

A SON OF PERDITION.

The well-known author af "The Mystery of a Hansom Cab" has long been a student of occult phenomena, and himself possesses remarkable physic powers and intuition. "A Son of Perdition" is, however, the first occult novel that has emanated from his ready pen.

THE volume is dedicated by direction to the neophytes beyond: but the appeal, I suppose, is to neophytes and others of this world. If I think, on the whole, that inscriptions of this kind are a little regrettable, it does not follow that the narrative so introduced will be wanting in appeal to many who are seeking tidings of the unseen. It is difficult to think that it is more than a story about the post-mortem state in its first stages, yet it claims to be the result of a discovery among certain papers bequeathed by a woman-friend to the editor. The narrative part is well told, especially The Two Hands and the closing section, which indeed is not less than arresting. Supposing it to be a product of automatic writing, it is much the best of its kind that one is likely to meet with in a long day of questing. Most of these things are sufficiently bad to suggest that they can be scarcely creations of the normal mind, but Mr. Brandon's sheaf of imputed experiences is sufficiently good to indicate on every page something of the literary method. This is to his credit and on the claims otherwise of the volume one prefers to say nothing. Personally, I am thankful for the sovereign reason, aided by which it is possible to be saved from deception when the unseen and its substitutes rise up to testify. A. E. WAITE.



BETWEEN TWO WORLDS. By A. E. Lloyd Maunsell. London: De La More Press. Cr. 8vo, pp. viii, 141. Price 5s. net.

It is a little book of testimony on the part of one who is pausing for a period between the hither and the further sides of existence, with an eve and an ear for both. It is a little book of reflections and intimations, about which it may be difficult to say whether one is drawn more by the one or other message. In the sense that I am using this term, the reflections are on the world without, as it is seen from the window of one who has no wider horizon, except in the memory of the past. But it is a window which opens on faërie, and the reflections are speaking likenesses, pictures, full of that observance and keenness which are possible only to deep and living sympathy. The intimations are of the other world, of "the eternity that stirs ever behind things transitory"; and they have spoken in the heart of one who-perhaps more fully and plainly than he can realize on his own part-has beheld and is still beholding, ever and continually, the vision of the noumenal through the veil and pageant of things that are manifest. Having regard to the personal note throughout, it must be said that the studies or impressions are those of "an ambitious student in ill-health," and in this respect there is no note of hope sounded through the whole volume, though it breathes in all things else the "tranquillity of an eternal assurance." The personal note, therefore, notwithstanding its over-frequent iteration, is an added, though pathetic, charm. There are beautiful and moving things in this modest memorial, which speaks, amidst conscious restriction, of liberation and union. A. E. WAITE.





This exceedingly witty book will please all political parties which have a sense of humour, and will convince sagacious readers that we have here a parodist of uncommon power who is able to seize characteristics and manipulate them in the most skilful manner to suit his purpose. The six imaginary speeches at the beginning are all good, and those by Lord Rosebery, Mr. Balfour and Mr. Ure, to mention only three, cannot fail to give unalloyed pleasure. In "The Sort of Poems Modern Poets Write," the mannerisms and affectations of much modern verse are happily hit off, though Mr. Squire blunts the edge occasionally by making too slight a modification of the style of the supposed originals. While "The Sort of Prose Articles Modern Prose-writers Write" contains many good things, it is hardly up to the level of the imaginary speeches, but some of the parodies in "The Practical Journalist" are delicious, especially "The Model Art Criticism" and "The Model Column for Housewives." If you want to be merry, read the book.

THOMAS DAVIDSON, says William James in this book, on one occasion "denounced me for the musty and mouldy and generally ignoble academicism of my character." Such a description is humorous to the last degree, when applied to a man so signally distinguished for vivacity and freshness and generosity of mind towards all new ideas. But a remark like this, coming from a noble friend, of a character so free and a life so intensely individual as Davidson's, must have held a lasting piquancy for William James. It was Thomas Davidson who said, "There is nothing in all the world like friendship, when it is deep and real," and also acted up to that saying, and in the first part of this book of essays we see their author rejoicing in his love for his friends. The whole book is as notable for its fine spirit as for its intellectual acumen. Among the great variety of topics treated in the fifteen papers, we may specially notice a remarkably fair estimate of Herbert Spencer, and an appreciative, level-headed account of Frederic Myers' services to psychology. The essay called "The Energies of Men" is full of illumination, and it is not an exaggeration to say that the reading of the last, that on Benjamin Paul Blood, a philosopher of rare quality, may easily be productive of a high excitement. We quote its final words: "Let my last word, then, speaking in the name of intellectual philosophy, be his word:—' There is no conclusion. has concluded, that we might conclude in regard to it? 

ENPENCE

YET another addition to the already extensive "Wisdom of the East" Series brings home to us the growing interest that exists in the old-world thought and literature. Miss Walsh has succeeded in bringing together some fine examples of the poetry of Japan, much of which can be referred to a date as early as the third century. It is to Hitomaro, the Prince of the Manyôshui poets, who flourished in the seventh century, that the finest efforts are attributed. The narrative poem hardly exists and ballads are scarce, while the epic is unexpectedly absent. The great body of Japanese poems are emotional and nature poems, while some few, such as the Wasau, or Buddhist hymn, are of a religious character. Here is a nature poem from the tenth century poet Minamoto:

Out of the murky clouds the lightning's glare Dimly reveals the brooding Autumn plain, Shown for an instant in its 'broidery rare, Then the dense darkness covers it again. Such is our life, an instant in the light, Then the Unknown, impenetrable Night!

How nearly the Buddhist poet may have been affected by the teachings of Christianity appears from a Wasau versified from the prose of Lafcadio Hearn entitled, "The Legend of the Murmuring from the Dry Bed of the River of Souls." It is impossible to escape the suggestion of the popular conception of the Good Shepherd:

Lifting the smallest and frailest
Into his bosom, and holding
His staff for the stumblers to clutch.

Jizō, the Diamond of Pity! Jizō, the little one's God!

The works of Professor Eucken are not, perhaps, as well known in this country as they deserve to be. This translation of his brilliant "Nobel" Lecture, delivered at Stockholm in 1909, in which he gave a succinct statement of his fundamental views, will undoubtedly gain a wider circle

Professor Eucken's philosophy may, perhaps, be best described as Ethical (as distinguished from merely contemplative) Idealism, He holds, and we think that all who give the subject due consideration must agree with him, that it is the activity of spirit which is primarily its reality, and that Idealism, rightly understood, is a striving towards the achievement of spiritual ideals. THE author has attempted a bold task and one that was doomed to failure from the fact of his having set too great a store by the influence of the Sun's position in the Zodiac at the time of birth. A very little knowledge of astrology suffices to show that the Sun has very little influence upon character, however much its position may have upon the general fortunes. The delineations of character here given are in groups of two and three degrees each, and frequently as many as five degrees are regarded as producing "similar characters." How thoroughly unreliable this system of characterization must be is illustrated by the fact that a large number of the "Birth Dates of celebrated Men and Women" are old style, when of course the Sun was not in the group to which the birthday, as given, refers. Thus I find Thomas Paine, William McKinley and Emanuel Swedenborg all grouped under January 29. The fact that I find myself among the upholsterers, decorators and machinists is blighting in the last degree. As a form of light amusement the book may find a market. SCRUTATOR.

The author of these poems is a South African, born in Natal, and writes of his native land with great and praiseworthy patriotism. The book is imbued with noble thoughts and a deep and sincere desire for the betterment of the race. Personally, I am inclined to think the poem called "Power" is the best in the book; I quote two verses—

"Who wisest is shall lead the thought,
And bring the world in tune;
Perchance a soul by Heaven taught,
In sorrow's grip rough-hewn,

"Shall feel a kinship with the gods,
And, struggling, reach their height;
Yea, chastened by their loving rods,
Attempt the world to right."

Mr. Cartwright's poems are more remarkable for the depth of thought and the noble aspirations they display rather than for originality of expression or refinement of rhythm. I may be mistaken, but I should think his writings have been considerably influenced by John Greenleaf Whittier, of whom some are very reminiscent.

THE sub-title says that these myths and legends are drawn from all ages and all climes, and the promise thus given is fulfilled literally. The arrangement is very simple in character—a few introductory sections and then the things in their order, as their names come alphabetically. The book is in this manner its own index, and we can turn to that which concerns us, taking and needing no pains. I call it a delightful book, suggesting no learning and yet shewing it on every page. It is a rosary of oldworld lore. But I should not be a reviewer if I did not mention that there are a few things which I have missed. One of them is past all credit, though I am not sure whether Mr. Skinner should lose or receive a crown of roses for having ignored all reference to Rosicrucian symbolism in connection with the "type of beauty" and "symbol of peace"—as he calls the Rose justly. He has strung many pearls together on this particular subject; but he could have added more, and they would have been true jewels, from the Kabalistic Sepher Ha Zohar, or Book of Splendour. I am sorry also that he has omitted all reference to the plant which gives rape-seeds to some of our pet birds. He could have told us, on the authority of Francis Barrett, that it should be sown with curses and imprecations; I have always wondered why. Well, it is a charming book, with a heavenly want of method. And, such is my folly, I am not sure that I would not rather have it than the Rose-Garden of Sadi.
