The location is the Western Hills Lodge on the shore of beautiful Lake Fort Gibson in the middle of the Cherokee Nation Reservation, Sequoyah State Park, near the small town of Wagoner, Oklahoma. On July 16 and 17, Thane will present his Master Initiate Class, The Crown Mysteries. There are no words to describe this rarely given esoteric instruction. You must experience it. This class has not been given east of the Rocky Mountains since 1960. Don't miss your opportunity!

Tuition envelopes for Thane and the instructors will be issued to all enrolling for the classes. Teachers in The Prosperos receive no salary from the class fees and must pay their own Assembly and Retreat expenses, including travel, hotel and class fees.

NOTE: Life Members are required to pay Assembly fee (not class fee) as this special event is not covered in life memberships.

The above prices, as in regular classes, cover only the class enrollment fees, which, as most of you know, seldom covers the cost of preparation and the expense of putting on the Assembly, Retreat and Classes.

C O M E T O T H E F E A S T by Thane

One of the oldest esoteric practices is that of feasting together. Anyone having ever attended a Prosperos' Assembly or Retreat know that the association of love and refreshing oneself within the guru-chela relationship is a feast not made by hands.

I have never known which is the greater privilege, being a student in class instruction or being a teacher. However, I do know that the annual retreat and/or assembly of the student body is more than a bonus. It is a strengthening, stimulating experience that touches deep chords of Reality that resound throughout the year. I think of it as more than a meeting of loving students and teacher; it is a sacred rendezvous and feast of spirit. To attend and participate is one true ambition that is singular among many desires and ambitions that may pay much less rewards.

In thoughtfully preparing myself for the next convocation, which immediately begins with the closing of any annual meeting, I translate that the fathomless Mind of Infinity will manifest the precisely needed instruction for each and everyone who will join me a year later. What comes forth is ours by sacred and divine right and I rejoice each year when I see that the message has blessed all collectively, and abundantly released something for each one individually.

Every class-taught student should be at the Annual Assembly and Retreat, for the simple reason that "men's hearts (are) failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth" (Luke 21:26), and the feast is good for the world as well as the individual.

It may seem a sacrifice to attend the feast but if you remember class instruction, you will know that Mind unfolding as the assembly and retreat is right now unfolding the means to be there. Class instruction brings the obligation to practice Translation and, even more, the crossing out of the material-human equation under refreshing tutelage. Any reluctance to attend is probably a matter of allowing erroneous sense testimony to get the upper-hand and dominating the consciousness. Anyone who has ever attended class instruction, or one of the national convocations, agrees that what they have received outweighs all so-called material values. Just as Jesus recalled "...man shall not live by bread alone...", we must remember our opportunity for spiritual feasts, and breathe life into the dead bones of our lives that wear thin when we are long away from inspiration.

As taught in Translation Class, any problem of materiality is nothing more than a temptation to believe in something other than our Truth-hood. Thus, we should rebuke any sense of money as matter, whether it is gained or spent, or whether we appear to not have any, as an error in consciousness and nothing else. Furthermore, we are lost from the Reality of our student-teacher relationship when we say, "I will go to the assembly if it works out that way." It would be just as foolish for me, the teacher, to say "I'll be there to teach my students if it works out for me to get there." This is tantamount to saying that the revival of inspiration and spirit, and the joyous love of student relationships is not part of the Divine Mind unfolding as Perfect Plan.

The temptation of sensory thinking finds nothing in us when we refuse to believe that Mind will not take care of family, social and business projects in some way while we make our annual pilgrimage to the feast. If we fall for this temptation we are, in effect, making our ego more important than Truth and the right-use knowing that the government of everything rests on God.

I am urging you to be alert and wise in the weeks between now and our Assembly/Retreat by placing the meeting and your attendance in the hands of God, and not in man-made preparations. Let us all dynamically accept the fact that Divine Mind is unfolding as a perfect, wonderful convocation and that it is now a blessing to all, successful in every way. Furthermore, let us realize that we'll never get there until we've decreed in our consciousness the decision to attend. Having done this first step, one is already on the way.
