## Horticultural, Botanical, and Herbal Guide, FOR 1870.

**JANUARY.**—In open and dry weather, sow in mild exposure for a succession, a few early frame peas, common beans, short-topped radishes, lettuces, carrots, onions, spinach, and curled parsley, protecting them from the Frost by mats or straw. Plant, prune, and train fruit trees and bushes. Form new flower gardens, and shelter from frost tender evergreens, tulips, &c. Plant snowdrops, crocuses, &c. *Herbs* to be gathered are groundsel, chickweed, archangel, and others which are in flower.

**FEBRUARY.**—Make ready all the ground intended for early crops; and when the weather is favourable, continue to sow every fortnight, peas, beans, onions, spinachs, savoys, lettuces, celery, cauliflowers, carrots, parsnips, and radishes. Cut early kidney potatoes for seed, and put them in a stove or hot-bed in order to start them for planting out. Plant out evergreens and shrubs of all kinds, particularly roses, &c. Prune vine and fruit trees. *Herbs* to be gathered: foalfoot, lingwort, pilewort, speedwell, chickweed, shepherd's purse, and broom.

**MARCH.**—The principal crops of vegetables should be put into the ground this month. Sow asparagus, celery, cauliflowers, broccoli, spinach, onions, carrots, peas, beans, savoys, parsnips, radishes, &c. Plant red cabbage and sea-kale: sow cucumbers and melons in hot beds. Finish pruning, dress borders and strawberry beds. This is the best time for grafting fruit trees, perpetual and moss roses, &c. Pot dahlias and cuttings. Plant pinks, polyanthus, carnations, &c. *Herbs* to be gathered for medicinal purposes: coltsfoot, fumitory, pilewort, ladyfrocks, lesser celandine, violet and comfrey roots, and all kinds of herbal bark.

**APRIL.**—Continue to sow and plant rhubarb, artichokes, asparagus, sea-kale, Dutch turnips, German greens, and small salading. Earth up peas, tie up lettuces, and in very dry weather water seedling beds. Finish the grafting of fruit trees, and train and clean walks and edgings. Sow annuals, biennials, and perennials. Plant evergreens and propagate by cutting, jasmine, lavender, sage, rosemary, rue, &c. Sow early Dutch turnips. *Herbs* to be gathered: ground ivy, dandelions, avens, buttercups, and others which are in flower, as well as all kinds of bark.

**MAY.**—Sow peas, cucumber, red beet for pickling, and a full crop for kidney beans. Transplant cabbages, winter greens, cauliflowers, and celery. Hoe and stake peas, water newly-planted crops, and propagate aromatic plants by slips or cuttings. Plant dahlias, if there be no appearance of frost, and protect from wind and rain choice tulips, &c. Propagate herbaceous plants by dividing the roots. *Herbs* to be cut: celandine, milkwort, moonwort, wood sorrel, and adder's tongue.

**JUNE.**—Top beans and peas to assist the filling of the pods. Set kidney beans, and transplant cabbage, savoys, broccoli, and sow turnips. Thin out onions, leeks, carrots, parsnips, and early turnips. Gather and preserve kitchen herbs. Shade and air melon plants, &c. Bulbous roots that have done flowering should now be taken up, and the off-sets separated. *Herbs* to be cut: avens, brooklime, centuary, comfrey, woodbine, valerian, eyebright, pimpernel, speedwell, and elecampane.

## Horticultural, Botanical, and Herbal Guide, FOR 1870.

JULY.—In this month prepare all unoccupied plots of ground for autumn and winter crops. Sow turnips, radishes, &c. Plant out broccoli, cauliflower, savoys, leeks, and winter cabbages, and earth up celery. Lift full grown winter onions, and prepare mushroom spawn. In fine weather, gather medicinal flowers and sweet herbs, when in bloom, dressing them first in the sun, & then in the shade for winter use. *Herbs* to be cut are all that are in flower, as lavender, tansey, vervain, bedstraw, agrimony, cinquefoil, mountain flax, foxglove, and meadow sweet.

AUGUST.—Sow early cabbages and parsley for the succeeding year; also spinach, broccoli, and cauliflower to stand the winter; earth celery; hoe and thin turnips; transplant broccoli, savoys, and cauliflower, and the principal crop of celery into the trenches for blanching. Make mushroom beds: propagate kitchen herbs by slips, and take up all onions, garlic and shallots that are withered in the stem. Sow the seed of bulbous flowers in pots. *Herbs* to be cut: all mints and sage, golden rod, pond weed, yellow gentian, tansey, mugwort, and loosestrife.

SEPTEMBER.—Plant savoys, broccoli, cauliflower, leeks, celery, and perennial aromatic, and pot herbs. Hoe winter spinach and turnips, earth up celery and cardoons, prick out cabbage plants, gather ripe seed, &c. Pull onions if the tops appear dying. Plant cuttings of gooseberries, currants, raspberries, and strawberries, taking out the old stools which have twice produced fruit. *Herbs* to be gathered; angelica, field gentian, valerian, feverfew, southernwood, briony, and wild berries.

OCTOBER.—Plant home radishes, early cabbages, and other greens neglected last month, in sheltered situations; also cauliflower, mint, and tarragon, in frames for winter use. Earth up savoys and cabbages as high as the leaves. Take up carrots and parsnips, cut off their tops and bury them in dry sand. Crop the tops of parsley, to make fresh leaves for winter. Transplant fruit trees and shrubs after the 10th day. Gather tree seeds: and sow for stocks. *Herbs* to be gathered: ivy, yarrow, wall rue, shepherd's purse, broom, rape, wall cress, and wild berries.

NOVEMBER.—Dig the ground where the crops are carried off, and which is not intended to plant again till spring: manure and prune fruit trees. Shallots are readily propagated by offsets. A stiffish soil, and open aspect should be preferred. These offsets, or "claws," should have their basis only pressed into the ground, without being covered. Tulips and hyacinth roots may be planted. *Herbs*: not many to be gathered this month for medicinal uses, except rose moss, rock fern, and polypody.

DECEMBER.—In this month forward the business of manuring, digging, or trenching vacant ground. Set all sorts of stones, kernels, &c. Complete tree planting, and forward all winter pruning. Continue planting various hardy roots, bulbs and shrubs. If frosty weather, be particular to protect all tender plants, trees, &c. Earth up celery. Sow small salad in warm borders, covered with mats. *Herbs* to be gathered: rose moss, rock fern, polypody, evergreens, and the mistletoe.

## NATURE AND CHARACTER OF THE ASPECTS.

*Aspects*, from *aspicio*, to behold, the being placed at a certain distance from a planet, these are either *good* or *evil* aspects. As the *conjunction* (☌) or being in the same sign and degree of the zodiac, *good* with the good planets; as *Jupiter*, *Venus*, the *Sun*, the *Moon*. Any planet is *afflicted* when in *conjunction* (☌) of *Saturn*, *Mars*, or *Uranus*. *Semisextile* (S.★), *Sextile* (★), and *Trine* (Δ), are *good* aspects with *all* the planets; and those days are said to be *lucky* when the *Moon* forms any of these aspects. See the "Lunar Aspects," commencing at page 8. The *Semisquare* (S.□), 45 degrees; the *Square* (□), 90 degrees; and the *Opposition* (♂), 180 degrees, are *ill aspects* with *any* of the *planets*, therefore unfavourable to mankind in any honourable undertaking. *Parallel*, or *P.* signifies an equal distance from the Equator, or being in the same degree of *Declination*; whether of the same name, *North* or *South*, is of no consequence. The effect of this position is exactly the same as that of a conjunction (☌), being *good* with *good* planets, as *Jupiter* (♃), *Venus* (♀), the *Sun* (○), the *Moon* (☽); and *evil* with the planets *Saturn* (♄), *Mars* (♂), and *Uranus* (♅). *Vide*, the "Mutual Aspects," commencing with page 8.

## THE MOON'S INFLUENCE ON VEGETATION.

*Important to Gardeners, Farmers, Horticulturalists, and Botanists.*



The wisest man that ever lived, and perhaps the greatest observer of the vegetable creation, and who obtained the greatest knowledge from experience, asserts, "I planted me vineyards: I made me *gardens* and *orchards*; and I planted trees in them of *all kinds* of fruits;" after which he says, "*To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose: a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which was planted.*"—*Ecclesiastes*.

Who dare deny the above assertions? None but infidels. Who can say from experience that the Moon has *not* an *influence* on the growth of beans, peas, cabbage, vines, lettuce, cucumbers, hyssop, palm tree, lily, white roses, poppies, linseed, moon wort, colewort, &c.?

I challenge any gardener to disprove any of the following assertions.

1. That if *peas* are sown in the increase of the Moon, they *never* cease blooming.
2. That a *pomegranate* will live only as *many years* as the Moon was *days old* when it was planted.
3. That if fruits and herbs are set after the Moon is fifteen days' old, they are neither so rich in flavour, nor so strong and healthy as when the Moon is between three and fourteen days' old.
4. Vines pruned during the Moon's increase will spread further than when pruned during her wane.
5. Shrubs and the like, if planted during the Moon's *increase*, and in  $\text{II}$ ,  $\text{I}$  or  $\text{III}$ , will take little root and shoot straight up.
6. Shrubs, if planted when the Moon is in  $\text{V}$ ,  $\text{VI}$  or  $\text{VII}$ , and on her *decrease*, will take deep root and strike downwards.

QUESTIONS.—1. Why do some flowers open their blossoms during night?

2. Why do some blossoms appear only whilst the Sun is up?

ADVICE.—Sow peas, beans, &c., when the Moon is about the *full*; prune vines during the Moon's *last* quarter. Shrubs intended to grow quickly and luxuriantly should be pruned in the Moon's *second* quarter. Fruits and herbs should be planted in the Moon's *second* quarter. Shrubs intended to take deep root and grow slowly and stiffly should be planted when the Moon is *past full*, and passing through the earthy signs  $\text{V}$ ,  $\text{VI}$  or  $\text{VII}$ . But if they are to take little root and grow tall and straight, plant them before the *full* Moon, and whilst she is passing either  $\text{II}$ ,  $\text{I}$  or  $\text{III}$ , this may be known by consulting the Calendar Pages, under the heading of *Moon's Long*. Gather seeds the *day after the New Moon* or a day or two before the *Full*.

# ASTRO-METEOROLOGY.

## THE QUARTERLY MAGNETIC STORMS.

The first quarterly storm period is between December the 21st of the old year, and January on the 8th of the New Year. This is one crisis of some great change or fresh establishment of weather. Mild autumns now give place to cold weather, or cold seasons for a time give up to mildness and storm. The second period is from March the 21st to April the 7th, when we never should venture on a pleasure trip, because now the commotion comes—the battle between winter and spring—and some rough weather may be looked for during the sixteen days.

The third period, and most notable, is from June 21st to July the 8th, but usually the general storm occurs near the 25th of June and the 7th of July, which times avoid travelling, pleasure, or haymaking.

The most unsafe for these matters are from June the 24th to the 29th, and on July the 6th and 7th, in most years. The fourth period noted for storms is from September the 23rd to October the 7th, and this being the very time most of the agricultural sales by auction are appointed, it often happens that they are attended with very unsavourable weather, however fine it was before. Watch the Barometer, and avoid the Sea!

## RULES FOR JUDGING OF THE WEATHER.

1. Blowing weather from west to south will be succeeded by rain, and if the wind "backs" from westward to S.S.E., it will soon rain much.
2. Easterly winds bring on storms from S.W., and more so in summer.
3. A south wind, and yet cold, bespeaks much rain.
4. In severe winters, when remarkably severe night comes, expect a thaw near at hand, and in hot weather, if one day after all prove more excessive than usual, expect a storm and sudden coolness.
5. Uncommonly thick fogs in December, for many days, betoken severe weather, and great snows in January.
6. In clear evenings, if many meteors shoot across the sky, it shows a very electric state, and storms will soon follow.
7. Flimsy stripes of white cloud, settling on the Crowns of the denser rocky ones, tell of thunder near.
8. In sharp frosty weather, if we see the straight sheets of cloud, or fleecy dotted ones, it will soon thaw, and blow, and rain.
9. In a calm time, when the wind-millers are waiting for wind, if they see straight bars of clouds near the horizon, almost like shoals of fish, they may be sure of a good breeze in a day or two.
10. Sharp pointed clouds are a *sure* prognostic of approaching winds.
11. A rainbow seen in the morning gives small rain; if seen at noon settled and heavy rain; if seen at night, fairer weather.
12. In the summer a strongly-scented blue haze coming over at noon, in clear weather, foreshows rain at hand.

*January 31st, invisible to England.*

*Begins* on the Earth generally, Jan. 31st, 1h. 44m. 36s. P.M. Mean Time at Greenwich, in Long.  $146^{\circ} 3' W.$ , and Lat.  $60^{\circ} 3' S.$  Greatest Eclipse, Jan. 31st, 3h. 26m. 12s. P.M. (Sun's diam.=1 0·481.

*Ends* on the Earth generally, Jan. 31st., 5h. 8m. P.M., in Long.  $32^{\circ} 52' E.$  of Greenwich, and Lat.  $42^{\circ} 22' S.$

The visibility of this Eclipse will be confined to the waters of Southern and Antarctic Oceans, and all round the South Pole, where no mortal eye will behold the Phenomenon.

### III.—A PARTIAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN,

*June 28th, invisible to England.*

*Ends* on the Earth generally, June 29th, 1h. 39m. 42s. A.M., in Long.  $137^{\circ} 39' W.$  of Greenwich, and Lat.  $42^{\circ} 59' S.$


This Eclipse will be visible to New Zealand, and the South Pacific Ocean.

The annexed representation of the positions, and path of the Moon, as she passes through the dark Shadow of the Earth from right to left, has been sketched for London, and will serve without sensible error for the whole of Great Britain.



**B.** denotes the *Beginning* ; **M.** the *Middle* ; and **E.** the *End*.

At the Middle of the Eclipse the Moon will be Vertical, or directly over head, in Long  $22^{\circ} 48'$  E. of Greenwich, and Lat.  $22^{\circ} 9'$  S., which place falls in the Middle of the Great Desert in South Africa. From this and other data, I find that this interesting Phenomenon will be visible to Europe, Asia, and Africa, and to the Islands, &c., adjacent.



## VI.—GRAND SOLAR ECLIPSE,

December 22nd, visible to Great Britain.

The last and most interesting is an Eclipse of the *Sun* on *Thursday*, December the 22nd. Throughout Great Britain it will be a large Partial Eclipse, varying from 9 to  $9\frac{3}{4}$  degrees, and it will therefore, be looked forward to, as an interesting Phenomenon. The following *Type* represents the Eclipse for *London*, where **B.** shews the *Beginning* of the Eclipse; **M.** the *Middle*; and **E.** the *End* of the Phenomenon.

## THE WINTER QUARTER;

*Or the Sun's Transit through Capricorn, Aquarius, and Pisces.*

The fields are desolate, a threat'ning hand  
Seems raised in icy enmity to mirth :  
Yet, listen ! Christmas carols through the land,  
His song, " Goodwill to man and peace on earth."  
And hopes immortal with the laurel wave  
Above the cypress of the old year's grave.

The Sun's annual ingress into the cardinal sign of the *Goat* takes place on the 21st day of Dec., 1869, at 6h. 23m. P.M. The horoscope of the hour presents us with a remarkable position of the heavens : the beginning of the sign Leo arises on the house of life, and significator of the community at large, while the 7th degree of Aries is meridional ; the Sun is in the lower part of the heavens : he is governed by Saturn, who commits his disposition to Mercury, lord of the 3rd, and 12th mansions. London feels the evil influence of Saturn, who is pondering, as it were, on whom he can pour his malefic influence. Fires, suicides, murder, and robbery, will be fearfully prevalent. The opposition of Mars and Uranus indicates great excitement ; and the result is violence and riot, as well as evils of a physical nature, in most parts ruled by the signs *Cancer* and *Capricorn*, for an enumeration of which places, *vide* page 72. I cannot help exclaiming, in the words of the renowned astrologer, *Lilly*, "The more I behold the heavens the greater mischief do I fear ; but knowing God can in a moment reconcile us, I am more sparing in art ; yet, let none take it ill ; I predict what I do from positive Rules of Art itself." Alas ! also for the gentle sex,—Venus in the house of death : prepare ye the funeral bier ; let the trappings too be gaudy ; is it beauty or fashion which marks the *one* who is so suddenly struck down from the gay heights of splendid life—a star perchance, in the illustrious galaxy, or is it one of regal lineage ? Time will show : the portents are striking, and they will prove true. Mars is in the sixth house of heaven, cowering in the sign of the Goat, he prepares the sting of mortality ; he fills the receptacles of the sick ; threatening pestilential vapours, malaria, epidemic disorders, and popular diseases. The starry portents are perhaps even more fearful than usual, in their denunciation to the Nations and Kingdoms of the Earth.

## THE SPRING QUARTER;

*Or the Sun's Transit through Aries, Taurus, and Gemini.*

Come sunny days ! come buds and early flow'rs !

Come hours of loitering in fragrant lanes,  
Where violets, sweet daughters of the show'rs,

Abound ; come gentle cowslips of the plains,  
Primroses pale, and daises yellow-ey'd,  
And starry buttercups, in amber dy'd.

The Vernal Equinox, which Astrologers esteem as the basis for their *grand horoscope*, whereby the fate of nations is read in the starry heavens, commences on the 20th day of March, 1870, at 7h. 32m. P.M. ; at which instant of Sidereal time, 15 degrees of the sign *Libra* are Oriental, and 19 degrees of *Cancer* culminate. The stations, aspects, and configurations of the governing stars are singular, eventful, and bode many mysterious circumstances connected with the fate of Europe, America, and the Indian dominions. Jupiter in the 8th house will cause numerous deaths amongst the nobility of the land, while his desperate affliction by the ponderous orb of *Saturn*, will cause the sepulchre to close on a clergyman of the highest rank—either an archbishop, or one high in the Church Militant. The evil *Saturn* in the 3rd house of the figure in quartile to the violent *Mars*, will cause serious accidents and loss of life on railways. The Post Office management becomes a subject of public remark ; and many of its officials are detected in misconduct. Ireland and Scotland are agitated by political and religious factions. The kingdoms of *Fez*, *Morocco*, and *Northern Africa*, suffer from malign influence. The provinces of *Spain* are excited by the infusion of priestly deceits. *India*, *Syria*, and the coasts of *Asia Minor*, are afflicted : some of the American Cities, but *New York* especially, are the scenes of confusion and disasters. Fires and explosions are to be feared, more than usual. Persons connected with mines cannot be too cautious. Much electricity exists, and fearful storms may prove inimical to the coming harvest. The equilibrium of the celestial atmosphere is disturbed by the action of the superior planets, and violent shocks of earthquake will be the result. The progress of *Mars* through the sign *Pegasus* creates excitement in *Portugal*, *Galicia*, *Calabria*, *Normandy*, and some other places ruled by that sign. Brighter prospects dawn on the sons of *Erin*, and they are freed from some of their burdens.

## THE SUMMER QUARTER;

*Or the Sun's Transit through Cancer, Leo, and Virgo.*

Gold, thou false idol of a sordid age,  
For thee, what votaries fight, what kingdoms rage!  
For thee, what prayers ascend, what constant vows!  
For thee, the merchant sighs, the statesman bows!  
*All sects unite*, and worship at thy shrine,  
And own thy glittering altar all divine.

The refulgency of the Summer may be said to have its astronomical commencement on the 21st day of June, 1870, at 3h. 56m. P.M., Sidereal time. The Sun then enters the constellation Cancer, and the celestial limits of his diurnal arc extended to their greatest length. The *theme of heaven* has 11 degrees of Scorpio on the ascendant; a sign of much affliction to the mercantile and trading part of the English nation. 26 degrees of Leo are on the midheaven; which causes the aspects to prevail over Royalty, and the aristocracy of the land; and the Solar orb is posited in the house of death,—a sad presage for many who now swell themselves out with the lust of power. Jove, Mars, and Mercury, are located in the sign Gemini, on the cusp of the 8th house, the mansion of death, which strikes down several public characters both in London and America during this quarter. The position of Uranus in the ninth house at this ingress is very threatening; and there will be great scandal on religious questions, and much gross infidelity publicly known; but what is even worse, gross hypocrisy among religious professors; and much enmity to the people will arise among the fat Pharisees of the day. Mars opposes Saturn, and the busy Mercury will scarcely fail in disseminating rumours of a warlike kind. This quarter will prove most prolific in high-sounding but fraudulent projects, participated in by the public in a surprising manner. It is painful to reiterate mention of evil to the sister country; but more peace and prosperity shall revisit her for a time; for Jupiter transits the Radiant Twins, and the Celestial Balance, emblem of even-handed justice, rises in the East. Holland and Belgium are threatened with calamity, probably from floods, a breaking in of the waters of the ocean, or storms unusual at this period of the year; and I fear Scotland will not escape visitations of a like or equally untoward nature. Marriages of note will enliven this quarter.

## THE AUTUMN QUARTER;

*Or the Sun's Transit through Libra, Scorpio, and Sagittarius.*

Inland, with wailing cry, the sea-gull flies,  
A hazy glow pervades the morning air;  
The misty clouds, on rapid wings arise:  
Bestir ye, Mariners! for storms prepare!  
A voice of warning moans upon the wave,  
Or booms in sullen wrath from cave to cave.

The Sun now once more pours forth his mild effulgence from the Celestial Balance, which Constellation he approaches and enters on the 23rd day of September, 1870, at 6h. 9m. A.M. As he enters among the first stars of this sign, 3 degrees of Libra are *Eastern*, 4 degrees of Cancer *Southern*, 3 degrees of Aries *Western*, and 4 degrees of Capricorn are *Northern*. Mars is once more angular in the house of political greatness; this will cause the sepulchre to close upon many of the *rich*, the *titled*, and the *ennobled*. The Sidereal portents at this Ingress, denote the vacancy of a dukedom or some such noble estate; a military man of some renown is carried to the sepulchre; and there are evident signs of conflagrations. The affairs of the clerical world are under such disastrous omens, that some important laws affecting them will be shortly made, or their hereditary revenues subject to a rigid censure; most probably many popular assemblies will be near this time convened; a clergyman of note dies. The position of Venus in the 12th house brings woe to females of note in London and Paris; and this phenomenon is evil for the female sex generally; disappointment and deception are the destiny of those who were born with the planet Venus afflicted at their birth. Some lady of rank will become the inmate of a prison during the reign of this Ingress. From the position of Saturn in the 3rd house, we predict that this quarter will be fearfully replete with accidents by land, railroads, and also with steam vessels. Mars elevated above the Moon will cause storms and earthquakes, and those very violent. As regards the relations of Britain with Foreign States, let us hope that though the symbols of war have so often sparkled upon the horoscope of the hour, its inflictions may be yet distant, and that we may, under the rule of our beloved QUEEN, continue to enjoy PEACE and SECURITY—blessings which, beyond all others, bind the subject to his Sovereign. Thus do I conclude my Prophetic Observations.

**Fulfilment.**—On the 22nd ult., the Dutch powder-house at Kinsembro, South West Africa, accidentally blew up, causing terrible destruction to property and life. A Hull steamer blew up at Great Yarmouth at the same time!

### CARDS AND THEIR EMBLEMS.

Every one must at some time have experienced the singular effects, either of chance or calculation, which result from the various dispositions of the cards, and it may afford some clue to the reason why a pack of cards should be chosen as a medium for divination to explain the principle on which they were originally constructed.—It is generally believed that cards were invented for the amusement of one of the early Kings of the line of Bourbon; but this belief is erroneous. Who the man was that invented those instruments of amusement is not known, neither can we tell in what age they were first invented. Our knowledge is limited to a country whence they came—namely, Egypt. The colours are two, red and black, which answers to the two Equinoxes. The suits are four, answering to the four seasons. The emblems formerly were, and still are in Spain—for the Heart, a cup, emblem of Winter; the Spade, an acorn, the emblem of Autumn; the Club, a trefoil, the emblem of Summer; the Diamond, a rose, the emblem of Spring. The twelve court cards answer to the twelve months, and were formerly depicted as the signs of the zodiac. The fifty-two cards answer to the number of weeks in a year: the thirteen cards in each suit, to the number of weeks in a lunar quarter. The aggregate of the pips, calculated in the following manner, amount to the number of days in a year.

Take the *number* of letters in the name of the asker, and the same in the name of the person or thing asked about; add these to the number placed against the day the question is proposed, and the planet's *number* of the same day; divide the total by 27; if the remainder be found in the list of fortunate numbers, the answer is in the affirmative; if not so found it is in the negative.

Fortunate Numbers—0, 1, 3, 6, 7, 9, 12, 14, 15, 18, 21, 24.

Thus: Florence asks if Edward shall be her Husband?

Divide 102 by 27, there remains 21, which is to be found among the fortunate numbers, and therefore the reply is in the affirmative.

Which sum divided by 27, the remainder is 11; and that not being a fortunate number, we conclude that Emma will not go the journey.
