In besieged cities and towns it is not only the people who suffer but also dumb animals, especially those that have formed part of the family and have shared in some measure the love and protection of their owners.

The owners, too, feel bereft when a beloved pet animal is missing, and possibly dead, so it may be of comfort to someone to hear examples of continued contact where either one or both has crossed that mysterious borderline known as "death."

In these times of stress when great Masters on the other side are being aided by such splendid workers as Edith Ellis on this side, it might be possible to establish some sort of a Dumb Friends' Shelter where thoughts might be exchanged similar, but on a simpler scale, to the WHITE CROSS STATIONS which serve the human race.

To show that contact between dumb animals and their owners may be made after death, I wish to submit two well-authenticated cases which happened during and after the first World War, one of which recently added confirmation quite received.

Even Dogs Understand

To those who are not lovers (and understanders) of dumb animals, these records concerning the last two four-footed members of the Gower family in their Brinton Terrace Studios in Denver, Colorado, will, perhaps, seem incredible. First, there was the case of Don, a brown-and-white English setter whose master had fallen in the first World War, leaving his widow with their little baby in Denver. She found herself unable to keep their faithful dog so Mrs. Brady, manager of the "Dumb Friends' League Shelter (a saint if ever there were one), brought them to us.

I had founded the League in Denver upon the lines of the London one, of which I had been a secretary. Mrs. Brady felt that we were the only ones who should have Don as he would grieve in a family who did not understand the longing he still had for his departed master. Somewhat reluctantly I undertook the charge, knowing that a semi-private home in a highly motorized town was not the best place for a large dog.

As his weeping mistress and her baby departed, Don whimpered

miserably and was the picture of woe; all his world had crumbled until I took his head on my knee and said, "Look, Don, your master is here—here in this room! He wants you to be happy." As I spoke the involuntary words I seemed to feel a thrill and I am sure that Don had the same feeling for he raised his head and looked around eagerly, barked twice and contentedly laid his head again on my knee. Just then Dr. Gower came in and from that time on I never had a chance—Don was my husband's boon companion to the end of his life and for always, I am convinced.

"Which" and "Tother"

Soon after the silent compact had been made, Don disappeared through the open door and we feared perhaps he had not understood after all. We phoned the Shelter and got in touch also with his mistress but nothing had been seen or heard of the missing one. However, about tea time he came trotting in quite as though he had always lived with us. We were now his family . . . with the spirit of his first master's love mingling in.

Shortly after this two young twin cats were added to our family, lovely brown-and-gold, tortoiseshell angoras so alike that we could not tell which from "tother"; so that was what we named them: "Which" and "Tother." One of them fell victim to a passing car so we decided upon calling the live pussy "Which" . . . though she may have been "Tother" for all we knew. My daughter called her "Black-Noses" and Dr. Gower, who loved to feed her, called her "LITTLE Eats" (with a special accent on the first syllable). After one of her numerous families of miscellaneous kittens came she became partially paralyzed, but, since a competent veterinarian assured us that she would not suffer if properly cared for we kept her for three years. She went about after us like a little seal, her strong forelegs doing all but climbing stairs and the rest of her body with its

THE TEST OF ENDURANCE

WORLD PROBLEMS How To Solve Them

New Methods of Thinking, Living, Application

"Greater Problems Than These Shall Ye Be Called Upon To Work Out."

New problems are always the result of new conditions and new combinations of life and its affairs. As conditions and combinations are continually changing and are in a state of perpetual re-arrangement, it becomes necessary we adopt, as well as apply, methods of solution to fit the ever newly-occurring problems.

We cannot, perhaps, lay down any fast and set rule or method of procedure; but we must always bear in mind this one eternal fact, that there is but one law by which any and all circumstances and exigencies of life can and must be solved, and that that law is universal, and purely spiritual.

Universal Unrest

That means all problems of life and experience must be worked out from the standpoint of the universal to benefit the individual, and always from the spiritual in order to assist and improve the physical.

Never, under whatever name, creed or law they may be presented, shall world conditions be solved merely to satisfy some selfish, personal wish or ambition.

I am not referring to the needs of a worthy, sincere soul; always will the universal answer the call of the individual when there appears an individual need. We should at all times be desirous of finding a panacea for a world-wide disease . . . a universal unrest.

Let us not forget that all problems are a sure indication of, as well as incentive to, progress and advancement; and as we would presume it folly to use the same answer for all mathematical problems, so is it entirely absurd to apply the same ideas, conceptions and beliefs of a decade or more ago . . . to conditions as we find them today.

Therefore, if the old, antiquated ideas and methods do not produce the desired results, by all means let us adopt new and more modern agencies, both of hand and brain . . . new methods of thinking, new methods of living, new methods of application.

the useless, besmirched wine skins of the past?

Did the Masters of old alone hold the secret keys to the solution of our daily tasks, and possess the knowledge whereby they could remove mountains of difficulties? I do not think so.

No one ever knew of a secret but . . . you and I may not now possess it. All Masters lived and moved in the universal, and not in nor for the individual.

I am sure we are struggling with human problems today which would call for the best efforts of any soul that ever lived at any time. We do not need a new law, a new God, nor a new Christ; they remain forever the same; and because of their unchangeableness they alone can and will solve and dissolve all difficulties.

Idea of Oneness

WHY?

People, even friends, are continually asking me the following questions.

"Why do you devote so much of your time, means and strength to this work for the White Brotherhood by doing all this transcribing for Wilfred Brandon?"

They came to see that the first World War which had, with the industrial and motor accidents so congested their plane . . . had taught the nations and their rulers nothing.

A Teacher of Souls

Europe was planning another and more terrible war on a scale that would wreck civilization. The result was that ten thousand of the best of these souls with minds sensitive and powerful, banded together as the American White Brotherhood. Their main purpose to try by means of those in Earth life with psychic development or with sufficiently radio-active head glands to be developed, to get through to Americans a warning of the danger confronting them.

Wilfred Brandon's task was to find someone through whom he could write and who would co-operate in all ways to get his warning message in print. He is second in authority and seniority on that plane, having been killed in our Revolution in 1781. His sensitive mind enabled him to do the important work of Recording. For over half a century he has been a Teacher of souls as they arrived and helped them in their adjustment to Etheric life. For twenty-four years he has held his Masters degree.

No Vicarious Sacrifices

The Grand Master and Founder of the Order has been two centuries in the Etheric. A titled Englishman, he inherited large estates in Virginia. In the messages that Lincoln sent through and which recently appeared in the PSYCHIC OBSERVER, he said "Wilfred Brandon and Lord Fairfax are the finest on our plane—free from all bias—of all save the hope of helping humanity." This is the spirit that resides in all of Brandon's writings. Is it strange that I work for and with him gladly?

The Brandon books give us the knowledge with which to work out our own salvation and to help the world return to its path of progress. Are we Americans to take advantage of this knowledge or continue to drift? Is psychic phenomena the end as well as the beginning of our spiritual attainments? It would appear so.

Having had proof of survival the average spiritualist, like the orthodox Christian, would seem to take it for granted that Faith alone is sufficient to carry one through all the planes and accomplish one's successful evolution. So the Orth-

odox folk love to think that the suffering and martyrdom of the Nazarene was a vicarious sacrifice for their shortcomings, even sins, and by faith alone they expect to enter into glory after death.

In much the same way the Spiritualist, after establishing contact with the departed, rests there in the belief that his path after his body's death will be smoothed by others. Perhaps that once was true but the accelerated tempo and momentum of life on the Etheric is even greater than it is here in our world.

Something for Nothing is a hope that springs eternal in the human breast. No one gets what they do not earn on any plane of consciousness. Those who serve humanity in the etheric realm are now overwhelmed by the destruction of life that our civilization causes. We need not look to guardian angels, saints or a personal Deity to do the work of advancing us or even adjusting us.

Spiritually Ignorant

We have got to learn to help ourselves. Don't ask your "loved ones" to do all the work. If you love them, learn to help yourself. Cheer them on their way, those who have gone before us . . . do not be a drag on them.

The only power we shall have in the afterlife is our mental power. We have no right to use up the mental power of others in doing what we must begin to learn to do ourselves. Already overcrowded, millions of young and spiritually ignorant souls will be thrust out of their bodies in this war. They are spiritually ignorant for the most part. They will require every member of the White Brotherhood and other Orders as well as all lay helpers . . . for many of them are thrown off their mental balance by their experience in their last hours. The Earthbound will still be milling around unable to help themselves or anyone else.

It is up to us, here and now, to learn our lessons. The books of Wilfred Brandon clearly tell us what to do and how and why. Through him the White Brotherhood is trying to help You.

Learn to do your part in that state once called Heaven but which without our co-operation will eventually become the ancient "sheol" or "hell" of which the Bible speaks. It is our future home.

musical evenings with Dr. Gower at the Steinway playing his beautiful music . . . a Beethoven sonata, I believe, and the atmosphere was all harmony. During one of the intervals the Rev. Cosmo Lang, who bore a very close resemblance to the new Bishop of Canterbury, a relative, told an amusing story about some clergyman whose organist, being taken suddenly ill, had asked a friend who played mostly by ear if he could help in the emergency and produce a voluntary and perhaps a few hymns.

Cats Are Sensitive

The man consented but to his horror found he could recall one tune only upon which to improve the voluntary, viz., "There'll Be a Hot Time in the Old Town Tonight," the Spanish War theme song. During the ensuing laughter someone suggested that Dr. Gower try to see what he could have done in the same situation. Expertly he wove the music into a fugue and carried on through an intricate introit a hymn, an offertory, a wedding march, and was ending up with a funeral march, reminiscent of Chopin, when in came Miss Which, back arched, plumed tail waving, dancing a mad fandango to the solemn music as she chased a feather which had blown through the open window. Her joyous pirouette gave just the needed contrast to the funeral strains and made her the high comedy spot of the evening.

Some two years ago . . . at least twenty years after Which's small golden brown body had been placed under a rosebush in Mary Elitch Long's private garden surrounding her cottage at Elitch's Gardens, we heard from her again in my small studio apartment in New York City.

... Then It Happened

A few of us, including three members of the American Psychic Research Society, were sitting about my heavy octagonal oak table chatting, after having failed to get more than a few faint raps in response to our request for an alphabetical message from Dr. Gower who had passed on in 1922, and who had seen such wonderful things done by unseen powers with that same table during our residence in Brinton Terrace in Denver. I rose and went to the alcove where there was a book containing pictures of our old studies, some of ourselves and of our four-footed family, taken by a very dear friend at various intervals. As I was returning to

the table I said, "Let us put on the table the pictures of our little cat of which Dr. Gower was especially fond. It might help." Then I added (imitating the strong accent on the first syllable which my husband spoke on her name, "He used to call her *Little Eats*." Suddenly the table sprang at least three or four inches from the floor startling us all. The joyousness of the response had called upon the mingled effort of a tiny loving creature and the strength of a man who had never willingly injured anything or anybody. If I had also mentioned Don I feel the table might have gone still higher; but perhaps he was there anyway, doing his bit.

We'll Meet Them Again

For a long time before my husband's passing he had been ailing and very feeble. Many times round the block he walked with his cane and with Don in close attendance; and when the earthly part of their companionship was over Don seemed lost and took no interest in anything. Finally when he grew feeble we were strongly advised to have him put to sleep. Several times my son and I took him to the veterinarian to have this done, but each time we brought him back, sick at heart at the idea of what seemed like betraying him. However, at last when the painless ordeal was over and the world seemed that much emptier of love, he appeared at my bedside for a moment, his old happy self. He came from behind the screen at the foot of my couch, the screen before

which I had quite plainly seen my husband's face the night after his passing, and I seemed to know they were once more together.

My daughter was again studying in New York City when Don's time came and my son had returned to the very necessary severance of my early tie with "Little Eats" was made. Somehow I felt utterly alone and my grief was out of all proportion to that I had suffered in my greater losses. Perhaps it was that I had been taught to believe that we shall meet our human loved ones again, but I had never felt sure of so doing in the minor raggedies I had suffered all through my life in the loss of beloved animals.

Protect Your Beloved Pets

My first cat, Kitty Grey Taylor, when I was seven; my saddle pony, Don Pedro, after my father's death; my deer-hound, Ticket, while I was abroad in early married days . . . all bring tears to my eyes now when I remember my overwhelming grief; although I now have what to me is complete proof of their survival. It will be a much more beautiful and natural place in the Etheric lands we all must traverse if we can find our faithful four-footed friends trotting beside us and loving us.

Gradually I am learning to know that we can all make in our hearts our own little "Dumb Friends' League Shelters" where we can contact any beloved pet by calling its name and putting it lovingly in the hands of our Father of whom it is said even the fall of a sparrow is noted.

Perhaps the instances which I have given may help by showing that sometimes proof is forthcoming which may be taken to cover cases where faith alone should be sufficient.

Medium's Guild

How About It?

Would the mediums co-operate? Would it be practical?

During the last twenty years much of my time and effort have been devoted to psychic research work . . . for my own edification and for the benefit of members of an investigating group of which I am a member.

My intention and desire have not been to disprove psychic happenings. To the contrary, my hope has been to add verification to the reports of others . . . showing psychic manifestations are frequently observed under test circumstances and conditions.

Even though I have met with some exhibitions which were non-veridical and unconvincing in character, for the most part the results of my efforts would show there are a great many sensitives at whose seances one may consistently observe incontestably dependable phenomena of the highest evidential character.

It is unfortunate that so many psychic researchers expend their energies trying to disprove everything.

Unwilling to Admit

To such an extent is this a fact that many of our outstanding mediums refuse to longer be used as guinea pigs, since the most they may hope for, by submitting to these gruelling and unpleasant experiences, is a grudgingly admitted statement worded along these lines: "So far as could be observed the phenomena were probably genuine but before a definite and final opinion could be possible it would be necessary to conduct a series of tests, under more rigid control conditions and with several trained observers present."

It is NOT that the investigator is not himself convinced as much as it is a question of his being unwilling to admit this to others.

I feel very strongly that proof and more proof should be given the general public but it is seldom, if ever, that reports of investigating committees supply this proof. An admission stating the demonstration "appeared" to be bona fide but that it might possibly be explained by telepathy, mind reading or some unknown

power we may all possess, is not likely to convince anyone.

On the other hand, if there could be found some reliable and unbiased group willing to report; and publish what they witness in the way of psychic manifestations without offering their explanation thereof, then it would be possible for the individual reader to reach conclusions of his own by sitting with the accredited sensitives who have demonstrated their powers at these test seances.

Given a special test room and with all demonstrations carried on in the presence of a reliable committee of unprejudiced individuals, there would be no call for the use of ropes, adhesive tape, wire and such similar things.

A Real Service

If after reasonable precautionary measures have been taken, one's ability to observe is so poor as to require the use of these barbarous methods, then that one is not fit or qualified to be called a researcher.

Once a medium had definitely proved his or her ability, then the names of those who had satisfied the committee could be recorded and when some interested person wished to attend a seance, public or private, it should be possible to ascertain from headquarters whether that medium had been tested and what conclusions the committee had reached as to ability of the worker.

In this way, much disappointment (Continued on Page 9, Col. 3)

Must it be something secret, something mysterious and unknown? Surely, because so few people seem to realize this prize as even a possibility, let alone themselves to search for it.

There can be only one thing in life worth having, and that is reality ... truth. There can be only one life worth living, and that the real life. There can be only one peace and security that endures, a peace and security so profound that nothing can uproot it. This reality, this truth, this life, is of a certainty the one prize, the greatest gift life has to offer.

Famous Mediums

By W. H. EVANS

IV.—FLORENCE COOK
(1856-1904)

To most spiritualists Florence Cook is known as the materializing Medium with whom Sir William Crookes held a number of successful seances.

Miss Cook had seen spirits in her childhood, but her accounts were put down to an over-active imagination. When fifteen years of age she was at a party where table turning was suggested, but she took no part in it.

Afterwards, with her mother's permission, she sat with some friends. Many strange things happened. The table became 'alive,' and she was levitated. After this she and her mother decided to sit at home. There they received a message in mirror-writing, which told them to go to a certain bookseller, who would be able to tell them about the Dalston Association, where a meeting was to be held, where she would meet the editor of *The Spiritualist*.

For some time, she attended the Dalston Association giving seances but the manifestations became so embarrassing that they ceased to attend there for public sittings. She sat a few times with *Herne and Williams*. Mrs. Cook decided that the sittings should be continued at their home.

John King ... the Buccaneer

It was then that a new personality manifested, calling herself *Katie King*, the daughter of *John King*, who manifested through other Mediums, notably with *Cecil Husk*. *John King* claimed to be *Henry Owen Morgan*, the buccaner.

Katie King's first materializations were incomplete, the face being a mask and hollow at the back. But she soon manifested in complete form. There was some resemblance to the Medium, as is often the case in the early efforts of spirits to materialize, but Sir William Crookes, in his *Researches into the Phenomena of Spiritualism*, gives many details of the differences between *Katie King* and her Medium. He also saw both Medium and spirit together.

In a seance held on December 9, 1873, when the *Countess of Caithness* and *Count de Pomar* were present, *W. Volckman*, becoming suspicious, seized the form. A struggle ensued, and, according to *Henry Dumphy*, a barrister, the spirit-form appeared to lose her feet, and sliding like an eel slipped out of Mr. Volckman's grasp, leaving no trace of any corporeal substance. Miss Cook was found in the cabinet dressed in black and fastened to her chair, with tape tied tightly around her waist, the knot sealed with the signet of the Earl of Caithness.

Subsequent search failed to reveal any white material upon her. The shock made her very ill. Sir William Crookes came forward in

her defense. At a later sitting with her he recorded that when walking arm in arm with *Katie King* about the room, "The temptation to repeat a recent celebrated experiment became almost irresistible."

Feeling, however, that if I had not a spirit I had, at all events a lady close to me, I asked permission to clasp her in my arms, so as to be able to verify the interesting observations which a bold experimenter had recently somewhat verbosely recorded.

Permission was graciously given, and I accordingly did ... well as any gentleman would do under

the circumstances. Mr. Volckman will be pleased to know that I can corroborate his statement that the spirit (not struggling, however) was as material as Miss Cook herself."

On May 24, 1874, Sir William Crookes witnessed the farewell between Miss Cook and *Katie King*. *Katie* had promised only to be with her for three years, and the time was now come when they were to part. Fully materialized, *Katie* awoke her Medium and they talked together. Miss Cook was in tears, and the farewell was a sad one. An account of this is given in Sir William's book already mentioned.

Another spirit, named *Marie*, took the place of *Katie King* and materialized many times.

Mrs. *Elgie Corner*, as she was named later, passed to the higher life in April, 1904. Sir William Crookes spoke very highly of the value of her mediumship.

Try the Spirits

Do We Choose Our Bodies ... Before We Are Born?

A "DEAD" MAN SUPPLIES THE ANSWER TO THIS QUESTION

These questions and spirit answers cover the whole gamut of Spiritualism's relationship to all departments of human thought.

The questions were asked at seances held three times a week, through the mediumship of MRS. J. CONANT, of Boston.

It is claimed that the REV. THEODORE PARKER, THOMAS PAINE, PROFESSOR ROBERT HARE and SIR HUMPHREY DAVY were among the band of spirits who gave these answers.

Is it your opinion that the spirit has power to choose the form through which it shall manifest?

I do not think so. Indeed, all past experiences prove to the contrary. Then there is a law still surrounding the spirit which causes it to take the form through which it manifests.

The spirit, as a whole, is a law unto itself. But each one of the individualized particles composing the Great Spirit is amenable to the law of all the rest. It can go so far but no further.

Will each individual soul come to a knowledge of a prior existence?

There are millions of souls in the spirit world who have no knowledge of having had an existence prior to the one they passed through in earthly life. These seem to be the rule, but there seems to be very many exceptions to the rule.

I am not prepared to say, for I have formed no definite opinion upon the subject, whether all souls will finally become possessed of this knowledge or remembrance of a former life.

I know that there are circumstances which, if they act upon the soul, will call up that memory; but whether they will ever act or no, I cannot say.

Is the individualized human spirit a result of acting natural and spiritual forces incident to the human physical form, perfected to an individual conscious existence beyond the reach of decomposition and decay? Or is the human physical form a result of a pre-existent spirit entity?

I believe that the spirit claims a life anterior to the body. I do not believe that the spirit is an outgrowth of the body. On the contrary, I believe that the body is an outgrowth of the spirit. The spirit is distinct, and comes up through an infinite number of de-

grees of material life.

It passes through the different degrees, and manifests itself according to the degree in which it lives. Human life manifests as human life, vegetable life as vegetable life, mineral life as mineral life, and so on through an almost infinite number of degrees.

I believe it is one great spirit, after all, one infinite ocean of life, acting through all forms, and manifesting according to the nature of the form in which it exists.

What is the medium of exchange in the spirit world? Or what is used there as our money is here?

Merit—that which belongs to the inner life. There is no special medium of exchange that is equivalent to gold or silver in our life. You may be very sure of that. But there is a medium of exchange.

If I have what I do not need, and my neighbor has need of it, I pass it to him. If he has what I need, he passes it to me.

There is a perpetual interchange of good things of spirit life. None can retain any more than they have need of. It is a very hard place for misers, particularly before they get rid of their miserly propensities.

How long does one sleep after passing?

The period of the time con-

sumed in that way depends upon the necessity. If there is need for a long rest, you may be sure that the need will be supplied; the long rest will come.

Are they conscious of any lapse of time during that rest?

Yes.

Are we then, to understand that there is time there?

Not the time that is understood here with you, but a lapse of conditions, experiences, periods. Of course, we do not reckon time by the revolution of the planets, as you do, or by the passing of day and night. It is not divided into years, months, weeks, days, hours, minutes, etc.

Still, is it capable of measurement?

Yes.

Do not spirits understand our time here? Can they not reckon it as well as we do?

Certainly they do. It is called the earth time.

Is Spiritualism, as a religion, to supplant Christianity?

Spiritualism, as a religion, I believe, is to supplant Christianity. The era of the Christian religion is passing away, changing. It will lose nothing of its life, nothing of that which the world of mind has need of; but it will part with its dross, and become absorbed in the newer and more perfect.

Is there any such thing as being translated, as is recorded of Elijah, that he never tasted death?

No, I do not understand it. The ignorance that surrounded the common people of that day gave rise to such a story. The priests, the heads of the Church, knew better, even then.

Some spirits, it is said, after the lapse of years in spirit life, still insist that they are in earth life. What can be the cause?

They insist that they are simply because they are here. Your friends having passed through "death," does not of necessity pass out of the earth's atmosphere, or away even from the earthly dwelling. It is unwise to determine that your spirit friends are absent from you because your external senses cannot take cognizance of them.

What is the spirit that prompts us to prayer?

I believe that we are acted upon constantly by the great infinite spirit of Nature. When we feel in our souls that rising up that spirit of prayer which would cause us to leave our darkness and enter light, then it is, I believe, that the spirit of infinite goodness sheds holy dew upon us. We rise by temptation. We are tempted to leave the past perpetually.

The soul feels that there is a better state of existence, and that it is an heir to that better state. It reaches out clairvoyantly and perceives the future. Being dissatisfied with the present, because of the future, it holds up its hands in prayer to the Great Infinite Spirit, and thus comes near to that spirit.

Let Faith ... Abide

Vision and Faith Will Carry You Through.

By ROSE ANN ERICSON

A great number of my acquaintances, knowing my interest in Spiritualism, have confessed to me their own intimate experiences of a psychic nature. In this way I have discovered that the phenomena of clairvoyance and clairaudience are surprisingly general. The psychic faculties involved have either opened spontaneously or responded very rapidly to efforts at development. Psychic impressions popularly known as "hunches" are of almost universal occurrence. Often they have the clearness of actual clairvoyance or clairaudience.

It is probably the commonest phase of mediumship, and most psychics are frank to state the fact when they speak from "impression." Much so-called "inspirational" speaking or writing is strictly impressionistic. Such a splendid word as "inspiration" should be reserved for the more transcendent phases of the phenomenon.

All persons who have the quality of saintliness exhibit the phenomenon of "impression" in a marked degree. The "Guidance" is attributed to the "Holy Spirit," or to the "Lord," or directly to "God." But the psychical aspect is definite. After all, the spirit world is filled with His ministers, and it is always a sacred mission that brings our beloved to us.

Grief Can Be Avoided

The power of mediumship is a wonderful gift and how inspiring it is to be a Spiritualist and to believe in the continuity of life. Don't be afraid to say you are a Spiritualist. On the contrary be proud of your enlightenment. Show it from the hilltops.

Dream your dreams and see your visions. Picture your good knowing that you draw forth, from the inexhaustible resources, just what your faith demands.

Vision and faith will carry

you through every sea of despair, every mountain of difficulty. Ask with faith and believe.

Let faith abide in every heart. God is all. There is no place where He is not. We are waves coursing on the bosom of the Infinite Ocean. No soul ever loses consciousness of itself, nor is ever lost to the consciousness of God.

Life cannot be extinguished. The form may change but not the spirit. It returns to its home, somewhere in the Infinite Ocean, but possesses the power to emerge again in form, in the place and manner its will and unfoldment shall decree. 
"There is nothing psychical or occult about this aura," he said to a reporter. "It is purely physical fact."

MEDIUM'S GUILD

(Continued from Page 4, Col. 5)

ment and heartache could be avoided. Our present so-called Research Societies refuse to recommend any mediums. Whereas such a committee as we are considering would gladly advise as to their findings at any tests conducted under their supervision.

These advices would, of necessity, be of a disinterested type so far as concerned the conclusions arrived at by the committee. That is, if a demonstrator failed to convince as to ability this should be recorded just as would be the fact that the operator HAD convinced the committee favorably.

Any favorable announcements must cover ONLY the phases of mediumship witnessed by the committee. One who might be an excellent clairvoyant might not be a competent trumpet medium; and still advertise independent voice sciences.

Where a psychic had not been tested, the committee should so state and not offer suggestions as to the ability of those interested, regardless of any reported reputation such individuals may enjoy.

The reputable, honest mediums, which means the majority, would welcome such a clearing-house; whereas those of dubious ability or character would be the only ones to object.

A Vital Need

It might be possible for members of this committee to visit the Spiritualist camps and conduct tests; and by arranging for an annual or even semi-annual convention of mediums, not only would it be possible to examine the work of large numbers of these instruments but much good would result from the getting together of the workers.

There is a vital need for a non-partisan society of mediums; no other group could help to stamp out undeveloped claimants to psychic ability as would the members of a mediums' Guild. In fairness to themselves and for their own protection this would be true.

It is only in comparatively recent years medicine and law were organized to the point where their practitioners were obliged to pass certain standardized examinations to be permitted to call themselves

and practice under the name of medical doctor or lawyer; and the individuals who did most to see to it that these laws were enforced were the legitimate physicians and lawyers themselves. Again it was a matter of self-protection.

Needless to say the first requisite for such Guild membership would be to successfully pass tests before the committee already referred to. Furthermore, just as there are physicians who specialize in certain branches of their work, there would be specialists in the Guild.

If the proposition were correctly handled then a Guild certificate would be worth having and the holder thereof would find a ready welcome wherever he went, quite apart from any other association membership he might enjoy. The main idea of the Guild should not be to make money.

Any charge made for tests and certificates would be but sufficient to cover expenses. This Guild would not interfere in any way with existing associations and societies any more than does certification of the physician by a Board interfere with the many medical societies and associations.

To say that proof of survival is no longer necessary is true only as it applies to those already convinced. Each one of us had to be convinced at one time and this conviction was only brought about through proof as furnished by the mediums.

Many are interested in what Spiritualism has to offer; many additional people would be equally as interested if they had any certain means of contacting absolutely dependable mediums. When I say dependable I mean psychics who have demonstrated their ability conclusively. When we can furnish such credentials for our psychics then, and only then, may we expect to reach our full growth.

It would be most interesting to hear what others think of all this. Why not write the editor and give your views?

The Proper Attitude

KING SOLOMON said, "Give me understanding, dear God, and I shall do Thy will."

The greatest foe of humanity is ignorance. All other vices known to mankind, including superstition and persecution, are the offsprings of ignorance. The antithesis of ignorance is knowledge; that is, understanding.

In approaching the truth of communication with the spirit world through any seance room, it will be very helpful if we realize and remember that there are some subjects in the universe which we do not fully understand. With this realization, and an open mind and heart, we may succeed in getting closer to the subject.

There are always two ways of doing anything, the right way and the wrong way. In order that we may do things the right way, knowledge of the particular rules governing them is essential.

Avoid Misconception

We know that to plunge into the subject of communication without a consideration of conditions which govern its phenomena might result in a misconception of the truth of the connection between earth life and spirit life. We must remember that in everything that is done there are governing conditions.

In order to convey our point to the earnest seeker it may help if we cite a few examples.

A chemist, in order to produce a certain definite compound, is required to mix definite amounts of certain elements, as prescribed by the laws of chemistry. Any deviation from the rules prescribed by these laws results in failure.

If we desire to establish telephonic communication, it is necessary for us to comply with certain definite rules and requirements before the lines are opened. The fact that the instrument and the facilities of telephonic engineering are there, will not help us

communicate, if we do not follow these necessary rules.

The musician requires not only a knowledge of music, but a means of expressing that musical conception. There must be the instrument. There must be sufficient harmony of condition to make possible the production of the music.

Any tradesman requires his tools. He might be able to produce very creditable results with inefficient tools, but he can do nothing unless he has tools of some description and materials upon which to work.

The lawyer must be in a position to consult his law library. He has not memorized every word and every paragraph and every page in the hundreds of volumes that are at his service. He has mastered certain principles of law, but each year new statutes are being written into books, and there are certain legal facts that he may not be called upon to discuss once a year. His books are his tools.

Proper Conditions Necessary

Suppose you wish to write a letter. Before you can write, you must have the material. You must have a place in which to write it. You cannot write until certain conditions have been met.

A surgeon may be able to perform a remarkable operation, but he must comply with certain conditions before that operation is possible. There are details that must be attended to. He needs certain instruments and certain accessories. While he may operate under the crudest and most adverse conditions, he still requires definite fundamentals before he can operate.

So it is with everything we may do. We must have conditions that are conducive to the result we wish

to produce.

Of course the blacksmith is not qualified to go into the shop of the watchmaker and tell him what he needs in order to make or repair a fine watch.

Nor is the shoemaker in position to go into the office of a physician and tell him what remedies he should have on his shelf or what reference books he should have in his library.

The farmer would not expect to go into the scientific laboratory and explain to the professor that he would be convinced of the reality of the experiment only when he had named the material and the equipment to be used.

Pseudo Investigators

The coal miner through his experience could claim no right to go into a studio and dictate to the artist how he should paint his picture or chisel his marble.

All these are simple truths that you will readily recognize. We knew, first, that no matter what is done, must be done in accordance with certain fundamental conditions, and second, that our experience qualifies us to dictate terms only relative to those things which pertain to our own capacity.

The individual who says that he is going to make his own law governing the receipt of messages from the spirit world, is doing what he would not attempt to do if he inquired into any other subject. "Investigators" who do this naturally secure little evidence of a convincing nature relative to spirit communication.

Bring Affection and Love

When a person goes to a photographer and asks the photographer to make a portrait of him, it is naturally necessary for him, if he wants a good portrait, to bring his face along plus a pleasant expression. Without it the photographer could not make a masterpiece.

There are some things also that many people forget to bring with them when they come to a seance room for spirit communication. They forget their hearts and their souls, and they leave their good faith outside, and yet when they come in, expect wonders.

Many people will ask "What it is necessary for me to do in order that desirable conditions for communication should be established in the seance room?"

The answer is simply this: Bring your heart and soul with you. Bring affection and love for those with whom you may wish to communicate. Be fair and honest with yourself, the medium, and the forces. Try to be at least as reasonable as with any other subject or problem in life. Be sincere, and come in good faith. These are the essential requirements. If you have a reliable Medium of unques-
