AWARDS - FOUNDER'S BIRTHDAY DINNER

"I wanted to cry and laugh at the same time. I felt as though my heart was being explored and found good!"

The student who made the above remark spoke for practically every Prospero who attended the Founder's Birthday Dinner which "lit the fuse" for the Training School just concluded at Santa Barbara's Miramar Hotel.

The event took place the night of July 13, 1963. Students arrived for the registration and cocktail party immediately preceding the dinner. There were loud greetings, much hugging and kissing "hello", and the happy sound of joyous laughter filling the lovely grounds outside the convention hall.

The comradely laughter danced all over the hall throughout the dinner. And it continued as jovial Jack Taulbee, Santa Barbara Prospero Host for the occasion, introduced the speakers. President Dickey gave a brief greeting. Then, toward the end of the dinner, Leslie Fullard-Leo of Hawaii and former President Dr. Henry Schlichting of Midland, Texas spoke both inspirationally and humorously.

But the fire which burned with ardor through the whole Training School experience was ignited by our Dean and Teacher, Thane of Hawaii. Speaking entirely without notes and from insight alone, Thane addressed each of the assembly by name and spoke of the heart of each, telling what manner of man he was, his potentials and his accomplishments. Every person there felt the warmth and love of Thane's salute to the whole man. In words that were sometimes humorous, sometimes challenging, and always pressed down and running over with understanding love, Thane spoke to each as incomparable Teacher to intimately known student.

Then to hearty applause, Thane announced the Awards for The Prosperos of the year. They went to Alice Petersen, San Francisco and Earl Keller, Newport Beach, Calif. As the citations were read which spoke of the years of devotion these two Prosperos have given to the Cause, tears came freely to all eyes.

Was the Founder's Birthday Dinner a success? Brimming hearts, glowing faces and love overflowing gave the answer. It was actually a "happy birthday" which Thane gave us all. It was a tremendous success!

### TRAINING SCHOOL EVENTS

The theme of The Prosperos' Training School was set by the Dean's opening lessons on School, the Fourth Way -- classes that have not been given since the initial Assembly at French Lick Springs, Indiana, and only given once theretofore in France, a number of years ago -- the Way of the Sly Man.

Survival Dynamics came up for major attention in the Training School lessons. The study of planetary cycles are studies for the advance student, given as part of Training School Curriculum, a preparatory course for aspiring interns and Mentors.

Personal Enrichment class provided graphic lessons in the practical application for taking action -- the necessary ingredient for setting plans into motion. These classes are basic and fundamental in that they provide a springboard: a sound foundation for substantial building, a factor that is too frequently overlooked by the average advance student of metaphysics.

These week long sessions of classes, given by the Dean, were interspersed by a series of four challenging talks on sexual problems by Hal Call, San Francisco, never before publicly presented. They were attended by city and county officials of the Santa Barbara district.

Along with an innovation on Group Dynamics, Panel Workshops were given in six sessions. The first three, moderated by Tom Wood, Newport Beach, Calif., Leslie Fullard-Leo, Honolulu, and Norma Keller, San Antonio, Texas, dealt with Releasing The Hidden Splendour or Joseph techniques. The latter three took up the art and practice, or mechanics of Translation, whose moderators were Miriam Pope, Honolulu, Coletta Bollman, Denver and Norma Keller, San Antonio, Texas. Other Panel member participants were Del Martin, San Francisco and Perry Dickey, San Antonio.

The week of study culminated in the Dean's first new class material in four years: EARTH MAN, STAY HOME! presented in three classes. Earth man series is specifically an insight on the man of the future, as he can only be envisioned and presented in our Dean's inimitable fashion, and the requisite change in man's concept of man in order to move with the future lest he remain a victim of a conformist society and fall into the extinction of the dinosaur age.

Those of us who were privileged to hear these moving talks felt ourselves literally transported into the future, with the full knowing that we were, indeed, an actual segment of this vanguard, the making of history in the present moment!

THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Annual Meeting of the Trustees of The Prosperos was held at Training School, Santa Barbara, Calif., meeting daily from July 13 to July 20th. Roll call included Miriam S. Pope, Richard Putman, Elfie W. Verhun, Norma Keller, W. Perry Dickey and Henry Schlichting, Jr. of the Advisory Board. Resignation of the following Trustees was accepted: Norma Keller, Miriam Pope, Elfie W. Verhun. All former Trustees were requested to remain in an advisory capacity. W. Perry Dickey and Richard Putman were voted to be permanent Trustees.

Del Martin was elected Director of The National Servers' Center. It was passed by the Board that the National Servers' Center would be moved to San Francisco, probably before August 30th.

Many things were submitted and discussed by the Board to promote the "re-vitalization" of The Prosperos including all facets of The Prosperos Organization--The National Servers' Center, Audio Center, etc. It was agreed that professional aid would be sought in the field of graphic arts to revamp Prosperos' advertising and establishing a new, accurate and appealing image of The Prosperos.

Two open meetings of the Board of Trustees were held with the student body at the Training School. President Dickey announced to the students the purposed moving of the National Servers' Center. Del Martin, Director of the Center gave the estimated cost of such a move. At this point there was a spontaneous flow of contributions from the students to be used to move the Center.

President Dickey Also stated that the Trustees were responsible for the student's Trust and that if any student fel that the Trustees were not holding this trust, to write him personally. He further stated that as students, it is everybody's obligation to do this.

"SPONTANEOUS COMBUSTION"

Perry Dickey, San Antonio, Texas, had just buried the NSC for us. (Actually he announced it as a "potential funeral," but he can make a potential funeral as tear-jerking as an actual funeral.) Del Martin, San Francisco, Calif., the new treasurer of the Board of Trustees, had read the figures of the minimum amounts of money that it would take to relocate the National Servers' Center to San Francisco, pay back rent and phone bill, and staff the Center with a paid staff of three for six months. These figures added up to a minimum of \$13,240 needed almost immediately, in order to guarantee a paid staff in San Francisco, or the alternative of a dead NSC in Newport Beach. And there it lay ... like a dead bug, while the students who had heard Thane's "The Fourth Way - Sly Man" series contemplated the incomprehensibility of that possibility.

Earl Keller, Newport Beach, Calif., ascertained that there were 558 members of The Prosperos. Allan Bollman, Denver, Colorado, suggested that the \$13,240 be divided by the 558 members and notices be sent out to all members as to how much was required from each to save the Center and The Prosperos as an organization. This would come to about \$24.00 a member. It was pointed out that this method had already been tried. It had failed. Then, spontaneous combustion began to occur among the students. Billie Ray, Forth Worth, Texas, a new student, spoke eloquently to the point that if she, who knew nothing of Translation and Releasing The Hidden Splendour, could find a way to come to this Training School, surely those of us who had had Translation and RHS could find the solution to so simple a problem. Jim Tucker, Atlanta, Ga., expressed similar feelings. Elizabeth Reynolds, Boerne, Texas, "was shocked" to find the situation so grave, but added that now she knew what she had come for (to Training School, that is). June Adams, Mission Hills, Calif., another new student, spoke eloquently in the same vein as Billie Ray. Dr. E. Francis, San Antonio, Texas, felt that one translation on the NSC should be done by all students present, that it should be a group translation, and that "the problem" should be kept among the students at the Training School. She added later that those who knew how to use Releasing The Hidden Splendour and Crown Mysteries should definitely use them and not stop at the Translation stage. Nothing was happening in the way of a definite motion of action. There seemed to be a long moment of silence after Dr. Francis spoke. Stella Rush, Manhattan Beach, was afraid that President Dickey might close the meeting (as time was growing short) before any definite action was agreed upon. So she tried to wrap up the previous suggestions with a top priority of her own. She felt, with others, that this definitely was an in-group responsibility at this particular point. June Adams had made the excellent suggestion of the Training School students taking their inspiration personally to their home study groups and inspiring them with the need to contribute to saving the National Servers' Center. Stella's top priority was 1. Money--NOW, "put your money where your mouth is."

Give money, however little. Pledge money on a monthly basis. 2. Dr. Francis' suggestion: Translation, RHS and Crown Mysteries. 3. June Adams' suggestion: take the message back to the study groups. Fire them up. Let them feel what we have learned, so that spontaneously they would know how important it was not to let the Prosperos School die. 4. When you get the Training School class list, write your fellow students, keep in touch with them. LOVE THEM! We are the nucleus that must inspire the rest of the students to the importance of this venture, so that they in turn will not miss a Retreat or Training School if they can possibly get there.

At point 3, President Dickey agreed, made an eloquent wrap-up and suggested that money and pledges be left with Earl Keller at the end of the meeting. The feeling ran so high that this was not satisfactory to the group. One member came up and laid a \$100.00 bill on the table in front of Perry Dickey, Pres. of the Board of Trustees. Then \$10's came up, \$50.00 checks, etc. President Dickey had to work to get the enthusiasm under control and the contributors to identify their contributions with a note. Spontaneous, heart felt, speeches were being made from the floor. Mrs. Irene Shannon, Newport Beach, Calif., moved everyone with her call for at least a \$10.00 a month pledge from everyone. As students left the hall for a short break before Thane was to speak, they filed by Del Martin and gave her more cash, checks, and pledges. At that time she received in all, \$805.50 in cash, \$640.00 in pledges (within 30-60 days) and \$165.70 in monthly pledges! Before the Training School was over, Del had in trust for the moving of the National Servers' Center, \$1075.50 in cash, \$640 in pledges and \$165.70 a month in continuing pledges!
