ADVICE FOR REINS-WOMEN.

"In whom there is no variableness, nor shadow of turning."

In their efforts to attain consecration a very important consideration for Reins women is to gain and to preserve an exactly balanced—poised—state of mind, soul and body, and to free themselves from the domination of other minds. This is an attainment necessary to all, yet Reins persons, if possible, more than any other need to do thorough work along this particular line because of their extreme susceptibility to physical, mental and psychic influence. The nature of an (K) person may be aptly compared to the sensitive plate of a camera, for it is a reflection of whatever object or condition it is exposed to. A steady persistent effort to realize the Presence and the un-failing love and protection of our Divine Parent, who is also the Creator and sustainer of all that is, and a true understanding of the Mind that includes all manifestation on any plane of Being whatsoever, together with a perfect trust in that loving Presence, will equalize the most sensitive mentality and induce mental, physical and soul states positive to all else, negative only to God. "In Him we live and move and have our being," "in whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning." The mentality that recognizes the omnipresent and omnipotent power of God will soon be released from bondage to fear, which is the basis in the moral mind for all the power evil has. "Perfect love casteth out fear." To know the qualities of perfect love is to know God, and to know God is life eternal. No higher or more true and practical teachings concerning the true relations of God and man can be found anywhere than were presented by Jesus Christ, and these teachings are for all times and all people. "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus," writes the Apostle Paul. Christ Jesus knew himself to be at one with God.
