An account of this is given in Sir William's book already mentioned.

Another spirit, named Marie, took the place of Katie King and materialized many times.

Mrs. Elgie Corner, as she was named later, passed to the higher life in April, 1904. Sir William Crookes spoke very highly of the value of her mediumship.





Any favorable announcements must cover ONLY the phases of mediumship witnessed by the com-mittee. One who might be an excellent clairvoyant might not be competent trumpet medium; and still advertise independent
