This was my first experience of a direct-voice seance. I hope it will not be my last.

If I were writing this article for a daily newspaper I should probably tackle it from a different angle. I should have to explain in details how I examined the room before the seance began and found no conjuring contraptions; how I handled the trumpet and voted it a very ordinary thing; and how I tapped the walls and prodded the carpet in a vain search for wires or what not.

Beyond Conjuring Skill

Readers of Psychic News need no such reassurances. Like them, I contend that if Estelle Roberts had, during her many years of Spiritualistic mediumship, resorted to the stage magic of Maskelyne, the skilled deception of a Devant or the clever professional chicanery of a Chung Ling Soo, she would have been exposed and ostracised from decent society long ago.

Indeed, it would require all the elaborate paraphernalia of the expert illusionist to present even a colorable imitation of the amazing phenomena I witnessed in that peaceful Surrey home.

What happened? Sixteen sensible, sober, wide-awake, clear-headed men and women sat in a circle in an ordinary sized room. Estelle Robert occupied what you might call the "chairman's position." The room was blacked out and illuminated inside by electric light.

Estelle was entranced with the light full on. It took her five minutes or more to attain outward unconsciousness. When her breathing settled down to peaceful and rhythmic respiration, the light was switched off.

When our eyes became acclimatised to the blackness, we could see the luminous paint spots of the trumpet as it stood erect on the floor at our feet.

Nothing Eerie

There was nothing frightening or cerie about the situation. We taked and chatted—and those of as who had never been to a voice seance before, speculated optimistically on what might happen.

We were not disappointed. In minute or two the trumpet moved. It rose a few inches from the ground. There followed sharp mocks, as it contacted the carpet

in a sort of staccato "Silence, please." I visualized a toastmaster calling a chattering crowd of diners to order.

The trumpet floats higher, shoulder high. I should say. There is tense silence—the silence you can "hear" . . . then the voice of Estelle's Indian collaborator Red Cloud. telling us in the deep, thick tones of a mature Red Skin, that he was doing his best to marshall together the boys on his side who were so anxious to communicate with their loved ones sitting hopefully and expectantly in that small circle.

"Hold On"

At last . . . "Hold on" . . . Red Cloud was giving us the signal for silence . . . a voice was coming through.

I am not going to speak of the messages except to make an observation or so about the amazing case of my own son. And that in a minute. Rather would I attempt in a clumsy way to give you my reactions as I remember them.

Each voice that came through was different, both in tone and culture. Stanley Burgess, who "died" at Crete, spoke to his mother (who had come all the way from Northwich) in the accent peculiar to those who are Cheshire born; later came the soft, cultured voice of Stephen Cohen, who passed over in an Indian hospital and regretted that it was a "bug" that caused his death—"not a very soldierly way of dying."

Stephen spoke of his aspirations to have been a barrister, of his hopes to have been an M.P. . . . and he assured his mother. Lady Cohen, that his studies on earth had not been wasted. They were helping him in his career in the spirit world.

Lady Cohen, clearly moved, talked of private matters . . . Stephen gave her advice . . . it was all so intimate, so real.

All So Natural

Then another contrast — bluff, breezy Bill Castello, leader of the four "dead" boys, who, with Red Cloud's help, are making these amazing contacts with the earth plane.

His mother and father were in the circle. I believe this is the fifth time they have talked with Bill. So far as I was concerned it might have been the fiftieth, so nat-

The trumpet, meanwhile had floated very near the carpet. Its mouth, so I judged, was only an inch or so above ground when I (Continued on Page 4, Col. 4)

He Had To Learn

Chesterfield Camp Opens July First

INDIANA SPIRITUALIST ASSOCIATION SCHEDULES LECTURES AND CLASSES

All Phases of Mediumship To Be Demonstrated

The Indiana Association of Spiritualists. internationally-known as CHESTERFIELD SPIRITUALIST CAMP, will open its fifty-seventh annual season. July 1st and close August 27th, 1911, at Chesterfield, Indiana, according to Mable Rif. the camp secretary. The association was incorporated under the laws of Indiana in 1887 and since that time, over half a million persons have had the opportunity to learn more about life after death and in most instances gain positive evidence of human personal surival. All of this has been made possible by the demonstration of psychic phenomena through various Chesterfield mediums.

Static Material Science **VOLUNTARILY REFUSING TO PROGRESS OUTSIDE OF PHYSICS**

'Philosophers Investigate' 'Fools Deride'

By

ARTHUR J. WILLS, C.E., Ph.D.

Varying from the physical, though intertwined, and its manifestations, more or less, affected by physics, the facts which substantiate psychic faculties of human life are different, and new methods of investigation must of necessity be slowly revealed.

But, in the mass, we are still like the ecclesiastical scientists of Galileo's day, who, when he demonstrated a principle of gravitation by dropping unequally sized iron cannon balls from the leaning tower of Pisa, asserted, "Your FACTS are wrong, our THEORIES are right." Such is the pitiful blunder of all fetish worshippers of beliefs, whether scientific, ecclesiastical or political.

We have learned that electric currents cannot be handled by a steam-shovel, as we have learned that the obsolete (though well-intentioned) barber-surgeon's panacea of phlebotomy (blood-letting) is not a cure-all for apolectic and anemic patients indiscriminately. So science generally, having no psychic vision, must cultivate a wider outlook, when investigating spirit manifestations, instead of airily, "Pooh, Poohing," what they theoretically, do not understand.

Science must learn both methods experimentally and experientally, the latter is as important as the former method.

What Effects Seances?

Conditions are not fixed as in chemistry and physics, etc. Medicine has varying effects on different persons and diseases, due to unknown or partly-known variations in the psyche as well as in the physique of the individual. Therefore, conditions vary the effects infinitely, especially in the case of spirit manifestations. Repetition of the same results are not predictable.

Take the eight notes on a piano, endless combinations and variations produce music. So in a seance with eight persons, myriads of permutations are possible. Add to this fact that each individual is also subject to innumerable permutations separately. Sorrow, irritation, inharmony frustration and illness intervene between sittings and change the extremely delicate conditions essential to success. The wonder is that we get so much, not to mention our stupendous ignorance and folly.

Phenomena Rarely Repeats

As to the supposed infallibility of science, consider the bee. According to known laws of science concerning flight, the bee cannot possibly fly, its relative weight, its bulk, too obstructive in air movement, and its wings too small. Yet IT DOES FLY, in spite of scientific rules, as any child can testify. Or take mathematics, the exact science par excellence. The mathematical juggler, using the symbol 00 to indicate infinity, multiplies one infinity by another infinity to produce an infinity of infinities, a manifest absurdity, mathe-

matical fairy tales. Ill informed on physical laws, the average scientist refuses to investigate the far more important psychic laws.

So while spirit manifestations rarely repeat consecutively as in physics, owing to the limitless varying conditions, they do recur spasmodically, quite unexpectedly to us, when similar conditions recur. This is puzzling to the beginner and the unthinking in such investigations and disappointing to the expert, though he has learned by experience not to expect the impossible.

Academic Prejudices

Curiously enough, the Psychologist (and many others) quite overlooks the inseparable spirit (psyche or soul) action involved in the simplest psychic phenomena. He is like the absentminded nurse who threw out the baby with the bath water, for he starts by rejecting spirit and confirms himtist) but a mind student or mentologist, a widely different Prof. Charles Richet,

He needs to set aside academic prejudices and look at things from a detached, impartial view-point. "It is the height of folly for any man to ridicule or lightly dismiss

heard: "It's not impossible . . . go . . . impossible? No . . . speak." It seemed to both my wife and myself as though there was a discussion going on "at the other end." Then . . . a voice: "Can you hear? . . . this is Eric speaking.

I was dumbfounded. Could this indeed be the voice of our boy who was shot down over Belgium when piloting a Whitley in the dark days of August. 1941?

Messages of Love

The voice was low, a little metallic. I doubt whether I should have recognized it in the ordinary way. But, one had to remember, it was passing through a metal trumpet over a foot long. One had to remember that even the radio varies the real voice of the broadcaster. I, myself. remembered how. when I first saw and heard myself speak on a Movietone news reel, I hardly recognized my own voice.

Anyhow, Eric went on talking. My wife and I asked questions. personal questions which meant nothing to the others and mean nothing to my readers. We had messages of love for his young wife. I was reminded by him, with what I imagine must have been a twinkle in his spirit eye, that he had been trying for a long time to get through, but that "newspaper men are hard-boiled."

He followed it up by quoting: "There are more things in heaven and earth than are dreamed of in our philosophy." Soon he bade us goodbye and asked us to speak to him again.

. . . But Things DO Happen

I was amazed. Quite frankly inborn stubborn antipathy towards anything supernormal made me say to myself: "It is a hoax. It must be a trick. Such things cannot happen."

Then, calmly analytical, I reviewed the matter from the practical standpoint, When Estelle came out of her trance and the lights were turned on. I looked around that room again.

How could that trumpet have been manipulated? How could it. like the acrobat of the song. "float through the air with the greatest of ease." without some intricate system of wires or without being guided by a human hand? And if the latter had been the case, is it humanly possible for a man or woman to perform the "floating" actions without making the slightest sound?

The Vital Question

I am certain there were spells in that seance when the trumpet went hither and thither, the silence was so tense that the minutest movement of a human body, the tiniest rustle of a piece of clothing. or the faintest creaking of a joint could have been distinctly heard.

And even if some human, stealthy as a jungle panther, had borne that trumpet through its aerial trips, how is it possible to explain by material methods how the "voice" was managed?

For, have no doubt of it, the voice definitely emanated from the trumpet, as surely as the recorded voice of a singer emanated from the horn of an old-time phonograph.

Was it possible to have fixed up some sort of microphonic connection between Mrs. Roberts, or an accessory, and the trumpet mouth. which would have given the same effect? I cannot believe it.

During the course of the conversation, Spiritualism and Occult Chesterfield and Etta subjects were discussed and as a result, my guests suggested the formation of a "home circle."

The final arrangements were concluded and the first meeting was held shortly after.

Recorded In Note Book

When we assembled for the meeting, it suddenly flashed across my mind that this, was the fulfillment of the prophetic message received from Harry Corbin through Etta Bledsoe.

In amazement, I exclaimed, "Oh, we are all divinely guided to meet. Let me read you a message received in Camp Chesterfield." I had the message recorded in a small note book, so I proved to them that all of our arrangements had been made by the spirit people.

Mr. McCord was from New York and was a Yale man. Mrs. McCord proved to be Virginia Johnson from Richmond, Va. They had recently married and moved to Louisville. In the message, I had been told that I already knew the third person, who proved to be Mary Fisher, a friend of long standing.

We Test The Laws

My experience in sitting for spiritual unfoldment was limited. Mr. and Mrs. McCord had no personal knowledge of direct communication with the spirit world. Mrs. Fisher had visited mediums once or twice but did not have any technical knowledge of any value

All of us were very sincere and earnestly aspired toward spiritual knowledge and wanted to learn the laws of God that govern life. We felt that if the teachings of Jesus and the other great Avatars were true, it should be possible for man to demonstrate here and now, the laws taught by them. Our real purpose was to test these laws and teachings of Jesus to ascertain whether or not we could demonstrate them.

us were not in rhythm. As an outline for proceeding, we used the four Gospels wherein the teachings of Jesus are recorded.

Bible Records a Promise

We selected the promise given in the gospel of St. Matthew, 18th chapter, 20th verse: "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them."

Firstly, we began our sittings in a brightly lighted room but soon found out that our thoughts were more or less distracted by each other and various objects therein. Then, we experimented with a dim light and lastly, tried darkening the room completely even to the exclusion of all light that came from the out-of-doors. The completely darkened room seemed to be the best suited for our particular work.

The procedure followed was: Opening the meeting with the Lord's Prayer. Then I, as leader, called the name of Jesus Christ and, in a simple child-like manner, I repeated the promise recorded in the Bible-"For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am in the midst of them."

Then in unison we said: "We believe this to be a true statement,

hence we know that we are under the guidance of angels."

After these opening remarks, we sang a hymn. "Nearer My God To Thee, and then asked that our spirit teacher, Harry Corbin. be given the light and strength to reach us and teach us.

'Do You Agree?"

At one time, Mr. McCord's mother was ill at her home in Ossining, New York. We prayed for her recovery by repeating: "If it is in accordance with Divine Law, we ask that the healing forces be sent to minister unto her."

I. as leader, would again refer to Matthew, 18th chapter, 19th verse; "Again I say unto you, that if two of you shall agree on earth as touching anything that they shall ask. it shall be done. for them of my father which is in heaven."

I asked the three students. "Do vou agree?" Their audible reply was "We do." I then said, "We thank thee, Father." We then sat in perfect silence.

On some occasions I would experience an unusual sensation. My forehead would feel as though a band had divided my mind, as it were. It would actually feel as though a part of me went out to Mrs. McCord in Ossining. I would describe to the class, step by step what I was experiencing.

"Mind Reading" Ruled Out

Never having visited Ossining, or the McCord home, this mental trip was most interesting to me as I could describe details of furniture and where it was placed in various rooms.

I recall, on one occasion, when We knew that our lives were not describing the exact location of perfectly harmonious and observed furniture in Mrs. McCord's bedthat other lives around and about room, Mr. McCord corroborated every detail as correct excepting the position of the dresser which was located on, say - the north side of the room. (I do not now recall the specific direction.)

I was so very positive that I was seeing the room as I described it, I requested that he write to find out if any changes had been made.

Mediumship AS THE BASIS OF Occult Practice

Superiority of Yoga Without Foundation

By W. H. EVANS

Noted English Writer He is the author of "How to be a Medium" (*) and "The Philosophy of Spiritualism" (**).

In these days there is some glamour around the words Occultism and Yoga, and one can always be sure of a public if one puts forward any claims to possess any power superior to that of ordinary mediumship.

There exists quite an erroneous idea that both Occultism and Yoga have something far superior to offer than can be gained by the development of mediumship. While it may be possible for devotees of Occultism, and the practitioners of Yoga, to exercise strange powers, apparently under their control, I think it can be laid down as a definite principle that without the possession of mediumistic powers no Occultist or Yogi can produce desirable results.

The exercise of clairvoyance which is, by some, thought to be controllable by the sensitive, depends upon the help of outside agencies. It is a pity that false notions about the powers of either Occultists or Yogis should be prevalent among Spiritualists, but that such notions exist is evident from what one occasionally reads or hears in conversation.

The superiority of Occultism or Yoga over ordinary mediumship is entirely without foundation, though both Occultists and Yogis are apt to look down their noses at Mediumship. Apart from some spectacular feats by a few Yogis, which demonstrate the existence

of strange and unknown powers, they rarely are productive of the good that arises from a proper use of mediumship; that is, they do not prove survival. That is the key point of true mediumship.

Altruistic Mediumship

Ever since the beginnings of the movement, the unseen have concentrated upon making that one point clear to investigators. All the wonders of physical phenomena with which we are acquainted have for their purpose the object of showing that the results achieved are under the control of minds separate and distinct from the medium, and these minds are the spirits of men and women who once lived upon earth.

Because of this, mediumship of the right kind is purely altruistic in outlook and method, designed to give comfort and support to those who have been separated by death from those they love. Can as much be said of either Occultism or Yoga? Do not both tend to concentrate attention upon self, the unfolding of strange and weird powers, the ability to manipulate the finer forces in the interest of the manipulator, rather than for the purpose of helping humanity in its need.

The Esoteric Groups

From the airs of superiority assumed by some who claim to have entered upon what they call "The Path," it is doubtful whether they are of real use to the possessors, or to the rest of humanity. There have been far too many sneers directed against mediumship by certain people who claim to possess occult powers, but who are very chary of demonstrating that their claims are true.

Once we used to hear about trained clairvoyants, but who ever witnessed any demonstration of the clairvovance so claimed? these superior people go up to the front firing line in the battle against materialism, and prove that there is a superior state of being beyond death? No, they kept them, it they possessed such powers, for what they called the esoteric groups.

Esotericism has been a curse to humanity, for it has erected a division between the higher and lower; the higher enjoying superior knowledge and the lower being kept outside the temple gates.

Humility is a divine virtue. Who ever heard of the really great ones of the earth denying to anyone the necessary knowledge that will lead to the kingdom of heaven? Let us beware of those who pose as superior and look down upon their humbler brethren engaged in

petent mediums." It was noted that one person was present at each of these scances, and for some mysterious reason appeared to be the cause of the failures. He asks: "What is there in the make-up of an ordinary individual which produces this result?"

The path of the psychic investigator is certainly variable. One person attends a public meeting and obtains striking evidential phenomena at once. Others attend public meetings for years, and never get a description or any type of message. In private and group sittings, the same principle seems to be operative.

"I Get Nothing"

One person gets striking evidence at his first sitting, whilst in other cases the medium indulges in generalities and often wild guesses, which offers no evidence of spirit return. He would be wiser to state frankly. "I can get nothing." In many such cases incompatibility between sitter and medium is the obvious explanationthey are unsuited to one another. It is probable that no medium can be successful with every sitter.

Experience shows that an investigator may be utterly unsuccessful in his sittings with the most popular mediums and yet obtain excellent results with another of far less psychic power. Personal Evidence Desired

Very occasionally one meets a sitter who draws blank in every attempt to obtain evidence. Sincerity and a desire for success has little to do with the matter. I have in mind my friend Thompson, who was very favorably disposed toward Spiritualism.

He had even addressed a few meetings on the subject. He was widely read, and intellectually he was quite satisfied of the fact of spirit communion. He began to seek personal evidence. He was comfortably off and had sittings with the best mediums in London and the provinces. Over sixty sittings were attended.

He took shorthand notes of them all. and he and I analyzed them. His wife, his child, his parents, and many friends were in the spirit world, but not a shred of real evidence came to him. A home circle was equally unsuccessf

"Power" Is Frozen

At this time I was holding a series of circles for levitation -the medium being Old John Taylor (Honest John) of Lancashire. John was probably the most successful medium for levitation in the country. It was quite usual in his presence to see a large table with three men on its surface, rise to the height of several feet and float round the room, in good light.

I arranged for Thompson to attend a sitting, but nothing happened. I secreted Thompson in the next room and we started a seance. The table floated! Quietly 1 opened the door and admitted Thompson. The table sank to the floor and refused to budge. After a while he left the room and instantly the table was freely levitated. I could only conclude that there was something in his psychic make-up which inhibited all phenomena whether mental or physical-and no one was more disappointed than he.

Why Some Successful

I quote this case because it is an extreme one. The presence of some folk inhibits phenomena, whilst that of others stimulates it. These results do not depend in any great measure upon whether the person is favorably or adversely disposed toward the subject. We begin to see why some people are invariably successful and others as certainly unsuccessful in their search for psychic evidences.

One conclusion which naturally arises is that successful seances depend quite as much upon the sitters as upon the medium. Every medium knows by experience that it is easy to obtain good results with some folk. and almost impossible

Fortunately such extreme cases as I have mentioned are rare: but between the two extremes it is probable that there are many gradLEST WE FORGET

uates, and this explains why some persons obtain striking results in the very early stages of their investigation, whilst others have to persist over long periods before attaining results which are evidential and conclusive.

Who Is At Fault?

they both loved.

I much deplore the tendency of some folks to lead investigators to believe that they have only to attend a seance or sit with a good medium to become convinced of spirit communion. The path is not always easy, but persistence will generally win through.

It may be that inability to secure results is dependant upon the nature of the psychic emanations of the sitter, which will not blend with those of the medium, but it is also possible that some folk subconsciously inhibit the operation of psychic power even when it is present in great strength My friend Mr. G --- was frequently told that he and his

By unanimous action on April 17th, the House of Representatives passed a resolution urging the Administration to send food to the other countries in Nazi-dominated Europe as is already being done so successfully in Greece.

This follows the passage in the Senate on February 15th, of bypartisan Senate Resolution 100 without a dissenting vote.

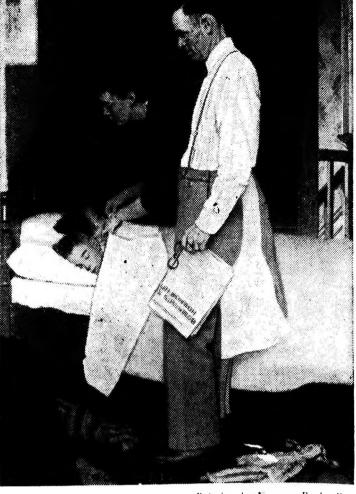
