I have been in communication and in contact with most of my dear ones who have passed on. From them I have received absolite and final proofs of their con-

tinued posthumous existence. In particular I have received from my father, since he passed on in 1930, overwhelming evidence not only of his own continued existence but of his continued interest in the welfare of his family and his care and love for each and all of us.

There is no doubt, question or argument about it . . . my father still lives on, in another sphere of existence, the same lovable individual as before, the same splendid father I was privileged to have on earth.

Fully Aware

He no longer has a physical body in our temporal world . . . he is free to enter the spirit realm. where he now exists at a different rate of vibration than when here on earth. But he is just as real and just as alive now as he ever was here, only he is able to function on much wider spiritual planes.

I must, however, stress the fact that my father only sends advice when the urgency of the matter at issue really warrants it. He realizes very well that too much advice and information from those on the Other Side can be injurious to the recipient on earth. for if I. for instance, were always in the habit of turning to my father for guidance in every difficulty in life. I should lose my own powers of initiative and of decisive action.

Make Own Decisions

One of the primary reasons of temporal existence is that we may learn from the experiences and difficulties of life to develop our own characters in the face of adversities. My father realizes, as I do. that one of the most important lesons which we should acquire in the school of earthly life would be obviated if we were to become incapable of making our own decisions and taking our own initiative by too frequent recourse to

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

The Dawn of **The Golden Age** May It Be A World Reborn

RELIGIOUS FERVOR REVIVED

This present world civilization has plenty of reason to look forward to 1946, and will have many more reasons for remembering it as the beginning of the present Age.

Writers on economical, political and religious subjects, seem to agree on 1946-47 as the years during which this present World Conflict will end.

This is not prophecy; it is forecast based on things present and known. Aside from that, the cycles of time are marked by significant events. In Leviticus 25:8 and 10 we read: "And thou shalt number seven sabbaths of YEARS unto thee, seven times seven years; and the space of the seven sabbaths of years shall be unto thee forty and nine years. . . And shall hallow the FIFTIETH year and proclaim liberty throughout the land unto all the inhabitants thereof; and it shall be a Jubilee unto you."

The 49-year period ends in 1945. The Jubilee year is 1946. Our history; both sacred and profane; dates from 4004 B.C. By 50-year stages of history there is marked on a like schedule, the birth of Jesus, the Christ in 4 B.C. Following on with the same schedule, the Jubilee year falls in 1946.

New Spiritual Cycle

On October 30th, 1940, while sitting with my co-worker, Edna Davis of Haddon Heights, N. J., and using the Ouija, I asked the communicating entity this question: "Different classes of writers, and others, in science and history tell us we are at the turning of a cycle in world affairs, or, what might be called the end of the age. Can you tell us anything about this?" (Note-The "Second Coming" of Christ was not mentioned.)

man, returning."

The conditions forecast in the Bible, that "every eye shall see Him" do not seem to be agreeable with the condition of a reincarnation of the spirit of the universal Christ principle in any one individual. What is more likely to be the condition is that there will be a universal consciousness of this Christ principle, which would have to be the condition if He is to be universally seen.

Aside from the conditions just cited, it surely would not be inconsistent with the philosophy of Spiritualism . . . and especially among those who believe in Reincarnation . . . to believe that there CAN be a reincarnation of the spirit of a person who lived like Jesus. What will happen is, that some man; probably now living; will be definitely 'anointed' so that he will be a world figure in Religious connections.

Religious Awakening

But what about this Golden Age? It will not come with a burst of splendor. The Christ . . . when He does come . . . will come silently, and any suddenness will be in the abrupt universal realization of a Cosmic Mind functioning in an individual.

It will be recalled that a great revival of Religion broke out in Wales under the leadership of Evan Roberts. not long after the war with Spain, in 1898. This revival spread all over the world which suddenly began to realize the great need of a new view of the God principle.

There was a revival of religious fervor after the World War I. With the increase of knowledge of the occult due to the Spiritualist Movement, the psychic manifestations, the utterances and writings of men high up in the church, it is a safe forecast that a religious awakening will take place after this present war.

Significant Trend

There will be such a wave of spiritual enlightenment that the denominational lines of belief and doctrine, will be caused to pass into the discard, and the whole of Christendom will become one flock and the kingdoms of this world will became universal.

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



Dr. Bigelow first met Dr. Andrew Jackson Davis, in 1888. after which they became close friends.

At the transition of Dr. Davis. many of his personal belongings were presented to Dr. Bigelow by Mrs. Davis, which he still has in his possession including the chair. known as "old hickory," which was presented to Dr. Davis by his name sake General Andrew Jackson.

Dr. Bigelow was also a close friend of Harrison D. Barrett whose home was in Canaan, Maine, ten miles from Skowhegan.

During the past sixty-nine years, Dr. Bigelow has followed the practice of a magnetic healer, with some success, accomplishing cures which have earned for him praise

An Interpretation COMMONWEALTH OF HEAVEN IN OUR MIDST

Upon his disciple band in that pre-Ascension period, their thoughts intent upon a semi-political and religious issue with its usual economic aspects, our Lord sought to lay the emphasis upon the necessity of spiritual power. "Lord, wilt Thou at this time restore the Kingdom to Israel?" (Acts 1:6) they enquired. "It is not for you to know the times or the seasons which the Father has kept in his own hand. But ye shall receive the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon you and ye shall be my witnesses," was his reply.

Many times in those post-resurrection days He stressed the issue, insisting on their remaining in Jerusalem until they had a very definite experience. He succeeded in tying the One Hundred and Twenty up to the holy city till the feast of Pentecost, and, because of very necessity, for they were poor folk away from home, to the upper room of the unknown friend of Jesus, to partake in large measure of his hospitality. Thus did Jesus safeguard their movements and conduct, so necessary for realization of what He undoubtedly had in mind.

So they tarried, these men and women, who by various cords had become bound up with Him. "These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication with the women, with Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren. "It was a long religious service with frequent intermissions for food and sleep. In harmony of thought, with a common love for their Lord, sustained by one purpose and looking to the one end, they waited in expectation for the fulfillment of the promise.

Conditions For Psychic

Phenomena

The conditions for presentation of psychical phenomena were hourly perfected; there was melody through sacred song and gradual approximation in feeling and expectation to what constitutes a perfect "circle" for the realization of the super-normal. Hence the phenomena which occurred in the early hours of the day of Pentecost, as described in the second chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, phenomena styled everywhere in the New Testament the Baptism of the Holy Spirit or the enducement with power from on high. That the phenomena were of a supernormal nature was conditioned upon the unusually gifted members of that company and upon their consistently following a course now known as the technique for securing such. Never Understood by the Church

The actual occurrence has never been understood by the Church. Many of our greatest recent authorities doubt the genuineness of the phenomena as related by the

Yet, why doubt such phenomena? They are most familiar to those acquainted with psychical studies. The writer, for instance, sat with a medium in a religious gathering in Seattle, and in the brightness of the electrically lighted hall heard her converse in German with a woman from the audience who recognized in the voice issuing from the medium's throat that of her dead brother-inlaw. The medium had no knowledge of German whatever. But why give space to proving what is so widely known?

This, that Peter described as the fulfillment of the prophecy through Joel (which in New Testament language, is described as a Baptism of The Holy Ghost), is established as a wonderful manifestation of primitive trance speaking under control of spirit presences of an exalted order; for that was guaranteed by the character of the members of the waiting group and by their high questing.

The reaction to the experience in Peter illustrates the nature of the enduement. Deep spiritual insight is displayed in his address, wherein he explains to the perplexed gathering the nature and meaning of the happening. Dr. C. A. Anderson Scott sees in the experience a wonderful invigoration of the whole personality equivalent to a vitalizing of dormant personalities in feeling and mensality. The disciples were realizing the life more abundant.

Speaking in Tongues

We cannot but enquire: What occurrences may we expect in our day in those groups where spiritual power is sought to be released? The answer undoubtedly is: Results depend upon the gifts possessed, potentially or developed, in those constituting the circle. and upon their expectations, aims, and perseverance.

On a later occasion (as described in Acts 4:31) the place was shaken where the disciples were gathered. To the company assembled in Cornelius' home the phenomena of speaking in "tongues" was experienced (Acts 1:46). In Corinth, such phenomena were brought into discredit as practically valueless (1 Cor. 12 and 14), since without the presence of trance mediums, it was produced mainly by suggestion through imitation because of the desire for the gift and was not always genuine.

perience may be genuine, and occasionally is attended with an actual communication in a language unknown to the speaker.

In Spiritual churches, there is much such inspirational speaking sometimes by an entranced medium, gifted psychically, when his voice organs are used by an informed and qualified presence. Thus are their congregations instructed when otherwise they would only be entertained, by the medium, who though psychically gifted is often ignorant and poorly qualified to address an audience.

The message may also come through a voice issuing from a trumpet as an amplifier where a thorax has been materialized, or direct from the materialized thorax of a communicating spirit. A fully materialized form is often engaged in conversation with the sitters, when such forms have been photographed both by a camera and also by an infra-red-ray apparatus.

Economic Problems

It would not be right to limit such phenomena. It seems best to take what comes, and that thankfully. Those on the other side will manifest as they may. However. it is always well and best to seek the highest. Put the proceed-

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FREDERICK G. LIEB'S BOOK . . . Healing Body, Mind & Purse"

"Physicians are coming more and more to the recognition that the mental attitude of their patients is one of the most important factors in their recovery." This is the opening sentence in Mr. Lieb's latest book, and it sounds, perhaps, the keynote of the entire work; for the author, a former sports writer and lifelong student of metaphysics, Christian Science, and occultism who has cured himself of a number of complicated ailments by metaphysical means, discusses in detail the various types of mental and spiritual cures possible, and stresses the part right thinking and right meditating play in effecting such cures of mind, body, and purse.

It is the belief of the author that as most human diseases are caused by wrong thinking they may likewise be cured by removing the cause and substituting right thinking in its place. In a comprehensive and common-sense manner Mr. Lieb explains what auto-suggestion, mental gland stimulation, meditation, and scientific prayer can do for anyone who is taken sick; and he quotes many true stories of such metaphysical cures to prove his points.

The Keynote

With the Christian Scientists and the Hindu Yogis Mr. Lieb believes that it is possible for every individual to "tune in" on that great Cosmic Energy and let that Force, the "God Force" as he and Dr. Frank B. Robi son of "Psychiana" fame call it, permeate every cell of your being, raising the vibrations and thereby correcting any diseased or abnormal condition. "Faith that you can be healed is the keynote" he insists, and many Spiritualis's and other students of the Higher Teachings will agree with him in this.

This book is based more or less on familiar Christian Science and metaphysical principles: and yet it states these teachings in a simple and sensible manner, readily understandable by everyone. The author makes a number of positive suggestions for meditation and prayer, and even suggests a few simple Hatha Yoga breathing exercises to help out. "Cling steadfast to the spiritual time, no matter how hard we try truth that you can arise above any or what methods we employ. This physical discomfort and conquer basic fact is the cause for many it by your own God power to think health, health, health into all your organs, tissues, nerves, and cells," he goes on. "Lifting the consciousness into this higher realm is the very thing that souls

come to earth to learn. . . No religion, no denomination, no sect, has any monopoly on spiritual healing.'

This book states the entire case for spiritual and mental healing in a very concise and convincing manner. It covers a great deal of territory, and even makes a few excursions into such subjects as Theosophy, Reincarnation, Karma, Yoga, glandular rejuvenation, faith healing, material prosperity, the Second World War, philosophy, and Spiritualism: and in all these matters the author shows a profound grasp and understanding of their significance in relation to right living today. It is a book which will appeal to both beginners and advanced students of "the hidden side of things."

Reincarnation and Karma

To me the most satisfying and convincing chapter was the one devoted to "Spiritual Healing," which alone would be worth the price of the book. The least convincing chapter, in my estimation, is the one dealing with the knotty problem of "Healing the Purse" in these hard times. Metaphysicians in general are apt to go a little "haywire" in this direction and assure us that all we need to do to make a million dollars is to visualize it hard enough!

Mr. Lieb does not make any such foolish statement as that; but rather attempts to handle the question in his usual same and sensible way. "One cannot think prosperity or abundance for thirty minutes of the day and expect it to counteract the effects of sixteen hours of worrisome fretting," he remarks very truly; and proceeds to suggest a program for demonstrating wealth according to the latest metaphysical means.

As a student of the Ancient Wisdom I was particularly interested to see that Mr. Lieb recognizes the part Reincarnation and Karma play in all spiritual and superphysical cures and demonstrations. In many cases we bring the tendency to some diseases or difficulty from a former incarnation, and because of some Karmie debt, we may not be able to "pay off" or completely overcome this trouble during our present lifefailures to effect a complete cure: and it is overlooked by many practicing metaphysicians today. But even in such instances Mr. Lieb believes that right thinking and right praying will help . . . which

is undoubtedly true.

The author recognizes also the importance of medicine and medical doctors, and does not hesi'ate to advise anyone with any stubborn complaint to seek relief by any system of healing. This again is a broad and generous attitude. His chapter devoted to the subject of ductless glands is very good; but I regret that he did not see fit to include some mention of vitamins and minerals as factors of health.

All in all this is a well-balanced, comprehensive, and satisfying book on a very important subject. Spiritualists will indorse the suggestion made in connection with "Spiritual Healing" that many of these miraculous cures, at Lourdes and elsewhere, are really brought about by the intervention of kindly spirit doctors and spirit healers, who are attracted to such localities by the prayers and thoughts of the visitors and monks and nuns in attendance. This is an interesting admission for a metaphysician to make; and it goes, along with many other similar thoughts, to show how well Mr. Lieb knows his subject. I recommend this book most heartily.

For the Young ... VII. First Visit To A Seance

It is essential that children should know the FACTS revealed by Spiritualism. This fascinating series is admirably suited for that purpose. The author has been a teacher all his adult life and is a Spiritualist of many years' standing.

I have told you how spirit friends come back and show themselves at public meetings. Now I am going to tell you all about how they come to our private meetings, in our own homes. Such meetings are quite different from those which are public, and they are called "home circles." I think you will be interested to hear about the first such "circle" I attended.

It was a long time ago, when I was beginning to see that there was some truth in what my friends had been telling me . . . the things I have been telling you. One day, my friend, Mr. What's-hisname, called at my house to see me. As soon as he had taken off his hat and sat down, he astonished me by saying, 'Mr. So-andso, I have an invitation for you from Brown Owl.

"From whom, did you say?" said I, rather bewildered, and thinking I could not have heard aright.

"From Brown Owl," he repeated.

"Who on earth is Brown Owl?" I exclaimed. "It sounds like the name of a Red Indian."

Curiosity Aroused

"It is the name of a Red Indian," replied Mr. What's-his-name, "and he says I am to take you along to our circle tomorrow night."

Now I began to understand. I had heard him talk of someone he spoke of as the "control" of Mrs. You-know-who, a friend of us both, who, he said, was a medium at their "home circle." Naturally, I was very anxious to go along and see what this mysterious business was all about, and I eagerly accepted the invitation.

"Seven o'clock, at my house,' said my friend, "and don't you be late. It isn't polite to the spirit friends to keep them waiting."

Promptly at seven o'clock I was on my friend's doorstep. full of curiosity, and, I must confess, a

I was told, was set aside for the purpose of these meetings of the 'circle."

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The chairs were arranged in a sort of circle, and there was a gramophone near one of the chairs, with a little table close by, on which were some records. The windows were closely curtained, so that no daylight could get in, and the electric light switches were near where one of the "sitters," as they called themselves, was to sit. I was told afterwards that each member of the circle had his or her particular seat, and that they always occupied the same places.

I had already understood that it was necessary to be punctual, and my friend told me that it was just as important to be regular. It would not be of any use to be absent every now and then, or the spirit friends would find it impossible to work with us. But the most important thing of all is, that there must be complete agree. ment and love between the members. If there were to be the slightest unpleasantness between any of them, even in their minds, the circle would be a failure!

The ladies and gentlemen sat al. ternately; first a lady, then a gentleman, and so on. Then the leader of the circle spoke to us. He asked us to sit in silence for a few moments, sending out healing thoughts to those who were sick, and inviting the good spirit friends to come to our meeting. Then we joined in quiet and reverent prayer, and sang a hymn. Next we joined hands, and waited while the gramophone played a soft and sweet piece of music.

Advice from Medium

"All ready?" said the leader, and then a red light was switched on, and he oher lights were switched off. At this point we let go of one another's hands.

Presently one of the ladies present began to describe the figure of a spirit friend she could see, in the same way as I had seen it done at a public meeting. When she had finished, another member of the circle said that he could hear a spirit friend talking, and he repeated the message he heard. It was for one of the circle, and advised him to take more care of his digestion, and not to eat things that disagreed with him.

Each in turn seemed to have a little spell of clairvoyance, or claraudience, though not so clearly or so successfully as the mediums I had seen in public. I now began to understand what was happening. These people were a sort of "apprentice mediums," that is, they were learning to use their powers in these ways, so that they too, might later on show publicly that there are no dead.

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THE END OF The Witch of Endor

THE WITCH WHO WAS NOT A WITCH

Is the Bible a Record of Ventriloguism?

professional medium's The name was Samuel, and he subsequently anointed Saul to be King. On another occasion, when he was desperately in need of guidance. Saul visited a medium at Endor.

The story of Saul and the Witch of Endor (as she has been called) is of particular interest because it is the only instance recorded in the Old Testament in which a person returns from the dead to speak to the living.

No Witch of Endor

There was no "witch" of Endor. The Bishops may call her a witch."

The Bible never calls her a "witch."

The word used means WOMAN: it is the same word as the one Jesus used when addressing his Mother: "Woman, behold thy son"!

But the Church would have us conjure up the witch's cavern dark and eerie, the horrible old witch with dishevelled hair and ragged dirty skirt, the blue fire and the cauldrons, the secret spells and incantations.

I say the "Church" because it is the Church that interprets the Bible to us, and foolishly calls this gifted. courageous and generous-hearted woman a 'witch." If you doubt the truth of my description of her. I beg of you to read the story for yourself, for no self-respecting, honest and unprejudiced reader of the Bible. however much he may deprecate her profession, can possibly regard this woman as anything but a good and courageous person.

The story is too well known to need repeating, and the Church has used it. and still uses it. to ndemn Spiritualism as a sin

fore, the Lord slew him and gave his kingdom unto David." But we have only to ask, "Who wrote these words?" and "Why were they written?" to discover how ignorant and unscholarly the Church's contention is.

Conflicting Records

Let me quote what Dr. Harvey Jellie says in the Century Bible Commentary on this passage in Chronicles . . .

"These verses from the chronicler's homily" (i.e. comment or interpretation) "upon the historic events recorded. He accuses Saul of disobedience to Jehovah and of complicity with the sorceress of Endor . . . The chronicler freely altered all that seemed to be in conflict with his own religious ideals."

Let us ask then . . . Is it true that Saul had not enquired of the Lord? and Is it true that the Lord slew him?

Dr. Jellie writes . . .

"As a matter of fact Saul had enquired of the Lord, but no answer had been vouchsafed." Verse 6 confirms this.

And with regard to Saul's death. when we turn to I Sam. 31:1 we find that he slew himself.

When we turn to 2 Sam. 1:10 we are told that he was slain by an Amalekite.

In neither of his *two* deaths (!) was he slain by the Lord, and in neither case was his death due to his "complicity with the Witch of Endor." It was due to his disobedience in not executing his fierce wrath upon Amalek as the Lord had commanded him to do. The Bible says so. (I Sam. 28:18.)

What purpose, then, has the Church in using I Chron. 10:13 against Spiritualism. and in calling a noble woman a "witch"?

The answers are many, but here are two: (a) The Church believes that all attempts to communicate with the other world are wicked and harmful. (b) She believes that if guidance can be received direct from the other world through mediums her own priestly authority will be greatly diminCONVERTED TO SPIRITUALISM

diplomacy to give up her former contention in view of the writings and experiences of such men as Barrett, Crookes, Dovle, Lodge. Wallace and the Revs. Canon Anson, Arthur Chabers, Dr. Lamond. Vale Owen. Drayton Thomas and Charles Tweedale, to mention only a few of the well-known convinced Spiritualists.

The Church, in maintaining that the Woman of Endor was a Ventriloquist. defeats her own ends. No one today would consult a ventriloquist in order to get in touch with a departed spirit!

So, whether the Church realizes it or not, she has left the field perfectly clear for honest and reverent investigation, because she has now decided that the classic Bible story which she once used in support of her case against Spiritualism is merely a record of ventriloquism.

Let me quote exactly what the latest Church Commentary . . . to which 61 of her best scholars have contributed . . . says about the story:

"It was only as a last desperate expedient that King Saul had recourse to this 'black magic.' . . . The medium pretended to see a ghost which she described, but her dupes only heard a voice, which by ventriloquism seemed to come from the ground."

And that is Church scholarship!

There is no witch.

There is no Samuel.

There is no medium.

There is only a VENTRILO-

Ventriloquists


The Church now tells us, however, that this woman was not a medium but was only a VEN-TRILOQUIST. (Vide the New Commentary.)

That discovery is peculiarly interesting because, hitherto, the Church has described her as a "necromancer"; and Saul's servants refer to her as "a woman that hath a familiar spirit." And in the famous verse Deut. 18: 10 Moses forbids anyone to consult a necromancer or one that hath a familiar spirit.

This is why the Church has constantly used this verse as a warning against mediums and those who consult them, declaring that these Old Testament magicians were the forerunners of our present-day mediums.

But we are now told, in effect, by the Church that these Old Testament magicians were not mediums, but merely ventriloquists. Perhaps she has felt bound in



SURVIVAL or Asleep In Death

REALITY OF CLAIRVOYANT VISION

If This Isn't Survival . . . What is It?

By ED BODIN

While I was on Hobby Lobby radio program for ten weeks during January, February and March, 1943, dramatizing true case-histories of survival and other phases of psychic phenomena, I received hundred of letters from listeners.

Only one out of a hundred was antagonistic; while many of the favorable letters gave me additional true cases for my collection which now totals over three thousand.

The few objectors to survival were evidently all members of some religious sect; because their arguments were the same, and based on Ecclesiastes Chapter 9. Verse 5: "For the living know that they shall die: but the dead know not anything, neither have they anymore a reward; for the memory of them is forgotten."

Survival A Fact

Far be it from me to refute the Bible or to change any part of it. All I can say is-maybe this was true at the time the Old Testament was written. But I am convinced that from the time of Christ, at least--survival for all mankind has been a fact-because in St. Matthew Chapter 27, Verses 51-53, we read: "And behold, the veil of the temple was rent in two from the top to the bottom; and the earth did quake; and the rocks were rent; and the tombs were opened: and many bodies of the saints that had fallen asleep were raised: and coming forth out of the tombs after His resurrection they entered into the holy city and appeared unto many."

If this isn't survival-what is it? But my objectors claim that some part of that chapter is missing from the Bible and that Saint Matthew didn't mean it just that way. It seems very convenient when one can cry "error" at any part of the Bible he doesn't like. It breaks down the whole basis of argument as to Bible authority.

comma should be placed after the word "today" - which refers to the time of the speaking and not to the time of fulfillment. Thus, we have another instance of changing the Bible to suit one's fancy; and consequently, argument goes out the window; for the common denominator is no longer common but merely individual interpretation.

But to me, the greatest proof in the New Testament of survival, is delivered by St. Matthew who tells of an actual ectoplasmic materialization. with Jesus as the medium--Chapter 17, Verses 1 to 8: "And after six days Jesus taketh Peter, James, and John his brother, and bringeth them into a high mountain apart, and was tran-figured before them: and his face did shine as the sun, and his raiment was white as the light.

"Be Not Afraid"

"And behold there appeared unto them Moses and Elijah (Elias) talking with Him. Then answered Peter, and said unto Jesus, Lord. it is good for us to be here: if thou wilt, let us make here three tabernacles, one for Thee, and one for Moses, and one for Elijah.

"While he yet spake, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them: and behold a voice out of the cloud, which said, This is my beloved Son. in whom I am well pleased: hear ye Him.

were sore afraid. And Jesus came and touched them, and said, Arise, and be not afraid. And when they had lifted up their eyes, they saw no man, save Jesus only."

And what do my objectors say to that? They claim it was "only a vision-not a reality."

Well-Joan of Arc's vision was pretty real-so was the vision of the shepherds at the birth of Christ -and St. Paul's vision on the Road to Damascus. As for me-I am satisfied to hope for "visions" of departed loved ones and hear their voices. It is much more comforting and convincing than really seeing a tombstone and resigning myself to grief.

Another argument used by my critics, is that no man goes to heaven immediately after death of his physical body, because Christ said-St. John Chapter 3, Verse 13: "And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but he that came down from heaven."

I can accept that and still be convinced of survival, because it is evident that man's spirit at death, enters into Paradise, a spirit-matter existence of high and low planes. And we all may have to grow or struggle in this Paradise or Purgatory until the Judgment Day or "Second Death."

Who Are The Devils?

The Bible tells us that Christ was in that spirit-matter existence for forty days until He finally ascended into Heaven. It was during that spirit-matter period that He manifested Himself to His Disciples. It was then that He promised each one of us, a spirit-guide or Holy Ghost as a comforter and protector.

But my objectors claim that all manifested spirits are devils who at the command of Satan are impersonating departed mortals in order to fool people --- just as Satan tried to fool Adam and Eve that "thou shalt not surely die."

But if one reads carefully, he will realize that Adam and Eve must have been spirit-matter creatures-and that Satan's boast referred to the death of the spiritmatter or "Second Death" which is so plainly depicted in the Bible. It was only after Adam and Eve disobeyed the laws of spirit, that they took on the low frequencies of physical decay and became mortals. They could not have been mortals at the time of the temptation because mortal law calls for death. But rather, they were of the same substance as Christ before His ascension.

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


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
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
