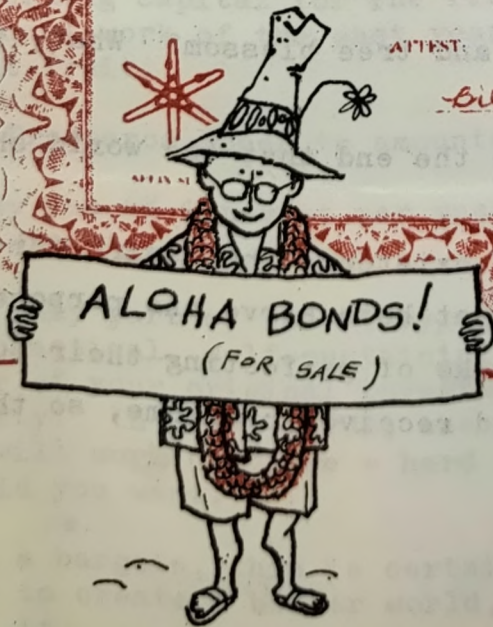

From Aloha to Alamo.....

In San Antonio, Texas, a special condensed review of RHS was presented to the students there by NORMA KELLER on August 21 and 22. In order to test how much a new student could assimilate, one new student, MRS. MELBA PATTERSON, was permitted to attend. Other students taking the condensed course were JUDGE and MRS. ALBERT TREVINO, WILLIS KINCKAE, DR. ELIZABETH FRANCIS, W. PERRY DICKEY, and ELEANOR and SHERWOOD NELSON.

Because the San Antonians are desirous of having further activity before Norma leaves for the fall lecture series, it was decided to have a Translation condensed class on September 9 and 10 to be held at the Granada Hotel. The class was preceded by an open lecture in Helotes, Texas.

The San Antonio Study Group #1 has taken the responsibility for the lecture hall expenses of this class, and plan to do the same whenever a teacher is available for a San Antonio series. This is their "church building" concept - a separate part of their group activity.

This idea of "church" was first made known by the Seattle Group #1, which decided last year to take more responsibility for providing Closed Class in their area. Realizing that fees collected had not been enough to cover expenses, the group voted to handle a part of the lecture room and advertising expenses. They explained their plan to the hotel and newspaper managements and arranged to make regular payments. Student contributions have allowed them to meet each payment. It is not strange that Seattle students had the opportunity for Closed Class instruction more often than students in any other city last year. It is only through the dedication and responsibility of someone else that it has been possible for us to have the privilege of class instruction. The Prosperos techniques are all based upon recognition of responsibility - which should not be confused with loss of freedom.

SALIENT NEWS ABOUT PROSPEROS STUDENTS

One distinguishing mark of a Prosperos student seems to be a propensity for travel (born with a packed suitcase). Here is news from two globe-trotters. DAVID WONG of Hawaii writes that he has just attended the International Lion's Convention in Nice, France, and that he is on his way back to Honolulu via New York and Seattle. According to DR. VELMA SCOTT of Midland, Texas, in a letter post-marked Cozumel Island, San Miguel, the Hawaiian Islands have a serious contender in the exotic beauty of the Carribean Islands. The current addresses of all Translation students, including Laverne's, are available by writing to the NSC. Group Translations tend to be more objective, and often clear up some aspect of Translation technique for those who are participating, as well as usually achieving an experience of satisfaction.

BOB ACHZEHNER, Chicago student, corresponds with the NSC by mailing 3 inch "voice letter" tapes, which are just long enough to hold most Translations. With this method, even distance between students need not stand in the way!

CLIFF FLETCHER, Seattle student, who attended the Pasadena Retreat, writes, "I want to tell you about a little thing that happened last Sunday. TEXTBOOK MYSTERY SOLUTION: ONE and ^{no}/100's DOLLARS, PGST PAID !!!!!!!!!!!!!

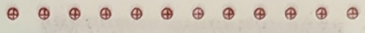

But wait, THERE IS A HITCH

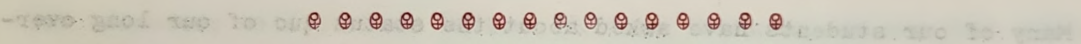

JUST NOT THE TYPE

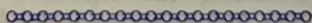
In The Prosperos' Closed Class instruction, much emphasis is placed on pointing up the erroneous concept, particularly in the field of modern-day psychology, of man's being a "type". Generally speaking, a great deal of concern is given to whether a person is this type or another; whether he should follow this vocation or that; whether or not he meets a certain measure of a conforming society; all of which relates to the personality of an individual. Such measurement of human behaviorism can, at best, give but a one-sided picture, because man must be viewed as a whole rather than compartmentalized. To eradicate the erroneous concept, man, then, must be seen as his full potential, not as we meet him and know him, presently, as some limited bias.

Using our present day evaluation, a writer for the Ventura Star-Free Press (California) has written a parallel on two of our great names in history, Albert Einstein and Socrates.

"There's been a lot of talk recently about methods of evaluating teachers, and school people put quite a lot of stock in this, as is eminently proper. Some of the rules for evaluation before the fact that Albert Einstein would not have been permitted to teach mathematics in a California junior college -- no credentials.

"We're indebted to Orville Rogers, who's in the education business himself (in Carmel) for the following evaluation, in the modern style, of perhaps the greatest teacher in history, Socrates.

- "Personal appearance: Low (dressed in old sheet.)
- "Adaptability: Prone to suicide when under duress.
- "Organization: Does not keep seating chart.
- "Room appearance: Has no bulletin boards.
- "Tact and consideration: Places students in embarrassing situation by asking questions.
- "Daily preparation: Does not keep lesson plans.
- "Professional ethics: Does not belong to professional association or PTA; quarreled with Aristophanes.
- "Education: No college degree.
- "Parent relationship: Needs to improve in this area; parents are trying to get rid of him.
- "Conclusion: Does not have a place in education -- should not be re-hired."

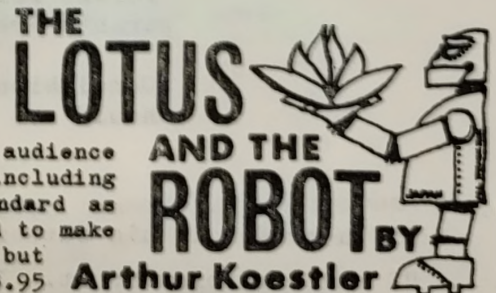
A Play Is A Play Is A Play.....?

A group of Newport students journeyed to the Laguna Beach Summer Theater to see its production of Lillian Hellman's play, "Toys In The Attic." The story centers upon two middle-aged spinster sisters who have raised their younger brother, Julian, who is recognized to be the dominant interest in their lives. After a number of unsuccessful business ventures, which have kept the sisters' bank account drained, Julian and his new wife return home. They are on the brink of acquiring a small fortune, depending on the consummation of a local business transaction. Julian, in lavish style and using his advance money, presents to his sisters all the material things that they ever desired in life, from paying off the house mortgage to a trip to Europe, which had always been postponed with each of Julian's financial crises. He discovers, to his astonishment, that the sisters, Carrie and Anna, are reluctant to believe his success is true, and Carrie demonstrates bitter resentment toward it and toward her sister who finally accepts the idea. The climax of the drama is reached when Carrie, the most possessive of the sisters, reveals information which causes Julian's deal to explode, and Carrie portrays delight and marshals her forces to take over responsibility for Julian again.

Miss Hellman shows deep insight into the human estate and the process of mind unfolding. Her characters exhibit the behavior of automatons, driven by compulsions, clinging to erroneous impressions of the past, and nurturing unconscious hatreds in hypocritical family loyalties. Their inability to accept good for themselves, as well as Julian, and their desperate need to hold him captive caused us all to examine our own "toys in the attic."

(This play was referred to by Thane while giving R H S instruction at the 1962 Retreat in Pasadena.)

In this case we have the author, Arthur Koestler, who wanted to know if Eastern Thought was the answer to the atomic threat and western jitters, so he consulted "The Lotus", the holy men of India, made some very interesting notes concerning his reaction to their teachings, and then he went for a personal and extended audience with "The Robot", the wisdom of ancient and modern Japan, including Zen Buddhist precepts. Of Japan, he relates a double standard as bad as any he's found in the West. If you've ever wanted to make just such a trip, make it now with this intelligent host, but honor him by coming to your own conclusions.....\$3.95

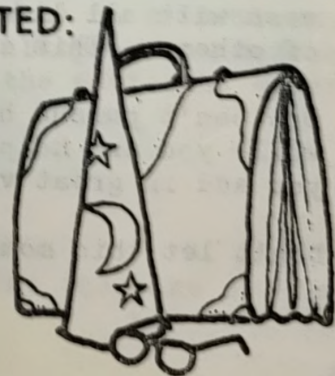

MATTACHINE SOCIETY CONFERENCE

Billye Talmadge, NSC Director, representing The Prosperos, recently attended the annual meeting of the Mattachine Society in San Francisco. Outstanding leaders in the fields of religion, psychology, medicine and law discussed the present day attitudes of society towards the homophile and the strides being made in education, moral and civil reform in this regard.

It was pointed out by D. Edgar Cummings, Associate Director, American Social Health Association in San Francisco, the gross lack of education in the field of sex, and the need of a wider distribution of information on venereal disease, adding that most parents are too ignorant in this area, themselves. This same ignorance concerning sex in any area was further confirmed by Richard Schlagel, Researcher, American University, Washington D.C., who stated that the Armed Forces "display utter confusion" on the matter and that the Department of Defense, without any clear definition of the word, attempts to act as an arbiter of morality. No constitutional right to do so has been given to any federal department, but no one to date has challenged this. The only solution that the Military has employed towards sexual deviation of any kind has been mass discharges. Constitutionality challenge has been started in this aspect.

The Rev. Robert W. Wood, Congregational Minister and author of "Christ and the Homosexual," who received a Prosperos Award in 1961, spoke via tape on the changing religious attitudes towards homosexuality. He felt that a deeper, more comprehensive definition of the word "Christian" (as well as re-defining Christian marriage) is needed, as the Clergy today refuses to admit that homosexuality exists and that they, the Clergy, feel that heterosexuality is pre-requisite in becoming a Christian. In turn, the homophile must make the effort to understand Christian ethics, and must recognize that he cannot ask for love, acceptance and understanding unless he gives these in return.

Dr. Evelyn Hooker, PhD, University of California at Los Angeles, gave a brief progress report of the research she has done on the male homosexual as compared to the heterosexual. This 6-month study, started in 1954, has become a full time project.

Aspects of the law were presented by Marshall W. Krause, Staff Counsel, American Civil Liberties Union, San Francisco. Inequality in justice does exist, in that many times the law applying to sexual crimes in general is more rigidly enforced in regards to the homophile and more rarely to the heterosexual. He noted that the ACLU will only act in behalf of a homophile in incidents where a civil liberty has been denied.

Karl M Bowman, M.D., Dept. of Psychiatry, University of California, concluded by stating that the changing attitudes in all areas of sex have been extraordinary in the last decade and that the future, indeed, looks bright. Cautioning the homophile organizations, Dr. Bowman said that unless all homosexuals maintain a proper, positive attitude towards the strides made in reform, any belligerent, antagonistic attitude will quickly dissolve all progress made up to date. "Play it safe, but make your ideas known," was the advice he offered.
