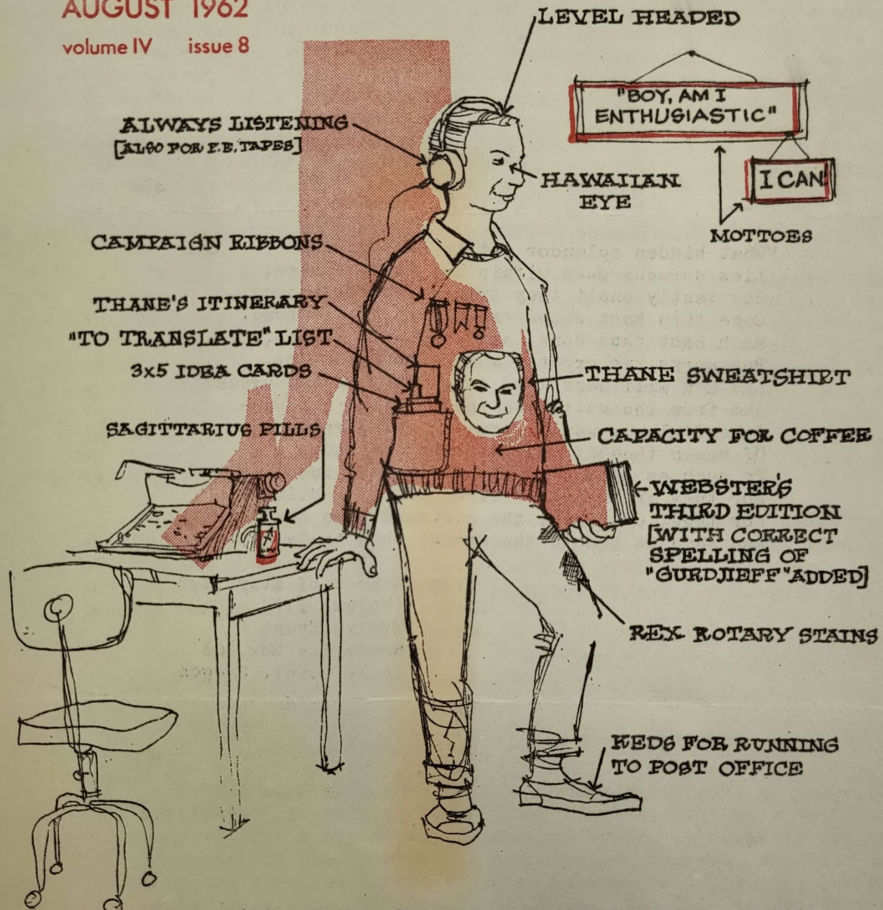

EFFECTIVE PLANNING

Under the newly elected Board of Trustees, a new idea was brought forth that all feel will do much to forward the progress of The Prosperos and the presentation of the teaching of our Dean, Thane.

"From the Heart of Things"

This Progress Report is coming from the National Servers' Center because the NSC is "the heart" of The Prosperos organization. It pumps blood into the veins and arteries represented by the Audio Center, the Juvenile School, the Closed Classes, the News Letter, the Study Groups of Prosperos' Students scattered throughout the nation and the world... as well as the many other facets of your organization.

Because The Prosperos is your organization, and because the NSC is the heart of your organization, the NSC, then, belongs to you as much as to anyone else. Thus, this report.

I have likened the NSC to a heart...but lately it has been functioning with only one valve. As stated in the last News Letter, your organization has been given a blood transfusion with additional personnel, additional enthusiasm, re-organization, and new ideas. And the first job is to get the "pump" (the heart) properly working.

This is a mammoth task...one that sometimes overwhelms me. For a long time I sat out on the sidelines as a Student, like you, and cussed and discussed "the Center"..."they" don't get book orders on time..."they" goof up this and that. Now I'm a part of that "they"...and I am also realizing that I ALWAYS was!

I have found the NSC to be dusty...dusty from dis-use and mis-use. And like all new-to-the-job executives, I whirl-wind about "dusting"...only to find that most of the dust is in my own thinking.

"Progress" means that which has been accomplished. So, I shall list those things accomplished: Files straightened out...bookkeeping caught up (a little)...correspondence stack dented (a little)...Staff School sessions begun...money-making projects started...but mostly, familiarization of all the many facets of just what this "heart" actually is.

FILES

Do you have any idea how many thousands of cards that twenty-two, large 3X5 files can hold?? Each one of these cards (and you are on one of them!) represents a person...with hopes, dreams, (and perhaps, problems) just like you.

These are by no means the only files, of course. There are many, each one with a purpose, a reason for being there. And each one bogged down because the heart has not functioned well. In fact, more filing cabinets are needed, because of crowded conditions.

BOOKKEEPING

There are so many facets to this organization of yours, that the bookkeeping, alone, is enough to confuse an IBM "brain"...(which assuredly, I am not!) But here, again, these bookkeeping systems are necessary to the proper functioning of this heart. And this, too, is way behind.

CORRESPONDENCE

Go back to those thousands of 3X5 cards, each one being a person, and just imagine the letters, notes, complaints, orders and confusion they represent daily. In just the week the Staff was at Pasadena for the Retreat, the stack of correspondence overflowed the filing basket. (Can you imagine the correspondence for Thane, alone, who gets even more than the NSC. At

least, we can answer some of our mail with form letters...his are done personally!) But there has been a dent made in that pile of confusion.

This does not mean I'm asking you not to write...I'm showing you why, sometimes, our replies from the NSC are with "pony-express" speed.

STAFF SCHOOL SESSIONS

Because the National Servers' Center is a School...a training ground... ..for interning Mentors and neophytes, like me, then sessions of School are also on the daily agenda, ranging from 30 minutes to 1 hour. (Take an hour out of the standard 8-hour office day and you lose a great deal of "accomplishment" time.) Our day here, at the moment, is much longer. And I do not mean to imply that this heart of yours only pumps 8 hours...it goes on continually...for the Staff at the NSC is "on call" 24 hours. I agree with Perry Dickey, President of The Prosperos, there really are 37 hours in a day!

MONEY-MAKING PROJECTS

"Miracle Shall Follow Miracle..." is not just a fun-thing around here. It is a well-established fact...for it is truly a MIRACLE, in the Translation sense, that the NSC opens its door each day. "When I was young and twenty" (a student "out there", like you) I often asked the question, "Why don't those slobs at the NSC practice what they preach and TRANSLATE?"

I'd like to change my analogy of the heart to that of a "pipe-line" ...a direct pipe-line to you, as a Student. There being ONE MIND, the NSC becomes the focal point of that pipe-line and everything that occurs to the Study Group in Seattle, or to the Study Group in Atlanta, or to the Student who is a prisoner of Castro's regime in Cuba manifests right here in OUR laps! This may sound fantastic...it is not!
