

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Spiritual and psychical development oftimes come in a great flash. Mediumship, in my case, has been very spasmodic. So many students become weary and give up in despair.

Now back to the year 1928. At that time I became seriously ill. I weighed 102 pounds as compared to my present weight of 145. Several doctors had treated me but I became worse instead of showing any signs of improve-

Finally a friend suggested that I go to Burleson Sanatorium at Grand Rapids, Michigan. At that time this institution occupied the top floor of the Morton Hotel.

I arrived at this sanitorium early in the morning. An examination was made. Though apprehensive as to the outcome the doctors set four o'clock for my operation.

Weak and weary from my overnight train journey. I went to bed! where I remained asleep until the nurse came to awaken and prepare me for the operation.

While under the anaesthetic, in my opinion. I made, what, in psychic science is called a soul flight. I visited a beautiful place. Many children and some grown men were present.

Under An Anaesthetic

One man addressed me. In part he told me that I had wasted my life up to this time. It was decided, however, that I should be given another chance to make good. I was told that, before I was born, I had promised to fulfill a mission. And that I must learn about God . . . God's power in relation to man.

This same man then proceeded to show me how the earth plane was regulated from above by. what appeared to me to be, just ordinary men.



Although procuring a number of different shades only three primary colors have ever been used: red. blue and vellow.

Unskilled Hand Controlled

By the year 1932, over twelve hundred of these pictures were drawn and no two of the same design or coloring. In drawing the pictures, the backgrounds are always made upon the white paper (or cardboard) before the design light tingling sensation running up to grow from a central "inner eye," or small circle. If you will observe the unusual texture-effect of the work, you will understand that no unskilled artist, such as I. is handling the work. The drawings are entirely free-hand: no compass or ruler being used and the method is very unique.

When the picture is finished, the pencil is laid flat on the paper, the wooden portion being rolled most vigorously and repeatedly all over the entire surface, producing a peculiar hardness which is like polish. A remarkable thing about this is that the pictures seldom blur or smudge by handling. Some of the designs have been thought by critics to embody a blending of the early Chinese and Egyptian coloring. Again, others find a suggestion of Arabic or Persian influence. In any event, it is s .75 an unusual exhibition of the power of spirit to control automatically. an unskilled hand.

Not Conceited

It is impossible to state definitely the exact time required for the completion of each picture. Often more time is required for the more simple designs than the difficult ones. I would say that less than four hours (more or less) is required for an average picture. At no time am I in any sort of trance condition, but am able to leave my work and return to it later, when the "electrical-connection" is resumed as readily as one takes up an interrupted telephone communication.

"SKIPPER" WOLF'S STORY
