from the Light of Mercury who is the Oracle or Messenger of the Sun.

Combining them together two at a time we obtain four different figures which analyze and explain the Tetragrammaton Formula—

He Vau He Yod
These are respectively: Universal
Affirmative, Particular Affirmative, Particular Negative, Universal Negative
—reading from right to left.

Adequate explanation of this IHVH Formula can be found in the textbook on "MAGICK" by the Master THERION, so I will not give more space to it here.

The next step is to combine the Yangs and Yins together three at a time. This gives eight Trigrams, whose shapes and names are as follows in the Logical order:

— KHWAN. It is called
— YONI on the Yetziratic
— plane and refers to MALKUTH on the Tree of
Life; its representative is EARTH and
its divinatory significance is capaciousness and submission. It is that sixfold star which lights the way to the
Stainless Abode.

KAN is FIRE on the Yetziratic plane and refers to
the Sphere of GEBURAH
on the Tree; represented

KHAN is MOON, YESOD, rain, clouds, springs, streams and defiles and signifies peril and diffi-

TUI is WATER, CHESED, marshes and lakes and means pleasure, complacency, satisfaction.

KAAN is EARTH, NET-ZACH, hills and mountains; is interpreted as resting and the act of

LI is SUN, TIPHARETH, lightning and of course has the sense of brightness and elegance.

SUN is AIR, HOD, wind, and wood and stands for flexibility and penetration. KHIEN is LINGAM, DAATH, heaven, the sky and read as untiring strength and power.

Omitting consideration of the four and five-fold figures for lack of space let us see how the Hexagrams are built up. Each Hexagram is produced by combining two Trigrams and its meaning will always be found by combining those of the two Trigrams which compose it. The upper trigram is called the modulus and the lower, the base. The whole figure is always erected and read in the ascending order, beginning with the bottom line. If the proper technic is used to erect a figure the operation is Magical and evokes the particular Spirit assigned to that Hexagram.

The method is as follows. Take two ordinary dice. Consecrate one of them with your own Feminine Potency. This always proceeds from the right hand of a man or the left hand of a woman. Consecrate the other with your Masculine Power, which may be done either with the left hand of a man or the right hand of a woman. Now the two dice

are to be thrown simultaneously upon a SQUARE whose exact structure must be as follows. Draw accurately a chessboard; fill in the sixty-four small squares with the sixty-four Hexagrams arranged in their Logical order with the LINGAM of LINGAM gram at the EAST. This is not the natural, but the magical EAST. Logical order of the sixty-four is found in the same way that one finds the logical order of the eight Trigrams; the latter being found thus-

In the SQUARE each file has the same upper Trigram throughout, each rank the same lower Trigram throughout. Files run perpendicularly—ranks run horizontally. The sequence is the same for both files and ranks; thus for files, from bottom to top and for ranks from right to left, in both cases be ginning with KHWAN and ending with KHIEN. Thus number 62 of the logical order will be placed in the 8th file and the 6th rank.

The two dice are to be thrown upon this SQUARE together six times, once for each line of the Hexagram to be erected. A line must be either a Yin or a Yang, which is determined by whether the sum of the pips is even or odd, respectively. Thus, for example, if Be stern for idleness and chattering.

the pips which turn up at the first thrown are six and three, their sum is nine, an odd number, so the first or bottom line of the Hexagram is a YANG, Suppose that at the next throw, the pips are four and two; their sum is six, an even number, so the next line will be a YIN, -. And so on.

Of course, while erecting the figure in this way, the operators must concentrate properly on the question or circumstances pertinent to the Divination or Ceremony.

Suppose that the figure obtained were the one which heads this chapter. One reads it by naming the modulus, then the base, thus-AIR of SUN. Looking this up in the Book of Changes (YI KING) we find that it may be interpreted generally in the following

"KIA ZAN: the household: this right rule's its base;

"The wife be firm, correct, in her own place."

Further we find the following comment-"The Superior orders his words according to the truth of things and his conduct so that it is uniformly consistent." "The Communication to others of one's Realization." "The Oracle of the Sun."

Those who already have some psychic power, skill and experience would need little more information about this figure than given above, but for the beginner it has been further analyzed in the following verse:

First, proper law's a necessary thing. Housekeeper keep the house modesty;

Thus fortune helps enrich the family. All share the luck of the high-minded king.

Sincere, majestic—the end's glittering. It is to be noted that the first line of the verse refers to the bottom line of the figure and so on consecutively.

It is also to be noted that all the Yin lines rhyme with each other; the Yang lines do the same.


In the scheme of the OTz ChIIM (Tree of Lives) this figure represents the Adverse Relation between Tiphareth and Hod.

No system of Divination is valuable if the objective mind is allowed to interfere in any way, either in obtaining an Oracle or in interpreting it. The essential thing in this and every form of Divination is to obey the oracles obtained. Then, the Spirits will reciprocate your confidence and trust by giving you symbols clearer and clearer in exact ratio to that fidelity. Those who keep a scientific record of their workings shall find the figure given always right and the answer always true, appropriate and suited to the question, individual or circumstance, in increasing proportion as they form the habit of heeding the counsel of the gods and of conforming their conduct to the advice given with firm correctness. Any slip-shod or careless procedure insults the Spirits and the operator will be punished accordingly. In all fairness to the gentle reader we must point out that anyone using or teaching this grammar from dishonest motives is very likely to get into serious trouble.

The natural organ of human personal consciousness is the cerebrum, which is the mammalian brain, the organ of

Numberizing the Two Major World's Fairs...1893, 1933

THERE IS no more unmistakable proof of age than to admit being at the World's Fair of 1893. The "dear young things" of today, who were not even born in 1893 look at the '93ers as if they were dinosaurs or some other anthropological relic. But really 40 years is not long as time goes; although these last 40 years have been very long and far reaching in progress. Things scarcely dreamed of in '93 are commonplace in '33. Ask any young voter to step back into the days of 1893 and he (or she) would think he was in some antediluvian period. He would ride on a high bicycle or in a horse-drawn street car or carriage. The automobile was only a curiosity-and a dangerous one at that, for it traveled at the tremendous speed of 15 miles an hour. There were no air ships of any kind; no radios of any kind; no X-ray machines; a few telephones, but only for the well-to-do. The usual home illumination was gas and oil lamps. There were no movies; and talking pictures had not even been dreamed of. A palm leaf fan was all that kept Grandma cool; and she, herself provided the motive power.

The fair of 1893 was as wonderful and as indicative of progress as the fair of 1933, but progress in the last forty years has been "stepped up" with such amazing swiftness that it has made a miraculous change in this old world of ours. Ex-president Curtis visited the Century of Progress not long ago and said "The present exposition is all that the old fair was, with 40 years of progress added." The classic beauty and static glamour of '93 has been supplanted by speed, movement, dynamic appeal to both the eye and ear. You sit at home and listen to a man's voice in London (this is not strange nor unusual to the young person) and before long you will be able to see him as well.

In comparing these two World's Fairs it is not a question of which was better, larger, more important. There is no need for comparisons of this sort. As Longfellow wrote

"Each thing in its place is best,
And what seems but idle show
Strengthens and supports the rest."

Each fair was wonderful for its time and a vital expression of its generation. These two expositions were all the more extraordinary because each was being planned and built during a period of business depression.

1893 was a "3" year (1+8+9+3=21=3), a year denoting artistic self-expression, but it followed a "2" year (1+8+9+2=20), and every student of Numerology knows that "2"

is a weak number for anything connected with financial or constructive progress. As one of the chroniclers of the '93 fair said, "The country and the world was passing through a spasm of financial pressure unexampled in the annals of business." Does that sound natural? As if it might have been written today in connection with the present fair? It is just as true in 1933 as it was in 1893. As a chronicler of the present fair says, "Chicago's Century of Progress has opened in the face of one of the greatest depressions the world has ever seen." These two facts should convince the most superstitious person that numbers do not govern our lives (but guide them); and that the most unfavorable vibrations can be overcome by positive, constructive liv-

1933 is a "16" year (1+9+3+3)= 16 = 7) which indicates difficulties to be overcome. Whenever and wherever we find "16" we must consider it a red lantern, a danger signal. It always means "stop, look and listen"-but it does not necessarily bring disaster unless the warning is disregarded. 1933 is a typical "16" year-full of pitfalls, opportunities for disaster, difficulties to overcome, struggles for readjustment, but with the ultimate "7" promising spiritual advancement after the obstacles of "16" have been met and conquered. Not only is 1933 a "16" year, but it is the culmination of the "lean" years which began with the stock market crash in the fall of 1929 (3), an easy-come-easy-go year; followed by a "4" year, a period of systematizing and analyzing, calling for efficiency and economy. Then came 1931 (14=5), a "14" year; and (as I said in my article in the Occult Digest for December 1932) "14" is a number which calls for caution, reconstruction and shows a lack of balance or harmony which must be met positively. If we meet this vibration negatively, bitterness, loss and trouble are likely to overtake us." Certainly bitterness, loss and trouble did come towards the close of the Hoover administration. But with the nomination of Franklin D. Roosevelt-his election-and the beginning of his term on March 4, 1933 (3+4+7= 14=5) we came to the time which marked the change from the negative 14 to the positive 5. Yet do not forget that both Mr. Roosevelt and his officials are still working under the influence of a "difficult" 16 year. Yet the Fair is here—as dynamic a spectacle as Mr. Roosevelt is man.

The opening date of each fair must be considered as its birthday, whatever conditions may have preceded it

and surrounded its pre-natal period. The earlier fair opened May 1, 1893 (5+1+3=9). No better key can be found to the character of that Exposition than 9. Every student of Numerology knows that 9 is the great artistic number, expressing good-will and friendliness to the whole world. It also has the note of finality or endingand surely the elaborate ornateness of the nineties saw its culmination and the beginning of its end in the fair of '93. This "9" vibration is perfectly in harmony with the cosmic vibration of the year 1893-(3 times 3 equals 9). And if you can remember, or if you have seen pictures of the 1893 fair you must have been impressed with the extreme ornamentation and elaboration of artistic flourishes that were seen in the super-embellishment of the architecture. A newtonian law states that, through motion, all congregations of matter force their electrons outward in all directions, and in the greatest volumes in planes of their revolutions. But if there is a weakness in the body it will be plainly shown by a bulging of the solid material in the planes of their revolution. The earth's equatorial diameter is a number of miles greater than that of its polar diameter. The great ring of Saturn is an instance of this pressure-force. The earth's equatorial velocity is one thousand miles an hour and that of Saturn is something like twenty-two thousand miles per hour. The great ring of that body is the result of that velocity. One may view fainter rings on the photographs of Saturn, ranging from the great ring to its poles. One may also view similar rings on the photographs of Jupiter, from the equator to its poles. But Jupiter is much more rigid than Saturn, its density, with the earth's I, being 24, and that of Saturn, 13.

The earth follows this law discovered by Sir Isaac Newton, and had its electrons not returned it would have been depleted of much volume long ago. This depletion would have effected the law of a falling body, that rigidly has remained the same since it was discovered over two hundred years ago. The return of the electrons thrown off by the earth's revolution, through what is known as the north and the south magnetic poles, has produced those lines of magnetic force, that reach from the north to the south pole, at every minutest point of the earth. The compass needle resting upon its delicate point causes it to swivel to a parallel position with these north and south lines of 'magnetic flux. One end of it, that which naturally points in the direction of the north star, Polaris, has been named the north-seeking end; and the other the south-seeking end. It is plain to be seen that the needle swivels on its delicate point, not because there is an attraction for it anywhere, but because of the law of pressure due to its being pivoted in a stream of units of a substance, magnetism.

If a board, say, four feet long and six inches wide, were pivoted upon a post in a stream of flowing water, one end most naturally would seek the down-stream point. One might, with reason, name this end the ocean-seeking end and the other the mountain-seeking end. This naming the ends is comparable to naming the ends of the magnet compass needle. In each case it is merely giving a name that they may be designated easily.

If one holds one end of a powerful magnet near the supposed north-seeking end of a magnet compass needle, if the current of units of magnetism is flowing out of that end the needle will reverse naturally, because the

pressure of the current will sway it from north position to that of a south one. This fact explains why if the north end of a compass needle is stroked with the south end of a magnet it will reverse, and it is considered a deep mystery. Conversely, should one hold the north end of the magnet, into which the current is flowing, the needle will not reverse, because the pressure holds it in that position most naturally. If one holds the board with its oceanseeking end against a current flowing towards the mountain, it would reverse the same as the magnetic needle does; and like the magnetic needle, the instant it were placed in a stream flowing to the ocean, it would seek and attain that former position. With the magnetic needle, if one causes it to reverse as explained, and the north end becomes a south one, the instant that one removes the magnet the needle will again point north.

If one lays a copper wire in any direction, relative to the points of the compass of the earth, and sends thru it not less than 100 amperes of current* it will generate circling lines of force around it. Place a magnetic compass needle, say, near and above it, and if one is facing the out-flow end from the body of the wire, the northseeking end of the needle will be at one's right hand, because from pressure of the current flowing in that direction. Approach this end with a strong magnet whose current is flowing outward and the needle will reverse, showing that attraction has nothing to do with the reversal, and, furthermore, that there is no relation between the magnetic compass needle and the poles of the earth other than the currents of magnetism flowing north and south. This fact positively proves that pressure-force is the agent of reversal.

The reason why a piece of steel when first cut into the form of a magnetic compass needle has a supposed north-seeking end is aptly illustrated by the action of the board in the flowing stream of water. It would be physically impossible to so balance it crosswise of the stream. The end of the board with even a shade of more floating material would surely swivel down the stream. Similarly, the piece of steel could not be cut to balance crosswise of the magnetic streams of electrons constantly flowing north and south. The strange part about this mystery is that the name, "north-seeking end" or "north end" is given after the needle swivels to its natural position.

If those currents in the past had been considered to be substance, and one had been able to see them as one does the current of a river, there would have been no mystery about the matter.

was planned, was to be June 1, 1933 (6+1+7=14=5). But in an effort to have President Roosevelt open this fair as President Cleveland opened that of 1893, the Century of Progress was born prematurely on May 27, 1933 (5+9+7=21=3). Had the fair opened as planned on June 1st, it would have been born under the vibration of 14 instead of 21. In a previous paragraph of this article I have given a very brief definition of 14. Those of you who have been following my articles on the Esoteric Meanings of Numbers will remember that 21 is called "The crown of the Magi" and denotes "success, attainment, power, individuality . . . victory. It is especially fortunate when found in connection with events. It is the 7th or perfect power of 3 (21). Mystically it is considered as mastery on three planes." This 21 is one of the most interesting of all numbers (See Occult Digest, February, 1933) and it may well be said that Fate and Mr. Roosevelt gave our present fair a most auspicious birthpath of 21, when it might so easily have come under the influence of the knotty 14.

If the two fairs were human beings we would say their Souls (Talents) were indicated by the vowels of their names. What was the Soul of the World's Columbian Exposition?

Its Soul was 6. This is a strong conservative number, expressing friendliness and helpfulness and education. There was nothing startling, exotic, new or unusual about it. It followed along beaten highways and did not seek new paths. Its Personality (the effect it had on people) was 22+11 (6). It was super-inspirational and powerful in its higher vibration yet still fundamentally a 6, the same character as its Soul. Its Destiny (6+6=3) indicates artistic self-expression and is identical with the year 1893. All this may be said to show the fair of '93 reached its high-water mark in artistic selfexpression, beauty, grace; and was master of things on the material plane.

Let us look at the present fair, the Century of Progress.

The Soul of the present fair is 3+11 (5) which indicates super-selfexpression, in its higher aspect and reduced to lowest terms (5) indicates new paths. 5 is a "go-getter" for experience-reaches out after new things -not satisfied with the old, but ever seeking new, novel, untried avenues. Its personality, or its effect on people, strangely enough is the same as its Soul, indicating that the Soul of the Century of Progress has found an outward manifestation perfectly in harmony with its Soul. (This was also true in the case of the '93 fair.) The Destiny of the Century of Progress is 1-the pioneer number. Whenever a 1 or 10 is found it invariably means a breaking with old things and the beginning of new ones. The 9-year cycle has been completed and the upturn into new, unexplored, creative ways has begun. 1 is the number of creation, initiative, independence, aggressiveness, vigor and a new purpose. A Destiny number of 1 gives the instincts of a pioneer; progressive in thinking; unconventional in action; interested in new ideas; courageous in carrying through any plan of action.

To sum up-the World's Columbian Exposition was the peak of conventional yet artistic expression. The Century of Progress is the pioneer, reaching out into unexplored regions, new methods, new thinking, new ways of expressing life, new ideas of art shown in its chaotic almost delirious use of color and its blank, windowless buildings.

In 1893 the hand of President Cleveland touched a so-called button, and by means of electrical current, the Fair sprang into life-at high noon. In 1933, no human hand assisted at the birth of the Century of Progress. A light ray from the star Arcturus which ray had been 40 years in reaching the Earth (having started in 1893) was the midwife who ushered this new and strange infant into the world in the evening. Arcturus, 240 million miles from the Earth, has a Destiny of 31(4), a vibration which is connected with astronomy mathematics, abstract law and all analytical subjects. Scientific men have been studying rays for some years but this is the first time that the lay mind has been aware of the tremendous vibrations and power of celestial bodies as a source of practical energy.

While the Columbian Exposition seemed satisfied to keep its feet on the ground, the Century of Progress has demonstrated that "the sky is the limit." It has built the largest dome in the world and hung it from the

1+2+7=10—something never done before. The Sky Ride (10) is also in tune with the general pioneer spirit. The immense Ferris Wheel, the feature of the '93 fair-going round and round

memory, which perceives by reflected light. Hence, Man is not instinctively intelligent in his acts, for the little stream of experience which flows into his physical consciousness is not enough to guide him. To act intelligently, he must act in accord with the totality of all his experiences, which are by no means confined to the sphere of physical sensation. The cerebrum, therefore, exhibits the vanishing point, so to speak, of cosmic intelligence; the lowest possible mind which is yet capable of acting on a universal scale. Insight, wit, rationality, co-ordination, creative thinking, the perception of the nature and identities of things as they are and of the significance of life, GENIUS or Godhead, does not belong to the cerebrum but is a function of the Cerebellum, whose activity is mostly sub-conscious. At this stage in human evolution the cerebrum is properly the most developed brain but we are entering a higher stage where Man shall learn to use his other brains. Nothing is better to develop truly practical thinking, which is something about which all the pseudoscientists in the world are quite ignorant, then Divination, if carried out faithfully with the right ritual. There must be no guesswork or psychic speculation.

The errors made by fortune tellers, diviners and those who deal with Spirits, are not the fault of the Spirits but are due wholly to wrong attitudes of persons who do not understand and obey the borderland laws, the first of which demands the possession of a clear, level head with self-control and absolute moral integrity. We hear on many sides warnings against spiritism and spiritualism because of the danger in dealing with evil and malicious spirits. The majority of those who issue such warnings imagine that entities higher in the scale of evolution than themselves are less intelligent than themselves and less moral, which is impossible. Evil and falsehood are inseparable. Consequently, no understanding can be the receptacle of truth unless it belongs to a will which is the receptacle of good. Nowhere in the cosmos is there such a thing as a genuinely intelligent evil spirit. If the Devil were wise he would not and could not be the Devil. It is absolutely impossible for anyone, human or otherwise, who hates Humanity, to have or develop the faculty of prevision. Therefore, suspect those who gaze in a crystal and prate of the approach of malevolent monsters; what

they see is only themselves. If they were capable of acquiring any real knowledge of themselves and the nature and powers of their own beings, they could pass the Dweller on the Threshold easily. But they shall remain slaves to time and space and the illusions of their shadow-personalities. The vestibule of the Spiritual world is rightly called the "Sphere of the Three Iron Necessities" and there is no pass-key but LOVE!

A Genius is always an Initiate of some Grade. He or she has learned how to think voluntarily with the Cerebellum, and other brains. The first step is to form the habit of Faith. but not ahead—was the symbol of the material and industrial progress of that time. Its Destiny was 11, expressing inspiration, but not progress. The Wheel was run by steam and was considered a remarkable achievement of engineering. The Sky Ride is motivated by electricity and one either goes up into the sky in one of the two 628 foot high towers; or one travels forward between them in "rocket" cars, a distance of approximately 1900 (10) feet; but never round and round in a circle.

It was planned to have the Fair opened for 150 days, but Mr. Roosevelt's change of date added four days, making the total 154 (10) days. The sum of the 424 acres covered by the fair also equals 10. And the Destiny of its president, Rufus C. Dawes, shows another super pioneer vibration, with its underlying 5.

On July 9, 1929, the official name of 7+9+3=10 the fair, "Century of Progress," was

officially adopted; and on February 5, 1929, (2+5+3=10) the requisite amount of money having been secured, Congress and the President invited other nations to participate.

The Fair is painted almost entirely in the three primary colors—Red (9), Blue (4), and Yellow (11) with the nature color, Green (4) added. If we trace this symbolism we find that Blue stands for logic, reason, mathematical science; Red (9) vibrates to the number of art, beauty and service to mankind; Yellow (11) is for inspiration; and Green is the color of grass and trees, the background of the fertile Mother Earth. Add these together 9+4+11+4=11+8=10 and again we have 10, made up of 11-8, the vibration of super executive power and financial success.
