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## EDITORIAL

#### TRANSMUTATION OR REPRESSION

HE LINE of demarcation between transmution and repression is very indefinite and tenuous. It is as indefinable as the line of demarcation between twilight and night, and dawn and daylight. One cannot say, definitely when twilight ends and dark begins or when the dawn is dispelled by the light of day.

Repression might be likened to the merging of the day of habit and appetite into the night of hidden desires, disease and unholy urges, through the power of will, but not eliminated from the subconscious.

Transmutation is the merging of the night of slavery to these same habits and appetites, due to an artificial state of mind, into the dawn of a new and higher state of mind, where freedom from destructive limitations is found, automatically, and the sunlight of a new day breaks upon the Conscious Mind.

By the same token, transmutation may be said to be a stepping up process from a lower to a higher plane, while repression may be likened to the stepping down from a higher to a lower plane, as it causes destructive processes to be set up in the body, eventually reverting to the practice of the habit or secret sin, or if not reversion, then a breaking out of disease or another pernicious habit.

Transmutation is accomplished by working from the center to the circumference, while repression is accomplished by working from the circumference to the center. The former is a positive force while the latter is negative.

Transmutation is accomplished without inward striving or tearing down processes while repression is a battle of contending forces.

#### GOD CONSCIOUSNESS

God Consciousness is that state of mind acquired by man when he has succeeded in conquering his desire body and is functioning on three planes, viz: The physical, mental and spiritual, with a full realization of the fact.

our alphabet which transposes the word immorality into immortality is the letter "T", known in ancient Egypt under the name "Tau", and which, in the religious symbolism of that country, designates a cross. Being the middle letter of the word, with five letters on each side, this letter holds a position of balance, through which it may have the power to redeem the entire world with its indwelling meaning.

Now whether we choose to accept the symbolism of things or not, the meaning of this transposition must appeal to every philosophic mind. # The Function and Office of the Moon---the Name

ORDS and names of things, more often than not, serve us as ill-made panes of glass through which the light comes crookedly; and the understanding of man, bound in these borrowed cerements, ceases to soar and grow. There is a certain property in a stone we call hardness; the materialist's idea of a ghost is a likeness in marble; but the Ideal is a thought rather than a statue. It has more latitude than the stone, and is far more effective in moulding life, character and action, unless, indeed, you are hit by the stone, but that is another question, and I refuse to be drawn into the controversy about this.

The point is, that if the stone is hard and resistant, because of a certain mysterious brooding over it of Saturn and his Rings, which tend to tighten things up and make them stay put, then there is a property in men's minds that feeds on pure earth-strength whose hardness gives birth to forbidden meaning. This is what we shall name the Mineral Mind, where the bud refuses to open into the flower of thought, because of the forbidding chill. Here the meaning of words and names may be crucified to save a sick mind from the reception of an idea that has not the trademark of orthodox sense, or that was not born in some text book of the schools

"I Believe", who got his stock in trade, from the dark ages of precedent—"I Believe" is a great Fundamentalist—writes a book. In this book he says he has written thoughts of the Eternal Thinker; so the people borrow copies of his thoughts and nourish them into a fixed belief. They harden down and gather the moss of precedent, which renders their appearance quite deceptive. The original meaning and purpose of the word is obscured and lost.

We speak of the Moon, but what do we mean; from what root of Sound does the word spring? From force of habit we are speaking of an object in the heavens, some 240,000 miles distant; what we see is the mere dead shell of a ghostly\* parenchyma. The real Moon we have never seen; nor is it visible to physical sense perception; the true mysteries regarding its phonic properties remain always hid with nature's harmonies. Moon, Mother, Mind, Man: these are synonymous. But the hues and aspects of the Moon's distant mists may vary and dissolve according to the quality of our receptivity, since she carries in her ark the seeds of all thought, sense, feeling and emotion. And we read that, "Mercury has to be ever near Isis, (the Moon) as her minister"; for without Mercury or the mental activity, neither Isis nor Osiris (the Sun) can ac-

complish anything in the great work. He is secretary and adviser of the great mother. Mercury is, therefore, the Recorder in the Sol-Lunar Dynasty, Wherever He is in your birth-map, there is the source of your mental receptivity. She stands at the gate of sense perception to let in that light of intelligence which Mercury engenders. Thus, in human anatomy, the semi-lunar ganglion is attached to the solar plexus, and there is a close sympathetic relationship between these and the inferior cervical plexus, ruling the hands and arms or the Gemini function. From these spring the diffusion of conscious life and the differentiation in form, speech and articulate sense. And these differ widely in different individuals. Words are deceptive because they are emotions expressed in sound; they have their native element of Feeling which may be traced directly to Cancer and the Moon. Cancer is the source of Personal Feeling and her touch always prompts utterance; I try to tell you what I think by the way I feel; and if my feeling is crude, then so is my speech. Also the speed of my sense is equivalent to the speed of my thought; the finer the feelings the greater the radio frequencies of my thought, until they become emotions expressed in sound like music. Take Taurus, where the Moon is exalted, for example. Taurus is where the divine and animal meet in articulate sound. Here is the instinctive consciousness of a perfect Unity in the Power of Song which is the most complete speech we know. It is because of the fact that Taurus has a greater perfection of the Sense Consciousness than others that she makes a more complete whole of that expression which conveys intelligent meaning.

If we could write a successful history of feeling, we should then be able to trace the meaning of those sounds we call words and discover what they have lost in transition. We have used the word "stone"; like all other words, it lost its hereditary meaning in transit, since once upon a time it meant town; no town was a town without a\*\* wall around it, a wall made of stone. Then again, in olden times they stoned the breaker of the law to death; and so we get the word "stun". An umbrella is a little shade, and a parasol, parries Sol. A rival is derived from river, because the other fellow lived on the opposite bank or the rival side. And so diversity becomes, like the proverbial consistency, a jewel hid in a dust heap, or like the bat among birds that flies in the dark.

The real meaning of words is conceived in the ancient womb of Feeling, mothered by Cancer and the Moon, but today their primordial sense is gone—lost in the emotional scale of modern usages.

Today, when we use a word, we immediately,

must find another to explain it. It is Relative, a poor relation to "Verihood". It is always being pursued by the djinn of "I don't mean that, I mean this".

But the Moon is Mother of Speech, and she is a child of Saturn, who conceals the real under the mask of illusion. Let us consider the crab, who, like the Moon, plays with the sea. And who, like Cancer, hides in his shell: which, being interpreted, is his Feelings.

This crab is the symbol of Cancer, as is the spider, the tortoise and the ass. All of these, in their way, represent qualities and characteristics of mind and habit, springing from those life-qualities resident in Cancer. And, let me suggest, we will do well to heed the ancient legends concerning these things, since folklore is often the Magic Song which reveals the soul of scientific fact. Cancer's fourth-house riddles give birth to science as an answer to necessity, since Want is a hunger of the mind quite as much as the stomach, which Cancer rules.

Now Cancer does not merely love Home, she IS HOME. If you want to find the true Cancer person you will find him at home. His primal instinct is to build a home and hide in it; and all mankind goes home to feed and rest. Cancer is called the wall-builder and the tent-builder; and the word "tent" springs from ten (th), having reference to the tenth sign, Capricorn, ruled by Saturn; Saturn being the architect of the body, which is the Home of the ego. The Moon and Cancer mould the form for the "I" to hide in; thus the Moon and her house become Persona, the Mask. It is related of that tribe of Israel, known as Zebulun, that it had its abode by the seashore and dwelt in tents; and Zebulun means habitation, dwelling and concealment. So the ego builds a wall of flesh about itself, and feels forth for Life. Cancer says "I Feel", and there is no deceit like Sense. Her desire is swifter and sweeter hours of Feeling, slaying herself on the upward way.

Now the name we give a thing is always mirrored in the Sense Perceptions. This name is a Feeling outlined by means of things, and it is the result of the interplay of two primal forces, which have been called the "reproductive desire, and the nutritive desire", which begets the hunger of life, this hunger always springing from Cancer.

Let us consider two words, Receptivity and Absorption—to drink in, to swallow up, to suck up, to consume, to engross, to exhaust, to imbibe. Also Receptivity implies an opening, which suggests a gate, a mouth, a window or a door. Cancer is this door of Sense, this gate of life, the mouth of the flowing river of the personality. She is called the North Gate, or the Gate of Man, the Entrance into Life, just as Capricorn is called the South Gate or the Exit out of Life; it being the special function of Saturn to swallow the Moon, which is the Giver of the Physical Form. Cancer, then, absorbs, drinks in, sucks up, engrosses and imbibes—yes, and exhausts. She rules the breast, even as she

rules the stomach, thus she is the sign of Suction. She drinks in life, only to give it forth again, and this is one of the chief functions of her instrument of life-the Moon, she being the giver of life to our globe. And by her is the Power of Names given; she absorbs that which gives word-formation, she records the history of Names, and they always have her "astral signature", as Elbert Benjamine calls it. To abstract and refine the name, or word, away, to the point of tenuity in Feeling, from which it first arose, would be to give it its psychic sound and meaning; and to follow this line of advancement would be to behold it grow luminous with the refinements of spirit. Its very essence of being would be changed into Light. It is said that there is one sign whose keyword is "I See", and its arrows of thought are aimed at the Source of Light; its possibilities are those of the attainment of cosmic consciousness; it is presided over by Jupiter, whose angel is associated with the Mother Cancer as in the birth of the Avatar. Thus we have the exaltation of Jupiter in Cancer. This is Receptivity of the highest type; the opening of the gate of the personality-ruled by the Moon-to the suggestions of the Spirit.

But we have kept the crab, anxiously waiting at the door of our interpretative thought; of all the sea animals he is, perhaps, the most remarkable. He was created from the Cancer life qualities, and in disposition and the appointments of his life and habits, he is purely a Cancer product. He has folding doors which close over his mouth; his entire internal economy is stomach. In all of his habits of life he is peculiarly subject to domestic intrigue. Life is one long struggle for food, raiment and shelter, and you always find him at home; he will never go far from his nativity, his first environment. In his early development he changes his clothing often; like the Cancer woman he is fond of a new house and new clothes; he casts his shell often, and sometimes eats the house he has lived in-all Cancer women are economical likewise; they dislike to see anything go to waste, although they often go to waist themselves, being lovers of good food in large quantities.

In the art of camouflage the crab is an adept; in this he is, no doubt, in league with the father of moons, Saturn; and there is a species of the deepsea crab that generates his own light, which is of the same chemical properties as Saturn's light.

Also, the artifice and strategy used by the crab, in all his concealments, are precisely those we look for in a shrewd, designing Saturnian. He always prefers to accomplish his ends in the dark and under cover. We are told that these "Safety Urges" springing from Saturn, "are the source of secrecy, aquisitiveness, covetousness, casualty and comparison". And that "the very fact that they spring into existence for the purpose of avoiding something, gives them a negative character", And that entity, be it human, animal or insect, who vibrates to the keynote of Saturn, "prefers to remain in the dark and accomplish its ends by subtlety, craft and cun-

ning". Thoughts of this nature are those which express as the selfish sentiments. And in this connection we would do well to note that the word "selfish, cell-fish and shellfish" have the same general root significance. With both Cancer and the crab, selfpreservation is the first law of their nature. Theirs is the unbroken tenacity which would seize upon the ver, source of life itself, and use any deceptive means to attain that end, like Aladdin, who demanded of the Genie of the lamp (the Sun), the Roc's Egg, from which creation was hatched. But the Genie snatched the lamp away, leaving only the ring in Aladdan's possession. This is the ring of Saturn that crowns our Moon with her borrowed light, by which means she translates the true source of light into a thousand-million illusive sense perceptions; and so our thoughts receive honor not their due.

I have called attention to a certain hardness of mind, belonging to the brick and mortar builders of opinions, from which the majority, conveniently, borrow their fixed ordinances and customs.

If the first birth of the thought is plentifully endowed with Feeling, then appearances may easily become the materialized idea; for it hardens under emotion. Water must always be added to the ground rock, if you desire it to harden into cement. It is the Watery Triplicity, from which the emotions and feelings arise, that gives birth to the concrete in thought. The same law governs in both instances, since there is one set of ordinances governing this universe.

Now the crab, as I have said, is always casting his shell, in order to grow one that is a little larger and a little harder. Not satisfied with this the spider crab covers himself with fragments of seaweed, that he may wear a complete disguise from the enemy. Many others, of a different order or family, seek concealment by burying themselves in the sand; and one species, finding a little hollow on the sea-bottom that just fits his body, proceeds to cover his shell with pebbles, until his appearance matches exactly the surrounding area of the ocean bed. Another species, which is more of a Mercurial Temperment, in that he is quite fond of travel, will carry about on his back a seaanemone, whose outspread tentacles possess a sting, to the end that the crab's enemies are quite content to keep their distance.

It is said of Scorpio, where the Moon has its fall, that she is the epitome of Resourcefulness; but this Resource she draws from the Mother Cancer. Also, Scorpio possesses a sting that often puts the enemy to route. Thus the creative mind qualities belonging to any given department of life or sign, runs, like a golden thread, thru every order of life belonging to its zoo. The form and expression of the entity is shown by the fineness of the substance it is able to draw from that ocean (sign) in which it has its home. In this sentient life arising from the mother, Cancer, it is certain that we meet the law of progression, since the

unfoldment of mental activity demands the service of higher potencies in the realm of conscious life. This quickening of the mental processes is accompanied by a corresponding complexity of that tree of life we call the nervous system. By consequence the responses—the Receptivity—is cumulative, until such time as Sense and Emotion pass wholly into the service of the intellect; and possibly the surest rhetoric is that which moves the man himself by other means than words.

It is said, for instance, that "Great knowledge embraces the whole; small knowledge a part only. Great speech is universal; small speech is particular". Spread out your knowledge and it will be found to be very shallow. In our mind puddle we seldom get over the shoe-tops. But Feeling is the spouse of Thought, and the water grows deeper, and by this same token we shall, one day, take to the Great Ocean and learn to swim. Also, Feeling is the spouse of Experience, which forces our changes into Energy. It is the spouse of Activity, and the offspring of Possibility and Capacity. Perhaps, also, it is the spouse of Concentration, whose child is Inspiration. Such is feeling—that which perpetuates Life and makes things real for us.

This fourth house and Cancer—the Beginning and the End of all things— which is the store-house of Sense, must, then, contain the core of the thought I have shaped by my Feelings. Here we catch a glimpse of that mysterious spiral of the Moon, leading inwards and backwards to that cleavage to the forgotten Voice, which gives the thrill to the magnetic life. It is the delight which attends the birth of those thoughts which spring into life from our own vitality. And which needs no other authority than that of their own creation.

Now the Sun goes backwards in the sign of the crab; and we find the crab, when approached, backing up or going sideways, and the over-sensitive Cancer child, when not wanting to be touched by someone, doing the same. Also, when extremely bashful, they hide behind mother. The tide, after becoming full, ebbs backward under the Moon's magnetic pull. The Moon's nodes recede backward thru the Zodiac, one degree in nineteen days. With the Moon and Cancer it is ever a recession, as if striving to reach the primal source or beginning of things. And all of her revolutions in the physical world are attended by a revolution in the intellectual world.

The cradle of Sense is also the cradle of man; its house, the fourth, a mirror of the past and future. It is the Knower's Looking glass, the lake of reflection in which we see ourselves and our fellows. And one can see promise of Power and Strength in its stress of Feeling. Here nature's art is endless imitation; and it is an astounding fact that in one species of the crab we find pictured the outline of the human face on the back of its shell, as if nature wishes to assure us of our origin and first estate. And the fourth and

tenth houses are those of the parents, Capricorn and Cancer sound the same note—it is the note of creation. Observe the glyph of Cancer strangely suggestive of this very protection of the encircling arms.

In the horoscope we are told that Saturn-or the Sun-represents the father, the Moon, the mother. And in a horary figure we are advised to choose an hour of the Moon to deal with women. In a Mars hour the clerks in the store are all busy in a Saturn hour, perhaps, the tide of trade is out. Saturn does not like to work outside of the mind; he does not sell, he buys and keeps. He is dumb to the summons of those "Encircling Arms", nor kisses the breast "which pillow the lips that cling". He is that which makes you say "I want to be Myself", patiently striving to pay what is due, "for ancient evils done". He is the net that stops the way at the borders of self-destruction, and his child-the Moon-is the sign of Change. Together, they force us to turn around and face the Truth of Exact Certainty. His wheels pass into lesser wheels, and back again into greater wheels, and this is the Ebb and Flow of Life.

This law of ebb and flow is everywhere present, manifesting the everlasting statutes of the Great Name in the four elements, Fire, Earth, Air, Water, Oxygen, Hydrogen, Nitrogen, Carbon. It governs the Emotions, the Feelings—the Moods of man, of commerce and trade. The tides in the ocean, the tides in the air, the tides in the blood, the going and coming of the air of the lungs, and the tides of thought and events. And all these are presided over by the Moon.

We may state the law as follows, namely: There is a gradual absorption of the electrical charge by the Moon, derived from the alternating current of Mercury's solar Energy, until it becomes equal with that of the Earth. This brings about a repulsion, no matter whether the electrification be positive or negative, the electric attraction changes back to electric repulsion. Thought follows this same general law, thereby giving rise to attractive and repulsive images. This, of course, belongs to the study of the occult anatomy of man, where every lanet has its own definite center; and in this there is a general order as well as those special divisions ma, | ed by the chart of birth; and in this connection it is well to understand that "man is a planet, and has a moon", and that moon has its own center in his body, known as the semi-lunar ganglion, this being the Receiving Station of sense impressions. And he is subject to the same general reactions as the planet from which his body comes into form; therefore the same law governs both. Now the electrification in the upper atmospheres of the Earth is enormous, just as they are in the human aura. This is the hydrogen sphere powerfully ionized, and attaining a value of tens of thousands of volts through absorption of the Sun's energy, and rich in the ultra-violet rays which are the most effective ionizers. Also these are associated with certain fluctuations of the Moon's motions of considerable size, which, likewise, bring great changes in human events. The greater of these periods is from 250 to 300 years; the lesser one about seventy-one years, coinciding with that change of one degree in the precessional cycle. Moreover, this brings about a gradual lessening of that attraction which exists between the Moon and her primary, this Earth; thus, there is a slight recession on the part of the Moon; a gradual withdrawal, by which we become less dependent on her, that is, outwardly, not inwardly.

In order that we may obtain a more comprehensive portrayal of this matter it becomes well to consider the fact that the Moon rules the personality which is doomed to pass away. The Sun and Uranus are concerned with the Individuality. Now it is a foregone conclusion that in proportion as the Individuality grows in power and command, the personality recedes and grows less. Of all the qualities of the Zodiac the Moon's sign, Cancer, contributes the strongest personal sense. Cancer, like the erab in his shell, hides in her Feelings; these are her entanglement, her safe refuge, and it is not uncommon that these feelings spoil her chance for usefulness, and her ambition dies in the womb of Sense. Her feelings become that revulsion that alters and transforms her; and by this same token she may become mean and small. There is a cancer of the mind that consumes us equally with the cancer of the body, and the Moon rules both.

In dealing with these tidal energies induced by lunar influence, no less than presenting these ideas concerning the Moon's recedence, the lessening of her power, in accordance with the increase in man of his center of egoity, one becomes painfully conscious that they are dealing with paradoxes which are exceedingly difficult to present to such minds as are disposed to judge all things by external appearances. Perhaps an illustration or two will help here. It requires but a monent's consideration to realize, for example, that as a thing diminishes in one direction it may easily become greater in another direction. A pint of water converted into super-heated steam may, if confined in a boiler, occupy a space of immensely greater area, and be made to do vastly more work. Also, if the hydrogen and the oxygen that goes to make up this pint of water are separated, they may, when brought together again under certain conditions, display an energy millions of times greater than that liberated by the steam.

Now the Moon has a special affinity for water; and being dual in nature, both male and female, positive or negative, according as she becomes head or tail of the Dragon (of Sense), she is, in her highest manifestation, the Oxy-Hydrogen power in all nature, and her Genius is the Spiritual Type of Man. Taurus, where she is exalted, in its highest expression, is the epitome of God in the Flesh.

One of the special characteristics of Taurus is that of her transmutative power. There are two qualities resident in the sign which are diametrically opposite in character; it is a great calm sea of luminous life qualities, a still ocean which steadily draws to itself that which it may; then, it is transmutation; a transmutation of such terrible power that no material substance known to man can resist its fires. Here the heated molecules will revolve, held by her magnetic force, and continue to revolve, making larger and yet larger circuits in their orbits, until finally the substance itself is dissolved by this transmutative force and goes off in the form of gas.

Now it is said that the Moon is slowly disintegrating-in a word, being transmuted; and, in this process of transmutation, she is constantly liberating finer and higher frequencies. Or, to put it in another way, she is, little by little, translating higher rates of frequency from the solar octave of worlds; in other words, the planets. Also, we observe that her Angel is that Virgin Mary (so highly esteemed by the church) who gives birth to the Christ. Here is a stupendous allegory, the nature of which is wholly unknown to both priest and layman. But this much we may say, that this transmutative force, acting through the Moon in association with the Taurus life qualities, will, in the fullness of time, bring forth the perfect man, who shall redeem the race. His mother is spirit, his father is spirit, yet he is, himself, incarnate. Thus it is, that the Moon, receding and growing less in power in the world of sense and matter, becomes greater and greater in spiritual power.

The Avatar now at hand introduces those mental frequencies belonging to Aquarius, and it is significant that, among all the signs, this is the only one having the face of a man. Moreover, its refinements are such as belong to Uranus, highly individualizing, and foreshadowing a marvelous inheritance, since its most important work is that of converting the life currents into higher and higher thought forms. Uranus transmits etherealized currents of such a nature as to open the soul of man into the realm of Limitless Knowing. It is that realm of Fixed Air by which the mind is permitted to take the aeroplane route to the realms of Eternal Causation.

Already the increase in mental power, in penetrative analysis, quick perception, keen and incisive determination, marvelous inventive ability, co-ordination, selectivity, powers of synthesis and directed thinking in general, are staggering to contemplate, as they manifest in thousands of specimens of the new race or younger generation.

It is here, in the sign Aquarius, that Heracles,

who is the synthesis of the spirit of the twelve signs, turns the stream of the Moon through the Augean Stables, where the three thousand oxen are kept.

Aquarius is the Tree of Sense, or Mind, if you please, in that it presides over the entire nervous system. ## Peter's Denial

HIS lesson in Matthew is based upon chapter 26, verses 69-75, and it serves to show the importance to spiritual realizations of the little things of life. The passage is common to all the Gospels (cf. Mark, 14:66-72; Luke. 22:55-62; John, 18:25-27) and the accounts differ with but minor variations. Mark has the cock crowing twice, and John gives Peter two denials only. The Galilean dialect of Jesus and his disciples is here remarked upon (the Jews from the northern part of Palestine were said to confound their gutturals) and this is excellent testimony to the historicity of the narrative for, were the gospel account forged and no more than a version of the Solar Myth forced into a Hebrew setting by unskilled hands, the central figure would hardly have been drawn as provincial and vernacular. Jesus and the disciples were at all times themselves. They were men who, many of them, were reaching out with a grasp of eternal verities that were to change the course of human destiny but who never ceased to be manifest through their own distinctive personalities, and those were markd as consistently in their failings as in their virtues. Here is one of the genuinely comforting moments of the Passion, at least to the average modern aspirant seeking to tread this ancient path.

In this lesson we learn that human nature is forever adaptable, and that the eternal fellowship, which is sought invisibly and which is known through the innermost operation of soul powers, is, in every age and through every set of circumstances, reflected or forecast most satisfactority in the rough and ready comradeship such as is inherent in every lesser human association. Peter seeks warmth; that is, he seeks association with his kind. Unable, at this moment, to travel on into the paths of the invisible with Jesus, and to see beyond the tragic events of the arrest and present disgrace, he is wholly and completely lost. Unable to desert his master, yet incapable of more than a blundering, blind following of Jesus into the precincts of the high priest, he grasps at anything with some semblance of permanent reality. And human association is granted him by a little group near the fire. They note his dialect and provincialisms, but nevertheless a place is made for him. He is truly welcomed, in fact, because, rather than the sullenness of a grudging permission to join them, these Judeans show him the real courtesy of "picking upon" him. Here is the instinctive initiation of all life. Relationship of all sort is based upon the possession of things in common, and where human individuals come together without the note of common interest the tendency is to create this through a rubbing together or friction such as will create it. The badinage, or even rough and actual hazing, to which men often resort under

these circumstances is always subconsciously, kindly at heart.

Individuals must always function in and through the mass of humanity. It is the race or life-stream, as a whole, that sustains the variation or differentiation which in essence and fact actually is the individual. The greater issues but provide the greater occasions for a manifestation of the greater individuality; they do not abrogate or obscure, except for the immediate moment, the operation of the usual, and equally important, expressions of distinctiveness. Events of more than local or transient importance serve, more than any other purpose in the light of cosmic progress, to make possible a shuffling of the ordinary factors of life, leading in turn to a greater development of individual distinction. Man is, as it were, shaken out of a rut. Thus barriers of race, religion and what-not are forgotten in the excitement of war, so that sterile groups of humanity are often almost completely rejuvenated. During carnivals, or upon major holidays, acquaintanceships will be scraped and divergent interests blended in a manner that eventually is a constructive aid to every section of the mass involved. In minor details of being, life must go on, and these people in the courtyard are quite thoroughly themselves in all that is personal and individual. The excitement resulting from the trial of Jesus merely serves to give them a greater tolerance. Peter is made at one with them, whereas, at other times, he probably would have been ejected (or frozen out) from the premises. This is by no means the least of the purposes served by the major events of life.

The spiritual teaching of the passage is found in the emphasis here drawn to trivial details. The little things of life are always the most upsetting, and the most disconcerting, from a destructive point of view. (The opposite, of course, is equally true; it is the trivial encouragement that often seems the most significant and actually may be the most potent—as in the classical instance of Robert Bruce and the indefatigable spider). Peter is here unmanned and shamed by a little maid; than which no incident in the Gospel is truer to the fundamental operation of life, nor more of a testimonial to the simple, honest and historical basis of our narrative. This is a passage in which the literal interpreter of the New Testament may revel. The dominance of woman in the ordinary routine of life is easily to be remarked through the whole course of history; indeed, with the gradual removing of the general focus of life from the home (or the palatial establishment of a ruler as representing the aggregate of homes in general) to the place of business, and the resultant growing complexity of life (making possible a dimensional increase in human experience, and so speeding the

evolution of this race), woman has inevitably been drawn into the office and the marts of trade, and to these fields she has transported the feminine standards of outer dignity and self-respect as to be marked in the modern luxuriousness of commercial and trade establishments, etc., etc.

It was his loss of "face" that betrayed Peter, not any element of fear. No physical danger beset him; all that he stood to lose was the immediate participation in the warmth of this casual fellowship. Had it been a man or an elderly woman who twitted him he would have been more able to reply in kind, but the young lady (whom above all he wished to impress) with quick divination sensed his inner sense of detachment from all things and with the happy thoughtless maliciousness of youth prodded him into the least form of selfdefense-a panic-stricken denial. Peter had not yet found himself, he still needed somthing to which to cling. With no Jesus at hand he sought to cling to the esteem of these strangers, which he had not even, as yet won, and, so he made himself eternally ridiculous.

The personal application of the passage lies in the realization that vehemence always marks a lack of control, either of self or of a situation. Profanity and other forms of outer emphasis never actually strengthen a statement but rather weaken it. Profanity or forceful expression constructively may mark an individual's rising to the occasion, but if there is nothing behind the outer exhibition of strength (if it is a mask, as in Peter's case) it is always futile.

The tears, or the melting of self, which generally follow after any realization of the fact that one has "lost face" or has made himself cheap and proved himself faithless, are forever the most bitter experiences of life. But, just as Peter afterwards was able to prove and establish himself, so may any other individual do this, even if first he fails to meet an issue with credit to himself. The very harrowing nature of these inner realizations creates the mightiest possible agency in a real building of character.

Freedom from fear is the first requisite for the assumption of responsibility.

## We Only Know Through the Spirit

ug. 20—Until one realizes that thinking a thing does not make it so, there is no possible coordination between the mind and the Spirit. All holdings of the mind are inconclusive. The best that we can think is part-truth; it might be half-truth. The opposite of what we think may be half-truth; it might be nine-tenths truth. The expressions of the world of finance and diplomacy—of all nationalism and socialism, of all anarchism, communism, conservatism—are expressions of partisanship. They are of the mind. The opposite demands equal attention. The mind thiuks; only the Spirit knows. The mind sees at one time from a certain point of the periphery only; the Spirit looks out from the Center.

The discussions of a thousand conferences— of labor and capital, of black and white, of religion and science; the bickerings in a thousand courts and cabinets, in the myriads of houses of men at this hour, the drone rising from a thousand altars—all meaningless as the grind of wheels on the world highways. Truth is not the opinions of parties. Truth is of the Spirit. Truth is central, immutable, never contradicts itself. Truth is one.

I can think a thousand things, but I cannot Know one of the mind alone. I can only know a

thing, because my Real Self gives it to my mind. I might hear truth from another, but I could not Know it to be Truth, unless my own Spiritual Nature was aroused to the point of recognition and giving it sanction in my mind. The mind is keyed to one vibration; the Spirit to another in this Place. In most of us there is no working communication between the two vibrations. In genius there are sparks of contact; in the teaching of Avatars alone, so far, is spiritual vibration sustained for utterance through the mind.

We enter the silence—that is, we still the craving of the body and the clamor of the mind—in the hope at last of hearing the Voice of the Silence, of lifting ourselves to the pitch wherein we may consciously respond to the vibration of the Spirit Clearly, now, can be seen the reason why so many of the mystic ordeals of the Path are toward the end of rendering the mind back to allegiance with its own Spirit.

It confines us in a narrow, rigid training for a time, because we are at the mercy of our desires, and lawless emotions, not fit to be at large in the freer sphere. Learning the lessons of order and restraint, the uses of this confinement are ended, and the physical vehicle is reabsorbed in its own elements.

But the mind is an added power given to Spiritual Being to facilitate its expression. I have likened it to the bobbin-filler which fulfills its use when placed against the whirring hand-wheel of the sewing machine itself. The bobbin-filler might think it was the whole machine, but that does not make it so; still it has as much right to say this, as the mind has to affirm, "I am Man".

Only the Spiritual Being has the authority to say I Am. Neither you nor I can say I Am, without appearing ludicrous from a spiritual standpoint, until we have ceased to speak our mind and have become the Voice of the Silence, our utterance straight from basic Spiritual Being. Thus, to speak means that we have cleansed and quickened our minds to answer to the vibration of the Spirit.

The time comes in our ordeals to eradicate the lies and sophistries of the mind, when we are conscious of the two vibrations—the tainted activity of the mind like a stench from a canal, compared to a breath of open ocean which is Spiritual Knowing. The mind, in its true state, plays like an orderly planet about its Sun. It is bathed in reflected light and works from all angles of its orbit. The Sun

shines with its own incandescence and forever works from the Center. Co-ordinated with its own Center, working in full allegiance with its own Spirit (as ours are not) the mind-power is a glowing, beautiful thing, capable of flashing initiatives and angles of vision at different points and times, but it can never work from the Center, at all points all the time. Its realm is not Knowledge. It can bring in testimony, but the spirit alone can decide.

Most of us are incapable of decision, because we are not Ourselves. We cannot see all sides at once, therefore cannot judge. We can think from a thousand slants, but we cannot Know; and the deeper our spiritual sleep, the more positive are we in the mind, that what we think is true. Very few of our minds, so far, have ever been touched with one real ruling decision from the Voice of the Silence. The Spirit within us is the ancient prisoner of the mind—ancient beyond the multiplication of ages in the mind itself. That is why we are down. That is why we are here. That is why every test and ordeal of our Path Homeward just now is a rendering back into allegiance of the mind-power to the Spirit—to become spiritually minded.

The Spirit does not criticize or placate or excuse or discuss or explain or argue. The Spirit speaks from Truth which is one. Not a thousand sides, not two sides, but one.

We have done, already, most of our chattering about God for many ages to come. The higher we climb on the Rising Road Homeward, the farther we shall see and the more awe we shall have for the Absolute. We are maudlin with mind-thinks of what God and Harmony are. One of our plexuses shakes loose, and we hear a voice from some earthbound entity, whom we would hide our children from, if he were in the body, and we say God has spoken to us. We rouse our ego from deep breathing or the conservation of sex-force, and explain to our neighbor that our utterance is divine.

This is not spiritual humility. It is the raving of our savage turnkey. When the mind says, "I am Wholeness", it lies, for it is all that Wholeness is not. The finest mind-power on this planet is a sick disrupted fragment of Wholeness, and unless coordinated with its own Spiritual Being, has yet to utter a single sentence of Truth.

# Useful Information Becomes Our Working Tools of Life

N WRITING a book the author's first aim should be to embody, therein, useful information. Now useful information is something that may be applied in everyday life; it becomes virtually an instrument or tool, placed in the hands of the student or reader, by which, if he be wise, he may, in some degree at least, shape his course in a manner that will be productive of desirable results. Thus, useful knowledge is, to the mind, that which the saw, hammer and square are to the carpenter; and whether he knows it or not, every man is a house-builder; from the beginning and rise of history of his first sensation at his mother's breast, he is a Builder. He comes into incarnation equipped with tools of a given temper and design which are termed "Elemental Urges" or planetary principles, about which have been built up thoughts of a very definite character, to the end that his reactions to any given environment will cause him to picture in his mind images of a specific character in regard to the things in this environment.

But right here comes in the principle of Discrimination—what is real and what is useful to you or to me. Now Discrimination is that principle in the mind that would keep pure all things that are; it belongs, primarily, to the Zodiacal sign Virgo, who is the chemist and sifter of the mind, separating one element from another in order to discover its birthright of Fact. She is what we might call the Syllogist of the Zodiac; she is three propositions in one, containing the major premises, the minor premises, and the middle term that links cause to effect. And we learn that "The common term disappears after furnishing the Logical Connection between the other two".

If it were not for this principle of selectivity there would be no gold, silver, iron, vegetables, animals, fish or water in the world, and all would become formless chaos; therefore Discrimination is the most important quality, and the one most crying need of the race today, by virtue of the fact that it tells THE TRUTH. It discloses to the human vision that which is True and that which is Needful for the occasion. Says Endersby, in his "The Gateway out of Time and Space", "The practical everyday method of distinguishing what is real from what is not",-or what is useful, which amounts to the same thing, since use determines all qualities as to whether they are good or evil-"consists of ascertaining what experiences are corroborated by other people". But more often than not we are merely borrowing those emotional reactions to environment which coincide with our

own, and "I-told-you-so" may be an overlapping falsification of Sense Perception, merely an "I feel". No man, therefore, Knows the TRUTH else it is Born in Him. This recognition is what Upward calls "Pure Verihood", where the Truth takes shape in the soul. You Know because you know, because it is given to you to know. You Remember those things you used to feel and know long, long ago, and which are the gain of the soul in battle. Your light, and enlightenment is painted in the sign of Strength. Here is a pure, endless track leading to the land of Endless Knowing in the Genesis of the Heavens. You can see the facts because they lie always in your path with the searchlight of Truth revealing their outline and purpose. If, as Edwin Arnold says, "Ye suffer from yourself! none else compels", so, likewise, you learn from yourself; none may compel you, since I can tell you nothing you do not already know. If you do not know it when you hear it for the first time, then indeed you will not recognize it. To the unlearned nothing can be given.

But the unlearned are always trying to find out what somebody else knows, while going away empty always. Perhaps this is because the path would be madness to them; Saturn is a stern gate-keeper.

In one sense the writer of a book is in a strange position. One is immediately reminded of the old saying; "They who know do not tell; and they who tell do not know". Also here is another—"The best language is that never spoken". And this reminds us that the Universe is Very Great. What does it have to do to be Great? It is without blemish of any kind; it doesn't have to get up in the morning and go to work; it does not have to awaken out of any pain or sickness; it has no heresies; it does not ask any blind man's opinion of it, and its prosperity is its own.

In the face of all this greatness why should I write a book to tell you how I feel? Probably you don't feel that way-my way-anyway; and I am not the Universe, but just small potatoes and few in the hill. Why, then, should I harness my spirit to a go-cart of words so that it may strive with yours? The answer is I have to! Maybe just Because. You have seen the diamond; you have seen the emerald, the ruby, the magic crystal; Deep in these are the "slaves of the Lamp", -the Word of the Sun, revealed by the Moon, translator of Light. These are the fire-words of nature; but my words are just black marks on this paper; they are signs for sound; would that I could put the Fire into them; would that I could make of them a Sheet of Music of the Spheres. But even as I strive with them they are no more than signs for my strength—the strength of my mind within me. They are no more than a check drawn on your mind. The coin this check represents is deposited in the bank of your soul; Will you draw on this account? Of course, the sureness with which I can use this check must vary with the character of the coins deposited in your bank—copper, gold, silver or jewels, or may be nickels; every one legal tender in their way; the only difference being that some, like the jewels, have large value wrapped up in a small space. You who have these have done more sifting for the essence of truth, by which token you arrived quickly; you see at a glance. Virgo has done a more perfect work.

Perhaps I write this book guessing that I may say something new or original, as well as useful; then all of a sudden I remember that the Universe is Mind-shaped and ideas circulate as freely in it as do the currents in the great oceans; and just as surely as I live, someone, aye many-one, have been caught in my little eddy of thought before, and they have said these same things long, long ago, and perhaps in far more tidy shapes.

Yesterday I met a friend in the Public Library; I was telling him about certain ideas I intended to embody in these pages. Like all the others, he immediately asked, "Where did you get that idea; what book did you read it in? Did you ever read 'Divine Revelations' by A. J. Davis'? "No", I replied, "I never have". "Well", said he, "I read practically that same thing in Davis' work years ago".

And so man is a mere poacher in space, and he often gets into the other fellow's lumber-room without knowing it. But Great Speech is Universal, and nobody's business, nobody's property, and no respector of persons. If you listen, it is always talking; but its language is a deafness to the ordinary senses, if there are any ordinary senses; and every plum-pudding has two sides, an inside and an outside, and many a brave little Jack Horner, sitting in some corner, may stick in his thumb and pull out a plum.

My theme is that of the Moon, her office and function, and the principle embodied in her nodes; she who is the famous geometrician of form and the immortal editor of our journal of life. There are things concerning her that involve the ransacking of the buried cities of thought, and the temples of the soul in forgotten realms, since she is Lot's wife, who, by turning round and looking backward, became a pillar of salt; and as for the salt, that is pure matter; and as for the turning round that is the churning of space by which astral matter solidifies and becomes physical matter. In the process of gathering the granules of butter, as in the old rotary churn, we always turned the crank the other way, or backwards; so the Moon has a retrograde influence; she turns "backward". And by this same token she Gathers, Collects and Solidifies (Sol-idea-fies). Matter is, primarily, a

product of the fire, Sol, or the Sun, It springs from the hydrogen atom, the basis of all matter, and which, in its descent into the corporeal, becomes successively fire, air and water; and it is from this latter that the Moon moulds her physical forms from mineral to man.

Say the stanzas in the Secret Doctrine: "Then Svabhavat sends Fohat to harden the atoms. Each is a part of the Web". Referring here to the web of life in form, woven by the Moon—"Reflecting the Self-Existing Lord. Like a mirror, each in turn becomes a world".

But what is Fohat? It is that higher form of electricity known as the cosmic electricity to which is added intelligence or the directing force. This form of electricity is electro-magnetic, or sol-lunar, and emanates from the planet Uranus, and the primal mind substance of the sign Aquarius; and it is beginning to be very actively present in the etheric bodies and nerve fluids of the new race now forming on this planet. It is the source of Aonian, or age-lasting life, so we find longevity constantly on the increase today.

But of the "Web", it may be said that it is the business of the Moon to build the Earth; thus she is called "The Mother", and rules females generally, although in actual practice, she is alternately male and female, since the interior of man is woman, and the interior of woman is man. This is why we say that in a female chart of birth we look to the Sun's application to some planet for a description of the husband, while the Moon's application refers, in like manner, to the mate of the male. When she, the Moon, assumes the office of a Creator she becomes male; that is to say, when she becomes positively charged with Fohat. This is the meaning of that passage in Revelation which tells us that in the great world change that is to usher in the Avatar of Aquarius, the Moon shall be turned to blood. In other words, the Moon is to come to life, in that she is that Eve or counterpartal self of man that has slept through the ages while he was perfecting a physical form for the indwelling spirit. To put it otherwise, under the Uranian vibrations, as embodied in Aquarius, the Moon becomes the agent of the inner man or soul senses; these soul senses becoming fully alive, during this precessional cycle of the sign of Man, wherein is the great outpouring.

On the other hand, the Moon's feminine or negative aspect or principle is the Prima Materia. Here it manifests that principle of receptivity which shows the nature of the thought-elements absorbed; for its sign, Cancer, which is essentially feminine, sucks up, or absorbs, so to speak, everything in its environment. But behind all this is the One Manifested Life, called the "Breath of Absoluteness". Although being No-Thing, or if you prefer, the "All-Thing", it remains nameless.

This is beautifully set forth in the stanzas. Referring first to the "Mother" (Moon), we read,

"The first is the Mother. Separating itself into its primary seven states", as expressed through the octave of worlds, "it proceeds downward cyclically; when, having consolidated itself in its Last principle as Gross Matter, it revolves around itself and informs, with the seventh emanation of the last, the first and the lowest element. In a Hierarchy, or Order of Being, the seventh emanation of her last principle is: (a) In the Mineral, the Spark that lies latent in it, and is called to its evanescent being by the Positive awakening the negative". The Sun or spark of positive life goes to sleep in the rock; but gradually the Earth absorbs more and more of this fire till at last it wakes into spiritual energy and the millenium is at hand.

"(b) In the plant, it is that vital and intelligent force which informs the seed and develops it into the blade of grass, the root or sapling. It is the germ which becomes the Upahdi of the seven principles of the thing it resides in, shooting them out as the latter grows and develops".

It is of interest to observe that in Gemini, where resides the principle of germination or branching, we have the personal center of thought which tends to diversify things, and which causes the Gemini individual to want to do many things at once. This is the source of development from a common center in all the various directions of which the human mind is in quest.

"(c) In the animal it does the same. It is its Life-Principle and vital power; its instincts and qualities; its characteristics and special idiosyncrasies.

To man it gives all that it bestows on all the rest of the manifested units of Nature; but develops, furthermore, the reflective attributes of all the forty-nine fires in him. Each of his seven planetary principles is an heir in full to, and a partaker of, the seven principles of the Great (Lunar) Mother. The breath of her first principle is his Spirit. Her second principle is his Soul. The third furnishes him with the Brain Stuff on the physical plane, and with the mind that moves it, according to his organic capacities".

These capacities are shown by the Sun-Moon polarity and the aspects the Moon makes to Ascendant, Midheaven, or any planet or planets, as the case may be.

In all this there is always the attendant magnetic lunar quality or influence. This lunar magnetism generates life, and it also preserves and destroys it, so that in a death figure or birth the Moon's influence is ever a most important distinction, just as in a horary figure she is First Partner in the Dance of Events. This giving or creating of life only to destroy it, is manifest both physically and psychically. In the Bible we read, "the soul that sinneth, it shall die".

In her, the Moon, is the power of life and death, since she is Lord of Things and their Power of

Light. So whether we die or live, whether we live much or little, depends on that toward which we polarize the thought, the direction our Lunar Polarity takes. We want some things, not everything; certain kinds of thought bring life; these sway the tides of the mind with Luminous Intelligence. They are young-old thoughts, with strong limbs that dare the rugged heights of the guilded heavens. Keep the mind young and the body will stay. Who was that poet who said:

"Life, like a dome of many-colored glass, Stains the white radiance of Eternity".

But this great power of the One Life. "It is the guiding force in the cosmic and terrestrial elements",—the moving power behind all of the "Nine Families of Elemental Urges", which Mr. Benjamine so marvelously describes in his course on Mental Alchemy.

"It resides in the Fire" (Aries, Leo, Sagittarius) "provoked out of its latent state", by Red Mars, "into its active being; for the whole of the seven subdivisions of the . . . principle reside in the terrestrial Fire. It whirls in the breeze, blows with the hurricane, and sets the air in motion, which element participates in one of its principles also. Proceeding cyclically, it regulates the motion of the water, attracts and repels the waves, according to fixed laws, of which its seventh principle is the informing soul". And so, we may add, it regulates the tides of the sea and the tides in man's blood; the tides in the air and the etheric tide of death; it controls the lightnings and the radio which carries your voice around the world. And even as it provokes the spark out of the rock, even so it provokes sound out of latency.

"It is in the root, the flower, the Action and the Thought. It is in the Sun, and is as present in the glow-worm. Not an atom can escape it. Therefore the ancient Sages have wisely called it the Manifested God in Nature". And the Moon holds its three-fold or trinity of power whose sound is beneath our spoken word. It is the sound of sorrow or of joy as we make it, and it is self-born.

It is the Elemental Language, in its relation to our Moon. It is a composite sound, and not words, as we now know them. It is sound, Number and Figure blended in One, and calling forth a response from the Superintending Powers (of the Sun). These sounds have intervals corresponding to the musical sol-lunar diatessaron; that is to say, the Perfect Four of the Elements, Fire, Earth, Air and Water. These are the perfect consonants of the diatonic scale of nature, quite inaudible to us because of their greatness of sound. Worlds are called out of Mother Chaos-having reference to Libra, the first sign, and the one which sounds the creative note of all the signs-by this sound. And it is interesting to note that very recently modern science has uncovered part, at least, of the Moon's secret power of articulation.

"In the private library of one Mr. Loomis", says the American Weekly, "after many disappointments, Prof. Wood and Mr. Loomis succeeded in producing beams of ultra-sounds far more intense than any hitherto obtained in the world. These beams proved to have extremely interesting properties. In a tank of oil or water, at the bottom of which was a vibrating quartz crystal emitting these inaudible sounds, a raised bump was lifted, as though a fountain were playing underneath. Dipped into this bump, raised by the sound waves, a glass test tube was shattered by the intensity of the sound. A human finger was burned as though it had been dipped into molten lead, although the water, oil and tank were quite cool". Let me suggest, in this connection, that frozen mercury will burn the flesh to the bone; and possibly this sound which shatters the glass is one of the phases of Mercury's alternating current acting through the Moon. "A living fish placed in the tank was almost instantly killed by the sound.

"Were human ears capable of hearing even a tiny fraction of these sound waves flowing out so powerfully from the quartz crystal, Mr. Loomis' laboratory would doubtless be filled with the most intolerable sound. However, it is as quiet as a country field, for the enormous energy of the sound waves is not within audible range". Professors

Newton Harvey and William Richards of the department of chemistry at Princeton University, have carried on some further investigation of the sound waves. And they have found that few weapons within the reach of man have proved so destructive to life, for these waves actually shake apart the structure of living matter. "The red corpuscles of the blood are destroyed and their vital coloring matter is let loose into the liquid part of the blood stream. Living germs disintegrate into mere drops of jelly under bombardment of these waves. No one has tried the experiment of allowing these sound waves to enter a human test and no one is likely to risk this test". But it has been suggested, also, that these rays may become as potent for good as for evil, in the destruction of disease germs.

On every side there is the evidence of the quickening of primordial matter. By slow degrees we are passing into vast refinements, in this great ocean of never-resting life, flowing in from the heavens. And standing here, we strive in vain to pierce the mystery of this infinite progression and wrest the secrets from the beyond.

Here is the mighty sweep of a New Cycle before us. And we stand in the presence of this Infinite New Energy, that promises the Potency of a new Terrestrial Life whose Sounds of Luna will shatter the "Evil" of Beggar Spouse of Night.

Fear builds the eleemosynary institutions.

## The Unpardonable Sin

## The Fourth Dimension

HE FOURTH Dimension, the mystery of the materialistic world. Variously called the Astral, Time, Chimera, Eternity, imaginary, etc., etc.

The Fourth Dimension is the One descending into Matter to become the Many. It is primordial substance being manifested in physical creation. It is God. It is here and now, everlasting, indestructible, ever manifesting in the flesh. It is the foundation upon which all creation stands. It is Atlas bearing the Universe upon his shoulders.

When man learns that he is a three-fold Being and that the three folds of his Being are the physical, mental and spiritual, and that it is his privilege to say upon how many of these planes he will manifest, and he determines that he will manifest on all three, then he will know, without further evidence or extraneous instruction, just what constitutes the Fourth Dimension.

In order that he may manifest on the three planes, it is necessary that he first overcome the two lower planes. That is, he must first overcome his habits and appetites, becoming the master of his body, in every particular, before he can say that he is manifesting, even, upon the two lower planes, as a human being. By overcoming the false appetites and restoring himself to a state where normal hunger, only, controls his desire for food, he will discover that he has only a desire for normal food, and normal food means vegetables, fruits and nuts.

With the regulation of his appetites to a normal basis, he will, automatically, find that his mind has begun to function in a manner unknown to him under the old regime. If he will continue to live normally, taking proper breathing exercises, he will also find an increase in his degree of sensitivity, which is evidence that his intuitive faculties are awakening. The old habits and appetites should have dropped away from him coincident with his awakening intuition, if he has made the slightest effort to create a new state of mind regarding them.

With the increase of his intuitive powers, he will also notice an increase in his clairvoyant power. This is merely a stepping up of his intuition and is evidence that he is on the borderland of contacting the Fourth Dimension. It is at this point that many cease to develop, assuming they have received all that the physical manifestation can give them. To do so, is to stop on the mental plane and become static on that plane. This is a state common to a majority of students and is the reason why there are so few students in the more advanced classes of Occultism. They become static at this

point, or, a better word, probably, would be dogmatic. To become dogmatic is to become paganistic; static, dogmatic, paganistic are, practically, as near as words may be, synonyms. At this point instruction ceases and retrogression begins, if they fail to follow up their investigations.

But the student who perseveres in his studies, will find the higher levels and, eventually, will be able to understand, exactly, what is meant by the Fourth Dimension.

Man is a Three-Dimensional replica of a Four-Dimensional original. That Four-Dimensional original is said to be the Grand Man of the Universe. This means very little to an average mind. The Grand Man of the Universe is the combined attributes of the planetary forces, stepped down through the world's transformer, the Moon, as it functions in its progress through the various chambers or houses of the Zodiac, giving form to the primordial spirit or cosmic waters, as they are played upon by the primordial thought substance (the Word) through the transmuting influence of primordial light, the result of the Word.

In this stepping down process, or cosmic photography, man loses a dimension just exactly as does a photograph from a camera. But this loss of dimension in the photo is only seeming. There is, in reality, the third dimension to the photograph, but it is very tenuous, or largely imaginary. So, likewise, is there a Fourth Dimension to the human being, but it is, also, very tenuous. It is the original primordial substance, or cosmic water, from which he started. It is his first estate, and to regain that first estate with full power of cognition, is man's business on Earth. This is done through what is termed Religion. The meaning of that word is juggled to suit the mentality using it but it has a real meaning that fitly explains its purpose.. Re means back and ligio to bind. So the meaning of Religion is a binding back and the place or thing to which it binds back is that first estate. We take with us into that estate of awareness, a full knowledge of all the experiences passed through on the way down and the way back. Arriving at the First Estate with a perfected technique, it is only reasonable to suppose that we are given a greater and still greater job as we advance. It was no idle figure of speech used in the Bible where it is said that a man who "conquers himself is greater than he that taketh a city".

Here is a simple trick with matches that will demonstrate the action of arriving at the Fourth Dimension: Take six matches, place three of them in a triangle flat on a table; (Fig. 1) then take the remaining three matches and hold them in the fingers so as to make them form a pyramid (Fig. 2), evenly spaced around, then place these three matches with their ends at the three corners of the triangle lying flat (Fig. 3). It will be seen







at a glance that the triangle l ying flat is the fourth one, forming the base from which radiate the three triangles standing upright. Thus it will be understood that when man is functioning on three dimensions, he is, automatically, functioning on the fourth.

Here, it will become evident, is the proof that the Fourth Dimensioon is always with us, but only as we are enlightened through proper eating, breathing and thinking, can we become conscious of this higher power within us. Here is also proof that primordial substance is inert and only becomes active as thought force is injected into it. This will explain why God is a God of vengeance to one man and a God of Love to another. Each man creates his own God.

Electricity numbers to 57—12—3. Gravity numbers to 39—12—3. Prinordial substance numbers to 84—12—3. Here is a significant array of mathematical deductions that is entirely satisfactory as proof to the philosopher and very difficult for the scientist to explain away.

"If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy; for the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are".—I Cor. III, 16-17.

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
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
