Aura Seen With Naked Eye

Scientist Tells of a New Discovery

There is a scientist in England who says, according to the "News-Chronicle," he has seen the human aura with the naked eye. Many of his statements confirm the experiments of Dr. Kilner, who drew attention to auric emanations.

"There is nothing psychical or occult about this aura," he said to a reporter. "It is purely physical trical in nature. fact."

According to this unnamed scientist, the aura consists of two layers and follows the outline of the body. In color it is from pale blue to grey.

The inner aura extends some four inches out from the skin. The outer aura extends a further six

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to twelve inches in a "good subject." Changes of temperature do not affect the aura. Therefore it is not a vapor.




The Proper Attitude


